- ii. Purchase Order Amendment Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) Strategic Advisory Services and Implementation Support: Slalom, Inc (\$700,000).

At the May 2025 Administration Committee meeting, staff provided an update on the ERP

Background:

Program and received approval of a purchase order amendment for ERP Strategic Advisory Services and Implementation Support with Slalom, Inc. An ERP System is software that integrates various business functions (such as Finance, HR, Contracts, Projects, Grants) into one complete system to streamline processes and information across the entire organization. The cross-functional core project team includes MTC staff experts on project management, technology, security, user experience, stakeholder engagement, finance, human resources, and contracts/procurement, and is supported by a broad stakeholder group representing the diverse roles and responsibilities across MTC. Derek Hansel, Chief Financial Officer, and Nick Roethel, Chief Operating Officer, oversee the project. On a monthly basis, the program team also meets with the Steering Committee, comprised of section directors, to provide an update on the implementation status, and for the committee members to provide strategic direction, and guidance on risk management, resource allocation, and change leadership support.

ERP Program Status:

In September 2024, the program team, including consulting firms Mythics and Slalom, kicked off the implementation phase by holding 'Discovery and Design' sessions with MTC subject matter experts (SMEs), who represent the diverse roles and responsibilities across the agency. Mythics then configured Oracle based on the requirements gathered and the design decisions made. In March and June 2025, Mythics demonstrated all Oracle modules to the program team and SMEs, capturing additional requirements and continuing to configure Oracle to MTC's needs. This spring, MTC, Slalom, and Mythics also began work on necessary system integrations and complete data conversions, as well as upcoming training activities to prepare staff for this significant change to Oracle.

As previously committed, we are informing the Committee early about a change to the ERP project. While MTC's configuration of Oracle is functioning as expected, the project executive sponsors and staff determined the original schedule would not allow for integrations with internal and external systems, and complex data conversions to be properly completed prior to formal testing. As a result, there will be a delay in the roll out of specific project elements. The ERP program team performed a feasibility analysis for timing of the deployment of Finance, Human Resources and Payroll modules. The updated draft ERP Program Schedule, as shown in Attachment A, now distributes the roll-out of scope across three phases, with Core HR and Payroll going live on January 1, 2026. Staff continues with risk mitigation measures, and the project is progressing toward having successful go-live dates.

The extension of the schedule will necessitate an increase in budget for the Mythics System Integration contract and the Slalom Strategic Advisory Services purchase order. The ERP Capital Budget will be included in the FY25-26 Agency budget amendment No. 1 to be approved by the Commission on December 17, 2025. In addition to the budget needed for the Mythics contract and Slalom purchase order amendments, the ERP Capital Budget amendment will also cover Koa Hills (\$400,000), Known2U (\$2000) and a Document Management System (TBD) (\$230,000).

Staff will be coming back to this committee in December for approval of two contracts:

Operations and Maintenance services for Oracle software, and the Document Management
System software.

Contract Actions:

Staff requests approval for two contract actions.

i. Contract Amendment – Oracle System Integrator Services – Mythics,
 LLC/Mythics VIII, LLC (\$2,745,859)

Staff requests an amendment to the Mythics contract to continue to provide ERP system integration services for Oracle Cloud Subscription Services.

Mythics was procured through a GPO, a collaborative intergovernmental procurement vehicle which satisfies MTC's competitive procurement requirements. Mythics is not a Small Business Enterprise (SBE) and has three subcontractors, as shown in Attachment B.

The proposed amendment would extend the contract by three months through August 31, 2026, and add an amount not to exceed \$2,745,859. The ERP Capital Budget for this amendment will be included in the FY25-26 Agency budget amendment No. 1 to be approved by the Commission on December 17, 2025.

Issues:

ii. Purchase Order Amendment - Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) Strategic Advisory Services and Integration Support: Slalom, Inc. (\$700,000)

Staff requests an amendment to the Slalom purchase order for consulting services to continue to provide strategic advice, program and change management, training, communications, and technical expertise in data strategy, data migration and future state business process mapping to support MTC's implementation of Oracle Cloud.

Slalom's services were procured using the California Multiple Award Schedule (CMAS), which satisfies MTC's competitive procurement requirements. Slalom is not an SBE and currently has no subcontractors.

The proposed amendment would extend the purchase order by two months through August 31, 2026, and add an amount not to exceed \$700,000. The ERP Capital Budget for this amendment will be included in the FY25-26 Agency budget amendment No. 1 to be approved by the Commission on December 17, 2025.

Issues:

Staff recommends that the Administration Committee authorize the following contract actions:


- i. \$2,745,859 for a Contract Amendment to provide Oracle System Integrator Services through the term of August 31, 2026; and
