- 18 AND THE PURPOSE OF THIS, ALL THIS WORK, WAS TO ENSURE THAT OUR
- 19 EOUITY FRAMEWORK IS FULLY EMBEDDED IN OUR BAHFA PROGRAMS. WE

KATE HARTLEY: WELL, FOR A \$10 BILLION BALLOT MEASURE WE WOULD 1 HAVE \$2 BILLION, AT 20%, AND WE EXPECT THAT THERE WILL BE FIVE 2 3 DIFFERENT ISSUANCES. SO, WE'LL HAVE EVERY 2 TO 3 YEARS, WE WILL ISSUE THE BONDS FOR BAHFA AND ALL THE COUNTIES. SO, FOR 4 5 BAHFA, WE'LL HAVE 2 BILLION DIVIDED BY FIVE IS 400 MILLION PER 6 TRANCHE. AND THEN THAT MUST BE SPENT ACCORDING TO THE RULES OF 1487. ALSO, I DEPARTMENT TO JUST ACKNOWLEDGE THAT WE 7 8 COMMISSIONED A PIPELINE STUDY OF ALL NINE COUNTIES. EVERY COUNTY HAS PIPELINE PROJECTS FOR WHICH IT DOES NOT HAVE 9 10 SUFFICIENT FUNDING. SO WE WANT TO WORK WITH ALL THE COUNTIES TO ENSURE THAT ALL OF THOSE PIPELINE PROJECTS THAT ALREADY ARE 11 IN SOME STATE OF PREDEVELOPMENT, SOME ARE EVEN READY TO GO 12 NOW, AND JUST DON'T HAVE FUNDING, THOSE ARE PRIORITIZED AND 13 BAHFA WANTS TO SEE THOSE MOVE QUICKLY. BUT EVERY COUNTY HAS 14 15 PIPELINE OF UNFUNDED PROJECTS. 16 CINDY CHAVEZ: THAT'S GREAT. AND THEN MY QUESTION WOULD BE, IF 17 THAT'S THE CASE, THEN SHOULD THE 20% BE AS PRESCRIPTIVE AS 18 THIS? OR -- AND IS THERE A WAY TO -- FOR THE -- YOU KNOW, FOR 19 FUNDS TO BE DRAWN DOWN MORE QUICKLY, PARTICULARLY ON THE 20 21 CONSTRUCTION SIDE? 22 KATE HARTLEY: WELL, WE CAN LOOK AT THE -- THE NUMBER OF 23 ISSUANCES, AND THAT'S ONE REASON THAT WE'RE COMING TOGETHER. 24

IT'S POSSIBLE THAT, BECAUSE OF THE PIPELINE, WE ONLY DO THREE



ISSUANCES. WE WANT TO -- WE WANT TO -- WE WANT TO ANALYZE 1 WHAT'S READY TO GO, HOW LONG IT WILL TAKE TO GET THAT MONEY 2 3 OUT THE DOOR, LEVERAGE OTHER FUNDS. ONE OF THE DIFFICULTIES THAT WE FACE, AS A REGION, IS THAT EVEN IF A COUNTY HAS FULLY 4 5 FUNDED A PROJECT ON ITS OWN TERMS, ACCORDING TO ITS OWN NOFA, THAT PROJECT MAY GET STUCK AT THE STATE AND DOES GET STUCK AT 6 THE STATE BECAUSE THERE IS INSUFFICIENT TAX EXEMPT BOND 7 8 FINANCING TO ALLOW EVERY PROJECT TO MOVE FORWARD ON ITS OWN TIMELINE. SO THAT'S WHY IT'S IMPORTANT THAT BAHFA WAS AB ABLE 9 10 TO BE A LEADER IN FUNDING NON-LIHTC AFFORDABLE HOUSING, WHICH IS WHAT WE WANT TO DO. BECAUSE WE WILL BE PUTTING THESE NEW 11 RESOURCES OUT INTO OUR ECOSYSTEM, WE'RE NOT GETTING IN 12 ADDITIONAL FEDERAL RESOURCES IN BONDS AND CREDITS ANY TIME 13 SOON, KNOWING WHAT'S HAPPENING IN CONGRESS. SO, WE, ALL, HAVE 14 15 TO ACKNOWLEDGE THAT, AND PACE THE BOND ISSUANCES ACCORDINGLY. 16 BECAUSE NEED TO SPEND THOSE BONDS FOR EACH ISSUANCE, EVERY --17 BY THREE YEARS, AT THE MOST. 18 CINDY CHAVEZ: RIGHT. AND I UNDERSTAND THAT. I CAN SAY THAT A 19 NUMBER OF OUR PROJECTS ARE BEING HELD UP EXACTLY BECAUSE OF 20 THAT, AND BECOMING MORE EXPENSIVE EVERY SINGLE DAY THAT WE 21 CAN'T GET THEM MOVING. AGAIN, WHICH IS WHY I HAVE CONCERNS 22 ABOUT ADDING, BOTH, ANOTHER PROCESS, AND ALSO JUST WONDERING 23 HOW QUICKLY FUNDS WILL BE AVAILABLE AT A LOCAL LEVEL. BUT, 24

SO, IT'S IMPORTANT, AND WE HAVE FULL 19 BUY-IN FROM THE -- THE HOUSING STAFF WITH WHOM WE SPOKE, THAT 20 21 THERE WILL BE EXTENSIVE CITY OUTREACH EFFORT, AND IT WILL BE COLLABORATIVE, AND WE'LL ALSO BE LOOKING AT THE PIPELINE 22 PROJECTS IN EACH COUNTY SO THAT ALL OF THOSE PROJECTS THAT ARE 23

DISBURSED, COUNTY-WIDE, CAN BE PRIORITIZED. BUT HAVING THAT



COMMUNICATION PLAN IN PLACE IS WHAT WE'LL BE WORKING WITH THE 1 2 COUNTIES TO DELIVER AND TO IMPLEMENT. 3 PAT ECKLUND: BUT -- BUT WHAT IF THERE IS A CONFLICT WHERE THE 4 5 COUNTY IS PUTTING ANOTHER CITY, OR ONE OF THEIR OWN PROJECTS BEFORE ONE THAT IS READY TO GO AND SO WE'RE NOT IN THAT HIGH 6 PRIORITY THAT FACTOR? SO WHAT IF THERE IS A CONFLICT? CITIES IN EACH COUNTY CAN DESIGN SO THAT YOU EXPEDITE THE 1 2 HOUSING THAT'S ALREADY IN PROCESS. 3 JESSE ARREGUIN: THAT'S HELPFUL. I JUST REALLY WANT TO 4 5 EMPHASIZE THAT POINT.
