IMPLEMENTATION AND DEPLOYMENT UPDATE AND 4B IS THE OPERATIONS 1 AND PERFORMANCE UPDATE. SO, THE FIRST ONE KELLY JACKSON IS 2 3 GOING TO WALK US THROUGH, WHICH IS THE SCHEDULE IMPLEMENTATION AND DEPLOYMENT. 4 5 KELLY JACKSON: THANK YOU, CHAIR POWERS. THE SYSTEM INTEGRATION 6 7 TESTING REQUIRED FOR CUBICS ACHIEVEMENT OF REVENUE READY IS 8 UNDERWAY. WE EXPECT TO HAVE MUCH BETTER INFORMATION AND CONFIDENCE WITH THE SCHEDULE AT THE END OF DECEMBER AFTER WE 9 EVALUATE THE PROGRESS OF TESTING. THE SITUATION WITH THE 10 TESTING IS DYNAMIC. FOR EXAMPLE, LAST WEEK THE CUBIC AND MTC 11 PROJECT TEAM REALIZED THE COMPLETION OF SYSTEM INTEGRATION 12 TESTING WAS SLIPPING INTO JANUARY WITH IMPLICATIONS FOR THE 13 START OF PREREVENUE PILOT TESTING. SO, BOTH TEAMS WERE ABLE TO 14 15 COMMIT TO SHIFTING EMPLOYEE RESOURCES FACILITATING MOR HOURS 16 FOR TEST WITNESSING EACH WEEK. WE'RE RESPONDING TO SCHEDULE ISSUES ON A DAY BY DAY BASIS WITH THE TESTING. WE WILL BE ABLE 17 TO SHARE MORE INFORMATION AT THE NEXT CLIPPER EXECUTIVE BOARD 18 MEETING ABOUT THE START OF CUSTOMER TRANSITION. THE RISK 19 LISTED IN THE MEMO, INCLUDING IMPLEMENTATION TESTING OF NEW 20 21 BUSINESS RULES, EQUIPMENT INSTALLATIONS, COORDINATION OF MULTIPLE CONTRACTORS INTEGRATION EFFORTS CONTINUE TO BE THE 22 MAIN POINTS OF CONCERN. HOWEVER, CUBIC AND MTC PROJECT TEAMS 23 ARE FOCUSED ON MANAGING RISK, AND CUBIC HAS MADE DEMONSTRABLE 24

PROGRESS. ONE OF THE MOST VISIBLE SIGNS OF PROGRESS IS NEW

- 4 TRANSIT INSTALLATIONS ARE PROGRESSING WITH AC TRANSIT ELECTING
- 5 TO HAVE CLIPPER READERS INSTALLED ON FRONT AND BACK DOORS OF
- 6 THE BUSES. FINAL BUS OPERATOR TO BE INSTALLED WILL WESCAT DUE
- 7 TO SOME ISSUES WITH CATAVL INTEGRATION THAT HAVEN'T BEEN
- 8 RESOLVED YET. ANY QUESTIONS.

- 19 ALETA DUPREE FOR THE RECORD SHE AND HER. DID GET TO PULL UP
- 20 THIS BRIEF PRESENTATION. AND THANK YOU FOR THE BRIEF AND
- 21 SUCCINCT WORK. I AM GRATEFUL TO SEE THE AC TRANSIT BUS WITH
- 22 THE NEW READER ON BOARD AND I DO SUPPORT THE IDEA OF HAVING
- 23 THE READERS ON THE FRONT AND BACK DOORS, WHICH HELPS WHEN THE
- 24 BUSES GET CROWDED. WHEN I USE AC TRANSIT A LOT BECAUSE WHEN I
- 25 AM IN THE BAY AREA, I STAY, GENERALLY, ALMOST ALL THE TIME, IN



- 1 THE EAST BAY. SO, AS I HAVE SAID BEFORE, THESE NEW READERS,
- 2 WHICH I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO USING, WILL GIVE THE CLEARER
- 3 PICTURE. THESE OLD READERS, THEIR SCREENS ARE JUST FADING OUT.
- 4 AND SO THE TRANSBAY SWITCH IS GOING TO BE MUCH MORE OBVIOUS TO
- 5 PEOPLE SO THAT WAY THEY WILL KNOW WHAT THE FARE WILL BE BEFORE
- 6 THEY TAP THEIR CARD OR PHONE ON TO THE READER. I AM NOT REAL
- 7 FAMILIAR WITH THIS WESTCAT. I DO NOT KNOW MUCH ABOUT WHERE IT
- 8 GOES. MAYBE I'LL USE IT SOME DAY. BUT IT LOOKS LIKE WE'RE
- 9 GETTING CLOSE WITH THIS. SO, I HOPE TO BE IN THE BAY AREA
- 10 BEFORE THE END OF THE YEAR. AND ONCE WE GET ALL THESE NEW
- 11 READERS OUT ON THE SYSTEM IT'S CERTAINLY GOING TO MAKE IT
- 12 EASIER FOR ME TO ESTABLISH THE STATUS OF MY CLIPPER
- 13 TRANSACTION AND HAVE THAT CLEAN AND SEAMLESS INFORMATION THAT
- 14 GOES ALONG WITH USING THE APP ON MY PHONE, IT WILL CERTAINLY
- 15 HELP THOSE WHO ARE USING PLASTIC CARDS. SO, THANK YOU. I
- 16 APPRECIATE THAT.

OPERATIONS AND PERFORMANCE UPDATE THAT'S COMPLEMENTARY TO WHAT 1 2 KELLY JUST WALKED US THROUGH FROM EDWARD. EDWARD? 3 EDWARD MENG: THANK YOU. THANKS AGAIN. THE CONTENT REPORTED IN 4 5 THE MEMO PROVIDES INFORMATION AND STATISTICS ON TRANSACTIONS AND REVENUE MOBILE CLIPPER CARD USAGE CUSTOMER SERVICE 6 STAFFING LEVELS AND OUARTERLY FARE CHANGES. LAST MONTH THE 7 8 CLIPPER SYSTEM PROCESSED 14 BILLION TRANSACTIONS AND SETTLED OVER 32 MILLION IN REVENUE. I WANT TO REMIND THE BOARD THAT IN 9 ORDER TO KEEP THE WORK OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF TESTING THE C TWO 10 SYSTEM ON TRACK KELLY DISCUSSED IN THE LAST AGENDA ITEM WE'RE 11 REQUESTING THAT THE OPERATORS PUT IN QUARTERLY FARE CHANGES 12 AND A REMINDER THAT FOR APRIL 1, 2024 FARE CHANGES ARE 13 REQUESTED BY JANUARY 1ST, SO BY THE END OF THIS YEAR. SO, 14 15 LET'S GET INTO SOME OF THE DATAS AND TRENDS IN SYSTEM USAGE 16 FOR SOME KEY METRICS. OVER THE PAST SEVERAL MONTHS WE HAVE SHOWN TO THIS BOARD DATA POINTS THAT COMPARE DATA FROM THE 17 LAST FEW YEARS IN ORDER TO ATTEMPT TO MEASURE THE IMPACT OF, 18 IN PARTICULAR, THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC ON TRANSIT RIDERSHIP. 19 THIS MONTH, FOR THE SLIDES, WE DECIDE THAT WE WANTED TO ZOOM 20 OUT A BIT MORE AND PUT SOME OF THIS CLIPPER DATA INTO CONTEXT 21 BY PROVIDING A LARGER VIEW, WHICH, FOR SOME OF THESE DATA 22 POINTS, IT'S OVER TEN YEARS. SO, IF WE CAN GO TO THE SLIDES, 23 PLEASE? IF YOU CAN PUT THEM ON THE BOARD? THANKS. THE NEXT 24

SLIDE, PLEASE. THANK YOU. SO, OVER THE LAST TEN YEARS WE HAVE



- 1 SEEN A STEADY INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF CLIPPER CARDS IN
- 2 CIRCULATION FROM 2 MILLION TO NEARLY 15 MILLION. AND, IN FACT,
- 3 SINCE FORMATION OF THIS BODY, THE CLIPPER EXECUTIVE BOARD IN
- 4 2016, APPROXIMATELY THREE OUT OF EVERY FOUR CARDS IN
- 5 CIRCULATION HAS BEEN DISTRIBUTED. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. OVER THE
- 6 SAME TIME PERIOD, THE UNIQUE NUMBER OF CLIPPER CARDS PER MONTH
- 7 HAS GROWN BY OVER 35%. OVER THE LAST TEN YEARS, THE NUMBER OF
- 8 CLIPPER USERS PER MONTH HAS INCREASED OVER 60%. AS YOU CAN SEE
- 9 FROM THE CHART WHILE THERE WAS A PERIOD OF DECLINE OVER COVID-
- 10 19 IT DOES APPEAR TO BE A TEMPORARY BLIP AND NOT PERMANENT.
- 11 CLIPPER RIDERS ARE RETURNING TO TRANSIT ESPECIALLY AS EMPLOYER
- 12 POLICIES ON REMOTE WORK CONTINUE TO EVOLVE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.
- 13 WE WANT TO HIGHLIGHT GROWING INTEREST IN CLIPPER START, THE
- 14 MEANS BASED PROGRAM THAT OFFERS DISCOUNTS OFF OF CASH FARE. WE
- 15 EXPECT INTEREST AS WELL AS PARTICIPATING IN THIS PROGRAM TO GO
- 16 AND HAVE PLANNED FOR IT BY DESIGNING O2 CLIPPER START AS ITS
- 17 OWN FARE CATEGORY THE ABILITY FOR TRANSIT AGENCIES TO OFFER
- 18 MORE FEATURES THAN DISCOUNTS FOR THOSE WITH MORE FEATURES MORE
- 19 LIMITED MEANS SINCE NOVEMBER 2023, 2.7 MILLION HAVE TAKEN TO
- 20 USING CLIPPER START DISCOUNT PROGRAM. NEXT SLIDE. WITH THE
- 21 RELEASE OF CLIPPER MOBILE APP THE CARD ON PHONES IN APRIL 2021
- 22 THE MOBILE APP HAS BEEN A SUCCESS AND IS REMARKABLY POPULAR
- 23 WITH THE TRANSIT RIDERS SINCE LAUNCH 2.2 MILLION MOBILE CARDS
- 24 HAVE BEEN PROVISIONED UNDER RIDER PHONES WHICH IN TERMS OF
- 25 COMPARISON WITH THE PLASTIC CARDS ONE OUT OF EVERY THREE CARDS



- 1 ADDED TO CIRCULATION SINCE LAUNCH. TOTALING NEARLY 5.7 MILLION
- 2 TRIPS HAVE BEEN TAKEN USING MOBILE CLIPPER CARD AS FARE
- 3 PAYMENT. NEXT SLIDE. FINALLY THE CLIPPER OVER THE LAST TEN
- 4 YEARS PERIOD CLIPPER SYSTEM HAS COLLECTED AND SETTLED TWO
- 5 TRANSIT AGENCIES TOTAL OF 4.4 BILLED IN TRANSIT FARES TO THE
- 6 REGIONS TRANSIT OPERATORS THIS AVERAGES AROUND \$436 MILLION A
- 7 YEAR OR ON AVERAGE 35 TO \$36 MILLION A MONTH THE SYSTEM'S
- 8 LOWEST MONTHLY REVENUE WAS APRIL 2020 AS RESULT OF THE
- 9 PANDEMIC AND WAS 2.8 MILLION AND HIGHEST OF THE SYSTEM HAS
- 10 EVER SETTLED WAS IN OCTOBER 2019, \$62 MILLION A MONTH THE LAST
- 11 MONTH BEFORE THE SYSTEM COLLECTED SETTLEMENT NEARLY 32 OR \$33
- 12 MILLION IN FARE REVENUE SIMILAR TO PRIOR SLICE THAT IS THE
- 13 IMPACTS OF THE PANDEMIC, BEGINNING TO LESSEN OVER TIME THE
- 14 SYSTEM IS RETURNING TO STABLE STATE AND PEOPLE ARE BEGINNING
- 15 TO RETURN TO RIDER TRANSIT. WITH THAT I'M HAPPY TO TAKE
- 16 COMMENTS OR QUESTIONS FROM THE BOARD.
- 18 CHAIR, BOB POWERS: THANK YOU FOR THAT PRESENTATION, EDWARD.
- 19 MADAM CLERK ANY PUBLIC COMMENT?

- 10 EDWARD MENG: WE DON'T HAVE THE EXACT NUMBER RIGHT NOW. WE CAN
- 11 GET THAT THAT TO YOU NEXT MONTH. BUT WE WOULD NOTE THAT RIGHT
- 12 NOW THERE IS A HIGHER PORTION OF BART RIDERS AS OPPOSED TO BUS
- 13 RIDERS, AND BECAUSE BART TENDS TO HAVE A HIGHER FARE, THE
- 14 AVERAGE FARE IS LIKELY HIGHER THAN IT WAS PREVIOUSLY.

- 1 THE MOBILE CARD. I DON'T KNOW IF THAT'S POSSIBLE TO RECREATE A
- 2 REPORT LIKE THAT? I KNOW I USED IT IN THE PAST WITH OUR
- 3 MARKETING DEPARTMENT TO TRY TO PUSH OUT MARKETING FOR THE
- 4 VIRTUAL CARD, ON THE MOBILE APP, RECOGNIZING THAT GETTING THE
- 5 CARDS SOMETIMES IS CHALLENGING, AND IT MAY BE USEFUL FOR US AS
- 6 OPERATORS TO SEE THAT AND USE IT. BUT IF IT'S SOMETHING THAT
- 7 GENERATES A TREMENDOUS AMOUNT OF WORK, THAT'S NOT SOMETHING I
- 8 WOULD ASK FOR.

- 10 EDWARD MENG: WE CAN TAKE A LOOK AT THAT AND GET YOU A RESPONSE
- 11 BY NEXT MONTH, BOARD MEMBER CHURCHILL.
