CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: I WILL NOTE COMMISSIONERS I HAVE SENT 4 5 COMMISSIONERS AN E-MAIL TALKING ABOUT ATTENDANCE AND I 6 ACKNOWLEDGE THAT WE HAVE HAD A LOT OF MEETINGS LATELY. WE'RE TRYING TO SYNCHRONIZE CALENDARS AS MUCH AS WE CAN, AND ALSO 7 8 ACKNOWLEDGE THIS CAN BE ANOTHER FULL-TIME JOB IN ITSELF. BUT I APPRECIATE EVERYONE'S COMMITMENT TO TRY TO ATTEND IN-PERSON. 9 THERE IS SO MUCH ON OUR WORK PLATE THAT WHILE WE DO NEED TO 10 FACILITATE ZOOM BEING ABLE TO HAVE THESE RELATIONSHIPS, TALK 11 ABOUT REGIONAL ISSUES, COMING IN-PERSON IS CRITICAL TO THE 12 WORK AT HAND. I ACKNOWLEDGE CHALLENGES WE FACE BACK AT HOME 13 BUT JUST KNOW IT IS APPRECIATED IF THERE ARE ANY CHALLENGES I 14 15 WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT COMMISSIONERS KNOW THEY CAN REACH OUT 16 AND WE'LL TRY TO ACCOMMODATE AS MUCH AS WE CAN BUT WE APPRECIATE ATTENDANCE IN-PERSON AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE. WE HAD TO 17 CANCEL SOME MEETINGS FIRST TIME IN MTC HISTORY NOT PART OF THE 18 HISTORY BOOKS WE WANT TO BE PART OF BUT STAFF DOES A LOT TO 19 TRY TO FACILITATE THESE MEETINGS WE'LL CONTINUE TO LOOK AT 20 AGENDAS TO STREAMLINE MEETINGS TO MAKE THEM SHORTER YET 21 22 PRODUCTIVE. MY COMMITMENT ON THAT, AS WELL. MOVING TO ITEM FIVE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL REPORT. RANDI, TAKE IT AWAY. 23 24

ADINA WILL BE GIVING A REPORT HER SUBCOMMITTEE. 4 5 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: ADINA IS UNMUTED. 6 7 8 RANDI KINMAN: THANK YOU. 9 ADINA LEVIN: DO YOU WANT ME TO START OR YOU START AND I'LL 10 11 PICK UP? 12 RANDI KINMAN: PLEASE. 13 14 ADINA LEVIN: THE TRANSFORMATION ACTION PLAN SUBCOMMITTEE MET 15 16 AND DISCUSSED THE TRANSITION TO THE VOICE OF THE CUSTOMER COMMITTEE AND HOW WE'LL BE INCLUDING WORKING WITH THE EXTERNAL 17 STAKEHOLDERS ON THAT COMMITTEE AS WELL AND ARE LOOKING FORWARD 18 TO THE NETWORK MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE TAKING THE NEXT STEP THIS 19 YEAR. WE, ALSO TALKED ABOUT CLIPPER START AND. 20 21 22 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: ADINA, WE LOST YOU. 23 RANDI KINMAN: ADINA, ARE YOU STILL THERE? 24 25

RANDI KINMAN: YEAH. I WILL GO AHEAD AND GO ON WITH THE REST OF 4 5 THE REPORT. THE EOUITY AND ACCESS SUBCOMMITTEE TRIED TO MEET LAST MONTH. THEY COULD NOT CALL TOGETHER A MEETING BECAUSE OF 6 A -- THERE WAS A OUORUM ISSUE. THEY WILL BE MEETING AGAIN ON 7 8 FRIDAY AT WHICH POINT THEY WILL BE NOMINATING CHAIRS AND VICE CHAIRS. SO, I WILL BE CHAIRING THE EOUITY ACCESS SUBCOMMITTEE 9 FOR THE NEXT TWO MONTHS WHILE THEY GET A CHAIR AND A VICE 10 CHAIR. THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL DID MEET AND ELECTED A VICE 11 CHAIR. I WOULD LIKE YOU TO WELCOME PAM CAMPOS TO THE MIX OF 12 CHAIRS AND VICE CHAIRS THAT WE WILL HAVE. PAM WILL BE MY VICE 13 CHAIR FOR THE DURATION OF THIS TERM. THE POLICY ADVISORY 14 COUNCIL ALSO HEARD MTC'S DRAFT 2023 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PLAN. 15 A LOT OF CONVERSATION ON THAT, AND A LOT OF INPUT FROM MEMBERS 16 OF OUR BODY THE ONE THING THAT WAS TELLING ABOUT THIS, IS IT'S 17 OBVIOUS THAT WE HAVE NEW PEOPLE, THAT THIS WAS NOT AN UPDATE -18 - IT WAS NOT A NEW THING, THAT IT WAS AN UPDATE. BUT THE 19 CONVERSATION WAS GREAT. THE SECOND ITEM WE HAD ON OUR AGENDA 20 21 WAS THE PUBLIC OPINION POLL RESEARCH FINDINGS WHICH WERE RATHER DISMAYING FOR ALL OF US REGARDING ANY POTENTIAL SUPPORT 22 FOR BALLOT INITIATIVES. I HOPE WE CAN MAKE THOSE NUMBERS COME 23 BACK UP BECAUSE OUR BODY STRONGLY FEELS THAT WE ARE IN NEED OF 24 GOVERNING OURSELVES BY RAISING OUR OWN MONEY FOR OUR 25

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TRANSPORTATION NEEDS IN THE BAY AREA. ALONG WITH THAT, THE 1 STAFF HAS CONDUCTED A SURVEY TO FIGURE OUT WHICH DAY OUR 2 3 SUBCOMMITTEES AND OUR COUNCIL WILL BE MEETING, SO THAT WE CAN BUNDLE OUR MEETINGS TOGETHER. WE HAVE LANDED ON FRIDAYS, WHICH 4 5 IS GOING TO BE INTERESTING, BECAUSE I HAVE ALREADY HEARD FROM SEVERAL PEOPLE THAT FRIDAYS WILL BE A NO GO POWER THEM. SO I 6 EXPECT TO LOSE A FEW MEMBERS THAT WAY. STAFF HAS ALSO CENT OUT 7 8 A MEMO BECAUSE WE HAVE BEEN HAVING TROUBLE GETTING COMPLIANCE WITH THE BROWN ACT AND RESOLUTION 3931 REVISED ON ATTENDANCE, 9 REMINDING PEOPLE OF THEIR ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS IN-PERSON, 10 AND THEY'LL BE COMPILING A LIST OF ATTENDANCE RECORDS AND I 11 HOPE THAT BETWEEN NOW AND NEXT MONTH SOMETIME, WE CAN FIND 12 TIME TO CARVE OUT WITH MY, WITH STAFF, MY VICE CHAIR, AND THE 13 CHAIR AND THE VICE CHAIR OF THE COMMISSION, TIME TO GO OVER 14 15 THAT REPORT. BECAUSE WE'RE HAVING REALLY BIG ISSUES. THAT ENDS 16 MY REPORT.

SO, THIS ALL HAPPENED WHEN A.B. 144 GAVE THE BAY AREA 18 TOLL AUTHORITY A LOT MORE RESPONSIBILITY IN THE TOLL BRIDGE 19 SEISMIC PROGRAM AND FUNDING OF THAT. IT'S OUR FIRST EFFORT 20 21 INTO STAFF CONSOLIDATION, ABOUT 20 EMPLOYEES CAME OVER FROM CALTRANS AND SUCCESSFULLY BECAME PART OF OUR FAMILY AND 22 CONTINUE TO WORK FOR A COUPLE OF DECADES HERE. SO WE WANTED TO 23 SAY GOODBYE TO THEM. MOVING TO KEY UPDATES THIS BUILDING HAS 24 HOSTED QUITE A LOT OF ACTIVITY IN THE LAST FEW WEEKS, JUST TO 25

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MENTION A COUPLE OF THEM, SECRETARY TOKES OMOSHAKIN FROM THE 1 STATE TRANSPORTATION AGENCY WAS HERE FOR A TRANSIT LISTENING 2 3 SESSION INCLUDED ALL THE NORTHERN CALIFORNIA OPERATORS AS WELL AS THE ONES IN THE BAY AREA HE BROUGHT HIS ENTIRE EXEC STAFF 4 5 AND SOME FROM CALTRANS HEADOUARTERS. CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION HAD A TWO DAY WORKSHOP AND MEETING IN THE BUILDING I'LL 6 MENTION THE PARTICULARS THEY APPROVED FOR US NEXT. WE HAD THE 7 8 OWNER'S NIGHT BY THE CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION THAT BROUGHT IN A BUNCH OF OUR PUBLIC WORKS OWNERS LIKE BART, 9 CALTRANS, VTA REALLY FROM ALL OVER THE REGION AND HAD A NICE 10 SHOWING WITH THAT ASSOCIATION. WE ALSO HAD AN EVENT SPONSORED 11 BY THE WOMEN'S TRANSPORTATION SEMINAR WHERE THEY HOSTED THE 12 CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION IN THE BUILDING AND 13 YESTERDAY WE HAD A NICE WARM CELEBRATION OF LIFE FOR JAY OUR 14 EMPLOYEE WHO PASSED AWAY A LITTLE WHILE AGO IN. WE HAD THE 15 16 HONOR OF HAVING THERESE MCMILLAN BACK IN THE BUILDING IT WAS REALLY NICE. THE CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION APPROVED 17 OUR APPLICATION TO PROVIDE TOLLING ON STATE ROUTE 37 I WANT TO 18 THANK COMMISSIONER SPERING FOR COMMENTS AT THE PUBLIC MEETING 19 AND ALSO COMMISSIONER DINA EL-TAWANSY FOR HAVING MY BACK 20 THROUGH A LONG PROCESS BUT IT WAS SUCCESSFUL IN THE END WE'RE 21 22 GOING TO SEE A LOT MORE ABOUT STATE ROUTE 37 IN FRONT OF THIS 23 COMMISSION OVER TIME. I DID MENTION THE LISTENING SESSION IT'S HELPFUL FOR THE SECRETARY TO HEAR FROM TRANSIT OPERATORS. IT 24 CLEARLY IS A STATEWIDE PROBLEM THAT WE'RE TRYING TO ADDRESS, 25

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AND HE COMMITTED TO GOING BACK TO SACRAMENTO AND HELPING US, 1 ALTHOUGH WE'RE STRUGGLING TO SEE WHAT THAT HELP IS GOING TO BE 2 3 AT THIS POINT. THE WTS EVENT DID, ALSO, GIVE THERESE MCMILLAN THE 2023 MAYOR PETERS INSPIRATIONAL LEADER AWARD. SO THAT WAS 4 5 NICE TO SEE. SO AB 817 IS A BROWN ACT BILL THIS YEAR 18 HAS BEEN, SORT OF, VIEWED AS A COMPROMISED PIECE OF 19 LEGISLATION THAT IS THE MOST POLITICALLY VIABLE. DOING 20 21 ANYTHING IN SACRAMENTO RELATED TO BROWN ACT REFORM IS 22 INCREDIBLY CHALLENGING. THERE WERE SEVERAL LEGISLATIVE 23 PROPOSALS THAT COULD EXTEND REMOTE MEETINGS FOR BOARDS COMMISSIONERS AND ADVISORY BOARDS ET CETERA THAT WOULD 24 ESSENTIALLY EXTEND WHAT WAS ALLOWED DURING THE STATE 25

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EMERGENCIES TO EXTEND PAST STATE EMERGENCIES AND YOU KNOW 1 UNFORTUNATELY THOSE PIECE OF LEGISLATION HAVE JUST NOT BEEN 2 3 ABLE TO SECURE THE VOTES REALLY TO MOVE THROUGH ANY COMMITTEE, SORT OF, THE WATER AND PARKS ASSOCIATIONS AND REALLY THE RURAL 4 5 COUNTIES SO FOLKS THAT ARE FROM KNOW AROUND THE STATE THAT ARE REALLY REPRESENTING VAST MAJORITY OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS HAVE 6 COLEAD BEHIND THIS COMPROMISED PROPOSAL WHICH IS REFLECTED IN 7 8 8817 WHICH WOULD ALLOW FOR THOSE PUBLIC BODIES THAT DO NOT MAKE FINAL DECISIONS TO BE ABLE TO CONTINUE TO MEET REMOTELY, 9 10 AND THE COMPROMISE PIECE OF THIS IS THAT IT ALLOWS FOR, SORT OF, EASIER ACCESS AND MORE PARTICIPATION FOR BODIES, AS 11 THEY'RE DISCUSSING ITEMS THAT THEY'RE PLANNING ON SENDING TO A 12 BOARD THAT MAKES A FINAL DECISION, BUT IT STILL RETAINS THE 13 TRANSPARENCY AND PUBLIC ACCESSIBILITY ELEMENT THAT IS REALLY 14 15 IMPORTANT TO FOLKS UP IN SACRAMENTO. AND I WOULD SAY REALLY 16 IMPORTANT HERE AS WELL. SO IF THE BOARD IS GOING TO MAKE A FINAL DECISION THAT THOSE BOARDS ALL NEED TO MEET IN-PERSON OR 17 FOLLOW THE EXISTING BROWN ACT TELECONFERENCE LAWS WHICH SAY 18 THAT YOU NEED TO BE POSTING YOUR MEETING LOCATION EVEN IF IT'S 19 AT YOUR HOME AND IT NEEDS TO BE PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE. THAT'S 20 WHAT THIS BILL WOULD DO. SOMETHING THAT'S PRESIDENT ET UNIQUE 21 ABOUT WHY WE'RE BRINGING IT TO YOU RIGHT NOW, THE BILL HAS 22 ACTUALLY BEEN HELD IN A COMMITTEE SO IT HAS BECOME A TWO-YEAR 23 BILL. WE TYPICALLY AT MTC DO NOT BRING YOU TWO YEAR BILLS TO 24 TAKE POSITIONS ON. THE REASON WHY IS THAT NORMALLY IF 25

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SOMETHING BECOMES A TWO-YEAR BILL IT MEANS THAT MORE 1 NEGOTIATION ON LANGUAGE IS GOING TO BE NEEDED BEFORE IT MOVES 2 3 FORWARD. AND IN THIS CASE, THE IDEA WITH WE HAVE BEEN WORKING CLOSELY WITH THE SPONSORS THE IDEA IS NOT NECESSARILY TO 4 5 CHANGE THE LANGUAGE IT'S TO DO MORE ADVOCACY TO CHANGE THE HEARTS AND MIND UP IN SACRAMENTO AND PROCEED WITH THE SAME 6 PROPOSAL NEXT YEAR. SO WE WOULD LIKE THE COMMITTEE'S -- THE 7 8 COMMISSION'S APPROVAL FOR US TO SUPPORT THIS BILL SO WE CAN, 9 SORT OF, REALLY GEAR UP ON THAT ADVOCACY. 10 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: ALL RIGHT. 8 STATE BUDGET. REBECCA LONG WILL PRESENT THIS ITEM AND OUR VICE
9 CHAIR IS READY WITH OUESTIONS.

REBECCA LONG: GOOD MORNING COMMISSIONERS REBECCA LONG 11 LEGISLATION STAFF YOU JOINED STAFF ON MONDAY IN THE LOBBY THE 12 LEGISLATURE ON TRANSIT FISCAL CLIFF AND IT WAS A DIFFICULT DAY 13 WE HAVE BEEN HAMMERING AWAY AMBITIOUSLY IN COORDINATION WITH 14 15 STATEWIDE PARTNERS, THERE IS A LOT OF RETICENCE TO ADDRESS 16 THIS. THE SENATE SUBCOMMITTEE THAT HANDLES TRANSPORTATION TOOK ACTION TO OPPOSE THE GOVERNOR'S CUTS TO THE TRANSIT INTERCITY 17 RAIL CAPITAL PROGRAM WHICH IS POSITIVE AND CERTAINLY WE 18 SUPPORT RESTORATION OF THAT PROGRAM HOWEVER THERE IS NO 19 ADDITIONAL FUNDING PROPOSED BY THE SENATE OR THE 20 ADMINISTRATION YET TO ADDRESS TRANSIT OPERATIONS SO WE ARE 21 22 ENCOURAGED BUT NOTED IN SOME OF YOUR MATERIALS THAT BOTH THE 23 MAY REVISE AND THE SENATE BUDGET PLAN ACKNOWLEDGE THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS TRANSIT OPERATING SHORTFALL AND ACKNOWLEDGE 24 WANTING TO WORK WITH THE OTHER PARTIES TO ADDRESS IT SO THERE 25

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IS STRONG AWARENESS AMONG THE LEADERSHIP, BUDGET COMMITTEES 1 AND GENERAL LEADERSHIP THIS IS AN URGENT CONCERN BUT WE HAVE 2 3 YET TO SEE HOW THEY PLAN TO ADDRESS IT. IT'S LIVE RIGHT NOW AND THERE IS A LOT OF CONVERSATIONS HAPPENING WITH BOTH 4 5 ASSEMBLY AND SENATE. TOMORROW THE ASSEMBLY WILL BE TAKING ACTION AND YOU KNOW WE HAVE STILL SEVERAL WEEKS BEFORE JUNE 6 15TH, AND I THINK THERE IS LIKELY TO BE SOME THINGS THAT ARE 7 8 DONE IN PUBLIC, IN FORMAL COMMITTEES, LIKE YESTERDAY WHERE IT LOOKED LIKE THE SENATE WASN'T DOING ANYTHING, AND YET 9 CONVERSATIONS ARE STILL ONGOING. SO WE WILL CONTINUE TO KEEP 10 YOU APPRISED. IN OTHER BUDGET RELATED NEWS, YOU HAVE AN ITEM 11 IN YOUR PACKET THAT JUST SUMMARIZES THE MAY REVISE ON HOUSING 12 NO FURTHER CUTS WERE PROPOSED BEYOND WHAT WAS IN THE BUDGET IN 13 JANUARY. THERE WERE A COUPLE OF CHANGES PROPOSED BY THE 14 ADMINISTRATION THAT AFFECT SOME OF OUR PROPOSED SOLUTION FOR 15 16 THE FISCAL CLIFF. SO, FOR EXAMPLE, THE GOVERNOR PROPOSES TO PUT MY CAP-AND-TRADE REVENUE TOWARDS ZERO EMISSION VEHICLES 17 RATHER THAN TRANSIT OPERATIONS, BRINGING THE TOTAL CAP-AND-18 TRADE PROPOSAL FOR ZERO EMISSION VEHICLES TO 1.4 BILLION. WE 19 HAVE BEEN ASKING FOR JUST 500 MILLION TO ADDRESS TRANSIT 20 21 OPERATIONS. AND THEN THE GOVERNOR ALSO PROPOSES TO SHIFT SOME FEDERAL HIGHWAY FUNDS TO BACKFILL OTHER GENERAL FUND NEEDS AND 22 THAT WAS ANOTHER PROGRAM THAT WE WERE HOPING TO TAP INTO TO 23 ADDRESS TRANSIT OPERATIONS. SO WE HAVE A WAYS TO GO, BUT AGAIN 24 VERY LIVE CONVERSATIONS AND JUST WANT TO THANK THE 25

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COMMISSION'S LEADERSHIP AND ALL THE COMMISSIONERS THAT WERE

2 ABLE TO JOIN US ON MONDAY. AND I'M HAPPY TO TAKE ANY
3 QUESTIONS.

5 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU, REBECCA. VICE CHAIR
6 JOSEFOWITZ?

8 V. CHAIR, NICK JOSEFOWITZ: I WANTED TO THANK OUR STAFF AND FELLOW COMMISSIONERS FOR ALL OF THIS, ALL OF THE WORK THAT'S 9 BEEN GOING ON HERE. I KNOW THIS IS A, SORT OF -- NIGHTS AND A 10 FULL-TIME EFFORT AND, SORT OF, ALL HANDS ON DECK ESPECIALLY 11 GIVEN WHAT WE LEARNED ON MONDAY BOTH FROM CONVERSATIONS AND 12 THE STATE SENATE PROPOSAL WHICH WOULD REALLY DO VIRTUALLY 13 NOTHING TO ADDRESS THE FISCAL CLIFF THAT OUR OPERATORS ARE 14 FACING, ESPECIALLY AS SFMTA, BART, AC TRANSIT AND OTHERS. AND 15 16 SOME OF YOU MAY HAVE SEEN THAT IS. FMTA DIRECTOR JEFFREY TUMLIN SAID THAT IF WE CAN'T ADDRESS THE FISCAL CLIFF HE'S 17 GOING TO START, SORT OF, PUTTING IN PLACE A PLAN THAT WOULD 18 CUT ONE BUS LINE A MONTH FOR THE NEXT 20 MONTHS IN SAN 19 FRANCISCO OF THE BART HAS INDICATED THAT THEY MAY NOT BE ABLE 20 21 TO RUN LATE EVENING EARLY MORNING WEEKEND SERVICE IF THESE CUTS COME INTO PLACE. AND I THINK WE WERE ALL VERY HOPEFUL 22 THAT THE STATE LEGISLATURE AND GOVERNOR WOULD DO WHAT THEY 23 TOLD US THEY WOULD DO WHICH IS THEY TOLD US THEY WOULD BE VERY 24 -- THEY CARED A LOT ABOUT TRANSIT, THEY KNOW THAT IT'S 25

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ESSENTIAL TO THE STATE, AND THAT THEY WOULDN'T LET IT DIE, AND 1 UNFORTUNATELY, THE PROPOSAL THAT HAS COME OUT DOESN'T DO THAT 2 3 AT ALL, IT LET'S TRANSIT DIE AND IT'S LEAVING -- IT'S GOING TO LEAVE HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE IN OUR REGION AND EVEN 4 5 MORE AROUND THE STATE WAITING AT BUS STOPS OR BUSES THAT ARE NEVER GOING TO COME WAITING AT BART STATIONS FOR TRANSIT THAT 6 ARE NEVER GOING TO COME. I THINK THERE IS -- I THINK THAT 7 8 SINCE MONDAY THERE HAS BEEN A, WITH THIS REALIZATION, HAS COME A NEW URGENCY FOR US ALL TO KIND OF STEP UP AND MAKE SURE THAT 9 THE LEGISLATURE AND GOVERNOR UNDERSTANDS THAT THIS IS 10 ABSOLUTELY NOT ACCEPTABLE. AND THAT EVEN KNOW THERE ARE MANY 11 PRIORITIES THAT THEY HAVE IN SACRAMENTO THAT THIS CAN'T BE ONE 12 THAT YOU JUST FALLS TO THE BOTTOM OF THE BARREL. AND IF THERE 13 IS -- THE FUTURE OF THE BAY AREA, AND THE FUTURE OF THIS 14 REGION IS A PLACE WHICH IS GOING TO ALLOW EVERYBODY TO THRIVE, 15 16 IS JUST INTIMATELY LINKED WITH THE ABILITY FOR STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT OLD ENOUGH TO DRIVE, FOR SENIORS, FOR LOW-INCOME 17 PEOPLE WHO CAN'T AFFORD A CAR, TO ACTUALLY BE ABLE TO GET TO 18 SCHOOL, TO GET TO THE HOSPITAL, TO GET TO JOBS AND THAT'S WHAT 19 TRANSIT DOES. SO, IS I AM DEEPLY DISAPPOINTED AT THE STATUS 20 QUO, AND I KNOW WE'RE ALL GOING TO COME TOGETHER AND MAKE SURE 21 WE DO EVERYTHING WE CAN OVER THE NEXT FEW WEEKS TO MAKE SURE 22 THAT THE CURRENT PROPOSAL IS NOT THE FINAL PROPOSAL. 23

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CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU. COMMISSIONER PAPAN, SPERING
 AND COMMISSIONER RONEN.

GINA PAPAN: THANK YOU MR. CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR. I AGREE, 4 5 COMPLETELY, WITH THE PASSION HERE. AND I DO THINK THE LEGISLATURE WANTS TO DO THE RIGHT THING. THE GOVERNOR WANTS TO 6 DO THE RIGHT THING, AND I THINK THEY'RE LOOKING TO US, TOO, TO 7 8 ACTUALLY ENSURE THAT THE TRANSIT AGENCIES ARE BETTER THAN EVER BEFORE, THE CUSTOMERS ARE PUT FORWARD HERE. AND IF WE CAN HELP 9 IN THAT PROCESS AND MAKE SURE THERE IS ACCOUNTABILITY, AND 10 THAT THERE -- FUNDING IS SPECIFICALLY FOCUSED -- FORGET THE 11 CLIFF, COMPLETELY, BUT ENSURING THEY'RE BETTER THAN EVER, I'M 12 SURE IS GOING TO SEND A MESSAGE OUT AND MTC REALLY NEEDS TO 13 SHOW A LEADERSHIP ROLE IN THAT ASPECT AND THAT WILL HELP THE 14 LEGISLATURE REALLY GET THE FUNDING THEY NEED. IT'S SO 15 16 IMPORTANT, AND I THINK WE HAVE HEARD THAT MULTIPLE TIMES FROM LEGISLATORS THROUGHOUT THE REGION. THEY HAVE TO BE BETTER. 17 THEY -- I KNOW THEY WANT TO BE BETTER, SO MANY OF THEM. SO 18 LET'S PUT IT ALL UP THERE IN THE RIGHT MANNER SO THAT WE CAN 19 ALL BE VERY PROUD OF SAVING THIS, BECAUSE WE ABSOLUTELY NEED 20 21 TO DO THAT. THANK YOU.

22

23 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: COMMISSIONER SPERING?

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JAMES P. SPERING: YEAH. I THINK THE VICE CHAIR SUMMED IT UP 1 2 QUITE WELL. YOU KNOW, WHEN WE WERE HAVING OUR MEETINGS IN 3 SACRAMENTO, IT WAS VERY DISAPPOINTING WHAT WE'RE HEARING FROM BOTH LEGISLATORS AND ALL OF THE AGENCIES. THE ONE THING, 4 5 THOUGH, I JUST WANT TO ASK THAT WE DON'T OVERLOOK -- AND I WAS LOOKING AT MY NOTES OF ALL THE MEETINGS THAT WE HAD -- AND 6 EVERY SINGLE AGENCY AND EVERY ELECTED OFFICIAL, LEGISLATOR 7 8 THAT WE TALKED WITH TALKED ABOUT ACCOUNTABILITY AND ASSEMBLYMEMBER TING SAID HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE SOME LANGUAGE 9 THAT THEY CAN PUT IN THEIR BILL. I THINK WE HAVE TO -- WE HAVE 10 GOT THE RECOMMENDATION FROM THE BLUE RIBBON AND WE REALLY NEED 11 TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THIS OPPORTUNITY. YOU KNOW? IF WE'RE 12 SERIOUS ABOUT THOSE CHANGES, AND I'M NOT QUITE SURE, YOU KNOW, 13 WHERE THE TRANSIT OPERATORS ARE GOING TO BE ON SOME OF THIS --14 THEY HAVE A CRISIS OF THEIR OWN. BUT I THINK WE NEED TO DECIDE 15 16 WHAT ARE THOSE ACCOUNTABILITY ISSUES THAT WE WANT THAT WE NEED TO SEE IN WRITING AND GIVE THE LEGISLATOR OPPORTUNITY TO 17 INTRODUCE IT. SO THAT PIECE, I DON'T WANT TO SEE US SQUANDER 18 THAT OPPORTUNITY. I REALLY THINK THEY'RE GIVING US AN 19 OPPORTUNITY TO REALLY BRING THOSE ISSUES THAT WE THINK ARE 20 21 REALLY IMPORTANT, AND THAT CHANGES THAT LINE -- ESPECIALLY ON THE NETWORK MANAGER, YOU GUYS ALL KNOW THE LIST. I THINK WE 22 HAVE TO LEVERAGE THAT. AND THE OTHER THING I JUST WANT TO SAY, 23 I WAS REALLY DISAPPOINTED, AND I THINK TO THE VICE CHAIR'S 24 25 COMMENTS, HOW DISCONNECTED MANY OF THE LEGISLATORS ARE FROM

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THE REALITY OF THE PROBLEM THAT WE'RE FACING, AND IF MUNI, 1 BART, ANY OF THEM START TO FAIL, THAT'S A CRISIS FOR 2 3 CALIFORNIA, NOT JUST THE BAY AREA. I MEAN, AND IT'S ANOTHER REFLECTION ON THE DYSFUNCTION THAT WE HAVE. AND, SO, I DON'T 4 5 KNOW WHAT WE CAN DO TO GET LEGISLATORS TO UNDERSTAND THE MAGNITUDE. BUT -- AND THE LAST THING I DO WANT TO SAY IS WE, 6 MTC IS PLAYING A REAL CRITICAL ROLE HERE. AND I HAD MENTIONED 7 8 THIS AT ONE OF OUR PREVIOUS MEETINGS, THESE ARE GOING TO BE SOME DO YOU HAVE AND IMPORTANT DECISIONS THAT WE HAVE TO MAKE. 9 WE HAVE TO STAND UP AND CLARIFY WHAT WE CAN DO AND WHAT OUR 10 EXPECTATION IS FROM THE STATE. SO WE KNOW WHO HAS FAILED THE 11 TRANSIT SYSTEM IN THE BAY AREA. AND SO, BUT, STAFF, I REALLY 12 THINK IT'S IMPORTANT, ON THIS ACCOUNTABILITY, THAT WE SHOULD 13 TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THAT TO PROVIDE WHAT WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE IN 14 15 LANGUAGE AND WHAT WE WOULD LIKE TO HAVE, SORT OF, 16 INSTITUTIONALIZED. THANK YOU, CHAIRMAN.

18 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: COMMISSIONER RONEN?

19

HILLARY RONEN: THANK YOU. I AGREE WITH EVERYTHING THAT'S BEEN
SAID. I WANT TO ADD THAT IN ADDITION TO MUNI HAVING TO CUT A
LINE A MONTH, ONE WAY THAT MTA IS TRYING TO REMAIN AFLOAT IS
BY INCREASING PARKING METERS UNTIL 10:00 P.M. DURING THE WEEK
AND ON SUNDAYS. AND THE AMOUNT OF E-MAILS THAT WE HAVE ALL
RECEIVED RELATED TO THIS, I HAVE NEVER RECEIVED THIS AMOUNT OF

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E-MAILS ON ANY TOPIC OR ANY ISSUE. AND I THINK THAT -- AND 1 2 IT'S FEBRUARY -- FOR A NUMBER OF REASONS, NOT ONLY TRANSIT AGENCIES, BAY AREA RESIDENTS POCKET BOOKS ARE TIGHT RIGHT NOW 3 AND THE NICKEL AND DIMEING ON ALL OF THESE DIFFERENT ISSUES IS 4 5 GETTING HARD TO KEEP UP WITH. SO TO PEOPLE'S POCKET BOOK. BUT NUMBER TWO IS THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY, THE SMALL BUSINESS 6 COMMUNITY THAT BARELY SURVIVED THE PANDEMIC, THAT ARE FINALLY 7 8 STARTING TO GET BACK TO, YOU KNOW, FULL FUNCTIONING AND NORMALITY IS SAYING THIS IS GOING TO CRUSH US, ESPECIALLY 9 RESTAURANTS AND ENTERTAINMENT, THIS IS GOING TO CRUSH THEIR 10 BUSINESS BECAUSE PEOPLE ARE JUST NOT GOING TO COME OUT TO PAY 11 THAT EXTRA \$20 IN PARKING, RISK GETTING A PARTICULATE, ET 12 CETERA. AND SO THE RAMIFICATIONS, THEY'RE JUST -- THEY ARE SO 13 MUCH BROADER THAN JUST THOSE DEPENDENT ON PUBLIC 14 TRANSPORTATION NOT BEING ABLE TO GET TO WORK. THEY'RE GOING TO 15 HIT ALL OF US, EVERYONE, ACROSS INCOME, YOU KNOW, SPHERE, 16 ACROSS THE TYPE OF TRANSPORT THAT YOU USE. AND I THINK THAT WE 17 NEED TO DO A BETTER JOB WITH MESSAGING AND ORGANIZING. AND WE 18 NEED TO -- AND I WISH I HAD DONE THIS, JUST SENT AN FORM E-19 MAIL BACK TO ALL OF THEM, SAYING E-MAIL, SCOTT WIENER, E-MAIL 20 21 GAVIN NEWSOM, ABOUT WHAT THIS MEANS FOR TRANSIT. BECAUSE WE --THERE IS NOT A SINGLE PERSON IN THE BAY AREA THAT'S NOT GOING 22 TO BE HEAVILY IMPACTED IF THESE TRANSIT AGENCIES FAIL. AND I 23 COULDN'T AGREE MORE WITH COMMISSIONER SPERING. THEY SEEM TO 24 NOT GET IT. AND THERE SEEMS TO BE THIS BIG DISCONNECT. THIS IS 25

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SO SERIOUS. I HAVEN'T SEEN SOMETHING SO SERIOUS SINCE THE 1 2 PANDEMIC IN TERMS OF OUR ECONOMY AND OUR ABILITY TO FINALLY 3 RECOVER FROM THE PANDEMIC. SO I THINK WE SHOULD -- I DON'T KNOW IF SOME FORM E-MAILS THAT WE COULD SEND SO THAT WHEN OUR 4 5 CONSTITUENTS ARE E-MAILING US, WE COULD RESPOND, THAT MIGHT BE HELPFUL, AND, YOU KNOW, IF WE'RE ALL DOING IT FROM OUR 6 DIFFERENT COUNTIES. BUT WE GOT TO GET THE WORD OUT THERE SO 7 8 PEOPLE UNDERSTAND WHAT'S HAPPENING HERE. 9 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: COMMISSIONER CANEPA? 10 11 DAVID CANEPA: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. I REALLY WANT TO THANK 12 STAFF FOR PUTTING THIS TOGETHER, ANDY, REBECCA, AND GEORGIA. 13 IT WASN'T THAT PRODUCTIVE, BUT WE REALLY, SORT OF, UNDERSTOOD 14 15 WHERE PEOPLE WERE, FROM THE TRANSPORTATION SECRETARY. ONE OF 16 THE THINGS WAS TALKED ABOUT WAS ACCOUNTABILITY. REBECCA, CAN YOU WALK US THROUGH AFTER THAT FEEDBACK WHAT THE PLAN IS 17 MOVING FORWARD AND HOW DOES THAT TIE TO OUR PRIORITIES? 18 19 REBECCA LONG: THANK YOU, COMMISSIONER. SO, I THINK WE ARE 20 21 STILL DETERMINING EXACTLY HOW WE WANT TO ADVOCATE ON THIS POINT. THE CALIFORNIA TRANSIT ASSOCIATION, THE STATEWIDE 22 TRANSIT ASSOCIATION HAS PUT FORWARD JUST AT THE END OF LAST 23 WEEK, AN ACCOUNTABILITY FRAMEWORK THAT LAYS OUT, YOU KNOW, 24 25 REPORTING, FIRST AND FOREMOST ON EXACTLY WHAT ARE YOUR

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DEFICITS, BEING MORE TRANSPARENT THAN THAT, ONE THING 1 2 LEGISLATURE HAS BEEN CONCERNED ABOUT, BASELINES AND THAT 3 EVERYONE IS USING SAME ASSUMPTIONS, PROPOSING THAT, AND THAT EVERYBODY TAKE ACTION THAT THEY WANT TO RECEIVE THIS FUNDING, 4 5 THERE IS THAT PIECE. THEN A REOUIREMENT THAT AGENCY SUBMIT PROPOSALS AS TO WHAT THEY'RE DOING TO IMPROVE THEIR SERVICE. 6 IT'S VERY -- HOW WOULD I PUT IT? THERE IS A LOT OF DISCRETION 7 8 IN WHAT THE CTA HAS PROPOSED IN TERMS OF WHAT AGENCIES COULD DO, AND WHAT -- WHICH MENU ITEM THEY'RE CHOOSING TO REPORT ON. 9 10 SO I THINK THERE COULD BE SOME PUSHBACK FROM THE LEGISLATURE THAT IT'S NOT QUITE STRONG ENOUGH. SO, I THINK -- YOU KNOW, 11 WE'LL TAKE DIRECTION FROM YOU, BUT ONE OPTION FOR US TO REVIEW 12 THAT AND POTENTIALLY RECOMMEND SOMETHING STRONGER THAN WHAT'S 13 BEEN PUT ON THE TABLE. WE ARE WANTING TO STAY UNIFIED WITH THE 14 ENTIRE TRANSIT ADVOCACY COMMUNITY, SO, THERE'S CHALLENGES 15 16 THERE. THE OTHER PIECE TO COMMISSIONER SPERING AND PAPAN'S POINT ABOUT ALL THE WORK WITH THE BLUE RIBBON IS WE COULD 17 RECOMMEND SOMETHING THAT IS BAY AREA SPECIFIC AND WE GOT 18 DIFFERENT MESSAGES ON THAT IN SACRAMENTO. SOME MEMBERS REALLY 19 WANT TO SEE THAT, OTHERS SAID JUST GIVE US A STATEWIDE 20 21 APPROACH. STAFF IS LOOKING TO THE COMMISSION FOR DIRECTION ON THAT. THE OTHER KEY QUESTION IS, HOW DOES THIS ACCOUNTABILITY 22 APPLY? DOES IT APPLY TO EVERY OPERATOR IN THE BAY AREA, OR 23 EVERY OPERATOR STATEWIDE, OR IS IT ONLY A CONDITION IF YOU GET 24 THE ADDITIONAL MONEY. AND THAT'S SOMETHING THE LEGISLATURE IS 25

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GRAPPLING WITH, IS DO WE WANT TO MANDATE THAT ALL TRANSIT
 AGENCIES DO BETTER BECAUSE WE ALL WANT TO SEE BETTER TRANSIT
 SYSTEMS OR IS THIS PART OF THE EXCHANGE FOR FUNDING. HOPEFULLY
 THAT'S HELPFUL AS TO SOME OF THE CONSIDERATIONS THAT WE'RE
 MAKING.

DAVID CANEPA: GREAT. AND LET ME JUST SAY THIS, SUPERVISOR 7 8 RONEN BROUGHT UP A GOOD POINT. I THINK ONE OF THE THINGS THAT WOULD BE HELPFUL WOULD BE A LOT MORE STORYTELLING. I THINK WE 9 10 TALK ABOUT SERVICE CUTS, WE TALK ABOUT THOSE PEOPLE WHO NEED US THE MOST. I THINK OUR LEGISLATIVE DELEGATION REALLY NEEDS 11 TO HEAR THAT. AND I KNOW, YOU KNOW, IT'S REALLY -- NOT REALLY 12 -- IT'S NOT REALLY FOCUSED ON POLICY, BUT I DO THINK WE NEED 13 TO REACH OUT TO DIFFERENT GROUPS AND THE TRANSIT SPACE WHO 14 ADVOCATE FOR RIDERS. THEY'RE A BIG PART OF THIS CONVERSATION. 15 16 AND THEN, I THINK THEIR INFLUENCE, YOU KNOW, RATHER THAN JUST BEING AN MTC ISSUE, IT'S NOT MTC. I THINK THE CHAIR ALLUDED TO 17 IT EARLIER, IT'S ABOUT PARTNERSHIP, PARTNERS COME FROM VARIOUS 18 PLACES. I DO HOPE -- AND I AM ENCOURAGED. I KNOW IT'S NOT THE 19 BEST, SITUATION, BUT WE HAVE AN INCREDIBLE STAFF, INCREDIBLE 20 21 STAKEHOLDERS. I DO THINK WE'LL FIND A SOLUTION BUT WE NEED PARTNERSHIP FROM ALL THOSE ORGANIZATIONS. THANK YOU. 22

24 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU, COMMISSIONER CANEPA. AND
25 AGAIN THANK YOU TO MY COLLEAGUES TO ALL SPOKE. REBECCA MY

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COMMENTS, I THINK IT WOULD BE GOOD IF YOU COULD SUMMARIZE AND 1 PROVIDE TO US SOMETHING AS WE HAVE QUESTIONS OF WHAT WE'RE 2 3 DOING GENERALLY THAT WOULD BE APPROPRIATE WE CAN HAVE SOMETHING WE CAN RESPOND WITH. AND I'LL SAY THIS, IT'S BEEN 4 5 CHALLENGING THE PAST FEW DAYS UNDERSTANDING THE SEVERITY OF THE SITUATION. WE KNOW WHEN'S AT RISK STATE LEGISLATORS ARE 6 TRYING TO RUN THE STATE, THERE IS MULTIPLE PRIORITIES ON THEIR 7 8 PLATE AS WELL. WE CAN'T LOOK BACK WE CAN ONLY LOOK FORWARD. THEY KNOW NOW, WE KNOW NOW, AND WE KNOW WE HAVE TO FIND 9 SOMETHING THAT WORKS FOR ALL OF US. AND I THINK COMMISSIONERS 10 THAT'S WHAT WE'RE TRYING TO DO AS COMMISSION LEADERSHIP 11 FINDING WHAT WORKS. THIS IS NOT GOING TO BE AN EASY DECISION 12 NO MATTER WHAT MONEY IS ON THE TABLE BUT WE'RE TRYING TO 13 BALANCE AND CONTINUE MOVING FORWARD, THE FACT RIDERS RIDING 14 TODAY ARE THE TRANSIT EXTENT. LETTING TRANSIT FAIL IS NOT AN 15 16 OPTION. WE AS COMMISSIONERS AND AS YOUR LEADERSHIP ARE TRYING TO PUT SENSIBLE REASONABLE SOLUTIONS ON THE TABLE. OUR FRIENDS 17 IN THE STATE LEGISLATURE KNOW THAT AS WELL. I THINK THE NEXT 18 COUPLE OF DAYS ARE GOING TO BE KEY. WE'RE TRYING TO DO AS MUCH 19 AS WE CAN BECAUSE WE KNOW THE OUTCOMES THAT WE DON'T WANT AND 20 21 WE MADE THAT ABUNDANTLY CLEAR TO THE STATE LEGISLATORS THAT IF 22 WE TRY TO FIND TOO MUCH COMPROMISE IT'S NOT GOING TO PRODUCE THE OUTCOMES THAT WE'RE TRYING TO ACHIEVE. WE HAVE BEEN CLEAR 23 ON WHAT WE'RE TRYING TO DO. ANY FURTHER QUESTIONS? REBECCA ANY 24 25 FINAL COMMENTS?

REBECCA LONG: THANK YOU CHAIR PEDROZA. I WANT TO SHARE 2 3 COMMENTS, IN TERMS OF WE HAVE GOT TO GET THE RIDERS AND THE STORYTELLING IS AT THE FOREFRONT OF THE CONVERSATION AND I 4 5 WANT TO SHARI HAVE NEVER SEEN SUCH A STRONG COALITION ON TRANSPORTATION ISSUES AS WE HAVE RIGHT NOW. OUR COALITION 6 LETTERS, WE HAVE WRITTEN THREE. WE HAVE OVER 100 ORGANIZATIONS 7 8 AND IT'S NOT JUST THE BAY AREA, WE HAVE CLIMATE ADVOCATES, TRANSIT RIDERS, WE HAVE LABOR, BUSINESS COMMUNITY, HOUSING 9 10 COMMUNITY, ALL HOUSING KEY PARTNERS IN THE BAY AREA HAVE SIGNED LETTERS IN SUPPORT OF THIS. AND AT THE HEARINGS, 11 INCLUDING YESTERDAY, THERE WAS ABOUT 45 MINUTES OF TESTIMONY 12 FROM REGULAR PEOPLE. A BLIND PERSON TALKED ABOUT HOW TRANSIT 13 IS HIS LIFELINE. PEOPLE TALKED ABOUT HOW THEY HAVE CARS, BUT 14 THEY DON'T LIKE USING THEIR CARS. THEY MUCH PREFER TO TAKE 15 16 TRANSIT. THEY USE BART EVERY DAY, SO THEY ARE HEARING THESE 17 STORIES FROM REGULAR PEOPLE AND I WANT YOU TO KNOW OUR ADVOCACY IS AMPLIFIED BY PARTNERS OUT THERE SENDING ALERTS, 18 YOUNG PEOPLE AND STUDENTS, THEY'RE NOT JUST HEARING FROM THE 19 AGENCIES AND IT'S REALLY HEARTENING TO KNOW HOW IMPORTANT AND 20 PEOPLE ARE TAKING TIME OUT OF THEIR DAY TO MAKE THAT MESSAGE. 21 THANK YOU. 22

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24 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU REBECCA LONG. KIMBERLY DO WE
25 HAVE PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS ITEM

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CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: I SEE THREE RAISED HANDS. HOW MUCH TIME 2 3 WOULD YOU LIKE TO GIVE? 4 5 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: TWO MINUTES. 6 7 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: RANDI KINMAN, UNMUTE YOURSELF. AND I'LL 8 START THE CLOCK. 9 RANDI KINMAN: THANK YOU. I'M JUST KIND OF STRUCK BY THE IDEA 10 THAT THIS IS LIKE A JOB PERFORMANCE REVIEW THAT YOU'RE GETTING 11 FROM SACRAMENTO. AND SACRAMENTO IS SAYING YOUR WHOLE DIVISION 12 ISN'T DOING A GOOD JOB, BUT THEY'RE NOT TELLING YOU WHAT THEY 13 WANT TO YOU DO BETTER. I JUST FIND THIS AS SOMEBODY WHO HAS 14 15 RUN BUSINESSES, THE MOST BIZARRE THING I HAVE EVER HEARD, AND 16 I REALLY APPRECIATE ALL OF THE WORK THAT HAS GONE INTO TRYING TO EXPLAIN TO THE FOLKS IN SACRAMENTO WHAT WE'RE DOING. AND 17 TRYING TO WALK THE PATH OF WORKING AS A GROUP AND AS A UNIT 18 AND STILL TRYING TO DIFFERENTIATE BETWEEN DIFFERENT AGENCIES 19 THAT ARE HAVING DIFFERENT PROBLEMS. BECAUSE WE ALL RUN 20 21 DIFFERENTLY. AND THE ABSOLUTE REFUSAL OF SACRAMENTO TO UNDERSTAND THAT VTA DOESN'T RUN THE SAME WAY AS BART. IT'S 22 JUST TWO DIFFERENT ANIMALS BUT WE'RE ALL IN ONE PLACE. SO, I 23 DO APPRECIATE -- I THINK I WOULD BE THROWING THINGS AT THIS 24 POINT IF I HAD TO TAKE THESE TRIPS UP THERE TO TRY AND EXPLAIN 25

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THAT. I DO WANT TOUCH BASE ON THE TESTIMONIALS THAT WE MAY OR 1 MAY NOT BE ABLE TO DO, AND I THINK A REALLY EFFECTIVE WAY OF 2 3 DOING IT IS FILMING AND SENDING LINKS TO PEOPLE OR GETTING IT ON THE AIRWAYS WHERE PEOPLE ARE IN SACRAMENTO DOING THEIR JOB, 4 5 SO THAT EVERY FEW HOURS THEY'RE SEEING PEOPLE FROM ACROSS THE STATE WHO ARE GOING TO BE HEAVILY, HEAVILY, HEAVILY IMPACTED 6 BY THIS, AND IF WE CAN JOIN FORCES AND DO THAT, I WOULD LOVE 7 8 TO SEE THAT HAPPEN. THANK YOU.

11 LEVIN, FOLLOWED BY VINAY PIMPLE.

ADINA LEVIN: GOOD MORNING. ADINA LEVIN WITH SEAMLESS BAY AREA. 13 BEHIND THE CURTAIN ON THE ADVOCACY SIDE, TO COMMISSIONER 14 15 RONEN, YES THERE ARE LETTER TOOLS AND CALL TOOLS THAT HAVE A 16 LINK TO LOOK UP YOUR LEGISLATOR WITH TALKING POINTS. HAPPY TO GET THAT TO YOU AND TO ANY COMMISSIONER THAT IS INTERESTED IN 17 DISTRIBUTING TO THAT. THE WAY THAT WE GET THOSE DOZENS AND 18 DOZENS OF COMMENTS IS THAT THERE IS THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE WHO 19 SIGNED A PETITION AND ALL OF THE GROUPS THAT SIGNED THE JOINT 20 21 LETTER GET ACTION ALERTS WITH THE TESTIMONY OPPORTUNITIES, AND THEN PEOPLE SIGN UP AND THEN SOMEBODY SENDS THEM A TEXT 22 MESSAGE WHEN IT'S TIME TO GIVE PUBLIC COMMENT. SO THERE ARE 23 ADVOCACY GROUPS THAT ARE WORKING BEHIND THE SCENES TO DO THE 24 INFRASTRUCTURE TO MAKE THAT TESTIMONY AND COMMENT AND FEEDBACK 25

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HAPPEN, AND PLEASE CONTACT ME AND I'LL PROVIDE THOSE TOOLS 1 2 THAT YOU CAN SHARE. IN TERMS OF THE FUNDING SOURCES, YES, THE 3 LEGISLATORS ARE STARTING TO SAY THAT TRANSIT IS IMPORTANT BUT IF THE SENATE SOLUTION REFLECTING IT. RCP HAPPENS WE WILL 4 5 EITHER WIND UP WITH KILLING DTX AND KILLING BART TO SILICON VALLEY OR WE WILL HAVE A LIFE-SIZE SET OF STATUS THAT IS OUR 6 PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM. THE BART TO SILICON VALLEY IS 7 8 GOING TO BE A MUSEUM BECAUSE IT WILL NOT HAVE BART TRAINS RUNNING. AND THAT MESSAGE REALLY NEEDS TO GET THROUGH THAT WE 9 NEED MORE FUNDING SOURCES AND ENOUGH FUNDING TO BE ABLE TO 10 KEEP THE SYSTEM RUNNING, REGROW RIDERSHIP. THANKS SO MUCH TO 11 THE COMMISSIONERS WHO ARE SPEAKING ABOUT ACCOUNTABILITY, 12 STRONGER ACCOUNTABILITY MEASURES, AND IT NEEDS TO BE REGIONAL 13 NOT JUST AGENCY BY AGENCY. BAY PASS IS THE SHINING STAR AND SO 14 15 IF WE HAVE SOMETHING THAT IS AGENCY BY AGENCY THAT UNDOES BAY 16 PASS, LIKE, THAT'S AN EXAMPLE OF WHAT WE NEED. THANK YOU.

19 PIMPLE. GO AHEAD YOU HAVE TWO MINUTES. I'LL LET YOU KNOW WHEN

VINAY PIMPLE: I'M VINAY PIMPLE FROM THE POLICY ADVISORY
COUNCIL. I WANT TO TALK FIRST ABOUT THE WHO ACCOUNTABILITY
ISSUE. YOU KNOW, I HAVE HEARD FROM MORE THAN ONE BUS TRANSIT
AGENCY MEASURE, BUS TRANSIT AGENCY PEOPLE THAT ON ANY ONE DAY

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YOU CAN EXPECT ABOUT 30% OF BUS DRIVERS NOT TO SHOW UP. AND I 1 DON'T SEE ANY OF THOSE THINGS ADDRESSED AT THE MTC MEETINGS. 2 AND SO FOR FOLKS KNOW THAT EVERY PERSON THAT HAS TAKEN TEN 3 DAYS OFF WHILE IN THE YEAR SOMEBODY ELSE IS TAKING 150 DAYS 4 5 OFF IN THE YEAR. THE OTHER THING IS ABOUT BUS SERVICE HOW MANY BUSES ACTUALLY SHOW UP ON TIME. I USED TO GO TO SAN FRANCISCO 6 A FEW YEARS AGO, BUS EVERY HALF HOUR, THEN ONCE THEY GET THE 7 8 7:35 BUS, IS REACH THERE AT 7:30 7:35 DIDN'T SHOW UP, 805, 835 AND 905 SHOWED UP AT 9:20. OF COURSE, I STOPPED TAKING THE BUS 9 AND STARTED TAKING AN UBER TO THE BART STATION. I TOOK THE L 10 BUS TO THE MTC BUILDING FIRST TIME I TOOK IT, IT WAS FINE, 11 SECOND TYPE I WAITED THERE 45 MINUTES AND IT DIDN'T SHOW UP. 12 IT'S AN HOURLY BUS. AGAIN, I STOPPED TAKING THE BUS. YOU KNOW, 13 IT'S AGAIN, TAKING TO BART AND BART OVER. BY AND LARGE BUSES 14 WHEN YOU NEED TO GET SOMEWHERE ON TIME UNLESS IT RUNS EVERY 15 16 TEN MINUTES IT'S NOT AN OPTION. PLEASE TAKE ACCOUNTABILITY BE ON BOARD TRY TO GET A REPORT FROM THE OPERATORS AS TO WHAT IS 17 ACTUALLY HAPPENING. THANK YOU. 18

ANDREW FREMIER: CHAIR PEDROZA, IF YOU DON'T MIND? ANDREW 4 5 FREMIER, I WOULD LIKE TO OPEN THIS ITEM. WE ARE PRESENTING A SERIES OF DRAFT BUDGETS TODAY THAT REPRESENTS ALL OF THE WORK 6 THAT THE COMMISSION DOES AND ALL THE DIFFERENT PARTS AND 7 8 PIECES. YOU WILL HAVE ANOTHER BITE AT THE APPLE IN JUNE. FINAL APPROVE IS AT THE JUNE COMMISSION MEETING. I WANT TO THANK 9 DEREK, ALIX, BRAD, AND THE TEAM FOR THE WORK PUT TOGETHER ON 10 11 THE BUDGETS TO REPRESENT THE CHARGE THAT YOU HAVE ASKED US TO TACKLE AND TAKE ON. THEY ARE A REFLECTION OF YOUR PRIORITIES 12 AND WE TOOK A DEEP LOOK AT HOW TO MEET THOSE COMMITMENTS, THE 13 DRAFT BUDGET IS CONSISTENT WITH MY MESSAGING AT THE WORKSHOP 14 THAT WE HAD IN NAPA IN TERMS OF THE, SORT OF, BOLD GOALS, WE 15 16 RECOGNIZE IN ORDER TO MEET THE SUPPORT LEVEL NEEDS TO BE AT 17 THE RIGHT LEVEL, AND ON-BOARDING AND SUPPORT AND CONTRACTING AND LEGAL IN ORDER TO KEEP UP WITH ALL OF THE DIFFERENT 18 PROCUREMENTS THAT WE ARE PUTTING ON THE STREET AND WE HAVE 19 OUITE A FEW TECHNICAL PROCUREMENTS, SIGNIFICANT TO THE 20 21 COMMISSION AND WORK WITH TOLL PLAZAS ELECTRIC TOLLING AND OPEN ROAD TOLLING OVER THE NEXT FEW YEARS. WITH THAT I WANT TO TURN 22 IT TO DEREK TO GO THROUGH THE PRESENTATION AND AS A REMINDER 23 YOU'RE GOING TO GO THROUGH MANY BUDGETS THIS MORNING AND WE 24 LOOK FORWARD TO YOUR FEEDBACK. 25

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2 DEREK HANSEL: GREAT. THANKS MR. FREMIER, AND IF WE COULD PULL 3 THE FIRSTS OF, AS ANDY SAID, SEVERAL PRESENTATIONS. ALL RIGHT. FIRST AND FOREMOST, I WANT TO ECHO THE THANKS ANDY GAVE. BUT 4 5 I'LL THANK ALL OF THE FOLKS ACROSS THE AGENCY WHO LED THIS TO BE A PRETTY GOOD PROCESS. YOU ARE SEEING A LOT MORE TODAY THAN 6 YOU WOULD HAVE SEEN THIS TIME LAST YEAR. WE ARE BRINGING BOTH 7 8 DRAFT AND PROPOSED BUDGETS TO YOU OVER THE NEXT FOUR WEEKS. SO, FIVE WEEKS, I GUESS. SO, I WANT TO THANK, PARTICULARLY, ON 9 10 MY PART, ARLEICKA CONLEY, OUR DIRECTOR OF BUDGETS, AND HER TEAM. THEY HAVE DONE JUST AN AMAZING AMOUNT OF WORK. THEY 11 APPARENTLY DID TAKE TO HEART MY ADVICE THAT SLEEP IS 12 OVERRATED. IF WE CAN TURN TO THE NEXT PAGE, PLEASE? AS ANDY 13 SAID, WE ARE BRINGING ALL OF THE DRAFT OPERATING AND CAPITAL 14 15 BUDGETS TO YOU TODAY. SO, IT WILL BE A LONG DAY. THAT'S THE 16 BAD NEWS. THE GOOD NEWS IS, WHEN WE BRING BACK PROPOSED 17 OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGETS ON THE 28th, HOPEFULLY THAT'S A VERY MUCH SHORTER DISCUSSION THERE. WE'LL BE BRINGING BACK 18 CHANGES BASED ON YOUR ADVICE AND THE FEEDBACK TODAY, AS WELL 19 AS, I CAN PROMISE YOU THERE ARE TWEAKS THAT WE WILL STILL BE 20 21 MAKING OVER THE NEXT FEW WEEKS BUT THE CHANGES WILL BE RELATIVELY MODEST. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. OKAY. SO, ASSUMPTIONS 22 FOR AND, AGAIN, ALL OF THIS IS GOING TO BE MTC RELATED FOR 23 THIS PRESENTATION. THEY'RE REALLY UNCHANGED FROM THE BUDGET 24 WORKSHOP. AS ANDY SAID WE'RE RECOMMENDING ADDITION OF SEVERAL 25

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CRITICAL POSITIONS THAT ADDRESS THOSE SPECIFIC NEEDS, 1 INCLUDING DEVELOPMENT OF SOME ADDITIONAL ORGANIZATIONAL 2 3 CAPACITY. AND WE'LL TALK ABOUT THOSE POSITIONS IN JUST A MINUTE. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THE CONCERNS WE FACE ARE THE SAME 4 5 THAT WE DISCUSSED, AGAIN, A COUPLE OF WEEKS AGO. THERE HAS BEEN A LOT OF INFLATION, INTEREST RATES ARE HIGHER, THE 6 REGIONAL BANK FAILURE CRISIS AND CONFIDENCE CONTINUES THOUGH 7 8 IT SEEMS A LITTLE BIT ABATED WE TALKED ABOUT THE BATA FUNDS OVERHEAD OPERATIONS OF MTC PROPER JUST SOMETHING TO BE 9 CONCERNED ABOUT KEEP AN EYE ON. THEN THE DEBT LIMIT CRISIS 10 COMING UP AT FEDERAL GOVERNMENT LEVEL WHICH IS CONTINUING TO 11 DEMONSTRATE THAT CONGRESS OPERATES IN A VERY RATIONAL WAY, AND 12 THAT'S PROBLEMATIC AND WE NEED TO SEE RESOLUTION OF THAT AND 13 THE CONSEQUENCES OF NON-RESOLUTION OF THAT OR LIKELY VERY BAD 14 15 BUT UNKNOWN SOMETHING WE ARE KEEPING AN EYE ON. VERY LITTLE WE 16 CAN DO BUT HOPE THAT FUNCTIONALITY RETURNS. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. LET'S GET INTO THE BUDGET. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO, YOU 17 HAVE IN FRONT OF YOU THE DRAFT BUDGET THAT WE HAVE PUT 18 TOGETHER IN YOUR PACKET. YOU HAVE GOT THE STAFF REPORT, ALONG 19 WITH DETAILED SCHEDULES HERE. PUSH IDENTIFYING KEY POINTS ON 20 21 THIS, FEDERAL FUNDS GRANT DECREASE IS A FUNCTION OF OUR 22 BUDGETING ONE YEAR OF GRANTS AS OPPOSED TO SHOWING MULTI-YEAR 23 GRANTS AND EXPENDITURES THAT'S REALLY AN ATTEMPT TO BETTER IDENTIFY FOR YOU WHAT'S HAPPENING IN AN ACTUAL PERIOD. WE NOTE 24 STATE AND HOLE FUNDING ARE UP FROM BOTH REAP 2.0 AND FROM 25

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CLIMATE INITIATIVE PROGRAMS AND YOU WILL SEE WHAT'S HAPPENING 1 ON SOME OF THAT FUNDING AS WE TALK ABOUT EXPENSES. ON THE 2 3 EXPENSE SIDE, SALARIES AND BENEFITS UP A BIT, THAT'S REALLY REFLECTING A FULL YEAR OF POSITIONS THAT WERE ADDED, A FULL 4 5 YEAR OF BUDGET POSITIONS THAT WERE ADDED, BUDGETED POSITIONS -- EXCUSE ME -- THAT WERE ADDED IN FISCAL '23. SO, YOU WILL 6 REMEMBER THAT WE HEAD ADDED SIGNIFICANT ADDITIONAL POSITIONS 7 8 AT THE BEGINNING OF FISCAL '23. WE ALSO ADDED SOME IN THE MID-YEAR PROCESS. SO MANY OF THOSE POSITIONS, OBVIOUSLY, FOR 9 FISCAL YEAR '23 WERE NOT FULL YEAR BUDGETED POSITIONS WE'RE 10 NOW BUDGETING THOSE ON A FULL YEAR BASIS. THERE ARE SOME 11 ADDITIONAL POSITIONS THAT DO HIT THE MTC BUDGET PROPER, AS 12 ANDY DISCUSSED, MANY OF THOSE NEW POSITIONS ARE GOING TO OTHER 13 ENTITIES, NOT MTC ENTITIES. SO THOSE, OBVIOUSLY, WOULD NOT HIT 14 15 THIS BUDGET. AND THEN THE COLA BASED IN THE MOUS THAT YOU JUST 16 APPROVED ARE ALSO IN THERE. SO, THAT'S ALL REFLECTED. AND THEN 17 THERE IS A RESERVE TRANSFER FOR MISCELLANEOUS CAPITAL PROJECTS AND WE'LL TALK ABOUT THAT IN A SECOND. I WOULD NOTE, AND AGAIN 18 I'LL MAKE THIS POINT IN THE DISCUSSION OF CAPITAL PROJECTS, 19 BUT THERE IS NO FUNDING FOR THE NEW ERP SYSTEM ITSELF PROVIDED 20 21 IN THIS. THAT IS GOING TO BE A SUBSTANTIAL COST, WHETHER IT HITS FISCAL '24, OR LATER. IT IS GOING TO BE A BIG COST AND 22 IT'S GOING TO BE ONE WE NEED TO FIGURE OUT BOTH HOW TO 23 IDENTIFY THAT COST, FUND IT, AND MANAGE THE ALLOCATION OF THAT 24 COST ACROSS THE AGENCIES. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. STAFFING, RIGHT 25

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NOW WE'RE BRINGING FORWARD IN THE DRAFT BUDGET, 16 NEW 1 POSITIONS. AS ANDY SAID, SOME OF THOSE ARE TO ADDRESS 2 ADMINISTRATIVE NEEDS, INCLUDING IT PROCUREMENT FINANCE LEGAL 3 AND HR, SO ALL OF THOSE BACK OFFICE FUNCTION THAT IS CRITICAL 4 5 FOR OPERATING THE AGENCY ITSELF. POSITIONS TIED TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF RM3T REGIONAL FORECASTING FOR PLANNED BAY 6 AREA 2050 PLUS, IMPLEMENTATION OF R AND M AND AGAIN SOME 7 8 SIGNIFICANT STAFFING ADDS FOR ENTERPRISE OPERATIONS, OUR EXPRESS LANES BATA AND CLIPPER. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. ON THE 9 CAPITAL BUDGET, THIS INCLUDES 16 MILLION OF ADDITIONAL FUNDING 10 FOR THE FORWARDS. NOTABLY \$10 MILLION FOR SR37, AND 4.3 -- OH 11 -- SORRY. I APOLOGIZE. I'M A PAGE AHEAD HERE. AGAIN, ON THIS 12 PAGE, SORRY -- THERE IS NO ERP FUNDING. THE MAJOR PROJECT IN 13 THIS, YOU WILL SEE IN THE RIGHT HAND COLUMN, TWO AND A HALF 14 15 MILLION DOLLARS, THAT IS FOR AN AGENDA MANAGEMENT AND 16 COMMITTEE PACKET AUTOMATION SYSTEM THAT WILL LET US BE MUCH MORE EFFECTIVE IN TRANSMITTING INFORMATION ARE TO YOU AND 17 ENSURING THAT YOU KNOW, KIND OF, WE'RE WORKING AS STAFF TO GET 18 ALL THAT STUFF PUT TOGETHER IN A TIMELY AND ACCURATE BASIS. 19 NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. OKAY. HERE ARE THE FORWARDS. WE'RE ADDING 20 A TOTAL OF \$16 MILLION FOR THE FORWARDS, NOTABLY \$10 MILLION 21 FOR SR37, AND \$4.3 MILLION FOR RICHMOND, SAN RISK, AGAIN, THE 22 FUNDING FOR THESE COMES FROM A VOLL VARIETY OF FEDERAL, STATE, 23 AND LOCAL SOURCES. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. ON THE OPERATING BUDGET 24 COSTS FOR OPERATING CLIPPER ARE UP SIGNIFICANTLY RELATED TO 25

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THE FACT WE'RE GOING TO BE OPERATING C1 AND C2 IN PARALLEL 1 UNTIL THERE IS FULL READINESS LAUNCH OF C2 ONLY AT WHICH POINT 2 3 THE COSTS WILL ROLL OFF SO HOPEFULLY FISCAL '25 WILL LOOK NOTABLY DIFFERENT THAN THIS. NEXT SLIDE. AND THEN THE CLIPPER 4 5 TWO CAPITAL PROJECT, YOU WILL NOTE THAT THERE ARE SOME ADDITIONS FOR FISCAL '24 THAT'S REALLY RELATED TO ADDITIONAL 6 STAFFING, SOME EQUIPMENT ON THE FARE CARDS FULFILLMENT AND 7 8 TICKET SUPPORT AND CONSULTANTS THAT REALLY HOPEFULLY THE LAST ADD RELATED TO MAKING C2 OPERATIONAL. AND BUDGET PRESENTATION 9 ONE IS DONE. HAPPY TO TAKE ANY QUESTIONS 10

17 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: THANK YOU. I SEE NO MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC
18 WITH A HAND RAISED AT THIS TIME, AND I HAVE RECEIVED NOTHING
19 IN WRITING.

21 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: ALL RIGHT. LET ME BRING IT BACK TO THE
22 COMMISSION. COMMISSIONERS, ANY QUESTIONS? IF NOT, MR. HANSEL
23 WERE YOU REQUESTING AN ACTION ITEM OR THIS IS JUST

24 INFORMATIONAL ITEM.



DEREK HANSEL: JUST INFORMATIONAL. WE'LL BE BRINGING BACK THE
 FINAL PROPOSED BUDGET TO YOU ON THE 28th OF JUNE.

4 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: THAT CONCLUDES THIS POINT. MR. HANSEL,
5 THANK YOU VERY MUCH. THAT WAS 12A SORRY. I WAS STILL ON THE
6 STATE BUDGET. RIGHTFULLY SO. THAT CONCLUDES THAT ITEM WE'RE
7 GOING TO MOVE TO ITEM 13, PUBLIC COMMENT. KIMBERLY DO WE HAVE
8 PUBLIC COMMENT?

9

10 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: THANK YOU. DO I SEE ONE MEMBER OF THE 11 PUBLIC WITH THEIR HAND RAISED. MR. VINAY PIMPLE. GO AHEAD AND 12 UNMUTE YOURSELF. YOU WILL HAVE TWO MINUTES.

13

VINAY PIMPLE: HELLO. I JUST WANTED TO SAY, YOU KNOW, ABOUT 14 15 NEED OF MAINTAINING PUBLIC TRANSIT. AS A BLIND PERSON, 16 WHENEVER I HAVE HAD THE NEED TO MOVE, ONE OF THE THINGS I HAVE ALWAYS CHECKED IS A PLACE CLOSE TO PUBLIC TRANSIT. DOES IT 17 HAVE SOME KIND OF BUS SERVICE, DOES IT HAVE SOME KIND OF TRAIN 18 SERVICE, AND AT THE VERY LEAST, THERE HAS GOT TO BE A BUS 19 SERVICE WITHIN A FEW BLOCKS OTHERWISE IT JUST MEANS THAT LARGE 20 21 PARTS OF THE AREA ARE ESSENTIALLY JUST RULED OUT. SO THAT JUST GIVES YOU A SENSE OF HOW IMPORTANT IT IS TO MAINTAIN OUR 22 PUBLIC TRANSIT SYSTEM. I HAVE TO SAY, I WAS A BIT DISTURBED TO 23 HEAR THAT THE GOVERNOR THINKS THAT EV REBATES ARE MORE 24 IMPORTANT THAN MAINTAINING OF OUR PUBLIC TRANSIT SYSTEM. EVS 25

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ARE TYPICALLY BOUGHT BY PEOPLE WITH HIGHER INCOMES. THE OTHER 1 ISSUE IS ALSO THAT -- I MEAN, I DON'T WANT TO SLAUGHTER THAT 2 3 HORSE, BUT I WISH FOLKS PRIORITIZE THE FISCAL CLIFF AWARDING A BOND MEASURE FOR NEXT YEAR, INSTEAD OF MASSIVE HOUSING MEASURE 4 5 AT A TIME WHEN THE BAY AREA IS HEMORRHAGING POPULATION, AT A TIME WHEN THE ECONOMY IS LIKELY -- NOT LIKELY -- BUT THE 6 ECONOMY MAY GO DOWN, AT A TIME WHEN INTEREST RATES ARE SO 7 8 HIGH, WHICH MEANS YOU WOULD BE PAYING A LOT OF THAT MONEY JUST 9 AS INTEREST.

11 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: 15 SECONDS.

13 VINAY PIMPLE: SO, I DON'T KNOW WHAT TO DO, I JUST THINK IT'S 14 REALLY IMPORTANT TO AVOID OF THE FISCAL CLIFF, AND I HOPE YOU 15 FOLKS DO EVERYTHING YOU CAN TO AVOID IT. GOOD LUCK. THANK YOU 16 VERY MUCH.
