- 1 SACRAMENTO AS IT RELATES TO OUR ADVOCACY PROGRAM AND UPDATE ON
- 2 KEY COMMITTEE LEADERSHIP CHANGES. THIS IS AN INFORMATION ITEM.
- 3 AND GEORGIA GANN DOHRMANN WILL PRESENT ON THIS ITEM.

- 5 GEORGIA GANN DOHRMANN: GOOD MORNING CHAIR ARREGUIN AND MTC
- 6 MEMBERS AND ABAG BOARD MEMBERS. GEORGIA GANN DOHRMANN, MTC
- 7 ABAG STAFF. SO, THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION, THE 2023 LEGISLATIVE
- 8 SESSION IN SACRAMENTO HAS COMMENCED. IT'S EARLY IN THE
- 9 LEGISLATIVE SESSION BUT THIS ITEM IS INTENDED TO PROVIDE
- 10 UPDATE ON KEY THEMES WE'RE STARTING TO SEE COMING OUT OF
- 11 SACRAMENTO. THE FIRST ONE I WANT TO CALL TO YOUR ATTENTION IS
- 12 CHANGE. SO, NEARLY 1/3 OF THE LAWMAKERS UP IN SACRAMENTO ARE
- 13 NEW. THIS IS ALSO GOING TO BE THE FIRST TIME MANY OF THE
- 14 LAWMAKERS IN SACRAMENTO ARE GOING TO BE FACING, SORT OF, SOME
- 15 BELT TIGHTENING, BUT IN ADDRESSING BUDGET DEFICITS, IT'S
- 16 SOMETHING THAT'S AGAIN TO BE, SORT OF, A SHIFT IN HOW FOLKS UP
- 17 THERE OPERATE. AND GIVEN BOTH OF THOSE THINGS WE'RE STILL
- 18 WAITING TO SEE HOW -- OH, AND THE OTHER REALLY BIG THING IS
- 19 THAT ON THE ASSEMBLY SIDE THERE IS GOING TO BE A PLANNED
- 20 LEADERSHIP CHANGE COMING IN LATER IN THE YEAR. AND, SO, WITH
- 21 ALL OF THAT ON THE TABLE, I THINK WE'RE STILL WAITING TO SEE
- 22 HOW SOME OF THE NEW POLITICAL DYNAMICS WILL SHAPE OUT AND
- 23 LEGISLATIVE AGENDAS ARE GOING TO REALLY COME, RISE TO THE TOP
- 24 OF THE PRIORITY LIST IN SACRAMENTO. I THINK, EVEN WITH ALL OF
- 25 THAT POTENTIAL, ALL OF THAT CHANGE, WHAT WE'RE SEEING COME OUT



- 1 OF SACRAMENTO ARE A COUPLE OF KEY THEMES THAT ARE GOING TO
- 2 CONTINUE TO BE VERY HIGH PRIORITIES FOR THE STATE LEGISLATURE.
- 3 AND THE FIRST ONE IS, REALLY, HOUSING HOMELESSNESS. WE ARE
- 4 ALREADY SEEING A SLEW OF BILLS INTRODUCED RELATED TO HOUSING
- 5 AND HOMELESSNESS AND MANY OF THE LEGISLATORS IN THE BAY AREA
- 6 AND ACROSS THE STATE HAVE MADE IT VERY CLEAR THAT ADDRESSING
- 7 THE HOUSING HOMELESSNESS CHALLENGES ARE GOING TO CONTINUE TO
- 8 BE ONE OF THEIR TOP PRIORITIES THIS YEAR. ANOTHER KEY THEME OF
- 9 INTEREST TO THIS COMMITTEE IS TRANSPORTATION. AND, IN
- 10 PARTICULAR, THERE IS INCREASING, SORT OF, AWARENESS IN
- 11 SACRAMENTO ABOUT THE IMPENDING TRANSIT FISCAL CLIFFS FACING
- 12 MANY BAY AREA OPERATORS, BUT ALSO OTHER OPERATORS AROUND THE
- 13 STATE. AND INCREASING, SORT OF, REQUESTS FOR, EXAMPLE, FOR
- 14 MTC, AND SOME OF YOUR STAFF, AND SOME OF YOUR LEADERSHIP TO
- 15 COME PRESENT AT THE BAY AREA CAUCUS A COUPLE OF TIMES ALREADY
- 16 TO PROVIDE AN OUTLINE OF WHAT THIS IS -- HOW SIGNIFICANT THE
- 17 ISSUE IS IN THE BAY AREA AND TO HELP OUR BAY AREA CAUCUS
- 18 LEADERS TO START BRAINSTORMING SOME POTENTIAL SOLUTIONS. WE
- 19 ARE ALSO REALLY HEARING AND SEEING SOME BAY AREA LEGISLATORS
- 20 LED BY SENATOR WIENER COME TO THE FOREFRONT OF PROCLAIMING
- 21 THIS ISSUE IS SOMETHING HE'S GOING TO BE CHAMPIONING IN
- 22 SACRAMENTO WHICH IS REALLY GREAT NEWS FOR THE BAY AREA AND
- 23 ALSO SEEING LEGISLATIVE LEADERS FROM AROUND THE STATE IN
- 24 PARTICULAR ASSEMBLY TRANSPORTATION CHAIR FRIEDMAN WHO IS
- 25 REALLY TRYING TO STEP UP AND BE VERY INVOLVED IN THIS ISSUE AS



- 1 WELL. AT THIS POINT IN SACRAMENTO THERE IS A SENSE THERE IS A
- 2 CHALLENGE THAT'S GOING TO BE COMING. AND WE HAVE NOT YET, IN
- 3 SACRAMENTO GOTTEN TO A POINT OF SOME ROBUST SOLUTIONS SO
- 4 THAT'S GOING TO BE SOME OF THE WORK OVER THE COMING MONTHS.
- 5 THAT, I THINK I WANT TO LEAD INTO JUST ACKNOWLEDGING THAT WE
- 6 ARE GOING TO BE GOING TO SACRAMENTO AT THE END OF FEBRUARY,
- 7 FEBRUARY 28TH TO MARCH 1ST, MTC AND ABAG LEADERSHIP, AND OTHER
- 8 FOLKS ON THIS COMMITTEE, AND SO THAT WILL BE A REALLY GREAT
- 9 OPPORTUNITY TO BE ABLE TO TALK TO FOLKS IN SACRAMENTO ABOUT
- 10 THE WORK THAT WE'RE DOING ON HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS POLICY
- 11 IN THE BAY AREA, SOME OF OUR LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES IN THAT
- 12 SPACE, AND LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES IN THE TRANSPORTATION,
- 13 PARTICULARLY, THE TRANSIT OPERATING SPACE. JUST FOR THE SAKE
- 14 OF TIME, I, SORT OF, WANT TO STOP THERE ON WHAT'S GOING ON IN
- 15 SACRAMENTO UPDATE. BUT I DO WANT TO CALL YOUR ATTENTION TO,
- 16 FOR THE SECOND PIECE OF YOUR MEMO, WHICH OUTLINES COMMITTEE
- 17 CHANGES FOR RELEVANT COMMITTEES IN THE BAY AREA -- OR NOT IN
- 18 THE BAY AREA, RELEVANT COMMITTEES IN SACRAMENTO AND IN
- 19 PARTICULAR WE HIGHLIGHT REALLY BAY AREA LEADERS IN THE STATE
- 20 ON RELEVANT COMMITTEES.

- 4 AMENDMENT ONE. VOTER THRESHOLD FOR LOCAL INFRASTRUCTURE BONDS
- 5 AND TAXES WHICH WOULD LOWER TO 55% THE VOTER APPROVAL
- 6 THRESHOLD FOR LOCAL BONDS SPECIAL TAXES FOR AFFORDABLE
- 7 HOUSING, TRANSPORTATION, RESILIENCE AND OTHER PUBLIC
- 8 INFRASTRUCTURE. THIS IS AN ACTION ITEM. AND GEORGIA GANN

- 11 GEORGIA GANN DOHRMANN: GOOD MORNING. THIS IS AN ACTION ITEM.
- 12 STAFF IS RECOMMENDING THE COMMITTEE RECOMMEND A SUPPORT
- 13 POSITION ON MTC AND ABAG ON ASSEMBLY CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
- 14 ONE LED BY ASSEMBLYMEMBER AGUIAR-CURRY. THIS IS A BILL THAT'S
- 15 PROBABLY FAMILIAR TO MANY OF YOU. IT'S SOMETHING THAT AGUIAR-
- 16 CURRY HAS BEEN INTRODUCING SINCE, I BELIEVE, 2017. MTC AND
- 17 ABAG HAVE TAKEN SUPPORT POSITIONS ON THIS PROPOSAL TO LOWER
- 18 THE VOTE THRESHOLD TO 55% IN PREVIOUS YEARS SO WE'RE BRINGING
- 19 THIS TO YOU AGAIN THIS YEAR WITH A RECOMMENDATION FOR SUPPORT.
- 20 I THINK A COUPLE OF DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THIS YEAR AND THE
- 21 PREVIOUS YEARS, WHY THE COMMISSION AND ABAG HAVE SUPPORTED
- 22 THIS MEASURE, JUST TO THINK ABOUT, IS THAT YOU KNOW, THE BAY
- 23 AREA VOTERS HAVE HAD A REALLY LONG HISTORY OF BEING GENEROUS
- 24 SUPPORTERS OF TAXING THEMSELVES TO FUND TRANSPORTATION AND
- 25 HOUSING IMPROVEMENTS. ONE OF THE THINGS THAT, YOU KNOW, WE



- 1 KNOW, IS THAT FOR PREVIOUS TRANSPORTATION AND HOUSING
- 2 IMPROVEMENTS, YOU KNOW, GETTING TO THE TWO THIRDS VOTE IS
- 3 ALWAYS VERY CHALLENGING. WE SAW THAT LAST YEAR AS WELL. ONE OF
- 4 THE THINGS THAT'S A LITTLE BIT OF DIFFERENT CONTEXT THIS YEAR
- 5 IS THAT WE ARE LOOKING AT REGIONAL HOUSING REVENUE MEASURE,
- 6 POTENTIAL REGIONAL HOUSING REVENUE MEASURE EXPLORING AND ALSO
- 7 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION REVENUE MEASURE DOWN THE ROAD. WE HAVE
- 8 DONE REGIONAL MEASURES BEFORE AS ALL OF YOU KNOW, BUT ALL OF
- 9 THE REGIONAL MEASURES WE HAVE DONE IN THE BAY AREA IN THE PAST
- 10 HAVE RELATED TO TOLL INCREASES AND BEEN SUBJECT TO A 50% VOTE
- 11 THRESHOLD. WE -- AND, SO, YOU KNOW, PROCEEDING OR LOOKING AT A
- 12 REGIONAL REVENUE MEASURE THAT IS SUBJECT TO A TWO THIRDS VOTE
