Dear Andrew Fremier, Executive Director, Metropolitan Transportation Commission,

The Soft Lights Foundation has been notifying CalTrans, Musco, San Francisco, and MTC since the inception of the Bay Lights project that LED lights emit hazardous light that causes non-epileptic and epileptic seizures, migraines, panic attacks, and thoughts of suicide for certain individuals with disabilities and that the installation of 50,000 LEDs will create an unlawful discriminatory barrier that interferes with path-of-travel, in violation of the Americans with Disabilities Act. The Soft Lights Foundation has also notified these entities that a CEQA and NEPA report are required for this project. Despite these Constructive Notices of Hazardous, Dangerous, and Discriminatory conditions, the Bay Lights project has been approved.

The Soft Lights Foundation requests that work on the Bay Lights project stop immediately to protect the health, safety, and civil rights of individuals with disabilities until such time as 50,000 LEDs can be proven not to create an unlawful discriminatory barrier.

I have been unable to locate any document that indicates that MTC performed an analysis for ADA, CEQA, or NEPA compliance for the Bay Lights project. I am requesting a response from MTC as to whether these analyses have been performed, as required, and, if so, where to locate these reports.
