Remembrances

Bob Planthold, an outspoken advocate for seniors and people with disabilities, died last month. For many decades Mr. Planthold did his part to advance the common good for those with disabilities at public meetings held by MTC and SFMTA, and by serving on civil grand juries. With limited mobility after contracting polio as a baby, Mr. Planthold dedicated much of his adult life to making the case for increased access and accommodations for those who need it most – and by extension all of us. Our thoughts are with Mr. Planthold's family, loved ones, and the many people whose lives he touched.

We also received news that Michael Evanhoe passed away last November. Mike served as the chair of the California Transportation Commission in the early 1980s, and subsequent to that, headed the Santa Clara Valley Sales Tax Authority, retiring in 2003 to work in the private sector. Mike was a colleague to many of us, and a mentor to me when I was an upstart intern to the CTC my last year as an undergrad at UC Davis. We remember Mike for his dedication to transportation.

Before that, she served as Director of the San Francisco Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development where she led a \$2billion public housing preservation and rehab program. Kate's first day with MTC was on February 22nd and we could not be more excited to have her lead the BAHFA team.

Alexandra Thomsen – Alexandra started with MTC on February 7th as a Junior Planner/Analyst in the San Francisco Estuary Partnership section.

Bay Area Secures over \$650 Million in State Funding for 1,372 Affordable Homes:

In February, the Governor's office announced the first round of awards for the California Housing Accelerator, a \$1.75 billion one-time investment to provide bridge funds to shovel-ready affordable housing projects. The program is derived from funds from the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The first round of awards totaled \$923 million stateside, with projects within the Bay Area securing over \$650 million in funding (roughly 71%) that will lead to the production of 1,372 new affordable homes. The Housing Accelerator prioritizes projects for people experiencing homelessness and for those below 30 percent of the Area Median Income. Nearly all projects are expected to break ground this summer.

Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities Grant

The Strategic Growth Council has adopted awards for the Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities grant program. The Bay Area will receive \$279 million in funding for twelve grants in Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco, San Mateo, and Santa Clara counties.

Legislative Update

On Friday, Assemblymember Ting introduced AB 2594, which makes statewide changes related to toll collection notices and penalties in response to media coverage related to the SPUR report on the impact of toll penalties. We are evaluating the bill and met with Assemblymember Ting in advance of its release last week. The Assemblymember has assured us that he wants the bill to protect our toll revenue stream and is open to amendments. We are further analyzing the bill and will bring it forward to our Legislation Committee for a position at the appropriate time.

Items to Note

Housing Technical Assistance:

In the area of collaborative projects with ABAG, I would like to spotlight the work we are doing on housing technical assistance for fair housing. Staff is creating data reports for each jurisdiction in the region that provide major indicators on segregation (race and income) as important baseline consideration for Housing Element development.

Express Lanes

The US 101 Express Lanes in Santa Clara and San Mateo counties began tolling on 2/11. Commissioner Abe-Koga participated in the ribbon cutting event on 2/10 at the VTA bus yard in Mountain View. As a reminder, MTC is operating the express lanes in San Mateo County on behalf of the San Mateo County Express Lanes Joint Powers Authority.

High-Speed Rail

The High-Speed Rail Authority released a draft Business Plan for public review and comment as part of a 60 day period that ends on April 11th, 2022. MTC staff will be reviewing and providing comments.

Bay Area Summer Academy


