EMERGENCY DISASTER PREPAREDNESS AND RECOVERY ASSEMBLY HEARING 1 -- A LONG TITLE -- WHERE IT WAS CHAIRED BY ASSEMBLYWOMAN LORI 2 3 WILSON, WHOM MANY OF YOU KNOW WAS A MEMBER OF OUR ABAG HOUSING COMMITTEE AND THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD FOR A LONG TIME, AND 4 5 ALSO ASSEMBLYWOMAN MIA BANTA WAS PRESENT, AND IT WAS A REVIEW OF HOW WE ARE PREPARED TO DEAL WITH DISASTERS ON LAND, SEA, 6 AND IN THE AIR, BASICALLY. AND I WAS HONORED TO BE ABLE TO 7 8 PRESENT WHAT THE BAY AREA HAS DONE IN THIS SPACE. CERTAINLY, A LONG LEGACY, LARGELY BEGINNING AFTER LOMA PRIETA, AS YOU ALL 9 10 WELL KNOW, BUT REFINED OVER MANY DECADES AND INCLUDING MOST RECENTLY A LOT OF LESSONS LEARNED FROM THE FIRES THAT HAD 11 RAVAGED OUR REGION AND MUCH OF NORTHERN CALIFORNIA. SO, WE --12 IT WAS AN INFORMATIONAL HEARING, AND I WANT TO THANK, ALSO, 13 MTC'S EMERGENCY RESPONSE LEAD, STEVEN TARIN WHOEVER'S ALSO 14 15 PRESENT TO ADDRESS OUESTIONS. SO THAT WAS A NICE OPPORTUNITY TO SHOWCASE WHAT WE HAVE DONE IN THAT ARENA. ALSO, YOU KNOW, 16 17 MOVING QUICKLY, WE'LL BE HEARING ABOUT REAP 2.0. WE WILL REQUEST APPROVAL TO APPLY FOR NEARLY \$103 MILLION IN FORMULA 18 BASED STATE FUNDING THROUGH THE REGIONAL EARLY ACTION PLANNING 19 GRANTS OF 2021. AND, AGAIN, MANY THANKS TO THE GOVERNOR AND 20 THE LEGISLATURE FOR, YOU KNOW, ALLOWING US TO HAVE, YET, MORE 21 CRITICAL PLANNING FUNDING BOTH FOR HOUSING AND FOR 22 TRANSPORTATION. SO, YOU WILL HEAR MORE ABOUT THAT. THAT WAS 23 PRESENTED, I BELIEVE, AT OUR PROGRAMMING COMMITTEE. CLIPPER 24 25 BAY PASS PROGRAM, WE HAVE EXPANDED THE ELIGIBILITY OF THE

PROGRAM TO STUDY THE IMPACT OF A SINGLE PASS THAT WILL PROVIDE 1 2 UP TO 50,000 BAY AREA RESIDENTS FREE ACCESS TO NEARLY ALL BUS, 3 RAIL, AND FERRY SERVICES IN THE NINE COUNTY REGION, AND WE HAVE RECENTLY WORKED, COMMISSIONER RABBIT, WITH THE SANTA ROSA 4 5 COMMUNITY COLLEGE TO BE ABLE TO EXPAND THAT TO INCLUDE A LONGER TERM THERE FOR THE STUDENTS REGISTER. WE HAVE GOTTEN 6 INITIALLY INCREDIBLY POSITIVE RESPONSES TO THIS PILOT. WE'RE 7 8 COLLECTING DATA, AND WE'LL BE ABLE TO REPORT, YOU KNOW, THE OUTCOMES OF THAT. A VERY IMPORTANT PIECE OF OUR FARE 9 INTEGRATION WORK BEING CONDUCTED UNDER OUR TRANSIT 10 TRANSFORMATIVE ACTION PLAN. I'M TRYING TO AVOID ACRONYMS HERE. 11 AND, AGAIN, SOMETHING THAT WE, OUR CUSTOMER BASE SEEMS TO, 12 THOSE WHO ARE USING IT, REALLY VALUE. I WANT TO THANK 13 COMMISSIONER DORENE M. GIACOPINI, WHO, OCTOBER 19TH WAS PART 14 15 OF A METRO TALKS ACCESS FOR ALL WEBINAR. WE HOLD METRO TALKS 16 PERIODICALLY ON A NUMBER OF EQUITY RELATED BUSINESS IS, AND WE DISCUSSED AT THAT TIME WHY EQUITY REQUIRES THAT PUBLIC 17 AGENCIES DESIGN FOR PEOPLE WITH THE BIGGEST BARRIERS TO 18 ACCESS, OUR MOBILITY IMPAIRED FELLOW TRAVELERS, AND, WHY, IN 19 DOING THAT, YOU MAKE THE BETTER SYSTEM FOR EVERYONE. AGAIN, 20 MANY THANKS TO COMMISSIONER JOCK PIN I FOR PARTICIPATING 21 THERE. AND FINALLY WE HAVE BEEN PROVIDING INFORMATION TO YOU 22 ALTHOUGH YOU ARE PROBABLY ON TOP OF THIS AS MUCH AS ANYONE, ON 23 THE MID-TERM ELECTION RESULTS AND HOW THEY MANIFEST THEMSELVES 24

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ASSISTANCE PROGRAM THOSE FUNDS WERE PLANNING ORIENTED AND THIS 1 SECOND ROUND OF REAP FUNDS ACTUALLY GOES TO THE METROPOLITAN 2 3 PLANNING ORGANIZATION, SO IT GOES TO MTC.
