ON THE BILL SIDE I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT OF 17 COURSE THAT A TRANSPORTATION REVENUE MEASURE WAS A REALLY BILL 18 CONVERSATION UP IN SACRAMENTO. OBVIOUSLY THAT CONVERSATION IS 19 ONGOING THIS YEAR. IN THE REALM OF THE TRANSPORTATION WORLD 20 THERE ARE TWO OTHER BILLS THAT ARE REALLY PERSONALITY THAT ARE 21 AWAITING THE GOVERNOR'S SIGNATURE THAT I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT. 22 FIRST IS SENATE BILL 960 FROM SENATOR WIENER, THIS RELATES TO 23 COMPLETE STREETS AND TRANSIT PRIORITY. AND I SPECIFICALLY 24

WANTED TO HIGHLIGHT ON THE TRANSIT PRIORITY COMPONENT THAT ONE



- 1 OF THE ELEMENTS OF THE TRANSFORMATION ACTION PLAN HAS BEEN
- 2 ADVANCING TRANSIT PRIORITY IMPLEMENTATION. THIS BODY HAS BEEN
- 3 INTERESTED FOR SOME YEARS ON WHAT WE COULD DO AT THE STATE
- 4 LEVEL TO SUPPORT TRANSIT PRIORITY IMPLEMENTATION, AND THE
- 5 ISSUE WASN'T REALLY RIPE UNTIL THIS YEAR. THAT, SORT OF,
- 6 RIPENESS PIECE IS REALLY DUE TO A LOT OF THE HARD WORK THAT
- 7 WENT ON OUTSIDE OF THE LEGISLATIVE SPACE FROM ALL THE FOLKS ON
- 8 THE GROUND IN THE BAY AREA THAT ARE WORKING ON TRANSIT
- 9 TRANSFORMATION ACTION PLAN ITEMS, HOLDING ONE WORKSHOPS,
- 10 ENGAGING WITH STAKEHOLDERS THEY DID THE WORK NEEDED TO
- 11 IDENTIFY WHAT THE PROBLEM IS AT THE STATE LEVEL AND SENATOR
- 12 WIENER WAS ABLE TO RUN A BILL THAT, SORT OF, GETS TO THE FIX.
- 13 SO ANYWAYS THAT'S A BILL THAT MTC SUPPORTED AND WE ARE
- 14 AWAITING ACTION ON THE GOVERNOR'S DESK. ANOTHER BILL TO CALL
- 15 OUT RELATES TO THE SONOMA-MARIN AREA RAIL TRANSIT DISTRICT
- 16 SENATE BILL 904 BY SENATOR DODD THIS BILL WOULD AUTHORIZE
- 17 SMART'S SALES TAX REAUTHORIZATION TO BE PUT ON THE BALLOT VIA
- 18 CITIZEN'S INITIATIVE. IT'S REALLY IMPORTANT FOR, A, FOR SMART,
- 19 FOR THAT REAUTHORIZATION, AND B, IT'S REALLY IMPORTANT THAT WE
- 20 ARE WATCHING EVERYTHING RELATED TO CITIZEN'S INITIATIVE
- 21 PRECEDENCE BECAUSE THERE IS MORE INTEREST IN CITIZEN'S
- 22 INITIATIVES AS A WAY TO SECURE SELF-HELP THROUGHOUT THE STATE
- 23 AND REGION. SO WE WILL BE KEEPING AN EYE AND UPDATING YOU ON
- 24 THE STATUS. THE REALLY BIG YEAR WITH A TIGHT BUDGET PAYING
- 25 MOST ATTENTION ENGAGED MOSTLY AROUND DEFENSE ON TRANSIT



- 1 OPERATIONS WE'RE COMMITTED IN THE PRIOR YEAR BUDGETS AND MTC
- 2 HAS COMMITTED FUNDING FROM THE BIG TRANSIT OPERATIONS DEAL
- 3 FROM LAST YEAR AND REALLY GOOD NEWS THOSE RESOURCES ARE
- 4 PRESERVED IN THIS YEAR'S STATE BUDGET. THE ITEM THAT WAS
- 5 AROUND REGIONAL EARLY ACTION PLAN 2.0 RESOURCES AND I WANT TO
- 6 GIVE A BIG SHOUT OUT TO ALL OF YOU WHO WERE UP IN SACRAMENTO
- 7 ADVOCATING FOR THE PRESERVATION OF REAP 2.0 MONEY DURING LOBBY
- 8 DAYS AND A LOT OF YOU PICKED UP THE PHONE AND ASKED FOR THOSE
- 9 FUNDS TO BE PRESERVED AND THERE WAS A SLIGHT HAIRCUT AT THE
- 10 END OF THE DAY IN THE BUDGET BUT GIVEN WHAT THE PROPOSED CUT
- 11 WAS, IT'S A REALLY HUGE WIN THOSE FUNDS ARE PRESERVED. ON THE
- 12 BALLOT SIDE, WITH REALLY TIGHT BUDGET, A HUGE, SORT OF, NEW
- 13 MONEY CONVERSATION IN SACRAMENTO WAS ON BALLOT MEASURES. JULIE
- 14 IS GOING TO COVER THAT IN SOME OF THE ITEMS THAT ARE ACTION
- 15 ITEMS FOR YOU NEXT YEAR -- NOT NEXT YEAR -- LATER IN THE
- 16 AGENDA -- [LAUGHTER] I DID ALSO WANT TO CALL OUT THAT A LOT OF
- 17 THE WORK AROUND THE BALLOT MEASURES, AND, AGAIN, WHAT YOU ARE
- 18 GOING TO BE HEARING ABOUT IN THE NEXT AGENDA ITEMS REALLY,
- 19 SORT OF -- MTC AND ABAG LEADERSHIP WERE VERY INVOLVED IN
- 20 HELPING SUPPORT THE OUTCOMES THAT ARE, YOU KNOW, GOING TO BE

- 24 THE GOVERNOR'S DESK RIGHT NOW. IT'S AB 598, WICKS, THAT BILL
- 25 MOVED FORWARD IN RESPONSE TO CONCERNS RAISED BY THE BAY AREA



- 1 BUSINESS COMMUNITY ABOUT SOME POTENTIAL UNINTENDED
- 2 CONSEQUENCES FROM THE REGIONAL AFFORDABLE HOUSING BOND. SO
- 3 ABAG AND MTC RAN A BILL WITH ASSEMBLYMEMBER WICKS THAT
- 4 CLARIFIES THAT BAHFA DOES NOT HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO CONDITION
- 5 FUNDING FROM A REGIONAL HOUSING MEASURE ON THE PRESENCE OR
- 6 ABSENCE OF LOCAL LAND USE AND HOUSING POLICIES. AGAIN, THAT IS
- 7 ON THE GOVERNOR'S DESK AND WE'RE ANXIOUSLY AWAITING THE
- 8 RESULTS OF THAT. SO, WITH THAT I'LL CLOSE AND OPEN FOR
- 9 OUESTIONS.

- 1 PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE TO BE PASSED WITH 55% THRESHOLD CURRENT
- 2 LAW SETS THRESHOLD AT 2/3. BOUNDARY AROUND TYPES OF HOUSING
- 3 AND INFRASTRUCTURE COULD BE FUNDED WITH 55% VOTE THESE INCLUDE
- 4 PUBLIC TRANSIT ROADS HIGHWAYS FLOOD SEA LEVEL RISE PROTECTION
- 5 PROGRAMS MULTI-SINGLE-FAMILY HOMES AMONG OTHERS. THE MEASURE
- 6 IMPOSES THE MOST EXPENSIVE ACCOUNTABILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR
- 7 BONDS THAT WE HAVE SEEN IN STATE LAW INCLUDING CAP ON
- 8 ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES OF 5%, APPOINTMENT OF A TRAINED
- 9 CITIZEN'S OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE AND REGULAR INDEPENDENT AUDITS.
- 10 AS GEORGIA MENTIONED, WE STRONGLY SUPPORTED THE MEASURES THAT
- 11 THE BILLS THAT PUT PROP FIVE ON THE BALLOT THROUGH ACA ONE AND
- 12 ACA10 BOTH AUTHORED BY OUR ASSEMBLY MAJORITY LEADER AGUIAR
- 13 CURRY. FUTURE HOUSING BONDS, FUTURE TRANSPORTATION BONDS,
- 14 FUTURE CLIMATE BONDS THERE, IS A LONG LIST OF POTENTIAL
- 15 MEASURES THAT WOULD HELP IMPLEMENT MTC ABAG'S PRIORITIES THAT
- 16 COULD BENEFIT FROM THIS. AND FOR THAT REASON WE ARE

JULIE SCHNEIDER? 17 18 JULIE SNYDER: GOOD MORNING AGAIN MTC ABAG STAFF PROPOSITION 19 FOUR IS A \$10 BILLION CLIMATE BOND APPEARING ON THE NOVEMBER 20 BALLOT AND STAFF IS RECOMMENDING A SUPPORT POSITION ON THIS. 21 22 THIS WAS PLACED ON THE BALLOT BY LEGISLATURE AND REFLECTS TWO YEARS OF NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN BOTH THE HOUSES AND GOVERNOR AND 23 MANY STAKEHOLDERS IT WOULD REFRESH A NUMBER OF EXISTING STATE 24 25 PROGRAMS AS WELL AS FUND NEW EFFORTS OF PARTICULAR INTEREST



- 1 GIVEN OUR AGENCY'S PRIORITIES, \$1.2 BILLION ALLOCATED TO
- 2 PROTECT THE COAST FROM SEA LEVEL RISE OTHER AND CLIMATE
- 3 IMPACTS. AT LEAST \$85 MILLION IN THIS POT IS RESERVED FOR
- 4 PROJECTS THAT ARE CONSISTENT WITH THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY
- 5 RESTORATION AUTHORITY ACT OR THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA
- 6 CONSERVATION PROGRAM. GIVEN THE EXTREME WILDFIRES THAT WE HAVE
- 7 SEEN IN THE NORTH BAY OVER THE LAST TEN YEARS, WE WERE VERY
- 8 PLEASED TO SEE A PROGRAM CALLED THE WILDFIRE MITIGATION
- 9 PROGRAM BEING SUPPLEMENTED WITH \$135 MILLION. THIS IS THE ONLY
- 10 STATE PROGRAM THAT'S FOCUSED ON THE TYPES OF STRUCTURE
- 11 HARDENING PROJECTS THAT DIRECTLY PROTECT HOMES FROM WILDFIRES.
- 12 THOSE ARE JUST A COUPLE OF THE PROGRAMS THAT WOULD BE FUNDED
- 13 PROPOSITION FOUR. OTHERS ADDRESS NEEDS RANGING FROM SAFE
- 14 DRINKING WATER, EXTREME HEAT MITIGATION AGRICULTURAL LAND
- 15 HIGHLIGHTED OVERARCHING PROVISIONS FOR A BOND SET ASIDE FOR
- 16 DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES, CRAFTED IN A WAY THAT THE BAY AREA
- 17 WITH HIGH MEDIAN INCOMES CAN COMPETE FAIRLY FOR THOSE FUNDS.
- 18 I'LL STOP THERE AND AGAIN WE RECOMMEND A SUPPORT POSITION ON
