- 2 YOU CAN BACK IT UP. MEYERS JOB WAS TO REPAIR SECTIONS OF I 280
- 3 VIADUCT IN SAN FRANCISCO DAMAGED BY THE 1989 LOMA PRIETA
- 4 EARTHOUAKE. A PROJECT THAT DREW SCRUTINY FROM QUINTON COBB AND
- 5 STEVE HEMINGER. MEYER'S REPUTATION IN 1994 WHEN CALTRANS
- 6 AWARDED HIS COMPANY TWO SECTIONS OF THE -- COMPLETED THE JOB
- 7 74 DAYS AHEAD OF SCHEDULE EARNING A TIDY \$14 MILLION BONUS IN
- 8 THE PROCESS. ASKED WHAT HE WOULD DO WITH THE MONEY MR. MEYERS
- 9 REPLIED I'M GOING BUY A BIGGER PLANE. BACK IN THE BAY AREA, A

- 9 SECOND GENERATION IMMIGRANT AND CHICANA WITH ROOTS ACROSS SAN
- 10 JOSE AND SANTA CLARA COUNTY. AS THE ELDEST OF FOUR DAUGHTERS,
- 11 I'M PROUD TO BE THE FIRST IN MY FAMILY TO EARN A COLLEGE
- 12 DEGREE FROM SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY AND WITH A DUAL
- 13 BACHELOR'S IN SPANISH LANGUAGE AND CHILD ADOLESCENT
- 14 DEVELOPMENT. MY CAREER FOCUS HAS BEEN ON EARLY CHILDHOOD
- 15 EDUCATION AS A PRESCHOOL TEACHER THEN ADVOCATE FOR FAMILY
- 16 SPACES AND COMMUNITIES DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS. AS CHAIR MY GOAL
- 17 IS TO CREATE A MEANINGFUL LASTING IMPACT ON LIVES OF CHILDREN
- 18 AND FAMILIES TO HELP CREATE A BAY AREA WHERE EVERYONE CAN
- 19 THRIVE. THE WORK WE DO AT MTC HITS CLOSE TO HOME FOR ME.
- 20 GROWING UP, MY MOM HAS ALWAYS BEEN A SUPER COMMUTER, LIVING IN
- 21 SAN JOSE WORKING IN MOUNTAIN VIEW, THEN PALO ALTO AND, NOW,
- 22 REDWOOD CITY. AND MY FAMILY JOKES WE SPEND MORE TIME IN THE
- 23 CAR THAN AT HOME. THE IMPACT TO QUALITY OF LIFE IS NO LAUGHING
- 24 MATTER, AND MY STORY IS NOT UNIQUE. MANY FAMILIES ACROSS THE
- 25 BAY SUFFER CONSEQUENCES OF TIME POVERTY DUE TO POORLY DESIGNED



- 1 COMMUNITIES DUE TO LACK OF ACCESS TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND
- 2 PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION THAT IS CONVENIENT AND DEPENDABLE.
- 3 HOUSING IS UNAFFORDABLE. I STILL LIVE AT HOME WITH MY PARENTS.
- 4 MY MOM WOKE ME UP AT 4:00 A.M. TO SEE IF SHE COULD BORROW MY
- 5 CAR TO GET TO WORK BECAUSE THERE IS NO PUBLIC TRANSIT TO TAKE
- 6 HER FROM SAN JOSE TO REDWOOD CITY WHERE SHE NEEDS TO BE MY
- 7 6:00 A.M. THIS IS WHY THE WORK OF MTC IS SO IMPORTANT TO ME.
- 8 WE DESERVE BETTER FOR OURSELVES, FAMILIES, AND COMMUNITIES IN
- 9 THE BAY AREA, I AM GRATEFUL TO THE AMAZING MTC STAFF,
- 10 COMMISSIONERS AND MY COUNCIL COLLEAGUES WHO ARE WORKING
- 11 TOGETHER MAKING SURE WE'RE CREATING A BETTER COMMUNITY FOR
- 12 FUTURE AND CURRENT GENERATIONS. A QUICK RECAP OF OUR PAST
- 13 COUPLE OF MONTHS OF MEETINGS IN JANUARY. FIRST ORDER OF
- 14 BUSINESS WAS ELECTIONS FOR THE 2024-2025 CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR
- 15 POSITIONS. AFTER TEN YEARS LEADING THE COUNCIL, RANDI KINMAN
- 16 DECIDED NOT TO RUN FOR A LEADERSHIP POSITION AND CONSEQUENTLY,
- 17 THE COUNCIL ELECTED MYSELF AS CHAIR AND MY COLLEAGUE, MICHAEL
- 18 BALDINI FROM NAPA COUNTY AS VICE CHAIR. CHAIR PEDROZA
- 19 MENTIONED WE MET IN EARLY FEBRUARY WITH VICE CHAIR BALDINI AND
- 20 MYSELF TO REVIEW OUR COUNCIL WORK PLAN AND THEN THIS ITEM CAME
- 21 BEFORE OUR COUNCIL THIS MONTH SO WE HEARD A LOT OF
- 22 CONSTRUCTIVE FEEDBACK INCLUDING WIDESPREAD SUPPORT TO HOST THE
- 23 LEADERSHIP RETREAT THIS YEAR FOR THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL.
- 24 SIMILARLY FOR THE COMMISSION'S WORKSHOP AND RETREATS OUR
- 25 COUNCIL WOULD APPRECIATE THE OPPORTUNITY FOR FUNDING AND STAFF



- 1 TIME TO SUPPORT AND HELP OUR NEWER MEMBERS UNDERSTANDS MTC
- 2 PLANNING TOOLS SUCH AS PBA2050+ AND THE BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE
- 3 REPORT. WE HOPE TO INCORPORATE THE COUNCIL'S REQUEST INTO THE
- 4 WORK PLAN AND THEN REVISIT THE ITEM IN THE SPRING WE ALSO
- 5 HEARD AN UPDATE ON THE REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION MEASURE THIS
- 6 MONTH AND TO SUMMARIZE THE FEEDBACK COUNCIL MEMBERS BELIEVE
- 7 THE EXPENDITURE MUST HAVE FLEXIBILITY WITH GUARDRAILS AND
- 8 EMPHASIZE THE NEED FOR OPERATIONS TO BE INCLUDED BECAUSE THAT
- 9 WILL ENSURE A BETTER FUNCTIONING REGIONAL TRANSIT SYSTEM THAT
- 10 IS FREQUENTLY CONNECTING RIDERS TO WHERE THEY NEED AND WANT TO
- 11 GO. MEMBERS ALSO WANT TO SEE TRANSPARENT COMMUNICATIONS
- 12 REGARDING RETURN TO SOURCE TO GIVE VOTERS A CLEAR
- 13 COMMUNICATIONS CAMPAIGN OF HOW PAST TAXPAYER TRANSPORTATION
- 14 PROJECTS HAVE IMPROVED OUR REGION AND EXACTLY WHAT CHANGES WE
- 15 CAN EXPECT TO SEE LOCALLY AND REGIONALLY IF THIS MEASURE
- 16 PASSES. REGARDING HIGHWAY INVESTMENTS MEMBERS SUGGESTED
- 17 PRIORITIZING TRAFFIC CORRIDORS IN NEEDS OF SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS
- 18 AND IF WE DO INVEST IN HIGHWAYS WE MUST THINK INNOVATIVELY AND
- 19 REOUIRE DESIGNS THAT ALLOW FOR FUTURE EDITION OF RAIL TO
- 20 FURTHER ADVANCE PUBLIC TRANSIT RIDERSHIP AND REDUCE GHG FROM
- 21 SINGLE OCCUPANCY COMMUTERS. THE RNM CUSTOMER ADVISORY GROUP
- 22 MET IN JANUARY AND FEBRUARY ADINA LEVIN WAS VOTED CHAIR, AND
- 23 WARREN CUSHMAN ELECTED VICE CHAIR. NEXT MONTH WE WILL LOOK
- 24 FORWARD TO PROMOTING THE NORMAN MINETA SUMMER BAY AREA ACADEMY
- 25 APPLICATIONS TO OUR LOCAL HIGH SCHOOLS AND HOPE TO HAVE FULL

- 22 SACRAMENTO GIVING UPDATES ON ALL THE GOOD WORK WE'RE DOING IN
- 23 THE HOUSING ARENA ALSO REFLECTING SOME OF THE CHALLENGES AND
- 24 CONTINUING TO WORK ON. IN TERMS OF PLACES WE HAVE GONE OUT AND
