EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

ABAG Executive Board January 20, 2022

KEY HIGHLIGHTS FOR JANUARY 2022:

Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA)

Starting in October 2019 with the convening of the Housing Methodology Committee (HMC), ABAG members, staff, and other stakeholders have embarked on an extended process to approve the Final Regional Housing Needs Allocation for Cycle 6.

RHNA is the state-mandated¹ process to identify the number of housing units (by affordability level) that each jurisdiction must accommodate in the Housing Element of its General Plan. The California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) determined Bay Area communities must plan for 441,176 new housing units from 2023 to 2031.

From September 24th, 2021 to October 29th, 2021 the ABAG Administrative Committee conducted public hearings to consider the RHNA appeals from several local jurisdictions. On November 12th, 2021, the Administrative Committee ratified a written final determination on each appeal.

The ABAG EB adopted the final RHNA plan on December 16th, 2021 and staff just received notice from HCD that they have given their final approval. HCD's review has determined that the RHNA plan is consistent with HCD's housing need determination for the ABAG region.

Congratulations on a job well done for the region and to staff who have done a phenomenal job navigating this complicated process!

BayREN

The California Public Utilities Commission approved the BayREN 2022-23 budget of over \$47 million that will directly benefit the Bay Area by funding energy-efficiency retrofit incentives for property owners and renters; electrification projects; job creation in the green economy; a water efficiency program; support for small businesses; and support for jurisdictions to meet their climate goals.

BayREN is also working on a new Business Plan, due in February, that will include a new workforce program aimed at job training and placement for youth from low-income communities, in partnership with the Rising Sun Center for Opportunity; two new public sector programs to support electrifiying municipal facilities; and a program that will replace high-GHG-emitting refrigerants in small businesses.

Background:

Since 2013, the Bay Area Regional Energy Network (BayREN) has implemented a portfolio of energy efficiency programs across the region. The Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) serves as the program administrator and lead agency for a 10-member unincorporated association of local government entities.

On May 31, 2018, the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) issued Decision 18-05-041¹ which among other things, authorized funding for BayREN through 2025, allowed for modifications to the existing portfolio, and increased the portfolio's total and annualized budget. While the CPUC has authorized BayREN's funding through 2025, an Annual Budget Advice Letter (ABAL) – which supersedes D.18-05-041 – is required to be submitted each year to the CPUC. For calendar years 2022 and 2023, the CPUC has directed program administrators to file a consolidated Biennial Budget Advice Letter (BBAL).

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) – as directed by the CPUC – is the fiscal agent for BayREN. The CPUC has also allowed PG&E and BayREN to negotiate contract terms independent of the CPUC. ABAG and PG&E currently have a contract for funding through December 2022 or FY 2022-23. The overall BayREN budget is developed each calendar year and the contracts have historically been amended on an annual basis or as needed.

In its 2022-2023 BBAL, BayREN requested an increase of approximately \$1.7 million to its previously approved calendar year 2022 budget. On January 3, 2022, the CPUC approved BayREN's BBAL. The increase, and subsequent 2023 budget primarily seek to:

- Sustain current levels of incentive funding for the nationally recognized Multifamily program.
- Augment funding for the Water Upgrades \$ave program to enable additional enrollment of municipal water utilities.
- Augment funding for the Green Labeling program, which assigns single family homes a Home Energy Score and provides training and resources for real estate professionals.
