Review of Plan and TIP Amendments – and supporting technical documents – by committees for referral to MTC and ABAG Executive Board

The proposed Amendment aligns the Plan to the most recent scope and cost assumptions in the project's Draft EIR.



Amendment Overview:

- The U.S. Highway 101 Managed Lanes Project was included in the adopted Plan's fiscally constrained investment strategy as RTPID 17-06-0007
- The amendment modifies the project's scope and costs

Amendment Details:

Scope

"Modify existing lanes <u>US 101</u> to accommodate an HOV lane from Whipple to San Francisco County Line and/or an Express Lane from approximately 2 miles south of the Santa Clara County Line to San Francisco County Line <u>Grand Avenue interchange near the I-380</u> interchange. Work may include shoulder modification, ramp modifications and interchange modifications to accommodate an extra lane. Work will be phased."

Cost \$365 <u>534</u> (millions)

The cost increase is accommodated by reducing the Cost Contingency and Financing Project (RTPID 17-10-0016)

Cost \$621 452 (millions)

No other changes or revisions are proposed in this amendment.

Public Comments focused on concerns related to the Amendment's effect on regional travel and emissions.

Comments:

- Concerns on the proposed amendment's effect on regional travel metrics, such as vehicle miles traveled (VMT)
- Concerns on the proposed amendment's effect on the region's ability to achieve its Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) and reduce per-capita greenhouse gas emissions from cars and light duty trucks
- Concern that the implementation of the project could affect access to the Millbrae Station (BART, Caltrain, and future High-Speed Rail access)

Response:

- Generally, the EIR addendum noted that implementation of the proposed amendment to the Plan would result in reduced vehicle travel and reduced mobile source emissions relative to the adopted Plan
- A summary of the findings related to travel and emissions can be found in the EIR Addendum



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The Conformity Analysis demonstrates that the Amendments to the $\frac{Plan}{BayArea}$ Plan and TIP are consistent with the federal air quality plan. 2040

- Federal planning regulations require that we demonstrate that the transportation activities of the Amended Plan and Amended 2017 TIP will not cause new air quality violations, worsen existing violations, or delay timely attainment of the federal air quality standards
- The Conformity Analysis was conducted consistent with the U.S. EPA's transportation-air quality conformity regulations and with the Bay Area Air Quality Conformity Protocol (MTC as Resolution No. 3757)
- The Conformity Analysis demonstrates that both the Amended Plan and Amended 2017 TIP are consistent with ("conform to") the federal air quality plan, which is referred to as the state implementation plan (SIP)

The Addendum to the Final EIR demonstrates that the Amendment does not change the conclusions of the Final EIR.

- This Addendum evaluates whether the Amendment to the Plan could result in additional significant effects on the environment relative to the conclusions reached in the Final EIR for the Plan
- This Addendum relies on the significance criteria for each issue area and the corresponding analysis methodology described in the Final EIR to assess the potential impacts of the Amendment
- The same environmental categories were examined to determine whether the Amendment would have an effect on the analysis in the Final EIR
- The proposed amendment to the Plan would not result in any new significant environmental effects or substantial increases in the severity of the previously identified significant effects disclosed in the Draft EIR and certified Final EIR completed for the Plan

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TIP Amendment 2017-28 ensures consistency between the TIP and the proposed Amendment to Plan Bay Area 2040.

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- Federal planning regulations require that the TIP be consistent with the Regional Transportation Plan
- TIP Amendment 2017-28 includes a proposal to revise the 2017 TIP to maintain consistency between the 2017 TIP and the Amendment to Plan Bay Area 2040
- The 2017 TIP as revised with TIP Amendment 2017-28 remains fiscally constrained as required by federal regulations
