- 11 PROGRAM. UPDATE ON THE RESILIENT -- REQUEST APPROVAL TO SUBMIT
- 12 APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION TO
- 13 SERIOUS POINT MARY ISLAND PROJECTED RESILIENCE. I BELIEVE
- 14 KEVIN IS GOING PROVIDE THE REPORT.

- 16 SPEAKER: KEVIN CHEN, MTC STAFF. WE HAVE A POWERPOINT. I'LL
- 17 START WITH BY MENTIONING THIS IS A JOINT EFFORT BETWEEN MTC
- 18 CALTRANS NORTH BAY COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITIES INCLUDING
- 19 MARIN SONOMA SOLANO AND NAPA. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THIS SLIDE
- 20 SHOWS OVERVIEW OF THE HIGHWAY 37 CORRIDOR NORTHERN NON-
- 21 MOUNTAINOUS REGION EAST WEST CONNECTOR IN THE REGION 21 MILES
- 22 CONNECTING US 101 IN MARIN OVER TO I-880 IN SOLANO THE PORTION
- 23 BETWEEN 101 IS A FOUR LANE EXPRESS HIGHWAY LOWEST ELEVATION
- 24 ALONG THE CORRIDOR MOST PRONE SEASONAL FLOODING. BLUE BETWEEN
- 25 SERIOUS POINT AND MARRY ISLAND IS TWO LANE CONVENTIONAL



- 1 HIGHWAY CREATING SIGNIFICANT BOTTLENECK RESULTING IN DELAYS.
- 2 PORTION IN GREEN SAY FOUR LANE FREEWAY IN SOLANO COUNTY. I
- 3 WOULD LIKE TO MENTION HIGHWAY 37 IS A KEY CORRIDOR CONNECTING
- 4 AFFORDABLE HOMES ON THE EAST BAY SIDE TO JOB MARKETS IN MARIN
- 5 SONOMA COUNTIES HAVING AN EQUITABLE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM IS
- 6 CRITICAL. YOU CAN SEE ON THE MAP TOP RIGHT CORNER THERE IS
- 7 REALLY NO PRACTICAL ALTERNATE ROUTE TO HIGHWAY 37. TO THE
- 8 NORTH SIDE WE HAVE HIGHWAY 116, HIGHWAY 12 WHICH IS A
- 9 CIRCUITOUS ROUTE THEN RICHMOND SAN RAFAEL BRIDGE TO THE SOUTH
- 10 BOTH ROUTES RESULT IN AT LEAST TWICE IN TERMS OF LONGER TRAVEL
- 11 SERVICE, STATE ROUTE 37 DESIGNATED CRITICAL EMERGENCY ACCESS
- 12 RICHMOND SAN RAFAEL BRIDGE RETROFITTED TO A NON-COLLAPSE
- 13 STANDARD MEANS THAT IN THE EVENT OF EARTHQUAKE THERE IS NO
- 14 GUARANTEE THAT IT WOULD REMAIN OPEN FOR REGULAR TRAVEL, 37 IS
- 15 GOING TO BE CRITICAL FUNCTION TO EVACUATION EMERGENCY. THERE
- 16 ARE A NUMBER OF CHALLENGES TO ADDRESS THE CORRIDOR. FIRST AND
- 17 FOREMOST TRAFFIC CONGESTION VERY SIGNIFICANT HAPPENS ON A
- 18 DAILY BASIS 21 MILE CORRIDOR IT TAKES COMMUTERS UP TO 100
- 19 MINUTES TO GET HOME IN THE AFTERNOON PEAK 80 MINUTES OF DELAY.
- 20 NEXT FLOODING ON THE WESTERN PORTION OF THE CORRIDOR WHERE THE
- 21 LOW LAYING GROUNDS ARE. A PORTION OF THE CORRIDOR ALREADY
- 22 FLOODED TWICE IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS WHICH LEAD TO HIGHWAY
- 23 CLOSERS IN 2017 AND 2019 FOR A NUMBER OF DAYS. SEA LEVEL RISE
- 24 WITH ANTICIPATED RISING TIDES INUNDATION ON THE MAJORITY OF
- 25 THE CORRIDOR IS EXPECTED TO HAPPEN BY ABOUT MID-CENTURY. NEXT



- 1 PLEASE. SO WE HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH OUR PROJECT PARTNERS OVER
- 2 THE LAST FIVE YEARS AND DEVELOPED A RESILIENT STATE ROUTE 37
- 3 PROGRAM TO TACKLE SEA LEVEL RISE ADAPTATION TO PROVIDE A
- 4 MULTI-MODAL TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM TO ADDRESS THE EQUITY
- 5 CHALLENGE TO IMPROVE THE ECOLOGY OF THE SAN PABLO BAY LANDS
- 6 AND TO PROVIDE PUBLIC ACCESS ACCOMMODATIONS. NEXT SLIDE
- 7 PLEASE. SO TO ADDRESS THESE DIFFERENT ISSUES, WE HAVE BOTH
- 8 NEAR-TERM AS WELL AS LONG TERM SOLUTIONS. ON THIS GRAPHICS YOU
- 9 SEE THE TIME SCALE SHOWN ON THE BOTTOM GOING FROM LEFT TO
- 10 RIGHT AS TIME GOES ON, AND WE HAVE AN ILLUSTRATION SHOWING HOW
- 11 THE WATER RISES OVER TIME WHICH WOULD INVADE THE CORRIDOR
- 12 EXPECTED TO HAPPEN BY MID-CENTURY. WE ARE WORKING TOWARDS
- 13 DELIVERING THE LONG-TERM PROJECT BEFORE THAT HAPPENS. SO
- 14 THAT'S THE SR37 SEA LEVEL RISE ADAPTATION PROJECT BETWEEN 180
- 15 AND U.S. 101 SHOWN AS THE HORIZONTAL BAR AT THE BOTTOM. WE
- 16 RECOGNIZE AN URGENT NEED TO ADDRESS THE SEVERE TRAFFIC
- 17 CONGESTION AND THE EQUITY CHALLENGE THAT'S FACING US TODAY.
- 18 AND WE ARE TACKLING THAT WITH NEAR-TERM PROJECT BETWEEN
- 19 SERIOUS POINT AND MARE ISLAND. MAKING PROGRESS LONG-TERM
- 20 IMPROVEMENTS CONCURRENTLY RECOGNIZING THE LONG-TERM MEGA
- 21 PROJECT REQUIRE SUBSTANTIALLY MORE INVESTMENT AND WOULD TAKE A
- 22 LOT LONGER TO DELIVER. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THE NEXT FEW SLIDES
- 23 I'M GOING TO PROVIDE INFORMATION ON THE NEAR-TERM PROJECT
- 24 SEARS POINT AND MARE ISLAND ALSO KNOWN AS THE INTERIM PROJECT.
- 25 THE PURPOSE OF THIS PROJECT IS TO ADDRESS THE TRAFFIC



- 1 CONGESTION ON 37 CAUSED BY THE TWO-LANE SECTION IN THE MIDDLE
- 2 STRETCH SHOWN IN BLUE HERE. THAT'S ABOUT TEN MILES IN LENGTH.
- 3 WORTH MENTIONING, THERE IS NO TRANSIT SERVICE ON THIS CORRIDOR
- 4 WHICH LIMITS TRAVEL OPTIONS FOR COMMUTERS. WITH THIS PROJECT,
- 5 WE'RE LOOKING TO IMPROVE TRAFFIC FLOW, REDUCE PEAK TRAVEL
- 6 TIMES, AND IMPORTANTLY INCREASE VEHICLE OCCUPANCY BY
- 7 INCENTIVIZING THE USE OF CARPOOLING AND BUS TRANSIT. NEXT
- 8 SLIDE PLEASE. HERE ARE SOME OF THE KEY PROJECT COMPONENTS.
- 9 WE'LL BE PROVIDING HOV LANES. WE'LL BE IMPLEMENTING BUS
- 10 TRANSIT SERVICE AS WELL AS PROVIDING PUBLIC ACCESS
- 11 IMPROVEMENTS. THERE ARE ALSO ITS ELEMENTS TO BE PROVIDED AS
- 12 PART OF THE PROJECT WHICH WOULD BE REALLY CRITICAL IN MANAGING
- 13 INCIDENTS. WE'LL ALSO BE PROVIDING ECOLOGICAL ENHANCEMENTS.
- 14 THE PROJECT PROPOSES TO IMPLEMENT TOLLING AS SUBJECT TO
- 15 APPROPRIATE APPROVALS. THE IMPLEMENTATION OF TOLLING IS
- 16 CRITICAL IN TWO ASPECTS ONE IT PROVIDES A DIRECT SOURCE OF
- 17 FUNDING TOWARDS THE DELIVERY OF THIS PROJECT, AND, TWO,
- 18 TOLLING OR PRICING IS AN EFFECTIVE TOOL IN MANAGING TRAFFIC
- 19 CONGESTION ALONG WITH THE HOV LANE IT REALLY ENCOURAGES THE
- 20 USE OF CARPOOLING AND FOR FOLKS TO TAKE TRANSIT ON THIS
- 21 CORRIDOR. WHICH WOULD EFFECTIVELY REDUCE VEHICULAR TRIPS AND
- 22 WOULD REDUCE VMT WHICH IS A REGIONAL AND STATEWIDE GOAL. NEXT
- 23 PLEASE. IN SUMMARY WITH THE INTERIM PROJECT WE ARE ADDRESSING
- 24 SEVERAL KEY ISSUES ON THIS CORRIDOR IN THE NEAR-TERM. FIRST IS
- 25 EQUITY. THIS CORRIDOR CONNECTS HOMES IN THE EQUITY PRIORITY



- 1 COMMUNITIES ON THE VALLEJO SIDE OVER TO JOBS IN MARIN AND
- 2 SONOMA COUNTY. THERE'S A SIGNIFICANT EQUITY PROBLEM AS IT
- 3 EXISTS TODAY, BECAUSE COMMUTERS REALLY HAVE NO CHOICE BUT TO
- 4 GET STUCK IN TRAFFIC FOR UP TO 100 MINUTES TO GET HOME IN THE
- 5 AFTERNOON. SO WITH THIS PROJECT DELAY TIMES WILL BE REDUCED
- 6 SIGNIFICANTLY AND TRAVEL TIME RELIABILITY WILL BE IMPROVED. TO
- 7 FURTHER ADDRESS THE EQUITY CONCERNS, IT IS ALSO OUR INTENT TO
- 8 IMPLEMENT A MEANS BASED DISCOUNT PROGRAM, AGAIN, SUBJECT TO
- 9 ADDITIONAL APPROVALS. THIS PROJECT ALSO DELIVERS
- 10 SUSTAINABILITY. WE HAVE BEEN WORKING VERY CLOSELY WITH THE
- 11 RESOURCE AGENCIES AND HAVE IDENTIFIED TWO KEY OPPORTUNITIES ON
- 12 THIS CORRIDOR IN ORDER TO IMPROVE THE ECOLOGY. FIRST IS TO
- 13 ENHANCE THE STRIP MARSH EAST ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE HIGHWAY
- 14 IN SOLANO COUNTY WHICH WOULD IMPROVE SENSITIVE MARSH HABITATS
- 15 THAT'S RAPIDLY DEGRADING DUE TO DRAINAGE PROBLEMS THIS IS A
- 16 NATURE-BASED SOLUTION WHICH MAINTAINS SHORELINE EROSION BUFFER
- 17 AND ATTENUATES WAVE ENERGY AGAINST THE HIGHWAY. SECOND
- 18 COMPONENT IS ITOLIC CREEK BRIDGE LENGTHENING OR REPLACEMENT.
- 19 THIS WOULD ENHANCE THE ITOLIC CREEK TIDAL PRISM WHERE IT'S
- 20 HIGHLY CONSTRAINT DUE TO THE NARROW BRIDGE THAT'S OUT THERE
- 21 TODAY. THIS BRIDGE IS CRITICAL TO SUPPORTING THE SONOMA CREEK
- 22 BAY LAND STRATEGY RESTORATION THAT IS PLANNED TO THE NORTH
- 23 SIDE OF HIGHWAY 37. THERE IS ALSO A COMPONENT OF THE HIGHWAY
- 24 THAT WOULD BOLSTER THE EXISTING HIGHWAY AGAINST THE
- 25 [INDISCERNIBLE] FLOODING RISK. LAST BUT NOT LEAST MENTIONED



- 1 THE TOLLING COMPONENT OF THE PROJECT HELPS ENABLE FUNDING
- 2 WHICH WOULD GENERATE DIRECT FUNDING TOWARDS DELIVERY OF THIS
- 3 PROJECT. IT PROVIDES A RELIABLE FINISHED SOURCE TO SERVICE
- 4 MATCH FUND AS WE COMPETE FOR VARIOUS FEDERAL AND STATE GRANTS.
- 5 IT PROVIDES OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO CONTINUE TO MAKE PROGRESS
- 6 TOWARDS THE ULTIMATE OR LONG-TERM IMPROVEMENT PROJECT. NEXT
- 7 SLIDE PLEASE. SO, THE COST OF THIS PROJECT IS ESTIMATED AT
- 8 \$430 MILLION AND HERE SAY SUMMARY OF OUR CURRENT FUNDING PLAN
- 9 SUBJECT TO CHANGE. WE HAVE COMMITTED FUNDS THAT WOULD GET US
- 10 THROUGH THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW PROCESS, AS WELL AS A DESIGN
- 11 PHASE OF THE PROJECT. WE'RE COMPETING FOR A NUMBER OF STATE
- 12 AND FEDERAL GRANTS THAT CAN GO TOWARD THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE
- 13 PROJECT, INCLUDING FUNDING PROGRAMS UNDER SB1. WE ANTICIPATE
- 14 THERE IS A NEED TO FINANCE AGAINST FUTURE TOLL FUNDS ON
- 15 HIGHWAY 37 IN ORDER TO COMPLETE THE FUNDING PLAN WHICH IS
- 16 ESTIMATED AT \$74 MILLION RIGHT NOW. UNFORTUNATELY, WE JUST
- 17 LEARNED, LATE LAST WEEK THAT WE WERE NOT SELECTED FOR THE U.S.
- 18 DOT RURAL GRANT SHOWN AT THE BOTTOM OF THIS TABLE, \$400
- 19 MILLION, SO WE'LL BE STRATEGIZING WITH OUR PROJECT PARTNERS TO
- 20 PURSUE OTHER GRANT OPPORTUNITIES TO FILL THIS GAP WHICH MAY
- 21 INCLUDE UPCOMING RESILIENCY GRANTS OR FUTURE CYCLES OF GRANTS
