- 4 HAVE MISSED THE ANNOUNCEMENT EARLIER THIS MONTH FORMER MTC
- 5 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ANNE FLEMING DIED IN HER HOME IN THE EAST
- 6 BAY. I'M SURE SOME OF THE COMMISSIONERS WILL HOLD MEMORIES OF
- 7 ANNE AND HER REMARKABLE CAREER, HER IMPACT ON THIS
- 8 ORGANIZATION. WHEN YOU SEE THE IMPACT OF SOMEONE, AND YOU GET
- 9 CALLS FROM CURRENT STAFF, IT DOESN'T SERVE JUSTICE. I HAD THE
- 10 CHANCE TO WORK WITH ANNE AND IT SPOKE SO MUCH ABOUT HER
- 11 IMPACT. ANNE BEGAN HER MTC CAREER AS AN INTERN IN 1982, AND
- 12 JOINED STAFF AS A PLANNER IN 1983. OVER THE NEXT 30 PLUS YEARS
- 13 ANNE ROSE THROUGH A SERIES OF POSITIONS TO BECOME MTC'S FIRST
- 14 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS IN 2001 AND EXECUTIVE
- 15 DIRECTOR OF POLICY IN 2009, MAKING HER THE ONLY PERSON TO HOLD
- 16 EACH OF THOSE LEADERSHIP ROLES. ONE OF HER EARLY LEADERSHIP
- 17 ROLES WAS THE COORDINATION TO THE BAY AREA'S RESPONSE OF THE
- 18 LANDMARK 1990 AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES EFFORT, ADVOCATING
- 19 AND ENSURING COMPLIANCE WITH THE NEW LAW. SHE WAS PART OF
- 20 CLIPPER AND THE 501 TRAVEL INFORMATION CENTER AND LATER DREW
- 21 ON HER BREADTH OF EXPERIENCE THAT LED TO JOINT DEVELOPMENT OF
- 22 MTC AND ABAG OF THE ORIGINAL PLANNED BAY AREA. BUT ANNE WAS A
- 23 LEADER IN THE FIELDS OTHER THAN TRANSPORTATION. SHE CAPTAINED
- 24 THE 2010 EFFORT TO RALLY SUPPORT AND RAISE FUNDS TO PRESERVE
- 25 BASEBALL AS A VARSITY SPORT AT UC BERKELEY, WITH THE FINAL OF



- 1 THE PAC 12 BASEBALL SEASON NOW UNDERWAY AT EVANS DIAMOND, THE
- 2 GOLDEN BEARS PITCHING STAFF IS NOW RECEIVED BY ANNE'S SON,
- 3 MATT. WHAT A GREAT TOUCH. ANNE'S WAS A HOME RUN CAREER, AND I
- 4 ASK THAT YOU ALL TIP THE PROVERBIAL HAT TO ANNE. SADLY, I
- 5 MISSED MENTIONING OF THE PASSING OF FORMER COMMISSIONER IRMA
- 6 ANDERSEN WHO DIED JANUARY 28TH AT THE RIPE AGE OF 93. WHAT A
- 7 GREAT LIFE. FROM 2003 TO 2007, IRMA REPRESENTED CITIES OF
- 8 CONTRA COSTA COUNTY ON THE COMMISSION. SHE WAS VICE CHAIR OF
- 9 PLANNING AND ALLOCATION COMMITTEE AND ALSO SERVED ON
- 10 ADMINISTRATION BATA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEES. IRMA WAS A RICHMOND
- 11 CITY COUNCIL MEMBER FROM 1990 TO 2001 AND MAYOR OF RICHMOND
- 12 FROM 2002 TO 2006. WE'RE GOING TO ADJOURN TODAY'S MEETING IN
- 13 MEMORY OF ANNE AND IRMA. THANK YOU, COMMISSIONERS FOR THAT.
