9 **CHAIR, EDDIE AHN, MTC:** ALL RIGHT. I BELIEVE THAT BRINGS US TO
10 AGENDA ITEM 8A, WHICH IS A BIT OF A DOOZY. FINAL PLANNED BAY
11 AREA 2050+. FOR NEARLY THREE YEARS STAFF HAVE BEEN WORKING ON
12 AN UPDATE TO THE REGION'S LONG RANGE PLAN FOR TRANSPORTATION,
13 HOUSING, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND ENVIRONMENTAL RESILIENCE
14 KNOWN AS PLANNED BAY AREA 2050+. PLANNED BAY AREA 2050+ IS A
15 LIMITED AND FOCUSED UPDATE OF THE CURRENT LONG RANGE PLAN
16 PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 ADOPTED IN 2021 THAT HAS STRIVED TO
17 REFLECT POST-PANDEMIC PLANNING REALITIES AND TIGHTER FISCAL
18 CONSTRAINTS WHILE ENGAGING THOUSANDS OF BAY AREA RESIDENTS AND
19 STAKEHOLDER ORGANIZATIONS. TODAY STAFF ARE BRINGING FORWARD
20 THE PROPOSED FINAL PLANNED BAY AREA 2050+ WITH RECOMMENDATION
21 TO ADVANCE VARIOUS COMPONENTS OF THE PLAN TO THE ABAG
22 EXECUTIVE BOARD AND TO THE COMMISSION ON MARCH 19th AND 25th
23 RESPECTIVELY FOR THEIR APPROVAL. STAFF WILL PROVIDE
24 CONSOLIDATED PRESENTATION ON TWO ABAG ACTION ITEMS AND FOUR
25 MTC ACTION ITEMS BEFORE THE COMMITTEES TODAY. AND FOCUSING ON



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1 REVISIONS MADE ON FEEDBACK DURING THE FINAL ROUND OF PUBLIC
2 ENGAGEMENT AND NEXT STEPS LOOKING AHEAD TO 2026. SO WITH THAT,
3 WE'LL HAVE DAVE VAUTIN WILL PROVIDE THE REPORTS. AND KEEP IN
4 MIND, THIS IS FOR ITEMS 8A THROUGH 8E. THANK YOU, DAVE.

5

6 **DAVE VAUTIN:** GOOD MORNING. DAVE VAUTIN, PLANNING DIRECTOR WITH
7 MTC AND ABAG, AND I'M EXCITED TO BE HERE THIS MORNING TO
8 PRESENT THE PROPOSED FINAL PLANNED BAY AREA 2050+ FOR YOUR
9 CONSIDERATION. THIS IS OUR REGION'S LONG RANGE PLAN CONNECTING
10 TRANSPORTATION, HOUSING, ECONOMY, AND THE ENVIRONMENT WHILE
11 MEETING AND EXCEEDING STATE AND FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS. BEFORE
12 WE GET GOING, I WANT TO RECOGNIZE THE TREMENDOUS EFFORT OF THE
13 PROJECT TEAM OVER THE PAST THREE YEARS INCLUDING PROJECT
14 MANAGER CHIRAG RABARI AND ACTING PROJECT MANAGER ADAM
15 NOELTING, AMONG MANY OTHERS WHO HAVE LED THIS EFFORT THAT
16 ENGAGED THOUSANDS OF BAY AREA RESIDENTS ACROSS OUR DIVERSE
17 REGION. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. NEXT SLIDE. ALL RIGHT. SO AS
18 MENTIONED, WE'RE NEARING THE FINAL MILESTONE OF THIS CYCLE OF
19 OUR REGION'S LONG RANGE PLAN PROCESS FOR POTENTIAL ADOPTION BY
20 THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD AND COMMISSION IN THE WEEKS AHEAD.
21 SINCE 2023, WE HAVE CONDUCTED THIS LIMITED AND FOCUSED UPDATE
22 WHILE RECOGNIZING POST-PANDEMIC HEADWINDS, TIGHTER FISCAL
23 CONSTRAINTS, SLOWER POPULATION GROWTH, AND HIGHER OFFICE
24 VACANCY RATES. IN 2025 THE COMMISSION AND ABAG APPROVED THE
25 FINAL BLUEPRINT INCLUDING STRATEGIES AND GROWTH GEOGRAPHIES,



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1 AND IN SUMMER 2025 ADVANCED THE FINAL BLUEPRINT INTO THE CEQA
2 PROCESS. SINCE OUR TEAM HAS BEEN WORKING HARD TO CONDUCT
3 STATE-MANDATED ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS, CRAFTING THE PLAN
4 DOCUMENT AND ASSOCIATED REPORTS, AND PERHAPS MOST IMPORTANTLY,
5 TRANSLATING THE PLAN'S LONG RANGE STRATEGIES INTO DISCRETE
6 MEANINGFUL NEAR-TERM ACTIONS THAT MTC AND ABAG CAN WORK TO
7 ADVANCE OVER THE NEXT FIVE YEARS, AS IDENTIFIED IN THE
8 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN. LAST MONTH, AT THESE COMMITTEES, WE
9 SHARED A SYNTHESIS OF COMMENTS FROM THE FOURTH AND FINAL ROUND
10 OF PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT, INCLUDING A DEEPER DIVES ON THE FINAL
11 REGIONAL GROWTH FORECAST AS REFLECTIVE IN THE JANUARY 2025
12 ACTION ITEM. SINCE THEN, WE HAVE POSTED ALL OF THE COMMENTS ON
13 THE PLANNED BAY AREA WEB SITE AND RESPONDED TO THEM ALL BY E-
14 MAIL, LETTER, OR VIA THE FINAL EIR. WE ALSO PROVIDED ONLINE
15 THE FAQ THAT COMMISSIONERS AND BOARD MEMBERS FOUND USEFUL ON
16 THE REGIONAL GROWTH FORECAST. LAST WEEK WE RELEASED THE
17 PROPOSED FINAL PLANNED BAY AREA 2050+ TO THE PUBLIC, ALSO
18 AGAIN, AVAILABLE ON THE PLANNEDBAYAREA.ORG WEBSITE, ALONG WITH
19 ITS FINAL EIR AND THE VARIOUS SUPPLEMENTAL REPORTS. WE HAVE
20 RECEIVED A HANDFUL OF COMMENTS SINCE THAT RELEASE. THOSE ARE
21 THIS GOLDENROD ATTACHMENT THAT YOU CAN FIND. I THINK THERE IS
22 ROUGHLY FIVE OR SIX LETTERS IN THERE THAT I WANTED TO
23 REFERENCE. THOSE ARE INCLUDED IN THE PACKET AND WE'LL CONTINUE
24 TO INCLUDE FURTHER COMMENTS THAT WE DO RECEIVE PRIOR TO ANY
25 ABAG BOARD OR COMMISSION APPROVAL ITEMS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.



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1 SO, THESE TWO COMMITTEES HAVE SEEN THIS SLIDE PERHAPS MANY,
2 MANY TIMES BEFORE. SO I'M GOING TO PROCEED FAIRLY QUICKLY TO
3 GET TO THE REVISIONS THAT HAVE BEEN MADE TO THE DRAFT PLAN
4 SINCE ITS RELEASE IN THE FALL. BUT SUFFICE TO SAY PLANNED BAY
5 AREA 2050+ PLANS TO ANSWER A NOT SO SIMPLE QUESTION OF WHAT
6 WOULD IT TAKE TO MAKE SURE THAT PLANNED BAY AREA IS AFFORDABLE
7 CONNECTED DIVERSE HEALTHY AND VIBRANT FOR ALL BY THE YEAR
8 2050. WHILE THE PLAN'S STRATEGIES RETAINED FROM PRIOR CYCLE WE
9 CONTINUED TO HAVE 35 STRATEGIES IN TOTAL THE COMMISSION AND
10 BOARD LAST YEAR APPROVED CRITICAL PIVOTS TO KEY STRATEGIES
11 FROM WEAVING COST SAVING PROPOSE TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING TO
12 REIMAGINING TRANSIT VISION POST-PANDEMIC WITH FOCUS ON
13 FREQUENCY SPEED AND SAFETY AS WELL AS MORE DELINEATING ROBUST
14 INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS ASSOCIATED WITH RISING SEA LEVELS. IT'S
15 IMPORTANT TO UNDERSCORE THAT PLANNED BAY AREA AS ALWAYS IS A
16 VISION AND NORTH STAR BUT DOES NOT ALLOCATE MONEY, DOES NOT
17 OVERRIDE LOCAL LAND USE AUTHORITY IMPOSE MANDATES OR PROPOSE
18 ANY LEGISLATION. NEXT SLIDE. THIS ITERATION OF PLANNED BAY
19 AREA CONTINUES A LONG-STANDING FOCUS ON FOCUSED GROWTH WITH
20 THE VAST MAJORITY OF HOUSING AND JOBS ANTICIPATED TO OCCUR IN
21 LOCALLY NOMINATED AND REGIONALLY IDENTIFIED GROWTH GEOGRAPHIES
22 WITH NEARLY ALL DEVELOPMENT OCCURRING WITHIN TODAY'S URBAN
23 GROWTH BOUNDARIES. NEXT SLIDE. IF IMPLEMENTED, THE PLAN WOULD
24 SIGNIFICANTLY REDUCE HOUSING AND TRANSPORTATION COSTS, EVEN
25 MORE SO FOR LOW-INCOME HOUSEHOLDS, CREATE MANY MORE HOUSING



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1 OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN A SHORT WALK OF PUBLIC TRANSIT, DOUBLE
2 THE SHARE OF SUSTAINABLE COMMUTING BY A TRANSIT, BIKING, AND
3 WALKING AND INCREASE OPEN SPACE PER CAPITA AMONG A VARIETY OF
4 OTHER POSITIVE OUTCOMES. PERHAPS MOST IMPORTANTLY, THE PLAN
5 WOULD ACTUALLY NOT JUST MEET, BUT EXCEED THE STATE-MANDATED
6 PER CAPITA GHG REDUCTION TARGET OF 19%, THROUGH A VARIETY OF
7 STRATEGIES, INCLUDING PRICING, LAND USE, AND PUBLIC TRANSIT.
8 FULFILLING A CRITICAL STATE REQUIREMENT. NEXT SLIDE. AS
9 MENTIONED EARLIER, THE STRATEGIC REVISIONS TO THE LONG RANGE
10 PLAN INVOLVE ROBUST COMMUNITIES ENGAGEMENT, AND WE TOUCHED ALL
11 CORNERS OF THE REGION IN THE PROCESS THROUGH A VARIETY OF IN-
12 PERSON AND DIGITAL MEANS, INCLUDING WEBINARS AND ONLINE
13 SURVEYS. FOR MORE ON ALL THE ASPECTS OF THAT PROCESS INCLUDING
14 THE PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT, I WOULD REFER YOU TO THE PLAN TODAY AS
15 WELL AS VARIOUS SUPPLEMENTAL REPORTS POSTED ONLINE. NEXT
16 SLIDE. THAT BRINGS US TO TODAY MARCH 2026. AS MENTIONED
17 EARLIER, OUR TEAM HAS BEEN FOCUSED ON MAKING TARGETED
18 REVISIONS TO VARIOUS PLAN DOCUMENTS THROUGH PUBLIC AND -- YOU
19 KNOW, IN RESPONSE TO PUBLIC AND STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK, AND I
20 WANT TO WALK THROUGH THOSE VARIOUS ASPECTS OF THE REVISIONS AS
21 WE BRING FORWARD THE PLAN FOR POTENTIAL APPROVAL HIGHLIGHTING
22 WHAT HAS CHANGED SINCE THAT OCTOBER 2025 RELEASE AND TODAY.
23 NEXT SLIDE. NOW, SHOULD YOU WISH TO ADVANCE THE PLAN TO THE
24 FULL COMMISSION AND BOARD FOR APPROVAL, AS CHAIR AHN
25 MENTIONED, THERE ARE FOUR ACTION ITEMS IN FRONT OF YOU,



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1 CONSISTING OF 36 INDIVIDUAL VOTES. TWO BY MTC -- SORRY -- TWO
2 BY ABAG, AND FOUR BY MTC. ITEM 8B IS RELATED TO THE AIR
3 QUALITY CONFORMITY REPORT WHICH FULFILL FEDERAL AIR QUALITY
4 REQUIREMENTS AND IT'S A STATUTORY REQUIREMENT ASSIGNED TO MTC.
5 ITEM 8C IS THE FINAL EIR WHICH FULFILLS STATE CEQA
6 REQUIREMENTS AND REQUIRES BOTH BOARDS TO ULTIMATELY CERTIFY
7 IT. ITEM 8D, THE FINAL PLAN DOCUMENT AND ITS ASSOCIATED
8 SUPPLEMENTAL REPORTS, WHICH ALSO MUST BE APPROVED BY BOTH
9 BOARDS, AND ITEM 8E IS THE 2025 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT
10 PROGRAM, OR TIP, WHICH NEEDS TO BE CONFORMED TO ALIGN WITH THE
11 NEW PLAN ONCE ADOPTED. AND, AGAIN, THIS IS AN MTC SPECIFIC
12 RESPONSIBILITY. I'LL SHARE MORE ON EACH OF THESE AS WE GO
13 FORWARD. NEXT SLIDE. LAST MONTH AT THIS COMMITTEE, WE DID
14 SHARE A SYNOPSIS OF KEY FEEDBACK HEARD DURING THE FINAL ROUND
15 OF ENGAGEMENT, AND THIS SLIDE IS REALLY INTENDED TO JUST
16 PROVIDE A QUICK REFRESH OR THAT. DURING THAT ENGAGEMENT,
17 RESIDENTS UNDERScoreD THE NEED TO BUILD PUBLIC CONFIDENCE BY
18 FOCUSING ON IMPLEMENTATION. THEY RAISED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE
19 PLAN'S REGIONAL GROWTH FORECAST, THEY UNDERScoreD THE
20 IMPORTANCE OF AFFORDABILITY, TRANSIT SERVICE AND EQUITY, AND
21 NOTE THAT LOCAL CAPACITY IS STRETCHED THIN. WE WORKED TO
22 ENHANCE THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN BASED ON THIS FEEDBACK AND
23 ADDED CONTEXT TO THE PLAN DOCUMENT'S SUPPLEMENTAL REPORTS
24 WHERE APPROPRIATE. NEXT SLIDE. WALKING THROUGH EACH OF THE
25 COMPONENTS AND HIGHLIGHTING WHAT'S CHANGED, LET'S START WITH



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1 THE PLAN DOCUMENT. IT'S IMPORTANT TO UNDERSCORE THAT THE
2 STRATEGIES, GROWTH GEOGRAPHIES, AND STRUCTURE OF THIS DOCUMENT
3 REMAIN THE SAME AND CONSISTENT WITH 2025 COMMISSION AND BOARD
4 ACTIONS; BUT THERE ARE TARGETED REFINEMENTS THROUGHOUT. THESE
5 INCLUDE REFRESH ENGAGEMENT METRICS AND MAP REFINEMENTS. THEY
6 ALSO INCLUDE EXPANDED CONTEXT ON TOPICS, LIKE AUTONOMOUS
7 VEHICLES, REGIONAL GROWTH FORECAST, AND SEA LEVEL RISE, AND
8 ADDITIONAL CONTENT ON THE PLAN'S VISION AND PATH FORWARD TO
9 IMPLEMENTATION THROUGH AN EXECUTIVE LETTER THAT SITS AT THE
10 TOP OF THE DOCUMENT. WE ALSO ADDED A NEW RESILIENCE PROJECT
11 LIST REPORT THAT CONSOLIDATED EXISTING CONTENT ON A SEA LEVEL
12 RISE THAT WAS PREVIOUSLY SPRINKLED ACROSS THE VARIOUS PLAN
13 DOCUMENTS AND REPORTS TO HAVE, SORT OF, A ONE-STOP-SHOP ON THE
14 TOPIC OF SEA LEVEL RISE. YOU WILL FIND A FULL LIST OF THE KEY
15 CHANGES IN ATTACHMENT A OF ITEM 8D. NEXT SLIDE. NOW TURNING TO
16 THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN, THERE WERE SOME KEY MODIFICATIONS
17 HERE AS WELL. AS WE COMMITTED TO LAST MONTH, STAFF ARE
18 RECOMMENDING ADDING IMPLEMENTATION ACTION TO SB63 WHICH WOULD
19 COMMIT TO CONVENING A ROBUST TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO
20 REVIEW UPDATE THE REGIONAL GROWTH FORECAST METHODOLOGY
21 STARTING LATER THIS YEAR AS PART OF PLANNED BAY AREA 2060
22 PROCESS STAFF REFINED LANGUAGE FOR THE NINE ADDITIONAL ACTIONS
23 BASED ON PUBLIC STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK AND NOTABLY MERGED
24 TOGETHER TWO DISCRETE ITEMS RELATED TO ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION
25 AND VISION ZERO INTO A SINGLE COHESIVE PATH FORWARD FOR THOSE



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1 TWO TOPICS. NEXT SLIDE. FINAL EIR INCLUDES RESPONSE TO PUBLIC
2 COMMENTS AS WELL AS MINOR REVISIONS TO THE DRAFT COMPLEMENTED
3 BY THE MITIGATION MONITORING AND REPORTING PLAN AND WILL ALSO
4 INCLUDE FINDINGS OF FACT WHEN BROUGHT FORWARD TO THE

21 PLANNED BAY AREA 2050+ ARE WELL WITHIN THE ALLOWABLE LIMITS
22 THAT THE PLAN AND AMENDED TIP WOULD MEET THOSE FEDERAL
23 CONFORMITY REQUIREMENTS FOR OZONE PM2.5 THEN ON THE LATTER

22 SLIDE. PLANNING IS AN ONGOING PROCESS AND UNDER FEDERAL AND
23 STATE LAW WE MUST UPDATE THESE PLANS EVERY FOUR YEARS WHICH
24 MEANS WE'RE ALREADY THINKING ABOUT THE NEXT CYCLE WHICH IS DUE

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1 ANTICIPATE RETURNING TO ALL OF YOU WITH AN INITIAL SCOPE AND
2 FRAMEWORK FOR A NEXT GENERATION PLAN UPDATE. PLANNED BAY AREA
3 2050+ WAS A LIMITED AND FOCUSED UPDATE, BUT THIS IS A REAL
4 OPPORTUNITY FOR BLUE SKY THINKS AND WE HAVE HEARD FROM MANY OF
5 YOU THAT THIS IS A GOOD TIME TO LOOK AT HOW THE REGION NAH
6 GATES AN UNCERTAIN FUTURE PERHAPS BY LEVERAGING SCENARIO
7 PLANNING AS A WAY TO DO SO. WE INTEND TO LOOK AT ALTERNATIVE
8 POLICY AND FUNDING FUTURES EXAMINE SOME OF THE TRANSFORMATIVE
9 FORCES THAT SHAPE OUR REGION TODAY FROM NEW TECHNOLOGY,
10 AUTONOMOUS VEHICLES TO DEMOGRAPHIC SHIFTS AND FUNDING

16 BIFURCATED QUESTION. HOW CAN PEOPLE, LIKE MYSELF, GOING TO BE
17 HELPED, TO BE ABLE TO STAY IN MY HOME, AND THEN HOW ARE WE
18 GOING TO HELP PEOPLE WITH FUTURE HOUSING NEEDS, OR CURRENT
19 HOUSING NEEDS? AGAIN, NOT ALL CITIES ARE THE SAME. NOVATO IS A

5 PRODUCTION, RIGHT? SO WE CONTINUE TO HAVE STRATEGIES LONG-TERM
6 THAT ARE FOCUSED ON EACH OF THOSE. YOU KNOW, JUST TO KIND OF,
7 YOU KNOW, HIGH-LEVEL ANSWER TO HOW WE'RE TRYING TO MAKE
8 HOUSING MORE AFFORDABLE FOR FOLKS THE PLAN INCLUDES
9 SIGNIFICANT INVESTMENTS BOTH FROM EXISTING AND POTENTIAL
10 FUTURE FUNDING TO BUILD MORE AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND ALSO TO
11 PRESERVE WHAT ALREADY EXISTS. THAT'S ABSOLUTELY CRITICAL TO

19 **PAT ECKLUND:** SO NOVATO NOW IS IN A CRITICAL POSITION WE JUST
20 EVACUATED A BUILDING THAT WAS UNINHABITABLE. SO THERE IS FIVE
21 OTHER BUILDINGS IN THE SAME CONDITION WE DON'T HAVE THE MONEY
22 TO PROVIDE HOUSING FOR THEM. SO WHAT IS AVAILABLE NOW A CITY
23 LIKE NOVATO? JUST KIND OF CURIOUS? IS THERE A BANK OF MONEY
24 THAT WE CAN BORROW AND THEN EVENTUALLY, POSSIBLY GET IT BACK
25 FROM THE OWNER OF THESE -- THE LAND BOARD, FOR AN EXAMPLE? SO,



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1 IS THERE A PROGRAM LIKE THAT.

3 **DAVE VAUTIN:** WELL, I CAN'T SPEAK SPECIFICALLY TO THE
4 INDIVIDUAL PROJECT YOU'RE SETTING. BUT I WOULD SAY, THROUGH
5 THIS PLAN WE HAVE INVENTORIED ALL EXISTING AFFORDABLE HOUSING
6 FUNDING SOURCES BUT OBVIOUSLY THERE IS THIS HUGE GAP. AND

13 IMPLEMENTED SO I THINK THERE IS DEFINITELY A FUNDING NEED
14 THERE. I THINK WHAT THE PLAN LAYS OUT KIND OF NEXT STEPS FOR
15 US HERE IN THE BAY AREA LIKE EXPLORING THOSE SOURCES SO THAT
16 WAY WE CAN HELP MEET NEEDS LIKE WHAT YOU ARE DESCRIBING IN
17 NOVATO.

19 **PAT ECKLUND:** SO, I WOULD ENCOURAGE US TO MAKE THAT A PRIORITY.

21 **CHAIR, EDDIE AHN, MTC:** BOARD MEMBER ECKLUND, I'M MINDFUL OF
22 OTHER BOARD MEMBER QUESTIONS. IF YOU COULD MAKE THIS A QUICK

25 **PAT ECKLUND:** YEAH, ACTUALLY I HAVE ONLY GOT ONE MORE. THAT'S

6 **V. CHAIR, CARLOS ROMERO, ABAG:** THANKS AGAIN APPRECIATE IT.

7 GLAD WE MADE THAT CLARIFICATION.

8

9 **CHAIR, EDDIE AHN, MTC:** VICE CHAIR BURT? BURT.

10

11 **V. CHAIR, PAT BURT, MTC:** SO A NUMBER OF QUESTIONS ONE IS
12 REALLY ON THE GROWTH FORECAST IF WE GO TO PAGE 53 OF THE
13 REPORT I'M NOT SURE IF YOU HAVE THAT CORRESPONDING SLIDE BUT
14 WE'RE LOOKING AT THOSE CASES, THE CHANGES IN-HOUSE HOLD
15 INCOME, I'M GLAD THAT BOTH ON THOSE ARE BEING FOCUSED ON
16 MEDIAN AND NOT GDP, AND AVERAGE BECAUSE REALLY THE ISSUE THAT
17 WE'RE TRYING TO ADDRESSING THE SEVERE AND GROWING INCOME
18 INEQUALITY IS ONE THAT I'M STILL TROUBLED THAT GROWTH FORECAST
19 THAT WE HAVE OF A MILLION NEW HOUSEHOLDS WITH 1.4 MILLION NEW
20 JOBS AND ABOUT TWO AND A HALF MILLION NEW PEOPLE IN THIS TIME
21 HORIZON IS GOING TO RESULT IN A WORSENING OF OUR CONDITIONS,
22 RATHER THAN AN IMPROVEMENT, DESPITE OUR BEST EFFORTS. AND THE
23 REALITY THAT ACTUALLY MAY MITIGATE THAT PROBLEM AND GIVE US AN
24 OPPORTUNITY TO ACTUALLY ADDRESS OUR GAPS IN HOUSING AND
25 TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE AND RELATED MATTERS IS THAT



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1 THOSE GROWTH FORECASTS MAY NEVER COME TO FRUITION. WE HAVE
2 SEEN THE DOT AND DOF FORECASTS ON THE STATE, ON THE REGION,
3 BASICALLY FORECASTING NO GROWTH OR NOMINAL GROWTH. WE MAY SEE
4 CERTAIN AMOUNT OF GROWTH INDUCED BY POLICY, BUT NOWHERE NEAR
5 WHAT WERE THEIR PRIOR FORECASTS. AND YET OUR JOB GROWTH FOR
6 THE REGION AND OUR POPULATION GROWTH FOR THE REGION IN THIS
7 REPORT IS NOT SIGNIFICANTLY CHANGED. WE DID SOME CHANGE TO IT,
8 BUT IT'S STILL VERY RAPID GROWTH IT'S JUST LESS THAN WHAT WE
9 HAD PREDICTED BEFORE. I THINK THAT WE STILL ARE LOCKED INTO
10 FUNDAMENTAL FLAWS IN THE WHOLE PREMISES OF THE REPORT. I KNOW
11 THAT STAFF HAS PROVIDED US WITH ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON WHAT
12 ARE REALLY THE STATE AND THE FEDERAL DRIVERS. BUT AS I LOOK AT
13 THOSE MORE CAREFULLY, THEY'RE REALLY BASED ON PLAN GROWTH, AND
14 REALLY WHAT'S UP TO US IN TERMS OF WHAT WE'RE ANTICIPATING ON
15 THAT GROWTH, BOTH WHAT WOULD BE ORGANIC GROWTH AND WHAT WE
16 MIGHT INDUCE. AND I STILL SEE A FUNDAMENTAL TENSION, IF NOT A
17 DISCONNECT BETWEEN OUR GOALS FOR EQUITABLE, SUSTAINABLE, AND
18 PROSPEROUS REGION, AND THOSE PREMISES. AND I ALSO, ON THE
19 GROWTH PROJECTIONS, WE'RE EVEN SEEING THIS OTHER SET OF MEGA
20 TRENDS OF AI AND AUTOMATION, WHICH NONE OF US KNOW EXACTLY
21 WHERE THAT'S HEADED, BUT THE PREMISES ARE THAT IT WILL
22 INCREASE PRODUCTIVITY AND IN DOING SO REDUCE THE DEMAND FOR
23 ADDITIONAL WORKERS, WHICH INTERESTINGLY CORRESPONDS WITH THE
24 DOT AND DOF FORECASTS THAT WERE REALLY MADE PRIOR TO A NUMBER
25 OF THESE TRENDS BEING AS EMBRACED AS THEY ARE TODAY, GIVEN



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1 THAT WE STILL DON'T KNOW WHAT THE FUTURE IS REALLY GOING TO BE
2 IN THESE. WE'RE JUST ALL TRYING TO GET A HANDLE ON IT. SO, I
3 JUST WANT TO PUT THOSE THINGS ON THE TABLE. I KNOW THAT WE ARE
4 GOING TO HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY, WITH THE PLANNED BAY AREA 2060
5 TO TAKE A FRESHER LOOK. BUT I HAD REALLY HOPED THAT THIS
6 UPDATE WOULD REFLECT MORE REALISTIC AND, IN A LOT OF WAYS,
7 MORE -- A MORE POSITIVE POTENTIAL. BECAUSE, YOU KNOW, WE, IN

13 IN -- THERE WAS A STUDY THAT I WOULD LIKE TO SEE US REALLY DIG
14 INTO MORE BY UC SANTA CRUZ THINK THANK TANK NOW FIVE YEARS
15 AGO, THAT SHOWED IN THE PRECEDING 20 YEARS, 80% OF ALL WORKERS
16 IN SILICON VALLEY HAD SEEN THEIR REAL INCOME DECLINE. NOT 30%
17 OR 50%. AND THAT IS SUCH -- IF THAT ASSERTION IS ACCURATE,
18 THAT IS SUCH A FUNDAMENTAL CHALLENGE TO THE ASSUMPTION WE HAVE
19 BEEN OPERATING OFF OF, THAT I REALLY THINK WE NEED TO REFLECT
20 MORE DEEPLY ON, ASSUMING THAT GDP GROWTH WILL LIFT ALL BOATS.
