- 9 SLIDE. SFEP, SAN FRANCISCO ESTUARY PARTNERSHIP, THEIR
- 10 PUBLICATION, THE ESTUARY BLUEPRINT, IS PUBLISHED EVERY FOUR
- 11 YEARS, A CREATION OF STRATEGY TO BOLSTER THE REGION'S

- 25 TOPICS OF INTEREST, WE PROVIDED 109 DATA PACKETS ACROSS THE

2	ELEMENTS. NEXT SLIDE. ONE OF THE TOOLS WAS INTERACTIVE SITE

- 17 ANOTHER AREA WHERE MTC PROVIDING A LOT OF SUPPORT. TYPING OF
