CHAIR, JESSE ARREGUIN: GREAT. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. WE HAVE A 1 BUDGET. SO, WE'LL PROCEED NOW TO OUR MAIN ITEM FOR DISCUSSION 2 3 TODAY, WHICH IS ITEM FIVE. THE BARC ORGANIZATIONAL PLAN UPDATE KICKOFF. AND I WOULD LIKE TO INTRODUCE THIS ITEM. I KNOW VICE 4 5 CHAIR WASSERMAN HAS COMMENTS AS WELL. AS YOU KNOW, BARC IS WORKING WITH BLUEPOINT PLANNING NHA ADVISERS TO ASSIST IN 6 EVALUATING ITS OVERALL MISSION, PURPOSE, AND STRUCTURE. LAST 7 8 TIME THERE WAS AN UPDATE TO THE ORGANIZATIONAL PLAN WAS 2015. IT'S BEEN NEARLY TEN YEARS, AND OBVIOUSLY THE SCOPE AND FOCUS 9 OF THE AGENCY HAS CHANGED. WE HAVE NEW PARTNER AGENCIES THAT 10 HAVE JOINED. WE HAVE REALLY NARROWS OUR FOCUS ON RESILIENCE 11 AND CLIMATE ADAPTATION AND ADDRESSING CLIMATE CHANGE. SO THIS 12 -- AND WITH THE SHARED WORK PROGRAM THAT WE HAVE ADOPTED AND 13 WE'RE WORKING TO IMPLEMENT ACROSS OUR MEMBER AGENCIES, THIS IS 14 REALLY AN EXCELLENT TIME, I THINK, TO TAKE ANOTHER LOOK AT OUR 15 16 FOCUS FOR THE FUTURE. SO, TODAY, OUR CONSULTING TEAM IS HERE TO SHARE THE PLAN AND PROCESS AND TO INVITE US TO PARTICIPATE 17 AS WE WORK TOGETHER TO ENSURE THAT OUR ORGANIZATION IS 18 PREPARED TO ACHIEVE ITS LEGISLATIVE MANDATE AND TO ADAPT TO 19 CHANGING DEMANDS AND NEEDS. AND, SO, LOOK FORWARD TO AN 20 ENGAGED AND CANDID CONVERSATION AS WE PROVIDE SOME STRATEGIC 21 DIRECTION TO OUR CONSULTING TEAM STAFF. WE WANT TO MOVE FAST 22 AND COMPLETE THIS WORK BEFORE YEAR'S END, AND AS SUCH WE'LL BE 23 USING OUR GOVERNING BOARD MEETINGS GOING FORWARD AS BENCHMARKS 24 IN THE PROCESS AND TO PROVIDE STRATEGIC INPUT IN THE 25

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DEVELOPMENT OF THIS PLAN. NOTE THE SEPTEMBER 20TH MEETING WILL
BE EXTENDED TO FACILITATE A RETREAT ON ORGANIZATIONAL OPTIONS,
SO THAT MEETING WILL BEGIN AT 9:30 A.M. AND 12 -- AND IT WILL
END AT 12:30 P.M. AND WE'LL PROVIDE REFRESHMENTS AND WE
ENCOURAGE EVERYONE TO MAKE AN IN-PERSON, IT'S IMPORTANT IN THE
CONVERSATION OUR STAFF WILL FOLLOW WITH SCHEDULING. I'LL TURN
IT OVER TO VICE CHAIR WASSERMAN.

V. CHAIR, ZACK WASSERMAN: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. AS I HAVE HAD 9 SOME CONVERSATIONS WITH JESSIE AND WITH ALLISON AND OTHERS 10 OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF MONTHS, AS JESSE SAID, IT'S TIME FOR 11 US TO TAKE ANOTHER LOOK AT WHAT WE WANT TO ACCOMPLISH. I WANT 12 TO SET A HISTORICAL CONTEXT TO START WITH. THIS ORGANIZATION 13 WAS CREATED UNDER A DIFFERENT NAME, THE JOINT POLICY COMMITTEE 14 -- COMMISSION, ESSENTIALLY, AT A TIME WHEN THE FOUR REGIONAL 15 16 AGENCIES WERE NOT COOPERATING VERY MUCH AND IT WAS REALLY AN ATTEMPT LED SIGNIFICANTLY BY MARK DESAULNIER TO COMPEL US TO 17 COOPERATE; AND IT'S WORKED. AND IN CERTAIN RESPECTS, IT'S 18 WORKED SO WELL, THAT THE QUESTION COMES UP, DO WE NEED TO KEEP 19 DOING THIS. I THINK THERE ARE SOME RECENT ILLUSTRATIONS THAT 20 21 WE CERTAINLY DO, BUT THIS IS THE KIND OF THING THAT WE DO NEED TO TALK ABOUT. I HAVE BEEN AT A COUPLE OF MEETINGS RECENTLY 22 WHERE THERE WERE DISCUSSIONS ABOUT REGIONALISTS. AND MOST OF 23 THE PEOPLE WHO SERVE ON BARC AND MOST OF THE PEOPLE, TO BE 24 FAIR, WHO SERVE ON THE CONSTITUENT AGENCIES ARE REGIONALISTS. 25



THEY'RE NOT SIMPLY LOOKING AT THEIR OWN JURISDICTIONS; THEY'RE 1 LOOKING THOSE, OF COURSE, BUT LOOKING BEYOND CROSS-2 3 JURISDICTIONALLY TO SEE HOW WE CAN IMPROVE LIVES OF EVERYBODY IN THE BAY AREA, ACROSS A WHOLE HOST OF ISSUES. AND IT'S IN 4 5 THAT, FOR ME, IT'S IN THAT CONTEXT, HISTORICALLY, WHAT'S GOING ON NOW. AND ONE OF THE SIGNIFICANT ILLUSTRATIONS OF THE KIND 6 OF NEED FOR BARC AND WHAT IT CAN DO IS THE WORK ON THE 7 8 MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING THAT IS NOW BEING CONSIDERED BY THEIR AGENCIES WITH A LOT OF HARD WORK, BY STAFF, OF ALL OF 9 10 THE AGENCIES AND SOME OUTSIDE SUPPORTERS, AS WELL BCDC WAS THE FIRST AGENCY TO APPROVE IT THIS WAY AND IT WILL MOVE BEFORE 11 ALL THE OTHERS. THAT'S SETTING CONTEXT OF WHAT WE'RE GOING TO 12 EXPLORE TODAY AND IN COMING MONTHS. IT'S NOT -- WE'RE NOT 13 SIMPLY LOOKING AT OUR BELLY BUTTON IT'S REALLY LOOKING AT WHAT 14 15 THE WORK IS, WHAT IT NEEDS TO BE, AND WHAT IT HAS BEEN. AND 16 IT'S NOT -- AS JESSIE SAID -- GOING TO TAKE A LONG TIME. WE'RE GOING MOVE THIS FAST. SO, I WELCOME THIS OPPORTUNITY AND I 17 HOPE EVERYBODY WILL ROBUSTLY PARTICIPATE. 18

20 CHAIR, JESSE ARREGUIN: TO FOLLOW-UP ON THAT, I KNOW WE HAVE
21 NEW MEMBERS, AND WELCOME MEMBER HURT TO THE BOARD. I KNOW WE
22 HAVE NEW REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE AIR BOARD AS WELL. THIS IS
23 OPPORTUNITY TO REFRESH WHAT IS THE LEGISLATIVE MANDATE OF BARC
24 AND WHAT IS OUR FOCUS AND TO THINK BIG PICTURE ON WHERE ARE WE
25 GOING. WHAT IS THE BENEFIT OF BRINGING ALL THESE REGIONAL



1 AGENCIES TOGETHER. HOW CAN WE REALLY NOT JUST REINVENT THE 2 WHEEL BUT ADD VALUE AND WORK ON HOW WE CAN BETTER COORDINATE 3 REGIONAL INITIATIVES FOR THE BAY AREA. I'M EXCITED AND 4 GRATEFUL TO ALLISON FOR HELPING INITIATE THIS PROCESS. WITH 5 THAT, I WANT TO TURN IT OVER TO ALLISON TO INTRODUCE OUR 6 PROJECT TEAM.

THANK YOU ALL FOR BEING HERE BECAUSE WE NEED A LOT OF COLLABORATION TO GET SOME GOOD FUNDING HERE THAT'S MY TWO 4 5 CENTS ON THIS FOR NOW. THANK YOU, ALL. 6 7 MINDY CRAIG: RANDI? 8 RANDI LEE: I'M RANDI LEE, AND I BRING MULTI-SECTOR EXPERIENCE 9 10 AS AN OPERATOR, STRATEGIC PLANNER AND RESEARCHER. I LIVE IN OAKLAND, AND I REALLY APPRECIATE THAT THIS GROUP ALL COMES 11 TOGETHER, AS A BAY AREA RESIDENT, AND LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING 12 WITH YOU. 13 14 15 SPEAKER: NORA? 16 SPEAKER: I'M NORA BAYLY PROJECT ASSOCIATED AT BLUEPOINT 17 PLANNING AND I'LL BE HELPING RUN THE PRESENTATION TODAY. 18 19 SPEAKER: NORA IS ON IT. IF YOU DROP A NOTE IN THE CHAT SHE 20 21 WILL HELP YOU OUT. 22 23 MINDY CRAIG: THANK YOU. WHAT WE'RE GOING TO PROVIDE TODAY IS CONTEXT AND AS I SAID BEFORE THIS IS OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO 24 HEAR WHERE YOU WANT US TO GO. WE'RE PLANNING TO DO RESEARCH, 25



EVALUATE, AND HOOK AT DIFFERENT APPROACHES FOR BARC MOVING 1 2 FORWARD. BUT THAT NEEDS TO BE FRAMED IN HOW YOU WANT THAT TO 3 LOOK. SO WE'RE GOING TO PROVIDE SOME CONTEXT SETTING, WE HAVE TALKED TO MANY OF YOU IN STAKEHOLDER INTRODUCES, WE HAVE DONE 4 5 ANALYSIS AND WE JUST WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU, WHERE DOES THAT LOOK MOVING FORWARD SO WE CAN BE RELEVANT AND ON POINT AS WE 6 GO THROUGH THAT. AND HOPEFULLY IT'S AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE VERY 7 8 FRANK AND VERY BROAD MINDED ABOUT WHAT THAT LOOKS LIKE. RIGHT NOW WE'RE KIND OF A BLANK SLATE IN SOME WAYS IN TERMS OF WHERE 9 WE WANT TO GO. SO THAT IS THE OPPORTUNITY HERE. WE'RE GOING TO 10 USE MENTEE METER. IT'S A TOOL SO WE CAN HAVE ALL OF YOUR INPUT 11 AS WE GO THROUGH THIS. SOMETIMES IT'S HARD WITH THE HYBRID 12 SITUATION TO GET EVERYONE'S VOICE. WE WILL ALSO ASK, IN A 13 COUPLE ROUND OF ROUND ROBIN WHEN WE TALK ABOUT GOALS BUT 14 15 EVERYONE WILL HAVE AN EXPANSE IN EVERY SECTION AND TO PROVIDE 16 FEEDBACK AS WE GO FORWARD. LET'S BRING UP THE SLIDE DECK, NORA. GREAT. AND IF YOU GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE? AND THOSE WHO 17 ARE ON MENTEE METER, YOU WILL SEE THE SLIDES WILL GO FORWARD 18 AND WE'LL LET YOU KNOW WHEN THAT INTERACTION HAPPENS. WE'RE 19 GOING TO START OFF WITH A OUICK OVERVIEW OF WHAT WE'RE DOING, 20 21 PROCESS AND OVERVIEW ON CONTEXT SETTING WHAT ARE THE THINGS WE NEED TO DO TO START, STOP, AND CONTINUE FOR THE ORGANIZATION 22 23 HELPING US FRAME WHERE WE'RE GOING AND FINAL PIECE WILL BE OPPORTUNITY TO TALK ABOUT WHAT ARE THE GOALS AND SUCCESS 24 FACTORS FOR THIS PROCESS FOR YOU, WHERE DO YOU WANT US TO 25



FOCUS AND HOW DOES THAT LOOK AND WE'RE GOING TO USE THOSE 1 GOALS AND SUCCESS FACTOR TO FRAME HOW WE DEVELOP THOSE 2 3 ORGANIZATIONAL MODELS AS WE GO FORWARD. NEXT SLIDE. OUR OBJECTIVES HERE ARE TO GET FOCUS AND DEEPER DISCUSSION 4 5 UNDERSTANDING AREAS OF ALIGNMENT WHAT ISN'T WORKING AND THEN IDENTIFY GOALS TO INFORM THE DEVELOPMENT OF ORGANIZATIONAL 6 7 OPTIONS. RANDI LEE: SO, AS WE HAVE HEARD ALREADY, THE PURPOSE OF THE 10 PROJECT IS REALLY TO SET BARC UP FOR SUCCESS TO RECOMMEND THE 11 BEST WAY FORWARD TO ORGANIZE A FUNDED AND EMPOWERED BAY AREA 12 BUT ALSO TO FULFILL ITS LEGISLATIVE MANDATE. OVERVIEW OF THE 13 PROJECT TAKES PLACE IN THREE PHASES 50 PHASE IS CONTEXT 14 SETTING WHICH IS WHAT WE'RE DOING TODAY MOVE ON TO DISCUSSION 15 16 OF DIFFERENT ORGANIZATIONAL MODELS AND FINALLY COME FORWARD WITH RECOMMENDATIONS. THE TALE COLOR INDICATES TIMELINE 17 PROJECT IS ORGANIZED AROUND GOVERNING BOARD MEETINGS DONE BY 18 THE END OF THE YEAR AND WE'LL USE THESE MEETINGS TO MOVE THE 19 WORK FORWARD. WE'RE GOING TO SPEND THE JULY MEETING GIVEN YOU 20 21 AN UPDATE ON ONGOING ENGAGEMENT WE HAVE DONE AND I'LL TALK 22 ABOUT THE WAY WE'RE GOING TO ENGAGE DIFFERENT AUDIENCES LATER TODAY. THESE ARE GOING TO BE VIRTUAL CALLS OF SMALL 16 GROUPS WHERE WE SHARE INFORMATION ABOUT THE PROJECT, THE OPTIONS, WHERE WE ARE, AND GET ADDITIONAL INPUT FROM THE 17 GROUP, AND, FINALLY, WE'RE GOING TO DO A SURVEY TO BRING EVEN 18 MORE PEOPLE INTO THE FOLD, AND MAYBE EVEN GET SOME MEANINGFUL 19 OUANTITATIVE DATA BY CONDUCTING A SURVEY AMONG PARTNERS AND 20 STAKEHOLDERS. SO THESE ARE THE FIVE DIFFERENT WAYS WE'RE 21 ENGAGE. IF YOU MOVE TO THE NEXT PAGE, WE HAVE ALREADY BEGUN 22 THE ONE-ON-ONE INTERVIEWS. AND THOSE ARE TAKING PLACE BETWEEN 23 THE EXECUTIVE OF THE MEMBER AGENCIES, BOTH VOTING, AND THE 24 25 NON-VOTING MEMBERS, SPEAKING TO THE BARC CHAIR AND CO-CHAIR,



AND ALSO SOME FORMER BARC MEMBERS AND PARTICIPANTS, SO THAT WE 1 2 CAN GET MORE OF A HISTORICAL CONTEXT FROM SOME PEOPLE WHO HAVE 3 BEEN AROUND IN THE PAST. I'M GOING TO TALK A LITTLE BIT ABOUT WHERE WE FOUND AN AGREEMENT, AND ALSO WHERE I'M HEARING SOME 4 5 DIFFERENCES. INTENT IS THAT'S WHY WE'RE HERE TODAY WHY EVERYONE AGREES IT'S 1 2 THE RIGHT TIME TO BE DOING IT. SOME PEOPLE WILL SAY, OH, IT'S 3 THE FORCING FUNCTION FOR US TO COLLABORATE AND COMMUNICATE IN THE REGION. OTHERS WILL POINT TO THE LONG -- THE REALLY 4 5 VALUABLE LONG-TERM VIEW. OTHERS WILL EXPLAIN THE BENEFITS OF COMING TO THESE MEETINGS AND GETTING THE GREAT INFORMATION 6 THAT THEY WOULDN'T LEARN ANYWHERE ELSE. PAT ECKLUND: I GUESS WHERE I HAVE THE ISSUE THOUGH IS WITH THE ULTIMATE GOAL OF IMPROVING QUALITY OF LIFE FOR ALL BAY AREA RESIDENTS, IT'S JUST NOT IMPROVING THE QUALITY OF LIFE FOR ALL BAY AREA RESIDENTS, BUT THERE IS OTHER REASONS WHY IT'S IMPORTANT THAT WE DO THIS. SO, I JUST -- I GUESS I DIFFER WITH JUST LIMITING IT TO THE --

BUT YOU 19 DON'T HAVE ANY WAY OF CHARGING IT IN YOUR LOW-INCOME FOURPLEX, 20 21 EIGHTPLEX, WHAT HAVE YOU. WHO DO YOU CONTACT? MOST PEOPLE DON'T HAVE ANY IDEA WHO THEY WOULD CONTACT TO GET A CHARGER, A 22 GRANT FOR A CHARGER, OR A CHARGER PLACE IN THEIR LOW-INCOME 23 NEIGHBORHOOD. SOME TYPE OF BRANDED PORTALS THAT THIS IS THE 24 GROUP, THIS IS THE AREA -- THE PEOPLE THAT YOU WOULD CONTACT 25



1 TO DIRECT YOU TO WHO COULD PROVIDE THAT ACCESSIBILITY TO A 2 CHARGER. AN EXAMPLE -- THAT'S -- AND, SO, WE ARE KIND OF 3 OVERLOOKING THE COMMON FOLK. BUT SHIFTING TO A PROJECT ORIENTED FOCUS FOR THE ACTIVITIES, I --9 I'M NOT SURE HOW THAT FITS, AT LEAST WHAT HAS BEEN OUR OVERALL 10 PURPOSE. 11

WHEREAS, I THINK BARC'S ROLE IS 22 REALLY TRYING TO FILL THE GAPS BETWEEN THE DIFFERENT 23 ORGANIZATIONS, AND ALSO JUST TRYING TO, YOU KNOW, THREAD 24 THROUGH THE DIFFERENT ORGANIZATIONS TO TRY TO BRING THEM ALL,



AND COORDINATE -- AND HAVE A STRONGER COORDINATION AND
 STRONGER STRENGTH TO TRY TO AFFECT CHANGE.

MINDY CRAIG: OBVIOUSLY FILLING THE GAPS IS IMPORTANT, DO YOU IS THERE CONSENSUS ABOUT WHAT THOSE GAPS ARE? IS THAT A
MISSING PIECE OF THE PUZZLE? YEAH, I'M SEEING THAT WE'RE NOT
QUITE SURE WHAT THAT MIGHT NOT BE. CHAIR?

DAVINA HURT: I WAS GOING TO ADD, I HAD ACTUALLY HIT THE OTHER, 9 THAT WAS ME. AND THE WAY I WAS THINKING ABOUT IT IS, LIKE, WHO 10 -- OR WHO DO WE WANT TO BE IN THIS WORLD, KIND OF ATTITUDE, 11 LIKE, WHAT DO WE WANT THIS REGION TO BE KNOWN FOR, AND WHAT'S 12 THE POLICY THAT CREATES THAT WORLD, AND WHAT'S THE BEST WAY TO 13 IMPLEMENT IT, AND AMONGST US WHO IS THE BEST WAY TO CARRY IT, 14 15 WHO IS THE BEST AGENCY TO CARRY IT. SO, IT'S MORE THAN JUST 16 CLIMATE, TO ME. IT'S ALSO EQUITABLE, AN INCLUSIVE AND AN EQUITABLE ENVIRONMENT, AND HOW WE TAKE ALL OF OUR AGENCIES TO 17 ENSURE THAT HAPPENS AND THEN TALK ABOUT THOSE POLICIES. 18 BECAUSE MAYBE WE DON'T ALL AGREE AND IF NOT HOW DO WE NOT WORK 19 AGAINST ONE ANOTHER BUT WITH ONE ANOTHER TO CREATE A LIVABLE 20 21 SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA.

MINDY CRAIG: YEAH. WHAT I'M HEARING, IF I'M RIGHT, IT'S ALMOST
AS IF YOU START WITH BARC, RATHER THAN END THERE. THAT YOU
ACTUALLY COME TOGETHER TO COME UP WITH ALMOST LIKE A REGIONAL



WORKPLAN FOR AND EVERYBODY, THEN YOU SAY WHO CAN ACTUALLY DO 1 ALL THESE PIECES, AND THEN, YOU KNOW, HOW THAT HELPS TO, SORT 2 3 OF, GET ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES AND CLARITY AND COORDINATION ACROSS THE REGION. RATHER THAN EVERYONE IS DOING 4 5 THEIR THING AND THEN, OH, WHAT IS AT THE BOTTOM THERE THAT BARC SHOULD BE FILLING IN; IS THAT A FAIR? SORT OF? 6 7 8 DAVINA HURT: THAT'S JUST A PIECE. BUT I AM A NEW MEMBER, MAYBE WITH A DIFFERENT LENS. 9 10 MINDY CRAIG: YEAH, YEAH, THAT'S GOOD. 11 12 PAT ECKLUND: I DO NOT NECESSARILY THINK BARC SHOULD HAVE THE 13 OVERALL WORKPLAN. KIND OF, I THINK THAT BARC IS THE 14 15 OPPORTUNITY TO TRY TO THREAD THROUGH ALL THE DIFFERENT 16 AGENCIES, AND TIE THEM ALL TOGETHER. 17 MINDY CRAIG: UH-HUH. 18 19 PAT ECKLUND: AND ON THINGS WHERE THERE IS COMMENTS SO THAT YOU 20 COULD POSSIBLY MAXIMIZE THE USE OF EACH OF THE ORGANIZATIONS 21 TO ACHIEVE THE END RESULT, REDUCE RESOURCES THAT EACH OF THE 22 AGENCIES ARE USING. THERE IS NO NEED TO DUPLICATE. SEE IF 23 THERE ARE THINGS THAT WE CAN COLLABORATE ON TOGETHER TO WORK 24 TOWARDS THE SAME OBJECTIVE, WITH OUR DIFFERENT 25



RESPONSIBILITIES. SO, I THINK THAT BARC SERVES A VERY -- CAN
 SERVE A VERY UNIQUE ROLE, AND I THINK THAT ONE OF THE THINGS
 THAT SCARCE THE LIVING DAY LIGHTS OUT OF ME IS IF BARC WERE TO
 TAKE OVER ANY OF THE REGULATORY RESPONSIBILITIES, I DON'T
 THINK THAT'S APPROPRIATE AT ALL.
 MINDY CRAIG: YEAH.

9 PAT ECKLUND: BECAUSE THEY DON'T NECESSARILY HAVE THE EXPERTISE
10 OR KNOW NECESSARILY WHAT WAS INTENDED. ANYWAY, JUST SOME
11 THOUGHTS AS A FORMER REGULATOR FOR A LONG TIME.

MINDY CRAIG: I'M CURIOUS, FROM THE MTC PERSPECTIVE, FROM THE14 TRANSPORTATION WORLD, WHAT ARE YOUR THOUGHTS ON THIS?

16 EDDIE AHN: BEING RELATIVELY NEW TO BARC, I, MYSELF, HAVE BEEN THINKING THROUGH THE INTERSECTION OF RESOURCES AND CLIMATE 17 CHANGE AND HOW -- IT'S NOT CLEAR TO ME WHETHER BARC IS ABLE TO 18 EVEN DIRECT, FOR INSTANCE, MTC, TO SHIFT RESOURCES TO CLIMATE 19 ADAPTATION PROJECTS, WHICH, THERE ARE WORKING GROUPS BASED ON 20 21 THIS THAT CHAIR WASSERMAN HAS BEEN A PART OF, THAT I HAVE ALSO BEEN TRACKING. BUT ON THIS QUESTION OF PROCESS HOW BARC 22 FOCUSES ON POLICY, I ENDED UP PICKING ONLY FOCUSED PROJECTS OR 23 INITIATIVES MY OWN PERSONAL INTEREST IS AROUND CLIMATE CHANGE. 24



SPEAKER: I WOULD ADD I AM CONCERNED ABOUT THAT TOO, I WANTED
 TO CHECK ALL THINGS RELATED TO CLIMATE BUT I'M ABOUT CAPACITY
 AND WHAT REALISTICALLY CAN BARC DO.

5 MINDY CRAIG: UH-HUH. ANY OTHER THOUGHTS BEFORE WE MOVE ON TO 6 THE NEXT ONE?

7

8 SPEAKER: YEAH I'M ONE OF THE FIVE PROJECTS FOCUS INITIATIVES 9 THAT'S AN AREA THAT ALMOST FORCES TO US WORK CLOSER TOGETHER 10 AS WE SUPPORT AND MOVE PROJECTS FORWARD, AND I THINK IT'S ON 11 THE PROJECT DELIVERY SIDE WHERE THE PUBLIC CAN SEE THAT THESE 12 ARE CHANGES OF SIGNIFICANCE. SO THAT'S WHY I SELECTED THEM. 13

MARK ROSS: AND THIS IS MARK ROSS, AND I WANT TO GO BACK TO MR. 14 15 WASSERMAN'S COMMENT ABOUT WHEN THE JPC WAS THE FORMED, AND WHY 16 IT WAS FORMED TO CREATE THE COMMUNICATION WHICH WAS VERY ROUGH BACK AT THE. BUT AS WE HAVE NOTED, IT'S IMPROVED GREATLY, AND 17 I HAVE A PROFESSIONAL -- I HAVE A BELIEF THAT THE 18 PROFESSIONALISM OF THE AGENCIES WILL CONTINUE. THAT THEY WILL 19 CONTINUE TO COMMUNICATE. I THINK THAT'S A PRETTY BASIC 20 21 EXPECTATION, AND THAT THEY WILL BE AWARE OF WHAT POLICIES THAT THEY'RE PROMULGATING, HOW THEY INTERACT OR INTERSECT WITH 22 CLIMATE GOALS. AND, SO, AGAIN, MY VIEW OF WHAT BARC SHOULD BE, 23 SHOULD BE A PORTAL OR A CLEARING HOUSE TO GO AND CHECK, OKAY, 24 25 THIS IS FIRST STEP, TO SAY HOW DOES THAT INTERSECT WITH THE



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BAY AREA'S CLIMATE GOALS. THAT'S KIND OF WHY I SAID ALL THINGS

RELATED TO CLIMATE, THAT BARC SHOULD BE, AND THIS WILL REQUIRE 2 3 RESOURCES AND EXPANDED STAFF AND EFFORT, BUT ALL THINGS RELATED TO CLIMATE, THIS IS WHERE YOU GO TO GET THAT ANSWER, 4 5 THAT POLICY QUESTION RESOLVED. 6 7 MINDY CRAIG: THANK YOU FOR THAT. 8 CHAIR, JESSE ARREGUIN: THERE IS ANOTHER BOARD MEMBER THAT 9 10 RAISED THEIR HAND. 11 DAVID HAUBERT: THIS IS HAUBERT, AND I APOLOGIZE. MY CAMERA IS 12 NOT WORKING AND MY NAME IS NOT LISTED THERE. SO REALLY SORRY 13 ABOUT THAT, BUT APPRECIATE THE OPPORTUNITY TO WEIGH IN, AND 14 15 REALLY APPRECIATE OUR COMBINED AND UNITED EFFORT TO RESOLVE 16 THE ISSUES OF CLIMATE CHANGE. HOWEVER, WE MUST ALL REALIZE THAT'S REALLY WAY ABOVE OUR REGIONAL SCALE AND CAPABILITIES. 17 IT'S A GLOBAL ISSUE. AND WHILE WE SHOULD BE THE LEADERS, AND 18 WE ARE THE LEADERS, WE ALSO NEED TO RECOGNIZE THAT WE NEED 19 FUNDING AND RESOURCES TO LEAD THE WAY. IT SHOULD NOT BE 20 21 ENTIRELY BORNE ON THE BACKS OF PEOPLE WHO, AS WAS MENTIONED EARLIER BY ANOTHER SPEAKER, PEOPLE ARE STRUGGLING AND YET WE 22 PAY A DOLLAR EXTRA FOR GASOLINE AND WE'RE TRANSITIONING AWAY 23 FROM THAT. SO, THIS'S GONNA BE COSTLY, AND WE HAVE 24 TRANSPORTATION NEEDS THAT WE'RE TRYING TO SWITCH TO ELECTRIC, 25



THAT HAVE COSTS ASSOCIATED. AND, SO, I JUST ASK THAT WE KEEP 1 IN MIND JUST HOW EFFECTIVE WE CAN BE AND WHAT THE COSTS ARE 2 AND THAT WE NOT BURDEN EVERYONE IN OUR SOCIETY WITH THAT. WE 3 NEED HELP FROM THE REST OF OUR GOVERNMENT. AND THEN, LASTLY, I 4 5 WOULD HOPE THAT BARC COULD BE A LITTLE BIT MORE OF A SOUNDING BOARD, OR RATHER MAKE POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS, FOR EXAMPLE, TO 6 THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, PERHAPS TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, AS 7 8 WE ARE THE LEADING EDGE AND THE EXPERTS LET'S VOICE WHAT WE SEE AND WE BELIEVE AS WE'RE CREATING THE LEADING EDGE, LET'S 9 MAKE IT KNOWN AND BE MORE AT THE TABLE WITH DECISION-MAKING. 10 AT LEAST FROM AN ADVOCACY STANDPOINT. AND I'M JUST NOT SURE I 11 HAVE SEEN ENOUGH OF THAT. I WOULD LIKE TO SEE MORE. SO THOSE 12 ARE MY COMMENTS. AGAIN, THANK YOU FOR LETTING ME WEIGH IN. WE 13 REALLY APPRECIATE THE DISCUSSION AND THIS GROUP, YOU'RE 14 15 AWESOME. THANK YOU.

MINDY CRAIG: THANK YOU. NOR A YOU CAN DO THE NEXT SLIDE HERE, 17 AND THERE IS OPPORTUNITY TO WRITE IN. BUT IT'S GREAT TO HEAR 18 PEOPLE'S FULL NARRATIVE ON THIS. SO, YOU CAN ADD IN THIS OR 19 NOT. BUT, ANYWAY, I THINK THERE IS SOME REALLY INTERESTING 20 21 PIECES THAT ARE KIND OF BUBBLING UP HERE, WHICH I'M REAL INTRIGUED BY, DAVID'S LAST COMMENT IS ALMOST SAYING, YOU KNOW, 22 BARC BECOMES AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE A CONSOLIDATED VOICE OF ALL 23 THE AGENCIES IN THE BAY AREA TO HELP THAT LEADERSHIP. WHICH IS 24 KIND OF AN INTEREST ELEMENT. SO THIS IS POTENTIAL. AND YOU CAN 25



HAVE MOVING UPWARDS OR DOWN WARDS, DEPENDING ON HOW YOU WANT 1 TO DO IT YOU ARE ALL DOING TONS OF WORK YOU'RE SUPER BUSY AND 2 3 HAVE HUGE DEMANDS, ON EACH ONE OF YOUR AGENCIES, AND THINGS THAT ARE OUTSIDE OF THOSE WHERE THOSE GAPS, AND WHERE DOES 4 5 BARC HIGHLIGHT BECOMING HELPING TO BE THE LEADER, HELPING YOU ALL BE LEADERS TO COORDINATE IN KEY POLICY AREAS. AND MARK OUT 6 THERE ON THE PHONE, FUNDING ALL OF THIS CLIMATE WORK BEING 7 8 EQUITABLE AND HAVING JUST TRANSITION IS A HUGE COST IS THAT A ROLE IS BARC PART OF THE FUNDING, BRINGING THE AGENCIES 9 TOGETHER TO GO HELP GET FUNDING. IS THAT ONE OF THE ROLES? I'M 10 KIND OF CURIOUS. SO, UP ON HERE IS HELPING THE MEMBER AGENCIES 11 COLLABORATE MORE TO JOINTLY SOLVE COMMON ISSUES. AND SOUNDS 12 LIKE THOSE FUNDING GAPS COMMON ISSUES, SEA LEVEL RISE, AND 13 JUST TRANSITION, HOW IS THAT IDENTIFIED AND WHAT DOES THAT 14 15 LOOK LIKE IF WE THINK ABOUT EACH ONE. ANYBODY ELSE WANT TO ADD 16 TO THE IDEAS ON PRIMARY FOCUS? I'M SEEING COMMONLY, COLLABORATE, COLLABORATE, COLLABORATE. THAT'S GREAT. YEAH. ONE 17 EXAMPLE REGIONAL PROJECT SEA LEVEL RISE, AND COMMON CAUSE EACH 18 COUNTY TRYING TO WORK ON ITS OWN. EVERYONE IS TRYING DO THEIR 19 OWN CLIMATE PLAN ADAPTATION PLAN ENGAGEMENT FIGURING OUT 20 GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS EACH THEIR OWN THINGS THEIR CITY IS 21 TRYING TO DO, CLEARING HOUSE COLLABORATION DETERMINE GAPS AND 22 OPPORTUNITY ABOUT OPPORTUNITIES CONCERN ABOUT WHO IS GOING TO 23 BE ABLE TO WRITE A GRANT THAT'S OPPORTUNITY TO BUILD GRANT 24 WRITING ON ALL SIDES. YES. OKAY. GREAT. OKAY. I'M GOING TO 25



MOVE US TO OUR NEXT PIECE OF THE CONVERSATION. SO, WAIT. HOLD 1 ON. THERE IS MORE. I'M NOT GOING TO STOP. BECOMING A TRUST AND 2 3 POLICY CLEARING HOUSE, THE IDEA OF CLEARING HOUSE REGIONAL OPPORTUNITIES NOT JUST ACCORD, LEAD. COORDINATION 4 5 COLLABORATION AGENCY CLIMATE INITIATIVES. IT SEEMS TO ME THERE IS RESEARCH AND GATHERING OF THESE DIFFERENT PIECES WHAT IS 6 EVERYONE TRYING TO DO, WHAT'S HAPPENING AND WHAT ARE THE GAPS 7 8 SEEMS TO BE A BIG PIECE OF THE PIE HERE. YEAH. COLLABORATION ON COMMON ISSUES. GREAT. OKAY. LET'S GO TO THE NEXT ONE. AND, 9 SO, AS WE THINKING ABOUT THIS, SO, WE JUST SAID, 10 COLLABORATION, COORDINATION, CLEARING HOUSE, COMMON ISSUES. 11 THINKING ABOUT WHAT YOU ARE DOING TODAY -- I'M GOING TO TURN 12 THIS OVER TO RANDI AND SHE'S GOING TO DO THIS. BUT I'M 13 THINKING ABOUT WHAT SHOULD WE DO, SHOULD NOT DO AND WHAT 14 SHOULD WE CONTINUE TO DO. THAT'S GOING TO BE THIS EXERCISE, 15 16 SORT OF, A DIFFERENT ONE. RANDI?

AND THEN WE'LL MOVE INTO WHAT SHOULD WE START. 2 3 YOU KNOW, HOW CAN WE ADDRESS THE NEW OPPORTUNITIES, COMBAT THREATS, WHAT'S SOMETHING BARC HASN'T DONE IN THE PAST THAT WE 4 5 SHOULD START TO DO. SO, LET'S MOVE ON TO QUESTION ONE AND 6 YOU'RE GOING TO PULL OUT YOUR MENTEE METER AGAIN. OH, HERE ARE SOME AREAS TO CONSIDER FOR THE START, STOP, AND CONTINUE, ALL 7 8 THREE QUESTIONS. JUST TO GET YOUR BRAIN GOING. BARC'S ROLE. SHOULD WE CONTINUE BEING A CONVENER, FOR EXAMPLE? THESE ARE 12 COMPONENTS OF THINGS TO CONSIDER. LET'S GO TO THE FIRST 13 QUESTION. NEXT PAGE. SO, WHAT SHOULD BARC -- OOH, NO, WE 14 15 SHOULD GO TO WHAT SHOULD BARC CONTINUE DOING, NORA. WHAT 16 SHOULD BARC CONTINUE DOING? WHAT DO WE WANT TO TAKE FORWARD THAT WE'RE DOING NOW, WE DO NOT WANT IT TO GET LOST AS WE LOOK 17 TOWARDS THE FUTURE. YOU SHOULD BE USING YOUR MENTEE METER FOR 18 THIS ONE. ALL RIGHT. LET'S GO AHEAD AND MOVE TO WHAT SHOULD WE 19 STOP DOING. OH, HERE ARE SOME TO CONTINUE. MEETING AND 20 21 DISCUSSING WHAT AGENCIES ARE INVOLVED IN, CONTINUING TO LOOK AT BOTH CONFLICTS AMONG THE AGENCY AND THE GAPS, ENHANCING 22 COMMUNICATION BETWEEN THE AGENCIES. LET THE EXECUTIVE 23 DIRECTORS DECIDE WHAT'S MOST EFFICIENT. CONTINUE BEING A FORUM 24 FOR CONVENING AND PRESENTING, REGIONAL POLICIES AND 25



INITIATIVES COORDINATING MULTIPLE AGENCIES IDENTIFYING

BUT, ALSO, AS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR, SORT OF, JOINT DISCUSSION 4 5 AND POLICY MAKING FOR THE REGION, AND I DON'T THINK WE HAVE DONE ENOUGH OF THAT HERE. AND THEN THERE COULD BE AN ADVOCACY 6 COMPONENT TO THAT RELATIVE TO STATE OR FEDERAL GOVERNMENT WE 7 8 HAVE CONVERSATION AROUND BUDGET CONTEXT AROUND SIGNIFICANT FUNDS THAT'S SACRAMENTO AND FEDERAL GOVERNMENT WE'RE GOING TO 9 10 BE BRINGING TO OUR REGION AROUND SEA LEVEL RISE ADAPTATION RESILIENCE AS THE BARC CONVENER SO MY HOPE IS OUTCOME OF THE 11 FOCUS ON HOW WE CAN BETTER COORDINATE POLICIES AND PROGRAMS. 12 AND AS SAID IN THE MENTEE METER, WHERE ARE THERE GAPS AND 13 OPPORTUNITIES TO FOSTER COLLABORATION THAT'S THE BENEFIT OF 14 15 ALL OF THIS.

19 V. CHAIR, ZACK WASSERMAN: LARGELY AROUND POLICY DISCUSSION,

21 ARE GAPS. AND AS I WAS TRYING TO FORMULATE AN ANSWER TO THIS
22 QUESTION, IT'S A LITTLE DIFFICULT BECAUSE, WELL,

ONE OF THE THINGS WE NEED TO COME OUT OF THIS WITH IS, ARE 1 THERE SOME THINGS THAT BARC CAN DO THAT ARE IMPORTANT ENOUGH 2 3 THAT WE REALLY NEED TO FIGURE OUT HOW TO RAISE MORE FUNDS FOR IT, IN A TIME WHEN ALL GOVERNMENTS ARE CHALLENGED ABOUT 4 5 RAISING FUNDS. AND ONE OF THE AREAS IN WHICH I THINK WE MAY GET TO A YES ANSWER FOR THAT ONE, IS FOCUS ON PROMOTING 6 REGIONALISM. THAT'S ONE OF THE THINGS I STARTED OFF TALKING 7 8 ABOUT. AND SEVERAL OTHERS HERE HAVE COMMENTED ON IT. BUT MOST -- THE MAJORITY OF PEOPLE ON THIS BOARD ARE ELECTED OFFICIALS, 9 WHICH IS FULLY APPROPRIATE, PRIMARY DUTY OF ELECTED OFFICIALS 10 IS TO THINK ABOUT THEIR CONSTITUENTS IN THEIR DISTRICTS. THE 11 PEOPLE THAT SIT ON THESE BOARDS TEND TO PUT THEIR LOCAL HAT 12 ASIDE, AND PUT ON A REGIONAL HAT WHEN THEY COME IN HERE. 13 MYSELF INCLUDED. I'M NOT AN ELECTED OFFICIAL, BUT I AM AN 14 OAKLAND BOOSTER FOR A VERY LONG TIME. BUT I THINK WE NEED TO 15 16 FIGURE OUT HOW TO BOTH PROMOTE REGIONALISM, SUPPORT THOSE WHO ARE REGIONALISTS. WE KNOW THAT A NUMBER OF VERY SIGNIFICANT 17 REGIONAL LEADERS IN THE BAY AREA HAVE RECENTLY RETIRED OR ARE 18 CLOSE TO RETIRING FROM POLITICAL LIFE. AND THERE ARE YOUNGER 19 PEOPLE COMING UP WHO ARE FILLING THAT, BUT WE NEED TO FIGURE 20 21 OUT HOW TO REALLY RECOGNIZE THAT, ENCOURAGE THAT, SUPPORT THAT, MENTOR THAT. 22

ONE ORGANIZATION THAT CAN INCLUDE EVERY SINGLE ORGANIZATION, 1 WE WORK WITH THE WASTEWATER UTILITIES WE SHOULD HAVE A DRAFT 2 3 PERMIT THAT WE JUST CLOSED PUBLIC COMMENT THAT DEALS WITH MASSIVE FISH KILLS AND HARMFUL ALGAE BLOOM THAT OCCURRED IN 4 5 2022 SO WE'RE WORKING WITH 37 WASTEWATER AGENCIES IN THE BAY AREA WE DON'T WANT TO BE COMING UNDER ONE UMBRELLA OF BARC 6 WE'RE DOING IT SUCCESSFULLY. I THINK THE LEADERS ARE SHOWING 7 8 UP, LAYER, AND ANDY SHOWS UP, THAT'S USEFUL WE ALL HAVE THOSE CONNECTIONS I CAN PICK UP THE PHONE AND CALL LARRY, WE'RE IN A 9 10 MEETING THIS AFTERNOON ON A DIFFERENT TOPIC AND COORDINATING, IN THAT REGARD I THINK IT'S ACHIEVED ITS PURPOSE AND AS I HAVE 11 BEEN PART OF THIS FOR LESS THAN A YEAR IS BRINGING TOGETHER 12 EARLY ON THERE WANT GOOD COORDINATION THERE IS OUTSTANDING 13 COORDINATION. PHONE CALLS AND E-MAILS AT NIGHT WE'RE ALL 14 RESPONSIVE TO EACH OTHER SO IN THAT REGARD COULD CLAIM 15 16 SUCCESS.

ANDREW FREMIER: ANDREW FREMIER EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MTC AND 20 21 ABAG. FIRST OF ALL, I DO APPRECIATE WE'RE PUTTING SOME EFFORT INTO THIS QUESTION BECAUSE I THINK IT'S VERY IMPORTANT AND I 22 DO THINK TO MAYBE FOLLOW COMMISSIONER SPERING'S POINT, 23 SOMETIMES WE DO, SORT OF, SNAG VICTORY AND KEEP TRYING TO FIND 24 25 NEW WAYS TO GROW IT. I TEND TO FOCUS, QUITE A BIT, ON THE



CHALLENGES WE ALL HAVE RELATIVE TO RESOURCES AND TRYING TO 1 MAKE SURE WE'RE DOING OUR BEST TO PUT THEM TO WORK. IN 2 3 PARTICULAR, FOR OUR TWO COMMISSIONS, ABAG AND MTC, WE'RE VERY RESOURCE CHALLENGED BASED ON THE WORKLOAD THAT'S IN FRONT OF 4 5 US, AND I'M VERY CONCERNED ABOUT SCOPE CREEP. I DON'T THINK THIS FORUM IS THE RIGHT PLACE JUST TO, SORT OF, REPEAT WHAT'S 6 BEING HAPPEN -- WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE VARIOUS AGENCIES, AND 7 8 I THINK WE HAVE TO BE VERY REFLECTIVE ABOUT WHAT WORK THIS GROUP TAKES ON. A LITTLE BIT ABOUT A COLLABORATION, I THINK IT 9 10 HAS CHANGED QUITE A BIT FROM ITS ORIGINAL GOALS AND THE FACT THAT LARRY, PHILIPPE, AND I ARE ALL IN THE SAME ROOM, SAME 11 BUILDING, MAKES IT VERY EASY FOR US TO BUMP INTO EACH OTHER ON 12 ANY KIND OF AN ISSUE AND BASIS. I ALSO THINK WE HAVE VERY GOOD 13 RELATIONSHIPS WITH FOLKS THAT HAVE JOINED THE TABLE LATELY, 14 15 ECHOING EILEEN'S POINT, AND I CERTAINLY KNOW HOW TO REACH AMY 16 AND EILEEN, AND THEY'RE WELCOME TO MOVE INTO THIS BUILDING ARE AS WELL WE HAVE PLENTY OF ROOM, AND WE CHARGE REASONABLE 17 RATES. [LAUGHTER] BUT, I DO THINK IT'S TIME TO REFLECT ON WHAT 18 IS THE SCOPE OF THE MISSION AND HOW CAN WE BE EFFICIENT AND 19 PROVIDE GOOD GOVERNMENTAL SERVICES. BECAUSE I THINK THE WORK 20 HAS JUST GOTTEN HARDER, AND I'M NOT SURE GROWTH IS NECESSARILY 21 THE RIGHT APPROACH HERE. I THINK WE OUGHT TO BE TAKING A LOOK 22 AT EFFICIENCY, CLAIMING SOME VICTORIES AND REALLY TRYING TO 23 FIGURE OUT WHAT IS THE INTENT OF THE WORK WE DO IN THIS SPACE. 24 AND I THINK THE MOU IS A PLACE WHERE THAT CAN BE DEFINED JUST 25



AS WELL AS THIS ORGANIZATION AND IT ACTUALLY BRINGS IF OUR
 PARTNERS A LITTLE MORE EFFICIENTLY THAT ARE NOT PART OF THE
 LEGISLATIVE REQUIREMENTS TO BE HERE.

PHILLIP FINE: I'M GOING TO ECHO A LOT OF THE THOUGHTS OF THE 7 8 OTHER EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS. WE ALL HAVE -- WE ALL HAVE OUR, YOU KNOW, LEGISLATIVE MANDATES, AND CORE MISSIONS, AND OBVIOUSLY 9 OUR PRIMARY DUTY IS TO FOCUS ON THOSE, BUT THERE ARE SPECIFIC 10 AREAS WHERE, YOU KNOW, THE LACK OF INTEGRATED PLANNING, OR 11 INTEGRATED IMPLEMENTATION IS HOLDING US BACK, AND I REALLY 12 THINK WE SHOULD FOCUS ON THOSE AREAS WHERE WE'RE ALL STILL, AS 13 AN AGENCY MOVING TOWARDS OUR CORE MISSION, BUT THE 14 15 COLLABORATION WITH THE OTHER AGENCIES ACTUALLY IS A 16 MULTIPLYING EFFECT AND ENHANCING EACH OF OUR CORE MISSIONS NOT NECESSARY HE ADDING TO EACH OF OUR CORE MISSIONS OR ADDING NEW 17 CORE MISSIONS TO BARC, BUT REALLY FOCUSING ON THOSE AREAS 18 WHERE NOT ONLY THE OVERLAP AND BENEFITS FOR EVERYBODY BUT ALSO 19 THE ONES WHERE WE'RE NOT MAKING A LOT OF PROGRESS AS STAFF, OR 20 21 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, AND WE NEED A PUSH FROM OUR BOARD MEMBERS TO HELP US COLLABORATE. I WOULD REALLY THINK ABOUT THOSE GAPS, 22 AGAIN, THERE IS, SORT OF, THIS GAP ANALYSIS WHERE WE'RE NOT 23 DOING A GOOD JOB THEN LOOKING AT BARC'S, SORT OF, CORE MISSION 24 IS REALLY, YOU KNOW, INTEGRATED -- I THINK OF IT -- MAYBE THIS 25



WILL HELP THE DISCUSSION, THERE ARE A COUPLE DIFFERENT AXIS IF 1 2 WE WANT TO DISTILL THE WHOLE CONVERSATION DOWN, I'M AN ENGINEER BY HEART. SO BEAR WITH ME. THERE IS ONE, SORT OF, 3 AXIS WHERE GOING ANYWHERE FROM JUST COMMUNICATING TO 4 5 CONVENING, THEN COORDINATING, COLLABORATING, ALL OF WAY TO, LIKE, COMBINING AND INTEGRATING, RIGHT? AND THERE HAS BEEN A 6 LOT OF DISCUSSION TO WHERE DOES IT SIT ON THAT AXIS. THE OTHER 7 8 AXIS IS ANYTHING ON PRINCIPLES, POLICY, TO PLANNING TO PROGRAMS PROJECTS RIGHT SO WHERE CAN BARC ON SPECIFIC TOPICS 9 LIKE THAT ON AREAS WHERE WE'RE ALL HAVING TROUBLE FIGURING OUT 10 WHAT THE SOLUTION IS. 11

AMY HUTZEL: AMY HUTZEL, EXECUTIVE OFFICER WITH THE STATE 15 16 COASTAL CONSERVANCY AND I GUESS WHAT I LOOK BACK ON WHAT BARC 17 HAS DONE WELL, I DO THINK ABOUT RESILIENT BY DESIGN, AND I THINK THE IDEA OF DOING REALLY FOCUSED INITIATIVES LIKE RBD, 18 WHERE YOU ARE BRINGING IN THE RESOURCES -- I THINK IT WAS THE 19 FORD FOUNDATION. ROCKEFELLER. SORRY. -- THAT PUT IN \$5 MILLION 20 FOR THAT EFFORT, AND THE CONSERVANCY PUT IN FUNDS, AND YOU 21 KNOW, WE WERE ABLE TO PULL SIGNIFICANT FUNDS, AND THEN REALLY 22 DO SOMETHING MEANINGFUL FOR THE REGION THAT ENGAGED 23 COMMUNITIES AT SPECIFIC SHORELINE LOCATIONS TO THINK ABOUT SEA 24 25 LEVEL RISE AND CLIMATE ADAPTATION. YOU KNOW, VERY SPECIFICALLY



IN THEIR NEIGHBORHOOD. AND SOME OF THOSE PROJECTS HAVE GONE 1 ON, YOU KNOW? THERE'S CONTINUED EFFORTS, LIKE THE NORTH 2 RICHMOND LEVEE, THE LIVING LEVEE PROJECT. SO, I'M -- YOU KNOW, 3 I'M A PROJECT FOCUSED PERSON, AND A REGIONALIST, BUT I LIKE 4 5 THE TANGIBLE OUTCOMES THAT BARC COULD HAVE AND I THINK THAT GETS AT SOME OF THE COMMENTS ABOUT INEQUITIES IN THE REGION, 6 AND SERVING, PEOPLE. I WAS ALSO STRUCK BY THE COMMENTS AROUND 7 8 ADVOCACY OR EDUCATION IN SACRAMENTO. THE COASTAL CONSERVANCY, WE'RE A STATE AGENCY, SO WE CAN'T DO THAT, SORT OF, ADVOCACY, 9 10 BUT WE HAD SIGNIFICANT FUNDS FOR SEA LEVEL RISE, AND 392 MILLION OF THOSE FUNDS ARE NOW PROPOSED FOR REDUCTION DUE TO 11 THE STATE'S FISCAL ISSUES, AND I JUST WONDER WHETHER, YOU 12 KNOW, SOME OF THE MEMBERS OF BARC, OR BARC AS A WHOLE COULD 13 HAVE COMMUNICATED, YOU KNOW, WHAT THAT MEANS FOR THE REGION TO 14 15 HAVE 392 MILLION OF SEA LEVEL RISE FUNDING CUT FROM THE 16 BUDGET. AND THEN, I GUESS, ALSO, YOU KNOW, DURING THIS 17 CONVERSATION, THIS IS NOT SO MUCH ABOUT SUCCESS OF BARC, BUT JUST THINKING ABOUT THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY RESTORATION 18 AUTHORITY BEING A MEMBER VERSUS THE STATE COASTAL CONSERVANCY, 19 THE STATE COASTAL CONSERVANCY WE ARE A STATEWIDE AGENCY, OUR 20 BOARD MEMBERS ARE NOT LOCAL ELECTED OFFICIALS IN THE BAY AREA, 21 I DON'T IMAGINE OUR BOARD IS GOING TO BE ENTHUSIASTIC ABOUT 22 JOINING BARC AS A VOTING MEMBER, HAVING ONE OF OUR CONSERVANCY 23 BOARD MEMBERS JOINING BARC. BUT MAYBE THROUGH THE SAN 24 25 FRANCISCO BAY RESTORATION AUTHORITY, WHICH IS A REGIONAL



AGENCY IS MADE UP OF LOCAL ELECTED OFFICIALS, YOU KNOW, THERE
 IS A BETTER MECHANISM, AND CHAIR PINE, DAVE PINE CHAIRS THE
 RESTORATION AUTHORITY, SO I MIGHT BE GETTING A LITTLE AHEAD OF
 MYSELF, BUT I'M JUST THROWING THAT OUT. THANK YOU.

MINDY CRAIG: THAT'S GREAT. DID I MISS ANYBODY? I THINK WE GOT 6 EVERYBODY. I THINK THAT'S VERY HELPFUL OF THE WE'RE GOING TO 7 8 BE TAKING ALL OF THE INFORMATION THAT YOU HAVE PROVIDED TO US, AND TRY TO PROVIDE A BIT OF A FRAMEWORK FOR US AS WE GO INTO 9 WHAT ARE THE POTENTIAL OPTIONS, WHERE SHOULD WE BE GOING, AND 10 THAT'S GOING TO COME BACK IN JULY TO HAVE YOUR, SORT OF, LIKE, 11 YES, YOU HAVE HEARD US CORRECTLY, THIS IS THE RIGHT DIRECTION 12 FOR US TO GO IN TERMS OF CONTINUING THIS, UNTIL, FOR THAT 13 SEPTEMBER BOARD MEETING. BUT I'M GOING TO THROW IT BACK TO 14 15 RAND TOW FINALIZE TODAY. AND APPRECIATE EVERYONE'S TIME HERE. 16 RANDI IS GOING TO GO OVER OUR NEXT STEPS THEN WE'LL TURN IT 17 OVER TO ALLISON.

5 FOR PUBLIC COMMENT. WE DO HAVE ONE IN-PERSON SPEAKER. THANK

CHARLEY LAVERY: GOOD AFTERNOON EVERYONE. THANK YOU FOR YOUR 9 WORK. CHARLIE LAVERY I'M WITH THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL ALSO 10 WITH THE OPERATING ENGINEERS UNION RESIDENT OF SAN MATEO 11 COUNTY AND PACIFICA STAKEHOLDER ON MULTIPLE LEVELS VERY 12 EXCITED BY THE CONVERSATION AROUND BARC BEING A CONVENER FOR 13 CLIMATE IMPACT ADAPTATION PARTICULARLY SEA LEVEL RISE. AS A 14 MEMBER OF THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL I HAVE SEEN MANY OF THE 15 16 COMMITTEE MEMBERS HERE KIND OF RESISTANT TO THIS IDEA OF REGIONALISM. EACH HAS THEIR LITTLE SYSTEM TRYING TO TAKE CARE 17 OF THEIR CONSTITUENTS. I THINK THERE IS OPPORTUNITY AND NEED 18 TO COORDINATE AROUND SEA LEVEL RISE AND CLIMATE CHANGE 19 MITIGATION PROJECTS AND THERE IS SPACE FOR REGIONAL VISION AND 20 I THINK BARC IS POSITIONED TO TAKE UP THAT SPACE. I CAN'T 21 22 THINK OF ANY ISSUE THAT LENDS ITSELF MORE TO REGIONALISM THAN 23 SEA LEVEL RISE; DESPITE ITS VERY NATURE. YOU KNOW? THE SEA DOESN'T RECOGNIZE CITY LIMITS, COUNTY LINES. SO, AS A MEMBER 24 OF THE CONSTRUCTION UNION, THAT WOULD DO MUCH OF THE WORK, I'M 25



DEFINITELY A STAKEHOLDER, PACIFICA WE HAVE GOT BUILDINGS 1 2 FALLING INTO THE OCEAN, AND AS A RESIDENT OF SAN MATEO COUNTY 3 THAT WOULD BE MOST IMPACTED BY SEA LEVEL RISE, SHALL I QUALIFY AS A STAKEHOLDER? SO, I'M VERY ENCOURAGED BY THE EMPHASIS IN 4 5 THE PRESENTATION AROUND STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT. I'M ALSO THINKING AS A VETERAN, IF MANY INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS, NOT 6 7 JUST FUNDING CAMPAIGNS. AND THEY ALL -- WE HAVE HAD A LOT OF 8 SUCCESSFUL, SOME OF THEM YOU HAVE SEEN HERE, MEASURE AA, THE WETLAND RESTORATION MEASURE, THE SEA WALL MEASURE, AND THEY 9 ALL HAVE A COMMON THEME AND THAT'S COMMON SENSE INFRASTRUCTURE 10 BENEFITS EVERYONE. YOU KNOW, THAT PROTECTS WHAT WE HAVE AND 11 ENABLES TO US HAVE A SUSTAINABLE ECONOMIC VIBRANCE IN THE 12 REGION. SO, APPRECIATE EVERYONE LOOKING AT THIS SPACE. IT DOES 13 14 NEED TO BE FILLED. AND WE NEED LEADERSHIP THERE. WE NEED 15 LEADERSHIP. IT IS A REGIONAL MEASURE. SO, THANK YOU. A 16 REGIONAL ISSUE. SO, THANK YOU.

BUT I THINK THIS WAS AN EXCELLENT CONVERSATION AND A 11 LOT TO WORK WITH, BUT I THINK WE'RE COALESCING AROUND KIND OF 12 A CLEAR FOCUS. SO, REALLY APPRECIATE YOU HELPING FACILITATE 13 THIS CONVERSATION TODAY. ALLISON, IS THERE ANYTHING ELSE YOU 14 15 WANT TO ADD?

17 ALLISON BROOKS: I REALLY APPRECIATE EVERYONE'S PARTICIPATION 18 AND I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO GETTING CLEARER AS WE MOVE FORWARD. 19
