- 3 REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS ALLOCATION. AS YOU KNOW, WE HAD A
- 4 REALLY, REALLY THOROUGH SIX CYCLE RHNA PROCESS BETWEEN 2019
- 5 AND 2021, IT REALLY TAXED THE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE A LOT
- 6 TO WORK THROUGH ALL OF THESE RHNA APPEALS THAT WE HAD, AND TO
- 7 MAKE SURE THAT WE PROVIDED A SOUND METHODOLOGY AND APPLIED
- 8 THAT IN AN EQUITABLE FASHION. AND THAT IS ONE OF OUR CORE
- 9 RESPONSIBILITIES AT ABAG. WE HAD TO DISTRIBUTE 441,000 HOUSING
- 10 UNITS ACROSS 109 JURISDICTIONS. WHEN YOU THINK ABOUT THAT
- 11 THAT'S A REALLY GREAT UNDERTAKING NEXT CYCLE DON'T GET TOO
- 12 COMFORTABLE FOR THOSE THAT JUST STARTED TO BREATHE FROM THE
- 13 LAST HOUSING CYCLE AND YOUR APPROVALS WE GET STARTED ON THE
- 14 NEXT ROUND IN 2027. IN REGARDS TO FINISHING UP CYCLE SIX WE
- 15 HAVE RECEIVED A NUMBER OF RHNA TRANSFERS FOR THE MOST PART
- 16 THOSE ARE DONE BY STATUTE AND THEY ARE WITHOUT ISSUE. WHAT WE
- 17 HAVE DONE FOR THE TECHNICALITY OF ONE OF THE RHNA TRANSFER
- 18 REQUESTS THAT CAME BEFORE ABAG, AS REQUIRED BY STATUTE, IS
- 19 THAT LAST WEEK, THE ABAG ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE DID, IN
- 20 FACT, APPROVE RESOLUTION 102025 WHICH RECOGNIZES THE REVIEW OF
- 21 NON-MUTUAL RHNA TRANSFER REQUESTS, THIS IS WHEN THE PARTIES
- 22 AREN'T IN AGREEMENT. AND MAKING SURE THAT WE PROVIDE
- 23 INCREDIBLY TECHNICAL APPLICATION OF THE METHODOLOGY FOR
- 24 DISTRIBUTION. AND, SO, IN ORDER TO ACCOMPLISH THAT, THE
- 25 RESOLUTION DELEGATED AUTHORITY TO STAFF TO ADMINISTER THOSE
