- 8 KATHLEEN LAI: REVIEWING FINANCIAL STATEMENT AUDIT FOR ACFA,
- 9 AND DIFFERENT AND DISTINCT FROM ABAG WE CONDUCTED OUR AUDIT IN
- 10 ACCORDANCE WITH GENERALLY ACCEPTED AUDITING STANDARDS. WE DO
- 11 ANTICIPATE REPORTING UNMODIFIED OPINION, EXCELLENT NEWS CLEAN
- 12 OPINION FOR THE YEAR WE DIDN'T HAVE ANY SIGNIFICANT
- 13 DEFICIENCIES OR MATERIAL WEAKNESSES DURING OUR AUDIT. WE'LL GO
- 14 OVER THE REQUIRED COMMUNICATIONS AS NOTED A LITTLE BIT SIMPLER
- 15 FOR THIS ENTITY COMPARISON TO ABAG BUT AGAIN MANAGEMENT
- 16 POLICIES PROCEDURES AND LIKEWISE, ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES
- 17 INCLUDED ACCURATE WITHIN THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS, NO FINDINGS
- 18 NOTED TO REPORT TO THE COMMITTEE TODAY, NEXT SLIDE, ACCOUNTING
- 19 STANDARDS NONE IMPACTED ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT AUDIT.
- 20 PLEASED TO REPORT WE DIDN'T HAVE ANY MATERIAL CORRECTED OR
- 21 UNCORRECTED MISSTATEMENTS RELATED TO THE AUDIT. LAST BUT NOT
- 22 LEAST.

SUZANNE BODE: THANK YOU. LET'S BRING UP MY SLIDE DECK, PLEASE. 2 3 I WANT TO THANK, BOTH, THE CROWE TEAM AND THE MTC TEAM FOR ALL THE HARD WORK IN PRODUCING TIMELY AUDITS. IT'S NOT ONLY THIS 4 5 ONE. AS YOU KNOW, THERE IS MANY OF THEM. SO YOU CAN BRING UP MY NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. AND THIS IS JUST -- OOPS. YEAH. SO THIS 6 IS JUST TO ECHO THE FACT THAT THIS IS 2020, WE HAVE BEEN 7 8 BASICALLY TAKING RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE DIRECT OVERSIGHT OF THE FINANCIALS AND PREPARATION FOR ALL FINANCIAL REPORTS IN 9 10 CONDUCTING THE AUDIT. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. ON THIS SLIDE, I WANTED TO COVER JUST A FEW KEY POINTS. SO ON THE STATEMENT OF 11 NET POSITION, BALANCE SHEET, BASICALLY NET POSITION DECREASED 12 BY 23,000 MERELY ATTRIBUTED TO THE CHANGE IN CASH INVESTMENTS 13 DUE TO WINDING DOWN AND BASICALLY A FLAT INVESTMENT OF CONDUIT 14 15 DEBT BONDS IN COMPARING TO LAST YEAR, WHICH HAD 83 CONDUIT 16 DEBT ARRANGEMENTS THIS ONE ONLY HAS 70. WE DECREASED TO 70 IN FY '22. THIS'S IMPACTING NOT ONLY THE REVENUE BUT ALSO THE 17 EXPENSES AND WE'LL SEE THAT IN THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO, ON 18 THIS SLIDE, BASICALLY, YOUR REVENUE EXPENSES AND CHANGES IN 19 FUND BALANCE, BASICALLY THE REVENUE DECREASED BY 22% AGAIN 20 21 ATTRIBUTED TO DECREASE IN THE OVERALL PROGRAM, COSTS ADMINISTER STIFFS SOME COSTS FIXED SOME VARIABLE BY FINANCIAL 22 SERVICES ONCE AGAIN IF THERE ARE NO NEW BORROWERS THOSE COSTS 23 DECREASE REVENUE DECREASE, AND LIKEWISE ON THE EXPENSE SIDE 24 OPERATING EXPENSE WOULD DECREASE WITH FEWER BONDS TO 25



1	ADMINISTER, PROFESSIONAL SERVICES DECREASED AND ASSOCIATED
2	WITH THE CONDUIT DEBT IF THERE IS LESS DEBT TO ADMINISTER
3	SERVICE FEES GO DOWN THERE WAS CONTRIBUTION FROM ACFA TO ABAG
4	OF 300,000 AND THAT WAS AN ITEM APPROVED BY THE BOARD TO
5	SUPPORT ABAG ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS AND HAD THAT NOT BEEN DONE
6	YOU WOULD HAVE A POSITIVE NET CHANGE OF 177,000 AS OPPOSED TO
7	THE 288,000 YOU SEE CURRENTLY AND ACTUALLY AN INCREASE IN THE
8	PRIOR YEAR FOR YOUR NET POSITION, I WANTED TO CALL THAT OUT IF
9	YOU HAD RESTRICTED TO NET ACTIVITIES YOU WOULD HAVE HAD A
10	SLIGHTLY DIFFERENTLY AMOUNT. NEXT SLIDE. THAT'S IT JUST A
11	BRIEF OVERVIEW. THERE WERE ANY QUESTIONS FOR KATHY OR MYSELF?
12	
13	KAREN MITCHOFF, CHAIR: COLLEAGUES? I JUST WANTED TO MAKE SURE
14	THAT WE'RE STILL AND I ALWAYS LOOK TO MR. PAUL, BECAUSE HE
15	WAS PART OF PUTTING THIS ALL TOGETHER. WE'RE STILL IN A GOOD
16	FINANCIAL POSITION, EVEN NO WE DON'T HAVE AS MANY CONDUITS. I
17	THINK THAT'S WHAT YOU REFER TO THEM. IS THAT DO YOU THINK,
18	JUST A FUNCTION OF THE FACT OF COVID AND DIFFERENT THINGS? OR
19	ARE WE JUST I KNOW WE DON'T HAVE, I GUESS, THE SALES TEAM
20	OUT THERE GETTING AS MANY THINGS. ANY COMMENT MR. PAUL?
21	
22	BRAD PAUL: YOU SUMMARIZED IT QUITE WELL. OUR COMPETITIVES
23	OFFERED A FLEXIBILITY THAT WE HAVE NOT BEEN ABLE TO. YOU COULD
24	DECIDE TO DO THIS, BUT THEY BASICALLY MEET EVERY WEEK. SO IF
25	THERE ARE PEOPLE THAT NEED TO DO A DEAL QUICKLY. THEY



1	BASICALLY CLEAR THEIR CALENDARS EVERY WEEK AT THE SAME TIME.
2	AND SO TO BE COMPETITIVE WITH THOSE EFFORTS YOU WOULD HAVE TO
3	SET-ASIDE AN HOUR EVERY WEEK FOR THE REST OF THE YEAR, AND I
4	THINK THAT'S A LITTLE UNREALISTIC. THERE ARE SOME OTHER IDEAS
5	WE HAVE. AND WE CAN COME BACK TO YOU LATER ABOUT HOW WE MIGHT
6	MARKET IT DIFFERENTLY. WE'RE WAITING TO GET BACK THE BUSINESS
7	PLAN FOR BAHFA IT'S GOING TO LOOK AT ISSUES ABOUT THE ABILITY
8	OF CONDUIT FINANCING AND WHAT BAHFA MAY DO AND THE ROLE GOING
9	FORWARD.
