COMMISSIONER RONEN. 14 15 16 HILLARY RONEN: I'M REQUESTING TO PARTICIPATE REMOTELY UNDER A.B. 2449 BECAUSE OF KNEE RECONSTRUCTION SURGERY THERE IS NO 17 ONE AROUND 18 PRESENT IN THE ROOM. 18 19 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU YOUR REQUEST IS NOTED. 20 21 EARLIER THIS YEAR STAFF PROVIDED UPDATES ON THE PLAN OF 22 FINANCE AND ASSET MANAGEMENT PROMPTED COMMISSIONERS TO REQUEST DEEPER DIVE INTO THE BATA FINANCES. BATA PLAN OF FINANCE HAS 23 LONG PROJECTED A TOLL INCREASE IN 2027. I WOULD LIKE TO ASK 24



THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO GIVE US A SENSE OF WHEN STAFF MIGHT 1 PROVIDE A DEEPER LOOK INTO THE BATA FINANCES. 2 3 ANDREW FREMIER: THANK YOU FOR THAT OUESTION, CHAIR PEDROZA. I 4 5 DON'T USUALLY LIKE TO INVOKE TRAGEDY TO MAKE PINT BUT FOR THOSE WHO FOLLOW THE NEWS THERE WAS A TERRIBLE EVENT IN 6 BALTIMORE THE OTHER DAY BY A SHIP ACCIDENT DOCKING OUT, A VERY 7 8 SIGNIFICANT STRUCTURE IN THAT HARBOR AND AS A REMINDER WE HAVE HAD SEVERAL OPPORTUNITIES TO EXPERIENCE THAT HERE IN THE BAY, 9 COSTCO BUSAN HIT THE BAY BRIDGE A HANDFUL OF YEARS AGO, OTHER 10 SMALLER HITS HAPPEN AND REHAB, MONEY TO WORK TO MAKE SURE THAT 11 THE BRIDGES ARE PROTECTED AND THE FENDERS AND DOLPHINS THAT 12 ARE PROTECTING THE BRIDGES THAT ARE IN GOOD WORKING ORDER THAT 13 DRIVES THE POINT HOME ABOUT HOW IMPORTANT THE BATA BRIDGE 14 15 RESOURCES ARE, THE GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE IS RIGHT THERE WITH 16 THEM. AND I DO APPRECIATE ASKING THE QUESTION AND BRINGING IT FORWARD. AS YOU MENTIONED, DERRICK DID BRING FORWARD THE BATA 17 PLAN OF FINANCE IN JANUARY. WE, ALSO ANTICIPATE USING A GOOD 18 PORTION OF YOUR WORKSHOP TO AGAIN GET INTO THE BATA FINANCE 19 ARENA BECAUSE I THINK IT'S CRITICAL. WE, YOU KNOW, HAVE DONE A 20 GOOD SUMMARY OF THE BROAD FINANCIAL PICTURE, BUT WHAT WE DID 21 IN THAT WORK IS IDENTIFY THAT YOU DO NOT HAVE THE FUNDS TO 22 COVER THE NEEDS THAT WE FORESEE WITH CALTRANS INTO THE FUTURE. 23 THE CURRENT ADOPTED CAPITAL INVESTMENT PLAN SHOWS OVER \$1.8 24

BILLION IN NEED OVER A TEN YEAR PERIOD, AND OUR CURRENT ASSET



- 1 MANAGEMENT WORK THAT WE'RE DOING WITH CALTRANS IDENTIFIES THAT
- 2 WITH THAT LIKELY GO UP. WE HAVE NOTICED THE TRAFFIC SEEMS TO
- 3 HAVE STABILIZED OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF YEARS BUT IT IS STILL
- 4 BELOW WHAT IT WAS BEFORE COVID AND THAT JUST MIGHT BE THE MORE
- 5 NORMAL TRAFFIC PATTERNS THAT WE'LL SEE. TOLL INCREASES ARE
- 6 SOMETHING THAT YOU HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO APPROVE IF IT'S
- 7 ASSOCIATED WITH THE CARE AND FEEDING OF THE BRIDGES SO THIS IS
- 8 AN ITEM THAT WILL DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF BATA AS A
- 9 RESPONSIBILITY. I DO THINK IT'S IMPORTANT TO NOTE, AS YOU
- 10 MENTIONED, THAT THE GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE TOLL INCREASES, YOU
- 11 KNOW, ARE RELATIVELY SIGNIFICANT, BUT THEY'RE DOING THAT FOR
- 12 THE SAME REASONS IN A LOT OF WAYS TO TAKE CARE OF THE ASSET.
- 13 SO, WE DO THINK THAT THIS IS A WORTHY DISCUSSION. WE DO THINK
- 14 IT'S A SERIOUS ACTION THAT YOU WILL HAVE TO UNDERTAKE AND WE
- 15 LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH YOU AT THE END OF APRIL IN THE
- 16 WORKSHOP TO HELP YOU UNDERSTAND IT AND START TO THINK ABOUT
- 17 WHAT THAT FUTURE MIGHT BE.

- 19 CHAIR, CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: ALL RIGHT. THANK YOU CHAIR
- 20 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ON THAT. IT'S GREAT TO PULL UP THAT AD-HOC
- 21 GROUP WE CREATED, I KNOW VICE CHAIR JOSEFOWITZ WAS ON IT AND
- 22 COMMISSIONER -- [INDISCERNIBLE] I BELIEVE. ALSO INTERJECT
- 23 GOING TO NEW YORK AND TALKING TO OUR BANKERS, VERY INTERESTED
- 24 IN THE PLAN OF FINANCE. I THINK NOT USING WHAT HAPPENED AS AN
- 25 OPPORTUNITY IT'S SOMETHING WE HAVE BEEN WANTING TO HAVE THIS



DISCUSSION I APPRECIATE YOU BRINGING THAT UP. ANY OUESTIONS 1 2 FROM COLLEAGUES? COMMISSIONER PAPAN? 3 GINA PAPAN: I THINK WE NEED TO GET THAT MESSAGE OUT THERE 4 5 SOONER RATHER THAN LATER SO WE DON'T HAVE CERTAIN LEGISLATORS THINKING THEY CAN TAG TEAM THE MORE TRANSPARENT WE CAN BE 6 7 WOULD BE HELPFUL. 8 9 CHAIR, CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: ALL RIGHT. 10 DAVID RABBIT: YOU MENTIONED GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE, WE DID RAISE 11 TOLLS 50 CENTS PER YEAR FOR NEXT FIVE YEARS TO ADDRESS THE 12 \$220 MILLION PROJECTED DEFICIT OVER THAT SAME FIVE YEARS 13 HOWEVER THAT RATE INCREASE AS SIGNIFICANT AS IT IS WILL GET US 14 15 HALFWAY THERE WITH THE \$139 MILLION DEFICIT WE HAVE NO OTHER 16 AUTHORITY OTHER THAN TOLLS. GOING FORWARD WE WILL REDUCE TRANSIT GOING FORWARD AND FIND OTHER PEOPLE'S MONEY AS WE ALL 17 LIKE TO FIND THROUGH DIFFERENT TRANSIT OPPORTUNITIES SO I JUST 18 PUT THAT OUT THERE BECAUSE I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT. AND JUST 19 BECAUSE THIS WAS FRESH ON OUR MINDS. WHEN THE BRIDGE WAS 20 21 BUILT, AND THAT COST \$35 MILLION IN TOTAL, ALL THOSE FIVE 22 YEARS AGO. THE TOLL AT THE TIME IN TODAY'S TIME WAS \$11 IT'S ALWAYS BEEN AN EXPENSIVE BRIDGE TO TRAVEL TOLL TODAY IS \$9.25 23 TO 10.25 THEN IT WILL GO UP BY \$0.55 DEPENDING ON THE PAYMENT

- 1 TODAY IT'S PAYING FOR A PORTION OF THE TRANSIT, BUS AND FERRY
- 2 THAT IT DIDN'T PAY IN THE 1930S IT WAS PAYING OFF THE DEBT SO
- 3 THAT'S TAKEN OVER THERE PARTICULAR REVENUE LINE. AND IT'S ALSO
- 4 PAYING, AS I THINK WAS MENTIONED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR,
- 5 THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS THAT ARE DESTINED INCLUDING A VERY
- 6 LARGE MAIN SPAN SEISMIC UPGRADE THE LAST PIECE OF THE SEISMIC
- 7 UPGRADE FOR THE BRIDGE WE TOOK CARE OF VULNERABLE SECTIONS ON
- 8 EACH SIDE. THIS IS AN \$800 MILLION ENDEAVOR THAT WILL INCLUDE
- 9 A SIGNIFICANT PORTION OF BRIDGE TOLL LOCAL MATCH TO PAY THAT'S
- 10 ON TOP OF THE IS YOU SIDE DETERRENT, THE ELECTRONIC TOLLS
- 11 THOSE KIND OF THINGS GOING FORWARD IN THE BRIDGE BUSINESS THE
- 12 WORK NEVER ENDS. I DO APPRECIATE LOOKING INTO IT FURTHER FOR
- 13 THE STATE MTC STATE BRIDGES THAT WE ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR. I
- 14 THINK, UNFORTUNATELY, WHAT HAPPENED IN BALTIMORE, YOU KNOW,
- 15 WITH THE AGING INFRASTRUCTURE THROUGHOUT, YOU KNOW, IS -- WE
- 16 ARE IN A VULNERABLE SITUATION, AND WE NEED AN INFLUX OF FUNDS.
- 17 AND I KNOW THE BIG BRIDGE PROGRAM WAS PART OF THAT BUT NEEDS
- 18 TO CONTINUE TO ADDRESS THOSE. DENIS MULLIGAN SENT OUT AN E-
- 19 MAIL THIS MORNING THAT I THOUGHT WAS FASCINATING THAT TALKED
- 20 ABOUT NORTH TOWER OF THE GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE SITS ON LAND SO
- 21 THE SHIP WOULD HAVE TO GROUND ITSELF BEFORE IT WOULD HIT THAT
- 22 ARE. THE SOUTH TOWER ACTUALLY HAS A FENDER. THE FENDER IS 40
- 23 FEET OUT FROM THE FACE OF THE STEEL TOWER. IT'S TEN FEET THICK
- 24 AT THE TOP. IF CONCRETE IT'S 27 AND A HALF FEET THICK, 40 FEET
- 25 DOWN AND IT'S FILLED WITH SANDWICH IT'S VERY MUCH LIKE A



- 1 MODERN HIGHWAY, YOU KNOW, WHATEVER WE CALL THOSE CRASH
- 2 TENUATORS, BUT AHEAD OF THEIR TIME FOR THE 1930S IT'S
- 3 SIGNIFICANT AND KNOCK ON WOOD PRETTY ROBUST AND THE BRIDGE IN
- 4 BALTIMORE DID NOT HAVE THAT PROTECTION WHICH IS A SHAME.

- 16 SPEND RESOURCES? OR IS IT APPROPRIATE TO SPEND RESOURCES IN
- 17 AND WHEN YOU DO THE PRESENTATION, I'M JUST REALLY TRYING TO
- 18 UNDERSTAND HOW IT CONNECTS INTO THE OTHER EXPENDITURES THAT WE
- 19 MAY MAKE ON A FREEWAY OR ROADWAY.

- 21 ANDREW FREMIER: UNFORTUNATELY THAT'S, LIKE A LOT OF THINGS, A
- 22 COMPLICATED ANSWER. THE BRIDGES HAVE VERY DIFFERENT
- 23 DEFINITIONS, THE IRONY FOR SAN MATEO IT GOES ALL THE WAY TO
- 24 THE 880 INTERCHANGE ACROSS TO FOSTER CITY. RICHMOND BRIDGE HAS
- 25 NO DEFINITION WE HAVE A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT WITH CALTRANS



1	AND WE'RE FOCUSED FROM BRIDGE END TO START AND ASSOCIATED
2	SUPPORT SYSTEMS MAINTENANCE THAT ARE REQUIRED TO KEEP IT IN
3	GOOD ORDER WE HAVE OPPORTUNITIES TO WORK WITH THE STATE BUT SO
4	DOES OTHER PROGRAMMING FUNDS LIKE SHOP ONCE YOU GET OUT INTO
5	THE PLAZAS. IT'S A LITTLE BIT OF YOU HAVE GOT TO DO THE RIGHT
6	THING. THE STATE HAS A LOT OF THE RESPONSIBILITY BUT WHEN WE
7	TOOK OVER ALL OF THE TOLLING FINANCE WITH THE BAY BRIDGE
8	SEISMIC LEGISLATION YOU ALSO TOOK ON ALL KNOW RESPONSIBILITY
9	FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS IN PERPETUITY. SO, THE ROLE HAS
10	CHANGED A LITTLE BIT IN 2005 IN TERMS OF RESPONSIBILITIES.
