

Bridge Traffic & BART Ridership: 2020 vs 2019 Weekdays














Transportation Recovery Plan: Goals


- Protect the health and safety of SFMTA employees and the public.

- Adapt transportation infrastructure and services to best serve San Francisco in the long term.





Transportation Recovery Plan History









Equity and Service Frequencies

When traffic congestion returns, service frequency will be forced to drop an additional 10% if transit is not protected from delay



2021 Equivalent Capacity


Since our vehicles can only carry a third of what they did in January, this will feel like a 70% service cut.

Time savings during Shelter In Place









