

- 2 \$4,998,938, AND CHRISTINE MALEY-GRUBL WILL PRESENT THIS ITEM.

- 4 CHRISTINE MALEY-GRUBL: GOOD MORNING CHAIR RABBITT AND MEMBERS.
- 5 MY NAME IS CHRISTINE MALEY-GRUBL OF THE FIELD OPERATIONS ASSET
- 6 MANAGEMENT TEAM AND PROJECT LEAD OF THE COMMUTER BENEFITS
- 7 PROGRAM OPERATIONS PROCUREMENT. I'M GLAD TO BE HERE THIS
- 8 MORNING. I'LL BE SEEKING APPROVAL FOR THE COMMUTER BENEFITS
- 9 PROGRAM OPERATIONS CONTRACT WITH WSP USA. FIRST I WOULD LIKE
- 10 TO PROVIDE YOU BACKGROUNDED ON THE COMMUTER BENEFITS PROGRAM.
- 11 NEXT SLIDE. THIS SLIDE SERVES AS AN OVERVIEW OF WHERE WE HAVE
- 12 BEEN AND THE NEXT SLIDE WILL TOUCH ON THE PROGRAM'S FUTURE.
- 13 THIS SLIDE REPRESENTS A STRONG TEN-YEAR PARTNERSHIP WITH THE
- 14 AIR DISTRICT. IN 2012, THE PROGRAM WAS AUTHORIZED UNDER SENATE
- 15 BILL 1339, AS A PILOT AND LAUNCHED IN 2014, REQUIRING
- 16 EMPLOYERS WITH 50 OR MORE FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES WITHIN THE
- 17 BOUNDARIES OF THE AIR DISTRICT TO PROVIDE COMMUTER BENEFITS TO
- 18 THEIR EMPLOYEES. WITH THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM BEING TO
- 19 REDUCE GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS AND VEHICLE MILES TRAVELED
- 20 FROM DRIVE ALONE COMMUTING. MTC'S FOCUS HAS BEEN TO PROVIDE
- 21 EMPLOYER REGISTRATION SUPPORT THROUGH CONSULTANT SERVICES
- 22 WHILE THE AIR DISTRICT IS PRIMARILY RESPONSIBLE FOR PROGRAM
- 23 ENFORCEMENT. THE PROGRAM IS THE FOUNDATION FOR THE PLANNED BAY
- 24 AREA 2050 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN STRATEGY EN7 TO EXPAND COMMUTE
- 25 TRIP REDUCTION PROGRAMS AND MAJOR EMPLOYERS AND IS A COURSE



- 1 STRATEGY TO HELP REDUCE GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS. IN 2017
- 2 SENATE BILL 1128 AUTHORIZED MTC AND THE AIR DISTRICT TO
- 3 CONTINUE THE PROGRAM ON AN ONGOING BASIS. EMPLOYEES SUBJECT TO
- 4 THE PROGRAM ARE REOUIRED TO REGISTER VIA THE PROGRAM WEB SITE
- 5 SELECT A COMMUTER BENEFIT AND OFFER THE BENEFIT TO THEIR
- 6 EMPLOYEES. AT OUTLINED IN THE AIR DISTRICT'S REGULATION 14
- 7 RULE ONE. FROM THE PILOT LAUNCH TO 2017 THIS FIRST PHASE OF
- 8 THE PROJECT FOCUSED ON REGISTRATION SUPPORT RATHER THAN
- 9 COMPLIANCE TO PROVIDE EMPLOYERS OPPORTUNITY TO RECEIVE THE
- 10 INFORMATION AND TO REGISTER. IN 2017 WHEN THE PROGRAM BECAME
- 11 PERMANENT MORE OUTREACH WAS CONDUCTED BY MTC AND THE AIR
- 12 DISTRICT BEGAN TO ISSUE ADVISORIES ABOUT THE NEURAL PERMANENT
- 13 PROGRAM. FROM 2018 TO 2020 WITH THE MODEST INCREASE IN OUR
- 14 CONSULTANT BUDGET, MTC SUBSCRIBED TO ADDITIONAL DATA SOURCES
- 15 TO SUPPLEMENT THE INITIAL PURCHASE DATA AND ALLOCATE THE
- 16 RESOURCES FOR DATA QUALITY ASSURANCE AND QUALITY CONTROL. A
- 17 LARGE EMPLOYER LIST WAS COMPILED AND THE AIR DISTRICT STARTED
- 18 ENFORCEMENT RELATED ACTIVITIES. THEN FROM 2020 TO 2022, AS YOU
- 19 CAN IMAGINE, IN CONSIDERATION OF EMPLOYER CHALLENGES WITH THE
- 20 PANDEMIC OUTREACH AND ENFORCEMENT EFFORTS WERE SCALED BACK.
- 21 NOW, GIVEN THE IMPORTANCE OF THE PROGRAM TO SERVE AS A
- 22 STARTING POINT FOR ENS COUPLED WITH EIGHT YEARS OF OPERATIONAL
- 23 EXPERIENCE, MTC DEVELOPED A PROCUREMENT STRATEGY WITH INPUT
- 24 FROM THE AIR DISTRICT THAT FOCUSES ON STRINGING THE FOUNDATION
- 25 OF THE COMMUTER BENEFITS PROGRAM THROUGH PROGRAM PRIORITIES



- 1 BASED ON INCREASING EMPLOYER REGISTRATION THROUGH A ROBUST
- 2 DATABASE AND ENHANCED PURCHASE DATA. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.
- 3 SPEAKING ON THE FUTURE OF THE PROGRAM, MTC AND THE AIR
- 4 DISTRICT IDENTIFIED FOUR AREAS FOR THE PROGRAM'S FUTURE AS
- 5 SHOWN ON THIS SLIDE. IN JANUARY, THIS COMMITTEE AUTHORIZED
- 6 CONTRACT SERVICES WITH SLOLOM, INC. WITH DEVELOPMENT OF A
- 7 ROBUST SALESFORCE DATABASE WORK IS ALREADY UNDERWAY AND
- 8 EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED BY THIS SUMMER. THE FOCUS FOR THIS
- 9 NEW COMMUTER BENEFITS PROGRAM OPERATIONS CONTRACT WHICH IS THE
- 10 SUBJECT OF TODAY'S APPROVAL ITEM IS FOCUSED ON THE OTHER THREE
- 11 AREAS SHOWN ON THE SLIDE, BOLSTERING EMPLOYER REGISTRATION BY
- 12 USING THIS NEW DATABASE AND ENHANCED PURCHASED EMPLOYER DATA
- 13 AND PREPARING THE PROGRAM FOR FUTURE ENHANCEMENTS AS OUTLINED
- 14 IN PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 EN7 STRATEGY. NEXT SLIDE. THE NEW
- 15 SCOPE OF WORK UNDER THE NEW CONTRACT WILL INCLUDE STRATEGIC
- 16 PROGRAM PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION BASED ON IDENTIFIED
- 17 PROGRAM PRIORITIES, EXPANDING LEVELS OF DATABASE MANAGEMENT
- 18 INCLUDING ROBUST DATA QUALITY CONTROL EFFORTS, CREATING AND
- 19 UPDATING WEB SITE CONTENT TO CREATE INVITING, COMPELLING HELP
- 20 RESOURCES FOR BAY AREA EMPLOYERS. DEVELOPING AND IMPLEMENTING
- 21 PROGRAM PROMOTIONAL PLANS AND STRATEGIES AND DEVELOPING AND
- 22 IMPLEMENTING A PROGRAM EVALUATION PLAN IN CONSIDERATION OF THE
- 23 PROGRAM'S PRIORITIES. THE SCOPE INCLUDES TASK THAT IS NEW AND
- 24 DIFFERENT, ALL AIMED AT INCREASING REGISTRATION AND EMPLOYER
- 25 AWARENESS OF THE TOOLS AND PROGRAMS TO HELP THEIR EMPLOYEES.



- 1 THE STRATEGIC PLAN AND PROMOTIONAL PLANS WILL PROVIDE
- 2 OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE COMMUTER BENEFITS TEAM TO KEEP WELL
- 3 INFORMED OF RELEVANT PROGRAMS AND LEGISLATION AND MORE
- 4 IMPORTANTLY SHARE THIS VALUABLE INFORMATION WITH EMPLOYERS.
- 5 NEXT SLIDE. AS A PART OF THE COMMUTER BENEFITS PROGRAM
- 6 OPERATIONS CONSULTANT TASK CONSULTANT MUST IDENTIFY EMPLOYERS
- 7 SUBJECT TO THE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS CONTACT THEM TO INFORM
- 8 THEM OF THE REQUIREMENT AND SUPPORT THE REGISTRATION THIS
- 9 PROVIDES OPPORTUNITY TO INFORM EMPLOYERS ABOUT RELEVANT
- 10 RELATED PROGRAMS LEGISLATION THAT MAY WORK FOR AN EMPLOYER'S
- 11 WEB SITE PROGRAMS SUCH AS CLIPPER BAY PASS PROGRAM RICHMOND
- 12 SAN RAFAEL E-BIKE COMMUTE PROGRAM NEW A.B. 2206 PARKING CASH
- 13 OUT AND BAY WHEELS AND BIKESHARE PROGRAM. NEXT SLIDE. AS PART
- 14 OF THE PROCUREMENT PROCESS MTC POSTED THE NOTICE OF UPCOMING
- 15 OPPORTUNITY ON NOVEMBER 7TH, 2022 AND THE RFP WAS ISSUED ON
- 16 DECEMBER 22ND WITH INFORMATION SHARED WIDELY TO OVER 5,700
- 17 FIRMS AND INDIVIDUALS. A CONFERENCE WAS HELD IN JANUARY 5TH,
- 18 2023 WITH 26 INDIVIDUALS AND 15 FIRMS IN ATTENDANCE WITH
- 19 FOLLOW-UP O&A PROVIDED. AS OF FEBRUARY 1ST PROPOSAL DEADLINE
- 20 MTC RECEIVED ONE PROPOSAL FROM WSP USA. THE EVALUATION PANEL
- 21 AND MTC AND THE AIR DISTRICT STAFF UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS WSP
- 22 USA DUE TO THEIR EXTENSIVE EXPERIENCE IN QUALIFICATIONS THERE
- 23 FIRM AND KEY PROJECT STAFF INVOLVED IN THEIR SUBCONTRACTORS
- 24 LOGICAL APPROACH ACCOMPLISHING SCOPE AND PROGRAM PRIORITIES
- 25 AND THEIR OVERALL COST EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PROPOSAL. IN



- 1 ADDITION THE WSP PROPOSAL EXCEEDS THE 22% DISADVANTAGED
- 2 BUSINESS ENTERPRISE GOAL ESTABLISHED BY CALTRANS FOR THE
- 3 PROCUREMENT. WE ARE EXCITED TO EMBARK ON THE NEXT PHASE OF THE
- 4 PROGRAM THAT SERVE AS THE FOUNDATION FOR PLANNED BAY AREA
- 5 IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY EN7 TO EXPAND COMMUTE TRIP REDUCTION
- 6 PROGRAMS AT MAJOR EMPLOYERS. BASED ON THIS STAFF RECOMMENDS
- 7 THAT THE COMMITTEE AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR HIS
- 8 DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE TO NEGOTIATE AND ENTER INTO A
- 9 CONTRACT WITH WSP USA TO OPERATE THE COMMUTER BENEFIT PROGRAM
- 10 OPERATIONS CONTRACT FOR A THREE YEAR TERM IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO
- 11 EXCEED \$4,998,938 WITH AN OPTION TO EXTEND UP TO TWO
- 12 ADDITIONAL YEARS SUBJECT TO MTC BUDGETS FOR FUTURE FISCAL
- 13 YEARS. I THANK YOU, COMMISSIONERS, FOR YOUR TIME. AND I'M
- 14 HAPPY TO ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS. IN ADDITION EMILY WAGNER
- 15 ASSISTANT DIRECTOR FOR FIELD OPERATIONS AND ASSET MANAGEMENT
- 16 IS ALSO AVAILABLE AS WELL TO ASSIST WITH ANY QUESTIONS IF
- 17 NEEDED. THANKS VERY MUCH.
- 19 CHAIR, DAVID RABBITT: THANKS CHRISTINE. I'LL LOOK TO MY
- 20 COLLEAGUES FOR QUESTIONS COMMENTS OR CONCERNS. GOING TO THE

- 23 V. CHAIR, SUE NOACK: I HAVE A QUESTION ON THE PROGRAM IN
- 24 GENERAL WITH THE LIMIT AT 50 EMPLOYEES. WITH SO MANY EMPLOYEES
- 25 NOW WORKING FROM HOME, IS THERE ANY THOUGHT ON THAT CHANGING?

- 1 BECAUSE IT SEEMS TO ME THAT YOU COULD HAVE A LARGE NUMBER OF
- 2 PEOPLE AT HOME AND BE REQUIRING THIS FOR TEN EMPLOYEES THAT
- 3 MIGHT BE COMMUTING. IS THERE ANY CONTEMPLATION ON CHANGING THE
- 4 CRITERIA?

- 6 CHRISTINE MALEY-GRUBL: ACTUALLY A COUPLE OF THINGS THAT COME
- 7 TO MIND. CRITERIA IS CURRENTLY 50 OR MORE EMPLOYEES AND THAT'S
- 8 SOMETHING THAT WE CAN WORK WITH THE AIR DISTRICT ON, THAT IS
- 9 PART OF THE CURRENT AIR DISTRICT REGULATION. SECONDLY, ONE OF
- 10 THE THINGS THAT WE DID DO, RECOGNIZING THAT THERE ARE A LOT OF
- 11 EMPLOYEES WORKING FROM HOME, WITHIN THE LAST, MUCH MORE
- 12 RECENTLY WE ADDED AN OPTION FIVE THAT AN EMPLOYER CAN INDICATE
- 13 THAT THEIR EMPLOYEES FOR THE MOST PART ARE TELEWORKING AND
- 14 THAT PROVIDES THE EMPLOYER AND THEIR EMPLOYEES -- THE EMPLOYER
- 15 A WAY TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS TO REGISTER FOR THE
- 16 PROGRAM. SO, I THINK BETWEEN THOSE TWO THINGS, BUT CERTAINLY
- 17 THAT'S SOMETHING WE CAN DISCUSS WITH THE AIR DISTRICT. BUT
- 18 MOVING FORWARD, SHOULD THAT LEGISLATION CHANGE.

- 1 ALFREDO PEDROZA: WE TRIED SOMETHING SIMILAR IN NAPA RIGHT
- 2 BEFORE THE PANDEMIC. WHAT WE LEARNED IS IT'S NOT JUST THE
- 3 VALUE OF THOSE WHO ENROLL BUT THOSE THAT DON'T. DO WE HAVE THE
- 4 ABILITY TO FIND OUT AND INQUIRE WHERE FOLKS MAY NOT ENROLL
- 5 BECAUSE THAT INFORMATION IS JUST AS VALUABLE TO US.

- 7 CHRISTINE MALEY-GRUBL: THAT'S A GOOD QUESTION. A COUPLE OF
- 8 THINGS THAT WE DO ONE OF THE REQUIREMENTS AS PART OF THIS
- 9 LEGISLATION IS THAT AN EMPLOYER NEEDS TO REREGISTER EACH YEAR
- 10 ANNUALLY AND THAT WOULD GIVE US A PICTURES OF PROVIDING US
- 11 WITH WHAT BENEFIT IS PROVIDED TO THEIR EMPLOYEES. SECONDLY,
- 12 WITH FINDING OUT WHO IS NOT REGISTERED, I THINK THAT THAT'S
- 13 SOMETHING THAT WE WOULD BE ABLE TO LOOK AT DOING, AND I WILL
- 14 MAKE A NOTE HERE. AS A PART OF THIS NEW SCOPE OF WORK AND THE
- 15 NEW ROBUST BUDGET THAT WE WILL HAVE, WE WILL HAVE THE
- 16 OPPORTUNITY THROUGH OUR PROMOTIONAL ACTIVITIES TO -- AND ALSO
- 17 THROUGH OUR PROGRAM EVALUATION, TO ASK A QUESTION LIKE THAT,
- 18 TO DETERMINE WHY THERE ARE EMPLOYERS THAT ARE NOT
- 19 PARTICIPATING AND THEN WHAT COULD WE DO TO GET THEM TO
- 20 PARTICIPATE. I THINK HAVING THESE ADDITIONAL RESOURCES AND
- 21 ADDING THESE PLANS, IN ORDER TO FIND OUT THAT INFORMATION WILL
- 22 -- SHOULD MAKE QUITE A DIFFERENCE FOR US AND WE WOULD BE ABLE
- 23 TO OBTAIN MORE INFORMATION FROM EMPLOYERS.



- 1 ALFREDO PEDROZA: AND I APPRECIATE THAT. AND, AGAIN, IT'S THE
- 2 INFORMATION FROM THE EMPLOYEES AND THEN THE INFORMATION FROM




