AND NORCAL 16 CARPENTERS WANT TO EXPRESS THEIR INTEREST IN TRYING TO WORK WITH COMMISSIONERS, WITH STAFF, TO CRAFT POLICIES, LANGUAGE, 17 RELATED TO THAT INITIATIVE, THAT WILL BOTH PROMOTE HOUSING, 18 BUT ALSO VERY IMPORTANTLY PROMOTE THE DEVELOPMENT OF AN 19 ADEOUATELY SIZED AND ADEOUATELY SKILLED CONSTRUCTION 20 WORKFORCE. BECAUSE, PRESENTLY, I THINK MOST OF YOU HAVE HEARD, 21 THERE ARE RELATIVELY -- THERE IS A RELATIVE SHORTAGE OF FOLKS 22 THAT ARE GOING INTO RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION WITH THE MAIN 23 REASON BEING THAT RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION JOBS ON THE TYPICAL 24

JOB IS NOT COMPETITIVE WITH OTHER OPPORTUNITIES. YOU WANT TO

ILL BE 23

BEFORE 13 I DIVE IN I WANT TO THANK EACH ENTITY THAT APPLIED FOR THIS 14 15 FUNDING WE RECEIVED MULTIPLE HIGHLY OUALIFIED APPLICANTS AND 16 OUR EVALUATION PANEL CONSIDERED EACH CAREFULLY. WE KNOW THERE IS ONGOING NEED FOR THIS TYPE OF PROGRAMMING AND I BELIEVE THE 17 COMPETITIVE PROCESS REFLECTS THAT NEED. THANKS AGAIN TO ALL 18 THOSE WHO DID SUBMIT. I WOULD LIKE IT TURN TO THE NEXT SLIDE 19 PLEASE. I WOULD LIKE TO REMIND US THAT THE GOALS OF THIS 20 21 PILOT, THIS RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM WILL FOCUS ON SENIORS 65 AND OLDER, AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES ON FIXED INCOMES WHO 22 ARE AT RISK OF HOMELESSNESS AND WILL PROVIDE PARTICIPANTS WITH 23 UP TO 48 MONTHS OF ASSISTANCE WHILE THEY'RE CONNECTED TO OTHER 24

HOUSING AND FINANCIAL SUPPORTS. PILOT GOALS ARE TO REDUCE THE



- 1 RISK OF HOMELESSNESS FOR PARTICIPANTS TO CONNECT THEM WITH
- 2 SAFETY NET BENEFIT PROGRAMS AND OTHER STABILIZING SUPPORTS TO
- 3 CENTER EQUITY AND COMMUNITY VOICE AND TO PRIORITIZE EFFICIENT
- 4 PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION AND LOW BURDEN ACCESS. THE RFP PROCESS
- 5 WE CONDUCTED OPENED AUGUST 15TH AND CLOSED SEPTEMBER 26TH. WE
- 6 RECEIVED FIVE OUALIFIED PROPOSALS REPRESENTING POTENTIAL TO
- 7 ADMINISTER A PROGRAM IN 1 OF 7 COUNTIES. THE EVALUATION
- 8 INCLUDED 60 MINUTE INTERVIEWS WITH THE TOP THREE CANDIDATES
- 9 BEFORE PROCEEDING WITH OUR SELECTION. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. WE
- 10 RECOMMEND THIS AWARD TO THE NAPA COUNTY HOUSING AND
- 11 HOMELESSNESS DEPARTMENT BASED ON THEIR STRONG APPROACH, FOR
- 12 ONE, A CONSORTIUM THEY SUGGEST WOULD BE LED BY COUNTIES STAFF
- 13 AND BRING TOGETHER SOCIAL SERVICE PROVIDERS ACROSS THE
- 14 COUNTIES REPRESENTING ROBUST EXPERIENCE ACROSS SERVING OLDER
- 15 ADULTS PEOPLE ON FIXED INCOMES INCLUDING PEOPLE WITH
- 16 DISABILITIES MONOLINGUAL SPANISH, INDIGENOUS LANGUAGE
- 17 SPEAKERS, LOW-INCOME RESIDENTS INCLUDING FARM WORKERS. THEY
- 18 SHOWED CLEAR THOROUGH APPROACH FOR EACH STAGE OF THE PILOT
- 19 DOCUMENTING ROBUST PLANNING AMONG STAKEHOLDERS PRIOR TO
- 20 SUBMISSION. THEY ALSO PLAN TO SERVE APPROXIMATELY 180-200
- 21 PEOPLE PER MONTH WITH THIS FUNDING. WITH EXPECTED IMPACT OF
- 22 250 UNIQUE HOUSEHOLDS SERVED. THIS TEAM STOOD OUT BECAUSE THEY
- 23 HAVE DEMONSTRATED SUCCESS IN IMPLEMENTING THE PILOT PROGRAM
- 24 RESPONDING TO DISASTERS QUICKLY BRINGING TOGETHER CONSORTIUM
- 25 AND AVOID DELAYS COLLABORATING WITH COMMUNITY NEED, EXPERIENCE



WITH ADMINISTERING EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE ASSESSING 1 2 HOMELESSNESS RISK AND RESPONSIBLY MANAGING SIGNIFICANT PUBLIC 3 FUNDS. THEY HAVE A STRONG UNDERSTANDING AND ARE PREPARED FOR CHALLENGES ASSOCIATED WITH IMPLEMENTING A PROGRAM SUCH AS THIS 4 5 AND PRESENT ABLE TO REPRESENT SIGNIFICANT LOCAL FINALIZED AND STAFFING TO MAXIMIZE IMPACT OF THESE PILOT FUNDS INCREASING 6 THE AMOUNT THAT WE ARE ABLE TO CONTRIBUTE USING BAHFA FUNDS. 7 8 NEXT SLIDE. I'M HAPPY TO ANSWER MORE QUESTIONS. BUT WE'RE VERY PLEASED TO BRING THIS SELECTION TO YOU TODAY AND THANK YOU FOR 9 10 YOUR CONSIDERATION. 11 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA, MTC BAHFAOC: THANK YOU FOR THAT. AND 12 I'LL JUST -- A QUESTION IN TERMS OF, THIS IS A PILOT PROGRAM 13 AND ONE OF THE THINGS WE ALWAYS ASK FOR IS THE OUTCOMES. YOU 14 15 CAN TALK A LITTLE BIT OUTCOME? 16 SPEAKER: FIRST REDUCED RISK OF HOMELESSNESS WE WILL BE 17 MEASURING THROUGHOUT THE TIME WHETHER RESIDENTS STAY HOUSED 18 HOWEVER WE CAN SEE FROM RECENT HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION 19 RESEARCH AND VALUATION AROUND SIMILAR PROGRAMS THAT IT CAN BE 20 21 HARD TO ASSESS BECAUSE EVEN AMONG A COHORT OF PEOPLE WHO PRESENT THIS RISK OF HOMELESSNESS MANY PEOPLE ARE ABLE TO 22 SELF-RESOLVE AND PINPOINTING EXACTLY WHAT POINT SOMEONE WOULD 23 BECOME HOMELESS WITHOUT THESE SERVICES COULD BE VERY 24

CHALLENGING AND THAT IS SOMETHING WE'LL CONTINUE TO ASSESS
