- 14 PRESENTATION TODAY. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO, SOME BACKGROUND ON
- 15 THIS ITEM. IN 2012, MTC INVESTED \$10 MILLION IN THE TRANSIT
- ORIENTED AFFORDABLE HOUSING FUND, THE ACRONYM FOR WHICH IS TOA
- 17 AND THE LOANS ORIGINATION PERIOD HAS EXPIRED. IT EXPIRED IN
- 18 APRIL OF 2022. I APOLOGIZE, I NOTE THIS MORNING THE SUMMARY
- 19 SHEET IN YOUR PACKETS ERRONEOUSLY STATES IT EXPIRED IN APRIL
- 20 BUT IT'S EXPIRED OVER A YEAR NOW AND WITH THE FUNDING
- 21 AGREEMENT WITH THE FUND MANAGER. THIS OFFERED PAUSE TO ASSESS
- 22 THE EFFICACY OF THE PROGRAM AND HIGHEST BEST USE OF THE
- 23 AGENCY'S EXISTING AFFORDABLE HOUSING FUNDS IN LIGHT OF BAHFA'S
- 24 LAUNCH LAST YEAR. THE INVESTMENT FACILITATED CONSTRUCTION OF
- 25 1600 UNITS WHICH IS SOMETHING TO CELEBRATE HOWEVER THERE ARE



- 1 CHALLENGES IN UTILIZING THE FUNDS AND OPPORTUNITIES HAVE
- 2 EMERGED SINCE LAUNCH OF BAHFA LAST YEAR. GIVEN CURRENT
- 3 PRIORITIES BAHFA RECOMMENDS TO CONTINUE TO INVEST \$5 MILLION
- 4 IN THE ORIGINAL TOA PROGRAM INTO THE PROGRAM AND REPURPOSE
- 5 REMAINING \$5 MILLION TO ESTABLISH NEW RENTAL ASSISTANCE PILOT
- 6 FOCUSED ON VULNERABLE RENTERS LIKE SENIORS FULL FULFILLING
- 7 BAHFA'S MANDATE TO PREVENT DISPLACEMENT. SOME OVERVIEW OF THE
- 8 TOA PROGRAM FOR THOSE LESS FAMILIAR PURPOSE IS TO ASSIST
- 9 DEVELOPERS WITH THE PURCHASE OF PROPERTIES NEAR TRANSIT FOR
- 10 THE DEVELOPMENT OR REDEVELOPMENT OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND
- 11 COMMUNITY SERVICES. IT'S A \$50 MILLION RESOLVING LOAN FUND
- 12 CREATED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FINANCIAL
- 13 INSTITUTIONS SO OF THAT \$15 MILLION \$10 MILLION WAS MTC'S SEED
- 14 INVESTMENT AND THAT WAS MATCHED WITH \$40 MILLION FROM OUR CDFI
- 15 PARTNERS. MANAGED BY THE LOCATION INVESTMENT FUND OR LIF, AND
- 16 LOANS ARE ORIGINATED BY A CONSORTIUM OF FIVE DIFFERENT
- 17 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FINANCING INSTITUTIONS ALONGSIDE LIF.
- 18 SOME KEY PROGRAM FEATURES INCLUDE THAT PROJECTS MUST BE
- 19 LOCATED IN PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT AREAS AND TRANSIT PRIORITY
- 20 AREAS AS A TOC PROGRAM. AND BORROWERS MAY UTILIZE LOANS FOR
- 21 EITHER ACQUISITION OR PREDEVELOPMENT FUNDING WITH CAPS ON THE
- 22 AMOUNT THAT CAN BE USED FOR PREDEVELOPMENT. ONE MORE SLIDE
- 23 OVER. SO SOME OF THE CHALLENGES WITH UTILIZATION SINCE
- 24 INCEPTION OVER THE LAST FEW YEARS. SO, SINCE 2019 ONLY ONE OF
- 25 THE FIVE ORIGINATORS ENTERPRISE COMMUNITY LOAN FUND HAS



1	CONSISTENTLY UTILIZED THE FUND IN RESEARCHING THIS AND
2	UNDERSTANDING WHY BY TALKING TO THE ORIGINATING LENDERS WE
3	FOUND A COUPLE REASONS. ONE IS SOME PROSPECTIVE PROJECTS ARE
4	LOCATED JUST OUTSIDE OF A PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT AREA OR TRANSIT
5	PRIORITY AREA WHICH ARE KEY ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS TO ENSURE
6	THIS IS A TRANSIT ORIENTED FUND. BUT WHAT HAS BEEN EVEN MORE
7	RESTRICTIVE IS THE FACT THAT COMPARABLE LOAN PRODUCTS ON THE
8	MARKET RIGHT NOW HAVE MORE COMPETITIVE TERMS. SO THE WAY THAT
9	THE LOANS WERE STRUCTURED IN OUR FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH LIF
10	CAPPED THE LOAN TO VALUE RATIO TO 110% AND THE PREDEVELOPMENT
11	LOAN SIZE TO 750,000, WHICH ARE LOWER THAN WHAT BORROWERS ARE
12	ABLE TO GET FROM OTHER SOURCES OF FUNDING. AND THEN, FINALLY,
13	THERE IS A LIMITED AMOUNT OF PERMANENT FINANCING OUT THERE
14	THAT CAN BE LEVERAGED WITH TOA IT'S IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT A
15	SUCCESSFUL 2024 BAHFA GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND COULD PROVIDE
16	PRODUCTION FUNDS NEEDED TO ACQUIRE LAND AND MOVE FORWARD WITH
17	CONSTRUCTION. IN TERMS OF THE PROPOSED PROGRAM CHANGES IN
18	LIGHT OF THESE CHALLENGES FIRST ARE REDUCE MTC'S INVESTMENT IN
19	IT. OA FROM \$10 MILLION TO \$5 MILLION AN ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF ITS
20	IMPORTANCE IN HAVING FACILITATED THE PRODUCTION OF UNITS WHILE
21	ACKNOWLEDGING THE CURRENT MOMENT. I'LL NOTE THAT WE LANDED ON
22	\$5 MILLION, SPECIFICALLY IN CONVERSATION WITH LIF AND
23	ENTERPRISE COMMUNITY LOAN FUND BECAUSE THERE IS STILL \$4.2

MILLION IN OUTSTANDING LOANS DUE BACK TO ENTERPRISE BY 2025

AND WE WOULD LIKE TO LEAVE ROOM FOR LENDERS TO MAKE A COUPLE

- 1 OF NEW LOANS OVER THE NEXT COUPLE OF YEARS UNTIL OUTSTANDING
- 2 LOANS ARE PAID AND CONTINUE TO REVOLVE INTO NEW LOANS THROUGH
- 3 THE END OF THE TERM SECOND PROGRAM REVISION EXTENDING
- 4 ORIGINATION PERIOD TO 2030. OVERALL FUND TERM ENDS IN 2035 BUT
- 5 BECAUSE THE ORIGINATION PERIOD HAS EXPIRED NO NEW LOANS CAN BE
- 6 MADE AT THIS TIME. BY EXTENDING THROUGH 2030 CONTINUING TO
- 7 REVOLVE LOANS THAT CAN BE REPAID AND MAKE NEW LOANS WITHIN
- 8 THAT \$5 MILLION POT. THERE IS ANOTHER RECOMMENDATION TO EXPAND
- 9 THE ELIGIBILITY OF PROJECTS LOCATED -- THOSE LOCATED IN
- 10 PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 GROWTH GEOGRAPHIES. SO, JUST EXTENDING
- 11 FURTHER BEYOND PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT AREAS TO INCLUDE HIGH-
- 12 RESOURCE AREAS AND TRANSIT-RICH AREAS AS PLANNED BAY AREA 2050
- 13 HAS EXPANDED THE DEFINITION OF AREAS WHERE GROWTH IS
- 14 ENCOURAGED AND ANTICIPATE. THEN FINALLY TO GET TO SOME OF THE
- 15 FINANCING TERMS THERE IS RECOMMENDATION TO INCREASE THE
- 16 MAXIMUM LOAN TO VALUE RATIO FROM 110% TO 120% FOR NON-PROFIT
- 17 SPONSORS, TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM PREDEVELOPMENT LOAN SIZE
- 18 FROM \$750,000 TO \$1 MILLION AND FINALLY TO INCREASE THE
- 19 MAXIMUM PREDEVELOPMENT LOAN TERM FROM TWO YEARS TO THREE
- 20 YEARS. WE'RE HOPING THAT WITH THESE THREE CHANGES THAT THE 5
- 21 MILLION THAT REMAINS IN THE FUND WILL BE USED MORE EFFECTIVELY
- 22 AND BE MORE FAVORABLE TO PROSPECTIVE BORROWS. AND I THINK THE
- 23 NEXT SLIDE I'LL KICK IT OVER TO IRENE TO TALK ABOUT HOW THAT
- 24 \$5 MILLION THAT WE FREE UP THROUGH THIS CHANGE WOULD BE USED
- 25 FOR A NEW PROGRAM.

2	SPEAKER: THANK YOU. I'M PLEASED TO SHARE A VISION FOR A NEW
3	RENTAL ASSISTANCE PILOT PROGRAM TO SUPPORT THE STABILITY OF
4	LOW-INCOME BAY AREA RESIDENTS IN THEIR HOMES. AS DESCRIBED IN
5	1487 MANDATED ADVANCEMENT OF PROTECTIONS FOR LOW-INCOME
6	TENANTS IN THE REGION AND RENTAL ASSISTANCE KEY COMPONENT OF
7	PROTECTIONS. THERE ARE NUMEROUS TYPES OF PROGRAMS THROUGHOUT
8	THE COUNTRY PILOTING WAYS TO SUPPORT LOW-INCOME COMMUNITIES
9	WITH DIFFERENT TYPES OF CASH TRANSFER RENTAL ASSISTANCE AND
10	EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS. THIS GAINED MOMENTUM
11	DURING THE PANDEMIC AND WE HAVE MUCH TO LEARN AND BUILD OFF OF
12	EVEN IN OUR OWN BACKYARDS. WE HOPE TO FOCUS THE POPULATION OF
13	THIS PROGRAM ON SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES IN
14	RECOGNITION OF THE PARTICULAR FRAGILITY OF THESE COMMUNITIES
15	AND THE VERY FAST INCREASE IN HOMELESSNESS THAT WE ARE SEEING.
16	A FEW DATA POINTS I'LL HIGHLIGHT ON THE RIGHT SIDE. THERE ARE
17	CURRENTLY APPROXIMATELY 575,000 PEOPLE AT RISK OF HOMELESSNESS
18	IN THE BAY AREA, ACCORDING TO A TURNER CENTER REPORT FROM
19	2021, AND THE MOST RECENT PIT COUNT EXCUSE ME POINT IN TIME
20	COUNT SHOWED APPROXIMATELY 36,800 PEOPLE CURRENTLY
21	EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS THIS ISN'T NEW DATA TO US BUT JUST
22	TO HIGHLIGHT THE URGENCY OF THIS ISSUE. PEOPLE ON FIXED
23	INCOMES FACING SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGES AND STAYING STABLY
24	HOUSED SEEING THE REPORT I REFERENCED SHOWED ONE OF THE MOST
25	VULNERABLE COMMUNITIES TO HOMELESSNESS RIGHT NOW IN THE BAY



- 1 AREA IS SENIORS AND STATEWIDE THE FASTEST RISE OF ANY AGE
- 2 GROUP IN TERMS OF PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN THE LAST FEW YEARS
- 3 HAS BEEN SENIORS. SO 108% INCREASE VERSUS 61% OF OTHER AGE
- 4 GROUPS. AMONG OLDER ADULTS HOMELESSNESS IS OFTEN TIED TO A
- 5 FINANCIAL CRISIS DUE TO LOSS OF SAVINGS, INABILITY TO CONTINUE
- 6 TO WORK, HEALTH CRISIS, AND OTHER ISSUES THAT ARISE THAT ARE
- 7 HARDER TO FIX THROUGH JUST GETTING A JOB. THIS IS ALSO AN
- 8 ISSUE OF RACIAL EQUITY BLACK AND OLDER RENTERS IN CALIFORNIA
- 9 ARE MOST LIKELY TO BE COST BURDENED AND SEVERELY COST BURDENED
- 10 THAT MEANS PAYING MORE THAN 30 OR 50% OF YOUR INCOME. NEXT
- 11 SLIDE. SO, I'M GOING TO GIVE A BRIEF OVERVIEW TODAY. THERE
- 12 WILL BE MORE INFORMATION ABOUT THIS PROGRAM COMING OUT. BUT I
- 13 KNOW YOU'RE ALL -- IT'S BEEN A BUSY MEETING. SO JUST TO KEEP
- 14 GOING. AGAIN, WE'RE PLANNING TO FOCUS THIS POPULATION ON
- 15 EXTREMELY LOW-INCOME AND LOW-INCOME RENTERS CAN -- THAT
- 16 PRESENT A HIGHER RISK OF HOMELESSNESS, RISK OF DISPLACEMENT
- 17 AND LOW ABILITY TO INCREASE INCOME. I WANT TO SHARE BAHFA
- 18 PLANS AT THE TOP HERE BAHFA DOES ENVISION ADMINISTERING THIS
- 19 PROGRAM THROUGH A CONTRACT WITH A HIGHLY EXPERIENCED AND
- 20 QUALIFIED SERVICE PROVIDER. SO ALL OF THE TERMS I'M SHARING
- 21 TODAY WOULD BE FINALIZED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THAT SERVICE
- 22 PROVIDER IN RECOGNITION THAT THEY REALLY HAVE THE EXPERIENCE
- 23 THAT WE WANT TO TAP INTO AND WE WANT TO FORM OUR PROGRAM IN A
- 24 WAY, YOU KNOW THIS IS OUR VISION BUT WE WANT TO FORM THE
- 25 PROGRAM AND ADMINISTER OF PROGRAM IN THE MOST EFFICIENT AND



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 - 1 EFFECTIVE WAY POSSIBLE AND THAT MEANS BUILDING UPON THAT
 - 2 EXPERTISE AND CREATING A CONTRACT THAT WILL ALLOW US TO BUILD
 - 3 ON THAT EXPERTISE. THE FORM OF TERMS WE LOOKED AT A LOT OF
 - 4 DIFFERENT PROGRAMS AROUND THE BAY. THERE IS GUARANTEED INCOME
 - 5 OR SHALLOW SUBSIDY PROGRAM IN PRETTY MUCH EVERY COUNTY AND
 - 6 MOST CITIES IN THE RENAL RIGHT NOW. SO WE ALSO ENVISION THIS
 - 7 FUNDING BEING SOMETHING THAT ONE OF THOSE EXISTING PROGRAMS OR
 - 8 A PILOT, YOU KNOW, I JUST READ ABOUT A NEW PILOT THAT SANTA
 - 9 CLARA COUNTY IS TRYING TO LAUREN FOR GUARANTEED INCOME
 - 10 YESTERDAY. SO THE IDEA IS WE DON'T WANT TO REINVENT THINGS WE
 - 11 WANT TO AUDIO AND MAKE SURE THAT WHAT WE'RE DOING IS HELPING
 - 12 PEOPLE STAY HOUSED AND DOING SO IN THE MOST EFFICIENT WAY
 - 13 POSSIBLE. TO THAT END THE ASSISTANCE THAT WE PLAN TO OFFER
 - 14 THROUGH THESE FUNDS IS FIRST AND FOREMOST RENTAL ASSISTANCE.
 - 15 OUR FOUNDING LEGISLATION ALLOWS US TO GIVE ONGOING RENTAL
 - 16 ASSISTANCE FOR UP TO 48 MONTHS WITH OPPORTUNITY TO RENEW TERMS
 - 17 FOR SENIORS. AND A CONNECTION WE ALSO ENVISION THERE BEING A
 - 18 CONNECTION WITH OTHER HOUSING, HOUSE AND SOCIAL SUPPORTS AND
 - 19 RECOGNITION OF THE POPULATION'S NEED AND HOPEFULLY THAT PEOPLE
 - 20 CAN BE CONNECTED WITH OTHER SERVICES THAT CAN SUPPORT THEM
 - 21 INSTEAD OF THESE FUNDS. AS I SAID WE WILL BE CONTRACTING WITH
 - 22 AN EXPERIENCED SERVICE PROVIDER TO OPERATE AND EVALUATE THE
 - 23 PILOT AND AS BAHFA IS WELL-POSITIONED IN THE REGION WE HOPE TO
 - 24 COORDINATE WITH OTHER PILOTS IN THE REGION AND STATE TO SPREAD
 - 25 LEARNING FROM THE EVALUATIONS THAT ARE HAPPENING AND TO



- 1 INCREASE THE VISIBILITY OF HOW IMPORTANT THESE PROGRAMS ARE TO
- 2 PREVENT HOMELESSNESS AND STABILIZE OUR LOW-INCOME COMMUNITIES.
