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ADINA LEVIN: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. ADINA LEVIN, CHAIR OF THE 2 3 REGIONAL NETWORK MANAGEMENT CUSTOMER ADVISORY GROUP. WE DID MEET IN BETWEEN THE LAST MEETING OF THIS BODY AND THE CURRENT 4 5 ONE, AND WE HAD TWO SUBSTANTIVE ITEMS ON THE AGENDA. THE FIRST WAS LEARNING MORE ABOUT AND PROVIDING FEEDBACK ON THE REGIONAL 6 WAYFINDING PROTOTYPES AND PILOTS THAT HAVE STARTED TO ROLL OUT 7 8 WITH THE FIRST ONE OVER AT EL CERRITO DEL NORTE AND THE SECOND ONE JUST SCHEDULED FOR THE 20th AT SANTA ROSA. A NUMBER OF US 9 HAD BEEN AT THE LAUNCH EVENT FOR THE EL CERRITO DEL NORTE AND 10 HAD A LOT OF GOOD AND POSITIVE THINGS TO SAY, PLUS SOME 11 DETAILED COMMENTS THAT STAFF WAS DILIGENTLY TAKING NOTES ON. 12 SO EVERYONE IS GLAD TO SEE THAT INITIATIVE MOVING FORWARD. THE 13 NEXT SUBSTANTIVE ITEM ON THE AGENDA WAS DISCUSSION ABOUT THE 14 15 NEXT GENERATION CLIPPER RELEASE THAT IS PLANNED AND NEXT 16 GENERATION ON FARE COORDINATION AND INTEGRATION. PEOPLE WERE EAGER TO SEE THAT TO BE RELEASED AS SOON AS HUMANLY POSSIBLE. 17 AND THERE WERE COMMENTS MADE ABOUT THE, YOU KNOW, IN SUPPORT 18 OF THE FREE AND REDUCED PRICE TRANSFERS THAT ARE COMING OUT 19 WITH IT, AND THE OPEN PAYMENTS AS THINGS HAVE A GOOD 20 21 LIKELIHOOD OF INCREASING TRANSIT RIDERSHIP, WANTING TO SEE PROMOTION OF THESE THINGS AS PART OF, YOU KNOW, RELATED TO THE 22 PREVIOUS ITEM ABOUT IMPROVEMENTS TO TRANSIT SERVICE BEING VERY 23 VALUED BY THE PUBLIC. AND, ALSO, SOME EAGERNESS TO SEE A 24 FUTURE DEVELOPMENT THAT COULD POSSIBLY ALLOW PEOPLE TO GET 25

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DISCOUNTS TO WHICH THEY ARE ENTITLED WHEN THEY'RE USING OPEN 1 PAYMENT, WHICH IS SOMETHING THAT STAFF HAS STARTED TO SAY IN 2 3 THE LAST FEW MONTHS THAT SUCCESS WORKED ON. SO, THAT WAS WELCOME TO HEAR. AND THE, I BELIEVE STAFF ALLUDED TO, 4 5 POTENTIALLY IN THE COMING YEAR WORKING ON THE NEXT STEPS IN FARE COORDINATION AND INTEGRATION. AND THAT IS BEING LOOKED 6 FOR TO WITH WELCOME, AS WELL. SO, THOSE ARE THE REPORTS ON 7 8 THAT ADVISORY MEETING. 9 V. CHAIR, SUE NOACK: GREAT. THANK YOU. OR 7 8 WILL THEY BE ABLE TO GET ACCESS TO THE DATA SOME BECAUSE I THINK THIS IS GOING TO BE REALLY IMPORTANT TO THE INDIVIDUAL 9 AGENCY, AS WELL, AS WE MOVE FORWARD, WORKING IN PARTNERSHIP 10 WITH MTC IN IDENTIFYING THESE PRIORITY AREAS. 11

BRITT TANNER: HI MY NAME IS BRITT TANNER. REGIONAL NETWORK 13 MANAGEMENT. SO, THE QUESTION WILL ITP BE ABLE TO SEE THIS 14 MODEL? UNFORTUNATELY NOT DIRECTLY. THE AGREEMENT IS WORKING, 15 16 MTC AND CAL ITP WILL HAVE ACCESS TO THE BATA BUT WE'RE GETTING AN INCREDIBLE DEAL ON THE SOFTWARE PAYING \$73 PER BUS WHEREAS 17 TYPICALLY AGENCY WOULD BE ANYWHERE FROM 2 TO \$400 PER BUS SO 18 GETTING APPLES TO APPLES COMPARISON HAVING SAME SOURCE DATA 19 FOR ALL NINE AGENCIES THAT ARE REPRESENTED WE ARE GETTING AN 20 21 AMAZING DEAL FROM ANALYSIS WE WILL BE ABLE TO RUN REPORTS WE CAN SHARE DATA THAT WE PULL JUST CAN'T PULL. 22

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GORDON HANSON: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. HELLO, VICE CHAIR NOACK
 AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS. IT'S NICE TO BE BACK TO PROVIDE AN
 UPDATE ABOUT THE PROJECT, ALONG WITH THIS AGAINST. AND ALSO,
 HAPPY VALENTINE'S DAY. [LAUGHTER] AS NOTED, I'M GORDON HANSEN
 PROJECT MANAGER FOR MTC'S REGIONAL MAPPING AND WAYFINDING
 PROJECT.

GORDON HANSON: GREAT. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. TODAY WE'RE BRINGING 10 YOU UP TO SPEED ON THE PROJECT'S RECENT PROGRESS AND TAKE A 11 STEP BACK TO PROVIDE HIGH-LEVEL PICTURE OF THE PROJECT'S 12 CONTRACT AND BUDGET ON WHICH OFFERS CONTEXT OF OUR REQUEST FOR 13 APPROVAL OF AN AMENDMENT WITH OUR PRIME CONTRACTOR APPLIED 14 WAYFINDING. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. JUST FOR A BRIEF RETROSPECTIVE 15 16 ON THIS PROJECT FOR THOSE WHO ARE WATCHING FROM HOME FOR THE FIRST TIME. THE PRIMARY GOAL OF THE REGIONAL MAPPING AND 17 WAYFINDING PROJECT IS TO RETAIN AND INCREASE TRANSIT 18 RIDERSHIP. WE ARE DEVELOPING HARMONIZED WAYFINDING SIGNS AND 19 MAPS TO IMPROVE THE CUSTOMER EXPERIENCE AT ALL BAY AREA 20 21 TRANSIT LOCATIONS. THE CURRENT PROJECT PHASE INCLUDES DEVELOPING, TESTING, AND REFINING NEW DESIGNS. NEXT SLIDE. 22 23

JUMANA NABTI: ALL RIGHT. WE'RE TESTING NEW DESIGNING
ITERATIVELY, INCORPORATING INPUT FROM TRANSIT AGENCIES AND

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RIDERS VIA IMPLEMENTATION AT INCREASING GEOGRAPHIC SCALES. 1 REFINED MAP AND SIGN DESIGNS WILL BE INSTALLED AT THE 2 3 PROTOTYPE STATIONS AND AT SEVEN ADDITIONAL TRANSIT HUBS AROUND THE REGION AND ALONG BUS LINES IN THE NORTH BAY AS PART OF THE 4 5 PILOT PROJECTS. NEXT SLIDE. WE HAVE SOME BRIEF UPDATES FOR YOU ABOUT THE PROJECT'S RECENT PROGRESS. FOR THE PROTOTYPES WE 6 WERE EXCITED TO CELEBRATE THE LAUNCH OF THE EL CERRITO DEL 7 8 NORTE PROTOTYPE WITH SOME OF YOU IN DECEMBER. THANK YOU FOR JOINING. NEW SIGNS AND MAPS WILL DEBUT AT THE SANTA ROSA 9 TRANSIT MALL AND SMART STATION THIS THURSDAY FEBRUARY 20TH. 10 OVER 1700 PEOPLE FROM AROUND THE REGION TOOK OUR ONLINE 11 SURVEY, WHICH WILL BE REOPENING NEXT WEEK TO GATHER FEEDBACK 12 FROM RIDERS IN AND AROUND SANTA ROSA. WE'RE ALSO ANALYZING 13 INPUT FROM FOCUS GROUPS, TEST JOURNEYS, INTERCEPT SURVEYS AND 14 15 STAFF SITE VISITS AND WILL PROVIDE MORE INFORMATION ON THE 16 RESULTS OF THOSE WHEN THEY'RE READY. FINALLY, PLANNING FOR OUR POWELL STREET MINI PROTOTYPE WHICH WILL TEST NEW DESIGNS AT 17 THE MOST COMPLEX STATION IN THE REGION IS UNDERWAY AND WE 18 EXPECT TO INSTALL A SMALL SET OF TEMPORARY SIGNS SOON. FOR THE 19 PILOT PROJECTS, IN PARALLEL, WE HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH PARTNER 20 AGENCIES TO PLAN FOR THE PILOT PROJECTS, INCLUDING SITE VISITS 21 22 AT EACH LOCATION. WE ARE ALSO WORKING WITH AGENCIES TO UNDERSTAND THEIR CAPACITY OR RESOURCES TO MANUFACTURE AND/OR 23 INSTALL SIGNAGE FOR THE PILOTS. WE'RE DEVELOPING AN RFQ TO 24 COVER ANY SIGNAGE THAT AGENCIES CANNOT ASSIST WITH. NEXT 25

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SLIDE. OVER OF THE PAST YEAR WE HAVE COLLABORATED EXTENSIVELY 1 WITH TRANSIT AGENCY STAFF, THE PUBLIC, AND THESE REGIONAL 2 3 NETWORK MANAGEMENT GROUPS, INCLUDING YOURS, ARE ABOUT THE PROJECT. TOGETHER THIS FEEDBACK HAS HELPED US BUILD A MORE 4 5 COMPREHENSIVE AND REPRESENTATIVE APPROACH TO DELIVERY. EXPERIENCE DEVELOPING PROTOTYPE SIGNS AND MAPS SURFACED A LOT 6 OF DETAILED INFORMATION ABOUT THE REGION'S TRANSIT SERVICE AND 7 8 HOW BEST TO DEPICT THEM IN A HARMONIOUS WAY. WHILE THE PROCESS WAS MORE COMPLEX THAN EXPECTED WE SEE THIS AS FRONT LOADING 9 EXTREMELY PERSONALITY TOPICS AND POTENTIAL CHALLENGES THAT WE 10 NEED TO KNOW ABOUT NOW. AS WE TRANSITION BETWEEN THE 11 PROTOTYPES AND THE PILOT PROJECTS WE'RE TAKING A STEP BACK 12 FROM THE DETAILS TO ENSURE THAT HOW WE MANAGE THE PROJECT BE 13 ALIGNS WITH OUR MODIFIED APPROACH TO DELIVER AND I'LL HAND IT 14 BACK TO GORDON TO TALK ABOUT THAT. 15

GORDON HANSON: NEXT SLIDE. LET'S FLY BACK UP TO THE 30 17 18 FINISHED FOOT LEVEL FOR CHECK IN ON THE PROJECT'S VENDORS BUDGET AND FUNDING. WE HAVE THREE CONTRACTOR, APPLIED 19 WAYFINDING, THE SUBJECT OF OUR DISCUSSION TODAY, PROVIDES 20 CRITICAL PROJECT CAPACITY. THEY DO DESIGN IMPLEMENTATION 21 22 SUPPORT AND OPERATIONAL PLANNING FOR THE PROJECT. THEY ALSO 23 CONDUCT PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT AND EVALUATION EFFORTS FOR BOTH THE PROTOTYPES AND THE PILOT PROJECTS, UPCOMING. NOW DUE TO 24 CHANGES IN OUR PROJECT DELIVERY APPROACH WHICH WE'LL TALK 25

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ABOUT IN A MOMENT, APPLIED ARE ALREADY REACHING THEIR \$6 1 2 MILLION NTE EARLIER THAN EXPECTED PROMPTING OUR CONTRACT 3 AMENDMENT REQUEST TODAY. SECOND CONTRACT IS WITH CORPORATE SIGN SYSTEMS THEY ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FABRICATION AND 4 5 INSTALLATION OF THE PROTOTYPE PROJECTS CONTRACT TERM WILL BE EXTENDED BY ONE YEAR TO ALLOW THEM TO SUPPORT PROTOTYPE 6 MAINTENANCE BUT THERE IS NO FUNDING INCREASE. FINALLY WE HAVE 7 8 ACCESSIBLE AVENUE THIS IS RON BROOKS OUR ACCESSIBILITY CONSULTANT HE PROVIDES PROJECT TEAM LEVEL CAPACITY AND INSIGHT 9 FOR ACCESSIBILITY NEEDS. NOW WE HAVE SOME FUTURE CONTRACTS 10 THAT WE EXPECT LATER THIS YEAR THIS WILL BE WITH FABRICATION 11 VENDORS FOR THE PILOT PROJECTS. BASED YOUR FEEDBACK IN 12 PARTICULAR WE ARE MEETING WITH AC TRANSIT AND GOLDEN GATE 13 TRANSIT TO BETTER UNDERSTAND THAT THEIR SIGN SHOP CAPABILITIES 14 AND WOULD LOVE TO PARTNER WITH THEM IF POSSIBLE ON FUTURE 15 16 MANUFACTURING. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. AS NOTED, OVER THE PAST TWO YEARS, MTC HAS MODIFIED THE PROJECT DELIVERY APPROACH. ONE 17 18 MAJOR MODIFICATION INVOLVED THE PILOT PROJECTS ORIGINALLY INTENDED TO INCLUDE ALL TRANSIT FACILITIES IN SOLANO, SONOMA, 19 AND EASTERN CONTRA COSTA AND ALAMEDA COUNTIES WE HEARD YOUR 20 21 AGENCY FEEDBACK AND THESE PROJECTS NOW ENCOMPASS REGIONAL HUB 22 STATIONS ALONG WITH A SELECTION OF BUS LINES IN THE NORTH BAY. 23 THE CURRENT \$6 MILLION NTE, OR NOT TO EXCEED AMOUNT FOR APPLIED FUNDS SEVERAL EFFORTS INCLUDING DELIVERY OF THE TWO 24 PROTOTYPES AND THE FORTHCOMING MINI PROTOTYPE AT POWELL 25

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OUTREACH AND ENGAGEMENT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE PROTOTYPES, 1 THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE VERSION ONE STANDARDS WHICH ARE DESIGN 2 3 GUIDELINES, AN EVALUATION OF NEW DESIGNS, DEVELOPMENT OF THE DIGITAL WAYFINDING PROOF OF CONCEPT THAT WE ARE TESTING AT EL 4 5 CERRITO DEL NORTE, AND PRELIMINARY PLANNING AND ENGAGEMENT FOR THE NINE REGIONAL HUB PILOT PROJECTS. THE RECOMMENDED \$4 6 MILLION NTE INCREASE WILL SUPPORT COMPLETING THE PLANNING AND 7 8 DESIGN FOR THE NINE REGIONAL HUB PILOTS. DEVELOPING AND DESIGNING THE NORTH BAY BUS LINES PILOT, RESEARCHING AND/OR 9 DEVELOPING DIGITAL TOOLS, INCLUDING AUTOMATED ARTWORKING AND 10 ASSET MANAGEMENT TO GIVE AGENCIES THE TOOLS THEY NEED TO 11 INSTALL AND MAINTAIN NEW WAYFINDING IN THE FUTURE. AND, 12 FINALLY, LONGER TERM PLANNING, INCLUDING UPDATES TO THE 13 STANDARDS AFTER THE PILOT PROJECTS, UPDATING THE OVERALL 14 15 BUSINESS CASE AND CRAFTING A LONG-TERM GOVERNANCE PLAN FOR HOW 16 THE REGIONAL MAPPING AND WAYFINDING PROJECT BECOMES A PROGRAM. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. WE HAVE IDENTIFIED A TOTAL OF \$36 MILLION 17 FOR THIS PROJECT. MOST OF THIS FUNDING COMES FROM FEDERAL 18 FORMULA FUNDS, APPROXIMATELY \$25 MILLION. NOW, WE ARE AWARE OF 19 SOME UNCERTAINTY AROUND FEDERAL FUNDING THESE DAYS. AND ARE 20 MONITORING THE SITUATION VERY CLOSELY. WE ARE CAUTIOUSLY 21 OPTIMISTIC, HOWEVER, AS THE MTC COMMISSION HAS PROGRAMMED 22 FEDERAL FORMULA FUNDS, SPECIFICALLY TO THIS PROJECT. IN 23 ACCORDANCE WITH STANDARD PROVIDERS MTC HAS APPLIED FOR A \$20 24 25 MILLION GRANT THAT IS CURRENTLY UNDER FTA AND DEPARTMENT OF

LABOR REVIEW. WE EXPECT IT TO BE AWARDED SOON. THE AMENDED 1 CONTRACT WITH APPLIED WILL CONSTITUTE \$10 MILLION WITH 2 3 REMAINING 26 MILLION TO BE USED FOR WAYFINDING FABRICATION AND INSTALLATION AS PART OF THE PILOT PROJECTS AS WELL AS SOME 4 5 OTHER EXPENSES. APPLIED'S CONTRACT INCLUDING THE RECOMMENDED AMENDMENT IS FINISHED PRIMARILY BY NON-FEDERAL SOURCES. THE AT 6 THIS TIME WE EXPECT TO HAVE SUFFICIENT FUNDING TO DELIVER THE 7 8 PROJECT. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO, LET'S LOOK AHEAD. TODAY, OF COURSE, WE REQUEST YOUR APPROVAL OF OUR RECOMMENDED CONTRACT 9 AMENDMENT. AS NOTED, WE WILL LAUNCH THE SANTA ROSA PROTOTYPE 10 NEXT THURSDAY FEBRUARY 20TH AND WE WILL TEST TEMPORARY SIGNAGE 11 AT THE PALACE STATION LATER THIS WINTER. MEANWHILE WORK ON THE 12 VERSION ONE STANDARDS DESIGN GUIDELINES AND PREPARATION FOR 13 THE PILOT PROJECTS IS ONGOING WE EXPECT TO ISSUE OUR RFQ AND 14 CONTRACT WITH FABRICATORS FOR THE PILOT PROJECTS IDEALLY 15 16 SUPPLEMENTING ASSISTANCE FROM TRANSIT AGENCY SIGN SHOPS LATER THIS YEAR RELEASE VERSION ONE DESIGN STANDARDS INCLUDING 17 GUIDANCE FOR REPLACEMENT PROJECTS THAT AGENCIES ARE LEADING. 18 AND LATER THIS YEAR WE PLAN TO BEGIN DELIVERY OF THE NINE 19 REGIONAL HUB PILOT PROGRAMS. OF COURSE, WE WILL HAVE MUCH MORE 20 TO COME TO DISCUSS WITH YOU IN COMING MONTHS AND WE THANK YOU 21 22 FOR YOUR ATTENTION TODAY.

SO, A \$4 MILLION INCREASE IN THE NOT TO EXCEED IS 18 NOT A GUARANTEE THAT THERE WILL BE A \$4 MILLION OUTLAY. IT 19 GIVES US THE FLEXIBILITY TO NEGOTIATE ADDITIONAL TASK ORDERS 20 21 THAT CAN HELP US RESPOND TO ADDITIONAL NEEDS FOR FLEXIBILITY. AND WE MAY NOT NEED TO SPEND THAT TOTAL AMOUNT TO DELIVER THE 22 PROJECT SUCCESSFULLY. TO YOUR POINT ABOUT COST EFFICIENCIES, 23 THAT'S -- OR AT LEAST THAT'S HOW I WROTE DOWN THE NOTE, WHICH 24 IS TO SAY YES, WE'RE LEARNING QUITE A BIT. ONE OF THE THINGS 25

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THAT WE DO KNOW IS I THINK WE HAVE A REAL OPPORTUNITY, 1 2 ESPECIALLY IN PARTNERING WITH TRANSIT SIGN SHOPS, LIKE AC 3 TRANSIT, WE HAVE HAD INITIAL CONVERSATION AND WE HAVE ANOTHER ONE SCHEDULED TO FOLLOW UP. IS THAT WE WANT TO MAXIMIZE 4 5 WHATEVER EXISTING AGREEMENTS FOR LOWER COST IMPLEMENTATION THAT WE CAN FOR THE PILOTS. AND A MAJOR QUESTION FOR US, OR 6 MAJOR POINT OF DISCUSSION OVER THE NEXT SEVERAL MONTHS AS WE 7 8 WORK TO FINALIZE THE FIRST SET OF DESIGN STANDARDS IS AROUND COST EFFECTIVENESS. THAT IS HUGE FOR US BECAUSE WITHOUT COST 9 EFFECTIVE PROJECT OR WAY FORWARD THIS CAN'T GO FORWARD. THAT'S 10 MAJOR FOR US. 11

DIANE SHAW: YEAH, I THINK THE IDEA OF MAINTENANCE, THE ONGOING 13 MAINTENANCE, ENSURING THAT WE HAVE A GOOD PLAN AND 14 15 UNDERSTANDING OF WHAT THE COSTS ARE GOING TO BE THERE, I THINK 16 -- I THINK IS REALLY -- I THINK IS CRITICAL TO ENSURING THAT WE CAN SUSTAIN THIS PROGRAM. ONE OF THE QUANTITATIVE METRICS THAT WE WOULD LIKE TO BE ABLE 22 TO MEASURE -- I SAY IT THAT WAY BECAUSE IT'S CHALLENGING TO 23 GET TO THIS -- IS THAT CAN WE NOTICE A BUMP IN RIDERSHIP THAT 24 WE CAN ADDRESS TO THE WAYFINDING SIGNAGE AND MAPS. THAT'S 25

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SOMETHING THAT WE WOULD LOVE TO BE ABLE TO MEASURE AND ARE 1 LOOKING FOR WAYS TO DO SO. BUT THE OTHER PIECE IS QUALITATIVE, 2 3 WHICH IS HOW DO PEOPLE -- I KNOW, FRANKLY, HOW DO THESE SIGNS MAKE THEM FEEL? DO THEY FEEL CARED FOR BY THE REGION, BY THE 4 5 AGENCIES? THAT'S SOMETHING THAT'S MORE DIFFICULT TO QUANTIFY BUT IT'S ESSENTIAL FOR THE SUCCESS OF THIS PROJECT IN TRANSIT. 6 IT'S THE WORD OF MOUTH FACTOR, REALLY. YOU KNOW? DO I TRUST 7 8 TRANSIT TO BE ABLE TO SHARE IT AND TO BE ABLE TO SAY TO MY FRIENDS, HEY THIS IS WORKING BETTER. WE'RE FINDING WAYS TO 9 ADDRESS THAT IN OUR EVALUATION PARTLY THROUGH TEST JOURNEYS 10 WHICH ARE ACCOMPANYING FOLKS AS THEY GO THROUGH A SERIES OF 11 STEPS AT LOCATIONS AND ASKING THEM OUALIFIED OR OUALIFIABLE 12 OUESTIONS ABOUT THEIR EXPERIENCE AND THAT'S BEING ADDRESSED IN 13 OUR EVALUATION THAT'S HAPPENING RIGHT NOW. SPEAKING OF THAT 14 YOU ASKED ABOUT OPERATORS, WE HAD A SERIES OF SITE VISITS AT 15 16 EL CERRITO DEL NORTE AND WE'RE PLANNING SUPPLEMENT SOME AT SANTA ROSA WITH TRANSIT AGENCY STAFF BUT AS YOU KNOW OPERATORS 17 ARE VERY IMPORTANT SO WE INTEGRATE THEM INTO OUR DESIGN 18 PROCESS MOVING FORWARD I THINK ONE OF THE CHALLENGES THERE, 19 THERE ARE UNION AGREEMENTS RULES THAT WE NEED TO BE AWARE OF 20 21 SO ASKING THEM TO COME TO US MAY NOT BE FEASIBLE WE MAY NEED TO GO OUT AND TALK TO THEM AT BUS DEPOTS SOMETHING WE'RE 22 THINKING ABOUT IN TERMS OF RON BROOKS WHAT AN ASSET TO THIS 23 PROJECT SO HAPPY THAT HE IS ABLE TO PARTICIPATE AT OUR PROJECT 24 TEAM LEVEL. ONE THING WE SUGGESTED THAT WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO 25

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IMPLEMENT IS THE ACCESSIBILITY WORKING GROUP WHICH WE BROUGHT 1 ONLINE MID-LAST YEAR AND ARE CONTINUING TO WORK NOW. WE HAD A 2 3 SITE VISIT WITH MEMBERS OF THE AWG AT EL CERRITO DEL NORTE SO WE COULD GET SPECIFIC INFORMATION AND FEEDBACK ON THIS 4 5 EXPERIENCES. THERE REMAIN A LOT OF OPPORTUNITIES FOR US TO IMPROVE IN THIS ARENA. ONE PIECE OF FEEDBACK THAT WE HAVE 6 HEARD THAT WE ARE STILL PUZZLING HOW TO IMPLEMENT IS AROUND 7 8 TACTILE PLANS. THAT'S THE CHALLENGE FOR US IS HOW TO -- HOW TO IMPLEMENT AT SCALE. BUT THAT'S SOMETHING THAT WE HAVE HEARD 9 REPEATEDLY AS A WAY THAT WE COULD MAKE OUR MAP PRODUCTS, IN 10 PARTICULAR, MORE ACCESSIBLE. SO THAT'S SOMETHING THAT WE'RE 11 LOOKING TO CONTINUE THE CONVERSATION WITH RON AND OUR 12 ACCESSIBLE WORKING GROUP. 13

15 DIANE SHAW: I THINK THE STORIES YOU'RE HEARING, ARE IMPORTANT 16 AS WE TALK ABOUT THIS WHEN WE TALK ABOUT GOING FOR THE TAX 17 REVENUE MEASURE. SO, I THINK IT'S GOING TO BE REALLY IMPORTANT 18 FOR YOU GUYS TO TELL YOUR STORIES AND WHAT YOU HAVE SEEN AND 19 SOME OF THE POSITIVE OUTCOMES HAVE COME OUT OF THIS EFFORT 20 THAT WE HAVE DONE.

BUT WE'RE ALL MONEY PEOPLE. LIKE, IT WOULD BE NICE TO SEE NUMBERS NOT JUST CHECKMARKS, YOU KNOW, IN THE FUTURE IT 4 5 WOULD BE HELP TO UNDERSTAND WHAT THESE COSTS ARE. 36 MILLION FOR TOTAL PROJECT COST IS REALLY HIGH TO ME. AND THEN IN TERMS 6 OF THE FULL ROLL OUT, WHAT WOULD ALSO BE HELPFUL, YOU KNOW, AS 7 8 YOU THINK ABOUT ALL THE OTHER QUESTIONS THAT, YOU KNOW, HAVE BEEN ASKED AND ALREADY ANSWERED BY YOU BOTH IT WOULD BE 9 HELPFUL TO UNDERSTAND WHAT FULL ROLL OUT MEANS. BECAUSE I 10 IMAGINE THERE IS DIFFERENT SCALES OF WHAT THAT FULL ROLL OUT 11 IS. IS IT, LIKE, LITERALLY EVERY BUS STOP AND EVERY -- LIKE, 12 EVERY KIND OF TRANSIT STOP GETS UPDATE SIGNS, OR DO YOU HAVE 13 CERTAIN THRESHOLDS? OR WHAT WOULD THAT EVEN BE? BECAUSE I 14 15 THINK HAVING A SENSE OF WHAT THAT FULL COST IS HELPFUL, SEEING 16 THIS PHASE COST 36 MILLION, HAS ME CONCERNED FOR WHAT THAT FULL ROLL OUT COST COULD BE. SO, I THINK UNDERSTANDING THE 17 SPECTRUM OF THAT IS HELPFUL. AND I DON'T KNOW IF YOU HAVE ANY 18 ESTIMATES NOW OR IF YOU HAVE BEGUN THINKING ABOUT WHAT THAT 19 20 LOOKS LIKE.

22 GORDON HANSON: I CAN SAY WE HAVE BEGUN THINKING ABOUT IT BUT 23 IT IS A BIT PREMATURE TO SHARE COST ESTIMATES AT THIS 24 PARTICULAR MOMENT.

WE THINK THAT IT HAS A ROLE. WE ALSO HAVE HEARD 12 FEEDBACK FROM OUR MULTIPLE TOUCH POINTS WITH AGENCIES THAT, IN 13 ADDITION TO WORK THAT THEY ARE ALREADY DOING, FOR EXAMPLE, AC 14 15 TRANSIT USES OR CODES ON THEIR SCHEDULE PANELS NOW.
