ARE THERE ANY MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE WISHING TO PULL AN ITEM? SEEING 19 NONE. IS THERE ANY MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC WHO HAS SENT IN 20 ANYTHING OR WANT TO SPEAK ON THIS ITEM? 21 22 23 CLERK OF THE BOARD: THERE ARE NO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WITH THEIR HAND RAISED, AND THERE WAS NO PUBLIC COMMENT SUBMITTED 24 ON THIS ITEM. 25

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1 FEDERAL GLOVER, CHAIR: OKAY. I WOULD ENTERTAIN A MOTION. OKAY. 2 3 AND A SECOND? WE HAVE A MOTION BY CHAVEZ, A SECOND BY RONEN. ROLL CALL, PLEASE? 4 5 CLERK OF THE BOARD: THANK YOU, MR. CHAIR. NO NEED TO DO THE 6 ROLL CALL SINCE WE'RE IN-PERSON WE'LL SIMPLY NEED TO STATE 7 8 THAT THE MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY BY ALL MEMBERS PRESENT? 9 FEDERAL GLOVER, CHAIR: IF THAT'S THE CASE. 10 11 CLERK OF THE BOARD: IT IS THE CASE. 12 13 FEDERAL GLOVER, CHAIR: [LAUGHTER] OKAY. ALL IN FAVOR? AYE. 14 15 OPPOSED? OKAY. MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY BY ALL MEMBERS 16 PRESENT. ON TO OUR NEXT ITEM ON THE AGENDA. WHICH IS 3A, MTC RESOLUTION 4565 GRANT FUNDING FOR MTC TO BAIFA FOR REGIONAL 17 EARLY ACTION PLANNING GRANT HOUSING PRESERVATION PRIORITY SITE 18 PROGRAM AND AUTHORITY TO THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO TAKE 19 ACTIONS ON IMPLEMENTATION OF THE GRANT. AND WE HAVE WITH US 20 21 TODAY, I THINK SAMOYA? DID I PRONOUNCE THAT RIGHT? 22 SOMAYA ABDELGANY: HELLO COMMITTEE THANK YOU FOR HAVING ME HERE 23 TODAY. MY NAME IS SOMAYA, I AM THE PRESERVATION PROGRAM 24 COORDINATOR FOR THE BAY AREA HOUSING FINANCE AUTHORITY. AND I 25

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AM EXCITED TO SPEAK TO YOU TODAY ABOUT TWO SPECIFIC PROGRAMS 1 WITHIN THE REGIONAL EARLY ACTION PLANNING GRANT FOR WHICH 2 3 WE'RE SEEKING APPROVAL TO TRANSFER FUNDS FROM MTC TO BAHFA FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THOSE PROGRAMS. NEXT SLIDE. CONTEXT 4 5 ABOUT HOW WE GOT HERE, THERE HAVE BEEN AS YOU ALL KNOW MULTI-YEAR PLANNING EFFORTS THAT ARE NOW CONVERGING AT THIS 6 IMPLEMENTATION OPPORTUNITY THROUGH STATE FUNDING. SO, PLANNED 7 8 BAY AREA 2050 WAS ADOPTED IN FALL OF 2021, AND INCLUDED SEVERAL HOUSING STRATEGIES AROUND PRESERVING EXISTING 9 AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND PRODUCING NEW HOUSING FOR RESIDENTS AT 10 ALL INCOME LEVELS. WE HAD THE REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS 11 ALLOCATION, SIXTH CYCLE ADOPT WINTER 2021 THAT IDENTIFIES 12 40,000 UNITS THAT NEED TO BE BUILT AROUND THE REGION TO MEET 13 OUR CYCLE NEEDS. WE HAVE THE REGIONAL HOUSING TECHNICAL 14 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM LAUNCHED THROUGH ABAG IN 2020 AND HAS BEEN 15 16 HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL IN PROVIDING LOCAL JURISDICTIONS WITH HOUSING ELEMENT SUPPORT AND OTHER HOUSING POLICY SUPPORT OVER 17 THE LAST COUPLE OF YEARS AND FINALLY THE BAY AREA HOUSING 18 FINANCE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHED BY STATE LEGISLATION IN 2019 19 COMPLETED ITS FIRST ROUND OF STAFFING IN 2020 AND LAUNCHED. WE 20 HAVE TWO SPECIFIC PROGRAMS WE WOULD LIKE TO TALK TO YOU ABOUT 21 TODAY HOUSING PRESERVATION PILOT AND PRIORITY SITES PILOT IN 22 CASE THIS SOUNDS FAMILIAR TO YOU IT HAS BEEN PRESENTED TO 23 SEVERAL MTC COMMITTEES ARE IN 2022 INCLUDING THE PROGRAMMING 24 25 AND ALLOCATIONS, AND THE JOINTS MTC PLANNING AND ABAG

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ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE. SO, THAT'S A GOOD SIGN IF YOU CAN 1 REMEMBER A LOT OF THE STUFF THAT I'M ABOUT TO SHARE. NEXT 2 3 SLIDE. FOR THOSE WHO HAVEN'T HEARD ABOUT REAP IN THE PAST IT'S A \$600 MILLION STATEWIDE GRANT PROGRAM TO METROPOLITAN 4 5 PLANNING ORGANIZATIONS THERE IS A \$103 MILLION FORMULA ALLOCATION TO MTC FOR THE BAY AREA OVERALL GOAL THE GRANT 6 PROGRAM IS TO ACCELERATE PROGRESS TOWARDS HOUSING EOUITY AND 7 8 CLIMATE GOALS GENERAL ALLOWABLE USES OF FUNDS FOR PLANNING EFFORTS CAPITAL PROJECTS THAT IMPLEMENT SUSTAINABLE 9 COMMUNITIES STRATEGIES WHICH IN OUR CASE PLAN 2050 10 ADMINISTERED BY HCD IN COLLABORATION WITH THE OFFICE OF 11 PLANNING AND RESEARCH AND STRATEGIC GROWTH COUNCIL AND THE 12 CALIFORNIA AIR RESOURCES BOARD. THE PRINCIPLES ACCELERATE 13 INFILL DEVELOPMENT FACILITIES HOUSING SUPPLY CHOICE AND 14 AFFORDABILITY AFFIRMATIVELY FURTHERING FAIR HOUSING AND 15 16 REDUCING VEHICLE MILES TRAVELED AND PROGRAMS ARE FUNDED MUST 17 DO ALL THREE. MILESTONES ALREADY COMPLETED, WE RECEIVED COMMISSION APPROVAL OF STAFF'S PROPOSAL OF \$103 MILLION IN 18 REAP FUNDS IN NOVEMBER 2022 STAFF SUBMITTED OUR APPLICATION 19 WITH THE STATE HOUSING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT IN DECEMBER OF 20 21 2022. WE'RE NOW AT THE PROGRAM DESIGN REFINEMENT AND COMMITTEE 22 APPROVAL STAGE PART OF WHICH TODAY'S ACTION IS INCLUDED AND 23 AFTER THAT WE WILL BE EXECUTING A STANDARD AGREEMENT WITH HCD FOR THESE FUNDS, AND HCD'S DEADLINE FOR US TO ENCUMBER FUNDS 24 AND COMMIT IS JUNE 30TH, 2026 AND DISBURSE -- SORRY --25

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ENCUMBRANCE BY JUNE 2024 DISBURSEMENT BY JUNE 2026. NEXT 1 SLIDE. WE'RE PROPOSING TO USE THE \$300 MILLION FOR A MIX OF 2 3 TRANSPORTATION AND HOUSING USEES ON THE TRANSPORTATION SIDE THERE IS THE COMMUNITY CHOICE PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION AND 4 5 TRANSIT TRANSFORMATION PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION. ON THE HOUSING SIDE FOCUS OF TODAY'S DISCUSSION IS THE PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 6 REGIONAL GROWTH FRAMEWORK IMPLEMENTATION COMPRISED OF THREE 7 8 DISTINCT PROGRAMS. FIRST CONTINUATION AND EXPANSION OF THE AGENCY'S SUCCESSFUL REGIONAL HOUSING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE 9 PROGRAM TO LOCAL HOUSING AND JURISDICTIONS LAUNCHED BY HCD 10 FIRST REAP TO ABAG IN 2020. SECOND PROGRAM TWO NEW AFFORDABLE 11 HOUSING PILOTS, WHICH ARE HIGHLIGHTED IN TODAY'S PRESENTATION, 12 AND THESE ARE THE HOUSING PRESERVATION PILOT AND PRIORITY 13 SITES PREDEVELOPMENT PILOT BEING IMPLEMENTED IN PARTNERSHIP 14 WITH THE RECENTLY LAUNCHED BAY AREA HOUSING FINANCE AUTHORITY 15 16 OR BAHFA. IMPORTANTLY THIS WOULD REQUIRE A TRANSFER OF \$43 MILLION IN REAP 2.0 FUNDING FROM MTC AS THE STATE'S NPO 17 18 GRANTEE TO THE BAHFA ADMINISTRATOR WHICH WE HOPE TO ACHIEVE 19 THROUGH TODAY'S ACTION. NEXT SLIDE. BEFORE I DIG INTO THE PRO PROGRAMS, I WOULD LIKE TO CONTEXTUALIZE BAHFA'S ROLE IN REAP 20 2.0. IT WAS ESTABLISHED BY ASSEMBLY BILL 1487 IN 2019 AND 21 22 BAHFA'S MANDATE IS TO RAISE ADMINISTER AND ALLOCATE REGIONAL 23 FUNDING FOR PROTECTION AFFORDABLE HOUSING PRESERVATION AND NEW PRODUCTION. THIS IS WHAT THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING PILOTS INTEND 24 TO DO LAUNCHING FIRST PILOT IN 2022 NOW POISED WITH SKILLS 25

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NEEDED TO EXECUTE THE REAP 2.0 AFFORDABLE HOUSING PILOTS. WHAT 1 ARE THOSE TWO PILOTS? IF I COULD GET THE NEXT SLIDE? WE HAVE 2 3 THE HOUSING PRESERVATION PILOT FOR \$15 MILLION. THIS WOULD PROVIDE OVER THE COUNTER CAPITAL FINANCING TO NON-PROFIT 4 5 DEVELOPERS AND COMMUNITY LAND TRUSTS FOR ACOUISITION AND REHABILITATION OF OCCUPIED RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS. IT WOULD 6 PREVENT DISPLACEMENT OF AT LEAST 60 FAMILIES BY CONVERTING 7 8 THESE PROPERTIES INTO PERMANENTLY AFFORDABLE HOUSING. IT WOULD ALLOW US TO BEGIN TO FULFILL THE PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 9 COMMITMENT TO TAKE THE LEAD ON PRESERVATION. IT WOULD BUILD 10 11 UPON THE EXISTING BAY AREA PRESERVATION PILOT WHICH WAS MTC'S, SORT OF, FIRST FORAY INTO THE PRESERVATION SPACE AND IS 12 ADMINISTERED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT 13 FINANCING INSTITUTIONS AS WAS RECENTLY REVISED BASED ON EARLY 14 FEEDBACK FROM POTENTIAL BORROWERS. SO WE'RE TAKING ALL OF 15 16 THOSE LESSONS TO DEVELOP A NEW IN-HOUSE CAPITAL FUND THAT STRIKES BALANCE BETWEEN CAPITAL FUNDS AND BUILDING EOUITY WITH 17 18 COMMUNITY OWNERSHIP MODELS. IF I COULD GET TO THE NEXT SLIDE 19 PLEASE. THE SECOND PROGRAM IS A PRIORITY SITES PILOT FOR \$28 MILLION AND THIS WOULD BE A PREDEVELOPMENT LOAN PROGRAM TO 20 21 HELP LAUNCH PROJECTS RESULTING ANYWHERE FROM 750 TO 3,000 AFFORDABLE HOUSING BRIDGING UP TO \$2 BILLION INTO THE REGION 22 23 BY LEVERAGING BAHFA'S EXPERTISE AND PRERECALL DEVELOPMENT FUNDING FOR PROJECTS. ESTABLISH A NETWORK OF REGIONALLY 24 SIGNIFICANT LOCALLY NOMINATED PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT SITES AND 25

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TRANSFORM SURPLUS PUBLIC LAND, CREATING A PIPELINE FOR 1 POTENTIAL FUTURE BAHFA AND OTHER LOCAL AND STATE FUNDING 2 3 OPPORTUNITIES. NEXT SLIDE. IN TERMS OF PREPROGRAM GUIDELINES APPROVAL THERE IS CURRENTLY A PARALLEL PROCESS HAPPENING WITH 4 5 OUR COMMUNITIES AND BOARD. WE WENT TO THE ADVISEE COMMITTEE IN FEBRUARY, TO DISCUSS GUIDELINES AND WE PLAN TO GO TO THE BAHFA 6 7 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE TOMORROW TO FURTHER SEEK APPROVAL FOR 8 RECOMMENDATION TO THE BAHFA BOARD MARCH 22ND. THIS IS ALL PENDING HCD APPROVAL OF OUR PROPOSED PROGRAM THAT WAS 9 SUBMITTED TO THEM IN DECEMBER WHICH THEY HAVE COMMITTED TO 10 DOING BY MARCH 31ST OF 2023. SO WITH ALL OF THOSE APPROVALS IN 11 PLACE LAUNCH NOFA THIS SUMMER FOR THE TWO PROGRAMS AND 12 POTENTIALLY EARLIER FOR THE PRIORITY SITES PROGRAM. NEXT 13 SLIDE. SO ULTIMATELY TODAY'S ACTION IS SEEKING MTC'S 14 AUTHORIZATION TO TRANSFER FUNDING AND PROGRAMMATIC 15 16 RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE \$43 MILLION IN REAP 2.0 PROCEEDS TO BAHFA TO ADMINISTER THE HOUSING PRESERVATION AND PRIORITY 17 SITES PILOTS. AND WITH THAT, THAT CONCLUDES MY PRESENTATION. 18 AND HAPPY TO TAKE QUESTIONS. THROUGHOUT CHAIR. 19 20

21 FEDERAL GLOVER, CHAIR: THANK YOU FOR THAT PRESENTATION. DO WE
22 HAVE ANY COMMISSIONER QUESTIONS? YES, VICE CHAIR?

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NICK JOSEFOWITZ: THANK YOU VERY MUCH CHAIR GLOVER. I KNOW ONE
 OF THE OBJECTIVES OF REAP 2.0 IS TO REDUCE VMT COULD YOU TELL
 US ABOUT HOW THE TWO PROGRAMS ARE GOING TO BE DOING THAT?

5 SPEAKER: THERE ARE GEOGRAPHIES THAT WE HAVE DESIGNATED, WE HAVE SOME GEOGRAPHIES THAT WE HAVE DESIGNATED AS BEING 6 ELIGIBLE FOR THESE PROGRAMS WE HAVE MAPPED OUT AS PART OF 7 8 THOSE GEOGRAPHIES LOW VMT AREA SO ANY AREA THAT HAS VMT PER CAPITA OF 15 MILES OR LESS WHICH IS AVERAGE FOR THE BAY AREA 9 WOULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR THIS PROGRAM IN ORDER TO MEET THE 10 REDUCING VMT REQUIREMENT IN THE SANE VEIN REDUCING VMT AND 11 INFILL WE'RE TARGETING GROWTH GEOGRAPHIES FROM PLANNED BAY 12 AREA INCLUDING PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT AREAS AND TRANSIT PRIORITY 13 AREAS WITHIN A HALF MILE BUFFER OF TRANSIT. 14

16 NICK JOSEFOWITZ: THANK YOU. THAT'S THE ONLY PLACE THAT'S GOING 17 TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THESE TWO PROGRAMS ARE THOSE TWO 18 GEOGRAPHIES?

19

20 SPEAKER: CORRECT. AND WE HAVE AN ASTERISK IF YOU ARE OUTSIDE 21 OF THOSE GEOGRAPHIES BUT CAN PROVIDE SOME DOCUMENTATION AT THE 22 PROJECT LEVEL THAT YOU ARE REDUCING VEHICLE MILES TRAVELED 23 THAT WE WOULD BE ABLE TO CONSIDER THAT ON A PROJECT BY PROJECT 24 BASIS BUT YOU ARE IMMEDIATELY ELIGIBLE IF YOU ARE IN THOSE 25 GEOGRAPHIES THIS HAS COME UP FOR EXAMPLE, IN CERTAIN AREAS

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THAT MAYBE DON'T HAVE AS GREAT TRANSIT ACCESS AND HAVE MAYBE
 THE ARGUMENT THAT IF YOU CREATE HOUSING FOR FOLKS TO LIVE AND
 WORK IN THE SAME CITY WOULD YOU BE REDUCING VEHICLE MILES
 TRAVELED BECAUSE THEY'RE NOT COMMUTING FROM HOURS AWAY IF RR
 AWAY F THEY CAN QUANTIFY THAT WE'LL LOOK AT THAT BUT GENERALLY
 THE LOW VMT AREAS AND GROWTH GEOGRAPHIES.

8 ALIX BOCKELMAN: THROUGH THE CHAIR, I WANT TO ADD TO THE POINT. ALIX BOCKELMAN, DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR POLICY. THIS 9 FRIDAY THE JOINT PLANNING AND ADMIN COMMITTEE WILL BE HEARING 10 A PRESENTATION WITH MORE DETAIL ON THE PRIORITY SITES 11 NOMINATION CRITERIA, WHICH I THINK WILL GET INTO MORE DETAIL 12 ABOUT WHAT SOME OF YOU ARE ASKING VICE CHAIR JOSEFOWITZ. AND 13 THAT IS, AFTER THAT CONVERSATION ON FRIDAY, IT'S SUPPOSED TO 14 15 GO TO THE FULL MTC COMMISSION FOR APPROVAL AS WELL AS THE ABAG 16 EXECUTIVE BOARD. I WANTED TO ADD THAT.

NICK JOSEFOWITZ: I THINK, AS YOU CAN PROBABLY TELL BY MY 18 OUESTIONING I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT THAT WE HONOR THAT PURPOSE 19 OF THE PROGRAM AND THAT WE'RE USING THIS TO ADVANCE OUR 20 21 REGIONAL PLAN AND WE HAVE IDENTIFIED GROWTH GEOGRAPHIES. SO I'M HOPING WE CAN KIND OF BE CONSISTENT ABOUT TARGETING THAT. 22 I WOULD LOVE TO SEE A MAP OF LOW VMT AREAS IN THE BAY AREA I 23 HAVE BEEN WANTING TO SEE THAT MAP FOREVER BECAUSE IT'S 24 MENTIONED A BUNCH OF OUR STUFF AND OTHERS. SO IF SOMEONE COULD 25



ACCEPTED THAT TO ME THAT WOULD BE TERRIFIC. THANK YOU VERY 1 2 MUCH. 3 SPEAKER: HAPPY TO PROVIDE THAT. 4 5 FEDERAL GLOVER, CHAIR: ANY OTHER COMMISSIONERS? COMMISSIONER 6 7 RONEN? 8 HILLARY RONEN: MY OUESTION IS SIMILAR IN ANSWER, BUT I WANT TO 9 MENTION HOW EXCITING THIS IS, YAY, TO FINALLY HAVE THE FUNDS, 10 11 TO HAVE BAHFA PRESERVE AND BUILD AFFORDABLE HOUSING. IT'S VERY MONUMENTAL, HOWEVER BECAUSE IT'S ONLY 43 MILLION AND HOPEFULLY 12 IT WILL BE MORE EVERY SINGLE YEAR, I'M JUST -- I'M -- I THINK 13 I WAS ON BAHFA, I THINK I WILL STILL BE. BUT I'M VERY MUCH 14 LOOKING FORWARD TO THE DISCUSSION THAT ALIX WAS DISCUSSING 15 16 ABOUT THE DETAILS. BUT I JUST WANTED TO JUST TAKE A MOMENT TO CELEBRATE. THIS IS REALLY, REALLY WONDERFUL. THANK YOU SO 17 18 MUCH.

20 FEDERAL GLOVER, CHAIR: OKAY. CHAIR PEDROZA?

ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU CHAIR GLOVER. I ECHO AROUND THE
PILOTS HOW DO WE TELL THE STORY OF WHAT WE ACHIEVED. IT WOULD
BE GREAT TO TRACK OUTCOMES THAT WE PRODUCE THAT WOULD BE ABLE
TO HELP TELL THE STORY TO GROAT POTS BUT ALSO PULL UP WHAT



SUCCESSES BUT ALSO WHAT'S NOT WORKING EITHER FOR INTENDED 1 PURPOSES. I WOULD LIKE TO SEE THAT REPORT COME BACK. 2 3 SPEAKER: YES. ONE THING ABOUT THIS FUNDING IS IT HAS REPORTING 4 5 REOUIREMENTS AS A MASTER REOUIREMENT WE'RE GOING TO BE 6 TRACKING HOW MANY UNITS WERE PRESERVED, PRODUCED, AND UNDERSTANDING HOW MANY YOU KNOW, TRYING TO QUANTIFY THE 7 8 REDUCTION OF VEHICLE MILES TRAVELED AND ALL OF THESE THINGS SO WE SHOULD HAVE SOME, AS FAR AS WE CAN FOR HCD, WE SHOULD HAVE 9 THAT DATA TO BACK US UP. 10 11 ALFREDO PEDROZA: YOU MENTIONED HCD. I WOULD LOVE TO HAVE A 12 LARGER CONVERSATION ABOUT THEM, I THINK THEY'RE AN INCREDIBLE 13 PARTNER IN THIS DILEMMA WE'RE IN BUT THAT PARTNERSHIP DOES 14 15 NEED TO BE ENHANCED IN THE FUTURE. 16 FEDERAL GLOVER, CHAIR: ANY OTHER? COMMISSIONER PAPAN? 17 18 GINA PAPAN: REITERATE WHAT THE CHAIR SAID. PLEASE, BECAUSE 19 THIS IS SO IMPORTANT TO US, AND THE DATA, SO WHAT WORKS AND 20 21 WHAT NEEDS TO WORK BETTER. I WANT TO POINT OUT ONE THING TOO, THE INTERACTION BETWEEN TRANSIT AND THESE DEVELOPMENTS, WE 22 JUST HAD AN SB35 PROJECT PRESENTED TO US, GREAT, LOW-INCOME, 23 EXTRA LOW-INCOME, HOWEVER, HIGH SPEED RAIL HAS DESIGNATED THE 24 SITE FOR STREET LEVEL PARKING. SO, THIS IS TROUBLESOME TO SAY 25

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THE LEAST. I THINK IT'S VERY IMPORTANT THOSE PARTNERSHIPS THAT 1 WE ALWAYS TALK ABOUT, THE INTERACTION, ARE NOTED AND BOTH 2 3 HOUSING AND TRANSIT ARE WORKING TOGETHER. SO, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. 4 5 SPEAKER: THANK YOU SO MUCH. 6 7 8 FEDERAL GLOVER, CHAIR: VICE CHAIR CHAVEZ? 9 CINDY CHAVEZ: THANK YOU. AND THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR THE 10 REPORT AND THE GOOD WORK. I'M CURIOUS ABOUT HOW WE WOULD 11 DELINEATE PROJECTS THAT ARE GETTING DEVELOPED BECAUSE OF THIS 12 MONEY VERSUS PROJECTS THAT ARE ALREADY MOVING FORWARD THAT THE 13 14 MONEY ENHANCES? 15 16 SPEAKER: INTERESTING QUESTION. I THINK THAT IN TERMS OF THE PRIORITY SITES PILOT, I THINK BOTH PROGRAMS ARE REALLY GOING 17 TO REWARD PROJECTS THAT HAVE OTHER FUNDING TO LEVERAGE AGAINST 18 OURS JUST IN TERMS OF DEMONSTRATING READINESS. THAT, LIKE, 19 THAT OUR DOLLARS ARE HELPING THEM GET ACROSS THE FINISH LINE. 20 21 SO I THINK THAT THE INCLUSION OF OTHER FUNDS -- IF I'M UNDERSTANDING YOUR QUESTION CORRECTLY STOP ME IF I'M NOT --22 THE INCLUSION OF FUNDS FROM OTHER SOURCES WE'RE SEEING AS AN 23 ASSET THAT'S ALLOWING FOLKS TO GET ACROSS THE FINISH LINE WITH 24 THESE DOLLARS. BUT IN TERMS OF, I GUESS, IS THERE A SCENARIO 25

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1 THAT YOU'RE THINKING OF IN WHICH THE PROJECT WOULD HAPPEN
2 WITHOUT US?

3

CINDY CHAVEZ: WELL, FRANKLY, SO, JUST KIND OF TWO BIG CONCERNS 4 5 I'LL SHARE WITH MY COLLEAGUES. ONE IS THAT I AM VERY INTERESTED IN KNOWING HOW NEW PROGRAMS CONSENT AND DRIVE 6 DEVELOPMENT. AND, SO, RIGHT NOW, FOR EXAMPLE, IN THE COMMUNITY 7 8 THAT I LIVE IN, WE HAVE A NUMBER OF SHOVEL READY PROJECTS, AND EVERYBODY IS EXCITED TO PUT IN THEIR \$4 TO GET IT TO BE FULLY 9 FUNDED. SO THEN IT'S, YOU KNOW, IT WOULD HAVE HAPPENED, 10 BECAUSE WE WOULD HAVE GOTTEN \$4 FROM SOMEWHERE, PRESUMABLY, SO 11 WHAT I'M CONCERNED ABOUT IS OUR ABILITY TO DEMONSTRATE THAT 12 THIS NEW MECHANISM IS ACTUALLY INCENTING A DESIGN THAT WE 13 HAVEN'T SEEN ALREADY VERSUS ONE MORE APPLICATION FOR SOMEONE 14 15 TO FILL OUT AND GET A LITTLE MORE MONEY FOR A PROJECT THAT 16 WOULD HAPPEN ANYWAY.

17

SPEAKER: FOLKS GENERALLY BECAUSE OF THE WAY PRESERVATION 18 PROJECTS WORK AND THE WAY THEY'RE TAKING ADVANTAGE OF 19 OPPORTUNITIES AS THEY ARISE ON THE MARKET THEY'RE NOT LOOKING 20 21 FOR PRESERVATION PROJECTS UNLESS THERE IS FUNDING TO GO OUT AND ACQUIRE THOSE PROPERTIES. ON THE PRESERVATION SIDE THERE 22 23 IS LOCAL DEVELOPERS THAT ARE EXCITED TO HEAR ABOUT THIS INCENTIVIZING AND ACTUALLY GO OUT AND LOOK FOR PROPERTIES THEY 24 COULD USE THIS FUNDING TO GO OUT AND BUY AND STABILIZE AS 25

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AFFORDABLE HOUSING. IN THE CASE OF PROJECTS THAT ARE AWAITING 1 FUNDING AND PREDEVELOPMENT AND ARE AWAITING FOR FUNDING, WE 2 HAVE A PIPELINE PROJECT AROUND PROJECTS HAVE BEEN SITTING FOR 3 YEARS IT'S NOT NECESSARILY JUST A NEED TO SUBMIT APPLICATION 4 5 THIS IS A PREDEVELOPMENT FUND SO THESE ARE FUNDS THAT WOULD COME IN EVEN BEFORE THEY HAVE GOT -- THEY'RE NECESSARILY NEAR 6 CONSTRUCTION. THE CLOSER THEY ARE TO CONSTRUCTION THE MORE WE 7 8 WANT TO ACCELERATE THAT PROCESS AND MAKE IT HAPPEN SOONER. IT IS CATALYZING. I MAY NOT BE SPEAKING TO THIS ELOQUENTLY, AND I 9 10 WOULD WELCOME BACKUP FROM KATE WHO IS THE EXPERT.

11

CINDY CHAVEZ: YOU'RE DOING FINE. I WOULD JUST SAY TO MY 12 COLLEAGUES, I THINK ON THE REHABILITATION SIDE, I THINK THAT 13 IS AN EXCELLENT POINT AND IT'S ACTUALLY SOMETHING THAT I 14 HADN'T THOUGHT ABOUT SO THANK YOU FOR THAT. THAT'S SUPER 15 16 HELPFUL. AS IT RELATES TO THE PREDEVELOPMENT FUNDS, I THINK WE KNOW, IN DIFFERENT PARTS OF THE COMMUNITY, THAT THAT WORKS, 17 HAVING THEM. SO, I THINK THAT'S REALLY GREAT, BUT I DON'T 18 THINK THAT'S INNOVATIVE. I THINK IT'S OPPORTUNISTIC, WHICH I 19 THINK IS FINE TOO. SO, WHICH IS FINE. I JUST THINK WHAT WOULD 20 21 BE HELPFUL TO UNDERSTAND IS WHERE WE CAN ACTUALLY LEARN SOMETHING THAT WE DON'T ALREADY KNOW, AND SO THAT'S ONE BIG 22 PIECE. AND, SO FRANKLY IT'S NOT A LOT OF MONEY, RELATIVE TO 23 THE NINE BAY AREA COUNTIES. SO THE OTHER THING IS THAT, I KNOW 24 25 ALL OF US ARE DISCIPLINED ABOUT, NO IT SHOULD BE IN MY

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DISTRICT, IN MY AREA. IN THESE INSTANCES IT WOULD BE BETTER TO 1 GO DEEP THAN GOING BROAD. THAT'S GOING TO REQUIRE TOLERANCE 2 3 FROM US. OTHERWISE, I THINK THE POINT ALFREDO ASKED ABOUT IS HOW ARE WE ABLE TO DEMONSTRATE THE IMPACT AND THE IMPACT 4 5 WOULDN'T HAVE HAD BUT FOR THIS. THAT'S FROM A LEARNING PERSPECTIVE I WAS TRYING TO UNDERSTAND. ON THE REHAB SIDE 6 YOU'RE RIGHT THERE IS NOT NEARLY ENOUGH DOLLARS FOR THAT. 7 8 ANYWAY, I THINK THIS IS VERY EXCITING. AND REALLY, I THINK, COLLEAGUES, I DO NOT LIKE TO SAY NOT IT MEANING THAT I DON'T 9 WANT TO -- I'M NOT NECESSARILY TRYING TO SEE THESE COME TO 10 SANTA CLARA COUNTY, BUT I THINK GOING DEEP AND UNDERSTANDING 11 THAT DOING THAT ON THE REHAB SIDE IN TERMS OF WHAT IS IT THAT 12 -- WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO GET THEM PURCHASED AND AVAILABLE AND 13 THEN THE OTHER THING I WOULD REQUEST IS THAT WE'RE TAKING A 14 LOOK AT OUR HOUSING AUTHORITY PARTNERSHIPS SO WE'RE ABLE TO 15 16 MARY SECTION-EIGHT VOUCHERS PARTICULARLY FOCUS ON PROJECT BASED VOUCHERS ABLE TO EITHER PRESERVE NATURALLY AFFORDABLE 17 HOUSING AND THEN PROTECT IT THAT WOULD BE GREAT IN TERMS OF 18 LEARNING HOW OTHERS AS WE THINK ABOUT DOING IT. ONE OF THE 19 THINGS I GET WORRIED ABOUT IS MONEY GETTING SUCKED UP INTO 20 21 THINKING PLANNING FEELING AND NOT BEING ABLE TO SEE THE DOOR WITH PEOPLE GOING IN. AND SO THAT'S WHY I'M HOPEFUL THAT THIS 22 PREWORK WILL ACTUALLY DEMONSTRATE THAT WE REGIONALLY HAVE THE 23 CAPACITY TO USE MONEY FOR SOMETHING BEYOND PLANNING, AND THAT 24



WE SEE FAMILIES IN THE DOOR AND WE CAN USE THE LESSONS 1 LEARNED. THANK YOU. THAT'S REALLY HELPFUL. 2 3 FEDERAL GLOVER, CHAIR: THANK YOU. COMMISSIONER? 4 5 DAVID RABBIT: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. THANK YOU FOR YOUR 6 COMMENTS. IT REMINDS ME, WE JUST YESTERDAY HAD AN IMPORTANT 7 8 MEETING WHERE WE SET ASIDE MONEY FOR PREDEVELOPMENT FOR A HOMEKEY SITE. I THINK ONE OF THE ISSUES THAT I BROUGHT UP, 9 BACKGROUND AND DEVELOPMENT WAS A PERCENTAGE OF OVERALL COST 10 GOING TO THE PREDEVELOPMENT WAS ABOUT 40% OF THE OVERALL 11 BUDGET OF THE PROJECT. SO, I THINK I'M ALL FOR THE 12 PREDEVELOPMENT PIECE, BUT I THINK WE NEED GUARDRAILS. BECAUSE 13 YOU WILL NEVER GET TO THAT DOOR IF YOU ARE SPENDING THAT MUCH 14 15 MONEY IN THAT PREDEVELOPMENT. AND NOT TO BE THE 16 SPEAKER: DEBBIE DOWNER. 17 18 DAVID RABBIT: DEBBIE DOWNER HERE. BUT I THINK IN THE NORTH BAY 19 WE HAVE REACHED THE POINT IN TIME WHERE THE COST OF A TYPICAL 20 21 TWO BEDROOM UNIT NOW DOES NOT PAY FOR ITSELF ANY LONGER, A LOT OF THOSE PROJECTS THAT WERE APPROVED ON THE PROJECT SIDE ON 22 THE MARKET RATE SIDE ARE NOT GOING TO BE BUILT BECAUSE THERE'S 23 NO WAY THEY CAN GET TRADITIONAL FINANCING WITH THOSE DEEP 24 25 POCKETS WHO ARE WILLING TO MAKE THAT INVESTMENT, JUST THROWING

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THAT OUT THERE, OVERALL THE SHAPE OF THINGS IS CYCLICAL. AND
 ACCORDING TO THE FED YESTERDAY WE'RE GOING TO BE DEALING WITH
 EVEN MORE OF THIS THAT MEANS UNAFFORDABILITY OF THOSE MARKET
 RATE UNITS IS GOING TO SPREAD THROUGHOUT THE BAY AREA EVEN
 PLACES THAT HAVE THE HIGHER CURRENT RENTS IN THE FUTURE.
 FEDERAL GLOVER, CHAIR: THANK YOU. AT THIS TIME WE'LL SEE IF WE
