- 21 THIS YEAR'S BUDGET DELIBERATION I HAVE FULL CONFIDENCE IN VICE
- 22 CHAIR JOSEFOWITZ AND BELIEVE IT'S SOMETHING HE'S GOING TO DO A
- 23 FINE JOB ON MAKING SURE HE HAS A COMMONWEALTH THAT HE
- 24 DESIGNATED THAT CAN WORK WITH HIM AND STAFF TO STEP UP TO MEET
- 25 THE MOMENT TO WORK WITH LEGISLATORS AND OPERATORS TO STRIKE

- 8 DOING AS A REGION. THERE ARE OVER A MILLION PEOPLE GETTING ON
- 9 TRANSIT EVERY DAY IN THIS REGION. THEY RELY ON IT MANY HAVE
- 10 ABSOLUTELY NO OTHER OPTIONS TO GET TO SCHOOL, TO GET TO THE
- 11 DOCTOR, TO GET TO WORK AND WE'RE FACING THIS EXISTENTIAL
- 12 CRISIS WE HAVE BEEN ADDRESSING THIS FOUR YEARS WITH THE
- 13 REGIONAL NETWORK MANAGEMENT WORK WORKING AROUND MAKING SURE
- 14 FEDERAL FUNDING IS SECURED AND DISTRIBUTED FAIRLY.
- 15 UNFORTUNATELY WE HAVE A LOT MORE WORK AHEAD OF US. I AM
- 16 EXCITED TO BE WORKING WITH ALL OF YOU. AND TO BE LEADING THIS
- 17 AD-HOC TO CHART A PATH TO PUT OUR TRANSIT AGENCIES ON A PATH
- 18 TOWARDS FISCAL SUSTAINABILITY. THANK YOU VERY MUCH CHAIR FOR
- 19 THE CONFIDENCE OF DOING THAT AND I LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING
- 20 WITH ALL OF YOU.

- 7 THIS MOMENT THIS IS ABOUT SITTING DOWN UNDERSTANDING OUR
- 8 PRIORITIES, WHAT'S AHEAD OF US AND REALLY DOING THE WORK THAT
- 9 WE NEED TO DO NOT THAT WE HAVEN'T DONE IT BUT I THINK WE HAVE
- 10 AN INCREDIBLE OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN THE QUALITY
- 11 OF LIFE OF PEOPLE IN THE BAY AREA BUT THAT MEANS HARD
- 12 DECISIONS HAVE TO BE MADE AND I WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT WE AS A

- 8 FLEMING; PROGRAMMING AND ALLOCATIONS, CHAIRED BY CINDY CHAVEZ
- 9 AND VICE CHAIR NATE MILEY; BAHFA OVERSIGHT AND HOUSING,
- 10 CHAIRED BY MYSELF AND VICE CHAIR NICK JOSEFOWITZ; PLANNING, WE
- 11 HAVE JIM SPERING, CHAIR, EDDIE AHN, VICE CHAIR; JOINT MTC AND

WE'RE GOING TO DO AGENDA MANAGEMENT TO ENSURE WE'RE USING OUR 1 TIME AS EFFICIENT AS WE CAN. YOU HAVE OUR COMMITMENT TO BE TRY 2 3 TO BE RESPECTFUL OF EVERYONE'S TIME. THAT'S THE COMMITTEE REPORT. I HAVE COVERED A LOT AT THIS POINT. I WILL SEE IF 4 5 THERE IS ANY QUESTIONS. COMMISSIONER SPERING? 6 JAMES P. SPERING: MR. CHAIRMAN, AND STAFF, WHAT IS THE TIMING 7 8 ON THE BUDGET, THE SENATE BUDGET? THROUGH THE CHAIR? 11 12 REBECCA LONG: THROUGH THE CHAIR? 13 14 15 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: YES. 16 REBECCA LONG: REBECCA LONG, DIRECTOR OF LEGISLATION AND PUBLIC 17 AFFAIRS. SO, THE LEGISLATURE IS REQUIRED TO ADOPT A BUDGET BY 18 JUNE 15TH, AND IN A RECENT HEARING ASSEMBLYMEMBER TING CHAIR 19 OF THE ASSEMBLY BUDGET COMMITTEE DID INDICATE THAT HE WOULD 20 21 LIKE TO SEE TRANSIT ADDRESSED IN THE JUNE BUDGET AND THE GOVERNOR HAS POSTPONED THE DATE BY WHICH FOLKS ARE REQUIRED TO 22 SUBMIT THEIR TAXES SO THERE IS ANTICIPATED TO BE KIND OF A 23 MORE REAL BUDGET ADOPTED IN THE FALL. HOWEVER, THE APPROACH 24

THAT WE'RE TAKING, LARGELY, AS IT RELATES TO THE TRANSIT



- 1 FISCAL CLIFF DOES NOT DEAL WITH THE GENERAL FUND SO MUCH IT'S
- 2 LOOKING AT OTHER FUNDS. WE THINK THERE IS A GOOD POSSIBILITY
- 3 THAT TRANSIT CAN BE ADDRESSED IN THE INITIAL BUDGET THEY'RE
- 4 REQUIRED TO ADOPT BY JUNE 15TH. SO, THAT'S KIND OF THE
- 5 CONTEXT.

- 18 AN OPPORTUNITY, CERTAINLY, FOR THE COMMISSION TO INFLUENCE
- 19 THAT, BUT IT IS A TIGHT TIMELINE BEFORE JUNE.

IS THAT ONE OF THE ISSUES THAT NEEDS TO BE RESOLVED? 11 12 REBECCA LONG: THANK YOU, COMMISSIONER CANEPA. ONE OF THE 13 OPTIONS BEING DISCUSSED BY THE CALIFORNIA TRANSIT ASSOCIATION 14 15 IS MAKING SURE THE TIRCP AUGMENTATION THAT WAS PROVIDED IN 16 LAST YEAR'S BUDGET OR IT WAS PLANNED FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023, 2024, AND FOR THE FOLLOWING YEAR. THOSE FUNDS ARE SUPPOSED TO 17 COME TO MTC AND OTHER AGENCIES ACROSS THE STATE WHERE WE GET 18 TO DETERMINE HOW TO EXPEND THOSE FUNDS. AND, FOR US, OVER THE 19 TWO-YEAR PERIOD, IT'S 800 MILLION. THE COMMISSION HAS ALREADY TAKEN 22 ACTION, RIGHT, ON HOW TO PRIORITIZE THOSE FUNDS. AGAIN, WE 23 REFER TO THESE AS THE TIRCP AUGMENTATION. WHAT'S BEING 24 DISCUSSED IS ALLOWING IN TRAILER BILL LANGUAGE THE OPTION FOR 25



- 1 REGIONS TO FLEX THOSE TO TRANSIT OPERATIONS, THAT THAT
- 2 DECISION WOULD REST WITH THE COMMISSION, NOT WITH THE
- 3 LEGISLATURE. IN SENATOR CORTESE'S SIGN-ON LETTER THERE WAS A
- 4 CASE BEING MADE THAT THAT FLEXIBILITY SHOULD NOT EVEN BE ON

- 18 TO DO. IN OUR LAST MEETING WE RECEIVED AN UPDATE ON OUR HIGH
- 19 SCHOOL AND COLLEGE SUMMER PROGRAMS AND THE NEXGEN FREEWAY
- 20 INITIATIVE THIS REVIEW ALLOWS US TO PROVIDE STAFF WITH
- 21 FEEDBACK OUTSIDE OF THE NORM NEXT MONTH WE'LL BE HAVING IN
- 22 DEPTH DISCUSSION WITH THE LEGISLATIVE TEAM INCLUDING POTENTIAL
