- 2 MATTERS RELATED TO TOLLING. LISA KLEIN WILL PRESENT.

- 4 LISA KLEIN: GREAT. GOOD MORNING COMMISSIONERS; YOU'RE RIGHT,
- 5 IT IS STILL MORNING. BETTER THAN THE LAST TIME I WAS HERE. I'M
- 6 LISA KLEIN DIRECTOR OF FIELD OPERATORS AND ASSET MANAGEMENT
- 7 SECTION HERE AT MTC. THIS IS A PROPOSAL THAT I SHARED
- 8 INFORMATION FOR LAST MONTH WE FINE TUNED IT AND ARE SEEKING
- 9 YOUR APPROVAL TODAY. COULD I HAVE THE BROADCASTING TEAM BRING
- 10 UP THE DECK, PLEASE? I SHOULD HAVE MENTIONED THAT EARLIER.
- 11 THAT IS GOOD TIMING. ALL RIGHT. YOU CAN GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE?
- 12 SO, JUST, YOU KNOW, A LITTLE BIT OF CONTEXT. IN APRIL OF LAST
- 13 YEAR, THE BAIFA BOARD WAS RECONFIGURED SO THAT IT MATCHES THE
- 14 MTC, THE COMMISSION BOARD. THAT WAS TO BE ABLE TO BETTER SERVE
- 15 A PORTFOLIO THAT INCLUDES ON THE ONE HAND REGIONAL TOLLING
- 16 COORDINATION, WHICH IS INCLUDES BUT IT'S NOT EXCLUSIVELY
- 17 RELATED TO EXPRESS LANES IMPLEMENTATION AND OPERATION OF BOTH
- 18 MTC'S EXPRESS LANES WHICH IS A CONTINUING ROLE AND FOR 37 WHEN
- 19 TOLLING IS AUTHORIZED ON THAT ROAD. AND THEN THIRDLY FOR
- 20 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION FINANCING, SUCH AS THE PLANNED BART
- 21 CAR FINANCING. WE ARE RECOMMENDING TODAY, TWO STANDING
- 22 COMMITTEES TO ADDRESS THOSE TOLLING RULES. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.
- 23 THE FIRST ROLE RELATES TO THE REGIONAL TOLLING COORDINATION,
- 24 OR SEAMLESS TOLLING AND THE GOAL HERE IS TO REALLY PUT THE
- 25 CUSTOMER FIRST. IT'S AKIN IN MANY WAYS TO THE NETWORK



- 1 MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION ALTHOUGH THE MECHANISM IS A LITTLE
- 2 DIFFERENT HERE AS SUCH IT IS REALLY A REGIONAL MATTER WITH
- 3 POLICIES THAT DO SOMETIMES CROSS EXPRESS LANES ON THE BRIDGES.
- 4 ADVISORY FORUM TO DISCUSS HOW OPERATORS CAN COORDINATE
- 5 POLICIES DISCOUNTS, EQUITY, TOLL VIOLATION POLICIES, THAT
- 6 WOULD BE APPROVED AND CARRIED OUT BY REGIONAL TOLL OPERATORS.
- 7 IN ADDITION, THIS IS A FORUM FOR TOLL NETWORK PLANNING WHICH
- 8 MAY IN THE FUTURE INCLUDE MORE WIDESPREAD TOLLING SUCH AS
- 9 ENVISIONED IN PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 TO REDUCE GREENHOUSE
- 10 GASSES AND OF COURSE THIS WOULD BE DONE IN CLOSE COORDINATION
- 11 WITH REGIONAL TRANSIT AND IN PARTICULAR EXPRESS BUS PLANNING.
- 12 NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THIS SLIDE IS ONE I HAVE SHOWN MANY TIMES.
- 13 I USE IT BECAUSE IT'S AN ILLUSTRATION OF HOW COMPLICATED THE
- 14 TOLLING POLICY LANDSCAPE IS. POLICIES SOMETIMES ALIGN AND
- 15 SOMETIMES THEY DON'T, AND, SO, YOU KNOW, THE GOAL LEER IS
- 16 REALLY TO BETTER UNDERSTAND -- FOR BAIFA TO BETTER UNDERSTAND
- 17 THAT. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THE SECOND ROLE, IN TOLLING, IS
- 18 DELIVERING AND OPERATING LANES WHERE BAIFA HAS THE
- 19 RESPONSIBILITY FOR TOLLING AND THAT STARTS WITH MTC'S EXPRESS
- 20 LANES IN SOLANO, CONTRA COSTA, AND ALAMEDA COUNTIES, SHOWN IN
- 21 COLOR ON THIS MAP. AND THIS IS REALLY THE NUTS AND BOLTS OF,
- 22 YOU KNOW ADOPTING POLICIES FOR THOSE LANES ENGAGE CONTRACTORS
- 23 TO BUILD AND OPERATE THEM AND DIRECTING USE OF TOLL REVENUE.
- 24 NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. AS FOLKS KNOW, BAIFA IS PURSUING AUTHORITY
- 25 FOR TOLLING ON THE INTERIM PROJECT ON STATE ROUTE 37. AND WHEN



- 1 APPROVED, BAIFA'S RESPONSIBILITIES THERE WOULD REALLY MIRROR
- 2 THE RESPONSIBILITIES FOR EXPRESS LANES. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE.
- 3 SO, THIS SLIDE SUMMARIZES THE RECOMMENDED COMMITTEE STRUCTURE.
- 4 AGAIN, IT PRESENTS TWO -- TWO COMMITTEES, TWO STANDING
- 5 COMMITTEES THAT ADDRESS THOSE TWO ASPECTS OF TOLLING. ON THE
- 6 LEFT IS A PROPOSED REGIONAL TOLLING POLICY COMMITTEE THAT
- 7 WOULD HANDLE THE COORDINATED PLANNING AND POLICY, AND WE ARE
- 8 RECOMMENDING THAT THAT COMMITTEE INCLUDE REPRESENTATION FROM
- 9 EACH COUNTY, BECAUSE THE FOCUS IS ON SEAMLESS TOLLING FROM THE
- 10 CUSTOMER STANDPOINT, NOT THE OPERATOR STANDPOINT. THAT'S A
- 11 SLIGHT ADJUSTMENT FROM THE PROPOSAL WE DESCRIBED LAST MONTH.
- 12 AGAIN, WITH REPRESENTATION FROM EVERY COUNTY. AND THIS
- 13 COMMITTEE, WE ENVISIONED WOULD MEET MAYBE 3 TO 6 TIMES A YEAR
- 14 IT IS NOT A MONTHLY KIND OF A TOPIC. [LAUGHTER] WE BELIEVE.
- 15 THE NEXT COMMITTEE SHOWN IN THE MIDDLE IS THE NETWORK AND
- 16 OPERATIONS COMMITTEE. THIS IS THE COMMITTEE THAT WOULD
- 17 FUNCTION MUCH LIKE THE BATA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE RELATED TO
- 18 THE, YOU KNOW, OPERATION, DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS OF THE MTC
- 19 EXPRESS LANES NETWORK TO START AND STATE ROUTE 37 WHEN TOLLING
- 20 IS AUTHORIZED THERE. ON THIS COMMITTEE WE'RE RECOMMENDING THAT
- 21 EACH COUNTY THAT'S IN THOSE FACILITIES, IF YOU WILL, WOULD
- 22 HAVE A SEAT ON THE COMMITTEE. SO THAT WOULD INCLUDE THE THREE
- 23 COUNTIES IN THE MTC NETWORK, AGAIN, SOLANO, CONTRA COSTA, AND
- 24 ALAMEDA. AND THEN ULTIMATELY WHEN THE 37 IS AUTHORIZED, THE
- 25 THREE REPRESENTATIVES -- THREE DIGITAL REPRESENTATIVES MARIN



- 1 SONOMA AND NAPA, IN THE INTERIM, HOWEVER, UNTIL THAT TIME, WE
- 2 ARE PROPOSING THAT THE CHAIR WOULD HAVE THE ABILITY TO APPOINT
- 3 THREE AT-LARGE REPRESENTATIVES. THIS COMMITTEE WOULD LIKELY
- 4 MEET MONTHLY. CALSTA PROPOSES A NON-VOTING MEMBER ON BOTH
- 5 COMMITTEES BECAUSE IT'S SUCH AN IMPORTANT PARTNERSHIP. I WENT
- 6 THROUGH THESE LAST TIME, IT, SORT OF, EMPHASIZES THE POINT YOU
- 7 WANT TO ADVANCE THE SLIDE PLEASE, THE BROADCASTING TEAM, YOU
- 8 KNOW, THAT THERE ARE MATTERS AT THE TWO TOP MATTERS, TOLL
- 9 VIOLATION PENALTIES, AND, YOU KNOW, TOLL SCHEDULES, AND
- 10 DISCOUNTS, THAT HAVE A SEAMLESS TOLLING ANGLE. WE WANT TO
- 11 UNDERSTAND HOW THOSE FIT INTO THE BROADER CONTEXT SO THOSE
- 12 WOULD RUN THROUGHOUT REGIONAL TOLLING COORDINATION COMMITTEE.
- 13 THE NEXT TWO EXAMPLES ARE FINANCIAL MATTERS RELATED,
- 14 SPECIFICALLY, TO MTC'S EXPRESS LANES. CONTRACTURAL MATTERS AND
- 15 THOSE WOULD RUN THROUGH THAT NETWORK OPERATIONS COMMITTEE. AND
- 16 LASTLY WE ENVISIONED THAT THE BART CAR FINANCING WOULD RUN
- 17 DIRECTLY TO THE BAIFA BOARD NOT RUN THROUGH [INDISCERNIBLE]
- 18 THAT CONCLUDES MY PRESENTATION. STAFF IS RECOMMENDING APPROVAL
- 19 THE RESOLUTION 46 TO ESTABLISH THOSE STANDING COMMITTEES. IF
- 20 APPROVED TODAY THEN THE CHAIR COULD APPOINT COMMISSIONERS TO
- 21 THOSE COMMITTEES AND THEY COULD MEET IN APRIL.
- 23 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: ALL RIGHT. THANK YOU LISA.
- 24 COMMISSIONERS? COMMISSIONER NOACK?

SUE NOACK: I APOLOGIZE, BEING NEW. I DON'T KNOW WHAT CHANGES 1 WERE FROM THE LAST MEETING TO THIS, THE CHANGE IN THE FIRST 2 3 COMMITTEE. IS THAT BEING DONE BECAUSE THEY'RE ANTICIPATING TO BE MORE TOLLING BROADER IN THE BAY AREA? OR -- I'M GUESSING 4 5 THAT. LET'S PUT IT THAT WAY. 6 LISA KLEIN: YEAH IT'S A COMBINATION OF FACTORS. THE ORIGINAL 7 8 PROPOSAL WAS TO HAVE A REPRESENTATIVE FROM EACH AUTHORIZED TOLLING ENTITY AND THAT WAS A LITTLE BIT AWKWARD THIS IS A LOT 9 10 SIMPLER APPROACH AND WOULD RESULT IN EIGHT REPRESENTATIVES, YOU KNOW. WE THINK THE NEW PROPOSAL FROM EACH COUNTY, ONE 11 MEMBER OF ALL COUNTIES DRIVING THE EXISTING POOL, RIGHT, THE 12 GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE, BATA BRIDGES, AND EXPRESS LANES, AND 13 EVENTUALLY 37. AND IN ADDITION THERE IS POTENTIAL MORE 14 WIDESPREAD TOLLING AS WE WORK THROUGH RECOMMENDATION 15 16 SUPERVISOR THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN. 17 SUE NOACK: THANK YOU. 18 19 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: COMMISSIONER SPERING? 20 21 22 JAMES P. - 1 LOOK AT SOLANO COUNTY, AND ALL THE TRAFFIC THAT WE'RE GETTING
- 2 THAT'S GOING TO TAHOE, COMING AND GOING ON THE WEEKENDS, A LOT
- 3 OF THAT TRAFFIC IS DIVERTING INTO OUR LOCAL STREETS AND ROADS,
- 4 AND WE'RE REALLY STARTING TO SEE AN IMPACT ON THAT. YOU KNOW,
- 5 AS YOU KNOW, OUR EXPRESS LANES ARE UNDER CONSTRUCTION RIGHT
- 6 NOW. I REALLY THINK THAT WE NEED TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THAT
- 7 OPPORTUNITY TO HELP PAY FOR THE EXPRESS BUS SERVICE AND MANY
- 8 OTHER OPPORTUNITIES. BUT IT'S JUST, A REVENUE SOURCE THAT I
- 9 THINK SHOULD BE PURSUED. AND ONE THAT IMPACT IS HAVING A
- 10 SERIOUS IMPACT ON OUR LOCAL STREETS AND ROADS IN SOLANO
- 11 COUNTY.

- 13 ANDREW FREMIER: COMMISSIONER, ANDREW FREMIER, EXECUTIVE
- 14 DIRECTOR. YOU AND I HAVE TALKED ABOUT THIS OVER THE YEAR AND I
- 15 ASSURE YOU WE'RE EVALUATING FIRST THE QUESTION OF WHETHER OR
- 16 NOT THE WEEKENDS AND THREE PLUS WORK IN SOLANO COUNTY AN
- 17 ASSUMPTION THAT WE DO AND SO WE'RE DEFINITELY PURSUING THAT
- 18 ULTIMATELY CALTRANS HAS SOME AUTHORITY TO TELL US WHAT WE CAN
- 19 DO BUT WE ARE AGGRESSIVELY TAKING A LOOK AT IT BECAUSE WE
- 20 AGREE TO PURSUE THAT FROM DAY ONE.

I WAS FEELING NEGLECTED. THE 8 QUESTION FOR LISA, AT THE END OF HER PRESENTATION, ON SLIDE EIGHT AROUND THE BART CAR FINANCING SHE SAID THAT THE PLACE 9 WHERE IT SHOULD BE ON THIS COMMITTEE AS OPENED TO SOMEWHERE 10 ELSE, AND THE SOUND CUT OUT SO I DIDN'T HEAR WHERE ELSE 11 SOMEWHERE ELSEWHERE THIS WAS NOT BEING RECOMMENDED. 12 13 LISA KLEIN: SURE HAPPY TO RESPOND THROUGHOUT CHAIR. THE WAY IT 14 15 WOULD WORK THE BART CAR FINANCING WOULD GO DIRECTLY TO THE 16 FULL BAIFA AUTHORITY AS OPPOSED TO ONE OF THE TWO PROPOSED STANDING COMMITTEES. HAVING A VEHICLE THAT I 17 DIDN'T OWN, THAT HAD A LICENSE PLATE SIMILAR TO MINE THAT KEPT 18 GETTING BRIDGE TOLLS, THAT'S KIND OF IMPORTANT TO HAVE. IT'S 19 GOING TO BE AN INTERESTING THING TO DEBUG, AND I WOULD 20 21 APPRECIATE IT IF WE COULD TRANSFER OR AT LEAST SEND FAIR MEETING TO THE EQUITY AND ACCESS SUBCOMMITTEE, THE ANALYSIS OF 22 THE OTHER PILOT PROGRAMS THAT TOOK PLACE IN OTHER STATES SO 23 THAT WE CAN DO AN APPLES TO APPLES COMPARISON.
