- 2 KATE MILLER, VICE CHAIR: ITEM TWO SAFE AND SEAMLESS MOBILITY
- 3 QUICK STRIKE PROGRAM. MALLORY ATKINSON.

- 5 MALLORY ATKINSON: I'M HERE TO PRESENT THE SAFE AND SEAMLESS
- 6 MOBILITY QUICK STRIKE PROGRAM. IN JANUARY THE COMMISSION
- 7 APPROVED THE OUICK STRIKE FRAMEWORK TO DISTRIBUTE \$54 MILLION
- 8 IN FEDERAL FUNDS THROUGH THE REGIONAL COMPETITIVE PROJECT
- 9 CALLING FOR PROJECTS THAT COULD IMPROVE BIKE AND PED SAFETY
- 10 MOBILITY CONNECTIONS TO TRANSIT AND EQUITABLE MOBILITY, AND
- 11 FUNDS THAT BEST REFLECT THE QUICK STRIKE PROGRAM CRITERIA AND
- 12 WE WERE GIVEN INITIALLY FUNDING TARGETS TO GUIDE SUBMISSION.
- 13 WE RECEIVED 71 PROJECT NOMINATIONS FROM CTA REQUESTING
- 14 FUNDING. STAFF EVALUATED PROJECTS AGAINST THE SIX EVALUATION
- 15 CRITERIA IN THE PROGRAM GUIDELINES INCLUDED IN THE STAFF MEMO
- 16 ON THIS ITEM IN ADDITION TO THE CRITERIA WE CONSIDERED
- 17 PRIORITIZE IN TIERING THAT WAS PROVIDED BY CTAS IN DEVELOPING
- 18 OUR INITIAL SET OF PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR EACH CATEGORY.
- 19 INITIAL RECOMMENDATIONS INCLUDE FUNDING FOR 40 PROJECTS
- 20 INCLUDING PARTIAL AWARDS. A FEW NOTES ABOUT THE RECOMMENDATION
- 21 IT WAS GREAT GROUP OF PROJECTS THAT WERE REVIEWED AND AT STAFF
- 22 LEVEL WE WERE EXCITED ABOUT MOVING THESE PROJECTS FORWARD AND
- 23 I WANT TO NOTE IN REFERRING TO THIS AS AN INITIAL
- 24 RECOMMENDATION I WANT TO STRESS THIS RECOMMENDATION IS
- 25 EXPECTED TO CHANGE AND THIS IS PRIMARILY BECAUSE WE ARE





- 1 RECOMMENDING TO DIRECT ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO THIS PROGRAM WHICH
- 2 WILL ALLOW US TO FUND ADDITIONAL PROJECTS AND WE'RE ALSO STILL
- 3 WORKING WITH CTAS ON MORE INFORMATION FOR PROJECTS WHICH IS A
- 4 REASON THE LIST COULD CHANGE SLIGHTLY. WHILE WE TRIED TO
- 5 ADHERE TO TARGETS IN SOME COUNTIES WE FELL SHORT OF THAT
- 6 HOWEVER WE PROPOSE RESOLVING INITIALLY SHORTFALLS WITH
- 7 ADDITIONAL REVENUE. AS NOTED IN THE STAFF MEMO WE ARE GOING TO
- 8 RECOMMEND TO THE COMMISSION TO USE OUR REGION'S SHARE OF THE
- 9 FEDERAL GO AHEAD RELIEF OR CRRSAA HIGHWAY FUNDS TO AUGMENT THE
- 10 STRIKE PROGRAM. THAT WOULD BRING 34 MILLION TO THE PROGRAM
- 11 THAT WOULD BE USED TO FUND COMPETITIVE PROJECTS. THEY WERE NOT
- 12 ABLE TO FIT INTO THE INITIAL 50 MILLION PROGRAM ENVELOPE AND
- 13 ALSO HELPED US RATHER THAN DEVELOPING A NEW CALL FOR PROJECTS
- 14 FOR THESE FUNDS IF WE JUST ADD TO THE QUICK STRIKE PROGRAM.
- 15 MORE ON THE CRRSAA AUGMENTATION RECOMMENDATION. WE'RE GOING TO
- 16 RECOMMEND THAT HALF AUGMENTATION BE USED TO FUND ADDITIONAL
- 17 PROJECTS WITHIN EACH COUNTY AND WE'RE ALSO CONSIDERING
- 18 RESERVING A SMALL AMOUNT OF THESE FUNDS FOR CTA PLANNING AND
- 19 PROGRAMMING. AND FOR THE OTHER HALF OF THE FUNDS WE'RE
- 20 RECOMMENDING CREATING A NEW REGIONAL AND CORRIDOR PROGRAM AND
- 21 COMPONENT AND PROJECTS THAT WERE COORDINATED BY CTA WITH CTC
- 22 AND BATA WOULD BE FUNDED THROUGH THIS PROGRAM. ALSO NOTE ABOUT
- 23 ADDITIONAL FUNDS SOME COUNTY CTAS LIMITED THEIR INITIAL
- 24 PROJECT NOMINATIONS TO US TO HONOR THE INTENT OF THE COUNTY
- 25 TARGETS WE HAD ESTABLISHED IN THIS CASE WE'RE GIVING



CONSIDERATION FOR OPTION OF NEW PROJECTS HOWEVER NEW PROJECTS 1 SUBMITTED WOULD BE IN COMPETITION WITH OTHER UNFUNDED PROJECTS 2 3 WITHIN THEIR COUNTY. WE ARE TAKING RECOMMENDATION TO AUGMENT FUNDS WITH THE CRRSAA MONEY TO OUR PROGRAMMING AND ALLOCATIONS 4 5 COMMITTEE AND COMMISSION IN MAY AND IN JUNE WE WILL PRESENT OUR RECOMMENDATION FOR THE FULL PROGRAM OF PROJECTS TO PACK IN 6 THE COMMISSION. AND I WOULD ALSO WANT TO NOTE THAT BECAUSE OF 7 8 A PENDING AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY GRACE PERIOD THESE PROJECTS WILL NEED TO BE IN THE TIP BY AUGUST IN ORDER TO PROCEED 9 OUICKLY OTHERWISE PROJECTS WILL NEED TO WAIT UNTIL OCTOBER OR 10 NOVEMBER TO BE ADDED TO THE TIP. IT WILL BE IMPORTANT FOR 11 PROJECTS TO BE SUBMITTED INTO THE TIP OUICKLY IN ORDER TO BE 12 ADDED TO THE JUNE OR JULY AMENDMENT. I WOULD TO REITERATE THAT 13 AND I WILL BE CONTACTING CTA STAFF AND PROJECT SPONSORS TO 14 REMIND OF UPCOMING DEADLINES ON THAT. THAT CONCLUDES THE 15 16 OVERVIEW OF OUR INITIAL RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THIS PROGRAM AND I WOULD BE HAPPY TO GET YOUR FEEDBACK. THERESA ROMMEL IS HERE AS 17 WELL, ON THE OVERALL RECOMMENDATION, THE PROCESS, IN GENERALLY 18 FOR THIS CALL FOR PROJECTS FOR RECOMMENDATION TO AUGMENT THE 19 PROGRAM WITH THIS CRRSAA FUNDING. 20 21 22 KATE MILLER, VICE CHAIR: THANK YOU MALLORY. SPEAKER: THERE ARE HANDS UP CHAIR MILLER. 1 2 3 KATE MILLER, VICE CHAIR: I SEE. ANNE, SUSAN, AND ANDY. ANNE, GO AHEAD. 4 5 SANDY WONG: THANK YOU. I WANT TO MAKE SURE I UNDERSTAND THE 6 SCHEDULE OF FUNDS AND THE CRRSAA PROCESS. ARE WE PROPOSING TO 7 8 SIMPLY ADD TO THE ORIGINAL 49 MILLION? BECAUSE YOU ALREADY KIND OF RANK ALL THESE PROJECTS IN THE STAFF REPORT, THEY'RE 9 RECOMMENDED PROJECTS THAT ARE RECOMMENDED TO BE FUNDED. SO, 10 YOU WILL APPLY THIS ADDITIONAL MONEY TOWARDS THOSE THAT ARE 11 NOT CURRENTLY RECOMMENDED FOR FUNDING? WHAT'S THE PROCESS? 12 13 MALLORY ATKINSON: YES THAT'S CORRECT. OUR HOPE IS TO USE THE 14 15 ADDITIONAL FUNDING, AT MINIMUM TO ENSURE THAT EACH COUNTY 16 RECEIVES THEIR TARGET LEVEL AND THEN TO GO THROUGH AND USE ANY REMAINING BALANCE TO FUND THE MOST COMPETITIVE PROJECTS 17 SO THE TARGET, IS AT THE INITIAL TARGET THAT WAS 18 REGION-WIDE. BASED ON THE 49 MILLION? OR THE TARGET WITH THE HALF NEW MONEY 19 ADDED? 20 21 22 MALLORY ATKINSON: THE ORIGINAL TARGET. 23 SANDY WONG: SO THE ADDITIONAL FUNDS, TECHNICALLY DOES NOT HAVE 24 A TARGET, THEN?



1 MALLORY ATKINSON: THAT'S RIGHT. WE'RE RECEIVED PROJECTS WE 2 3 COULDN'T FUND SO WE'RE HOPING TO PULL MORE MONEY IN FOR THOSE PROJECTS BUT WE'RE ALSO WANTING TO MAKE SURE THE MINIMUM EACH 4 5 COUNTY HAS THE ORIGINAL TARGET BECAUSE IN OUR INITIAL RECOMMENDATION ALL SOME FELL SHORT OF THE TARGET. 6 7 8 KATE MILLER, VICE CHAIR: SUSAN? 9 SUZANNE SMITH: THANK YOU CHAIR MILLER. MALLORY, THANK YOU FOR 10 THE PRESENTATION. TO FOLLOW UP ON THAT, I FEEL I MAY HAVE DONE 11 MY PROJECT SPONSORS A DISSERVICE, IN THAT WE SUBMITTED 12 PROJECTS BASED ON OUR TARGET AS OPPOSED TO, YOU KNOW, A DOZEN 13 PROJECTS. SO, I -- I'M -- YOU KNOW, WE HAVE GOT ONE UNFUNDED 14 15 PROJECT, I THINK THAT WOULD LIKELY BE COMPETITIVE BUT FEELS 16 LIKE I SCREWED UP SOMEHOW. IF WE HAD TARGETS I THOUGHT WE WERE SUPPOSED TO SUBMIT TO THOSE. WE GOT ADDITIONAL PROJECTS 17 SUBMITTED TO US. I WOULD LIKE THE OPPORTUNITY TO PROVIDE THOSE 18 TO YOU FOR CONSIDERATION, SINCE THERE IS NOW MORE MONEY ON THE 19 20 TABLE. 21 22 MALLORY ATKINSON: YES. WE RECOGNIZE THAT WAS AN ISSUE IN SETTING THOSE INITIAL TARGETS BUT NOW THAT WE HAVE OPPORTUNITY 23

TO RECEIVE ADDITIONAL FUNDS -- WE DIDN'T KNOW UNTIL VERY



RECENTLY THAT WE WERE GETTING THOSE SO WE'RE HAPPY TO ADDRESS 1 WITH YOU SOME OF THOSE PROJECTS THAT WERE LEFT OFF. 2 3 SUZANNE SMITH: GREAT. THANK YOU. 4 5 CLERK OF THE BOARD: MEMBER RICHMAN, YOU'RE UP NEXT. 6 7 8 ANNE RICHMAN: THANK YOU MALLORY AND MTC STAFF. WE APPRECIATE THE OPPORTUNITY TO FUND THESE MUCH DESIRED PROJECTS. JUST WANT 9 TO SAY I WOULD BE SUPPORTIVE OF ADDING FUNDS TO THE PROGRAM 10 GIVEN THE BIG DEMAND. OUR COUNTY WAS ONE OF THE ONES THAT DID 11 NOT RECEIVE OUR TARGET AMOUNT. SO I WOULD WELCOME THE 16 OPPORTUNITY OVER THE NEXT -- SOUNDS LIKE A MONTH OR SO -- TO CLARIFY THAT. THANK YOU. 17 18 CLERK OF THE BOARD: MEMBER LENGYEL. 19 20 SPEAKER: I WANT TO TALK ABOUT PROCESS FUNDING AND LOOK 21 22 FORWARD. 

- 14 ACTIONS. SINCE THEN, STAFF HAVE FOCUSED ON INCORPORATING
- 15 FEEDBACK RECEIVED FROM POLICY MAKERS, STAKEHOLDERS, AS WELL AS
- 16 INTERNAL STAFF AND REFINING THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN IN



- 17 SIGNIFICANTLY DIFFERENT, GIVEN THE CHANGES THAT WE HAVE SEEN,

- 3 THE CURRENT TRANSPORTATION LANDSCAPE AND MAJOR POLICY
- 4 INITIATIVES. THIS IS THE LANDSCAPE OF A LAND LENS WE'RE GOING
- 5 TO LOOK THROUGH TO SAY WE KNOW OUR COMMISSION WANTS TO DO ALL
- 6 OF THIS AT SOME LEVEL, WHAT IS THE ROLE AND WHAT THE THINK
- 7 SUGGEST GOING TO BE AND MY GUESS IS TWO OR THREE DIFFERENT

YOU KNOW, THERE ARE A LOT OF NEW CONSIDERATIONS OR LANDSCAPE FACTORS THAT ARE INCLUDED HERE, 4 5 AND THE OBAG PIE IS ONLY SO BIG. BUT ON THE FLIP SIDE OF THAT, I WOULD 10 HOPE THAT PART OF THE LANDSCAPE THAT WOULD BE CONSIDERED IS 11 ALSO WHAT'S GOING ON AT THE FEDERAL LEVEL N PARTICULAR, AND 12 SHOULD THERE BE AN INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN OR SOMETHING LIKE IT, 13 THAT PROVIDES FUNDING AND KIND OF NEW BUCKET AREAS, SEA LEVEL 14 15 RISE FOR EXAMPLE, AND OTHER AREAS WHERE THERE WOULD BE AREAS 16 TO TAKE CARE OF THESE NEEDS OUTSIDE OF THE OBAG PROGRAM AS WELL. I THINK THAT SHOULD BE CONSIDERED AS PART OF THE 17 PROCESS. 18 19 THERESE MCMILLAN: AND ANNE, THAT'S EXACTLY THE SCENARIO TO 20 CLARIFY IN TERMS OF LANDSCAPE. THE POLICIES AHEAD OF US WHAT 21 THE COMMISSION WANTS TO PURSUE WHAT ROLE OBAG PLAYS IN ALL OF 22 THIS THE OUESTION IS NOT NECESSARILY THE CASE AS YOU WELL 23 POINT OUT BECAUSE OF SCALE SIMPLY COULDN'T DO EVERYTHING. AND 24 THERE IS OTHER THINGS THAT MAY BE COMING TO THE TABLE, OR 25

- 4 ON THE MARGIN. WE NEED TO TAKE A LOOK AT, HOW DID OBAG TWO
- 5 PERFORM. DID IT ACHIEVE WHAT WE WANTED IT TO ACHIEVE? ARE
- 6 THERE OTHER THINGS THAT, PERHAPS, NOW, TODAY, DECADE IN, WE
- 7 WANT TO REEMPHASIZE. SO, AGAIN, I THINK WE WERE JUST TRYING TO
