TALKING YOU THROUGH THE STATUS OF HOUSING ELEMENTS, AND THEN



- 1 MY COLLEAGUE WILL JOIN AND GIVE YOU SOME INFORMATION ABOUT THE
- 2 IMPACT THAT IS THE MONEY. SO, IF I CAN HAVE THE NEXT SLIDE,
- 3 PLEASE? HERE WE GO. CONTEXT FOR THE CONVERSATION. AS YOU ALL
- 4 WILL PROBABLY RECALL, THE OBAG PROGRAM IS CONDITIONED ON
- 5 COMPLIANCE WITH HOUSING ELEMENT LAW, AND THIS HOUSING ELEMENT
- 6 CYCLE HAS BEEN, LIKE, NONE THAT EVER CAME BEFORE IN SO MANY
- 7 WAYS. TAKING INTO ACCOUNT THE EXTRAORDINARILY MORE COMPLICATED
- 8 AND EXPENSIVE PROCESS THAT ALL THE JURISDICTIONS HAVE BEEN
- 9 GOING THROUGH. THE COMMISSION EXTENDED AND BY GRANTING A GRACE
- 10 PERIOD, THE DEADLINE FOR COMPLIANCE TO QUALIFY FOR THE OBAG
- 11 GRANTS. AND, SO, THAT GRACE PERIOD HAS BEEN GRANTED TO GO
- 12 THROUGH DECEMBER 31ST OF 2024. HOWEVER, YOU REQUESTED A SIX
- 13 MONTH UPDATE ON HOW THINGS ARE GOING. SO, WE'RE HERE ON GIVE
- 14 YOU THAT TODAY. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THIS IS JUST A QUICK
- 15 REFRESHER ON HOUSING ELEMENT PROCEDURE. GENERALLY, THE PROCESS
- 16 IS THERE IS AN INITIAL DRAFT THAT'S SENT TO HCD, THEY NOW HAVE
- 17 90 DAYS TO REVIEW, AND THEY TAKE VIRTUALLY ALL OF IT, USUALLY.
- 18 THERE ARE AT LEAST A SECOND DRAFT, AND OFTEN MULTIPLE DRAFTS,
- 19 AND THEN AN ADOPTION. AND EACH OF THOSE STEPS, HCD HAS 60 DAYS
- 20 TO REVIEW, AND THEY TAKE VIRTUALLY ALL OF IT. THE STATUTORY
- 21 DEADLINE WAS WAY BACK IN JANUARY 31ST OF 2023, BUT AS I
- 22 MENTIONED, WE HAVE A GRACE PERIOD FOR THE OBAG THROUGH THE END
- 23 OF THIS CALENDAR YEAR. A NEW THING THIS CYCLE THAT HAS BEEN
- 24 VERY CHALLENGING IS THERE ARE NEW REZONING DEADLINES. IN PRIOR
- 25 CYCLES, IT WOULD BE THREE YEARS FROM THE END OF YOUR



1	CERTIFICATION TO GET YOUR REZONING DONE. AND VERY COMPLICATED
2	DETAILS UP HERE, BUT ESSENTIALLY, THE DEADLINE FOR MOST OF OUR
3	JURISDICTIONS WAS, ALSO WAS JANUARY 31ST OF THIS YEAR. AND
4	THAT WAS PART OF WHAT DROVE THE DECISION TO CREATE THE GRACE
5	PERIOD FOR OBAG. AND ADDITIONALLY, [LAUGHTER] ONCE YOU GET
6	CERTIFIED THAT'S NOT JUST YOU'RE DONE FOR EIGHT YEARS. HCD CAN
7	ALWAYS DECERTIFY. AND YOU CAN FOLLOW OUT OF COMPLIANCE. SO,
8	NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THIS TABLE WAS SHOWING THE HOUSING ELEMENT
9	STATUS AS OF MAY 2ND. AND I AM VERY HAPPY TO REPORT THAT
10	THINGS HAVE BEEN GOING WELL SINCE THEN. AND THE CURRENT
11	NUMBERS ARE 81 JURISDICTIONS THAT ARE FULLY CERTIFIED, AND
12	FOUR MORE ARE FOUND IN SUBSTANTIAL COMPLIANCE. SO, WE FULLY
13	EXPECT THEM TO BE CERTIFIED SOON. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.

17	CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: SURE.

19	VICTORIA FLEMING: ON THE PREVIOUS SLIDE, I'M JUST CURIOUS TON,
20	IT LOOKS LIKE IN GENERAL, THE GREAT MAJORITY OF CITIES AND
21	JURISDICTIONS HAVE TRIED, WHO HAS BEEN DECERTIFIED?

1 CINDY CHAVEZ: APOLOGIZE. AND DECERTIFY THROUGH THE CHAIR 2 3 WHAT'S THE IMPACT OF IT? 4 5 HEATHER PETERS: OBAG IS NOT THE ONLY FUNDING SOURCE THAT'S SUBJECT TO THE HOUSING ELEMENT CERTIFICATION IT MEANS THAT HCD 6 HAS REVIEWED THE ADOPTED HOUSING ELEMENT AND HAS BEEN FOUND TO 7 8 BE COMPLIANT IN SUBSTANCE WITH STATE LAW THAT MEANS YOU'RE ELIGIBLE NOT ONLY FOR OBAG BUT FOR MANY SUBSTANTIVE FUNDING 9 SOURCES FROM THE STATE, AND YOU'RE ALSO AVOIDING SEVERE 10 CONSEQUENCES THAT CAN HAPPEN IN THEIR ESCALATING DISCIPLINARY 11 PROCESS WHICH WE'LL TALK ABOUT IN A MOMENT. BUT THEY'RE NOT 12 JUST FINANCIAL CONSEQUENCES, THEY'RE SUBSTANTIVE CONSEQUENCES. 13 MANY OF YOU HAVE HEARD OF THE BUILDERS REMEDY THAT'S HOT ON 14 15 EVERYONE'S MINDS. IF YOU ARE NOT CERTIFIED, AND AN APPLICATION 16 COMES IN FOR A PROJECT THEY ARE ENTITLED TO PRETTY MUCH IGNORE ALL THE OF YOUR ZONING, AND YOU MUST PROCESS THE APPLICATION, 17 REGARDLESS. OTHER VERY EXTREME INSTANCES ARE THE HMM CD CAN 18 ACTUALLY COME IN AND TAKE OVER YOUR PERMITTING. FORTUNATELY, 19 WE'RE NOWHERE NEAR ANY OF THAT. [LAUGHTER] SO, DOES THAT 20 21 ANSWER YOUR QUESTION FOR NOW? 22 23 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: AND THEN VICTORIA HAD A QUESTION. 24 FOREMEN.



VICTORIA FLEMING: YES CAN YOU SAY WHICH JURISDICTIONS HAVE 1 2 BEEN DECERTIFIED. 3 HEATHER PETERS: TWO OF THEM PORTOLA VAL AND SANTA HELENA, GOOD 4 5 NEWS IS ST. HELENA FINISHED THEIR REZONING AND THEY HAVE BEEN RECERTIFIED. SO THE ONLY ONE THAT'S CURRENTLY DECERTIFIED IS 6 7 PORTOLA VALLEY AND THAT'S FOR FAILURE TO PROPERLY REZONE. 8 SPEAKER: WITHIN THE DEADLINE. 9 10 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: [LAUGHTER] ALL RIGHT. PLEASE GO ON. 11 12 HEATHER PETERS: NEXT SLIDE TALKING ABOUT DISCIPLINARY PROCESS. 13 IT'S NOT NECESSARILY LINEAR, AND IT IS ALSO AT THE DISCRETION 14 15 OF HCD, WHERE THEY WANT TO DROP IN AND TAKE DIFFERENT ACTIONS. 16 BUT, GENERALLY, THE LEVELS OF SEVERITY ARE ON THE SLIDE HERE. THE LEAST LEVEL IS MONITORING. THEY JUST HAVE CONVERSATION 17 WITH STAFF, THEY SAY WE'RE TAKING A LOOK AT THIS, WE WANT TO 18 MAKE SURE YOU GET IT RIGHT. IF YOU DON'T, WE MAY PROCEED TO 19 MORE FORMAL DISCIPLINE. SO THAT'S JUST A FRIENDLY 20 21 CONVERSATION. [LAUGHTER] LETTER OF INQUIRY IS THE NEXT LEVEL. IT'S A FORMAL WRITTEN CORRESPONDENCE THAT SAYS, WE ARE 22 WATCHING THIS, WE ARE CONCERNED ABOUT THIS, AND YOU HAVE 30 23 DAYS TO RESPOND IN WRITING TO EXPLAIN WHAT THE PROCESS IS 24 YOU'RE GOING THROUGH TO ALLEVIATE THE CONCERNS. AND THOSE ARE



- 1 OFTEN JUST RESOLVED RIGHT THERE. STAFF SENDS A LETTER,
- 2 EXPLAINS THAT THEY'RE MAKING PROGRESS. HCD IS CONVINCED THAT
- 3 THEY'RE MAKING GOOD FAITH EFFORT AND THAT IT JUST ENDS THERE.
- 4 THE NEXT LEVEL OF ACTION, AFTER THAT, IS IF YOU HAVE RECEIVED
- 5 THE LETTER OF INQUIRY, OR NOT NECESSARILY -- SOMETIMES THEY
- 6 CAN SKIP RIGHT THROUGH TO WHAT THEY CALL A LETTER OF
- 7 CORRECTIVE ACTION -- AND THAT IS A MORE FORMAL STEP. THE
- 8 LETTER OF CORRECTIVE ACTION, YOU GET ANOTHER 30 DAYS TO
- 9 RESPOND, BUT THE FACT THAT THE LETTER OF CORRECTIVE ACTION
- 10 WENT OUT INDICATES THAT HCD WASN'T REALLY HAPPY WITH THE FIRST
- 11 ROUND OF CONVERSATIONS THEY HAVE HAD, OR NECESSARILY THE
- 12 SECOND ROUND. SO, IT'S MORE SERIOUS. BUT, AGAIN, NOT
- 13 DECERTIFICATION. AGAIN, THERE IS A 30-DAY CHANCE TO RESPOND IN
- 14 WRITING, AND HCD WILL PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND TRY TO
- 15 GET YOU BACK ON TRACK. THAT LEVEL OF INVOLVEMENT -- ALL OF THE
- 16 LETTERS ARE PUBLIC RECORD -- BUT IT'S ONLY WHEN YOU GET TO THE
- 17 LEVEL OF THE CORRECTIVE ACTION THAT WHEN YOU GET OUT OF IT
- 18 THAT THEY ACTUALLY POST A NOTICE THAT YOU HAVE FULLY COMPLIED
- 19 WITH THEIR LETTER OF CORRECTIVE ACTION. SO FOR STAFF IT'S A
- 20 LITTLE BIT OF WHERE IS WALDO TO TRY AND FIGURE OUT WHO IS AT
- 21 WHAT STAGE OF THE GAME. BECAUSE WE DO SEE A LOT OF LETTERS OF
- 22 INQUIRY AND WE DON'T REALLY KNOW WHATEVER HAPPENED BECAUSE
- 23 THEY DON'T POST FOLLOW UP. SO WE HAVE SPENT TIME IN
- 24 CONVERSATIONS WITH HCD WITH OUR COUNTY PLANNING COLLABORATIVES
- 25 AND LOCAL STAFF TO TRY TO GET OUR BEST OF WHAT EVERYBODY IS IN



- 1 THE PROCESS. ANOTHER LEVEL OF SEVERITY IS NOTICE OF POTENTIAL
- 2 VIOLATION AND THAT CAN BE FOR HOUSING ELEMENTS, BUT THEY CAN
- 3 ALSO BE FOR FAILURE TO PROPERLY PROCESS BUILDERS REMEDY
- 4 APPLICATIONS, OR ANY OTHER VIOLATION OF STATE LAW. IT DOESN'T
- 5 NECESSARILY NEED TO BE HOUSING ELEMENTS. AND THEN, AS I
- 6 MENTIONED, THE NEXT STEP AFTER THAT, IF YOU HAVE A RESOLVED,
- 7 EVERYTHING IN THE LETTERS, YOU DO GET A FORMAL LETTER OF
- 8 COMPLIANCE, OR COMPLETION OF THE CORRECTIVE ACTION, IF YOU
- 9 DON'T, THEN THEY PROCEED TO DECERTIFICATION. DOES ANYONE HAVE
- 10 ANY QUESTIONS ABOUT THAT BEFORE I MOVE FORWARD? GREAT. CAN I
- 11 HAVE THE NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. OKAY. AGAIN, AS OF MAY 2ND SUMMARY
- 12 OF DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS. THESE ARE ALL, HCD MONITORING FIRST
- 13 AND SECOND COLUMNS ARE SEVERE HMM CD MONITORING WE DETERMINED
- 14 THROUGH CONVERSATIONS WITH HCD LETTER AND EVERYTHING ELSE TO
- 15 THE RIGHT OF THAT LETTERS INQUIRY PUBLIC RECORD ALTHOUGH WE
- 16 DON'T KNOW HOW THEY GET RESOLVED NECESSARILY LETTERS OF
- 17 CORRECTIVE ACTION AND/OR PUBLIC RECORDS CERTIFICATION AND
- 18 SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF ACTION ARE ALL PUBLIC RECORD. GREAT
- 19 NEWS ON THIS FRONT. WE, THROUGH -- AS I MENTIONED, MANY
- 20 CONVERSATIONS WITH MANY DIFFERENT PEOPLE OF MANY LEVELS. WE
- 21 HAVE BEEN ABLE TO SLEUTH OUT THAT IT LOOKS LIKE ABOUT 75% OF
- 22 THESE WE'RE PRETTY SURE ARE RESOLVED. AND AS I MENTIONED, ST.
- 23 HELENA IS RECERTIFIED. AND THE ONES THAT ARE NOT RESOLVED,
- 24 SOME OF THEM ARE LETTERS OF INQUIRY. SO THEY MAY HAVE BEEN
- 25 RESOLVED, AND WE JUST HAVEN'T BEEN ABLE TO SLEUTH OUT THAT

- 18 PROJECTS ARE LISTED ON THE SCREEN. WITH THAT WE'RE AVAILABLE

THINK THE GOAL IS TO PENALIZE THE JURISDICTIONS, BUT WE'LL BE 1 2 WORKING WITH THEM, AS YOU ARE, AND HCD --3 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: LIBBY OVER HERE LEANING IN. 4 5 GINA PAPAN: WELL, THAT'S WHY THERE IS EXTENSION TO HELP THEM 6 ALONG THE WAY. SO WITH THE CHAIR'S PERMISSION HERE, THAT WOULD 7 8 BE VERY HELPFUL. 9 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: I THINK MAYBE COMMISSIONER SCHAFF DID ASK 10 FOR A REPORT BACK, THAT WOULD COME BACK, I THINK, IN DECEMBER, 11 WITH THAT LIST OF -- IF I'M REMEMBERING THIS PROPERLY, WITH 12 THE -- FRANKLY WITH WHO IS ON THE NAUGHTY LIST, RIGHT BEFORE 13 THE HOLIDAYS. APPROXIMATE THAT WOULD BE GREAT? 17 18 HEATHER PETERS: NO PROBLEM. 19 20 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: EVEN THOUGH I SAW MY COUNTY'S NAME ON THE 21 22 LIST HERE, DO THINK THAT HAVING A LIST OF WHO IS STILL OUTSTANDING AND FRANKLY WITH DEEPER DISCUSSION WITH EACH OF 23

THEM ABOUT WHY IS GOING TO BE IMPORTANT. AND I WOULD ALSO

SUGGEST IF ANY OF THEM WANT TO COME AND EXPLAIN -- NO. I'M

BUT WE HAVE TO 11 RESPOND TO VOTERS HERE WHO VOTED FOR REGIONAL MEASURE 3 TOO. 12 13 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: MAY I PUT A THOUGHT ON THE TABLE? I 14 15 UNDERSTAND WHAT YOU'RE SAYING. TWO THINGS IN THE MOTION. SO, 16 WE HAVE A MOTION. DO WE HAVE A SECOND? THANK YOU, NATE. I THINK THE FIRST PART OF THE MOTION IS MAKING SURE THERE IS 17 FLEXIBILITY IN TERMS OF WHAT RESOURCES CAN BE USED. THE SECOND 18 -- WHAT I WOULD RECOMMEND IS THAT THERE BE A MECHANISM. I KNOW 19 YOU HAVE ONE, WHICH IS TO REACH OUT TO FOLKS AND SAY, HEY 20 21 WE'RE GETTING CLOSE. WE THINK THE MONEY NEEDS TO BE SPENT. - 22 SPREAD OUT THROUGHOUT THE REGION DELIVERING GOOD REGIONAL
- 23 PROJECTS THAT ARE IDENTIFIED IN LAW. SO, I THINK WE DO, IN THE
- 24 LARGE EXCEL SPREADSHEET THAT CALCULATES HOW MONEY RETURNS BACK



TO VOTERS, WE DO A GOOD JOB WITH IT. QUARRY LAKES PARKWAY IS NOT AN EXPRESSWAY; IT'S A LOCAL COMPLETE 23 STREETS ROADWAY, TWO LANES IN EACH DIRECTION WITH SEPARATED 24

BICYCLE LANES AND WALKING PATHS. IT IS IN NO WAY AN EXPRESSWAY



- 1 BECAUSE BETWEEN MISSION BOULEVARD AND ALVARADO NILES ROAD
- 2 THERE WILL BE NO LESS THAN FOUR SIGNALIZED INTERSECTIONS. THAT
- 3 ROADWAY IS NECESSARY FOR THE ADDITIONAL 2,000 UNITS. WE ARE
- 4 BUILDING IN THE AREA, AND IN ADDITION TO PUBLIC SAFETY, AS
- 5 WE'LL DO A DEPRESSED ROADWAY BETWEEN TWO SETS OF RAILROAD
- 6 TRACKS AND THE BART TRACKS. THAT ROAD IS NECESSARY TO HAVE
- 7 DECOTO ROAD BE THE BEST RAPID TRANSIT FROM MISSION BOULEVARD
- 8 ALL THE WAY TO DUMBARTON BRIDGE. WITHOUT QUARRY LAKES PARKWAY,
- 9 WE CAN'T GET TRANSIT OFF TO DECOTO ROAD AS NECESSARY TO HAVE
- 10 THAT BUS ONLY LANE. ALSO, WITH QUARRY LAKES PARKWAY THERE, OUR
- 11 DUMBARTON EXPRESS BUS WILL HAVE DIRECT ACCESS TO THE EAST SIDE
- 12 OF BART STATION AND HAVE IT INSTEAD OF HAVING TO TAKE THE
- 13 ROUTE THAT NOW TAKES DOWN TO DECOTO ROAD UP INTO THE BART
- 14 STATION. SO, THE TRANSIT IS VERY IMPORTANT BOTH FOR THE BUS
- 15 PORTION AS WELL AS BICYCLES AND PEDESTRIAN. SO WE HAVE, IN
- 16 UNION CITY, HELD MULTIPLE PUBLIC MEETINGS. THE SPEAKER YOU
- 17 HEARD FROM EARLIER CALLING IT AN EXPRESSWAY AND EVERYTHING
- 18 ELSE IS NOT A UNION CITY RESIDENT. HE LIVES IN FREMONT. SO, I
- 19 WOULD APPRECIATE YOUR CONSIDERATION. COMMISSIONER MILEY, I'M
- 20 SORRY I DID NOT GO INTO MORE DETAIL ABOUT THE HISTORY OF
- 21 QUARRY LAKES PARKWAY WITH YOU, BECAUSE YOU WOULD HAVE BEEN
- 22 BETTER PREPARED TO ADDRESS THIS. HOWEVER, I AM LISTENING, SO
- 23 IF THERE IS QUESTIONS, YOU HAVE FOR ME NOW, I'M MORE THAN
- 24 HAPPY TO ANSWER THEM. OH, I ALSO -- CAN I ADD ONE MORE THING
- 25 THAT'S VERY IMPORTANT --



1 2 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: ABSOLUTELY. 3 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, VICE CHAIR: -- FOR OUR PROJECT. I DID 4 5 SPEAK WITH CHAIR CHAVEZ A COUPLE OF DAYS AGO ABOUT THIS, AND THE ONE THING THE COMMISSION NEEDS TO UNDERSTAND IS TO GET OUR 6 LOCAL ROADWAY THIS IS ALSO IMPORTANT FOR A 500 PLUS UNIT 7 8 HOUSING PROJECT THAT IS ON THE FORMER CALTRANS PROPERTY THAT UNION CITY IS TAKING OVER. WITH THE SALE OF THAT PROPERTY FOR 9 HOUSING -- AND WE ARE IN EXCLUSIVE NEGOTIATING AGREEMENT WITH 10 A DEVELOPER AS WE SPEAK -- AND WITH THE SALE OF THAT, IT WILL 11 BRING IN AN APPRAISED \$86 MILLION. AND UNION CITY IS IN A 12 LOWER SPOT TO RECEIVE ANY OF THAT MONEY. AND IN THE FIRST 13 PLACE, IT WILL GO TO VTA NEAR AND DEAR TO COMMISSIONER 14 15 CHAVEZ'S HEART, TO REPAY A LOAN THAT HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING FOR 16 YEARS. AND THEN WE HAVE GOT SOME OTHER FOLKS IN FRONT OF UNION 17 CITY, AND UNION CITY WOULD ULTIMATELY BENEFIT FROM ANY MONEYS LEFT OVER TO MOVE FORWARD OUR PROJECT IN THAT AREA. SO, THIS 18 IS A VERY COMPLEX PROJECT. WE HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH ALL OF 19 THE REGULATORY AGENCIES, THE ARMY CORP OF ENGINEERS, THE FLOOD 20 21 CONTROL FOLKS, YOU NAME IT. WE HAVE BEEN WORKING DILIGENTLY ON THIS. IT'S NOT AN EASY PROJECT. AS A MATTER OF FACT, UNION 22 CITY HAD TO TAKE OVER THE PROJECT WHEN IT WAS UNDER THE 23 SPONSORSHIP OF THE ALAMEDA COUNTIES TRANSPORTATION BECAUSE 24 THINGS JUST WEREN'T MOVING WE TOOK IT OVER A FEW YEARS BACK



AND STARTED FROM SCRATCH AND GOT IT TO WHERE IT IS TODAY TO BE 1 A COMPLETE STREETS VERY BEAUTIFUL TRANSIT ORIENTED MULTI-MODAL 2 3 CORRIDOR. SO AGAIN LOCAL ROADWAY NOT AN EXPRESSWAY. 4 5 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: ANDY? FOREMEN CONTEXT THAT MIGHT BE HELPFUL GENERATIONALLY. THIS IS THE REMNANT OF THE AREA OF 6 HAYWARD BYPASS WHICH WAS A LONG-TERM PROJECT THAT CALTRANS 7 8 NEVER WAS ABLE TO SUCCESSFULLY TO GET THROUGH THE CHARGES. THE COMMISSIONER IS RIGHT THIS IS A COMPLICATED AREA AND IS TRYING 9 TO CREATE A SOLUTION THAT WORKS IN TODAY'S ENVIRONMENT THROUGH 10 WHAT IS GOING TO BE A LARGE FREEWAY GOING THROUGH CITIES. SO 11 THE REMNANTS AND CLOSE OUT IS REALLY A HISTORY ASSIGNMENT FOR 12 SOME OF US ON WHAT IT TAKES TO KIND OF CONNECT COMMUNITIES 13 AGAIN.
