

    of background staff provided overview of proposed changes to
25
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the existing toll facility ordinance of baifa network and 1 operations committee at MARCH 14th 2025 meeting and amended 2 3 the restated toll authority ordinance posted on mtc's web site beginning on APRIL 7th, 2025 provisions were made to receive 4 5 hard copies by mail if needed in APRIL legal notices were published multiple times in multiple languages in newspapers 6 and san francisco alameda contra costa solano santa clara 7 8 counties announcing the opening of a 30 day public comment period identifying today's public hearing to receive oral 9 testimony and written comments about baifa's proposed amended 10 11 restated toll facility ordinance the public comment period started on APRIL 9th, 2025 and closes MAY 9th, 2025 written 12 comments can be submitted to mtc until 5:00 P.M. Today MAY 13 9th, 2025 considered oral comments will be received into the 14 15 close of this hearing written comments can be submitted to 16 mtc's public information office by e-mail at info@bayareametro.Gov or by usps by 5:00 P.M. Today MAY 9th 17 staff will prepare summary of all public comments received to 18 19 inform our decision-making on the proposed amendment proposed amended restated baifa toll facility ordinance will be 20 considered for adoption by the authority at its JUNE 25th, 21 22 2025 meeting its title is bay area infrastructure finance 23 authority toll facility ordinance as state JULY 27th, 2016 as amended and restated JANUARY 22nd, 2020, SEPTEMBER 23rd, 2020, 24 and JUNE 22nd, 2020 -- 2022. the ordinance about resolution number 52 revised article four

division 17 of the vehicle code I'll ask diana dorinson to 3 provide overview of the proposed amendment to the baifa 4 5 facility ordinance before public comment begins. 6 diana dorinson: I'm diana dorinson principle with mtc express 7 8 lanes I'll present the information item as context for the 9 formal public hearing on proposed amendments to the baifa toll facility ordinance. Can I have the presentation brought up? 10 11 Thank you. And let's go to the next slide. Thank you. As a reminder, the toll facility ordinance is the legal document 12 which lays out our toll policy for express lanes customers so 13 they understand the rules of the road and how violations of 14 those rules will be addressed we enforce the toll ordinance 15 16 through combination of camera based monitoring to identify vehicles that are traveling in express lanes without a fastrak 17 18 account and chp patrols to site vehicles that violate the 19 state traffic laws such as occupancy rules and crossing double white lines. Toll ordinance plies to all of baifa's express 20 lanes which are shown on the blue map on this slide interstate 21 22 680, contra costa county interstate 880 alameda county and 23 through the amendment the future express lanes interstate 80 solano county the agency partners that operate other beys bay 24 area express lanes which are shown in the gray on this map 25



1	have their own toll ordinance. Next slide. Baifa adopted its
2	toll ordinance in 2016 and lead up to the opening of the
3	express lanes on I 680 since then baifa has amended the toll
4	ordinance three times to add new express lanes and keep
5	policies up-to-date. Process to amend the toll ordinance
6	include requirement for public comment period including public
7	hearing which provides opportunity for decision makers to hear
8	from constituents about policies and procedures on the primary
9	reason we are bringing forward the toll ordinance amendment.
10	We folded in other policy updates that we will need to make in
11	the near future as part of the same amendment effort to make
12	sure we're staying ahead of the developments both inside and
13	outside our agency. Attach b in your packet presents full toll
14	facility ordinance with changes that show modifications that
15	are being proposed for consideration next month I'll summarize
16	five key changes now. The amendment would extend baifa's toll
17	rules new express lanes being constructed on I80 in solano
18	counties, I80 must be added to the ordinance before express
19	lanes operations can begin later this year second a change
20	being proposed to extend the period over which baifa is
21	allowed to conduct pilot programs especially to evaluate
22	different operational practices and today pilot r pilot
23	limited to three years this amendment would allow for
24	additional three years in circumstances which means maxim
25	pilots duration would be six years revised language clarify



1	pilots can test alternative hours of operation and days of the
2	week currently being considered is for potential pilot of
3	weekend hours on I80 third proposed amendment would update the
4	minimum toll per zone from \$0.50 up to \$0.75 for all baifa
5	express lanes and minimum toll when there is little or no
6	congestion and proposed increase insures cost recovery. The
7	federal law that permit vehicles to use carpool lanes without
8	qualifying number of occupants is scheduled tonaled SEPTEMBER
9	30th, 2025 our discount would also end at the same time unless
10	federal law is amended prior to that date. lastly the
11	amendment would update the list of toll facilities on I 680 to
12	reflect the gap closer between baifa's express lanes and
13	contra costa county and express lanes operated by the alameda
14	county transportation commission farther southbound extension
15	is expected to begin operations next year. Today's public
16	hearing is opportunity for baifa to listen to the public's
17	feedback about our policies as one operator in a regional
18	network baifa must consider how its policies relate to other
19	partner operators who manage other express lanes in the bay
20	area we try to be responsive to suggestions but it tames time
21	to coordinate and reach conscience all partner operators in
22	the bay area try to prioritize regional consistency in our
23	policies. While baifa MAY not be able to act on public input
24	immediately the feedback we receive is an important of the
25	larger conversation we have with partner agencies on



1	continuously improving our facilities for all users. Next
2	slide please. This slide shows the overwhelm schedule for the
3	toll amendment ordinance process. I'll provide additional
4	details on the various outreach activities on the next slide
5	but one thing to note here is this public hearing is not the
6	end of the process we're currently in the public comment phase
7	which will end today at 5:00 P.M. The actual votes to approve
8	and adopt the toll ordinance amendment will be placed on the
9	agenda for next month's committee and authority meetings. Next
10	slide please. California law requires baifa to follow a
11	specified process when it amends the toll ordinance. The items
12	in the set of bullets on the left side of this slide highlight
13	key features of this process which are publication of formal
14	notice of baifa is absent to amend the ordinance, public
15	comment period and at least one public hearing to receive oral
16	testimony. Baifa's practice for toll ordinance amendment is to
17	hold comment periods f open for 30 days. To help raise
18	awareness the plan changes express lane network opportunity
19	for the public to share feedback on the toll ordinance staff
20	also conducted outreach activities we distributed a press
21	release news story cross posted information to mtc home page
22	and 511.Org we published dedicated web page with key
23	information about the toll ordinance to include fact sheets in
24	five languages faqs youtube video and web form to receive
25	comments we developed a social media campaign to increase



1	visibility outside of traditional print media that include
2	organic posts to mtc related social media accounts paid
3	digital ads five languages paid search promotions and worked
4	with one of our cbo partners in solano can't we held a public
5	webinar on APRIL 23rd to answer questions, and discussed the
6	toll ordinance amendment public comment period as part of the
7	informational item on I80 project at a recent board meeting of
8	solano transportation authority. Next slide. The public
9	comment herd has been open 30 days with options to submit
10	comments via web form e-mail U.S. Mail and fax baifa has
11	received relatively few comments so far during this comment
12	period most comments received have centered on concerns around
13	cost and fairness of tolling with remaining comments spread
14	out over topics such as climate change greenhouse gas
15	emissions and hov and sav discounts. Baifa can also consider
16	feedback in its deliberations on the amendment. To provide
17	additional context for you I would like to share examples of
18	typical themes and comments from pyre amendment cycles and how
19	baifa responded to that feedback. Equity and cost concerns
20	have been raised before in 2020 when I-880 corridor was added
21	to the network in 2022 when northern extension on I 680 was
22	added. The express lane start pilot program discounted tolls
23	oichlt 880 for low-income residents after working on efforts
24	potentially to expand that pilot to the new I80 corridor in
25	solano county also taken other steps to lessen cost burdens



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for express lane users including reducing violation penalties

and participating in low-income toll payment plan and 2 3 supporting data equity action plan. Completion of initially pilot that can provide confirmation of had. Ov statutes and 4 corresponding eligibility for reduced tolls or free travel 5 staff are currently evaluating potential next steps for 6 testing apps and other technologies that have potential to 7 8 supplement traditional chp enforcement patrols we review and 9 develop express lanes policy. Next slide. In terms of next steps oral comments received today during the hearing will be 10 11 recorded baifa can choose to accept proposed amendments modify the proposed amendment language or choose not to move forward 12 with the amendment final committee recommendation will be 13 presented as an action item at the baifa meeting on JUNE 25th. 14 If adopted the amended restated toll facility ordinance 15 16 becomes effective 30 days later in JULY. Next slide please. So this concludes my presentation and I'll hand it back to the 17 18 chair. 19 chair, sue noack: thank you. We'll now receive oral testimony 20 on baifa proposed amended and restated toll facility 21 ordinance.
