PROCEEDING 19 TO THE MAIN EVENT. I'M GOING TO CLARIFY WITH COUNSEL. WHILE ABAG HAS NOT CONVENED, I HOPE WE CAN TAKE PUBLIC COMMENT ALL 20 21 AT ONE TIME. THIS ITEM, THIS IS AN INFORMATIONAL ITEM. SO TO 22 MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC DEMAND EXPECTATIONS, IF YOU WANT TO 23 COMMENT ON THE LABOR STANDARDS THIS IS THE MOMENT IN TIME? 24

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KATHLEEN KANE: THAT'S CORRECT. THIS IS THE ENTIRETY OF THE 1 2 HEARING ON THE INFORMATIONAL ITEM, AND THE PUBLIC WILL HAVE 3 ONE OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK ON IT. 4 5 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: CONFIRM WE HAVE NOT ESTABLISHED THE TELECONFERENCE LOCATION FOR OAKLAND? 6 7 8 SPEAKER: CORRECT. 9 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: THIS IS ITEM SEVEN. 10 REGIONAL EXPENDITURE PLAN LABOR STANDARDS. THIS IS AN ABAG 11 HOUSING COMMITTEE THAT HASN'T CONVENED YET. BUT IT'S THE BAHFA 12 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE INFORMATIONAL ITEM ONLY. FOLLOWING OUR 13 DIRECTION AT THE FEBRUARY 14TH MEETING FOR STAFF RETURN WITH 14 15 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON POTENTIAL LABOR STANDARDS, I BELIEVE 16 OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, ANDY FREMIER WILL INTRODUCE THE ITEM. 17 ANDREW FREMIER: THANK YOU, CHAIR AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE. 18 WE HAVE BEEN MEETING REGULARLY WITH A LOT OF THE BROAD LANE OR 19 REPRESENTATION. AND WHILE I DON'T LIKE TO JINX DISCUSSIONS WE 20 21 THINK THEY'RE GOING VERY WELL, BUT WE HAVE SEVERAL MORE PLANNED IN COMING WEEKS BUT BECAUSE WE HAVE NOT CONCLUDED 22 THOSE DISCUSSIONS TODAY'S PRESENTATION IS REALLY JUST 23 INFORMATION. AND OUR GOAL FOR TODAY IS TO MAKE SURE WE HAVE 24 COMMON VOCABULARY AS WE TALK ABOUT LABOR STANDARD OPTIONS AND 25

WHAT TRADE-OFFS THERE ARE FOR DIFFERENT STANDARDS. WE EXPECT 1 2 TO RETURN TO THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON APRIL 10TH TO THE JOINT 3 COMMITTEE, FROM OUR DISCUSSIONS AS WELL WITH LABOR REPRESENTATIVES AND STAKEHOLDERS AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE 4 5 I THINK IT'S SAFE TO SAY THERE IS REAL COMMON INTEREST IN ENSURING THAT STRONG PROTECTIONS FOR LABOR ARE INCLUDED IN OUR 6 DIRECTION AND THAT THEY'RE EFFECTIVE IN EVERY COUNTY 7 8 ACKNOWLEDGING THAT THERE IS A LOT OF DIVERSITY IN THE COUNTIES AS WE MOVE FORWARD. SO WE LOOK FORWARD TO PRESENTING THESE 9 10 STANDARDS THAT STRIKE A BALANCE FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION IN THE NEXT MONTH AND I'LL TURN IT OVER TO KATE HARTLEY WHO WILL WALK 11 US THROUGH THE PRESENTATION. 12

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CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: THANK YOU. I APPRECIATE 14 STAFF'S COMMITMENT TO HAVING AN HONEST AND ROBUST 15 CONVERSATION, THIS IS A FRAGILE DISCUSSION. WE'RE UNITED IN 16 THE OUTCOME OF HOUSING WE'RE TRYING TO CHIEF AND WHETHER 17 WALKING THE HALLS OF SACRAMENTO, WE ARE U INDICT. BUT WE CAN'T 18 LET PERFECT GET IN THE WAY OF PROGRESS. PERFECT WOULD BE IDEAL 19 BUT WE HAVE TO MAKE PROGRESS AND WE HAVE OPPORTUNITY AROUND 20 21 THIS TO GALVANIZE TOGETHER TO CREATE MEANINGFUL RESOURCES FOR OUR REGION BUT IT'S GOING TAKE US ALL LEANING IN AND NOT 22 TRYING TO BE PERFECT IN THIS MOMENT IN TERMS OF WHAT WE'RE 23 TRYING TO ACHIEVE. SO I WANT TO THANK ALL PARTNERS AND 24 25 STAKEHOLDERS. WE HAVE ALL HAD COUNTLESS MEETINGS, COUNTLESS

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PHONE CALLS AND E-MAILS WITH ALL SIDES OF THIS SITUATION. BUT
 I WANT TO THANK STAFF. SO I'LL TURN IT BACK OVER TO KATE.

KATE HARTLEY: THANK YOU SO MUCH. AND GOOD AFTERNOON COMMITTEE 4 5 MEMBERS. AS YOU HAVE HEARD, DISCUSSIONS ARE ONGOING WITH OUR PARTNERS, OUR LABOR PARTNERS AND DEVELOPERS AND STAKEHOLDERS. 6 WE WANT TO TAKE TODAY, USE TODAY AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO PROVIDE 7 8 SOME BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND CONTEXT TO HELP YOU AND OUR BOARDS GO THROUGH YOUR DECISION-MAKING PROCESS ON THIS ISSUE. 9 10 NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. AND AS A REFRESHER, AND I THINK WE WANT TO GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE TOO. THANK YOU. AS A REFRESHER, BAHFA'S 11 AUTHORITIES ARE LOCATED IN OUR ENABLING STATUTE, IT'S THE SAN 12 FRANCISCO BAY AREA REGIONAL AFFORDABLE HOUSING ACT. THE ACT 13 DOES NOT ALLOW US TO IMPOSE LABOR STANDARDS ON THE 14 15 JURISDICTIONS. OUR STATUTE COULD BE AMENDED, HOWEVER, TO SAY 16 THAT BAHFA MAY IMPOSE LABOR STANDARDS, BUT NOT ALL LABOR STANDARDS ARE ACCESSIBLE IN THAT WAY. OUR GENERAL COUNSEL HAS 17 ADVISED THAT EVEN IF OUR ACT IS AMENDED, WE CANNOT REQUIRE 18 CITIES AND COUNTIES TO USE A PROJECT LABOR AGREEMENT, FOR 19 EXAMPLE, DUE TO FEDERAL LEGAL REOUIREMENTS THAT APPLIED FOR 20 21 PLAS AND I'LL SAY MORE ABOUT THAT IN A MINUTE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. TO DETERMINE WHAT COULD BE AN ALLOWABLE AND 22 APPROPRIATE STANDARD FOR BAHFA AND POTENTIALLY THE WHOLE 23 REGION THROUGH AN AMENDMENT TO OUR ENABLING STATUTE, WE WANT 24 25 TO GIVE A SHORT SUMMARY OF DIFFERENT LABOR STANDARD FRAMEWORKS

THAT ARE CURRENTLY IN USE IN CALIFORNIA. SO, FIRST UP IS THE 1 CALIFORNIA LABOR CODE, AND THAT SAYS THAT PROJECTS THAT USE 2 3 PUBLIC FUNDS MUST PAY PREVAILING WAGES. HOWEVER THERE IS A SECTION IN THE CODE IT'S 1720C FIVE THAT EXEMPTS PRIVATELY 4 5 OWNED RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION IF THE PUBLIC FUNDS USED FOR THAT MEET CERTAIN CRITERIA. AND IT'S VERY, VERY EASY FOR AN 6 AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT TO MEET THOSE TERMS. SO, IT'S 7 8 SIMPLY APPLYING THE LABOR CODE DOES NOT GUARANTEE A PAYMENT STANDARD FOR WORKERS UNLIKE OTHER PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS, LIKE 9 INFRASTRUCTURE INSTALLATIONS, THAT ARE OWNED BY A PUBLIC 10 ENTITY. THERE ARE MANY WAYS THAT WE DO APPLY AN ENFORCEABLE 11 PREVAILING WAGE HOWEVER. FEDERAL FUNDS THAT FLOW THROUGH 12 CITIES AND COUNTIES LIKE CDBG AND HUONG PROVIDE PREVAILING 13 WAGES SOME CITIES IN OUR REGION ATTACH A PREVAILING WAGE 14 15 REQUIREMENT TO ALL FUNDS THEY PROVIDE REGARDLESS OF SOURCE OF 16 FUNDS, AND CERTAIN PROGRAMS BY THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT REQUIRE PREVAILING WAGES. 17 THE NEXT STANDARD WE WANT TO HIGHLIGHT TODAY CONSISTS OF THREE 18 MAIN REOUIREMENTS, AN ENFORCEABLE PREVAILING WAGE STANDARD, 19 CARE PAYMENTS FOR PROJECTS THAT ARE 50 UNITS AND OVER, AND USE 20 21 OF APPROVED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS FOR BUILDINGS THAT ARE 50 UNITS AND MORE THIS STANDARD IS INCLUDED IN RECENTLY PASSED 22 STATE STREAMLINING LEGISLATION A.B. 2011 WHICH IS BUFFY WICKS 23 BILL AND IT ALSO APPLIES TO SB FOUR ALSO KNOWN AS YES IN GOD'S 24 25 BACKYARD AND IS STREAMLINING AS WELL ALSO IN MODIFIED FORM

SENATOR BILL 423 ANOTHER STREAMLINING PIECE OF LEGISLATION AT 1 THE STATE AND SB 423 THE WAGES HEALTHCARE AND APPRENTICESHIP 2 3 REQUIREMENT IS JOINED WITH REQUIREMENT TO USE SKILLED TRAINED LABOR FOR ANY MARKET RATE MIXED INCOME BUILDING THAT IS OVER 4 5 85 FOOT HOWEVER 100 AFFORDABLE DEVELOPMENTS THAT ARE EXEMPT, BRINGS US TO FRAMEWORK WHICH IS GENERAL SPEAKING RESTRICTIVE 6 STANDARD THAT REOUIRES WORKFORCE TO BE SKILLED JOURNEY PERSONS 7 8 AND GRADUATES OF AN APPROVED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM IT WAS RECENTLY INCLUDED IN SB SENATE BILL SIX, SB SIX, WHICH IS A 9 BILL THAT ALLOWS RESIDENTIAL USE ON COMMERCIALLY ZONED 10 PROPERTY WITHOUT REZONING BUT IF YOU USE SKILLED AND TRAINED 11 WORKFORCE. FINALLY OUR LAST FRAMEWORK TO PRESENT TODAY IS 12 PROJECT LABOR AGREEMENTS, PLAS AND AS MENTIONED OUR OFFICE OF 13 GENERAL COUNSEL HAS ADVISE THAT FEDERAL LEGAL REQUIREMENTS 14 15 PREEMPTING STATE AND LOCAL LAWS PREVENT BAHFA FROM IMPOSING 16 PLA ON ALL JURISDICTIONS REGARDLESS OF THE LANGUAGE IN OUR STATUTE. WE COULD IMPOSE, WE COULD ADOPT A PLA FOR BAHFA'S OWN 17 FUNDS, 20% OF FUNDS IF WE WERE TO MAKE CERTAIN FINDINGS ABOUT 18 BAHFA'S ROLE AS A MARKET PARTICIPANT PROCURING LABOR SERVICES 19 BUT GIVEN THE STATUTORILY REQUIRED DISTRIBUTION OF BOND 20 21 FUNDING TO NINE COUNTIES THOSE MARKET PARTICIPANT FINDINGS FOR BAHFA WOULD NOT EXTEND TO ALL THE COUNTIES BECAUSE BAHFA WOULD 22 HAVE NO ROLE IN THE PROCUREMENT OF SERVICES AT THE CITY AND 23 COUNTY LEVEL. SO, THIS PUTS US IN A VERY DIFFERENT POSITION 24 25 FROM AREAS THAT RECENTLY HAVE EMPLOYED A PLA, SUCH AS ALAMEDA

COUNTY, THAT'S THE ONE-COUNTY STANDARD, AS WELL AS IN LOS 1 2 ANGELES, THE LACOSTA LEGISLATION RECENTLY PASSED THAT REQUIRES A PLA, AGAIN THAT'S FOR ONE COUNTY ONLY. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. 3 SO, AS THE BOARDS CONSIDER THESE COMPETING FRAMEWORKS WHICH 4 5 HAVE COMPLEXITY WHEN YOU THINK ABOUT THEIR APPLICATION THROUGHOUT THE REGION, WE WANT TO PROVIDE FURTHER CONTEXT FOR 6 DECISION-MAKING, DRAWING ON FEEDBACK FROM THIS COMMITTEE, AS 7 8 WELL AS BAHFA'S GUIDING PRINCIPLES SET FORTH IN OUR BUSINESS PLAN. THESE INCLUDE THE GOALS OF EXPANDING THE PROTECTION OF 9 WORKERS IN THE BAY AREA'S AFFORDABLE HOUSING CONSTRUCTION 10 INDUSTRY, BUILDING AND PRESERVING HOUSING AT SCALE TO ADDRESS 11 THE REGION'S LONG-TERM HOUSING SHORTAGE, AND IN ORDER TO MEET 12 OUR GOALS PURSUING NEW STRATEGIES FOR CONTROLLING COST AND 13 DELIVERING HOUSING IN QUICKLY. NEXT SLIDE. REGARDING THE 14 OUESTION OF WORKER PROTECTIONS, IT'S HELPFUL TO FIRST 15 16 UNDERSTAND WHO'S DEVELOPING AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN THE BAY AREA 17 AND HOW LABOR STANDARDS ARE APPLIED IN DIFFERENT CONTEXT. THIS IS A VERY HIGH-LEVEL DISCUSSION. AND I'M VERY MUCH 18 GENERALIZING HERE, BUT, GENERALLY SPEAKING, IF YOU LOOK AT THE 19 DATA FROM THE LAST FEW YEARS OF ALLOCATIONS OF TAX CREDITS AND 20 21 TAX EXEMPT BONDS, WHICH, AS YOU KNOW ARE THE MAIN WAYS THAT PEOPLE BUILD AFFORDABLE HOUSING, TWO DIFFERENT DEVELOPER TYPES 22 EMERGE. FIRST OUR DEVELOPERS ARE THAT USE LOCAL FUNDS, FROM 23 CITY AND COUNTIES WHICH THEY'RE LOCATED AND THEY'RE USUALLY 24 25 THOUGH NOT ALWAYS NON-PROFIT CORPORATIONS, THEY ALMOST ALWAYS

PAY PREVAILING WAGES, AND SINCE 2022 WHEN A.B. 2011 PASSED, WE 1 2 HAVE NOT SEEN ANY PROJECTS IN THE WHOLE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, 3 ACTUALLY, MOVE FORWARD USING THAT WAGE'S HEALTH CARE TRAINING STANDARD. SO, THE APPLICATION OF THAT STANDARD WOULD ADD 4 5 HEALTH CARE AND TRAINING REOUIREMENTS TO AN ENFORCEABLE PREVAILING WAGE STANDARD THAT THIS COHORT OF DEVELOPERS IS 6 ALREADY USING ALMOST ALL THE TIME. THE PROJECTS THAT THIS 7 8 COHORT BUILD ARE ALSO TYPICALLY SUBJECT TO ADDITIONAL REGULATORY OBLIGATIONS THAT OFTEN COME WITH LOCAL FUNDS. SO 9 TOTAL DEVELOPMENT COSTS TEND TO BE CORRESPONDINGLY HIGH. THE 10 SECOND GROUP OF DEVELOPERS DOES GOT TAKE LOCAL FUNDS. THEY ARE 11 OFTEN, THOUGH NOT ALWAYS, FOR-PROFIT COMPANIES. THEY USUALLY 12 FINANCE THEIR PROJECTS WITH THREE SOURCES OF FUNDS, TAX 13 CREDITS, TAX EXEMPT DEBT, AND A VERY HIGH-LEVEL OF DEFERRED 14 15 DEVELOPER FEES. THEY ARE NOT SUBJECT TO THE REGULATORY 16 REOUIREMENTS THAT OFTEN ATTACH TO LOCAL FUNDING. THEIR 17 DEVELOPMENT COSTS ARE USUALLY QUITE LOW, AND BECAUSE TAX CREDITS DO NOT REQUIRE PREVAILING WAGES, PREVAILING WAGE 18 COMPLIANCE IS NOT TYPICAL ON THESE JOBS. THE APPLICATION OF 19 LABOR STANDARDS TO THESE PROJECTS WOULD PROVIDE ENFORCEABLE 20 WORKER PROTECTIONS WHERE THEY DO NOT NOW EXIST FOR THE MOST 21 PART. NOT IN ALL CASES, AGAIN, BUT IN THE MAJORITY OF THE 22 PROJECTS BUILD BY THAT PARTICULAR COHORT OF DEVELOPERS. AND TO 23 GIVE YOU A SENSE OF SCALE ABOUT THESE TWO DEVELOPER TYPES, WE 24 LOOKED AT SIDLAC AND TCAC PROJECTS, PROJECTS THAT GOT AWARDED 25

FUNDS BETWEEN 2021 AND 2023. THERE WERE 90 PROJECTS. THEY 1 BUILT ABOUT 12,000 HOMES, AND OF THESE 55 INCLUDED LOCAL FUNDS 2 3 FOR THEIR PROJECTS. AND OVER 90% OF THOSE PROJECTS PAID PREVAILING WAGES FOR THEIR PROJECTS. 35 OF THE TOTAL 90 4 5 PROJECTS DID NOT USE LOCAL FUNDS, AND APPROXIMATELY 80 PERCENT OF THOSE DEVELOPMENTS DID NOT INDICATE ANY ATTENTION TO PAY 6 PREVAILING WAGES. SO, OF THE 12,000 APARTMENTS THAT WERE 7 8 FUNDED BETWEEN '21 AND 2023 IN THE BAY AREA, ABOUT 7,000 WERE BUILT BY -- OR IN PROCESS WITH DEVELOPERS USING LOCAL FUNDS 9 AND MOST PAYING PREVAILING WAGES. 5,000 BUILT WITH JUST CREDIT 10 BONDS DEFERRED DEVELOPER FEE AND 80% OF THOSE NOT PAYING 11 PREVAILING WAGES. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SHIFTING NOW TO HOUSING 12 NEEDS, WE ALL KNOW THE CONSEQUENCES OF THE REGION'S LACK OF 13 AFFORDABLE HOUSING. WE SEE IT EVERY DAY. AND IT'S ESPECIALLY 14 15 ALARMING TO KNOW THAT HOMELESSNESS CONTINUES TO RISE IN MOST 16 COUNTIES. THE NEED TO BUILD AT SCALE AND BETTER MEET OUR REGION'S AFFORDABLE HOUSING NEEDS IS IN STARK RELIEF ON THESE 17 SLIDES SHOWING OUR ACHIEVEMENT OF THE FIFTH RHNA CYCLE, 18 ESPECIALLY WHEN YOU COMPARE IT TO THE SIXTH RHNA CYCLE TARGET. 19 BETWEEN 2015 AND 2023 PRODUCTION OF MARKET RATE HOUSING WAS 20 21 TWICE THAT WHICH IT EXCEEDED THE TARGET BY 100%. AND AFFORDABLE HOUSING LAGGED SIGNIFICANTLY BELOW THE TARGETS. THE 22 HIGH COST OF HOUSING AND THE LACK OF SUFFICIENT RESOURCES TO 23 BUILD AFFORDABLE HOUSING ARE MAJOR FACTORS IN THIS FAILURE TO 24 REACH THE TARGETS THAT WE SEE IN THE FIFTH CYCLE. NEXT SLIDE 25

PLEASE. MEETING OUR SIXTH CYCLE RHNA TARGETS WILL PROVE MORE 1 2 CHALLENGING AT EVERY SINGLE LEVEL. THE 441,000 HOMES NEEDED 3 FOR THE BAY AREA IS 235% OF WHAT THE FIFTH CYCLE TARGET WAS. AND THE HIGH-LEVEL OF AFFORDABLE HOMES NEEDED IS ESPECIALLY 4 5 DAUNTING. TO MEET THESE NEW GOALS AND TO FULFILL ITS MISSION, BAHFA, THE CITIES, THE COUNTIES, THE ENTIRE HOUSING INDUSTRY 6 HAS TO BUILD SIGNIFICANTLY MORE UNITS AND TO DO THAT WE HAVE 7 8 TO CHANGE THE WAY THAT WE'RE DOING THINGS NOW. NEXT SLIDE. AS I STATED, ONE ISSUE THAT MAKES OUR GOALS ESPECIALLY DIFFICULT 9 IS THE HIGH COST TO BUILD IN THE BAY AREA. THE DEVELOPMENT 10 COST YOU SEE COME, AGAIN, FROM THE PROJECTS THAT WE ANALYZED 11 BETWEEN 2021 AND 2023 THAT GOT SIDLAC AWARDS. WE KNOW THAT 12 LOCALLY FINISHED PROJECTS COST SIGNIFICANTLY MORE THAN 13 PROJECTS THAT DO NOT USE LOCAL FUNDS AND USUALLY DON'T PAY 14 PREVAILING WAGES. THE COST OF THOSE PROJECTS FUNDED BETWEEN 15 16 2021 AND '23, IN THE SECOND COLUMN, THOSE THAT DID NOT TAKE LOCAL FUNDS IS IN THE THIRD COLUMN, AND THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN 17 THOSE DEVELOPMENT TYPES IN EACH COUNTY IS SHOWN IN THE LAST 18 COLUMN. THESE COST DIFFERENCES TELL US THAT MUCH MORE IS GOING 19 ON BEYOND JUST THE PAYMENT OF PREVAILING WAGES. THIS 20 21 INFORMATION GIVES US AN OPPORTUNITY TO WORK TOGETHER TO UNDERSTAND EXACTLY WHAT IS GOING ON, WHAT ARE NON-ESSENTIAL 22 REGULATORY REOUIREMENTS THAT WE COULD REDUCE, HOW COULD WE 23 WORK TOGETHER TO BETTER EXPEDITE FINANCING AT THE LOCAL LEVEL 24 25 TO FINANCE MORE EFFICIENTLY OUR PROJECTS, TO MOVE FASTER,

THAT'S THE BEST WAY TO SAVE MONEY ON AFFORDABLE HOUSING 1 2 DEVELOPMENT, TO PRIORITIZE PROJECTS THAT CAN USE STREAMLINING 3 LEGISLATION SO THAT THEY DON'T WAIT YEARS FOR ENTITLEMENT, AND FACE THOSE YEARS OF COST ESCALATIONS WHICH BRING US INTO THAT 4 5 \$900,000 RANGE. AND WE CAN PRIORITIZE REFOCUSING ON OUR DESIGN STANDARDS WITH THE GOAL OF BUILDING SAFE, DECENT, AND COST 6 EFFECTIVE HOUSING. ALL OF THIS TAKES MORE RESEARCH BUT WE KNOW 7 8 THAT THERE IS SIGNIFICANT OPPORTUNITY IN THIS DATA TO WORK TOGETHER TO HELP BRING COST DOWN SO THAT WE CAN USE OUR 9 PRECIOUS RESOURCES TO BUILD MORE. NEXT SLIDE. THE COST TRENDS 10 ARE WORSENING, BUT WITH A SUCCESSFUL BOND WE'RE GOING TO HAVE 11 THE RESOURCES WE NEED TO START IMPLEMENTING THIS BETTER 12 FINANCING SYSTEM AND THESE DEVELOPMENT STRATEGIES THAT CAN 13 HELP US REVERSE THIS TREND. NEXT SLIDE. SO, TO SUMMARIZE, WE 14 15 KNOW THAT A SIGNIFICANT PORTION OF TAX CREDIT FUNDED HOUSING 16 BUILT NOW APPLYING ZERO LABOR STANDARDS AND IN THIS SETTING WORKERS CAN BE VULNERABLE. BUT WE ALSO KNOW THAT ESTABLISHING 17 RIGID AND RESTRICTIVE STANDARDS ALONG WITH OTHER REGULATORY 18 BURDENS CAN DRIVE COSTS UP AND THAT WILL MAKE IT VERY 19 DIFFICULT TO REACH OUR GOALS. WE HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY, WITH 20 OUR REGIONAL HOUSING BOND, TO EXPAND WORKER PROTECTIONS, 21 CREATE MORE JOBS, AND BUILD THE HOUSING THAT WE NEED. SO, 22 CREATING A BALANCED AND INCLUSIVE LABOR STANDARD THAT CAN WORK 23 IN EVERY COUNTY IS CRITICAL TO ACHIEVING OUR VISION AND 24 CREATING THE SYSTEMS CHANGE THAT WILL BE NECESSARY TO MEET 25

THESE RHNA TARGETS AND OUR OVERALL HOUSING GOALS. NEXT SLIDE. 1 NEXT STEP TIMELINE WE'RE GOING TO CONTINUE THE DISCUSSIONS 2 3 WITH LABOR REPRESENTATIVES AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS WE WILL BE HAVING AN INFORMATIONAL MEETING IN MARCH FOR THE ABAG 4 5 EXECUTIVE BOARD. WE HOPE THAT ALL THE BOARD MEMBERS CAN MAKE IT. IN APRIL WE'LL BE RETURNING TO YOU ON APRIL 10TH WITH 6 WRITTEN RECOMMENDATIONS ON LABOR STANDARDS AND AT THE END OF 7 8 THE MONTH IN APRIL, THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD WILL HAVE BEFORE IT SOME REALLY CRITICAL DECISIONS MOVING FORWARD OUR BUSINESS 9 10 PLAN, OUR EXPENDITURE PLAN WITH LABOR STANDARDS AND THE INITIATING RESOLUTION FOR THE BOND MEASURE. THEN WE HAVE A 11 REQUIRED INFORMATIONAL MEETING AT THE BAHFA BOARD IN MAY, WITH 12 THE FINAL VOTE ON THE BOND MEASURE. ADVANCING IT TO THE 13 NOVEMBER BALLOT IN JUNE. AND THAT CONCLUDES MY PRESENTATION, 14 AND WE LOOK FORWARD TO THE DISCUSSION. THANK YOU. 15

MY NAME IS ANNE BRADLEY. I AM VICE PRESIDENT ON THE COUNCIL OF ELDERS AT ST. MARY'S CENTER I'M 22 ALSO ON THE STEERING COMMITTEE FOR THE RESIDENTS UNITED 23 NETWORK. WE WORK TO GET LEGISLATION PASSED STATEWIDE TO HELP 24 25 THE HOMELESS INCLUDING NEW HOUSING CONSTRUCTION. HOUSING IS A

HUMAN RIGHT. AND I THINK WE NEED TO KEEP THE HOMELESS AT THE 1 CENTER OF THIS BILL. I LIVE IN AFFORDABLE HOUSING. THANKFULLY 2 3 I LIVE IN A PROJECT BASED VOUCHER BUILDING, SO I PAY 30% OF MY INCOME, NOT 30% OF AMI. THE AMI IN OAKLAND IS \$158,000. THAT'S 4 5 A LOT OF MONEY. WHAT WE'RE ASKING YOU TO DO TODAY IS, INSTEAD OF GIVING MONEY TO THE ZERO TO 50% GROUP OF AMI, WE WANT YOU 6 TO DROP THAT TO 22% OF AMI, WHICH AMOUNTS TO ABOUT \$35,000 A 7 8 YEAR. PEOPLE WHO MAKE 50% OF AMI CAN AFFORD A ONE BEDROOM APARTMENT. THEY CAN ALSO AFFORD FOOD TO PUT ON THE TABLE. SO, 9 10 PLEASE HELP THE ACUTELY LOW-INCOME. THAT'S WHO IS AT THE HEART OF THE MATTER HERE, AND HOMELESSNESS. 11

LET'S GET THIS DONE AND GET 24 THE MEASURE ON THE BALLOT THIS NOVEMBER. THANK YOU. 25

ONE QUESTION RELATED TO MAYBE A SERIES OF TEN E-MAILS 13 WE RECEIVED ABOUT ALL ELECTRIC STANDARDS. GIVEN, I WANT TO 14 15 UNDERSTAND WHAT, IF ANY, ABILITY WE HAVE TO PUT IN ELECTRIC 16 STANDARDS? I DON'T KNOW IF WE CAN DO ALL ELECTRIC BASED ON THE BERKELEY LAWSUIT, BUT, CERTAINLY (LAUGHTER) -- BUT, CERTAINLY, 17 I THINK IT'S PROBABLY POSSIBLE TO DO SOME, SORT OF, ELECTRIC 18 STANDARDS THAT MAYBE TALK ABOUT, IN NEW BUILDINGS, YOU KNOW, 19 RECHARGE -- ELECTRIC CAR CHARGING, OR AT LEAST BUILDINGS THAT 20 ARE READY TO RECEIVE THAT, I MEAN, THOSE UPGRADES, SO, YOU CAN 21 TELL ME WHERE THAT MIGHT GO? BECAUSE I DO -- I WANT TO BE 22 SOMEWHAT RESPONSIVE TO THAT SET OF INTEREST. 23

KATE HARTLEY: THROUGH THE CHAIR. YES. I WANT TO THANK ALL THE 1 PEOPLE WHO SUBMITTED THE LETTERS ON THE ALL-ELECTRIC STANDARD. 2 3 THIS WOULD BE SOMETHING THAT, AS OPPOSED TO LEGISLATION WE COULD PUT INTO OUR FUNDING GUIDELINES FOR CONSTRUCTION 4 5 PROJECTS WE'LL BE CREATING FUNDING GUIDELINES GENERALLY WILL BE TAKING THEM FOR YOUR APPROVAL THIS IS HIGH ON THE LIST OF 6 PRIORITIES IT MAKES TOTAL SENSE FOR NEW CONSTRUCTION. THE 7 8 REQUESTS FOR ALL ELECTRIC HAVE BEEN FOR REHABS OF EXISTING BUILDINGS, AS WELL, THAT'S A LITTLE MORE COMPLICATED. WE 9 10 INTEND TO MAKE, RECOMMEND THOSE STANDARDS FOR PRESERVATION PROJECTS ALSO. AND WE ARE REALLY FORTUNATE TO HAVE A GREAT 11 PARTNER IN THE ENERGY SECTION OF MTC WORKING, ALREADY, ON THE 12 ELECTRIFICATION OF EXISTING BUILDINGS. SO, THAT PIECE ISN'T 13 QUITE AS STRAIGHT FORWARD, BECAUSE YOU'RE WORKING WITH PEOPLE 14 LIVING IN THEIR HOMES. BUT THE NEW CONSTRUCTION IS PRETTY 15 16 STRAIGHT FORWARD. SO, WE WILL BE BACK WITH FUNDING GUIDELINES. 17

GINA PAPAN: GREAT. TRULY APPRECIATE THE WORK OF STAFF, LOOKING 15 16 AT A HOLISTIC APPROACH AND I THINK WE HAVE THE RIGHT PEOPLE AT THE ABLE TO GET TO THE RIGHT POSITION THAT WE ALL FEEL 17 STRONGLY ABOUT. I WANT US TO BE CAREFUL OF THE NARRATIVE WHEN 18 WE DO BRING LABOR STANDARDS INTO, ACTUALLY THE EXPENDITURE 19 REPORTS, REDUCED COSTS BECAUSE WE REDUCE RISK AS ONE SPEAKER 20 21 SAID 4% SAVINGS THE STUDIES HAVE SHOWN WE DO HAVE LABOR STANDARDS SO THE DISCUSSION WE REALLY NEED TO MAKE SURE OUR 22 NARRATIVE IS CLEAR ON THAT, FOR EVERYBODY WHO IS HERE THAT'S 23 GREAT AND WONDERFUL WE WANT THIS TO HAPPEN BUT THERE'S PART 24 TWO HERE WE HAVE TO MAKE SURE THE VOTER STANDARDS THRESHOLD 25

WHAT'S THE BILL? ACA ONE ALSO PASSES TO LOWER THE VOTING 1 APPROVAL TO 55% PLUS ONE, I GUESS, SO IT'S KIND OF A TWO PART 2 3 WE GOT YOUR SUPPORT HERE WE REALLY NEED IT OVER THERE TOO WE ARE REALLY HEADED IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION ONCE AGAIN THANK YOU 4 5 FOR YOUR EFFORTS IN SACRAMENTO WE HAVE A LOT OF PEOPLE LOOKING AT THIS WANT WANTING TO HAPPEN THEN LOCAL CONTROL WE'RE GOING 6 TO DEBRIEF WHAT WE CAME BACK WITH HERE AND WE'RE JUST TRYING 7 8 TO MAKE EVERYTHING BETTER SO WE CAN GET THROUGH. 21 SPEAKER: AND IF I MAY, THROUGH THE CHAIR, YOU MAY WANT TO 22 CLARIFY THE LIKELIHOOD OF THAT BEING RESOLVED PRIOR TO APRIL 23 18TH WHEN THE MEASURE HAS TO BE APPROVED. WHICH IS UNLIKELY. 24

25 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: THAT'S CORRECT.

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1 2 KATHLEEN KANE: IF I COULD JUST OFFER, THROUGH THE CHAIR, 3 QUICKLY. THE IDEA IS TO HAVE THE BALLOT MEASURE, ITSELF, BE CLEAN AND ALLOW FOR LATER CHANGES IN STATE LAW SHOULD THEY 4 5 HAPPEN. I DON'T KNOW IF MISS LONG WANTS 13 TO ADD ANYTHING TO ADD? 14 15 REBECCA LONG: REBECCA LONG, DIRECTOR OF LEGISLATION AND PUBLIC 16 AFFAIRS. I THINK THE ONLY THING I WOULD ADD IS ASSUMING THAT 17 THIS BODY, BAHFA AND ABAG ARE COMFORTABLE WITH LABOR STANDARDS 18 THAT ARE AGREED UPON FOR THE 20%, WE DON'T ANTICIPATE THAT 19 THERE IS A TIMING CHALLENGE TO GETTING LEGISLATION THROUGH THE 20 21 PROCESS IN ORDER FOR IT TO APPLY TO THE 80%. SO, THERE IS, YOU KNOW, ACTIVE INTEREST IN SACRAMENTO IN DOING THAT, AND, AGAIN, 22 AS OUR GENERAL COUNSEL INDICATED, WE DON'T NEED THAT PIECE OF 23 IT. WE DON'T NEED THE LEGISLATION TO BE WRAPPED UP BEFORE THE 24 BODIES TAKE ACTION TO PUT THE MEASURE ON THE BALLOT FOR US TO 25

HAVE THE ABILITY TO IMPOSE THE STANDARDS ON THE 80%. AS LONG
 AS THE LEGISLATION TAKES EFFECT BEFORE THE FIRST BOND
 ISSUANCE, WHICH ON THE NATURAL ANY BILL PASSES THIS YEAR,
 WOULD TAKE EFFECT JANUARY 1ST, 2025.

6 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: ALL RIGHT. THANK YOU.
7 COMMISSIONER MILEY, IS THAT YOUR LIGHT?

8

NATHAN MILEY: YES. THANK YOU. YES, I JUST KIND OF WANT TO 9 10 WEIGH IN, THAT I'M VERY IMPRESSED WHAT I'M HEARING THROUGH WITH THIS CONVERSATION. I JUST WANT 20 TO ACKNOWLEDGE EVERYONE'S WORK ON THIS. AND WHATEVER I CAN DO 21 AS A COUNTY SUPERVISOR, IN MY LITTLE COUNTY OF ALAMEDA, 22 PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD, JUST KEEP ME INFORMED. THANK YOU. 23 24

 ROLE FOR ALL OF US. (LAUGHTER) ALL RIGHT. I'LL KEEP LOOKING.

JESSE ARREGUIN: I WANT TO EXPRESS MY APPRECIATION TO STAFF FOR 4 5 MEETING WITH LABOR STAKEHOLDERS AND WANT TO ENCOURAGE CONTINUED CONVERSATIONS AND I'M GLAD THAT IT SEEMS LIKES WE 6 ARE MAKING SOME PROGRESS ON AGREEMENT ON LABOR STANDARDS I 7 8 WANT TO EMPHASIZE HOW IMPORTANT IT IS THAT WE HAVE STRONG LABOR STANDARDS, FOR MANY OF THE REASONS STATED TODAY WE NEED 9 10 TO MAKE SURE WE INVEST PUBLIC DOLLARS TO ACHIEVE THE KINDS OF OUTCOMES THAT WE WANT THIS IN OUR REGION THAT INCLUDES MAKING 11 SURE WE ARE BUILDING A SKILLED AND TRAINED WORKFORCE THAT'S 12 GOING TO BE CRITICAL TO ENSURE THAT WE CAN BUILD HOUSING MUCH 13 FASTER AND MORE AFFORDABLE LONG-TERM PROVIDING GOOD MIDDLE 14 CLASS JOBS FOR PEOPLE IN OUR COMMUNITIES SO WE DON'T HAVE 15 16 THOSE OPPORTUNITIES INCLUDING KIDS IN OUR SCHOOLS WE TALK ABOUT PUBLIC SAFETY KEY TO ADDRESSING PUBLIC SAFETY IN OUR 17 REGION IS LIFTING UP ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY FOR PEOPLE IN OUR 18 REGION AND LASTLY TO ADDRESS HAVING A PATH TO HIGH ROAD JOBS, 19 BUILDING HOUSING IN OUR COMMUNITIES, EXPLOITED WAGE THEFTS IN 20 21 THE WORKPLACE AND SAFETY VIOLATIONS PEOPLE WHO DON'T HAVE AFFORDABLE ACCESSIBLE HOUSING IN THE COMMUNITIES THAT THEY'RE 22 WORKING IN WHO WERE LIVING IN THEIR CARS. AARON TIEDEMANN: LIKE EVERYONE WHO HAS SAID WITH THE WINDOW OF 18 WHAT'S POSSIBLE RIGHT NOW PUTTING SOME LABOR STANDARDS ON OUR 19 20% MAKES SENSE. I THINK WE HAVE BROAD SUPPORT IF WE HAVE 20 LEGISLATIVE FIX FOR PUTTING ON THE REST OF THE MONEY THAT 21 MAKES SENSE WHAT WE HAVE ENDED UP FROM BROAD OPTIONS WE HAVE 22 BEEN PRESENTED WITH TODAY IT'S GOING TO UPLIFT AND PUT A NEW 23 MINIMUM STANDARD THAT IS INCREDIBLY IMPORTANT EVEN IF IT'S 24 JUST ON OUR MONEY, IT'S THE MOST AGGRESSIVE BENEFIT FOR HUGE 25

AMOUNT OF LABORS ACROSS THE BAY AREA. HAVING THIS CONVERSATION 1 FOCUS ON TWO OF THE PARTS THAT STAFF INCLUDED IN THE 2 PRESENTATION FOR OUR LEVEL SETTING, THERE ARE TWO THINGS THAT 3 I DON'T THINK SHOULD COME AS A SURPRISE FOR US THAT I THINK WE 4 5 SHOULD BE THINKING ABOUT IN THIS CONVERSATION AND ALL CONVERSATIONS GOING FORWARD, THE TABLE TWO OF THE RHNA CYCLE 6 FIVE PERFORMANCE, WHICH SHOWS THAT WE'RE ALL BUILDING A LOT OF 7 8 HOUSING, BUT WE'RE NOT BUILDING THE RIGHT BALANCE OF HOUSING. AND I HAVE LOOKED AT THIS CHART IN A LOT OF DIFFERENT WAYS, 9 10 AND SEEN IT, AND IT SHOWS THAT WE JUST NEED A HUGE AMOUNT MORE INVESTMENT BECAUSE WE'RE NOT BUILDING THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING 11 THAT WE SO DISPARATELY NEED. WE ARE MAKING IT POSSIBLE TO 12 BUILD THE MARKET RATE AND THAT IS AN IMBALANCE THAT WE CAN'T 13 HAVE CONTINUING ADDRESSING THE HOUSING CRISIS. THE OTHER ONE I 14 15 WANT TO DRAW ATTENTION TO IS TABLE FOUR IN COMPARISON 16 DEVELOPMENT COST FOR PROJECTS THAT TAKE LOCAL FUNDS AND PROJECTS THAT DON'T. AGAIN, I DON'T THINK THIS ANALYSIS WILL 17 COME AS A SURPRISE TO ANY OF THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPERS 18 WHO ARE DOING THIS WORK, ANYONE ON THE GROUND, ANYONE WHO IS 19 DOING THOSE APPROVALS, AND I THINK IT REQUIRES BOND FOR OUR 20 21 OWN POLICIES ON THE CITIES AND COUNTY AND LOCAL LEVEL OF WHAT OUR POLICIES ARE THERE MAY BE IMPORTANT REASONS WHY THERE IS A 22 MORE EXPENSIVE COST PER UNIT FOR PROJECTS THAT TAKE LOCAL 23 FUNDS. BUT I'M NOT SURE FOR MY COUNTY OF ALAMEDA IF THERE ARE 24 ABOUT 400,000 OF THOSE REASONS, IF THAT'S HOW MUCH MORE 25

EXPENSIVE IT SHOULD BE. SO, WE NEED TO BE THINKING ABOUT WAYS 1 2 THAT WE CAN MAKE THAT CHEAPER AND MAKE THESE FUNDS GO AS FAR AS THEY CAN, AS WELL AS JUST MAKE ANY FUNDS WE INVEST IN 3 AFFORDABLE HOUSING GO FARTHER IN OUR OWN COMMUNITIES AND THERE 4 5 IS WORK WE CAN ALL DO THERE BOTH ON THIS BOND AND IN OUR OWN POLICIES. THANK YOU. 6 7 8 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: ALL RIGHT. I DON'T --9 SPEAKER: THANKS SO MUCH FOR THE WORK THAT STAFF HAS DONE AND 10 THAT EVERYONE HAS BEEN DOING IN TERMS OF THE NEGOTIATION. THIS 11 PRESENTATION WAS VERY HELPFUL. IN OAKLAND, WE HAD THE 12 OPPORTUNITY TO BUILD A REALLY STRONG COALITION AMONG 13 AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPERS, LABOR PARTNERS AND OTHERS 14 THROUGH MEASURE U WHICH WE PASSED IN 2022. SO THAT'S 350 15 16 MILLION IN AFFORDABLE HOUSING. AND WE ARE ALSO LOOKING TO THIS PROCESS TO INFORM HOW WE POTENTIALLY MOVE FORWARD ON LABOR 17 STANDARDS. SO, FIRST I WANT TO APPRECIATE ALL THE WORK THAT 18 EVERYONE HAS DONE, UNDERSCORE THE NEED TO BUILD A REALLY BROAD 19 COALITION IN ORDER TO PASS THIS TRANSFORMATIONAL BOND MEASURE. 20 21 AND WANTED TO, YOU KNOW, I AGREE WITH A LOT OF WHAT HAS ALREADY BEEN SAID, AND ALSO WANT TO UNDERSCORE THE POINT OF 22 MAKING SURE THAT WE HAVE GOOD DATA AS WE CONTINUE THE 23 NEGOTIATIONS AND LOOK AT WHAT WE CAN DO. YOU KNOW, THERE IS A 24 LOT OF INFORMATION THAT ALREADY EXISTS. I BELIEVE THE UC 25

BERKELEY LABOR CENTER IS ALSO PUTTING TOGETHER SOME RESEARCH 1 AND IN TERMS OF THE COST OF CONSTRUCTION, THE COST OF LABOR 2 3 STANDARDS, I REALLY WANT TO MAKE SURE WE'RE LOOKING AT GOOD DATA SO THAT THE WORK THAT WE'RE DOING AND THE PROPOSAL THAT 4 5 COMES TO US IS WELL INFORMED. AND THAT ALSO GOES ACROSS THE BOARD. WE HAD DISCUSSION AT OUR LAST MEETING ABOUT THE EQUITY 6 FRAMEWORK WITHIN BAHFA, WHICH I REALLY COMMEND, AND THAT'S 7 8 ANOTHER EXAMPLE OF AS WE DO OUR INFORMATIONAL MEETINGS AND WE'LL BE DOING SOME OF THOSE IN OAKLAND AND ALAMEDA COUNTY, 9 THAT WE'RE ALSO LOOKING AT THE DATA AND WHAT'S NEEDED IN TERMS 10 OF THE TYPE OF HOUSING WE NEED TO BUILD, WE NEED TO ENSURE WHO 11 HAS ACCESS TO THAT HOUSING. SO, EOUITY, I BELIEVE, WHETHER 12 IT'S ECONOMIC, OR RACIAL EQUITY, OR EVEN LOOKING AT EQUITY IN 13 TERMS OF PROVIDING JOBS THROUGH THIS MEASURE, REALLY DOES NEED 14 15 TO BE GROUNDED IN DATA, AS WELL AS THE CONVERSATIONS THAT I 16 KNOW THAT STAFF WILL BE HAVING. AND IF THERE IS ANY WAY THAT 17 MYSELF OR OTHERS IN OAKLAND CAN HELP SUPPORT THE PROCESS BETWEEN NOW AND APRIL 7TH IS WHEN PERHAPS THE PROPOSAL WILL BE 18 PUBLISHED. PLEASE CALL ON US. THANK YOU. 19

LISA MOTOYAMA: THANK YOU STAFF, AND THE PUBLIC, FOR ALL THIS WORK. AND I WOULD JUST LIKE TO ECHO WHAT CHAIR ROMERO SAID, THE TENOR OF THIS MEETING IS VERY DIFFERENT. I DO HAVE A QUESTION ABOUT THE TABLE FOUR ABOUT THE COST. AND I JUST WANTED TO UNDERSTAND WHY THE CHOICE OF METRIC WAS THE USE OF

LOCAL FUNDS. SO, I THINK THAT THERE ARE MANY, MANY REASONS WHY
PROJECTS ARE EXPENSIVE, BUT IT SEEMS CALLING OUT THE USE OF
LOCAL FUNDS SEEMS LIKE KIND OF AN INTERESTING CHOICE AS
OPPOSED TO HIGHER SERVICES OR HIGHER COST OF LAND, OR LOTS OF
OTHER CHOICES THAT YOU COULD HAVE MADE. AND JUST KIND OF -WHAT POINT ARE YOU DRIVING THIS TOWARDS WITH THAT?

8 KATE HARTLEY: THROUGH THE CHAIR, WE WERE LOOKING AT THE DATA IN A, SORT OF, AGNOSTIC WAY AND WE KEPT SEEING THOSE 9 10 DEVELOPMENTS COME IN THAT WERE SIGNIFICANTLY LOWER. AND SO WE DUG INTO THEM AND WE REALIZED THERE IS THIS MODEL AVAILABLE --11 THAT IS IN USE, YOU KNOW, OF 12,000 UNITS, 5,000 HAVE BEEN 12 PRODUCED IN THIS WAY BETWEEN 2021 AND 2023, WHERE DEVELOPERS 13 ONLY USE CREDITS, BONDS, AND DEFERRED DEVELOPER FEE, PROJECT 14 15 AFTER PROJECT, THAT WAS THE CAPITAL STACK, AND THEN WE DUG 16 DEEPER AND WE REALIZED THAT HIGHER COST DEVELOPMENTS ALL HAD LOCAL FUNDS. NOW, THAT IS NO INDICTMENT OF THOSE PROJECTS, AT 17 ALL. MANY OF THOSE PROJECTS ARE URBAN INFILL, SPECIAL NEEDS, 18 100% HOMELESS. WE KNOW THAT CERTAIN DEVELOPMENTS HAVE HIGHER 19 COST. BUT WE ALSO KNOW THAT THERE'S SOME GRAY AREA THERE 20 21 BETWEEN THAT EXPENSIVE URBAN INFILL EIGHT STORY 100 SPECIAL NEEDS DEVELOPMENT AND THE 60 -- THE DEVELOPMENT THAT IS, YOU 22 KNOW, FIVE STORIES, SURFACE PARKING, \$500,000 A DOOR. LOOKING 23 AT THE DATA, TOGETHER, IT WILL BE SOMETHING THAT WE'RE 24 25 UNDERTAKING AND WE NEED MORE RESEARCH. WE NEED TO DIG DOWN,

AND THERE IS OTHER PEOPLE THROUGHOUT THE INDUSTRY WHO ARE ALSO 1 LOOKING AT THIS, IS ON OUR PLATES. BUT, WE -- THAT WAS THE 2 3 DISTINCTION THAT REALLY JUMPED OUT. IF YOU TOOK LOCAL FUNDS, YOU WERE BRINGING YOUR PROJECTS AT A LOW COST. IT'S IMPORTANT 4 5 BECAUSE, ESPECIALLY FOR HOMELESSNESS, AS WE KNOW THAT IN MANY COUNTIES, FOR EVERY PERSON WHO IS UNHOUSED THAT WE FIND --6 THAT, YOU KNOW, THEY'RE -- THAT WE CAN CREATE PERMANENT 7 8 HOUSING FOR, ONE, OR TWO, OR EVENLY, ARE PUSHED INTO HOMELESSNESS. IT REALLY MAKES START THE DEMAND FOR MORE 9 HOUSING. SO IT IMPLEMENTS SOME OF THE CHANGES THAT WE THINK 10 BAHFA CAN FACILITATE LIKE STREAMLINED FINANCING IF YOU DON'T -11 - THE FEWER SOURCES OF FUNDS THAT YOU HAVE TO PURSUE THE LOWER 12 YOUR COST STRUCTURE IS PRIORITIZING DEVELOPMENT ON PROJECTS 13 THAT HAVE BEEN STREAMLINE ENTITLEMENTS WE KNOW THAT WE CAN --14 JUST IN THE NEWS TODAY WAS A PROJECT THAT EDEN HOUSING IS 15 16 DOING IN LIVERMORE THAT HAS BEEN IN LITIGATION FOR YEARS AND YEARS. THOSE PROJECT COSTS GO UP MORE RATIONAL STATE FUNDING 17 SYSTEM. IF YOU HAVE TO GO YEAR AFTER YEAR IN APPLICATIONS AT 18 THE STATE, THAT'S GOING TO COST -- THAT'S GOING TO CREATE COST 19 ESCALATION. SO, ALL OF THOSE THINGS NEED TO COME INTO PLAY. 20 21 THE POINT BEING WE CAN HAVE RESOURCES TO DO MANY OF THOSE THINGS WITH THIS BOND AND BRING COSTS DOWN TO SOME EXTENT. YOU 22 KNOW, UNDERSTANDING EXACTLY WHAT THE ISSUES ARE AND BUILD MORE 23 HOUSING BECAUSE WE KNOW WE NEED THAT. 24

I'LL BACK TO 9 THE BOARD. THIS WAS AN INFORMATIONAL ITEM ONLY. I DON'T HAVE 10 ANY OTHER PARTING WORDS. I DO APPRECIATE CHAIR ROMERO FOR 11 CHAIRING THE LAST MEETING. IT WAS A BIT MORE CONTENTIOUS. 12 THAT'S JUST THE DRAW SOMETIMES. (LAUGHTER) ON THAT NOTE. THANK 13 YOU TO THE STAFF AND THE PUBLIC FOR YOUR ENGAGEMENT. WE'RE ALL 14 TRYING TO SHAPE SOMETHING HERE THAT IS GENERATIONAL FOR ALL OF 15 16 US. AT THIS POINT, PROCEEDING TO ITEM 8.
