THIS IS 14 15 ITEM 6A RM3 ORIENTATION AND OVERVIEW THIS MAY BE REPEAT INFO 16 FOR MANY BUT WE THOUGHT IT WOULD BE USEFUL AS THIS COMMITTEE RESETS FOR THE NEXT YEAR. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO, AS A 17 REMINDER, ON THE RM3 BACKGROUND, VOTERS APPROVED A \$3 TOLL 18 INCREASE ON STATE OWNED BRIDGES TO BE PHASED IN OVER SIX 19 YEARS. THAT FULL \$3 TOLL INCREASE IS IMPLEMENTED AS OF JANUARY 20 21 1ST OF THIS YEAR. RM3 INCLUDES AN EXPENDITURE PLAN WHICH IDENTIFIES CAPITAL AND OPERATING INVESTMENTS TO BE FUNDED WITH 22 RM3 REVENUES WITH GOAL OF IMPROVING THE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM 23 REGION-WIDE. WHILE LEGAL CHALLENGES DELAYED RELEASE OF RM3 24
