ALSO WITH US THIS EVENING IS BUFFY WICKS, REPRESENTING 14 OF EAST BAY HOUSING COMMITTEE CHAIR. I AM 4 GOING TO INVITE YOU UP, DAVID, TO SHARE THE GOOD, BAD, THE 5 UGLY WITH US. BUT, REALLY, THE EXCITING JOURNEY THAT WE'RE ALL 6 7 ON TOGETHER AND ANYTHING YOU WOULD LIKE TO SHARE WITH US. 8 DAVID CHIU: THANK YOU, MADAM PRESIDENT. MEMBERS, LET ME START 9 BY SAYING THERE IS NO BAD OR UGLY; THERE IS JUST GOOD. IT'S A 10 DELIGHT TO BE HERE WITH THE WOMAN WHO SUCCEEDED ME AS CHAIR OF 11 THE ASSEMBLY HOUSING COMMITTEE, NOW THE CHAIR OF THE 12 APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE, MY DEAR FRIEND BUFFY WICKS. 4	REGIONAL HOUSING ROLE GAINED SUPPORT. MANY OF YOU ARE FAMILIAR
5	WITH THE CASA COMPACT FROM THAT TIME WITH THE FOCUS ON THREE
6	P'S, PRODUCTION PRESERVATION AND PROTECTION WHICH WAS THE
7	CATALYST OF MY AUTHORSHIP. A.B. 1487 THE BAY AREA AFFORDABLE
8	HOUSING ACT. WHOSE BILL CONCEPT CAME FROM THAT WORK. THE CASA
9	UNDERSTANDING PUT OUT A NUMBER OF SPECIFIC PROPOSALS A.B. 1487
10	CAME FROM THAT. I WANT TO THANK ABAG FOR YOUR DEEP ENGAGEMENT
11	WITH ME AND MY COLLEAGUES DURING THE LEGISLATIVE PROCESS TO
12	ESTABLISH BAHFA IN 2019 AND CERTAINLY YOUR FORMER PRESIDENT
13	AND VICE PRESIDENT WAS INVOLVED IN THAT AS WERE MANY OF YOU
14	SITTING HERE TODAY. AS YOU KNOW YOUR INDIVIDUAL AND COLLECTIVE
15	PERSPECTIVES ALONG WITH ABAG'S PRIORITIES WERE EMBEDDED IN OUR
16	LAW INCLUDING ENSURING LOCAL GOVERNMENTS HAVE A STRONG VOICE
17	IN HOW FUNDS ARE USED WITH 80% OF FUNDS TO RETURN TO LOCAL
18	SOURCE AND I APPRECIATE YOUR STRONG VOTE OF SUPPORT FOR THE
19	BILL BEFORE ITS PASSAGE. NOW SINCE 2019 SO MANY FOLKS HAVE
20	WORKED DILIGENTLY TO ESTABLISH AND BUILD UP BAHFA. AND I WANT
21	TO THANK AND APPLAUD THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD AND MTC
22	COMMISSIONERS AND BAHFA LEADERSHIP HERE TODAY FOR GETTING US
23	TO THIS POINT. SO HERE WE ARE, A MONTH AWAY FROM POTENTIALLY
24	TAKING HISTORIC ACTION TO ADVANCE FOR FURTHER CONSIDERATION BY

1	AFFORDABLE HOUSING ACROSS OUR NINE BAY AREA COUNTIES. NOW,
2	THIS BOND WOULD BRING MANY GREAT THINGS. IT WOULD PROVIDE AN
3	UNPRECEDENTED LEVEL OF HOUSING RESOURCES TO EVERY COUNTY IN
4	THE BAY. IT WOULD PROVIDE HOUSING AT ALL LEVELS, FROM HOMES

13	BY MOVING FROM CONCEPT TO REALITY THE TENS OF THOUSANDS OF
14	HOMES IN THE PIPELINE THAT ARE AWAITING AND BEGGING FOR
15	FUNDING. NOW, AS SOMEONE WHO CAME FROM LOCAL GOVERNMENT WHO
16	SERVES AT PRESIDENT OF MY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHO THEN WENT
17	TO THE STATE LEGISLATURE AND IS NOW BACK AS A LOCAL ELECTED I
18	KNOW HOW EASY IT IS FOR ANY OF US IN OUR BAY AREA OF NINE

IN TERMS 4 5 OF HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION, THERE ARE SO MANY KNOWN EFFECTIVE WAYS TO PREVENT HOMELESSNESS WITH RESPECT TO FUNDING. SANTA 6 CLARA COUNTY HAS A HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION PROGRAM IT'S A 7 8 SUBSIDY THAT PROVIDES HOUSEHOLDS AT RISK IT'S BEEN SUCCESSFUL, WELL PUBLICIZED RENTAL ASSISTANCE EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE 9 PROGRAM AFTER PROGRAM THAT HAS THOSE KIND OF FUNDS IN WHATEVER 10 LENGTHS OF TIME --11 12 SUSAN ELLENBERG: THOUGH ARE GENERALLY ONE TIME FUNDS OR ONE 13 TIME DOLLARS. I'M INTERESTED IF BONDS WILL ALLOW FOR 14 15 EXPENDITURES FOR HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION. 16 KATE HARTLEY: I'M GETTING TO THAT, BECAUSE WE KNOW THAT THOSE 17 ACTIVITIES ARE VERY SUCCESSFUL, BUT YOU ALSO KNOW, WE'RE ALSO 18 ALL KNOW THAT THE CALIFORNIA CONSTITUTION DOES NOT ALLOW THE 19 USE OF GO BONDS FOR RENTAL ASSISTANCE OR SERVICES DOLLARS.
