I NEED MY 3 CLOCK HERE. 4 5 CLERK, WALLY CHARLES: TWO MINUTES. 6 7 SPEAKER: THIS BUDGET LOOKS REASONABLE. I'M SEEING THAT IT'S 8 BALANCED, AT LEAST FOR THE NEXT FEW YEARS, WHICH IS A GOOD THING. I'M NOT SEEING A BREAKDOWN OVER WHAT OUR OPERATING FEE 9 10 PRESIDENCY ARE GOING TO BE WITHIN THE LINE ITEM, WE HAVE GOT TO PAY THOSE AND THAT'S JUST PART OF DOING BUSINESS PAYING 11 BANK FEES AND MTC IS VERY GOOD AT NEGOTIATING THAT. CLIPPER 12 TWO IS THE REALLY BIG ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM, COMING UP. LOOKS 13 LIKE WE HAVE OUR MONEY AVAILABLE FOR THAT. BUT, OVERALL, THE 14 BUDGET LOOKS CLEAR. IT MAKES PROVISIONS AS FAR AS THE RTC 15 16 PROGRAM, OF WHICH I AM A MEMBER OF. AND WITH VARIOUS CLARIFYING VARIOUS MOBILE APP FEES, BECAUSE IT DOES TAKE 17 FUNDS, IT DOES COST MONEY TO CREATE TO PAY MOBILE CARDS. EVEN 18 THOUGH THERE ISN'T A PIECE OF PLASTIC, THERE IS TILL MONEY IN 19 THERE. WE'RE FUNDING THAT, AND HOPEFUL WE CAN TRY TO KEEP THE 20 21 MOBILE CARDS FREE TO THE USER AS LONG AS POSSIBLE. BUT I HAVE SEEN THESE BUDGETS BEFORE. I THINK WE HAVE A GOOD BUDGET AND 22 WE SHOULD GO FORWARD WITH THIS SO WE CAN GET OUR WORK DONE. 23 THANK YOU. 24

- 13 A DIRECT SIDE BY SIDE COMPARISON. SO, IF YOU -- I WOULD LIKE
- 14 TO TAKE THAT BACK AND LOOK AT IT. ONE REMINDER, WE'RE NOT
- 15 CHARGING A \$3 A CARD ACQUISITION FEE AT THIS POINT IN TIME.
- 16 BUT WE ARE CHARGING THAT FEE FOR PEOPLE WHO ACQUIRE A PHYSICAL
- 17 PLASTIC CARD, ADULT CARD, NOT A DISCOUNT CATEGORY CARD. AND WE
- 18 MAY WANT TO REVISIT THAT, AS WELL, AT SOME POINTS. SO, I THINK
- 19 IF WE COULD JUST TAKE THAT BACK AND DO A LITTLE BIT OF A SIDE

- 11 BILL CHURCHILL: THE REASON I ASK, IS WE SPEND A LOT OF TIME
- 12 INTERNALLY WITH EACH OF OUR OPERATIONS, WHAT IS THE COST OF
- 13 MANAGING THE MONEY, SO MANAGING CASH IS EXPENSIVE, MANAGING
- 14 CLIPPER CARDS IS MUCH LESS EXPENSIVE. IS THERE YET ANOTHER
- 15 ITERATION DOWNWARD IF WE'RE GOING MOBILE? AND IT WOULD BE
- 16 INTERESTING TO KNOW. THERE IS CLEARLY ADVANTAGES TO OUR
- 17 CUSTOMERS GOING MOBILE, IF THEY HAVE THAT ADVANTAGE, BUT I
- 18 ALSO AGREE, YOU CANDIDATE ELIMINATE THE CARD NOR CAN YOU
- 19 ELIMINATE CASH FOR A HOST REASONS. APPRECIATE IT.

- 21 CAROL KUESTER: WE ARE CLOSELY MONITORING THE SUPPLY OF PLASTIC
- 22 CARDS. I GIVE A LOT OF CREDIT TO THESE FOLKS AND BART FOLKS
- 23 FOR MEETING EVERY WEEK ON FRIDAY I THINK WE'RE HOLDING STEADY.
- 24 BUT IT IS A SUPPLY ISSUE THAT REQUIRES CLOSE MONITORING
- 25 BECAUSE -- AND, REALLY, I LOOK TO BART STAFF FOR THAT BECAUSE



THEY'RE THE BIGGEST SUPPLIER OF CARDS VIA TDMS.
