September Allocation Recommendations

Approximately \$87 million in RM3 Capital Funds to 7 projects

San Jose Diridon Station

\$35 million allocation to VTA for the environmental phase

- **Today's recommended allocation** completes a \$42 million funding plan for the environmental phase, estimated to be completed in 2029.
- Out of a total of \$100 million in RM3, this project has previously received \$31 million in allocations to date for right of way and project development.
- **MTC staff considerations:**
 - Construction of this megaproject is not fully funded and is likely to rely on significant future federal and state discretionary funds for completion.
 - Project partners should consider governance/project delivery structures with an option to focus on a broader portfolio of projects (i.e., grade separations) in the corridor.
 - VTA should consider utilizing remaining RM3 funds to build a deliverable segment with independent utility.

3 Additional Transit Projects Leverage Discretionary Funding

\$7.4 million in RM3 as matching funds for transit electrification grants

- RM3 Project 5.5, Ferry Enhancement Program
 - \$5.5 million to WETA for one electric 400-Passenger Vessel.
- RM3 Project 26, North Bay Transit Improvements
 - \$1.0 million to Petaluma Transit for the Petaluma Transit Facility Electrification Project (RM3 Project 26.12);
 - \$0.9 million to Marin Transit for the design phase of its first Fixed Route Electric Vehicle Charging & Maintenance Facility (RM3 Project 26.13).

\$45 Million in RM3 Funds for Roadway Investments

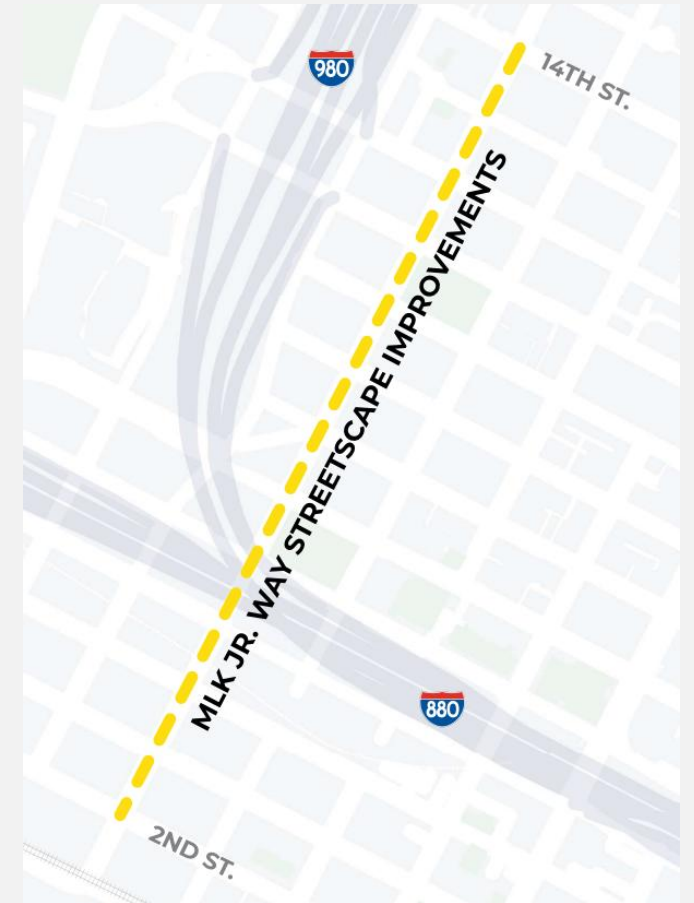

Martin Luther King Jr. Way Streetscape Improvements Project

\$30 million to the City of Oakland for construction

- Safe & multimodal access with separated facilities for walking, biking, and truck traffic using barriers and signal upgrades.
- \$49.9 million construction cost, funded by RM3 and California State Transportation Agency (CalSTA).
- Construction completion: 2028



\$15 Million in RM3 Funds for Additional Roadway Investments

- **RM3 Project 23, State Route 37 Improvements Program**
 - \$10 million to the Sonoma County Transportation Authority for the Highway 37/121 Long Term Improvements Project (RM3 Project #23.3).
- **RM3 Project 25, Richmond-San Rafael Bridge Access Improvements Program**
 - \$5 million to the Bay Area Toll Authority for the Richmond San Rafael Forward Open Road Tolling and I-580 WB HOV Lane Extension Project (RM3 Project #25.4).
