RE: BATA Financial Statements for February 2019

Attached are the BATA financial statements for the eight month period ending February 2019. Major financial highlights include:

- (1) **Revenues**: Total toll bridge revenue is just under \$576 million or 97% of the budget projections. Total interest revenue earned of \$35.7 million is 143% of the total budget as the result of a higher interest rate market. Year-to-date (YTD) toll violation revenue of \$15.6 million is slightly below the budget. YTD subsidy payments from the U.S. Government to offset the interest expense of the Build America Bonds is at \$18.6 million and the next subsidy payment is expected in April.
- (2) **Expense:** Total operating expense of \$240 million is 27% of the approved budget. Operations and facility maintenance costs are running at 96% of the adopted budget and are expected to be very close to budget by year-end. Fastrak® operations and maintenance costs have a bit more room at 44% YTD but year-end still looks close projecting to 97% of the \$51 million adopted budget. Debt service payments appear low, however, the major debt service payment will be made in April bringing costs much closer to budget.
- (3) Transfers to MTC and Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG): The budgeted annual 1% administration fee for MTC and operating contribution to the ABAG Estuary Partnership were transferred at the beginning of the fiscal year. The balance of the transfers are generally made on a drawdown basis.

This memorandum requests authorization to amend BATA's contract with BKF Engineers (BKF) to provide on-call design services for the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge (SFOBB) Touchdown Parking Project (Project) in an amount not to exceed \$284,000 and extend the period of Performance to no later than June 1, 2020.

#### **Background**

The Project will construct a parking lot between the new east span of the SFOBB and the Bridge Yard Building to provide access to the Bay Bridge Trail. The Project will provide 67 parking spaces, will fulfill public access permit requirements for the SFOBB east span seismic replacement project and provide additional parking for the future park. The Project will require a new bridge crossing of an existing eight-foot diameter sewer outfall and will import fill to meet new roadway elevations. The lot has been designed in coordination with Caltrans, the East Bay Regional Parks District (EBRPD), and the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission (BCDC).

In January 2014, the BATA Oversight Committee authorized the Executive Director to enter into contracts with eight firms, including BKF, to provide on-call design services. Following a competitive selection among the firms, this Committee authorized a contract with BKF to provide design services for the Project in May 2017.

#### **Scope of Work – This Amendment**

Staff is requesting the Committee authorize a contract amendment with BKF for an additional \$284,000 for additional design work for the Project. The additional funds will pay for: design of added features, including the addition of new ADA accessible restroom facilities; re-packaging the Project for construction under an existing Caltrans construction contract in the area to save on construction costs and avoid conflicts; and additional design support during construction.

Attachment A includes a summary of BKF and its project team's small business and disadvantaged business enterprise status related to the work described in this memorandum.

This memorandum requests Committee approval to enter into a cooperative agreement with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000, to provide Quality Management Assessment (QMA) during the environmental, design, and right-of-way phases of Dumbarton Forward. BATA will reimburse Caltrans for eligible QMA costs associated with projects in the state right-of-way.

#### **Background**

The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), in partnership with the Alameda and San Mateo congestion management agencies, transit agencies, cities/counties, and businesses, conducted a Dumbarton Forward Design Alternatives Assessment of the Dumbarton Bridge corridor to identify innovative near-term strategies to address traffic flow, increase person throughput and manage transportation demand. MTC prepared a Project Study Report-Project Development Support (PSR-PDS) that is currently circulating for signature approval by Caltrans. Project elements include:

- Peak Period Bus on Shoulder (BOS) Pilot Program
- Signalization Improvements to Bayfront Expressway Intersections
- Reconfiguration of Eastbound SR 84/Thornton Avenue Off-Ramps
- Relocation of Ardenwood Park-Ride Bus Stops
- Improvements to Operations at the Dumbarton Bridge Toll Plaza

With the completion of the PSR-PDS, staff has determined that BATA should fund and implement the project delivery phase, which includes environmental clearance, design plans, and construction.

#### Recommendation

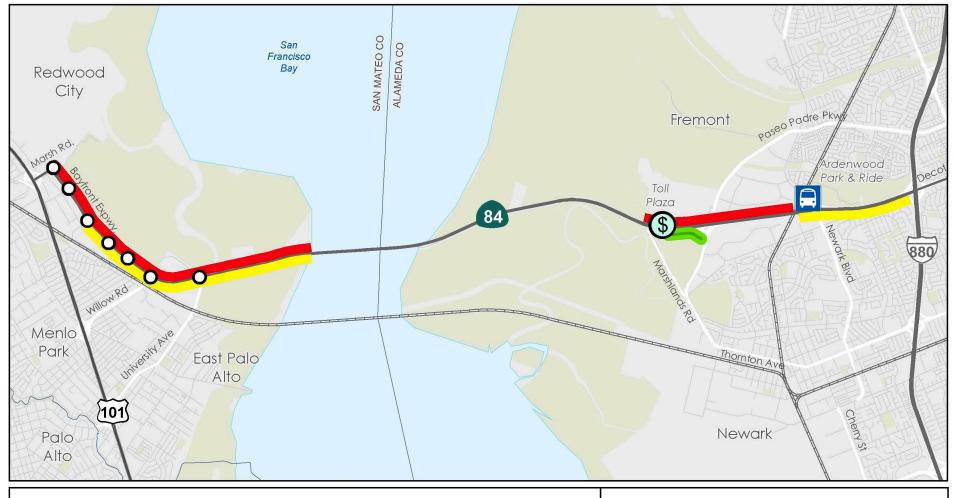

This item would authorize the Executive Director or designee to negotiate and enter into a contract amendment with Ghiradelli Associates, Inc. (Ghiradelli) (\$150,000) and a contract with WSP, Inc. (WSP) (\$350,000) to support the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge (SFOBB) Metering Lights Project, and a contract with Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. (Kimley-Horn) (\$750,000) to support the Dumbarton and San Mateo-Hayward Bridge Metering Lights Project.

#### **Background**

BATA and California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) District 4 are working jointly to upgrade the metering lights at the SFOBB and to activate existing metering lights at the Dumbarton and San Mateo-Hayward bridges. The projects will modernize both system hardware and software metering components and provide several redundant layers to increase system reliability and performance during periods of congestion on the bridges, and improve person throughput by providing more reliable and faster travel times for buses, vanpools and carpools. In addition to being a traffic management tool, the new Metering Lights system will have the functionality to hold back traffic lanes, thus, allowing CHP and Caltrans to respond to incidents.

#### San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge Metering Lights

The SFOBB toll plaza is the convergence of 20 traffic lanes coming from Interstates 80, 580 and 880. The existing metering system was developed in 1974 by Caltrans to smooth the transition of the 20 approach lanes to the five lanes on the bridge. The system uses embedded loop detectors and off-pavement sensors to measure traffic flow and determine signal timing and last received minor improvements in 1980. BATA initiated and is delivering the project utilizing a number of consultants and contracts. The civil construction contract is scheduled to be advertised this spring. Construction is expected to be completed by the end of the year to be followed by testing of the new system in parallel with the old system to help ensure a smooth transition and activation in 2020. Staff is requesting two consultant support contracts for this project, as follows:

#### i. Contract Amendment - San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge: Ghiradelli (\$150,000)

Staff is requesting that the Committee authorize a contract amendment with Ghirardelli in an amount not to exceed \$150,000 for additional project controls, monitoring, and scheduling analysis services. Ghiradelli was originally selected as part of a competitively selective consultant bench to provide on-call construction management services in December 2013. Ghiradelli provided project scheduling support to coordinate

project delivery. BATA will require continuing project controls and scheduling support through the construction and testing phase of the project. Budgeted toll bridge rehabilitation funds will be utilized for the work.

#### ii. Contract – San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge: WSP (\$350,000)

Staff is requesting that the Committee authorize a contract with WSP in an amount not to exceed \$350,000 to provide construction management and resident engineering services. WSP was originally selected as part of a competitively selective consultant bench to provide on-call construction management services in December 2017. WSP will support BATA during construction of the civil package of the metering lights project, including new cabinets, connections, and improved detection and signals. Budgeted toll bridge rehabilitation funds will be utilized for the work.

#### **Dumbarton and San Mateo-Hayward Bridges Metering Lights**

The Dumbarton and San Mateo-Hayward bridges have existing metering light systems that were installed during prior bridge and toll plaza construction but never activated. BATA's objective, in conjunction with Caltrans, is to activate the metering lights with modern in-lane equipment and systems and use them as a traffic and incident management tool. The goal for the project is to have the metering lights ready for activation by early 2020 to coincide with opening of the new express lanes on I-880 and Dumbarton Forward projects.

Staff is requesting that the Committee authorize a contract with Kimley-Horn in an amount not to exceed \$750,000 to provide design services to activate the metering lights on the Dumbarton and San Mateo-Hayward bridges. Kimley-Horn was originally selected as part of competitively selective consultant bench to provide on-call design services in December 2017. Under a separate contract, Kimley-Horn is providing design support on the SFOBB metering light projects. Staff recommends Kimley-Horn to provide the same services for the Dumbarton and San Mateo-Hayward bridges, including the Concept of Operations, System Engineering Management Plans and System Requirements, and environmental documentation to satisfy NEPA/CEQA requirements. Budgeted toll bridge rehabilitation funds will be utilized for the work. Additional system integration and construction contracts will be needed in the future with other contractors to complete buildout of the Project.

Attachment A includes a summary of each firm's project team's small business and disadvantaged business enterprise status.

#### Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Committee authorize the Executive Director or designee to negotiate and enter into a contract amendment with Ghiradelli in an amount not to exceed \$150,000, a contract with WSP, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$350,000 and a contract with Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$750,000 for project support services for the toll bridge metering light projects.

This memorandum requests authorization to amend BATA's contract with WSP USA Inc. (WSP) to provide additional toll bridge asset management program support services for the Richmond-San Rafael (RSR) Bridge, for an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000.

#### **Background**

On April 11, 2018, this Committee approved the selection of a panel of pre-qualified consulting firms to provide on-call asset management program support for the seven state-owned toll bridges ("Bridges") as the result of a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) issued by staff.

On October 10, 2018, this Committee authorized a contract with WSP for an amount not to exceed \$800,000 to provide asset management support for the RSR Bridge as the result of a mini-RFQ issued by staff. With these funds, WSP will develop an asset management plan incorporating performance gap, life-cycle, and risk management analyses. The mini-RFQ scope also made provision for focused studies of bridge systems and/or elements and maintenance procedures to identify opportunities to improve effectiveness of the bridge's life-cycle maintenance and rehabilitation projects.

On March 4, 2019, BATA and Caltrans committed to Senator Mike McGuire and Assembly Member Marc Levine to analyze the bridge's structural capacity to accommodate on the upper deck a third westbound lane for peak period traffic, with a movable barrier system for a bicycle and pedestrian path during non-peak hours.

#### **Contract Amendment**

Since the start of the assessment last fall, BATA has identified the need for two studies to be performed on the bridge: a load rating study and a deck condition study.

The load rating study will both: 1) Fulfill a Federal Highway Administration requirement of Caltrans; and 2) Evaluate the bridge's structural capacity to accommodate a third westbound traffic lane with a movable barrier system on the upper deck. The load rating would be completed in two phases: 1) Modeling of the as-built condition, including the 2006 seismic retrofit of the bridge; and 2) Accounting for structural degradation or effects of corrosion, where identified in existing inspection reports. The analysis will account for proposed changes to lane configurations, and is expected to take 12-18 months to complete.

The deck condition study will inform on the need for deck rehabilitation and replacement, which Caltrans has identified as future high-cost projects in the Toll Bridge Rehabilitation Program. In the context of the asset management plan, the goal is to optimize which deck projects move forward when, relative to hypothetical timeframes for replacing the bridge. WSP will scan the deck using various vehicle-based non-destructive tests: ground-penetrating radar; infrared thermography; high-resolution video; and digital acoustic response. WSP will post-process the data and provide plan views of the upper and lower decks and a report identifying areas of concrete degradation.

WSP's proposal includes scanning the other state-owned toll bridges without post-processing the data; the testing equipment will be mobilized in the Bay Area and the cost of collecting the data is only approximately one-tenth of the deck study with post-processing being the more costly part of the effort. This will provide raw data of a snapshot in time that can then be post-processed and compared with data collected in the future, should the need arise.

While the deck study is useful in determining the condition of the majority of the deck, it would not have discovered the conditions that led to the February 7<sup>th</sup> deck joint failure that closed the bridge in both directions as that joint was covered by steel plates. BATA has committed to replacing over the next year the 61 joints that date to the span's original construction.

Staff recommends amending the contract with WSP to fund the completion of a load rating and deck study of the RSR Bridge. Staff recommends including a contingency of 15 percent, equal to \$200,000, for this work. Funding will come from the BATA Toll Bridge Rehabilitation Program. The cost of work is estimated as follows:

This memorandum requests that the Committee authorize the Executive Director or designee to negotiate and enter in to a contract amendment with AECOM Technical Services, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$12,500,000 for on-call design services to provide environmental and design services for the State Route 37 Interim Traffic Congestion Relief Project (Project), subject to amending the BATA long-range plan to include the Project and approval of future BATA budgets.

#### **Background**

State Route 37 (SR 37) is a 21-mile highway from US 101 in Novato, Marin County to I-80 in Vallejo, Solano County. In December 2018, Caltrans approved a Project Initiation Document (PID) that includes the purpose and need, scope and assessment of costs, schedule and risks for SR 37 Segment B between SR 121 and the Mare Island interchange. BATA, Caltrans and the four North Bay Congestion Management Agencies (CMAs) are ready to advance improvement projects into the project development and delivery phase. Given that travel demand exceeds the capacity of the 2-lane segment between SR 121 and the Mare Island interchange, the agency partners will start with preparing the environmental review and design for the Project which adds capacity with either the addition of a contraflow lane (3-lane highway) or conversion of the shoulder into a travel lane (4-lane highway).

Since 2016, MTC has led the development of the corridor plan, design alternative assessment for Segment B, environmental stakeholder outreach, and the PID for Segment B. More recently, to leave open the possibility of using federal funds, MTC issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQs) to BATA's on-call design bench for environmental and design services for the Project. At this juncture, however, MTC will transition out of the Resilient SR 37 Program and staff recommends that BATA step in as the contracting agency, in accordance with the approved MOU The MOU contemplates amending legislation to include SR 37 into the BATA enterprise of toll crossings. This scope of work gives BATA an opportunity to perform its due diligence and to understand the costs, risks and viability of SR 37 prior to deciding to support inclusion in the BATA enterprise.

#### **Consultant Selection Process**

In December 2017, after a competitive procurement, the BATA Oversight Committee authorized the Executive Director to enter into contracts with eight firms, including AECOM, to provide on-call design services. On January 22, 2019, MTC issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) to all eight pre-qualified firms to provide design and environmental services for the SR 37 Interim/Traffic Congestion Relief Project. On February 19, 2019, staff received Statements of Qualifications (SOQs) from three of the eight firms in response to the RFQ. AECOM, Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc., and T.Y. Lin International submitted SOQs.

A panel consisting of staff from MTC, Caltrans and Napa, Sonoma and Solano CMAs performed a review and evaluation of the SOQs based on each firm's qualifications and specific experiences, including proposed project manager and key staff, project understanding, staff resources to achieve an expedited schedule, and communication, in descending order of importance. After SOQs were reviewed, all three firms were interviewed. Based on the combined scores from the written SOQs and the interviews, the evaluation panel unanimously ranked AECOM as the top-ranked team. T.Y. Lin was ranked second, and would be suitable to perform the work should BATA fail to enter into an agreement with AECOM. The panel's final ranking is below. Attachment A includes AECOM and its project team's small business and disadvantaged business enterprise status.
