- 3 FUTURE. I HAD SUCH A GREAT CHILDHOOD, I COULD JUMP ON A
- 4 STREETCAR AND GO 47 MILES TO THE MOST WONDERFUL PARKS IN THE
- 5 COUNTRY. WE HAD A FULL SERVICE COMMUNITY. MY PARENT HIS AN ICE
- 6 BOX. THEY WERE REFUGEES FROM THE DEPRESSION. WE DID NOT HAVE A
- 7 REFRIGERATOR, SO THAT NECESSITATED LOCAL TRIPS TO THE GROCERY
- 8 STORIES EVERY DAY 33 SMALLTIME STORIES WITHIN A COUPLE OF
- 9 BLOCKS OF MY HOUSE WE HAD A PHARMACY, THREE LIQUOR STORES,
- 10 THREE BARS, WE HAD A BARBERSHOP, A GAS STATION, LAUNDRY, AND A
- 11 CLEANERS, JUST ABOUT EVERYTHING YOU WOULD NEED. IF YOU GO
- 12 THROUGH OLD NEIGHBORHOODS AND CITIES AND YOU SEE THESE OLDER
- 13 RUN DOWN RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS ON ALL FOUR CORNERS, THAT WAS A
- 14 STREETCAR STOP. WE STILL HAVE SOME OF THOSE IN MY COMMUNITY
- 15 WHERE I GREW UP IN KANSAS CITY. THIS WAS A GREAT THING FOR ME,
- 16 AND I AM SO THANKFUL FOR THERESE MCMILLAN, JAMES CORLESS WHO
- 17 GAVE ME THE TRAINING I NEED TO AT LEAST UNDERSTAND AND KNOW
- 18 WHAT I WAS TALKING ABOUT. THERE WERE SO MANY PEOPLE, MARTHA
- 19 SILVER HAS BEEN INVALUABLE TO ME, KEEPING ME ORGANIZED AND

1 REBECCA LONG: REBECCA LONG, DIRECTOR OF LEGISLATION AND PUBLIC 2 AFFAIRS. IF WE COULD HAVE THE TECH TEAM PULL UP THE SLIDES 3 PLEASE? AS THE TITLE OF THIS PRESENTATION SAYS, WE CAN'T 4 5 AFFORD TO LOSE TRANSIT AND YOUR 2023 ADVOCACY PROGRAM IDENTIFIED SECURING STATE TRANSIT ASSISTANCE TO PROTECT 6 EXISTING SERVICE AND FUND RIDER FOCUSED ENHANCEMENTS AS OUR 7 8 TOP PRIORITY THIS YEAR. NEXT SLIDE. TODAY I'M GOING TO WALK THROUGH THE LATEST RIDERSHIP STATISTICS AND DEFICIT FORECASTS 9 FOR BAY AREA TRANSIT AGENCIES AND DESCRIBE OUR PROPOSED POLICY 10 PRINCIPLES AND FUNDING OPTIONS TO ADDRESS THE FISCAL CLIFF. 11 AND SUPPORT IMPLEMENTATION OF THE REGION'S TRANSIT 12 TRANSFORMATION ACTION PLAN, WHICH I BELIEVE YOU EACH HAVE AT 13 YOUR PLACE. NEXT SLIDE. SO, OVERALL, TRANSIT RIDERSHIP ACROSS 14 THE BAY AREA REMAINS AT ONLY 54% OF PRE-PANDEMIC LEVELS, THIS 15 16 IS BASED ON THE MOST RECENT DATA FROM THE NATIONAL TRANSIT 17 DATABASE, AVERAGE FROM DECEMBER TO FEBRUARY OF THIS YEAR. BUT, EVEN SO, IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT OVER 21 MILLION 18 19 PASSENGER TRIPS WERE TAKEN ON TRANSIT ON AVERAGE IN THAT PERIOD. SO IT IS STILL PROVIDING VERY IMPORTANT MOBILITY IN 20 THE REGION. ALSO NOTED HERE IS THAT THE DROP IN TRANSIT USAGE 21 22 IS NOT ENTIRELY EXPLAINED BY REMOTE WORK. ACCORDING TO THE CONSENSUS OF THOSE STILL COMMUTING THE SHARE TAKING TRANSIT 23 HAS FALLEN FROM 14% IN 2019 TO 5% IN 2021. HOPEFULLY IT'S 24

HIGHER THAN THAT. WE DON'T HAVE THE 2022 DATA YET BUT IT DOES



- 1 INDICATE THERE IS STILL AN OPPORTUNITY EVEN WESTERN THE
- 2 REDUCED MOBILITY AS A RESULT OF REMOTE WORK TO CAPTURE MORE OF
- 3 THOSE TRANSIT TRIPS. NEXT SLIDE. RIDERSHIP RECOVERY DOES VARY
- 4 A LOT BY OPERATOR, AS YOU CAN SEE HERE, WITH THE OPERATORS
- 5 THAT ARE PRIMARILY FOCUSED ON SERVING THE COMMUTE, THE MOST
- 6 DEPRESSED IN TERMS OF RECOVERY. YOU CAN SEE BART IS AROUND
- 7 40%, CALTRAIN IS NOT OUITE THERE, GOLDEN GATE TRANSIT AROUND
- 8 40% WHEREAS LOCAL BUS OPERATORS WHICH TEND TO SERVE MORE LOCAL
- 9 TRIPS HAVE SEEN MUCH MORE ROBUST RECOVERY. NEXT SLIDE. A QUICK
- 10 REMINDER OF WHAT WE LEARNED FROM THE SHORT RANGE TRANSIT PLANS
- 11 THAT OPERATORS FINALIZE IN FEBRUARY. AT THE TOP THERE, FAREBOX
- 12 DEPENDENT OPERATORS REMAIN VULNERABLE TO THE SLUGGISH
- 13 RIDERSHIP RECOVERY IT'S OUR COMMUTE ORIENTED SYSTEMS THAT TEND
- 14 TO HAVE THE HIGHEST FARES AND HIGHEST FAREBOX RECOVERY RATIOS
- 15 IT'S A DOUBLE WHAMMY FOR THEM WITH THE RIDERSHIP BEING MORE DE
- 16 DEPRESSED THAN OTHERS AND MORE DEPENDENT ON FARES IT'S
- 17 IMPORTANT TO NOTE COST IS A FACTOR PANDEMIC REVENUES WOULD NOT
- 18 BE SUFFICIENT TO PROVIDE THE HELVE OF SERVICE THAT WE'RE
- 19 PROVIDING TODAY REALLY A MISMATCH ACROSS THE REVENUES GROWING
- 20 COSTS HAVE BEEN EXACERBATED BY OVERALL INFLATION FISCAL CLIFF
- 21 IS NOT THE ONLY CHALLENGE FACING TRANSIT SOME AGENCIES AND
- 22 OPERATOR RECRUITMENT RETENTION ARE SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGES WHEN
- 23 IT COMES TO RESTORING TRANSIT SERVICE LEVELS THE FACT
- 24 AFFECTING MANY INDUSTRIES INCLUDING EDUCATION, HEALTH CARE,
- 25 IT'S A REAL CHALLENGE. NEXT SLIDE. THIS SLIDE ILLUSTRATES THE



- 1 CURRENT DEFICIT FORECAST PROVIDED BY BAY AREA OPERATORS
- 2 CONSISTENT WITH THEIR CURRENT BUDGET FORECAST. WHAT YOU CAN
- 3 SEE IS THAT FOR FISCAL YEAR '23, '24 THE BUDGET BEING
- 4 NEGOTIATED RIGHT NOW IN SACRAMENTO WE'RE LOOKING AT AROUND 70
- 5 MILLION THEN IT JUMPS UP SIGNIFICANTLY TO CLOSE TO 400 MILLION
- 6 THE FOLLOWING YEAR AND THEN OVER 700 MILLION IN THOSE OUT
- 7 YEARS. THIS REPRESENTS THE ANTICIPATED RIDERSHIP RECOVERY,
- 8 COST DRIVERS, AND OTHER OPERATORS AND THE REASON FOR THIS
- 9 SIGNIFICANT JUMP OVER THE NEXT TWO YEARS IS THAT SPEND-DOWN OF
- 10 THE COVID RELIEF FUNDING THAT WE RECEIVED. SO THE MISMATCH
- 11 BETWEEN ACTUAL REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES IS AROUND 700 MILLION
- 12 TODAY, BUT OPERATORS HAVE ACCESS TO THOSE COVID RELIEF FUNDS.
- 13 NEXT SLIDE. SO NEXT I'M GOING TO OUTLINE OUR ADVOCACY
- 14 FRAMEWORK FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF WHAT WE'RE CALLING STATE
- 15 TRANSIT RECOVERY FUNDS. NEXT SLIDE. THE CASE FOR WHY THE STATE
- 16 SHOULD STEP UP NOW TO PROTECT EXISTING TRANSIT SERVICE IS
- 17 REALLY CLEAR. FOR ONE, THE STATE IS A SIGNIFICANT INVESTOR IN
- 18 OUR TRANSIT SYSTEM, HAVING INVESTED ABOUT \$6.5 BILLION IN
- 19 EXPANDING THE BAY AREA'S TRANSIT NETWORK OVER THE LAST TWO
- 20 DECADES, BUT RELATIVELY LITTLE SUPPORT ITS OPERATIONS COMPARED
- 21 TO STATES WITH ROBUST TRANSIT SYSTEMS. CONGRESS BY CONTRAST
- 22 HAS STEPPED UP INFUSING \$4.4 BILLION TO SUSTAIN CURRENT
- 23 TRANSIT SERVICE. AND LAST BUT MOST IMPORTANTLY, TRANSIT IS
- 24 FOUNDATIONAL TO THE STATE'S CLIMATE AND EQUITY GOALS. WE
- 25 CANNOT CALL OURSELVES A STATE THAT LEADS ON CLIMATE CHANGE AND



- 1 LET OUR TRANSIT SYSTEMS COLLAPSE WE CANNOT CALL OURSELVES THE
- 2 STATE THAT CARES MOST ABOUT VULNERABLE POPULATIONS AND SLASH
- 3 TRANSIT SERVICE WHICH IS USED DISPROPORTIONATELY BY LOW-INCOME
- 4 RESIDENTS, PEOPLE OF COLOR, AND RENTERS. NEXT SLIDE. IF
- 5 TRANSIT IS TO REMAIN A CORE PART OF THE BAY AREA'S TRANSIT
- 6 SYSTEM THE STATE IS GOING TO NED TO STEP UP THESE ARE THE KEY
- 7 CONCEPTS GUIDING OUR ASK. FIRST TO SEEK NEW FUNDING FOR
- 8 TRANSIT OPERATIONS PRIMARILY BY SHIFTING EXISTING RESOURCES
- 9 THAT MINIMIZE IMPACT ON THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND. YOU'RE ALL
- 10 AWARE THAT THE STATE IS FACING A SIGNIFICANT DEFICIT. IT WAS
- 11 ESTIMATED IN JANUARY TO BE ABOUT 22 BILLION, RUMORS ARE THAT
- 12 IT'S GOING TO ACTUALLY BE OUITE A BIT HIGHER THAN THAT, BUT
- 13 WHAT WE'RE PROPOSING HERE DOES NOT SIGNIFICANTLY IMPACT THAT
- 14 PORTION OF THE BUDGET DEBATE. WE'RE REALLY LOOKING AT SHIFTING
- 15 OTHER FUNDING SOURCES. SECONDLY, WE DO RECOGNIZE THAT TRANSIT
- 16 HAS TO SHOW IT HAS SKIN IN THE GAME AND THIS THERE IS
- 17 EXPECTATION THAT TRANSIT IS WILLING TO FLEX SOME OF THE
- 18 FUNDING AVAILABLE FOR TRANSIT CAPITAL TO OPERATING. WE WANT TO
- 19 SEE FUNDING AVAILABLE TO ENSURE THAT TRANSIT SERVICES IS
- 20 MAINTAINED WHICH WE'RE CALLING THE SURVIVE BUCKET AS WELL AS
- 21 MAKE THOSE INVESTMENTS TO HELP MAKE TRANSIT THRIVE THAT ARE
- 22 HIGHLIGHTED IN OUR TRANSFORMATION ACTION PLAN. I WANT TO GIVE
- 23 THE LEGISLATURE A RANGE OF OPTIONS SO THEY CAN MAKE THE
- 24 DIFFICULT DECISIONS AROUND WEIGHING THE PROS AND CONS AND NOT
- 25 GIVING TOO NARROW OF A SET OF OPTIONS TO WORK FROM. ALSO WE DO



- 1 RECOGNIZE THAT THE LEGISLATURE IS GOING TO WANT TO SEE
- 2 COMMITMENTS ON THE PART OF TRANSIT AND WE HAVE SOME IDEAS FOR
- 3 HOW THE LEGISLATURE CAN ENCOURAGE IMPROVEMENTS TO TRANSIT
- 4 SERVICE. NEXT SLIDE. SO, AS I NOTED, THIS PRINCIPLE IS REALLY
- 5 ABOUT PROVIDING FUNDING BOTH TO SUSTAIN EXISTING SERVICE, THE
- 6 SURVIVE PIECE, AND ALLOW TRANSIT TO RETOOL, THE THRIVE
- 7 COMPONENT. NEXT SLIDE. PRINCIPLE TWO IS THAT THE SURVIVE FUNDS
- 8 SHOULD REALLY BE DISTRIBUTED BASED ON NEED. THE NEEDS ARE
- 9 REALLY DISPROPORTIONATE FOR CERTAIN OPERATORS, FOR EXAMPLE, IN
- 10 THE BAY AREA, WE ARE LOOKING ABOUT 2/3 OF THE NEED IS FOR BART
- 11 AND MUNI. AND MANY OF OUR OTHER REGIONS OPERATE -- MANY OF THE
- 12 OTHER REGIONAL OPERATORS DEPEND ON THE SUCCESS OF BART AND
- 13 MUNI, AND THEY ARE WELL AWARE OF THAT. BUT WE NEED TO BE
- 14 FOCUSING THE FUNDS WHERE THEY'RE MOST NEEDED. FOR THE THRIVE
- 15 CATEGORY, SOME KIND OF DISTRIBUTION BY FORMULA OR EVEN
- 16 COMPETITIVE MAKES SENSE BECAUSE EVERY OPERATOR IN THE STATE
- 17 COULD USE IMPROVEMENTS TO THEIR SERVICE TO ATTRACT NEW RIDERS.
- 18 AND THEN LASTLY, SINCE THE NEED IS NOT AS SIGNIFICANT TO
- 19 SUSTAIN SERVICE IN THAT NEXT BUDGET YEAR, MORE FUNDS COULD BE
- 20 FRONT-LOADED TO ADDRESS THOSE IMPROVEMENTS WHICH COULD REDUCE
- 21 OUT-YEAR DEFICITS BY ATTRACTING MORE RIDERS IN THE NEAR-TERM.
- 22 NEXT SLIDE. SO, NEXT I'M GOING TO OUTLINE WHAT OUR KEY FUNDING
- 23 SOURCE RECOMMENDATIONS ARE IN MORE DETAIL. NEXT SLIDE. SO THIS
- 24 CHART WHICH IS QUITE BUSY, YOU DON'T NEED TO COMMIT IT ALL TO
- 25 MEMORY RIGHT NOW REPRESENTS A MENU OF OPTIONS THAT I'LL



- 1 EXPLAIN IN DETAIL IN THE NEXT TWO SLIDES. I WOULD LIKE TO
- 2 HIGHLIGHT TWO MAIN CATEGORIES OF FUNDING. THE TOP FOUR MENU
- 3 ITEMS ARE NEW SOURCES OF PROPOSED TRANSIT OPERATING REVENUE
- 4 THAT ARE PROPOSED TO BE TEMPORARY. YOU CAN SEE IN THE MIDDLE
- 5 COLUMN IT INDICATES WHETHER THE CALIFORNIA TRANSIT
- 6 ASSOCIATIONS COMMITTEE THAT WAS STOOD UP TO LOOK AT THE FISCAL
- 7 CLIFF ENDORSED THESE OPTIONS. AND YOU CAN SEE THAT TWO OF THE
- 8 NEW ONES, THEY DID ENDORSE, THAT'S CAP-AND-TRADE AND THE
- 9 DIESEL SALES TAX SHIFT AND THE OTHERS THEY DID NOT AND I'M
- 10 GOING TO GET INTO MORE DETAIL IN A MINUTE ON WHAT EACH OF
- 11 THESE OPTIONS ARE. THE NEXT COLUMN IS THE AMOUNT THAT WE'RE
- 12 RECOMMENDING THE LEGISLATURE CONSIDER ON, AS A MAXIMUM IN EACH
- 13 OF THESE CATEGORIES. AND YOU WILL NOTE THAT 7.4 BILLION IS THE
- 14 SUMMATION OF THOSE. THAT IS MORE THAN WHAT THE CALIFORNIA
- 15 TRANSIT ASSOCIATION ESTIMATES AS THE TOTAL STATEWIDE NEED
- 16 WHICH IS AROUND 6 BILLION. BUT WE'RE -- WHAT WE'RE
- 17 RECOMMENDING IS TO GIVE THE LEGISLATURE, AGAIN, MORE CAPACITY
- 18 IN THE SET OF OPTIONS THAT WE'RE SUGGESTING, SO THAT THEY HAVE
- 19 MORE FLEXIBILITY TO MAKE ADJUSTMENTS. AND THE LAST COLUMN HERE
- 20 IS JUST ILLUSTRATING WITHIN EACH CATEGORY OF FUNDING WHAT
- 21 PORTION ARE WE SUGGESTING BE SHIFTED OR MADE AVAILABLE. NEXT
- 22 SLIDE. OKAY. SO OUR STAFF RECOMMENDATION IS THAT THE
- 23 COMMISSION ENDORSE EACH OF THOSE OPTIONS THAT WERE IN THAT
- 24 MENU, 1 THROUGH 4, STARTING WITH CAP-AND-TRADE. THIS AMOUNT IS
- 25 ABOUT 1/3 OF THE DISCRETIONARY FUNDING AVAILABLE. AS YOU



- 1 LIKELY ARE WELL AWARE, CAP-AND-TRADE IS DISTRIBUTED PRIMARILY
- 2 ON A CONTINUOUS APPROPRIATION BASIS WITH SPECIFIC PERCENTAGES
- 3 PROVIDED, FOR EXAMPLE, TO HIGH SPEED RAIL, TO AFFORDABLE
- 4 HOUSING. WHAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT HERE IS JUST THE PORTION
- 5 THAT'S CALLED DISCRETIONARY, WHERE THE LEGISLATURE
- 6 APPROPRIATES IT EACH YEAR AND IT'S ABOUT 1.5 BILLION. SO WE'RE
- 7 SUGGESTING THAT A MAXIMUM OF 500 MILLION BE MADE AVAILABLE IN
- 8 THAT CATEGORY. THIS WOULD FACILITATE, STILL, THE COMMITMENT
- 9 THAT IS THE GOVERNOR HAS RECOMMENDED FOR ZERO EMISSION
- 10 VEHICLES, AND STILL ACCOMMODATE THAT. CLEARLY CAP-AND-TRADE
- 11 ALSO HAS PRECEDENT FOR FUNDING TRANSIT AND HAS A STRONG NEXUS
- 12 TO CLIMATE CHANGE. THE NEXT BIG ITEM IS THE SHOPP.
- 13 SPECIFICALLY A PORTION OF THE NEW FEDERAL HIGHWAY FUNDING
- 14 INCREASE THAT THE STATE RECEIVED WHICH IS ROUGHLY 1 BILLION A
- 15 YEAR STAYING AT THE STATE. STAFF IS PROPOSING MAXIMUM OF 500
- 16 MILLION TO BE USED TO ADDRESS THE FISCAL CLIFF EACH YEAR
- 17 STARTING WITH THE 300 MILLION THE GOVERNOR HAS ALREADY SHIFTED
- 18 SOME FUNDS TO BACKFILL THE ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM
- 19 COMMITMENTS FROM LAST YEAR'S BUDGET. WE DO NOT MAKE THIS
- 20 RECOMMENDATION LIGHTLY. MTC HAS BEEN A CHAMPION OF THE
- 21 IMPORTANCE OF FIX IT FIRST WITH 2/3 OF PLANNED BAY AREA'S
- 22 TRANSPORTATION SPENDING GOING TOWARDS MAINTAINING AND
- 23 OPERATING OUR CURRENT TRANSPORTATION NETWORK AND THE REASON WE
- 24 FEEL THIS RECOMMENDATION IS SOUND IS THANKS TO THE HUGE
- 25 INCREASE IN FEDERAL HIGHWAY FORMULA FUNDING THAT THE STATE



- 1 RECEIVED FROM THE INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT AND JOBS ACT AND
- 2 THAT FUNDING INCREASE WAS SO SIGNIFICANT THAT THIS SHIFT IN
- 3 FUND COULD BE DONE WITHOUT IMPACTING ANY EXISTING SHOPP
- 4 PROJECTS WHICH IS AN \$18 BILLION PROGRAM OVER FOUR YEARS AND
- 5 ACCOMMODATING A 19% INCREASE IN SHOPP PROGRAMMING. GIVEN THAT
- 6 WE THINK IT'S WORTHY OF CONSIDERATION AND ADVANCEMENT TO THE
- 7 LEGISLATURE. THE NEXT ONE IS THE DIESEL SALES TAX. THIS IS THE
- 8 SOLE FUNDING SOURCE TODAY, THE DIESEL SALES TAX FOR STATE
- 9 TRANSIT ASSISTANCE RECEIVING 80% OF THAT PROGRAM, BUT A SMALL
- 10 PORTION DOES NOT GO TO PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AND THAT WAS
- 11 ACTUALLY SUSPENDED, 2.5% OF THE RATE WAS SUSPENDED IN LAST
- 12 YEAR'S BUDGET TO PROVIDE SOME ECONOMIC RELIEF. OUR
- 13 RECOMMENDATION IS THAT WHEN THAT COMES BACK ONLINE, THIS
- 14 OCTOBER, THOSE FUNDS BE ALSO DEDICATED TO TRANSIT, BUT THIS
- 15 WOULD REOUIRE A GENERAL FUND BACKFILL. SO, THAT IS ONE OF THE
- 16 LIMITATIONS OF THIS PROPOSAL. AND, LASTLY, THE TRANSPORTATION
- 17 IMPROVEMENT FEE, OR TIF, THIS WOULD REPRESENT A MODEST
- 18 INCREASE IN THIS REGISTRATION FEE WHOSE RATE VARIES DEPENDING
- 19 ON THE VALUE OF THE VEHICLE. PROPOSAL HERE WOULD EXEMPT 40% OF
- 20 THE STATE A VEHICLES BY PROPOSING NO SURCHARGE ON VEHICLES
- 21 VALUED BELOW \$5,000 AND ONLINE A \$10 SURCHARGE ON VEHICLES UP
- 22 TO 35,000. SO, THAT IS THAT. AND THEN I'M GOING TO WALK
- 23 THROUGH THE NEXT SET OF RECOMMENDATIONS ON FUNDING SHIFTS.
- 24 NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO, AS YOU MAY RECALL FROM THE SLIDE WITH
- 25 THE TABLE, CTA ALSO ENDORSED A NUMBER OF FUNDING SHIFTS FROM



- 1 EXISTING REVENUE. THOSE INCLUDE CONTINUING TO PROVIDE
- 2 FLEXIBILITY IN WHAT'S CALLED THE LC-TOP, LOW CARBON TRANSIT
- 3 OPERATIONS PROGRAM AND THE STATE TRANSIT ASSISTANCE STATE OF
- 4 GOOD REPAIR. THOSE ARE ALREADY BEING USED FOR TRANSIT
- 5 OPERATIONS IN THE BAY AREA. SO THAT'S GREAT TO CONTINUE THAT.
- 6 IT DOES NOT HELP THE REGION. SO, WE'RE JUST STAYING NEUTRAL ON
- 7 THAT TO REALLY PUT THE FOCUS ON THE NEW REVENUE. THE OTHER TWO
- 8 ITEMS ARE SHIFTING, THE TIRCP PROGRAM, THE TRANSIT AND INNER
- 9 CITY RAIL CAPITAL PROGRAM, THEIR TWO PORTIONS OF THIS PROGRAM,
- 10 ONE WAS THE GENERAL FUND AUGMENTATION THAT WE HAVE YET TO
- 11 RECEIVE BUT ARE HOPING TO RECEIVE IN THIS YEAR'S BUDGET THEN
- 12 THERE'S THE REGULAR TIRCP THAT WE JUST HEARD EARLIER TODAY WE
- 13 RECEIVED A NUMBER OF PROJECTS IN THE BAY AREA HAVE RECEIVED
- 14 AWARD ON WHAT YOU CAN SEE HERE IS CONCERN THAT WE HAVE ADOPTED
- 15 COMMITMENT FOR HOW TO SPEND THESE FUNDS IN OUR MAJOR PROJECT
- 16 ADVANCEMENT SO RELYING ON THESE FUNDS WOULD PUT MAJOR PROJECT
- 17 ADVANCEMENTS IN JEOPARDY. LASTLY, LEGISLATURE WILL MAKE SOME
- 18 DEMANDS IN TERMS OF ACCOUNTABILITY WHAT THEY WANT TO SEE FROM
- 19 TRANSIT AGENCIES IN EXCHANGE FOR THESE FUNDS THAT'S NOT
- 20 UNREASONABLE BUT ALSO DOES REPRESENT AN OPPORTUNITY TO
- 21 ACCELERATE TRANSFORMATION ACTIONS ALREADY UNDERWAY HIGHLIGHTED
- 22 HERE, SAFETY, CONVENIENCE AND SPEED WITH ANY REQUIREMENTS
- 23 ATTACHED TO FUNDS WE PROPOSE ADVOCATING THEY INCLUDE RIDER
- 24 FOCUSED IMPROVEMENTS. NEXT SLIDE. LAST BUT NOT LEAST,
- 25 LEGISLATURE WANTS TO KNOW WHAT IS THE LONG-TERM PLAN FOR



- 1 TRANSIT TRANSITION TO A FINANCIALLY SUSTAINABLE BUSINESS
- 2 MODEL. WE ARE ANTICIPATING DEFICITS IN THE RANGE OF 700
- 3 MILLION BUT MAKING A FIVE YEAR ASK HERE, WHAT IS THE PLAN.
- 4 WHAT'S ILLUSTRATED HERE IS SHORTHAND TO SHOW THAT WE DO IN
- 5 FACT HAVE A PLAN AND SOME OF IT IS ALREADY UNDERWAY THANKS TO
- 6 THE TRANSFORMATION ACTION PLAN IMPLEMENTING SOME OF THOSE
- 7 PROJECTS AND PILOTS INCLUDING RELATED TO INTEGRATE THE FARES.
- 8 ALREADY HAPPENING NETWORK MANAGEMENT IS BEING STOOD UP LATER
- 9 THIS YEAR AND ALSO STARTING NOW BUT TO BE COMPLETED IN 2025 IS
- 10 THE TRANSIT 2050 PLUS WHICH IS A TRANSIT NETWORK PLAN TO
- 11 REALLY CHART OUT WHAT THE REGION'S TRANSIT NETWORK SHOULD BE,
- 12 HOW MUCH IS ANTICIPATED TO COST, AND THEN OF COURSE, NEXT
- 13 YEAR, ASSUMING THAT WE CONTINUE ON THE PATH THAT THE
- 14 COMMISSION HAS DIRECTED US ALREADY, WE PLAN TO PURSUE ENABLING
- 15 LEGISLATION FOR A REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION MEASURE TO PUT ON
- 16 THE BALLOT IN 2026 AND BY 2028 MANY OF THE TRANSFORMATION
- 17 ACTION PLAN PRIORITIES WILL BE WELL UNDERWAY IN TERMS OF
- 18 IMPLEMENTATION, REALLY PUTTING US ON A MUCH MORE STABLE
- 19 FOOTING. SO, YOU KNOW, THERE IS GOING TO BE MANY MORE ACTIONS
- 20 THAT ARE ILLUSTRATED ON THIS SLIDE THAT NEED TO HAPPEN, BUT

- 24 HAPPENING IN SACRAMENTO THIS MORNING THE SENATE IS EXPECTED TO
- 25 RELEASE THEIR SENATE BUDGET PLAN FROM THE SENATE PRO TEMPORE,



TONY ATKINS WHICH WE BELIEVE WILL REFERENCE TRANSIT IN THAT 1 PLAN. SENATOR WIENER HAS ENDORSED ALL OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS 2 BEFORE YOU TODAY, AND IS HOLDING A PRESS CONFERENCE AT NOON 3 RELATED TO CHAMPION, YOU KNOW, THE NEED TO ADDRESS THIS IN THE 4 5 BUDGET. - 3 THE NUMBERS WE'RE GETTING, THIS FISCAL CLIFF, YOU KNOW, HOW
- 4 ACCURATE ARE THOSE NUMBERS? HOW ARE WE VERIFYING THOSE
- 5 NUMBERS? THAT'S NUMBER ONE. AND THE OTHER IS, YOU KNOW, AS YOU
- 6 SHOW THAT ONE CHART WITH THE RIDERSHIP RECOVERY VARIES, YOU
- 7 KNOW WHEN YOU LOOK AT THE SMALL OPERATORS, THEY SEEM TO BE
- 8 RECOVERING, AND SERVING THEIR LOCAL COMMUNITIES. AND YOU ALL
- 9 HAVE HEARD ME SAY THIS BEFORE, I THINK THE SMALL OPERATORS

- 16 ACTION PLAN, WE ARE -- WE ARE BEING VERY SHORTSIGHTED. THIS IS
- 17 AN OPPORTUNITY THAT MOST OF US WON'T SEE AGAIN IN OUR
- 18 POLITICAL LIFE. AND I THINK WE HAVE GOT TO CONDITION THE
- 19 MONEY, DEMAND THE CHANGES THAT WE HAVE SEEN, DEMAND THE
- 20 CHANGES THAT THE RIDERS HAVE CLEARLY IDENTIFIED, AND THIS
- 21 NETWORK MANAGER, I DON'T THINK, IF IT EVER HAS BEEN MORE

- 1 THERE SHOULD BE A HELL OF A LOT MORE DISCUSSION, ESPECIALLY ON
- 2 1, 2, 3, 4, AND THE OTHER ONES. BUT I WOULD LIKE TO HEAR FROM
- 3 MY COLLEAGUES ON HOW THEY FEEL ABOUT THAT. BUT THIS IS A BIG
- 4 DECISION THAT YOU'RE ASKING US TO MAKE TODAY. I MEAN, THIS
- 5 REALLY AFFECTS A LOT OF PROJECTS. YOU KNOW? AND, YOU KNOW,
- 6 THIS LAST WINTER, I DON'T KNOW ABOUT MOST COUNTIES, BUT THE

- 12 DISCUSSION. SO, MR. CHAIRMAN, THOSE ARE MY COMMENTS. I JUST
- 13 THINK THIS IS REALLY A VERY IMPORTANT DECISION THAT WE'RE
- 14 MAKING TODAY

- 16 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU, COMMISSIONER SPERING. AND,
- 17 LOOK, I CONCUR WITH THE COMMENTS THAT YOU HAVE MADE. I DO WANT
- 18 TO SEE THIS MOVE FORWARD WITH A CONDITION. AND TO ME, A LOT OF

- 1 DECISIONS WE NEED CONFIDENCE IN THAT. REBECCA PART OF WHAT I'M
- 2 GOING TO BE ASKING FOR IS YOU COME BACK WITH THAT TYPE OF
- 3 INFORMATION BUT ALSO WHAT OPERATORS ARE DOING TO BE
- 4 RESPONSIBLE AND ALSO TO BE A PARTNER IN ADDRESSING THE FISCAL
- 5 CLIFF WE'RE FACING. I THINK THAT IS CRITICAL. SO, TO ME,
- 6 THAT'S PART OF WHAT I WANT TO SEE. AND YOU KNOW, AS
- 7 COMMISSIONER SPERING MENTIONED, THIS JUST UNDERSCORES THE NEED
- 8 FOR NETWORK MANAGEMENT AND WHAT WE'RE DOING. AND THAT'S
- 9 HAPPENING ON THAT TRACK. SO I DON'T WANT TO WALK BACK WHAT
- 10 WE'RE DOING AND WE'RE GOING TO BE TALKING ABOUT THAT TOMORROW
- 11 OF SOME THINGS THAT ARE IN MOTION ALREADY WHERE OUTCOMES DON'T
- 12 MATERIALIZE BUT THERE IS A LOT IN MOTION. MOST IMPORTANTLY IS
- 13 THE DATA AND HOLDING EVERYONE ACCOUNTABLE NOT JUST THE
- 14 OPERATORS. THE OPERATORS WANT TO BE ACCOUNTABLE BUT I WANT TO
- 15 MAKE SURE WHAT WE DO HERE IS NOT PROLONGING A BIGGER ISSUE,
- 16 THAT WE ARE TRYING TO GET RIDERSHIP BACK, AND WHAT WE DO HAS
- 17 TO BE GEARED TOWARDS THAT, AND TO ME, WE NEED TO BE VERY
- 18 INTENTIONAL OF THAT. COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ?
- 20 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: YES. THANK YOU. YOU KNOW, FIRST OF ALL, I
- 21 JUST WANT TO SAY HOW MUCH I APPRECIATE THAT THE STAFF DIDN'T
- 22 HAVE A GREAT -- A BUNCH OF GREAT CHOICES. RIGHT? AND THAT ALL
- 23 OF OUR AGENCIES ACROSS THE BOARD ARE REALLY SUFFERING, AND I

- 3 THE LAST THING YOU SAID ALFREDO, AND THAT IS I BELIEVE THAT
- 4 EVERY SINGLE ONE OF OUR AGENCIES IS TRYING TO FIGURE OUT HOW
- 5 TO SURVIVE. SO, I THINK THAT'S ONE. I THINK TWO, THAT FOR MANY
- 6 OF OUR AGENCIES, THE LIFE CYCLE OF THE IMPACTS OF THE ECONOMY,
- 7 THE IMPACTS OF RIDERSHIP HAVE ALL HIT THEM DIFFERENTLY, AND

- 14 ABOUT IS GETTING INTO AN US/THEM. WE'RE ONE TEAM, AND WE HAVE
- 15 GOT TO COMPORT OURSELVES THAT WAY. I WANT TO GIVE ONE EXAMPLE
- 16 THAT I THINK IS CRITICAL FOR US TO THINK ABOUT. I'M GOING TO
- 17 USE VTA AS AN EXAMPLE. SO, WE, THE VALLEY TRANSPORTATION
- 18 AUTHORITY, I SIT ON THE VTA BOARD AND THE CALTRAIN BOARD. THEY
- 19 COULDN'T BE MORE DIFFERENT IN TERMS OF HOW THEY'RE RESPONDING
- 20 -- NOT HOW THEY'RE RESPONDING -- BUT HOW THEY'RE BEING
- 21 IMPACTED. VTA, FOR YEARS AND YEARS AND YEARS, BECAUSE OF OUR
- 22 LOW FAREBOX RECOVERY, AND THE 1200 ACRES, 1200 SQUARE MILES WE
- 23 COVER, HAVE BEEN CUTTING SERVICES FOR YEARS SO MUCH SO THAT
- 24 WE'RE DOWN TO A SPINE TRYING TO MAKE SURE WE'RE ABLE TO
- 25 CONNECT BECAUSE WE'RE AN INTEGRATED SERVICE AND REALLY TRYING



- 1 TO GET SMALL SO WE COULD GROW. FOR CALTRAIN, CALTRAIN WAS
- 2 ZOOMING DOWN GETTING BIGGER AND BIGGER AND BIGGER BECAUSE THE
- 3 FAREBOX RECOVERY, I THINK WAS, AT ITS HIGH .74%, VTA IS AT 14.
- 4 SO, VTA, PRIOR TO COVID WAS ALREADY SCOPING DOWN. CALTRAIN'S
- 5 SCOPING UP, AND NOW THEY DON'T HAVE FAREBOX TO CONTINUE TO
- 6 GROW. EACH OF THOSE AGENCIES IS PROPOSING SOME STRATEGIES THAT
- 7 I THINK WE NEED TO ASK OURSELVES, WHAT ARE THE SHARED
- 8 STRATEGIES, WHAT ARE THE DIFFERENT STRATEGIES, BASED ON WHAT
- 9 YOU SAID JIM ON SIZE, IMPLICATIONS OF THE CURRENT ECONOMIC
- 10 FRAMEWORK. TO MAKE IT AN US NOT THEM FRAMEWORK WE SHOULD
- 11 INVITE THEM HAVE THE SAME QUESTIONS FOR ALL OF THEM GIVE THEM
- 12 FIVE SLIDES 15 MINUTES. I REALLY DON'T CARE BUT I THINK I
- 13 DON'T WANT TO PUT OUR STAFF IN AN AWKWARD POSITION IN
- 14 TESTIMONY OF DEFENDING AND NOT DEFENDING HOW PEOPLE ARE DOING
- 15 THEIR WORLD. AND THE LAST THING I WANT TO ADD WHICH IS A NON
- 16 SEQUITUR BUT RELATED TO OUR CHAMPIONS IN SACRAMENTO. OUR
- 17 CHAMPIONS OF IN DIFFERENT PLACES BASED ON WHAT THE IMMEDIATE
- 18 NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITIES ARE. AND ONE THING I HOPE COMES OUT
- 19 OF OUR DISCUSSION IS THAT WE ALL CAN HAVE SOME SHARED
- 20 STRATEGIES THAT WE CAN SHARE WITH OUR ENTIRE DELEGATION. I DID
- 21 -- THE CHAIR OF OUR COMMITTEE, CHAIR JOSEFOWITZ ASKED US TO
- 22 MAKE SOME PHONE CALLS, AND IT WILL NOT SURPRISE YOU, DEPENDING
- 23 ON WHERE YOU SIT IS HOW YOU SEE THE WORLD, AND I -- WHICH
- 24 MAKES SENSE, RIGHT? -- BUT TO THAT END, I THINK TO
- 25 COMMISSIONER SPERING'S POINT, THAT THE COMMISSION NOT



- 1 NECESSARILY THE STATE, BUT THE COMMISSION NEEDS TO BUILD IN
- 2 ENOUGH FLEXIBILITY IN OUR REQUESTS THAT IT ALLOWS THE
- 3 COMMISSION TO RESPOND REGIONALLY IN THE BEST FAITH THAT WE CAN
- 4 DO THAT. SO, ANYWAY, THOSE ARE KIND OF SOME BROAD THOUGHTS.
- 5 THANK YOU COLLEAGUES

- 7 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ. GREAT
- 8 COMMENTS. I AGREE WITH YOU IT'S NOT ABOUT US VERSUS THEM WE'RE
- 9 ALL IN THIS TOGETHER. THAT'S SO IMPORTANT. THANK YOU FOR THAT.
- 10 VICE CHAIR JOSEFOWITZ, THEN COMMISSIONER PAPAN THEN
- 11 COMMISSIONER RONEN.

- 13 V. CHAIR, NICK JOSEFOWITZ: THANK YOU. COMMISSIONER SPERING, I
- 14 THINK -- YOU KNOW, I CERTAINLY HEAR YOUR CONCERNS ABOUT THIS.
- 15 AND THESE WERE ALL CHALLENGES THAT WE GRAPPLED WITH IN THE AD-
- 16 HOC, AND WE HAD DISCUSSIONS ABOUT WHETHER WE -- ABOUT WHETHER
- 17 WE NEEDED TO DO MORE WORK ON THIS BEFORE BRINGING IT TO THE
- 18 COMMISSION. AND, UNFORTUNATELY, WE'RE NOT ON OUR OWN TIMELINE

- 23 DON'T HAVE THE LUXURY OF KIND OF PAUSING TO MAKE THIS AS GOOD
- 24 AS IT SHOULD BE, AND AS COMPREHENSIVE AS IT SHOULD BE. BECAUSE
- 25 WE NEED TO, I THINK, GIVE STAFF, SORT OF, THIS INITIAL



- 1 DIRECTION, WHICH DOESN'T HAVE TO BE THE FINAL DIRECTION, BUT
- 2 THE INITIAL DIRECTION TO KIND OF BE ABLE TO ENGAGE
- 3 SUCCESSFULLY ON BEHALF OF THE REGION IN SACRAMENTO. AND SO, I
- 4 THINK THAT'S ANOTHER ONE OF THE DIFFICULT DECISIONS WHICH

- 11 REEMPHASIZE THIS, THAT THESE FUNDING -- THIS REALLY IS, SORT
- 12 OF, A TRANSITIONAL MOMENT, AND THAT WE ARE TRULY ASKING FOR

- 1 SOURCES AGAIN, FROM THE STATE. AND I THINK ON THE HIGHWAY
- 2 FUNDING, IT'S -- THERE IS ANOTHER ELEMENT WHICH ALSO MAKES IT,
- 3 I THINK, NATURALLY MORE TEMPORARY, BECAUSE WE'RE NOT GOING UP
- 4 -- WHAT THE RECOMMENDATION WAS, WAS NOT TO TOUCH ANY OF THE
- 5 BASE FUNDING THAT MIGHT BE ALLOCATED TO SHOPP BY THE STATE.
- 6 AND IT HASN'T YET BEEN ALLOCATED TO SHOPP BY THE STATE. IT'S
- 7 FUNDING COMING FROM THE IRA WHICH ITSELF IS TEMPORARY. SO THAT
- 8 IS GOING TO -- THAT IS NOT GOING TO BE PERMANENT. SPECIFICALLY
- 9 IN PRESIDENT BIDEN'S BUDGET, FY 2024 BUDGET MESSAGE, IT'S
- 10 SPEAKING TO THESE FUNDS SPECIFICALLY, OF WHICH WE ARE, SORT
- 11 OF, THE AD-HOC RECOMMENDED THAT WE ADVOCATE TO THE STATE TO
- 12 FLEX A PORTION OF THEM TO TRANSIT OPERATIONS ON A TEMPORARY
- 13 BASIS, AND I QUOTE "THE BUDGET ALSO ENCOURAGES STATES TO
- 14 SUPPORT THEIR TRANSIT SYSTEMS BY TRANSFERRING AVAILABLE
- 15 FEDERAL AID, HIGHWAY FUNDING FOR TRANSIT OPERATING NEEDS." SO,
- 16 EVEN IN PRESIDENT BIDEN'S BUDGET FOR THIS TEMPORARY IRA BOOST
- 17 TO FEDERAL AID HIGHWAY FUNDING, HE ALREADY ENVISIONED THERE
- 18 COULD BE, SORT OF, TEMPORARY TRANSFERS TO TRANSIT OPERATING
- 19 NEEDS FOR STATES LIKE OURS THAT REALLY NEED IT. AND IT'S
- 20 CERTAINLY SOMETHING THAT WE -- YOU KNOW, IT WAS A DIFFICULT --
- 21 IT WAS DIFFICULT, AND THERE IS A GOOD CHANCE THAT, YOU KNOW,
- 22 FOR WHATEVER REASON, THAT WE DON'T -- THE STATE DECIDES NOT TO
- 23 FLEX THIS FEDERAL AID HIGHWAY FUNDING TO TRANSIT OPERATIONS
- 24 BUT IT'S IMPORTANT TO KIND OF KEEP IT ON THE TABLE AT THIS

- 1 GOING UP IN SACRAMENTO AND THESE FAST MOVING BUDGET
- 2 NEGOTIATIONS ARE. AND I THINK TO REITERATE WHAT EVERYONE ELSE
- 3 SAID WE WISH THERE WERE AS MANY OPTIONS GOING UP TO SACRAMENTO
- 4 BUT UNFORTUNATELY WE HAVE TO PICK FROM A BUNCH OF BAD OPTIONS.
- 5 ALL THE POINTS YOU MADE, COMMISSIONER SPERING, WERE REALLY
- 6 VALID.

14 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: WE'RE ALL GOING TO GET TO TALK.

- 16 GINA PAPAN: STAFF, THANK YOU FOR ALL YOUR HARD WORK AND EFFORT
- 17 HERE, BUT I REALLY NEED TO EMPHASIZE WHAT COMMISSIONER SPERING
- 18 SAID HERE. WE HAVE HAD EVERY OPPORTUNITY. AND I HAVE SEEN THE
- 19 LEGISLATIVE PACKET THAT WENT BEFORE THIS, AND AT THE VERY END,
- 20 THERE WAS JUST A COMMENT ON DOING BETTER. AND I HEAR A
- 21 STATEMENT FROM THE PROVIDERS, FROM BART, WE'RE GOING TO MAKE
- 22 THIS AND THAT AND MAKE IT CLEANER. IT'S A LOT OF TALK. AND WE
- 23 WANT TO -- THE PLAN HERE IS GREAT. BUT YOU'RE GOING TO THE
- 24 STATE BUDGET AND THEY'RE HEARING FROM EVERY ONE OF THEIR, THE
- 25 PEOPLE THEY REPRESENT. IT'S NOT WORKING RIGHT. AND WE WANT



- 1 THEM TO GET THE FUNDING. DON'T GET ME WRONG. I WANT THIS
- 2 FUNDING TO GO, BUT IF WE DON'T SEND THE MESSAGE ALONG WITH
- 3 THAT, WE CONSISTENTLY, YOU KNOW, APPROVE THINGS. WE TALK -- WE
- 4 HAVE GREAT CONVERSATIONS HERE. WE SAY WONDERFUL THINGS HERE
- 5 AND IT DOESN'T -- IT'S NOT WRITTEN IN WHAT GOES FORWARD. AND
- 6 THIS IS A TRANSITION, BUT IF COMMUNICATIVE IN THAT TRANSITION,

- 19 HAVE TO BE CLEAR ON THE PRIORITIES, THE BLUE RIBBON, THE
- 20 TRANSFORMATION PLAN HERE. BECAUSE WE HAVEN'T BEFORE. WE
- 21 LITERALLY HAVE NOT. WE SPENT ALL THIS TIME ON THAT PLAN. WHEN
- 22 I FIRST GOT ON THIS COMMISSION, WE ALREADY HAD A RESOLUTION
- 23 THAT SAID MUCH OF THAT, AND NOBODY ENFORCED IT. NOBODY
- 24 BELIEVED IT. WE BELIEVE IN THIS. THAT MESSAGE HAS TO GO WITH,
- 25 THIS IS THE FUNDING THAT WE RECOMMEND. IF IT DOESN'T, BAD ON



- 1 US. IT WON'T HAPPEN. IT WILL NOT HAPPEN. BECAUSE THE CLIFF IS
- 2 SO CLEARLY THERE. EVERYBODY, THAT MESSAGE HAS TO GO FORWARD
- 3 WITH WHATEVER WE DO HERE. AND I AM CONCERNED ABOUT THE SHOPP
- 4 FUNDING. THE TRANSPORTATION -- THE HIGHWAY FUNDING. THAT'S A
- 5 REALLY RIGHT NOW THAT, AS I THINK REBECCA SAID, FIX IT NOW --
- 6 I'M A LITTLE UNFAMILIAR WITH THE TERMINOLOGY. BUT YOU ALSO
- 7 SUGGESTED IT WOULDN'T HAVE THAT IMPACT. SO I'M A LITTLE
- 8 CONFUSED ON THAT FRONT. AND WE REALLY NEED THE ROADS FIXED,
- 9 REPAIRS ARE JUST GOING TO GET WORSE AND WORSE AND WORSE. AND,
- 10 SO, IT'S AN INTERESTING QUANDARY. WE -- I THINK EVERYBODY HERE
- 11 AGREES, WE NEED THE FUNDING. BUT, I MUST EMPHASIZE
- 12 COMMISSIONER SPERING'S COMMENTS HERE, THAT MESSAGE NEEDS TO BE
- 13 SENT NOW. AND IT -- YOU CAN'T SLOW IT DOWN. SO, PLEASE, IT'S
- 14 THE BIGGEST MESSAGE WE CAN SENDS. IF WE'RE NOT SENDING IT NOW,
- 15 AS WE LEAD UP TO THE BALLOT MEASURE, IT'S WHAT DID YOU DO FOR
- 16 ME? AND YOU DIDN'T DO IT. I HOPE WE MOVE ALONG AND GETTING
- 17 FUNDING AS WELL. I DON'T HAVE THE MAGIC PILL HERE.

- 19 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THERE IS NO MAGIC PILL. WE'LL GET
- 20 FURTHER DISCUSSION. COMMISSIONER RONEN?

- 22 HILLARY RONEN: THANK YOU. I'M GOING TO STATE THE OBVIOUS HERE,
- 23 BUT I FEEL NECESSARY TO DO SO, BECAUSE OF THIS DISCUSSION.
- 24 FIRST BEFORE I DO THAT, I WANT TO THANK STAFF. YOU DID A
- 25 PHENOMENAL JOB. I SUPPORT THIS WHOLEHEARTEDLY. IT'S NOT AS IF



- 1 WE'RE REACHING THIS CLIFF OUT OF NOWHERE, OR BECAUSE OF A
- 2 PROBLEM WITH OUR FUNDAMENTAL SYSTEM. WE'RE REACHING THIS CLIFF
- 3 BECAUSE OF A WORLDWIDE PANDEMIC AND THE FACT THAT WORK HAS
- 4 FUNDAMENTALLY TRANSFORMED IN THE REGION. AND WE CANNOT LETS
- 5 THIS FUNDAMENTAL INFRASTRUCTURE IN OUR REGION, THAT IS
- 6 ESSENTIAL TO MEETING OUR CLIMATE GOALS, ESSENTIAL TO SERVING
- 7 THE NEEDS OF THE POOREST AMONGST US BY LETTING IT FAIL. I JUST
- 8 WANT TO REMIND US FOR A MOMENT HOW DEEPLY IMPORTANT OUR
- 9 TRANSIT SYSTEM IS. AGAIN, I KNOW I'M STATING THE OBVIOUS HERE.
- 10 BUT I THINK WE NEED TO GO BACK TO THOSE BASICS, BECAUSE THE
- 11 SITUATION IS THAT DIRE. AND IF WE DON'T SUPPORT OUR SYSTEM, I
- 12 FEAR WE WILL LOSE ENTIRE -- ENTIRE AGENCIES. THAT'S HOW BAD
- 13 THINGS ARE. I DO BELIEVE WE HAVE A LONG-TERM PLAN. I ALSO
- 14 BELIEVE WE DON'T KNOW HOW RIDERSHIP WILL CHANGE OVER THE NEXT
- 15 FOUR YEARS IF WE ARE ABLE TO MAINTAIN THE LEVEL OF SERVICE
- 16 THAT WE HAVE NOW. IF WE CONTINUE TO REDUCE THAT SERVICE, IT'S
- 17 THAT DO LOOP THAT EVERYONE LOVES TO TALK ABOUT IN SAN
- 18 FRANCISCO. BUT I REALLY BELIEVE THAT DO LOOP IS A REALITY FOR
- 19 OUR TRANSIT AGENCIES. SO, I JUST -- I AGREE WITH COMMISSIONER
- 20 SPERING. THERE IS MAYBE NOTHING MORE IMPORTANT THAN THE
- 21 DISCUSSION IN THIS ACTION WE'RE ABOUT TO TAKE. AND THE
- 22 URGENCY, AS COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ MENTIONED, IS RIGHT NOW.
- 23 IT'S THIS BUDGET YEAR. AND I REALLY LOOK FORWARD TO SUPPORTING
- 24 THIS ITEM TODAY. THANKS.



CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER. 1 2 3 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI: YES. THANK YOU. DOOM LOOP, IS THAT WHAT YOU JUST CALLED IT? [LAUGHTER] 4 5 HILLARY RONEN: ALL YOU HAVE TO READ IS ANY ARTICLE ABOUT SAN 6 7 FRANCISCO AND THEY MENTION A DOOM LOOP. 8 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI: THE REASON I MENTION IT IS BECAUSE THIS 9 10 MORNING THERE WAS NEWS ABOUT TRANSIT BART, THE FISCAL CLIFF, AND WHAT YOU HAVE, BUT THEY WERE CALLING ALL OF THE TRANSIT 11 OPERATORS TO A DEATH SPIRAL. I KNOW YOU PUT A LOT OF THOUGHT INTO IT, AND YOU 16 ALL AGREE AS I'M HEARING HERE AS WELL WE DON'T HAVE A LOT OF GREAT OPTIONS BUT WE HAVE TO DO SOMETHING. I'M GLAD TO 23 HEAR THIS IS TEMPORARY, BECAUSE IT'S GOING TO BE A HARD ASK 24

WHOLE BUNCH OF DIFFERENT POTS BUT YET WE'RE ASKING YOU FOR 1 EVEN MORE ON A PERMANENT BASIS. SO, THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR 2 3 ENTERTAINING MY COMMENTS. 4 5 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU. COMMISSIONER CANEPA? 6 DAVID CANEPA: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. AND THANK YOU, REBECCA, FOR 7 8 YOUR PRESENTATION. I THINK THIS ALL COMES DOWN TO CHOICES. AND WE HAVE DIFFICULT CHOICES TO MAKE.
