CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU VERY MUCH, KIMBERLY. ITEM 12 FOUR, CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT. A VERY IMPORTANT DAY FOR THE BAY 13 AREA HOUSING FINANCE AUTHORITY, MTC ABAG AND SPECIFICALLY ALL 14 PEOPLE WHO HAVE WORKED FOR MANY YEARS TO PROVIDE A BETTER WAY 15 16 OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING FOR BAY AREA RESIDENTS. WE'LL TAKE THE FINAL ACTION TO PLACE THE HOUSING BOND ON THE NOVEMBER BALLOT. 17 THIS MEETING FOLLOWS A PUBLIC NOTICE WE HELD MAY 22ND THERE IS 18 MULTIPLE TIMES WE HAVE TALKED ABOUT THIS. I REALLY LOOK 19 FORWARD TO THIS DAY IT IS A CULMINATION OF SO MUCH DISCUSSION 20 21 FROM COMMISSIONERS AND MEMBERS. WE HAVE SPENT SEVERAL YEARS CREATING DEBATING AND FINALIZING OUR HOUSING POLICIES, WE'RE 22 NOT GOING TO ASK STAFF TO PRESENT AGAIN BECAUSE WE ALL KNOW IT 23 BY MEMORY AT THIS POINT. I WANT TO THANK STAFF FOR THEIR 24 25 COMMITMENT, OUTREACH, GOING INTO LOCAL COMMUNITIES TO HEAR

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FROM THEM AT THEIR LOCAL LEVEL TO HEAR FROM THEM CONCERNS FROM 1 PEOPLE. IN A FRONT FACING WAY THESE ARE YOU ON NEIGHBORS AND 2 3 FAMILY MEMBERS. I REALLY APPRECIATE THIS. WE WILL TAKE CARE OF BUSINESS TODAY ON THE FINAL POLLING NUMBERS ON THE HOUSING 4 5 BOND. I WANT TO THANK THE BODY LEANING INTO THIS AND TACKLING ISSUES THAT NEED TO BE ADDRESSED. I'LL SHARE A PERSON STORY, I 6 WAS COACHING SOCCER AND I SAW THESE KIDS AND THERE WAS A FLASH 7 8 BACK TO HOW WE GROUP, AND THERE WAS HOUSING OPPORTUNITY FOR MANY OF US AND IT ENCAPSULATES AN OPPORTUNITY WE'RE TRYING TO 9 PRESERVE. I TALK ABOUT SOCCER BECAUSE I DID THAT YESTERDAY. IT 10 WAS TOP OF MIND. WE'LL GO TO OUR CONSENT CALENDAR. I'LL SEE IF 11 WE HAVE PUBLIC COMMENT ON OUR CONSENT CALENDAR? 12

[AYES] I HAVE 20 NEVER SEEN SO MUCH ENTHUSIASM. 21 22 23 KATHLEEN KANE: FOR THE CLARITY OF THE RECORD MOTION PASSES 24 UNANIMOUSLY BY ALL MEMBERS PRESENT. 25

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CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: PROCEEDING TO ITEM 6A POLL RESULTS FOR
 THE BAY AREA AFFORDABLE HOUSING BOND. STAFF WILL PROVIDE AN
 OVERVIEW OF FINDINGS FROM THE MAY JUNE 24TH VOTER OPINION.
 TURNING IT OVER TO REBECCA LONG AND RUTH BERNSTEIN. THIS IS AN
 INFORMATION ITEM ONLY.

REBECCA LONG: GOOD MORNING CHAIR AND MEMBERS OF THE BAHFA 7 8 AUTHORITY. REBECCA LONG DIRECTOR OF LEGISLATION AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS I'M GOING TO HAND IT OVER TO RUTH B, EMC RESEARCH, 9 10 CEO, HER AND HER TEAM HAVE CONDUCTED A NUMBER OF POLLS FOR US ON THIS BOND MEASURE, RECENTLY THREE, THE MOST RECENT ONE WAS 11 COMPLETED LATE MAY, JUNE. IT'S IMPORTANT YOU SEE THAT POLL 12 BEFORE YOU TAKE THIS HISTORICAL VOTE TODAY. WITH THAT I'LL 13 14 TURN IT OVER TO.

16 RUTH BERNSTEIN: RUTH THANK YOU REBECCA, AND I ASSUME THERE ARE 17 SOME SLIDES THAT ARE GOING TO MAGICALLY SHOW UP ON THE SCREEN. 18

19 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: WHY DON'T WE GET STARTED AND I'M SURE 20 THEY WILL SHOW UP.

21

RUTH BERNSTEIN: I'LL WALK YOU THROUGH HIGH-LEVEL THE NUMBERS
FROM THE MOST RECENT POLL THAT WE DID AND YOU WILL SEE
COMPARISONS TO SOME OF THE EARLY POLLING. NEXT SLIGHTED
PLEASE. SLIDE. THIS MOST RECENT POLL IS FRESH DATA WE

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CONDUCTED THIS AT THE BEGINNING OF THE MONTH AND RECEIVED 21 1 HELPED RESPONSES SO WE COULD FEEL CONFIDENT IN RESULTS. AND IT 2 3 WAS REPRESENTATIVE OF THE NINE COUNTY BAY AREA THOSE LIKELY TO VOTE THIS NOVEMBER AND WE DID THE SURVEY IN MULTIPLE 4 5 LANGUAGES, ENGLISH, SPANISH, AND CHINESE AND TRIED TO REACH PEOPLE WHERE WE COULD REACH THEM, BY PHONE, ALSO TEXTING AND 6 E-MAIL INVITATION. SO MULTI-MODAL, VERY TYPICAL OF HOW POLLING 7 8 IS DONE NOW. NEXT PAGE. WHAT WE SAW OVERALL BIG PICTURE TAKEAWAY AS WE SAW IN THE BIG PICTURE IN POLLING VOTERS NOW 9 ARE PESSIMISTIC NOT FEELING SUPER CONFIDENT IN WHERE THINGS 10 ARE GOING GENERALLY. AND THEY'RE FEELING TAX HESITANT AND 11 THAT'S BEEN FAIRLY CONSISTENT. A LOT OF THAT HAS TO DO WITH 12 COST OF LIVING. WHAT WE'RE ALSO SEEING THOUGH THAT THERE 13 CONTINUES TO BE AWARENESS THAT HOUSING AVAILABILITY AND 14 HOUSING AFFORDABILITY IS A HUGE PROBLEM. IT'S NOT A SECRET. 15 16 EVERYONE IS AWARE OF THIS AND THERE IS SOME AWARENESS THAT A BOND COULD MAKE A DIFFERENCE EVEN THOUGH WE HAVE SEEN IN 17 RESEARCH PEOPLE DON'T UNDERSTAND WHAT A BOND IS OR DOES THEY 18 SEE IT COULD MAKE A DIFFERENCE WE'RE SEEING IN THIS POLL IT 19 STARTS AT 54% THOSE LEANING TOWARDS YES AFTER ADDITIONAL 20 INFORMATION WE GET TO 55 WHICH IS SLIGHTLY HIGHER THAN WE HAVE 21 SEEN IN EARLIER POLLING. THROUGH THE NUMBERS ON THE NEXT PAGE 22 -- SORRY -- YEAH, JUST AS I MENTIONED, OVERALL PESSIMISM, 58% 23 OF VOTERS IN THE BAY AREA THINK THINGS ARE GENERALLY OFF ON 24 THE WRONG TRACK. 40% RIGHT DIRECTION. AND THAT'S BEEN VERY 25

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CONSISTENT OVER THE LAST SIX MONTHS OR SO. ON THE NEXT PAGE, 1 ON TAX SENSITIVITY, GENERALLY TAXES ARE HIGH ENOUGH THAT 2 3 PEOPLE WILL VOTE AGAINST ANY TAX INCREASE. 68% SAY THEY WILL JUST RIGHT OFF I'M GOING TO VOTE FOR ANY TAX INCREASE SOME 4 5 TURN AROUND AND VOTE YES. MANY OF THEM ARE OPPOSED FUNDAMENTALLY. THAT'S BEEN CONSISTENT SINCE DECEMBER. IT WAS 6 VERY DIFFERENT TWO YEARS AGO, FOUR YEARS AGO, FIVE YEARS AGO. 7 8 IT HAS BECOME MORE ANTITAX ENVIRONMENT RIGHT NOW. ON THE NEXT PAGE, BUT WE ALSO SEE THAT THERE IS A CONCERN ABOUT HOUSING. 9 SO, WE ASK, COMPARED TO A YEAR AGO IS, IT EASIER OR HARDER TO 10 FIND A PLACE TO LIVE. WE STILL HAVE A HUGE PERCENTAGE ALMOST 11 HALF SAYING IT'S HARDER TO FIND A PLACE TO LIVE AND 10% SAYING 12 IT'S EASIER TO FIND A PLACE TO LIVE. WE HAVEN'T SEEN A BIG 13 SHIFT AT ALL IN THIS. ON THE NEXT PAGE WE ALSO DO SEE SUPPORT 14 FOR MORE HOUSING CONSTRUCTION. 60% OVERALL SAYING I SUPPORT 15 16 BUILDING MORE HOUSING IN MY NEIGHBORHOOD, ONLY 39% OPPOSED TO THAT. SO THERE IS AWARENESS OF THE PROBLEM AND WILLING TO SEE 17 SOMETHING DONE TO ADDRESS IT WITH MORE HOUSING. ON THE NEXT 18 PAGE, PERCEPTION OF NEED, DO YOU THINK THERE IS A NEED FOR 19 MORE FUNDING TO ADDRESS HOUSING AFFORDABILITY? 67% SAY THAT 20 21 THERE IS A NEED. THEY RECOGNIZE WE NEED MORE HOUSING. AND THAT WE NEED MORE FUNDING TO ADDRESS IT. ON THE NEXT PAGE, THIS IS 22 A LITTLE BIT OF AN INDICATION OF THE FRUSTRATION OF THE 23 AWARENESS OF THE PROBLEM BUT CONCERN ABOUT RAISING TAXES. I 24 WOULD SUPPORT TESTING IN AFFORDABLE HOUSING EVEN IF IT MEANS 25

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RAISING TAXES. WE HAVE ONLY 47% THAT AGREE WITH THAT 53% 1 OPPOSE. SO WE HAVE TO MOVE PEOPLE INTO WILLING TO OPEN THEIR 2 3 CHECK BOOKS. NEXT PAGE, A REGIONAL HOUSING BOND CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN ADDRESSING BAY AREA HOUSING AFFORDABLE. WE NOW 4 5 HAVE 58% THAT AGREE WITH THAT, SAYING IT CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE THAT'S BEEN CONSISTENTLY AT 55% OR ABOVE. ON THE NEXT PAGE. ON 6 THE NEXT PAGE. SO, WE DID ASK A QUESTION. WE SAID IF THIS 7 8 MEASURE IS ON THE BALLOT, AND WE HAVE BEEN TWEAKING THIS OVER TIME, YOU KNOW SOME WORDS IN, SOME WORDS OUT. WE FEEL LIKE 9 THIS IS NOW MAYBE WE HAVE KIND OF LANDED ON A BEST LANGUAGE 10 HERE, WITH 54% TOTAL SAYING THAT THEY WOULD VOTE YES. WE 11 ACTUALLY HAVE THE ROUNDING IS A LITTLE OFF, 52% -- 52.42% 12 SAYING THEY WOULD VOTE YES THEN 1.23 VOTING YES, 54, BECAUSE 13 PEOPLE ASK 52% WHY NOT 53. 46% NO. [LAUGHTER] ON THE NEXT 14 15 PAGE. WE DID, AS A COMPARISON, AS I HAVE SAID WE ASKED THIS 16 QUESTION IN A NUMBER OF DIFFERENT WAYS. BACK IN MARCH OF 2023 WE DID ACTUALLY HAVE A QUESTION THAT WE WERE AT 58%, 49, 51, 17 AND 50, NOTING HERE WE'RE NOW AT 54 SO WE'RE A BIT HIGHER. IT 18 DOESN'T NECESSARILY MEAN THAT SUPPORTED IS GROWING. IT MEANS 19 THAT WE'RE CONTINUING TO REFINE AND FIND SOME LANGUAGE THAT'S 20 21 RESONATING. ON THE NEXT PAGE WE HAVE A COUPLE OF PAGES HERE I'M NOT GOING TO READ ALL THE INFORMATION BUT WE PRESENTED 22 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION, KIND OF POSITIVE, SUPPORTIVE 23 MESSAGING, TO VOTERS, GIVE THEM ALL KINDS OF INFORMATION HERE, 24 SOME OF THE OUTCOMES AND SOME THINGS THE MEASURE COULD DO. 25

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SOME OF THE REASONS FOR THE MEASURE. AND WE SEE IT ALL AS 1 GENERALLY POSITIVE BUT NOT WITH A LOT OF INTENSITY. ON THE 2 3 NEXT PAGE WE SEE AS WELL, THE ADDITIONAL, YOU KNOW, NOT VERY NEGATIVE, NOT VERY POSITIVE, BUT SOME MESSAGES HERE THAT ARE 4 5 MOVING PEOPLE. AND AT THE END, THEN WE ASK AGAIN, AFTER THE INFORMATION, NOW HOW WOULD YOU VOTE, AND WE DO SEE SUPPORT 6 GOES UP A LITTLE BIT TO 55% YES, 45% NO, INCLUDING THOSE THAT 7 8 LEAN TOWARD VOTING YES. ON THE NEXT PAGE, THIS IS JUST A COMPARISON FROM THE PREVIOUS POLLING OF KIND OF AT THE AFTER 9 POSITIVE INFORMATION. SO, WE HAVE SEEN THE POSITIVE 10 INFORMATION MAYBE MAKES SOME DIFFERENCE, GOT TO 54, 52, 50, 11 AND NOW UP TO 55. SO, THIS POLL WE'RE SEEING KIND OF STARTS A 12 LITTLE HIGHER AND AFTER INFORMATION WE GET MORE MOVEMENT. 13 FEELING SOMEWHAT POSITIVE ABOUT THAT, OBVIOUSLY THAT IS STILL 14 15 RIGHT AT THAT 55% THRESHOLD. SO THIS IS NOT SAYING THIS WILL 16 BE EASY IN ANY WAY. BUT THERE ARE IN -- YOU KNOW, AND THIS IS 17 WHERE THE NUMBERS ARE, WHERE THE NUMBERS HAVE BEEN, AND WE HAVE SEEN INSTANCES WHERE POLLING, THE CAMPAIGN, AND THE WHOLE 18 ENVIRONMENT CAN ULTIMATELY, THE SUPPORT IS LOWER. WE HAVE ALSO 19 SEEN MANY MEASURES WHERE A CAMPAIGN CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE AND 20 INCREASE SUPPORT. SO MEASURE AA, THE RESTORATION AUTHORITY 21 MEASURE, THE POLLING WAS WHERE IT WAS, THE ULTIMATE BALLOT 22 OUESTION -- THE ULTIMATE ELECTION RESULTS WERE A LITTLE HIGHER 23 THAN THE POLLING. ALSO CALTRAIN, RECENT CALTRAIN SALES TAX 24 MEASURE. SO THERE IS NO GUARANTEE THAT A CAMPAIGN CAN MAKE THE 25

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DIFFERENCE AND INCREASE SUPPORT, BUT WE'RE JUST SAYING IT HAS 1 BEEN DONE. LAST PAGE THIS. IS THE END. LAST PAGE SHOWING A 2 3 COUPLE OF QUOTES FROM AN OPEN-ENDED QUESTION ASKING VOTERS WHY WOULD YOU SUPPORT A MEASURE, WHY WOULD YOU OPPOSE IT. SO, YOU 4 5 CAN SEE SOME OF THE RESPONSES IN VOTER'S OWN WORDS. AND I WILL 6 STOP THERE AND SEE IF ARE THERE ANY QUESTIONS. 7 8 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU, RUTH. ANY QUESTIONS FROM COMMISSIONERS BEFORE WE TAKE PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS ITEM? 9 DON'T SEE ANY. KIMBERLY ANY PUBLIC COMMENT ON 6A? 10 11 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: YES. WE DO HAVE ONE SPEAKER WITH A CARD 12 FOR ITEM SIX. THAT IS DAN PLEASE APPROACH THE PODIUM. 13 14 SPEAKER: GREAT. THANK YOU. MY NAME IS DAN CEDIK. I'M AN 15 16 ENVIRONMENTAL ADVOCATE. I BELIEVE IN STICKS BUT I BELIEVE ALL THE INFORMATION YOU CAN PROJECT IN THE FUTURE HERE I HAVE A 17 BIT MORE INFORMATION THAN YOU DO, I FILED CPRAS AND GOT BACK 18 TEN STATISTICS DOCUMENTS FROM EMC ON THIS, IN NOVEMBER THIS 19 BOND IS GOING TO FAIL BY 3.8%. MISS ECKLUND HAD IT RIGHT WHEN 20 SHE ASKED WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WE DON'T -- IF WE FAIL? WHAT 21 HAPPENS IF WE FAIL? 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SPEAKER: GOOD MORNING I'M MARK JOFFE PUBLIC POLICY ANALYST 2 3 BASED IN WALNUT CREEK WHILE THE \$20 BILLION BOND MEASURE YOU'RE CONSIDERING TODAY WILL RAISE PROPERTY TAXES FOR BAY 4 5 AREA HOMEOWNERS AND RENTERS OVER 50 YEARS IT WILL DO SURPRISINGLY LITTLE TO CREATE AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN THE NEAR-6 TERM. AS WE SAW WITH LOS ANGELES'S PROPOSITION HHH, IT TAKES 7 8 SEVERAL YEARS FOR BOND FUNDED UNITS TO BE APPROVED, BILL, AND OPEN TO RESIDENTS. FURTHER WHILE THE NEWLY CREATED UNITS WILL 9 OFFER BELOW MARKET RENTS, THE COST OF BUILDING THEM IS LIKELY 10 TO BE HIGH. TO GET AN IDEA OF EXACTLY HOW HIGH, WE CAN LOOK AT 11 GOVERNMENT FUNDED HOUSING IN THE BAY AREA, CONSIDER, FOR 12 EXAMPLE, THE PROJECT THAT 3300 MISSION STREET IN SAN 13 14 FRANCISCO, WHICH IS BEING BUILT WITH FUNDING FROM THE MAYOR'S 15 OFFICE OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT. DO I NOT BELIEVE THIS BOND 18 MEASURE IS A GOOD USE OF MONEY I BELIEVE IT WILL INCREASE 19 HOUSING COST FOR THOSE OF US WHO ALREADY LIVE HERE AND WHO 20 21 HAVE TO PAY PROPERTY TAXES OR PAY PROPERTY TAXES THROUGH OUR RENTS. AND I WOULD URGE YOU TO VOTE NO ON THIS MEASURE. THANK 22 23 YOU.

I DON'T SEE AN ORGANIZATION THAT'S DOING 14 SO WELL WITH THEIR CORE MISSION THAT EXPANDING THE PORTFOLIO 15 16 TO INCLUDE HOUSING IS A GREAT IDEA. FROM '72 TO 2019, PRECOVID, TRAFFIC CONGESTION INCREASED 96% IN SAN 9 FRANCISCO/OAKLAND, AND 300% IN SAN JOSE. THE COST OF 10 RECONSTRUCTION OF THE EAST SPAN OF THE BAY BRIDGE INCREASED 11 2600%. BASED ON THIS RECORD OF PERFORMANCE, HOW DID MTC GET 12 PUT IN CHARGE OF HOUSING? WE ASK FOR A NO VOTE. YOU ARE NOT 13 SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR TRANSPORTATION, BUT WHO ELSE DO WE 14 15 BLAME? THANK YOU.

SPEAKER: HELLO. MY NAME IS MARCUS CROWLEY. THIS AFFORDABLE HOUSING BOND SOUNDS GOOD, SOUNDS FRIENDLY. BUILD AFFORDABLE HOUSING? SORT OF, SOUNDS LIKE LOW-COST HOUSING. BUT IT'S NOT LOW-COST HOUSING. AND BOND, THAT SOUNDS PRETTY FRIENDLY, ALSO, LIKE BOND OF FRIENDSHIP. BUT WHEN WE REALLY DISSECT THE WORDS,

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1 WHAT WE GOT IS GOVERNMENT SUBSIDIZED HOUSING WITH A TAX

2 HOWARD BEALL WHO MADE THE STATEMENT FOR US, I'M MAD AS HELL
3 AND I'M NOT GOING ON TAKE THIS ANYMORE. AND WE'RE GOING TO
4 STOP THIS. AND I KNOW COMMISSIONER SCHAFF WILL SAY, I HOPE
5 THERE IS GOING TO BE NO OPPOSITION TO THIS. LET ME TELL YA,
6 YOU'RE IN FOR A FIGHT, MISS SCHAFF. AGAIN, I ENCOURAGE YOU TO
7 VOTE NO ON THIS. THANK YOU.

SPEAKER: GOOD MORNING. MY NAME IS RON BROWN. I AM A MEMBER OF 13 THE MARIN ORGANIZING COMMITTEE AND WE'RE PROUD TO BE MEMBERS 14 15 OF BAY AREA HOUSING FOR ALL AND HOUSING FOR ALL MARIN 16 COALITIONS. IN CALIFORNIA WE'RE MORE THAN WILLING TO PUT MONEY INTO CASE MANAGEMENT BUT 23 IT DOESN'T MATTER BECAUSE THERE IS NO HOUSING. MARIN'S 24 25 SKYROCKETING RENTS ARE ESPECIALLY HARD ON OUR SENIORS WITH

I BELIEVE IT WILL ALLOW LOCAL OFFICIALS TO INVEST IN THE COMMUNITY AND PROVIDE MUCH NEEDED 17 AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN A CRITICAL HOUSING CRISIS. WE 12 HAVE TEN OR SO OPPORTUNITIES THAT WE OPERATE IN MOUNTAIN VIEW, 13 IN THE CITY OF SUNNYVALE, ABOUT THE SAME NUMBER IN THE CITY OF 14 15 SAN JOSE. WE LOOKED UP THE WAIT LIST NUMBERS FOR THESE 10,000 16 HOMES WE OPERATE IN EVERY COUNTY OF THE BAY AREA, AND IT'S 100,000. SO, I JUST WANTED TO SHARE EXPRESSION OF DEMAND 17 THERE. I ALSO WANT TO RESPOND TO SOMETHING I HEARD EARLIER, 18 WE'RE NOT GOING TO START ENTITLING PROJECTS NOW. WE HAVE 19 ENTITLED PROJECTS NOW THAT CANNOT GET FINANCED THROUGH THE 20 21 SYSTEM. 1300 UNITS THAT MID-PEN ALONE HAS ENTITLED AND WAITING TO GO. BECAUSE SO MANY OF YOU HAVE WORKED ON ADVANCING 22 ENTITLEMENTS FOR SPECIFIC PROJECTS YOU KNOW EACH ONE TAKES A 23 THOUSAND ACTS OF LOVE FROM BOTH YOU AND YOUR STAFF TO GET 24 ACROSS THE FINISH LINE. HERE IT'S READY TO GO. BECAUSE I COME 25

GOOD MORNING. I WANT TO SAY THE BIGGEST PROBLEMS THAT I SEE WITH THIS BOND IS 17 THERE IS NO DEFINITION FOR AFFORDABILITY. YOU HAVE IT UP TO 18 140% AMI, 150% AMI. IF I CAN TELL YOU IN MY CITY, 120% AMI, 19 ONE BEDROOM, ONE BATH AT APPROXIMATELY 600 SQUARE FEET IS 20 RENTING FOR \$5,200, THAT'S 100% AFFORDABLE PROJECT THAT'S ALL 21 120% AMI. SO, WHEN I'M LOOKING AT THIS AND YOU HAVE NO CLEAR 22 DEFINITION THAT IT IS ACTUALLY ADDRESSING THE AFFORDABILITY 23 ISSUE, THE AFFORDABILITY HOUSING ISSUE, THEN WE'RE NOT GOING 24 TO BE SOLVING THE HOMELESSNESS PROBLEMS THAT YOU ARE CLAIMING 25

AT EH HOUSING, WE OPERATE AS ONE OF 18 THE LEADING NON-PROFIT AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPERS WITH OVER 19 2500 UNITS THROUGHOUT THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA SERVING SENIORS 20 VETERANS AND RECENTLY UNHOUSED AND MANY LOW-INCOME FAMILIES 21 THE BAY AREA HOUSING FOR ALL BONDS TODAY WILL PROVIDE STABLE 22 HOUSING FOR OVER 500,000 LOW-INCOME RESIDENTS OVER THE COMING 23 DECADES AND WILL ADDRESS THE IMMEDIATE NEEDS OF OUR MOST 24 25 VULNERABLE POPULATIONS. WILL 23 I BE ABLE TO LIVE IF A PLACE I DESERVE, SO I HAVE A LIFE THAT 24 OTHER PEOPLE HAVE. THE SO, I URGE YOU, PLEASE, CONSIDER THEM, 25



WHO YOU, OR YOUR LOVED ONE, WHO HAVE BEEN SERVED BY THEM, ONE 1 2 WAY OR THE OTHER, THAT THEY HAVE NO WAY TO PAY FOR HOUSING. AND I AGREE WHEN YOU FUND AFFORDABLE, MAKE IT LOWER, TO GET 3 THEM IN 15% OR EVEN LOWER BRACKET OF AMI. THANK YOU. 4 5 6 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU. 7 8 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: JEFF MITCHELL FOLLOWED BY CHRIS 9 COUPLINGS, KEN CHAN, A BUT, PARDON MUSS PRONUNCIATION, LESLIE 10 RODRIGUEZ, AND STEVE LANGSTON. 11 SPEAKER: GOOD MORNING MY NAME IS JAY MITCHELL, I AM A LEADER 12 WITH FAITH AND ACTION IN THE EAST BAY. 24 HABITAT MEMBER OF COALITION WE SUPPORT THIS BOND AS PART OF
25 COMPREHENSIVE EFFORT AROUND PROTECTING TENANTS AND RENTERS,

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AGAINST DISPLACEMENT AND PRESERVING AFFORDABLE HOUSING THIS 1 BOND REPRESENTS AN IMPORTANT STEP IN PUBLIC INVESTMENT THAT 2 BUILT EVERY COMMUNITY IN THE BAY AREA. OUR 3 ORGANIZATION SERVES OVER 31 CITIES IN SAN MATEO, SAN FRANCISCO AND MARIN COUNTIES AND WE SUPPORT THE PASSAGE OF THIS MEASURE. 4 5 HABITAT HAS A LONG HISTORY OF BUILDING HOMES FOR LOW-INCOME FIRST TIME HOME BUYERS ACROSS THE REGION, TATE, AND GLOBE. WE 6 ARE PROUD TO BE ONE OF THE MOST TRUSTED AFFORDABLE HOUSING 7 8 DEVELOPERS IN THE REGION. WE'RE COMMITTED TO FINDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL WHICH IS WHY I REMAIN CEO OF THIS AMAZING NON-PROFIT FOR OVER 4 5 15 YEARS. WE MUST DO BETTER AND WORK IN SOLIDARITY, OUR EDUCATORS, FIRST RESPONDERS AND LOCAL FAMILIES WORKFORCE 6 DESERVE ACCESS TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND STABLE HOUSING AMONG 7 8 OUR COLLEAGUES I SPEAK IN SUPPORT OF PLACING BAHFA ON THE NOVEMBER BALLOT PROVIDING SIGNIFICANT INVESTMENTS TO ADDRESS 9 OUR HOUSING CRISIS. 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FRANKLY, WE NEED TO MAKE SURE THAT THE PROPER LABOR CONDITIONS 1 2 ARE IN THIS. WE NEED A PLA, AND I KNOW WE'RE WORKING TOWARD 3 THAT BUT IT NEEDS TO HAPPEN. THE BUILDING TRADES HAS THE LARGEST PRIVATE SECTOR SCHOOL IN THE COUNTY THAT COSTS THE 4 5 PUBLIC NOTHING. THE BUILDING TRADES IS A GOOD JOB THAT CAN AFFORD COST 7 8 OF HOUSING SO LET'S GET THIS DONE LET'S MAKE SURE THAT OUR YOUNG PEOPLE IN CONSTRUCTION HAS A GOOD PROGRAM FOR THEM TO 9 GET LIFE-LONG LEARNING PROGRAM THAT'S MIDDLE CLASS FAMILY 10 INCOME. SPEAKER: GOOD MORNING. I'M CATHERINE HEDGES A SAN JOSE 18 RESIDENT AND MEMBER OF CATALYZE SB. I'M A SUPPORTER OF BAHFA 19 ON THE NOVEMBER BALLOT BECAUSE I WANT TO LIVE IF A BAY AREA 20 21 WHERE EVERYONE HAS A SAFE AND AFFORDABLE PLACE TO LIVE. I MYSELF HAVE LIVED IN LIHTC AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND I WOULD LIVE 22 IN MY CAR IF I DIDN'T HAVE THIS BECAUSE THERE IS NO PLACE I 23 CAN AFFORD IN THE ENTIRE COUNTRY ON SOCIAL SECURITY. THAT IS 24 THE FACT WHY SENIORS ARE AN EXAMPLE OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT 25

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GROWING SEGMENT OF OUR UNHOUSED POPULATION. BAHFA EXTREMELY 1 LOW-INCOME LEVELS HELP THOSE INCOMES WHO DON'T RISE TO THE 2 3 MEDIAN INCOME SANTA CLARA MEASURE SAN JOSE MEASURE FUNDING ARE BREAKING GROUND BEING COMPLETED EVERY MONTH HERE IN SANTA 4 5 CLARA COUNTY. WITHOUT THIS FUNDING MANY, MANY MORE -- YOU KNOW, THOUSANDS MORE PEOPLE COULD BE UNHOUSED IN THE AREA. BUT 6 IT'S NOT ENOUGH, AND WE NEED TO HAVE MORE HOUSING WHERE RENTS 7 8 ARE NOT PART OF THE REAL ESTATE INVESTMENT TRUST WHERE HOUSING IS A COMMODITY. WE NEED THE HOUSING COMMUNITY LAND TRUST OR 9 COMMUNITY AT-LARGE PLEASE PUT THE BAHFA ON THE BALLOT. THANK 10 YOU VERY MUCH. 11 12 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: BARRY SMITH FOLLOWED BY RICHARD GALLOW. 13 14 SPEAKER: CAN YOU HEAR ME NOW? 15 16 17 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: YES.

I HAVE 22 NOTICED THREE THINGS. I'M GOING TO CITE MY EXPERIENCE AT INTEL 23 WHERE I WAS PART OF THE TEAM THAT INTRODUCED THE MICRO 24 PROCESSOR AND THEN LATER AT APPLE WHERE I WAS PART OF THE TEAM 25 THAT DEVELOPED THE MACINTOSH. THERE ARE THREE THINGS THAT I METROPOLITAN
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HAVE OBSERVED FROM TECH COMPANIES IN TERMS OF PRODUCTS THAT

WIN, SUCCEED, AND THOSE THAT FAIL. THOSE THAT WIN HAVE THESE 2 3 CHARACTERISTICS. ONE, IT'S A GREAT PRODUCT IDEA; TWO, THE LEADERSHIP TEAM IS SUPERB; AND, THREE, THERE IS AN INCREDIBLE 4 5 FOCUS. SO, AS I LOOK AT THIS PROPOSAL, I THINK IT'S A GREAT 6 PRODUCT IDEA. WHEN I LOOK AT THE LEADERSHIP TEAM, I HAVE TO SAY I HAVE VERY LITTLE CONFIDENCE IN MTC. THEY HAVE 7 8 UNDERPERFORMED FOR DECADES, AND I DON'T TRUST THEIR ABILITY TO EXECUTE. AND THEN, THIRD, WITH FOCUS, THIS IS COMBINING 9 10 AFFORDABLE HOUSING WITH LABOR STANDARDS. LABOR STANDARDS DON'T NEED TO BE THERE. SO, WHAT I WOULD RECOMMEND IS HAVE AN 11 INDEPENDENT AUDIT OF BAHFA, SO WE KNOW THAT IT'S BEING MANAGED 12 ___ 13 14 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU. YOUR TIME. THANK YOU. 15 16 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: RICHARD GALLOW FOLLOWED BY COLIMA. 17 18 SPEAKER: GOOD MORNING, EVERYONE. THIS IS RICHARD GALLOW. I AM 19 A VOLUNTEER WITH RESIDENT UNITED NETWORK KNOWN AS RUN, WHERE 20 21 WE'RE A STATEWIDE HOUSING ADVOCACY ORGANIZATION OF INDIVIDUAL LIVING IN A PORTABLE HOUSING SUPPORTIVE AFFORDABLE HOUSING 22 COMMUNITIES THROUGHOUT THE STATE I'M A VOLUNTEER WITH HOUSING 23 NOW WHICH IS AN ADVOCACY ORGANIZATION IN SUPPORT OF AFFORDABLE 24 HOUSING IN OUR COMMUNITY. I TRULY BELIEVE THIS CAN BE DONE 25

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ONLY IF IT'S DONE RIGHT. WE NEED TO INCLUDE UNFORTUNATELY 1 2 DESIGN FEATURES IN ALL NEW POLICIES, INCLUDING AFFORDABLE 3 HOUSING THROUGH INCREASED ACCESSIBLE FOR SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES, BESIDES THE CURRENT STANDARDS WHICH 4 5 REGULATE THE MINIMUM AMOUNT REOUIRED. PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES NEED HOUSING. WE HAVE A LARGE PROPORTION OF UNHOUSED 6 COMMUNITIES THAT NEED ACCESSIBLE HOUSING. WE HAVE INDIVIDUALS 7 8 WITH DISABILITIES THAT WANT TO LIVE IN INDEPENDENT HOUSING, SO THAT HE OR SHE CAN LIVE IN THEIR OWN COMMUNITIES, NEAR THEIR 9 10 FAMILIES, FRIENDS, AND GO TO SCHOOL, WORK, AND VOLUNTEER DAY PROGRAMS WHERE THEY GO TO. THIS FUNDING MUST BE USED PRO 11 LABOR. WE NEED THEM TO BUILD OUR HOUSING. THEY NEED --12

15 CALIMA SALAHUDDIN FOLLOWED BY DELMA HERNANDEZ.

SPEAKER: HELLO. MY NAME IS CALIMA SALAHUDDIN CHAIR OF HOUSING 17 LEADERSHIP COUNCIL, MOTHER OF THREE ADULTS. HERE TO SAY 18 HOUSING SHOULD NOT BE A PRIVILEGE. I HAVE BEEN HOMELESS FOR A 19 YEAR BECAUSE I HAD TO CHOOSE BETWEEN SERVICES FOR MY SON AND 20 21 RENT. 16 YEARS LATER I'M FINDING AFFORDABLE HOUSING STABILITY FOR YOUR 27-YEAR-OLD SON WHO HAD TO WAIT FIVE YEARS TO FIND 22 AFFORDABLE HOUSING THAT HE COULD PAY FOR ON HIS SSI, AND THAT 23 WAS CONSIDERED LUCKY. SO NOW I KNOW THAT IF ANYTHING HAPPENS 24 TO ME, AND NOT HAVING THE BURDEN IF ANYTHING HAPPENS IT ME IF 25

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I SHOULD DIE WOULD MY SON BE OKAY AND I DON'T WANT ANY OTHER 1 PARENT TO HAVE THAT REALITY. BECAUSE 26-YEAR-OLD TWINS WHO 2 3 STILL LIVE WITH ME AND I'M READY TO BE AN EMPTY NESTER, Y'ALL, BUT WHERE CAN THEY GO? WE MOVE TO THE DREAM OF BUYING A HOME 4 5 JUST TO BE ABLE TO HAVE A ROOF AND I DON'T WANT TO MOVE THE NEEDLE ANYWHERE. SO, I THANK YOU FOR ALL THE WORK ON THIS. I'M 6 READY TO MOVE FORWARD, AND I HAVE TWO, LIKE I TALKED ABOUT, 7 8 THOSE 26 YEAR-OLD TWINS THEY'RE READY TO BE PHONE BANKED. 9 [LAUGHTER] THANK YOU SO MUCH.

SPEAKER: THANK YOU VERY MUCH MY NAME IS DELMA. I WANT TO THANK 14 15 YOU SO MUCH FOR ALL THE WORK AND COMMITMENT I AM AN ORGANIZER 16 WITH COMMUNITY LAND TRUST BASED IN SAN JOSE, THE FIVE-YEAR ORGANIZATION CREATES AND EXPANDS COMMUNITY CONTROL OF THE LAND 17 IN ORDER TO PROVIDE AFFORDABLE HOUSING TO COMMUNITY RESIDENTS 18 WE COVERED FIRST PROPERTY EARLY IN YEAR, BUILT IN 1929 IT HAS 19 DIFFERENT MAINTENANCE IT'S FOURPLEX LOCATED IN DOWNTOWN SAN 20 21 JOSE. CURRENTLY HOME FOR RESIDENTS VETERANS, ONCE WE ACQUIRED 22 THE BUILDING WE GOT TO WORK ON REHABILITATION AND THE 23 NEIGHBORHOOD IS EXPERIENCING RAPID -- THIS AREA IS EXPERIENCING RAPID REGENTRIFICATION, THIS IS AN EXAMPLE 24 PRESERVATION WORKS. I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT IT WAS NOT EASY TO 25

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ACQUIRE WEED STREET BECAUSE OF LACK OF FUNDING SOURCES IT TOOK
 US TWO YEARS TO ACQUIRE IN THAT TIME SPAN FOR POTENTIAL
 DEVELOPERS AND LENDERS WE HAD TO ORGANIZE GRASSROOTS CAMPAIGN
 TO RAISE MORE THAN FIVE HELPED THOUSAND DOLLARS SO THE BAY
 AREA AFFORDABLE HOUSING BOND WILL BE KEY TO PRESERVE MORE
 BUILDINGS LIKE REID STREET. THANK YOU SO MUCH.

SPEAKER: GOOD MORNING COMMISSIONERS AND STAFF I'M KEITH BROWN 11 FROM ALAMEDA LABOR COUNCIL WE'RE DEDICATED TO THESE JOINT 12 EFFORTS TO EXPAND AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND CREATE HIGH OUALITY 13 JOBS I URGE TO YOU VOTE IN FAVOR TODAY AND ALSO CALLING FOR 14 15 AFFIRMATION ON BAHFA STAFF'S COMMITMENT TO COLLABORATE WITH 16 SENATOR CORTESE ON SB735. THIS COLLABORATION IS CRITICAL TO ADVANCING OUR SHARED GOALS. WE SUPPORT INITIATIVES THAT 17 INCREASE HOUSING AVAILABLE IN THE BAY AREA WHILE PROVIDING 18 CAREER -- FAMILY SUSTAINING CAREERS FOR WORKERS, ESPECIALLY 19 THOSE FROM HISTORICALLY UNDER SERVED COMMUNITIES. PROJECT 20 21 LABOR AGREEMENTS ARE A PROACTIVE APPROACH TO ENFORCING 22 PREVAILING WAGE AND CREATING A PATHWAY TO THE MIDDLE CLASS. 23 THESE AGREEMENTS ARE CRITICAL FOR FOSTERING OUALITY JOBS AND STABLE COMMUNITIES. HOWARD WONG: HOWARD WONG, MEMBER OF THE POLICY ADVISORY

8 SPEAKER: I'M TIM FRANK EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF CENTER FOR SUSTAINABLE NEIGHBORHOODS WE'RE SUPPORTIVE OF THIS MEASURE SAN 9 FRANCISCO SUSTAINABLE NEIGHBORHOODS SUPPORTS POLICIES THAT 10 PROTECT AND HELP BUILD SUSTAINABLE NEIGHBORHOODS IN REGIONS. 11 IT'S CRITICAL COMPONENT WE NEED BOTH AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND 12 OUALITY JOBS AND THIS MEASURE WILL PROVIDE BOTH. ADINA LEVIN: HELLO. ADINA LEVIN, MTC POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL, 7 8 SPEAKING FOR MYSELF. I COFOUNDED LOCAL AND SUBREGIONAL ORGANIZATIONS SUPPORTING IMPROVING HOUSING AFFORDABILITY IN 9 MENLO PARKS REALLY WANTING TO WORK WITH OTHERS TO HAVE A 10 COMMUNITY THAT CAN SUPPORT MANY PEOPLE WITH MANY DIFFERENT 11 INCOME LEVELS AND INCLUDING PEOPLE WHO REALLY STRUGGLE IN THE 12 BAY AREA WITH A HOUSING AFFORDABLE CRISIS. AS MANY PEOPLE 13 MENTIONED, THIS BOND IS NOT THE ONLY SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEM 14 15 BUT IT'S A CRITICAL PIECE OF LEGISLATION SO THANK YOU VERY 16 MUCH TO THE COMMISSION, AND ALL OF THE GOVERNING BODIES, 17 STAFF, ALL NON-PROFITS, ALL COMMUNITY MEMBERS AND ALL WORK THAT'S GOING INTO OUTREACH TO HELP PASS THIS REGIONAL MEASURE. 18 THANK YOU. 19

REBECCA LONG: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ, SENATOR CORTESE 14 HAS INTRODUCED SB735 I BELIEVE IT'S IN ASSEMBLY HOUSING AND 15 16 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE TODAY. AND I ACTUALLY DON'T KNOW THE DISPOSITION OF IT TODAY. THE BILL DOES INCLUDE 17 PROJECT LABOR AGREEMENT REOUIREMENTS, ARE STARTING WITH BART 18 THEN IT KIND OF TIERS OFF WITH ALTERNATIVES THAT WOULD BE 19 SUBJECT TO APPROVAL OF BAHFA AND THE BUILDING TRADES. SO, THAT 20 21 THE STATUS OF THAT BILL. THE COMMISSION, BAHFA ABAG DOESN'T HAVE A POSITION ON THAT BILL. IT'S NOT CONSISTENT WITH THE 22 LABOR STANDARDS THAT ARE INCORPORATED IN THE EXPENDITURE PLAN, 23 AND IT'S, YOU KNOW, SOMETHING THAT WE'RE BASICALLY TRACKING. 24 WE DO PLAN TO COME BACK TO THE LEGISLATION COMMITTEE IN JULY 25

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AND AS YOU KNOW, THE COMMISSION AND ABAG DIRECTED STAFF TO 1 PURSUE LEGISLATION THIS SESSION THAT WOULD ALLOW US TO IMPOSE 2 LABOR STANDARDS ON THE 80%. AND, SO THAT'S STILL SOMETHING 3 THAT WE'RE TRACKING. YOU KNOW, POTENTIALLY AS SB735 IS STILL 4 5 SUBJECT TO NEGOTIATION, THAT MAY GET FOLDED INTO THAT BILL. SO, IN SUMMARY, I WOULD SAY, YOU KNOW, IT'S INFLUX. WE'RE 6 TRACKING IT, AND WE PLAN TO COME BACK TO THE LEGISLATION 7 8 COMMITTEE IN JULY WITH AN UPDATE. I'M SORRY. DID YOU HAVE A SECOND OUESTION ABOUT THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS AND THE 9 CITIZEN'S OVERSIGHT PIECE. WE HAVE BEEN WORKING CLOSELY WITH 10 THEM ON DEVELOPING, YOU KNOW, VERY STRONG STANDARDS THERE. I 11 DON'T KNOW, KATE MIGHT HAVE MORE OF A SPECIFIC UPDATE ON THAT 12 13 PIECE.

14

15 KATE HARTLEY: YES. WE ARE COMMITTED TO CREATING A STRONG 16 ROBUST INDEPENDENT, TRANSPARENT PROCESS WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF 17 A CITIZEN'S OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE. WE ARE CURRENTLY COLLECTING 18 BEST PRACTICES OF CITIZEN'S OVERSIGHT COMMITTEES THROUGHOUT 19 THE REGION SO THAT WE CAN DISTILL THEM DOWN AND MAKE 20 RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE ELEMENTS OF THE COMMITTEE TO THE 21 BOARDS.

22

23 CINDY CHAVEZ: THANK YOU. AND JUST AS A FOLLOW-UP, AND REALLY,
24 THIS IS TO THE CHAIR AND PERHAPS OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, I DO
25 THINK THE ALIGNMENT AROUND -- AROUND THE SENATE BILL IS REALLY

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CRITICAL. AND I THINK THAT COULD CAUSE SOME CONFUSION AND 1 CONCERN DURING THE PROCESS. AND I ALSO JUST WANT TO SAY, DO 2 3 YOU THINK THAT ROBUST OVERSIGHT IS REALLY AN IMPORTANT THING, AND THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS HAVE MADE ME PAINFULLY AWARE OF 4 5 THAT, AND I AM SURE THEY HAVE WITH YOU AS WELL, AND I THINK THEY'RE NOT WRONG IN TERMS OF GIVING CONFIDENCE TO PROCEED. 6 ONE REQUEST I WOULD MAY IS THAT AT THE NEXT AVAILABLE MEETING, 7 8 I WANT TO BETTER UNDERSTAND OUR WORK WITH SENATOR CORTESE ON THE SB2035 -- IS IT 2035? 735. THANK YOU. WITH THAT, AND ALSO 9 MORE CONCRETELY WHAT ARE WE GOING TO BE DOING RELATIVE TO 10 OVERSIGHT IN THE NEXT COMING MONTHS. I WANT TO SAY TO MY 11 COLLEAGUES, I KNOW A NUMBER OF YOU HAVE BEEN WORKING ON THIS 12 FOREVER, AND JUST TO SAY, YOU KNOW, THANK YOU. THESE ARE 13 REALLY, REALLY TOUGH PROJECTS TO GET ACROSS THE FINISH LINE, 14 AND I KNOW WE'RE NOT CLOSE, BUT EACH MILESTONE IS VERY 15 16 SIGNIFICANT. SO I ALSO WANT TO SAY THANK YOU TO STAFF AND TO MY COLLEAGUES WHO PLAYED A LEADERSHIP ROLE IN THIS AND OUR 17 NON-PROFIT PARTNERS AND THE LABOR MOVEMENT AND FRANKLY I WANT 18 TO RESPOND TO ONE PERSON WHO SAID THAT EVERYBODY SPEAKING 19 TODAY WAS SPEAKING FOR A UNION OR HAD SOME SELF-INTEREST. I 20 THINK THE INTEREST PEOPLE HAVE IS HAVING A GREAT COMMUNITY 21 THAT EVERYBODY CAN AFFORD TO LIVE IN AND STAY IN. AND I THINK 22 THAT'S REALLY WORTHY OF OUR VOTE AND SO I'LL BE SUPPORTING 23 TODAY. THANK YOU. 24

CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU. COMMISSIONER RONEN THEN 1 2 COMMISSIONER FLEMING. 3 HILLARY RONEN: THANK YOU SO MUCH. AND I KNOW POLITICIANS 4 5 ALWAYS SAY THEY WILL BE BRIEF AND SPEAK FOREVER BUT I WILL BE BRIEF OUT OF RESPECT FOR YOU ALFREDO. 6 7 8 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: 90 SECONDS. 9 HILLARY RONEN: EXACTLY [LAUGHTER] I JUST COULD NOT TAKE THE 10 OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK BECAUSE I THINK THIS IS ONE OF THE MOST 11 SIGNIFICANT VOTES I HAVE EVER TAKEN IN MY CAREER, AND THAT'S 12 SAYING A LOT. HOUSING SHOULD BE A HUMAN RIGHT. BUT SADLY, IT'S 13 NOT. AND OUR FEDERAL GOVERNMENT HAS FAILED TO ADDRESS ONE OF 14 THE BIGGEST ISSUES IN OUR COUNTRY. AND TODAY, THIS BODY IS 15 16 GOING TO GIFT VOTERS OF THE BAY AREA AN OPPORTUNITY TO STEP IN WHERE OTHERS HAVE FAILED AND TO GO A LONG WAY TOWARDS FIXING 17 THIS ISSUE. I THINK IT'S PROFOUND. I THINK IT'S AMAZING. I 18 THINK IT'S EXCITING. AND LIKE COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ SAID, WE ARE 19 ALL INTERCONNECTED. SO, YOU KNOW, IT'S CRIME, AND 20 21 HOMELESSNESS, AND DRUG ADDICTION, AND MENTAL ILLNESS, ALL OF 22 THE ISSUES THAT AFFECT ALL OF US AND ARE SOLVED WHEN WE ARE ABLE TO PROVIDE STABLE HOUSING TO EVERYONE IN OUR COMMUNITY 23 AND IT'S A HISTORIC DAY; IT'S A HISTORIC VOTE. AND I JUST 24 THANK EVERYONE WHO'S WORKED SO HARD TO GET US HERE. 25



1 2 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: COMMISSIONER FLEMING. 3 VICTORIA FLEMING: THANK YOU, CHAIR. I HAVE RARELY BEEN SO GLAD 4 5 TO SIT THROUGH SO MANY HOURS OF PUBLIC COMMENT. IT'S HEARTENING TO HAVE THE PUBLIC FORUM WHERE PEOPLE CAN COME 6 TOGETHER WORKING ON THIS FOR YEARS AND YEARS, HOUSING, LABOR 7 8 KNOW UNIONS BUSINESS PEOPLE, STAFF, IT'S CERTAINLY NOT A PANACEA FOR ALL OF OUR PROBLEMS BUR IT IS A CATALYST FOR 9 SOLVING SOME OF OUR HISTORICAL CHALLENGES. AND WE HAVE JUST 10 DISINVESTED IN OUR COMMUNITY -- OUR MOST NEEDED COMMUNITIES, 11 AND WITH THE ASPECTS OF PRESERVATION AND PROTECTION, THIS 12 GIVES US A CHANCE. IT GIVES US AN OPPORTUNITY TO DO SOMETHING 13 DIFFERENT. THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTIES WILL CHOOSE WHETHER OR 14 15 NOT WE MOVE IT IN NOVEMBER. AND WHAT WE SEE IN OTHER HOUSING 16 MODELS IS WE SEE THE OPPORTUNITY TO CHANGE THINGS FOR US. I'M LOOKING AT KATE AND DANIEL AND I KNOW HOW MUCH YOU HAVE POURED 17 INTO THIS ALONG WITH YOUR STAFFS, AND WE'RE SO GRATEFUL. BUT 18 THE THING IS, THAT DIDN'T REALLY GET MENTIONED TODAY, AND I'LL 19 BE BRIEF. IT WILL BE UNDER 90 SECONDS, I PROMISE, IS THAT THE 20 THING THAT DIDN'T GET TALK ABOUT TODAY THAT IS SUBSTANTIALLY 21 IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST IS THE PUBLIC BANKING FUNCTION OF THIS 22 BOND. THIS IS GOING TO BE TRANSFORMATIONAL. THIS WILL GROW ON 23 ITSELF AND WE WILL, IF THE VOTERS ALLOW US, SHOW THE PEOPLE OF 24 25 THE REGION THE STATE AND BEYOND WHAT IT IS THAT WE CAN DO WHEN

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WE CHOOSE TO INVEST, TURN OUR INVESTMENTS BACK TO THE PEOPLE,
 RATHER THAN TO OUR CORPORATE INTEREST WHEN IT COMES TO PUBLIC
 INTEREST AROUND HOUSING. SO, THANK YOU ALL FOR YOUR VISION AND
 FOR USING BEST PRACTICES IN THE NATION AND BEYOND. I'LL BE
 VOTING YES TODAY, AND IN NOVEMBER.

7 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER FLEMING.

8 COMMISSIONER SPERING, AND THEN COMMISSIONER SCHAFF.

JAMES P. SPERING: I'M VERY SUPPORTIVE OF PUTTING THIS ON THE 10 BALLOT, BUT I COUNTED ABOUT 85 SPEAKERS AND THERE WAS ONE 11 SPEAKER THAT STOOD OUT TO ME AND THAT WAS MISS YOUNG FROM SAN 12 FRANCISCO. AND WE CANNOT OVERLOOK THE IMPACT IT'S GOING TO 13 HAVE ON PEOPLE THAT ARE JUST GETTING BY THAT ARE IN THEIR 14 15 HOUSE, WE'RE ADDING MORE TAXES. AND THERE ARE THOUSANDS OF 16 THOSE INDIVIDUALS IN THE REGION. AND SO AS WE MOVE FORWARD, WE HAVE GOT TO MAKE SURE THEY ARE PROTECTED. I HEARD SOME OF THE 17 SPEAKERS, YOU'RE GOING TO MAKE IT WORSE. AND HER PASSION, THE 18 IMPACT THIS WOULD HAVE ON HER FAMILY, I HOPE EVERYBODY HEARD 19 THAT. GO FORWARD AND SAY WELL IT'S A FALL OUT. IT CAN'T BE A FALL
 OUT WE HAVE TO BE AWARE OF THOSE INDIVIDUALS AND WHAT THEY'RE
 FACING.

I WANT 19 TO UNDERSCORE NEVADA MERRIMAN'S REFERENCE TO 1,000 ACTS OF 20 21 LOVE AND I HOPE THIS CAMPAIGN REPRESENTS 1 MILLION OR 20 BILLION ACTS OF LOVE, INCLUDING RESPECTFUL LISTENING TO THE 22 ANGER AND FRUSTRATION THAT WE HEARD ON ALL SIDES TODAY. THANK 23 YOU FOR ALLOWING ME TO CONTINUE TO SERVE ON THIS COMMISSION AS 24 25 HUD'S APPOINTEE. I THINK YOU COOPERATE GET RID OF ME, JUST



LIKE JIM SPERING, IN PART, [LAUGHTER] SO FAR THAT WE COULD BE
 HERE FOR THIS DAY, THIS MOMENT, THIS VOTE. THANK YOU.

WHAT AUTHORITY? 14 15 THEY HAVE ONE AND YOU CAN GO AROUND WE REPORT TO SERVICES 16 ABOUT PROBLEMS IN THE BUILDING AND SINCE MOST PEOPLE IN ADVISORY BOARD ARE PEOPLE WHO MAKE PROBLEMS, THEY'RE NOT 17 INTERESTED IN STOPPING THE SECURITY ISSUES AND SMOKING OR GET 18 BETTER REPAIRS OR BETTER MAINTENANCE OR MANAGEMENT OR HAVE 19 STAFF HERE WHEN THEY SHOULD BE. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. 20
