1 2 KATE HARTLEY: THANK YOU CHAIR PEDROZA AND I WOULD LIKE TO 3 TRANSFER THAT HONOR TO MY COLLEAGUE IRENE FARNSWORTH WHO PRESENT ON THIS ITEM TODAY. 4 5 SPEAKER: THANK YOU. IF I COULD HAVE THE PRESENTATION. MY NAME 6 IS IRENE FARNSWORTH, THE ANTI-DISPLACEMENT PROGRAM COORDINATOR 7 8 WITH BAHFA PLEASED TO BE HERE TODAY FOR A RENTAL ASSISTANCE PILOT PROGRAM NEXT SLIDE. TO START OFF I'LL SHARE INFORMATION 9 FOR THE NEED FOR RENTAL ASSISTANCE TO PREVENT HOMELESSNESS AND 10 STABILIZE HOUSING FOR LOW-INCOME INDIVIDUALS IN THE BAY AREA. 11 I'M GOING TO BE READING SLIDES FOR ACCESSIBILITY PURPOSES. SO 12 TO THE TITLE OF THIS SLIDE IS RENTAL ASSISTANCE TO PREVENT 13 HOMELESSNESS. AND THE NEED FOR HOMELESS PREVENTION, CURRENTLY 14 ACCORDING TO THE LAST PIT COUNT, 36,800 BAY AREA RESIDENTS 15 16 WERE UNHOUSED IN 2022. APPROXIMATELY 575 PEOPLE ARE CONSIDERED AT-RISK OF HOMELESSNESS. THIS IS OF CONCERN FACING OLDER 17 ADULTS. THEY ARE THE FASTEST GROWING HOMELESS POPULATION. THIS 18 ALSO IS A PARTICULAR CONCERN FACING OLDER ADULTS, SENIORS ARE 19 THE FASTEST GROWING POPULATION WITH THE AGE GROUP WITH 108 20 INCREASE IN CALIFORNIA BETWEEN 2017 AND 2020 COMPARED TO 61% 21 OF THE GENERAL POPULATION BLACK OLDER RENTERS IN CALIFORNIA 22 ARE MOST LIKELY TO BE COST BURDEN WHICH MEANS PAYING MORE THAN 23 30% OF THEIR INCOME AND COST PERSON, MORE THAN 50% THESE ARE 24

CONSIDERED IMPORTANT CRITERIA THAT COULD CAUSE RISK OF



1	HOMELESSNESS. CURRENTLY THERE ARE HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION
2	PROGRAMS THAT PROVIDE RENTAL ASSISTANCE AMONG OTHER SERVICES
3	UNDERWAY IN MANY CITIES MORE THAN IS ON THE SLIDES, SAN JOSE,
4	SAN FRANCISCO AND SOAKED I AM AWARE OF OTHER CITIES AROUND THE
5	BAY DOING THIS WORK NOW AND RECENTLY THROUGH THE CALIFORNIA
6	EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM WE SAW THE IMPORTANCE OF
7	EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE TO PREVENT HOMELESSNESS AND
8	DISPLACEMENT DURING THE PANDEMIC. FINALLY THIS IS A SLIGHTLY
9	DIFFERENT TYPE OF PROGRAM BUT THERE ARE DOZENS OF GUARANTEED
10	INCOME PILOTS THAT ARE OPERATING CURRENTLY IN NEARLY EVERY BAY
11	AREA COUNTY NATION-WIDE THAT SHOWS THE DIFFERENCE IT CAN MAKE
12	TO HAVE A LITTLE EXTRA CASH TO HELP STABILIZE YOUR HOUSEHOLD
13	WHETHER WITH RENT OR FOOD OR OTHER BASIC NEEDS. NEXT SLIDE
14	PLEASE. RESOURCES AND LEGISLATIVE MANDATES IS THE TITLE OF
15	THIS SLIDE. SO BAHFA HAS RECEIVED \$5 MILLION IN MTC EXCHANGE
16	FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING THIS RENTAL ASSISTANCE
17	PILOT. WE ANTICIPATE DIRECTING ADDITIONAL FUNDS AS THEY BECOME
18	AVAILABLE TO EXPAND AND CONTINUE THE PILOT BUT RIGHT NOR WE'RE
19	JUST TALKING ABOUT THAT 5 MILLION TO BE CLEAR. AND WHILE THIS
20	FUNDING IS NOT SUBJECT TO THE A.B. 1487 MANDATE, I DO WANT TO
21	JUST REMIND US THAT THE TENANT PROTECTIONS ARE A CRITICAL PART
22	OF WHY BAHFA WAS A CREATED AND TO ADVANCE, AND WE'RE AN
23	IMPORTANT PART OF THE INITIAL CASA COMPACT I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT
24	HOW 1487 DOES INCLUDE RENTAL ASSISTANCE AS AN ESSENTIAL MEANS

OF FULFILLING THE TENANT PROTECTION OBLIGATION AND THE



- 1 CRITERIA THAT IS SET OUT IN THAT LEGISLATION SO THAT BAHFA CAN
- 2 FUND 48 MONTHS OF RENTAL ASSISTANCE PER HOUSEHOLD WITH OPTION
- 3 TO CONTINUALLY RENEW ASSISTANCE FOR LOW-INCOME SENIORS. SO
- 4 THAT MEANS IF THERE WERE FUNDS ELIGIBLE FOR 1487 MANDATE THAT
- 5 WOULD BE THE CRITERIA. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. ALL RIGHT. SO, FIRST
- 6 I WANT TO PREFACE THIS SLIDE. BY SAYING THAT BAHFA PLANS TO
- 7 CONTRACT WITH A HIGHLY QUALIFIED AND A SERVICE PROVIDER THAT
- 8 HAS DEMONSTRATED SUCCESS IN THIS AREA. WE ARE NOT PLANNING TO
- 9 CREATE THIS ALONE. THESE ARE OUR PILOT PROGRAM GOALS BUT WE
- 10 ANTICIPATE WORKING CLOSELY WITH A SERVICE PROVIDER TO HONE
- 11 THESE GOALS AND MAKE SURE THAT OUR PILOT IS GOING TO

- 18 ALSO WANT TO -- YOU KNOW THIS IS A PILOT PROGRAM SO WE HOPE TO
- 19 LEARN FROM THIS WORK. THERE IS TO OUR KNOWLEDGE FEW PILOTS
- 20 THAT FOCUS ON SENIORS WE'RE LOOKING TO LEARN ABOUT THE SENIOR
- 21 POPULATION ALSO HOPING TO LEARN WHAT THE PILOT CAN DO THIS
- 22 PILOT IS GOING TO SERVE PEOPLE FOR LONGER THAN THE CURRENT
- 23 PILOTS WE SEE IN THE REGION WE'RE DEALING WITH SCARCE
- 24 RESOURCES IT MAKES SENSE TO HAVE SHORTER PILOTS IN SOME CASES
- 25 BUT WE HOPE TO PROVIDE SUPPORT FOR LONGER THAN THE TYPICAL 12



- 1 TO 24 MONTHS THAT WE SEE IN THE REGION. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. AS
- 2 I MENTIONED, BAHFA WILL -- THE PILOT OVERVIEW PROGRAM
- 3 ADMINISTRATION, BAHFA WILL CONTRACT WITH AN EXPERIENCED
- 4 SERVICE PROVIDER TO ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM THROUGH AN OPEN
- 5 PROCUREMENT. WE WILL LAUNCH THE PROGRAM AS SOON AS POSSIBLE
- 6 WITH A FUNDING COMMITMENT EXTENDING THROUGH AT LEAST JUNE
- 7 2026, AND BAHFA WILL PURSUE ALL AVAILABLE FUNDS WITH THE GOAL
- 8 OF CONTINUING THE PROGRAM. IN TERMS OF GEOGRAPHIC REACH, FROM
- 9 OUR RESEARCH WE DO NOT BELIEVE THAT THESE FUNDS, WHILE

- 17 ENROLLMENT PROCESS INCLUDING THE VERIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY.

- 23 THEY'RE GOING TO BE RESPONSIVE TO THAN OTHERS, MAYBE DOING AN
- 24 E-MAIL BLAST ISN'T GOING TO WORK SO MAKING SURE THE WAY KEY DO
- 25 ENROLLMENT IS TAILORED TO THE POPULATION AND CULTURALLY



- 1 APPROPRIATE. FOR PROGRAM INTERVENTION PART OF THE PROGRAM
- 2 WE'LL PROVIDE A MONTHLY HOUSING SUBSIDY OF \$500 TO \$800 FOR UP
- 3 TO 48 MONTHS WITH OPTION OF EXTENSION IF ELIGIBLE AND
- 4 CONNECTIONS TO SUPPORT SERVICES, THIS IS VOLUNTARY NOT A
- 5 REOUIREMENT OF ENTERING THE PROGRAM FOR EACH PARTICIPANT.
- 6 LASTLY EVALUATION, WE ENVISION THIS TO BE A SMALLER IN-HOUSE
- 7 EVALUATION COMPARED TO RANDOMIZED CONTROL TYPE PILOTS, WE WANT
- 8 TO FOCUS FOUNDERING ON THE PROGRAM ITSELF SO THIS WOULD BE

- 19 GOING TO GO BACK TO NAPA I'M ALSO GOING TO THINK ABOUT SENIORS
- 20 IN NAPA THAT NEED HELP. IN THIS MODEL HOW DO WE PROVIDE EQUITY
- 21 IN TERMS OF TRYING TO SPREAD THE FUNDING AROUND WHERE WE HAVE
- 22 PARTICIPATION FROM SMALLER RURAL COUNTIES, AS WELL, JUST AS
- 23 BIG URBAN COUNTIES?



- 1 IRENE FARNSWORTH: THROUGH THE CHAIR THAT'S A GOOD QUESTION.
- 2 THE WAY WE'RE PLANNING TO STRUCTURE THIS PROPOSAL WE WOULD
- 3 ACCEPT PROPOSALS FROM SERVICE PROVIDERS OPERATING IN BOTH
- 4 RURAL OR URBAN AREAS. AND I THINK YOUR QUESTION GETS AT, YOU
- 5 KNOW, THIS MONEY WOULD POTENTIALLY HELP MORE PEOPLE OR FEWER
- 6 PEOPLE, DEPENDING ON WHERE WE'RE GOING, AND I DON'T THINK THAT
- 7 WE CAN SAY IT'S FAIR TO ONE PLACE OR ANOTHER. [LAUGHTER] BUT I
- 8 THINK THAT'S ONE OF THE RELATIONSHIPS WHY WE HAVE A SLIDING --
- 9 WE HAVEN'T DETERMINED THE FINAL AMOUNT THAT PEOPLE WOULD
- 10 RECEIVE BECAUSE \$500 COULD GO A LOT FURTHER IN NAPA FOR
- 11 EXAMPLE, THAN SAN FRANCISCO

- 13 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: I APPRECIATE THAT. AND
- 14 LOOK, IF NO ONE APPLIES FOR NAPA FAIR GAME AND I DON'T WANT TO
- 15 STAND IN THE WAY OF OTHER COUNTIES WHO ARE APPLYING OR
- 16 OPERATORS IN OTHER COUNTIES SO I BELIEVE WE NEED TO MAKE SURE
- 17 THAT WHOEVER SUBMITS GETS OPPORTUNITY TO GO. BUT I ASK FOR
- 18 CONSIDERATION AS WE SEE FOLKS APPLYING LOOKING AT EOUITY
- 19 GEOGRAPHICALLY WE'RE HELPING AS MANY FOLKS AS WE CAN VERSUS
- 20 CONCENTRATION IN ONE COMMUNITY. THOSE ARE MY COMMENTS. THIS IS
- 21 THE TYPE OF STUFF WE GOT TO KEEP PUSHING FORWARD. I APPRECIATE
- 22 IT. COMMISSIONER RONEN?

- 24 HILLARY RONEN: THANK YOU. I JUST WANT WANTED TO MENTION A
- 25 PROGRAM THAT WE HAVE IN SAN FRANCISCO THAT MIGHT DOVE TAIL



WITH SOMETHING LIKE THIS, INTERESTINGLY. IT'S CALLED THE SOS 1 SUBSIDY PROGRAM. SO, WHAT -- MANY SENIORS ARE INELIGIBLE FOR 2 3 OUR LATEST INCOME AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN SAN FRANCISCO BECAUSE THE AREA AMI IS SO HIGH THAT THEIR SOCIAL SECURITY OR SSI 4 5 DOESN'T OUALIFY THEM. AND, SO -- AND THIS IS PARTICULARLY FOR SENIORS. SO SAN FRANCISCO HAS A LOCAL PROGRAM WHERE WE FURTHER 6 SUBSIDIZE THE AFFORDABLE AND, YOU KNOW, IN OUOTES "HOUSING FOR 7 SENIORS" IN ORDER TO MAKE THEM ELIGIBLE FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING 8 THAT'S HOW GRIM THINGS ARE IN SAN FRANCISCO THAT WE HAVE TO 9 10 SUBSIDIZE AFFORDABLE HOUSING FOR SENIORS TO AFFORD TO LIVE IN IT. SO, YOU KNOW -- IT MIGHT GO FURTHER IN OTHER COUNTIES -- I 11 PROBABLY SHOULDN'T SAY THAT -- BUT THAT IS THE TRUTH. BUT, WE 12 ALSO JUST HAVE SUCH A GREAT NEED IN SAN FRANCISCO FOR, TRULY, 13 AFFORDABLE HOUSING FOR SENIORS. SO SOME, SORT OF, OVERLAP OF 14 15 PROGRAMS OR PORTION OF THE MONEY WITH A PROGRAM LIKE THAT TO 16 INCREASE THE NUMBER OF ELIGIBLE SENIORS WOULD BE GREAT. 17 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER. 18 CHAIR ROMERO? 19 20 CHAIR, CARLOS ROMERO, ABAG HC: A COUPLE OF OUESTIONS. SO YOU 21 WERE LOOKING FOR ONE PROVIDER THAT WOULD, IN THE MINE CAN'T 22 BAY AREA WILL DOING THIS FOR THE NINE COUNTIES? OR IS IT JUST 23 ONE PROVIDER IN ONE COUNTY, THEY'RE THE WINNERS? 24



IRENE FARNSWORTH: YES, TO CLARIFY, WE WOULD BE STRUCTURING 1 THIS TO BE ONE PROVIDER, HOWEVER THE DRAFT LANGUAGE I'M 2 3 LOOKING AT, FOR EXAMPLE, A SIMILAR STATE PROGRAM THAT IS PROVIDING ASSISTANCE FOR GUARANTEED INCOME ALLOWS THERE TO BE 4 5 A GROUP OF ENTITIES SUCH AS LOCAL JURISDICTIONS SO THAT THE DEPARTMENT AND SERVICE PROVIDER TOGETHER WE HAVEN'T FINALIZED 6 THAT BUT TO CLARIFY THIS WOULD BE OPERATING IN 1 TO 2 7 8 JURISDICTIONS AT ONE TIME. I DON'T ANTICIPATE THERE BEING SUFFICIENT -- FROM FOLKS WE HAVE TALKED TO, THIS COULD SERVE 9 ABOUT 100 TO 150 PEOPLE SO THAT WOULD BE A LOT TO SPREAD 10 THINNER ACROSS MULTIPLE JURISDICTIONS. I HOPE THAT HELPS. 11 12 CHAIR, CARLOS ROMERO, ABAG HC: I GUESS. RIGHT, IT LOOKS LIKE 13 IF YOU TESTED THIS PROGRAM FOR A YEAR AND YOU GET THE LOWEST 14 AMOUNT OF MONEY WHICH IS 500 IN MY HEAD YOU GET 830 PEOPLE YOU 15 16 CAN SERVE IN A YEAR AND YOU WOULD EXHAUST THE MONEY THIS IS A 17 MULTI-YEAR PROGRAM. 18 IRENE FARNSWORTH: WE ARE HOPING TO OFFER ASSISTANCE FOR UP TO 19 48 MONTHS IT COULD BE LESS IF PEOPLE NO LONGER NEED FUNDING. 20 21 22 CHAIR, CARLOS ROMERO, ABAG HC: COULD BE 200. I'M SORRY CHAIR, 23 JUST A COUPLE OF OUESTIONS. THE MATCHING COMPONENT THERE WOULD BE POINTS OFFERED IN THE RFP FOR THE NON-PROFIT PROVIDER OR 24

I KNOW THAT NOT A LOT OF MONEY BUT I KNOW 11 THEY'RE ARE GOING TO BE COUNTIES THAT MAY NOT BE ABLE TO 12 APPLY. 13 14 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: ARE WE TALKING ONE 15 16 OPERATOR FOR THE WHOLE REGION. 17 SPEAKER: I'M NOT AWARE OF SUCH AN OPERATOR EXISTS. 18 19 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: IF THEY WERE TO EXIST 20 21 THEY COULD APPLY BUT DECISION WORK WITH THE OPERATORS. 22 23 SPEAKER: ONE SERVICE PROVIDER HOWEVER IF TWO WANT TO BAND TOGETHER AND SUBMIT A FANTASTIC PROPOSAL I WOULD CONSIDER IT, 24 TO CLARIFY THE VISION IS ONE SERVICE PROVIDER THAT OPERATES 25

THIS IS A SPECIALIZED AREA THAT NOT 13 A LOT OF ORGANIZATIONS HAVE. SO, BEING ABLE TO DO THAT BANKING 14 15 SIDE OF THINGS, AND THEN I USE THE TERM SERVICE PROVIDER 16 BECAUSE WE ALSO ENVISION THERE BEING AVAILABLE SERVICES TO GO ALONG WITH THIS ASSISTANCE. 17 18 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: I GUESS MY STRUGGLE IS, 19 THERE IS INFRASTRUCTURE AND MANY MUNICIPALITIES, COMMUNITY 20 21 FOUNDATIONS THAT DID IT DURING THE PANDEMIC, WHY WOULD WE NOT WANT TO GIVE THEM AN OPPORTUNITY SO IF THE FOUNDATION IN NAPA 22 BIDS AND THE FOUNDATION IN SAN FRANCISCO BIDS THEN MARIN AND 23 SONOMA IT SEEMS YOU'RE STRETCHING IT MORE AND WILL POTENTIALLY 24

REACH MORE PEOPLE, DIE LOSING THE 5 MILLION BUT IS THERE



VALUE, IN THE REGION WE CAN COME BACK AS POLICY MAKERS AND OUR 1 500,000 -- WITH THE WAITING LIST OF 1,000 YOU KNOW -- ARE WE 2 3 MISSING AN OPPORTUNITY. 4 5 KATE HARTLEY: OUR GOAL IS TO REACH AS MANY PEOPLE IN, OUR GOAL OF 100 A MONTH OR 200 A MONTH IS PROBABLY NOT GOING TO PREVENT 6 A SENIOR FROM BECOMING HOMELESS, AND SO WHY WE'RE THINKING 500 7 8 TO 800 A MONTH IS STILL QUITE SHALLOW, THE FACT THAT MANY SENIORS HAVE SOCIAL SECURITY INCOME AT 800 A MONTH, MIGHT HAVE 9 1,000 A MONTH RENT PAYMENT IF THEY'RE LUCKING SO WE HAVE A 10 SMALL AMOUNT OF FUNDS 5 MILLION IS MORE THAN MANY OF THE 11 PROGRAMS THAT ARE OUT THERE SO WE FELT FORTUNATE THAT WE CAN 12 EXTEND IT AND REALLY PREVENT HOMELESSNESS BUT OUR GOAL 13 REGIONALLY IS TO BE ABLE TO OVER TIME THROUGH OUR LENDING AND 14 15 OTHER FUND RACING INCREASE THIS POOL OF FUNDS IT'S ABSOLUTELY 16 NECESSARY AND IT'S VITAL TO PREVENT HOMELESSNESS ESPECIALLY FOR SENIORS THIS IS JUST A START AND WE WANT TO BE IN EVERY 17 COUNTY BUT WE KNOW WE HAVE TO WORK WITHIN THE CONSTRAINTS OF 18 THE ONE TIME SOURCE OF FUNDS RIGHT NOW BUT WE'RE GOING TO 19 WELCOME EVERY SINGLE APPLICATION THE FARTHER ARE WE CAN MAKE 20 21 THE MONEY GO THE MORE PEOPLE WE CAN REACH, THE BETTER. 22 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: I DON'T WANT TO GET IN 23 THE WAY OF PROGRESS BUT I HOPE WE ALLOW CONSORTIUMS TO BID SO 24 IF IT'S A FOUNDATION IN NAPA, SONOMA-MARIN, SANTA CLARA, THEY 25



- 1 BID AND THEY'RE JUST AS COMPETITIVE AS ONE BIGGER SERVICE
- 2 PROVIDER. SO I JUST WANT TO MAKE SURE WE'RE NOT EXCLUDEING
- 3 ANYONE FROM APPLYING. SOUNDS LIKE WE'RE NOT. PERFECT.
- 4 COMMISSIONER PAPAN?

- 6 GINA PAPAN: THANK YOU. AND THANK YOU FOR ALL THIS GREAT WORK.
- 7 THIS IS EXCITING, BUT AS YOU CAN UNDERSTAND, WE ALL HAVE
- 8 JURISDICTIONS THAT ARE IN SUCH DIRE NEED FOR THIS. SO, LET ME
- 9 BACK UP FOR A SECOND. HOW DO WE DETERMINE WHO IS AT RISK AS
- 10 FAR AS SENIORS GO? BECAUSE MOST PEOPLE, UNTIL THEY'RE
- 11 EXTREMELY JUST THERE, IS -- HOW ARE YOU DETERMINING THIS?

- 13 IRENE FARNSWORTH: THAT'S A GREAT QUESTION. PRIORITIZATION IS
- 14 ONE OF THE BIGGEST THINGS THAT THESE PROGRAMS GRAPPLE WITH.
- 15 BECAUSE AS YOU'RE ALL SAYING THERE ARE SO MANY PEOPLE IN NEED
- 16 OF THIS ASSISTANCE WE ANTICIPATE OUR RFP HAVING A BROAD LOW-
- 17 INCOME PEOPLE MUST BE LOW-INCOME MUST DEMONSTRATE A NEED FOR
- 18 THE ASSISTANCE, AND WITH A PREFERENCE FOR BEING SENIORS.
- 19 HOWEVER, FROM DOING RESEARCH TO CREATE THIS PROPOSAL, I TALKED
- 20 TO NUMEROUS PROGRAMS, INCLUDING SEVERAL THAT SERVE SENIORS
- 21 SPECIFICALLY, FOR EXAMPLE, ONE IN SAN DIEGO WAS SAYING THAT IT
- 22 CAN BE VERY CHALLENGING WITH THE SENIOR POPULATION TO USE THE
- 23 SAME CRITERIA WE USE FOR THE GENERAL POPULATION AROUND RISK OF
- 24 HOMELESSNESS BECAUSE THEY MAY BE VASTLY PREFERENCING SPENDING
- 25 THEIR MONEY ON HOUSING, COMPARED TO THE WORKING POPULATION.



- 1 SO, FOR EXAMPLE, SPENDING 90% OF THEIR -- 100% OF THEIR INCOME
- 2 ON THEIR HOUSING. SO, HAVING REALLY SPECIFIC CRITERIA AROUND
- 3 THEIR FINANCES IS SOMETHING THAT I GOT FEEDBACK THAT IT'S
- 4 BETTER TO START MORE GENERAL IN THAT AREA. HOWEVER, AGAIN, I
- 5 WOULD BE LOOKING TO THE CONSORTIUM, THE INDIVIDUAL PROVIDER,
- 6 WHOEVER WE CONTRACT WITH, TO PROVIDE GUIDANCE IN THAT AREA.
- 7 AND I THINK TO YOUR POINT, THE MAIN CRITERIA THAT I HAVE SEEN
- 8 IN RESEARCH FOR PREDICTING HOMELESSNESS IS A PREVIOUS
- 9 INCIDENCE OF HOMELESSNESS. THIS IS, UNFORTUNATELY, ONE OF THE
- 10 MOST CONSISTENT PREDICTORS OF HOMELESSNESS. AND GIVEN THE
- 11 SENIOR POPULATION, A LOT OF PEOPLE BECOME HOMELESS FOR THE
- 12 FIRST TIME. THEY HAVEN'T BEEN HOMELESS SINCE THEY WERE 25,
- 13 THEY HAVE BECOME HOMELESS FOR THE FIRST TIME AS AN OLDER
- 14 PERSON AND I'M NOT SURE THAT'S SOMETHING WE WANT A STAKE IN
- 15 THE GROUND RIGHT NOW. NOT TO SAY WE WOULDN'T PUT IN PLACE AT A
- 16 LATER DATE BUT RIGHT NOW I THINK YOU WANT TO STICK TO A
- 17 SLIGHTLY BROADER DEFINITION.

- 19 GINA PAPAN: YOU CLEARLY IDENTIFIED HEALTH ISSUES AND WE KNOW
- 20 FOR A FACT THAT CAN SEND PEOPLE INTO HOMELESSNESS VERY
- 21 QUICKLY, I'M NOT SURE IF THERE IS AN INDICATOR ARE PEOPLE
- 22 FOLLOWING THIS TYPE OF THING BUT WOULD IT BE A GOOD PREVENTION
- 23 ASPECT TO IT HERE I MEAN I'M PROBABLY IN THE JURISDICTION WITH
- 24 THE LARGEST INCOME GAP LITERALLY PEOPLE ARE LIVING THIS YEAR
- 25 ALONE UNDER 15,000 I'M NOT SURE HOW THEY ARE, BUT THEY ARE. WE



- 1 DON'T WANT TO SEE THIS JUST GET CENTERED IN ONE AREA. BECAUSE
- 2 EASILY ALL OF OUR AREAS ARE TUMBLING DOWN FURTHER AND FURTHER,
- 3 AND WE ALL HAVE DISPARATE NEED FOR THIS. SO, I KNOW YOU GUYS
- 4 ARE INTERESTED IN RESULTS. SO ARE WE, AND HOPEFULLY WE CAN GET
- 5 MUCH MORE FUNDING OUT THE DOOR HERE. BUT YEAH WE REALLY WANT
- 6 TO SEE THAT IT'S JUST NOT FAVORED IN ONE AREA, THAT IT'S -- IT
- 7 GETS SPREAD AS FAR AS POSSIBLE, AND HOPEFULLY WE GET LOTS MORE
- 8 MONEY TO ENSURE THIS HAPPENS. AND WE'RE EAGER TO SEE HOW IT
- 9 WORKS, TOO. SO, THAT WILL BE GOOD. THANK YOU. I'M EXCITED, BUT
- 10 WISH I WAS MORE EXCITED. [LAUGHTER] THANKS.

- 14 HILLARY RONEN: THANK YOU. SORRY TO TALK AGAIN. I JUST WANTED
- 15 TO SAY THAT I REALLY APPRECIATE THE CRITERIA THAT YOU HAVE
- 16 COME UP WITH. I THINK IT'S SO LITTLE MONEY THAT IT ACTUALLY
- 17 DOES PROBABLY MAKE SENSE TO GO WITH ONE. OR, YOU KNOW, ONE OR
- 18 TWO PROVIDERS. AND I THINK IT'S A GREAT PILOT PROJECT, AS
- 19 BAHFA'S ESTABLISHING ITSELF AND LEARNING HOW TO OPERATES IF A
- 20 REGIONAL CONTEXT. BECAUSE IN SAN FRANCISCO, ALONE, WE HAVE
- 21 MANY LOCAL PROGRAMS AND WE GO THROUGH, SIMILAR TO THIS, ALL
- 22 LOCAL AGENCIES. SO, AND EVERY ONE HAS SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT
- 23 CRITERIA, I BELIEVE, BASED ON THE POPULATION THAT THEY WORK
- 24 WITH. SO YOU LEARN A LOT ABOUT WHAT THAT PARTICULAR POPULATION
- 25 LOOKS LIKE, AND HOW THEY'RE VULNERABLE TO HOMELESSNESS. AND,





- 1 SO, ONE -- YOU KNOW, PROBABLY OUR BIGGEST PROVIDER OF
- 2 ASSISTANCE OF THIS TYPE OF ASSISTANCE IS THE EVICTION DEFENSE
- 3 COLLABORATIVE AND SO WHAT THEY HAVE DONE IS THEY HAVE
- 4 CONNECTED THEIR EVICTION DEFENSE ATTORNEY WORK WITH THIS
- 5 HOUSING SUBSIDY PREVENTION WORK. SO, IF SOMEONE IS GETTING
- 6 EVICTED FOR FAILURE TO PAY RENT, THEY SEE IF THEY'RE ELIGIBLE
- 7 FOR THIS PROGRAM AND THEY COMBINE IT TOGETHER AND PREVENT THIS
- 8 PERSON FROM BECOMING HOMELESS THAT'S A PARTICULAR MOD OLE
- 9 BECAUSE THEY HAVE LAWYERS IN-HOUSE DOING EVICTION DEFENSE THAT
- 10 HE WORKED QUITE WELL, OTHER THAN CENTRAL LEGAL DE LA RAZA THAT
- 11 DOES HAVE LAWYERS IN-HOUSE ISN'T DOING EVICTION DEFENSE BUT
- 12 IT'S WORKING WITH A VERY LOW-INCOME POPULATION IT LOOKS A
- 13 LITTLE DIFFERENT WITH LITTLE MONEY THEN YOU DON'T HAVE THE
- 14 SAME KIND OF LEARNING THAT YOU WOULD HAVE AS A PILOT, AND SEE
- 15 SUCCESS AS YOU WOULD, AND I MEAN MY JURISDICTION WOULD KILL ME
- 16 FOR SAYING THIS, BUT I THINK IT MAKES SENSE THIS WILL PROBABLY
- 17 BE THE FIRST AND LAST TIME YOU HEAR ME SAY THIS IT'S PROBABLY
- 18 GOING TO A SMALLER AREA THAT DOESN'T HAVE SUCH A ROBUST LOCAL
- 19 PROGRAM I'M GOING TO GET KILLED FOR THIS, BUT BECAUSE YOU HAVE
- 20 TO -- YOU KNOW, WE HAVE TO SPREAD THIS OPPORTUNITY OUT, AND WE
- 21 NEED ALL OF OUR REGIONS TO BE LEARNING THIS REALLY, REALLY
- 22 SUCCESSFUL TECHNIQUE IN PREVENTING HOMELESSNESS. AND, YOU
- 23 KNOW, MANY JURISDICTIONS HAVE NOTHING. AND SAN FRANCISCO HAS
- 24 QUITE A ROBUST PROGRAM. WE HAVE MANY PEOPLE, MANY MORE PEOPLE
- 25 THAN WE CAN SERVE. SO, I HATE SAYING THIS, BUT, AGAIN, THIS IS



-- IT'S A PILOT POT OF MONEY. AND SO YOU WANT TO LEARN 1 SOMETHING NEW FROM IT. AND, SO, DON'T TELL ANYONE THAT I SAID 2 3 THAT, BUT -- I JUST WANT TO THROW THAT OUT THERE. 4 5 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: COMMISSIONER ABE-KOGA? 6 MARGARET ABE-KOGA: THANK YOU, CHAIR. I WOULD AGREE WITH 7 8 EXACTLY THAT, IT'S A PILOT PROGRAM. I ACTUALLY THINK \$5 MILLION IS A GOOD AMOUNT OF FUNDING. WE IN MOUNTAIN VIEW DID 9 RENTAL HOUSING -- RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM RENT RELIEF DURING 10 COVID AND IT WAS 5 TO \$6 MILLION AND I HAVE TO LOOK BUT I 11 THINK WE HELPED ABOUT 2000 FAMILIES. SO THAT WAS A SUBSTANTIVE 12 AMOUNT OF PEOPLE WE HELPED. AND I GUESS I WAS LOOKING AT THE 13 POSSIBILITY OF MATCHING, AND I WAS THINKING CROSS 14 15 JURISDICTION, THERE IS AGENCY THAT DOES SERVE SAN MATEO AND 16 SANTA CLARA COUNTIES AND THEY'RE REALLY EMBARKING ON THE GUARANTEED BASIC INCOME INITIATIVE. I'M WONDERING IF THERE IS 17 SOME WAY TO PARTNER WITH THAT. I FIND -- I'M REALLY EXCITED 18 ABOUT THIS. I THINK THERE ARE SOME OPPORTUNITIES OUT THERE, 19 AND AS MENTIONED, COMMISSIONER RONEN, I THINK WE JUST NEED TO 20 DO MORE OF THESE TO SHOW PEOPLE THAT THEY CAN WORK AND THEN TO 21 LEARN FROM THESE PROGRAMS. PANDEMIC THAT WE DID IT AND IT SHOWED SUCCESS, AND I BELIEVE



WE SHOULD CONTINUE TO DO THESE PILOTS AND SHOW THE BENEFIT OF 1 THEM. THANK YOU. 2 3 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER. 4 5 MEMBER TIEDEMANN? 6 7 SPEAKER: THANK YOU. FIRST I WANT TO AGREE WITH THE PREVIOUS 8 MEMBERS, AND SPEAKING FROM MY EXPERIENCE, IF YOU -- THERE IS A LOT OF ECONOMIES OF SCALE GOING ON HERE AND IF YOU BREAK IT 9 DOWN FURTHER THAN 5 MILLION AS SAID THIS IS A COMPLICATED 10 THING TO ADMINISTER, AND IT MAY START TO BECOME DIFFICULT TO 11 ADMINISTER IT WHILE ALSO HAVE A MEANINGFUL IMPACT WHERE IT IS. 12 SO, YOU KNOW, AS A PILOT PROGRAM IT MAY MAKE SENSE TO DO IT IN 13 ONE PLACE, IT'S INCUMBENT ON US TO FIGURE OUT MORE FUNDING FOR 14 15 IT AT SOME POINT DOWN THE LINE. I HAVE TWO QUESTIONS IN A 16 SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT TACK, BECAUSE WE DON'T HAVE A PROVIDER WHICH IS TOTALLY FINE, SAYS HAS THE DECISION BEEN MADE ON HOW 17 FUNDING IS GOING TO PEOPLE IF IT'S GOING TO THEM OR A LANDLORD 18 19 DIRECTLY. 20 SPEAKER: THAT DECISION HAS NOT BEEN MADE BUT AS YOU MENTIONED 21 22 PILOTS ARE CURRENTLY DOING BOTH.



SPEAKER: AND THEN SECONDLY YOU MENTIONED THE CORE GOAL TO 1 2 REDUCE ADMIN BURDEN FOR APPLICANTS HAS THERE BEEN THOUGHT 3 ABOUT HOW THAT'S GOING TO BE ACCOMPLISHED. 4 5 SPEAKER: THAT WOULD ALSO BE SOMETHING I WOULD FINALIZE PARTNERSHIP WITH THE SERVICE PROVIDER BUT I HAVE HEARD 6 MULTIPLE EXAMPLES FROM OTHER PILOTS JUST HAVING RELATIVELY 7 8 SIMPLE FORMS HAVING THINGS IN MULTIPLE LANGUAGES BRINGING PAPER TO PEOPLE'S HOUSES MEETING PEOPLE WHERE THEY'RE AT AND 9 10 IF HE DIDN'T HAVE THE PERFECT DOCUMENTATION IN PLACE FIGURE OUT ANOTHER WAY. 11 12 AARON TIEDEMANN: WE HAVE DONE A PROGRAM IN ALBANY AND I HAVE 13 LOOKED AT SOCIAL SAFETY NET PROGRAMS AND THE ADMINISTRATIVE 14 15 BURDEN FOR APPLICANTS IS REALLY HARD TO OVERSTATE HOW BIG OF 16 AN ISSUE THAT CAN BE FOR PEOPLE WHO MOST NEED THIS SO I WANT TO MAKE SURE WE'RE DOING EVERYTHING WE CAN TO MAKE SURE THAT 17 DOESN'T MAKE PEOPLE NOT APPLY AND IT SEEMS ESPECIALLY IN THIS 18 CASE, IN ALAMEDA COUNTY THERE IS A WHOLE LIST OF PEOPLE WHO 19 HAVE COMPLETED AN APPLICATION TO GET RENTAL ASSISTANCE AND NOT 20 21 GOTTEN IT, IF YOU HAVE SUBMITTED AN APPLICATION AND PROVEN EVERYTHING FOR ANOTHER PROGRAM IF WE CAN TAKE THAT FULLY 22 FORMED AND SAY YOU OUALIFY, YOU HAVE ALREADY DONE THE WORK AS 23 MUCH AS POSSIBLE, AND SIMILARLY HOW WE'RE GETTING IT TO 24

PEOPLE, I WANT US TO BE CAREFUL IN ALBANY OF, THERE IS A



- 1 DANGER SOMETIMES IF WE ARE GIVING MONEY TO FOLKS THAT IT WILL
- 2 DEQUALIFY THEM FOR OTHER MONEY THAT THEY'RE DEPENDENT ON,

- 8 WOULD HELP EXTEND THE USE OF THIS LIMITED AMOUNT OF MONEY THAT
- 9 WE HAVE, BECAUSE OBVIOUSLY THE RENT IN SAN FRANCISCO IS A LOT
- 10 MORE THAN IN THE OUTLYING AREAS OF THE BAY AREA. AND, SO, IF

SO, HAVE YOU HAD A CHANCE TO LOOK AT THAT ISSUE WHETHER 18 OWNERS OF MOBILE HOMES WOULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR THIS RENTAL 19 20 ASSISTANCE 21 IRENE FARNSWORTH: THANK YOU FOR THAT POINT WE KNOW MOBILE HOME 22 RENTAL ASSISTANCE WOULD BE HELPFUL WE HAVE TAKEN A LOOK AT IT 23 AND PEOPLE WHO OWN THEIR MOBILE HOME BUT PAY RENT ON THEIR PAD 24

WOULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR THIS SOURCE OF FUNDS.
