- 8 JENNIFER YOU'RE GOING TO LEAD US AND WALK THROUGH THIS ITEM
- 9 LEAD US THROUGH THE DISCUSSION?

- 11 JENNIFER LARGAESPADA: YES. THIS CONTRACT IS FOR A CONTRACT
- 12 AMENDMENT, WITH VENTEC TRANSIT INCORPORATED. IN 2019 MTC
- 13 EXECUTED A SOLE SOURCE CONTRACT WITH VENTEC FOR VARIOUS
- 14 INTEGRATION WORK BETWEEN THE VENTEC TDM'S AND THE CLIPPER
- 15 NETWORK. THE CONTRACT WAS AND SPLIT INTO THREE DISTINCT TASKS.
- 16 FIRST TWO TASKS HAVE BEEN COMPETED. THEY WERE FOR MORE
- 17 FREQUENT CONFIGURATION DATA UPDATES AND ALSO THE INTEGRATION
- 18 WITH MOBILE. AND THIS AMENDMENT IS TO ADD FUNDS INTO THIS
- 19 CONTRACT TO COMPLETE THE THIRD TASK WHICH IS TO WITH THE
- 20 CLIPPER C2 LIBRARY WHICH WILL ALLOW FOR REALTIME INTEGRATION
- 21 WITH THE CLIPPER SYSTEM. SO, THIS INTEGRATION WORK INCLUDES
- 22 DEVELOPMENT AND TESTING AS WELL AS DEPLOYMENT AND FIELD
- 23 TESTING FOR ALL OF THE VENTEC TDM'S CURRENTLY IN USE FOR
- 24 CALTRAIN, GOLDEN GATE, SMART, AND VTA. AND THE FUNDING FOR
- 25 THIS CONTRACT AMENDMENT WAS INCLUDED IN THE TWO-YEAR CLIPPER



- 1 BUDGET APPROVED BY THIS BOARD IN JUNE 2022. WE DID NOT AT THE
- 2 TIME HAVE SPECIFIC SCOPE AND COSTS THE SPECIFICS WEREN'T
- 3 AVAILABLE UNTIL DECEMBER OF 2022. BUT THE FUNDING WAS INCLUDED
- 4 IN THE TWO-YEAR CLIPPER BUDGET. SO, STAFF IS RECOMMENDING THAT
- 5 THIS BOARD APPROVE A CONTRACT AMENDMENT WITH VENTEC, NOT TO
- 6 EXCEED \$500,000 TO PROVIDE INTEGRATION WITH THE NEXT
- 7 GENERATION CLIPPER LIBRARY.

3	JASON WEINSTEIN STAFF. NOTED IN OUR SCHEDULED UPDATE IN
4	NOVEMBER 2022, AND AS SHOWING THAT'S IN THE FIGURE ON THE TOP
5	OF MEMO A IN YOUR PACKET WE CONTINUE TO BE ON TRACK FOR THE
6	TRANSITION TO NEXT GENERATION CLIPPER SYSTEM IN SUMMER OF
7	2024. SO THAT IS GREAT. TRANSITION DATE AT A MOMENT WHICH
8	WE'LL EXPECT TO HAVE THE CLIPPER SYSTEM FULLY OPERATIONAL AND
9	EQUIPMENT INSTALLED ACROSS ALL THE 22 PARTICIPATING TRANSIT
10	OPERATORS, AND JUST AS A REMINDER, WHICH I THINK MANY OF YOU
11	KNOW, BUT IT DOESN'T HURT TO REPEAT, CUSTOMERS CAN EXPECT
12	FEATURES LIKE FUNDS ON THEIR CLIPPER CARDS IMMEDIATELY
13	AVAILABLE FOR USE, WHICH YOU CAN DO TODAY TOO, BUT WILL STILL
14	BE THERE. TAPPING YOUR OPEN PAYMENTS, CREDIT DEBIT PAY,
15	MANAGING ALL CARDS ON A SINGLE ACCOUNT, AND MORE TRAVEL
16	OPPORTUNITIES. CURRENTLY THE SYSTEM IS BEING TESTED AND
17	UNDERWAY AND WITNESSED BY MTC AND OPERATOR STAFF AND IS
18	ONGOING AT MULTIPLE OPERATORS. I'LL PAUSE THERE TRYING TO BE
