THANK YOU. NEXT UP 11 REBECCA IS GOING TO GIVE US AN UPDATE. I HEARD WE JUST HAD AN 12 ELECTION. 13 14 REBECCA LONG: THANK YOU, VICE CHAIR LICCARDO, AND COMMITTEE 15 16 MEMBERS. REBECCA LONG, MEMBER DIRECTOR OF LEGISLATION AND AFFAIRS. WE HAD A RECENTLY ELECTION, FEELS LIKE A LONG TIME 17 AGO ALREADY. WE ARE GOING TO SEE SOME CHANGES IN DC, IN 18 CONGRESS DEMOCRATS HAVE CONTROL OF THE SENATE AND DESPITE THE 19 CHANGE ANNOUNCED JUST WITHIN THE LAST 24 HOURS WITH RESPECT TO 20 21 SENATOR SINEMA WHO IS NOW GOING TO BE AN INDEPENDENT, THAT 22 DOESN'T CHANGE DEMOCRATS HAVING CONTROL OF THE COMMITTEE 23 CHAIRMANSHIPS. SO JUST SOME INTEL THERE. LOOKING AT OUR CONGRESSIONAL AND BAY AREA DELEGATIONS. WE HAVE ONE CHANGE IN 24 25 CONGRESS, AND THAT IS FORMER ASSEMBLYMEMBER KEVIN MULLIN WHO

- 2 NOW MOVING TO CONGRESS TO FEEL IN THE ESTEEMED SHOES OF HIS

- 4 NEW MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATURE, INCLUDING ASHA WAHAB WHO WAS
- 5 ON THE HAYWARD CITY COUNCIL, ON THE SENATE SIDE REPLACING WHAT
- 6 WAS LARGELY OF COURSE WE HAVE REDISTRICTING NOW -- SENATOR
- 7 WOCHOWSKI SEAT. AND THEN, OF COURSE, OUR OWN DAMON CONNOLY
- 8 MOVING TO REPLACE ASSEMBLYMEMBER LEVIN'S SEAT IN MARIN COUNTY
- 9 AND SOUTH PENINSULA, LIZ ORTEGA, ASSEMBLY DISTRICT 20; SHE WAS
- 10 SERVING AS THE STATEWIDE POLITICAL DIRECTOR FOR ASK ME. DINA
- 11 PAPAN, SISTER TO OUR COMMISSIONER GINA PAPAN, DISTRICT 21, AND
- 12 GAIL PELLERIN WHO WAS THE FORMER SANTA CRUZ COUNTY CLERK ON
- 13 SOUTHERN PORTION OF SANTA CLARA COUNTY ASSEMBLY DISTRICT 28.
- 14 CONGRATULATIONS. WE HAVE SENT LETTERS TO NEW MEMBERS.
- 15 DEFINITELY LOOKING TO DO SOME EARLY OUTREACH TO INTRODUCE
- 16 THOSE WHO AREN'T FAMILIAR WITH MTC AND ABAG AND GET OUT THERE
- 17 SHARING OUR ADVOCACY PRIORITIES TO THEM. WITH THE MEASURES
- 18 WITH THEM. THE REST HIGHLIGHTS LOCAL MEASURES. WE HAVE A LOT
- 19 OF MEASURES ON THE BALLOT, BOTH ON THE POLICY AND FUNDING
- 20 SIDE. CONGRATULATIONS, MAYOR SCHAFF, ON THE CITY OF OAKLAND,
- 21 BOND MEASURE, SIGNIFICANT INFUSION OF NEW FUNDING FOR
- 22 AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND TRANSPORTATION MEASURE U. AND OUR
- 23 PRESIDENT OF ABAG IS NOT WITH US TODAY, BUT CONDOLENCES ON THE
- 24 HARD LOSS IN THE CITY OF BERKELEY, DESPITE 59% SUPPORT THAT
- 25 AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND INFRASTRUCTURE BOND COULD NOT PASS DUE



- 1 TO THE TWO THIRD'S THRESHOLD. MAYBE WE'LL FIX THAT ONE OF
- 2 THESE DAYS. SAN FRANCISCO HAD A BIG WIN WITH THEIR SALES TAX.
- 3 IT'S A TOUGH TIME TO PASS THINGS WITH OVER 2/THREES. BUT THEY
- 4 DID GET 72% SUPPORT FOR THE EXTENSION OF HALF CENT SALES TAX
- 5 AND THIS IS REALLY IMPORTANT FOR OUR PRIORITY PROJECTS
- 6 ESPECIALLY FOR DOWNTOWN CALTRAIN EXTENSION DTX AND BART CORE
- 7 CAPACITY. THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING AUTHORIZATION THAT IS
- 8 REQUIRED UNDER THE CONSTITUTION WERE ALL PASSED IN BERKELEY,
- 9 OAKLAND, AND SOUTH SAN FRANCISCO, ARTICLE 34, AND THEN ALSO I
- 10 THINK A SIGNIFICANT MEASURE THAT TOOK A LOT OF ADVOCACY IN
- 11 MENLO PARK, THERE WAS A PROPOSAL TO BASICALLY REQUIRE THAT ANY
- 12 KIND OF CHANGES IN THE ZONING WITH RESPECT TO SINGLE-FAMILY
- 13 ZONING WITH RESPECT TO VOTER APPROVAL, THAT WAS NOT PASSED
- 14 WITH 62% OF MENLO PARK VOTERS REJECTED THAT RETAINING THE
- 15 ZONING AT THE CITY COUNCIL LEVEL. ONE BIG DISAPPOINTMENT SPLIT
- 16 VOTE AT MTC AND ABAG A CONTROVERSIAL MEASURE BUT WE DID ENDS
- 17 UP ENDORSING IT PROP 30 WHICH WOULD HAVE POURED A LOT OF
- 18 RESOURCES INTO THE 0 EMISSION TRADITION DID FAIL WITH 58% OF
- 19 VOTERS REJECTING IT INTERESTING LOOKING COUNTY BY COUNTY BREAK
- 20 DOWN SAN FRANCISCO VOTERS DID SUPPORT IT ALONG WITH SANTA CRUZ
- 21 AND MONTEREY COUNTIES AND THEN SOME INTERESTING ONES KIND OF
- 22 UP NORTH AND EAST. AND THEN A LOT OF GENERAL FUND MEASURES
- 23 PASSED THAT ARE ONLY SUBJECT TO A SIMPLE MAJORITY. AND, SO
- 24 MANY OF THESE REFERENCED STREET REPAIRS AND AFFORDABLE HOUSING
- 25 AS ELIGIBLE EXPENDITURES SO WE DID HAVE QUITE A FEW OF THOSE

- 14 FULL RANGE OF BAY AREA AGENCY PARTNERS TRANSPORTATION HOUSING
- 15 PARTNERS FROM AROUND THE REGION, THE STATE, AND THEN ALSO FROM
- 16 NATIONAL TRANSPORTATION AND HOUSING GROUPS. AND THEN YEAR WE
- 17 ALSO HAD A CHANCE TO SEEK INPUT FROM LEGISLATIVE STAFF IN
- 18 SACRAMENTO. SO, THE REVISIONS FROM THE FINAL TO THE DRAFT THAT
- 19 REFLECT A LOT OF THAT INPUT ARE SUMMARIZED IN YOUR COVER MEMO.

- 4 SO, JUST SOME GOOD NEWS ON THIS ITEM. NEXT ITEM THAT WE'RE
- 5 GOING TO DISCUSS IS THE BAY AREA HOUSING FINANCING AUTHORITY.
- 6 WE DID HEAR SOME REALLY STRONG SUPPORT FROM THE COMMITTEE FOR
- 7 THE PROPOSAL THAT WE AT MTC AND ABAG SPONSOR A BAHFA CLEAN-UP
- 8 BILL. ITEM A HERE. IT'S JUST A REMINDER ON THIS, SINCE
- 9 STANDING UP BAHFA, STAFF HAVE IDENTIFIED NUMEROUS STATUTORY
- 10 CHANGES THAT ARE GOING TO BE NEEDED IN ADVANCE OF A 2024
- 11 REGIONAL REVENUE MEASURE TO MAXIMIZE BAHFA'S FINANCING
- 12 POTENTIAL. SO, IN THIS ITEM, WE'RE CONTINUING TO RECOMMEND

ANY RESPONSE FROM 19 STAFF? OR SHOULD I MOVE ON? REBECCA. 20 21 22 REBECCA LONG: THROUGH THE CHAIR, I'LL TAKE A STAB AT A 23 RESPONSE. THANK YOU VICE CHAIR JOSEFOWITZ. THIS ISSUE DOES REMAIN A CHALLENGING ONE IN THE CONTEXT OF ONGOING LITIGATION 24 ESPECIALLY IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA. EVERYONE ON THIS COMMITTEE 25


