MOVING TO 7 8 AGENDA ITEM 3A, MTC RESOLUTION 4487 REVISED AND 4505 REVISED. THE ADOPTION OF THE 2023 REGIONAL ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION 9 PROGRAM OR ATP, CYCLE SIX PROGRAM OF PROJECTS AND REVISIONS 10 INTO THE ONE BAY AREA GRANT OBAG THREE PROGRAM AND WE HAVE 11 KARL ANDERSEN AND THOMAS ARNDT TO PRESENT THE PROGRAM. I'M NOT 12 SURE WHO IS STARTING OFF, BUT I'LL GO TO EITHER OF THEM. 13 14 THOMAS OR KARL. 15 16 KENNETH KAO: ACTUALLY CHAIR RABBITT, IF I MAY, ACTUALLY INTRODUCE THE ITEM BRIEFLY BEFORE KARL OR THOMAS. I'M KENNETH 17 KAO, ASSISTANT DIRECTOR IN THE PROGRAMS AND ALLOCATIONS 18 FUNDING SECTION OF MTC. THIS ITEM IS SPLIT INTO TWO FOR THE 19 ATP TEAM AND THE OBAG THREE PROGRAM THESE ARE PRETTY LARGE 20 21 REGIONAL PROGRAMS AND I WANT TO EXPRESS MY APPRECIATION BEFORE 22 THEY GET STARTED FOR MY TEAM. THIS IS A CULMINATION OF OVER A YEAR OF WORK FOR BOTH PROGRAMS AND WE'RE REALLY EXCITED AND 23 I'M HAPPY TO PRESENT THIS. IT'S ALMOST \$450 MILLION THAT WE'RE 24 PROGRAMMING AS RECOMMENDATION TODAY. WITH THAT I'LL TURN IT 25



OVER TO KARL WHO WILL COVER ATP AND THOMAS WILL COVER THE OBAG

DAVID RABBITT: THANK YOU KENNETH. THANK YOU KENNY AND THANK 4 5 YOU CHAIR RABBITT. I'M KARL ANDERSON MTC FUNDING POLICY AND PROGRAM STAFF. 3A IS AN ACTION ITEM FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE 6 2023 REGIONAL ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM KNOWN AS ATP CYCLE 7 8 SIX FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE GRANT COUNTY LOCAL PROGRAM. THE ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM IS A STATEWIDE COMPETITIVE 9 PROGRAM ESTABLISHED IN 2013 WITH THE GOAL OF PROMOTING ACTIVE 10 FORMS OF TRANSPORTATION LIKE WALKING AND BIKING THE PROGRAM IS 11 DIVIDED INTO STATEWIDE COMPETITIVE PROGRAM, REGIONAL 12 COMPETITIVE PROGRAMS FOR THE TEN LARGEST MPOS AND COMPETITIVE 13 PROGRAMS FOR THE SMALL AND URBAN AND RURAL COUNTIES 320 14 15 MILLION AVAILABLE PER YEAR STATEWIDE AND THE PROGRAM IS 16 ADOPTED EVERY TWO YEARS RECENTLY THE PROGRAM HAS RECEIVED NOTABLE AUGMENTATIONS IN 2017 SENATE BILL ONE ADDED 100 17 MILLION ANNUALLY TO THE PROGRAM, AND THE SUMMER FEDERAL IRA 18 LEGISLATION ADDED 50 MILLION ANNUALLY AND THE 2023 STATE 19 BUDGET ADDED ONE TIME \$1 BILLION AUGMENTATION FOR ATP. THE ATP 20 21 REMAINS A HIGHLY COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM ATP CYCLE SIX THE 22 STATE RECEIVED 434 APPLICATIONS REQUESTING OVER \$3.1 BILLION IN FUNDING THE AVERAGE REQUEST FOR THE CYCLE HAS INCREASED 23 FROM 7.1 MILLION FROM 5 MILLION IN ATP CYCLE FIVE FOR THE MTC 24 REGIONAL PROGRAM STAFF RECEIVED 63 APPLICATIONS REQUESTING 25

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\$544 MILLION DOLLARS [INDISCERNIBLE] TOTAL PROJECT COST 1 RECEIVED FEWEST APPLICATIONS FROM NAPA AND SAN FRANCISCO 2 3 COUNTY AT TWO EACH. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. NOW I WOULD LIKE TO SHARE RESULTS OF THE STATEWIDE COMPETITIVE PROGRAM. LAST MONTH 4 5 THE CTC ADOPTED THE STATEWIDE PROGRAM OF PROJECTS ADOPTED PROGRAM INCLUDED 67 STATEWIDE PROJECTS FOR A TOTAL OF \$853 6 MILLION, IN THE BAY AREA CTC FUNDED SIX PROJECTS FOR A TOTAL 7 8 OF 88 MILLION OR 10% TOTAL. WHILE 10% MARK IS A BIT LOWER THAN ANTICIPATE CTC SELECTED GREAT PROJECTS THROUGHOUT THE REGION 9 THE FULL PROJECT LIST ON THIS SLIDE INCLUDES NEARLY \$40 10 MILLION IN GRANT PROJECTS IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY. MTC HAD \$143 11 MILLION AVAILABLE POWER PROGRAMMING MTC RECEIVED 63 12 APPLICATIONS REQUESTING \$544 MILLION IN RESPONSE TO THE CALL 13 FOR PROJECTS. TO ESCORT PROJECTS MTC STAFF ENLISTED A 25 14 PERSON EVALUATION COMMITTEE TO SCORE AND RANK REMAINING 15 16 APPLICATIONS. THE REVIEW COMMITTEE USED SAME FORM SCORING CRITERIA AS THE STATEWIDE ATP FOR A MAXIMUM SCORE OF 110 17 POINTS. STAFF RANKED THE APPLICATIONS FROM HIGHEST TO LOWEST 18 BASED ON THE EVALUATION COMMITTEE'S CONSENSUS SCORE. USING THE 19 SCORE STAFF RECOMMENDS FUNDING 14 PROJECTS AND PARTIALLY 20 FUNDING ONE PROJECT FOR A TOTAL \$143 MILLION, 100% OF FUNDING 21 PROPOSED WILL BENEFIT EQUITY PRIORITY COMMUNITIES, AND ALL 22 23 PROJECTS SUPPORT MTC INITIATIVES TO REDUCE GHG EMISSIONS AND TO EXPAND THE REGIONAL BIKE NETWORK STAFF RECOMMENDS ADOPTING 24 A LIST OF CONTINGENCY PROJECTS TOTALING \$53 MILLION. THESE 25

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PROJECTS ARE ALL DETAILED IN ATTACHMENT TWO OF THE MEMO. STAFF 1 RECOMMENDS PARTIAL FUNDING THE SAN JOSE KEYS PROJECT WHICH 2 3 WILL BE DISCUSSED FURTHER IN THE PROJECT. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THE REGIONAL ATP AND OBAG THREE PROGRAMS SHARE TIMELINES STAFF 4 5 REVIEWED BOTH LISTS THAT INCLUDED OVERLAPPING SCOPE BOTH TEAMS COORDINATED TO ENSURE RECOMMENDATIONS DID NOT CONFLICT IN 6 EITHER PROGRAM FOR HIGHLY SCORES PROJECTS WITH OVERLAPPING 7 8 ELEMENTS STAFF RECOMMENDS FUNDING ATP REQUEST FIRST AND ANY REMAINING BALANCE AS PART OF THE OBAG THREE PROJECTS. IN 9 ALAMEDA COUNTY SAN LORENZO CREEK WAY PROJECT INCLUDED EXPANDED 10 SCOPE IN THE ATP APPLICATION THEREFORE STAFF RECOMMENDS 11 FUNDING THE BASE PROJECT IN THE OPEC THREE PROGRAM AND THE 12 ADDED SCOPE OF THE ATP PROGRAM. STAFF RECOMMENDS PARTIALLY 13 FUNDING SAN JOSE STORY KEYS PROJECT WITH THE REMAINING ATP 14 FUNDING SAN JOSE REQUESTS \$36 MILLION IN THE ATP FUNDS FOR THE 15 16 STORY KEYS PROJECT COMPLETING STREETS PROJECTS HOWEVER ONLY \$4 MILLION OF ATP REMAINED AFTER FUNDING HIGHER SCORING PROJECTS. 17 18 THEREFORE STAFF RECOMMENDING PARTIALLY FUNDING THE PROJECT WITH \$4 MILLION IN ATP FUNDS AND SAN JOSE SUBMITTED THE SAME. 19 MTC STAFF EXPECTS FULL PROJECT BENEFITS TO BE DELIVERED AS 20 PART OF THE PLAN COMPLETED BETWEEN THE RECOMMENDED FUNDING AND 21 RENAL NAT ATP AND OBAG THREE PROGRAMS. NEXT OVERVIEW OF THE 22 ATP FUNDING HISTORY SINCE UPON \$2,014,555,000,000 HAS BEEN 23 AWARDED TO PROJECTS IN THE MTC REGION THROUGH AWARDED 24 PROJECTS. CONSIDERING BOTH PROGRAMS MOST COUNTIES HAVE 25

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RECEIVED A COMPARABLE AMOUNT OF FUNDS TO THE POPULATION SHARE 1 WITHIN THEIR REGION TWO OUTLIERS, ALAMEDA COUNTY RECEIVES MORE 2 3 GRANT FUNDING THAN ITS POPULATION SHARE AND SANTA CLARA COUNTY RECEIVES LESS CONTRIBUTABLE TO MAIN REASONS ONE THE ATP 4 5 PROGRAM PRIORITIZES DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES AND IN ALAMEDA COUNTY HIGHER PERCENTAGE OF CONSENSUS TRACKS THAT QUALIFY 6 7 UNDER THE DEFINITIONS THERE IS A SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCE IN THE 8 AMOUNT OF FUNDS AND NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS REQUESTED BY THE COUNTIES. ALAMEDA COUNTY HAS REQUESTED 32% OF THE TOTAL FUNDS 9 THROUGH HUNDRED 47 APPLICATIONS OVER ALL OF OUR CYCLES WHERE 10 SANTA CLARA COUNTY REQUESTED 16% OF THE FUNDING REQUESTS 11 THROUGH 63 APPLICATIONS. NOTABLY SANTA CLARA COUNTY AGENCY 12 SUBMITTED EIGHT APPLICATIONS PER CYCLE WHERE ALAMEDA AGENCIES 13 SUBMITTED DOUBLE THAT AT 16 STAFF WILL CONTINUE TO WORK WITH 14 SPONSORS TO IMPROVE APPLICATIONS TO INCREASE THE REGION'S 15 16 GRANT SUCCESS RATE. FURTHER DISCUSSION IN SLIDES. NEXT I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT MTC ATP APPLICATION TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. 17 18 AS A CONTINUATION FROM ATP CYCLE FIVE MTC EXTENDED THE 19 APPLICATION TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM TO IMPROVE THE OUALITY AND OVERALL COMPETITIVENESS OF APPLICATIONS FROM THE 20 21 REGION MTC STAFF LEAD THE PROJECT IN SUPPORT, AND REVIEWED 22 SEVEN APPLICATIONS IN ASSESSING QUALITY ELIGIBILITY 23 CONSISTENCY AND TECHNICAL DETAILS SEVEN APPLICATIONS RECOMMENDED FOR FUNDING TO THE REGIONAL PROGRAM. STAFF 24 PROPOSES TO AUGMENT FUNDING AND REFINE THE TECHNICAL 25

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ASSISTANCE PROGRAM OBAG THREE INCLUDES 300,000 FOR AUGMENTED 1 SUPPORT. ADDITIONAL SCOPE OF THE PROGRAM COULD INCLUDE SCOPE 2 3 DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT AND MTC OR CTC LEAD APPLICATION PRIORITIZATION PROCESSES FURTHER DISCUSSION IN THE TECHNICAL 4 5 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM PROVIDED IN ATTACHMENT ONE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THIS CONCLUDES THE ATP HALF OF THE ITEM'S 6 PRESENTATION. I'LL TURN IT BACK OVER TO THE CHAIR, CHAIR 7 8 RABBITT IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO ENTERTAIN QUESTIONS NOW OR WAIT UNTIL AFTER THE PRESENTATION ON THE OBAG THREE 9 10 RECOMMENDATIONS. 11 DAVID RABBITT: I SEE ONE HAND RAISED. IF WE COULD ROLL ON 12 FORWARD AND TAKE ALL QUESTIONS AT ONCE? 13 14 15 GINA PAPAN: ACTUALLY, I HAVE QUESTIONS RELATED TO EACH GROUP. 16 DAVID RABBITT: OKAY. WHY DON'T YOU GO AHEAD, GINA, AND ASK 17 YOUR QUESTION NOW. 18 19 GINA PAPAN: OKAY. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. I APPRECIATE ALL THE 20 HARD WORK EFFORT AND THAT WENT INTO THESE. THERE IS KIND OF A 21 NEGATIVE OPTICS AS YOU POINTED OUT. WE'RE TRYING TO INVEST IN 22 VMTS AND REDUCTION IN GREENHOUSE GAS PROJECTS THROUGHOUT THE 23 BAY AREA, BUT THE RESULTS AGAIN WERE POINTED OUT SEEM 24 LOPSIDED. 72% OF RECOMMENDED FUNDING, THE QUESTION IS WE WANT 25

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TO PARTICIPATE IN LEARNING FROM WHAT WE DID WRONG OR HOW WE 1 CAN BETTER IMPROVE. I HAVE THREE QUESTIONS HERE. FIRST OFF HOW 2 3 DID ONE COUNTY GET ALL THAT? BUT I THINK YOU EXPLAINED THAT IN THE PRESENTATION. THAT'S BEEN ANSWERED. WHAT RULE DID REGIONAL 4 5 DISTRIBUTION PLAY IN THESE REGIONAL RECOMMENDATIONS AND WERE THERE REPRESENTATIONS ON THIS REVIEW COMMITTEE FROM EACH 6 7 COUNTY ON THE EVALUATION PANEL? AND WE WOULD LIKE TO KNOW WHO 8 THOSE -- IF THEY WERE, WHO THEY WERE FROM EACH COUNTY SO THAT WE CAN JUST SEE WHERE THE OPINIONS ARE COMING FROM, SHALL WE 9 10 SAY?

11

12 KARL ANDERSON: HAPPY TO TAKE THOSE QUESTIONS. ON THE LAST ONE 13 YOU MENTIONED REGARDING THE EVALUATION COMMITTEE IN THE 14 ATTACHMENT TO THE MEMO THERE IS A FULL LIST OF THE AGENCIES 15 AND THE TYPE OF AGENCY THAT PARTICIPATED IN THE EVALUATION 16 COMMITTEE AND WE DID HAVE REPRESENTATION FROM ALL NINE BAY 17 AREA COUNTIES ON THAT PANEL.

19 GINA PAPAN: WHERE IS THAT AGAIN? I'M SORRY KARL.

21 KARL ANDERSON: ATTACHMENT THREE TO THE STAFF MEMO IT LISTS ALL
22 MEMBERS IT DOESN'T LIST THE NAME JUST THE AGENCY THEY'RE
23 AFFILIATED WITH AND THE TYPE OF AGENCY.

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GINA PAPAN: I'LL LOOK IN MORE DETAIL THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR 1 2 THE REFERENCE. THIS MAY BE SOMETHING WE WANT TO DISCUSS IN THE 3 FUTURE BECAUSE SOMETIMES WITH MTC STAFF THINGS REPRESENT COUNTIES THAT DON'T NECESSARILY DO THAT. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. 4 5 GO AHEAD. KARL. 6 KARL ANDERSON: ON YOUR OUESTION OF GEOGRAPHIC BALANCE WE ARE 7 8 BOUND BY STATEWIDE GUIDANCE SO WE AREN'T ALLOWED TO INTRODUCE ANY, SORT OF, METRICS OR SCOPING PRIORITIZATION TO ACCOUNT FOR 9 GEOGRAPHIC EQUITY THE PROGRAM HAS TO REMAIN COMPETITIVE AND WE 10 HAVE TO ABIDE BY THE PROCESS GUIDELINES. 11 12 GINA PAPAN: LOOK FORWARD TO MORE DISCUSSION. 13 14 15 KARL ANDERSON: THANK YOU. 16 DAVID RABBITT: ANY MORE QUESTIONS ON THIS PIECE? 17 18 NICK JOSEFOWITZ: I HAVE ONE. 19 20 21 DAVID RABBITT: GO AHEAD. 22 23 NICK JOSEFOWITZ: SAN FRANCISCO SUBMITTED A PROJECT ON HOWARD STREET, THAT JUST MISSED OUT ON THE STATE FUNDS SCORED 90 OUT 24 OF 100 -- 89 OUT OF 100 ON THE STATE SCORING. IT SCORED 25

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SIGNIFICANTLY LOWER ON THE REGIONAL SCORING, 81% ON THE 1 REGIONAL SCORING. SO, I WOULD LIKE -- NOT NOW, BUT OFFLINE, 2 3 MAYBE YOU CAN EXPLAIN TO ME WHY THERE WAS SUCH A DISCREPANCY ON THE SCORING FOR THIS PROJECT? AND IT'S PARTICULARLY 4 5 IMPORTANT BECAUSE WE HAVE A \$23 MILLION RAISE GRANT ASSOCIATED WITH THIS PROJECT. AND THE MAPS THAT WE WERE PLANNING FOR IT 6 WERE THROUGH DEVELOPER FEES WHICH MANY OF YOU KNOW THERE IS 7 8 NOT OF DEVELOPMENT GOING ON IN DOWNTOWN SAN FRANCISCO, NOT BECAUSE OF REALLY ANYTHING THAT WE HAD TO DO WITH WORK-FROM-9 HOME AND COVID AND ALL THAT STUFF. SO WE ARE IN -- FACING DOWN 10 A REAL POSSIBILITY OF POTENTIALLY NOT BEING ABLE TO MAP, 11 PROVIDE THE LOCAL REGIONAL MATCH NECESSARY FOR THIS RAISED 12 GRANT, AND I THINK IT WOULD BE A REAL SHAME NOT JUST FOR SAN 13 FRANCISCO BUT FOR THE REGION TO, SORT OF, HAVE TO GIVE THIS 14 15 MONEY BACK TO THE FEDS. SO, IF YOU COULD HELP US BETTER 16 UNDERSTAND, OFFLINE, WHAT THE SCORING CRITERIA IS, I WOULD 17 REALLY LIKE TO ASK YOU, ALSO TO SEE IF THERE ARE, HOW WE CAN -- YOU KNOW, WHAT MTC CAN TRY AND DO TO KIND OF FUND THIS 18 IMPORTANT -- AND I THINK, WHAT SHOULD BE A VERY HIGH SCORING 19 20 PROJECT.

21

22 DAVID RABBITT: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. COMMISSIONER RONEN?23

24 HILLARY RONEN: THANK YOU SO MUCH. I JUST WANTED TO PIGGYBACK
25 ON COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ'S COMMENTS. MY UNDERSTANDING IS

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THAT SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS WAS A MAJOR ASPECT OF THIS FUNDING 1 REQUIREMENTS. AND THE HOWARD PROJECT, THAT'S THE ENTIRE POINT 2 3 OF IT. AND SO IT DOES FEEL CONFUSING TO ME WHY IT SCORED LESS THAN IT DID AT THE STATE. SO, AGAIN, WE CAN HAVE THIS 4 5 CONVERSATION OFFLINE, BUT IT IS CONCERNING TO ME. 6 KARL ANDERSON: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER RONEN AND COMMISSIONER 7 8 JOSEFOWITZ. YES THERE IS SOME DIFFERENCES IN THE WAY THAT THE SCORE TOTALS ARE CALCULATED BETWEEN THE REGIONAL AND STATE 9 PROGRAM. I HAVE CONNECTED WITH SFMTA STAFF TO DO A DEBRIEF ON 10 THEIR APPLICATION QUESTION BY QUESTION SCORE BY SCORE. SO 11 HAPPY TO COMMUNICATE ANY INFORMATION THAT COMES FROM THOSE 12 MEETINGS TO YOU. 13 14 15 HILLARY RONEN: THANK YOU.

DAVID RABBITT: GREAT. ANYONE ELSE? BEFORE WE MOVE ON TO THE 17 OBAG THREE, I JUST WANT TO SAY, I VERY MUCH APPRECIATE THE 18 FACT THAT STAFF HAS PROPOSED AN AUGMENTATION OF \$300,000 GOING 19 FORWARD TO REALLY MAKE SURE THAT WE'RE AS COMPETITIVE. I HAVE 20 A FEELING THAT WE'RE IN A DIFFERENT PLACE THAN MANY OTHER 21 PARTS OF THE STATE AND THAT WE HAVE BEEN MAKING COMMITMENTS TO 22 ATP PROBABLY FOR A LONGER PERIOD OF TIME AND WHAT WE'RE 23 TALKING ABOUT ARE GAP CLOSURES AND THINGS THAT MAY SCORE 24 DIFFERENTLY THAN WHAT HAPPENS ELSEWHERE IN THE STATE. I KNOW 25

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THAT WE'RE ALL VERY COMPETITIVE NOT ONLY FOR THE REGION TO
 MAKE SURE THAT WE BUNCH ABOVE OUR WEIGHT AND BRING THOSE
 DOLLARS HOME BUT ALSO FOR OUR JURISDICTIONS SO I DO APPRECIATE
 THE COMMENTS. WITH THAT WE'LL MOVE ON THEN IF THERE IS NO MORE
 QUESTIONS E COMMENTS, CONCERNS ON ATP, TO THE OBAG THREE
 PORTION OF THE PRESENTATION.

NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THE COMMISSION ADOPTED GUIDELINES TO THE OBAG THREE LOCAL AND COUNTY PROGRAM IN MARCH OF 2022 17 18 CARRYING FORWARD SUCCESSFUL PRINCIPLES FROM PREVIOUS CYCLES THE PROGRAM MAINTAINED EMPHASIS ON LOCAL PRIORITY PROJECTS 19 THAT ADVANCE REGIONAL OBJECTIVES AND CONTINUE WITH INVESTMENTS 20 21 IN PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT AREAS FOR PDA WITH ADDITIONAL 22 CONSIDERATIONS FOR NEW PLANNED AREAS FOR PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 GEOGRAPHIES AND THE GUIDANCE MAINTAINED ELIGIBILITY FOR A 23 VARIETY OF PROJECT TYPES INCLUDING COMPLIANCE WITH NEW AND 24 STATE HOUSING LAWS. THE COMMISSION APPROVED A NUMBER OF POLICY 25

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CHANGES FOR THE CYCLE WHICH ENHANCE MTC PROJECT SELECTIONS IN 1 RESPONSE TO MTC FEDERAL CORRECTIVE ACTION INCLUDING 2 3 ESTABLISHMENT OF NOMINATION TARGETS FOR EACH COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AGENCY OR CTA WHICH ARE ELIMINATE GUARANTEED 4 5 PERCENTAGE SHARE FOR EACH COUNTY AND REGIONAL EVALUATION OF ALL NOMINATED PROJECTS CONSISTENT WITH THE PROJECT SELECTION 6 7 GUIDELINES INCLUDING ASSESSING EMISSIONS REDUCTION BENEFITS 8 FOR ALL PROJECTS ELIGIBLE FOR FEDERAL AIR QUALITY FUNDS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. HAVING COMPLETED THE CALL FOR PROJECTS PROCESS 9 OVER THE PAST YEAR INCLUDING PRIORITIZATION OF PROJECTS LIKE 10 11 CTAS AND REGIONAL EVALUATION OF NOMINATED PROJECTS STAFF ARE RECOMMENDING APPROVAL OF THE COUNTY AND LOCAL PROJECTS. I'LL 12 HIGHLIGHT KEY FINDING OF THE PROPOSED PROGRAM. SIMILAR TO ATP, 13 LARGER APPLICATION PROJECTS THIS CYCLE AND PROJECTS PROPOSED 14 COST IS OVER \$900 MILLION EFFECTIVELY USES LIMITED OBAG 15 16 FUNDING FOR LOCAL AND STATE FUNDS. LOCAL AIR OUALITY FUNDS PRIORITIZING COST EFFECTIVE PROJECTS FOR THE FUNDING SOURCE 17 18 FUNDS ARE ANTICIPATED TO GENERATE SUBSTANTIAL EMISSION 19 REDUCTIONS AS DETAILED IN THE STAFF REPORT. OVERALL THE PROPOSED PROGRAM OUTPERFORMS EXPECTATIONS AND EXCEEDS 20 AMBITIOUS TARGETS ESTABLISHED BY THE COMMISSION. STAFF BELIEVE 21 22 SUCCESSES MAY BE DRIVEN IF PART TO THE COMPETITIVE NATURE OF 23 THE PROCESS THIS CYCLE WHICH INCENTIVIZES PROJECTS. NEARLY ALL PROJECTS PROPOSED ARE WITHIN OR SUPPORTIVE OF PDA WITH EACH 24 COUNTY EXCEEDING INDIVIDUAL PDA MINIMUM. MAJORITY OF PROPOSED 25

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INVESTMENTS ARE IN ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION WHICH EXCEEDS THE 1 \$200 MILLION TARGET. YOU CAN SEE THE PIE CHART TO THE RIGHT OF 2 3 THE SLIDES FOR A BREAK DOWN OF PROPOSED INVESTMENTS BY MODE. PROPOSED INVESTMENTS IN SAFER ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROJECTS 4 5 PROGRAMS ARE DOUBLE ESTABLISHMENT TARGETS AND OVER HALF AVAILABLE FUNDS ARE RECOMMENDED FOR PROJECTS IN EQUITY 6 PRIORITY COMMUNITIES. NEXT SLIDE. THIS SLIDE SHOWS SUMMARY OF 7 8 FUNDING RECOMMENDATION BY COUNTY AND RESULTING GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDING I'LL DIRECT TO AGENDA PACKET FOR 9 DETAILED PROGRAMS INCLUDING PROJECT LISTS AND MAPS. SAMPLE TO 10 11 THE RIGHT OF THE SLIDE SHOWS PROPOSED PROJECTS IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY RECOMMENDED PROJECT AWARDS IN RED PDA SUPPORTED IN 12 GREEN OR GOLD -- EXCUSE ME -- [INDISCERNIBLE] IN GREEN. NEXT 13 SLIDE PLEASE. REMINDER OF NEXT STEPS FROM PERCENTAGE SPONSORS 14 SELECTED FOR OBAG FUNDING AWARDEES WILL NEED TO COMPLY WITH 15 16 VARIOUS REOUIREMENTS. REOUIREMENTS SUMMARIZED IN THE GREEN BOX NOTABLY CITIES AND COUNTIES MUST HAVE HOUSING ELEMENTS 17 APPROVED BY DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT HCD 18 19 PRIOR TO ACCESSING FUNDS. 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TO THE RECOMMENDED PROGRAM OF PROJECTS PART OF THIS ITEM STAFF 1 ARE PROPOSING CONTINGENCY PROJECT LIST FOR USE IN FUTURE 2 3 PROGRAMMING SHOULD ADDITIONAL CAPACITY BECOME AVAILABLE DURING THE OBAG THREE PERIOD STAFF RECOMMENDS FUNDING PROJECTS FROM 4 5 THIS LIST RATHER THAN ISSUING CALL FOR OTHER PROJECTS AND CONTRACTS WITH PROPOSED GRANT AWARDS ARE SELECTED BASED ON 6 7 REGIONAL PARTICIPANTS DELIVERABILITY IN THE COMPLETION OF FULL 8 FUNDING PLANS AND TOTAL PROJECT SCORE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. I'LL LEAVE YOU WITH RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ADOPTION OF THE ATP AND OBAG PROGRAM. FOR 17 18 ATP THIS INCLUDES ADOPTION OF THE CYCLE SIX PROJECT LIST AND 19 DIRECTION TO STAFF TO DIRECT THE LIST TO CTC AND OBAG THREE RECOMMENDATION INCLUDES PROGRAMMING COUNTY AND LOCAL FUNDS 20 RECOMMENDED PROJECTS APPROVAL OF THE CONTINGENCY PRIVILEGES 21 22 LIST AND PRIORITIES AND PROGRAMMING REGIONAL FUNDS FOR THE 23 ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. NOTING IN THE AGENDA ITEM WE RELEASED UPDATED INFORMATION FROM PROJECT 24 SPONSORS AND IF CHANGES ARE NEEDED BASED ON THE INFORMATION 25

16 GINA PAPAN: THANK YOU. I KNOW AN ENORMOUS AMOUNT OF WORK HAS GONE INTO THIS. I JUST LOOKED UP THE EVALUATOR LIST AND IT IS 17 FAR FROM TRANSPARENT. REALLY GOING TO NEED SOME HELP ON THIS. 18 BECAUSE ALL I SEE IS ALAMEDA COUNTY, ALAMEDA COUNTY, CALTRANS, 19 CITY OF CONCORD, CITY OF DIXON, CITY OF FREMONT, NAPA, SAN 20 21 RAFAEL, CONTRA COSTA TA, MARIN, MTC, SEVERAL LISTINGS, NAPA, 22 NAPA, AND SILICON VALLEY. SO, AS YOU CAN UNDERSTAND, IT'S VERY 23 DIFFICULT FOR SOME OF US TO UNDERSTAND WHO THESE EVALUATORS ARE. SO, IF YOU COULD PROVIDE US A SUPPLEMENTAL ANALYSIS THERE 24 THAT WE CAN SEE MORE TRANSPARENTLY WHO THE EVALUATORS THAT 25

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WOULD BE HELPFUL. AND WE'RE LOOK FORWARD TO MTC TO SEE HOW WE 1 2 CAN LEARN AND ALL BE MORE COMPETITIVE HERE. ON THIS OBAG 3 PRESENTATION, AND AGAIN I KNOW THIS HAS TAKEN A REALLY LONG TIME. I APPRECIATE ALL YOUR HARD WORK EFFORT AND. WILL THERE 4 5 BE NEW FUNDING AVAILABLE BECAUSE OF THE FEDERAL INFRASTRUCTURE BILL? AND WOULD THAT BE USED TO FUND THE PROJECTS IN THE 6 7 CONTINGENCY TABLE FIRST? 8 SPEAKER: THROUGH THE CHAIR WE ARE EXPECTING MODEST INCREASES 9 IN PROGRAM REVENUE DUE TO THE LATEST TRANSPORTATION 10 AUTHORIZATION AND WE'RE EXPECTING TO BE BRINGING REPROGRAMMING 11 AUTHORIZATIONS THIS SPRING THOSE WILL BE MODEST INCREASES, NOT 12 ON THE LEVEL SEEN IN THE ATP PROGRAM. 13 14 GINA PAPAN: SO, YOU CAN ADDRESS THE CONTINGENCY LIST? 15 16 SPEAKER: I'M SORRY. YES. IT'S APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION. 17 18 WE'LL BE USING THE CONTINGENCY FRAMEWORK INCLUDING THE CONTINGENCY LIST TO RECOMMEND THOSE PROJECTS FOR 19 20 REPROGRAMMING. YES. 21 22 GINA PAPAN: THANK YOU THOMAS. APPRECIATE IT. 23 DAVID RABBITT: THANK YOU. COMMISSIONER SPERING? JIM, YOU ARE 24 MUTED. 25

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JAMES P. SPERING: I THOUGHT IT HAD COME OFF. FIRST I WANT TO 2 3 THANK STAFF. AS I LOOK AT THE SOLANO COUNTY BUDGET, IT HELPS ADVANCE TRANSIT IN SOLANO COUNTY. BUT IF THERE IS ADDITIONAL 4 5 MONEY AVAILABLE, WOULD THE GAP CLOSURE PROJECTS HAVE A PRIORITY? BECAUSE I THINK AS YOU LOOK THROUGH THIS LIST THERE, 6 IS A LOT OF PROJECTS WITH A MODEST INVESTMENT THAT CAN MAKE A 7 8 REAL DIFFERENCE, ESPECIALLY THE SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL AREAS. 9 SPEAKER: THROUGHOUT CHAIR, OUR PROPOSED CONTINGENCY PROJECT 10 PRIORITIES ARE REGIONAL SIGNIFICANCE. THAT FITS IN THERE, AND 11 COMPLETION OF FULL PROJECT FUNDING PLANS AND TOTAL PROJECT 12 SCORE WOULD HOPE TO REFLECT THE IMPORTANCE OF GAP CLOSURE 13 14 PROJECTS. 15 16 DAVID RABBITT: GREAT. THANK YOU. ANYTHING ELSE COMMISSIONER? 17 I'LL TAKE THAT AS A NO. ANYONE ELSE HAVE ANY QUESTIONS FOR STAFF BEFORE WE MOVE ON? TESS LYNGEL, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR 3 ALAMEDA COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION THIS IS AN EXCITING 4 5 CULMINATION OF SEVERAL YEARS AND COLLABORATIVE WORK ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE OBAG THREE PROGRAM AND IT'S NICE TO SEE THE 6 COORDINATION WITH THE ATP PROGRAM. I WOULD LIKE TO NOTE THIS 7 8 IS CRITICAL FUNDING FOR COUNTIES LIKE ALAMEDA COUNTY WHO ARE 9 PARTNERS WITH MTC AND DOING THE VERY SPECIFIC DIRECT PROJECT DELIVERY TO HELP ADVANCE THE GOALS OF PBA2050. WE RECEIVED A RESPONSE BACK FROM MTC YESTERDAY 16 THEIR RESPONSE FAILED TO ADDRESS OUR MAIN CONCERNS ONE WHICH IS THAT THIS GRANT APPLICATION DID NOT CONTAIN THE NECESSARY 17 18 INFORMATION CRUCIAL TO ACTUALLY SCORE AND EVALUATE THIS 19 PROJECT AS TOPPER LANE WAS INCLUDED IN THE GRANT REQUEST PRIMARILY FOCUSED ON SCHOOL STREET BENEFITS AND ALSO PROJECT 20 REQUESTING FUNDING TO BUILD PATHWAY THAT WILL BENEFIT 6 TO 8 21 22 STUDENTS. WE HAVE NO CONCERNS WITH THE REQUEST FOR SCHOOL 23 FUNDING BUT WE FIND IT DIFFICULT TO FATHOM HOW THE PROCESS WOULD RESULT IN ENDORSING INCLUSION OF TOPPER LANE WHEN SO 24 MANY OTHER EFFORTS THAT DID GET PRIORITIZE SAID FUNDING HAVE 25

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MUCH BROADER PUBLIC APPEAL. NOT ONLY DID MTC RESPONSE 1 DISREGARD OUR PRIMARY CONCERNS BUT IT CONTAINED A NUMBER OF 2 3 POINTS BASED ON ASSUMPTIONS AND BROAD GENERALIZATION. THESE POINTS DIDN'T PROVIDE EXPLANATION AS TO WHY TOPPER LANE WOULD 4 5 NOT HAVE SCORED FAVORABLY COMPARED TO OTHER GRANT REOUESTS. OUESTIONS WHY MTC WOULD RECOMMEND FUNDING MILLIONS OF DOLLARS 6 7 TO PROJECTS WITH SUCH LIMITED BENEFIT MARKETS. REGARDING MORE 8 INFORMATION REGARDING SCORING PROCESS WE HAVE REQUESTS TO GO INTO DETAIL WITH MTC HOW THE PROJECT WAS SCORED AND TO 9 DISCUSSION CONCERNS RAISED CLEAR AND TRANSPARENT DIALOGUE ON 10 WHY TOPPER LANE WAS PRIORITIZED FOR FUNDING. 11

HAD TOPPER LANE BEEN CONSIDERED SEPARATE FROM SCHOOL STREET IT WOULD HAVE SCORED LOW AND NOT 4 5 MADE THE CUT AS A PRIORITY PROJECT. WE FEEL THE GRANT WAS MISREPRESENTED BECAUSE THE NEGATIVE ATTRIBUTED AT TOPPER 6 LANE'S INCLUSION WERE NEVER CONSIDERED IN THE SCORING PROCESS. 7 8 SO SCORING WAS BASED ON THE MERITS ATTRIBUTED TO SCHOOL STREET AND SCHOOL STREET ONLY THEREFORE WE OUESTION THE LEGITIMACY OF 9 10 THE OVERALL SCORE. AND, AGAIN, WE WILL BE FOLLOWING UP WITH MORE DETAIL AND COUNTER POINTS WE RECEIVED IN RESPONSES TO THE 11 CONCERNS NOTED IN ATTACHMENT C. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. THANK 12 YOU. 13
