23	REGULAR AGENDA ITEM 3.A MTC RESOLUTION 4320 REVISED CLIPPER
24	START PILOT UPDATE AND EXTENSION. SO I THINK MELANIE AND MR.
25	- MELANIE, YOU'RE STARTING US?



1 2 JUDIS SANTOS: I'M JUDIS. 3 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: OH, JUDIS. IS MELANIE JOINING YOU? WE'RE 4 GOING TO HEAR FROM STAFF AND THEN GO TO MY COLLEAGUES. 5 6 JUDIS SANTOS: GOOD MORNING. I'M JUDIS SANTOS ASSISTANT 7 8 DIRECTOR MTC ABAG CO-LEADING THE EVALUATION OF THE CLIPPER START PILOT WITH TRACY MCMILLAN WITH NELSON NYGAARD WHO IS 9 10 WITH US VIRTUALLY, AND MELANIE CHOY WITH MTC FUNDING POLICY AND PROGRAMS AND LYSA HALE PROJECT MANAGER FOR THE OPERATIONS 11 OF CLIPPER START. WE'RE HERE TO SHARE KEY FINDINGS FROM THE 12 EVALUATION AND EXTENSION OF THE PILOT PROGRAM UNTIL JUNE 30, 13 2025. NEXT SLIDE. MTC AND COMMUNITY PARTNERS ARE WORKING TO 14 BUILD A TRANSIT FARE SYSTEM THAT SUPPORTS THE BAY AREA BY 15 16 REMOVING BARRIERS TO USE PUBLIC TRANSIT FOR EVERYONE TO GET TO WHERE THEY NEED TO GO. THESE BARRIERS ARE SYSTEMIC IN REACHING 17 THE FINALLY BURDENED LIKE GETTING FUNDING INTO THE HANDS OF 18 PEOPLE WHO NEED IT. DESIGNING A PROGRAM TO BE EASY, SIMPLE, 19 STRAIGHT FORWARD AS POSSIBLE SETTING MONEY AND TIME FOR RIDERS 20 21 AND OFFERING THE BENEFIT OR TRANSIT DISCOUNT TO TRANSIT 22 SERVICE THAT IS ENTICING ENOUGH TO THE CUSTOMER WHILE 23 FINANCIALLY VIABLE TO THE REGION AND TRANSIT OPERATORS. MTC TOGETHER WITH TRANSIT OPERATORS AND COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS 24 IMPLEMENTED THE PILOT LAUNCHING DURING THE LOCKDOWN PERIOD OF 25



- 1 THE PANDEMIC IN JULY 2020. WE LEARNED MUCH ABOUT THE BARRIERS,
- 2 WHO WAS USING THE SYSTEM DURING THIS DIFFICULT TIME, AND TO
- 3 IMPROVE THE PROGRAM EVEN MORE WHILE KEEPING IN CHECK IT'S NOT
- 4 JUST ABOUT IMPROVING ONE STRATEGY LIKE MARKETING OUTREACH BUT
- 5 ALSO EXPLORING OTHER STRATEGIES IN PROGRAM DESIGN TO INCREASE
- 6 UPTAKE WHILE ALWAYS KEEPING IN CHECK FINANCIAL VIABILITY AND
- 7 OUR BUDGETARY ENVIRONMENT. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THE PILOT IS A
- 8 THREE YEAR PROGRAM WITH GOALS BELOW WITH TRANSIT OPERATORS
- 9 OFFERING 20 OR 50% DISCOUNT MIRRORS'S GOAL IS 100%
- 10 PARTICIPATION FROM TRANSIT OPERATORS ON THE CLIPPER SYSTEM
- 11 WHILE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY HAS ITS OWN LOW-INCOME DISCOUNT
- 12 PROGRAM MTC STAFF USE VALUE FOR VTA AND ITS CUSTOMERS TO HAVE
- 13 AGENCY PARTICIPATE IN CLIPPER'S START AS IT ALLOWS DISCOUNTS
- 14 ON CONNECTING SYSTEMS THROUGHOUT THE BAY AREA. MELANIE WILL
- 15 PROVIDE PROGRESS UPDATE LATER IN THE PRESENTATION. AN
- 16 EVALUATION OF THE PILOT WAS A REQUIREMENT OF THE ORIGINAL
- 17 FRAMEWORK MTC RESOLUTION 4320 TO UNDERSTAND AND LEARN AND
- 18 FURTHER IMPROVE UPON THE PROJECT GOALS KEY FINDINGS AND
- 19 LEARNINGS ARE SUMMARIZED IN ATTACHMENT C IN YOUR PACKET AND
- 20 THE DRAFT TECHNICAL REPORT ON MTC'S WEB SITE SIX OUTCOMES WERE
- 21 IDENTIFIED BY MTC AND CLIPPER START WORKING GROUP WHICH
- 22 INCLUDE PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION OUTCOMES AWARENESS AND
- 23 MARKETING CUSTOMER EXPERIENCE FINANCIAL VIABILITY
- 24 ADMINISTRATIVE FEASIBILITY CUSTOMER IMPACT OUTCOMES LIKE
- 25 AFFORDABILITY AND IMPROVE ACCESS AND MOBILITY. THESE OUTCOMES



- 1 WERE MEASURED AND BY A MULTITUDE OF DATA SOURCES TO INCLUDE
- 2 CHIP DATA APPLICATION SURVEY PROGRAM USER SURVEY FOCUS GROUPS
- 3 AND GENERAL AWARENESS SURVEY THIS INCLUDES APPLICATION
- 4 SUBMITTED PROGRAM ENROLLEES, AND MEMBER NUMBER OF TRIPS AND
- 5 TRANSFERS. THE ESSENCE OF THIS TABLE IS THAT THE PILOT AS FAR
- 6 AS OPERATIONALLY DESIGNED IS WORKING ONCE THE USER GETS THE
- 7 BENEFIT WITH PARTICIPATION GETTING BETTER. AND THERE IS MUCH
- 8 OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE IT EVEN BETTER. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. KEY
- 9 LEARNINGS INCLUDE THE PROGRAM IS REACHING CRITICAL
- 10 POPULATIONS. PEOPLE WITH HOUSEHOLD INCOMES LESS THAN 20K WHICH
- 11 IS 57% WOMEN, 59% PEOPLE IDENTIFYING AS ASIAN OR HISPANIC,
- 12 62%, ARE THE MAJORITY OF ENROLLEES. GREATER PROPORTION OF
- 13 APPLICANTS ARE BETWEEN 19 TO 35 WITH ENROLLMENT INCREASING FOR
- 14 THE 19 TO 25 RANGE IN Q4 AND BEYOND. FOR INCREASED MOBILITY
- 15 MOST RIDERS ARE TAKING TRIPS THAN AT THE START OF THE TWO YEAR
- 16 PILOT WITH AVERAGE PARTICIPANT TRIP FREQUENCY UP TO 5.6 TRIPS
- 17 PER WEEK. FOR INCREASED AFFORDABILITY THE TRIP RATE IS HIGHER
- 18 THAN APPLICATION RATE FOR THE HOUSEHOLD INCOMES EARNING
- 19 BETWEEN 5,000 TO 30K YEARLY. AND LASTLY, UPTAKE, UPTAKE,
- 20 UPTAKE CONTINUES TO BE A CHALLENGE. THERE IS MUCH DETAIL ON
- 21 THIS PARTICULAR REBOUND OF DEMOGRAPHICS AND THE TECHNICAL
- 22 REPORT. I'LL HIGHLIGHT A FEW OF THE LEARNINGS. THE MAP ON THE
- 23 RIGHT DEMONSTRATES NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS BY ZIP CODE AND
- 24 DARKER AREA SIGNIFYING MORE THAN 100 APPROVED APPLICATIONS IN
- 25 THE AREA ZIP CODE AND LIGHTER SHADE VARIATIONS WITH LESS THAN



- 1 100 APPLICATIONS. LARGE CONCENTRATION OF PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS
- 2 LIVE IN SAN FRANCISCO, 52%, MEANWHILE THE PROPORTION OF
- 3 APPLICANTS INCLUDE SAN JOSE, OAKLAND, SAN LEANDRO AND BERKELEY
- 4 AND DALY CITY IS HAVE INCREASED. APPLICATION RATES RELATIVELY
- 5 LOW IN SOME OF MTC'S EQUITY COMMUNITIES INCLUDING SANTA ROSA
- 6 FAIRFIELD VALLEJO AND CITIES WITHIN CALTRAIN AND SAMTRANS
- 7 SERVICE AREA 40% OF ALL CLIPPER START TRIPS HAVE BEEN TAKEN ON
- 8 BART FOLLOWED BY 38 ON MUNI, BETWEEN Q ONE AND Q EIGHT
- 9 PROPORTION OF TRIPS TAKEN ON BART DECREASED FROM 61% TO 40% IN
- 10 THE SAME TIME PERIOD. THE PROPORTION OF TRIP TICKET ON MUNI
- 11 INCREASED FROM 32 TO 38. AGENCIES JOINED LATER ON SUCH AS AC
- 12 TRANSIT SAMTRANS SAN FRANCISCO BAY FERRY AND SMART AND EAST
- 13 BAY AGENCIES BUT VINE INCREASED THROUGHOUT THE PILOT PERIOD
- 14 ACROSS THE AGENCY ALL OPERATORS HAD MORE THAN FIRST% OF THEIR
- 15 SUPER START RIDES TAKING RIDERS EARNING LESS THAN 20K PER YEAR
- 16 PETALUMA SANTA ROSA, AND NAPA VINE 73% SONOMA COUNTY TRANSIT
- 17 73% HAD THE SAME PROPORTION OF RIDERS EARNING LESS THAN 20K
- 18 WITH BART HAVING THE HIGHEST PROPORTION OF RIDERS EARNING MORE
- 19 THAN 20K IN A NUTSHELL MULTIPLE STRATEGIES CAN BE UTILIZED TO
- 20 INCREASE PARTICIPATION RATES. THE TABLE ILLUSTRATES STRATEGIES
- 21 EVALUATION THROUGH IMPROVED PROGRAM ALONG WITH MTC STAFF
- 22 RESPONSE TO THE STRATEGIES FALL WITHIN THREE CATEGORIES
- 23 MARKETING ELIGIBILITY, FARE POLICY TO ADDRESS DIFFERENT
- 24 OUTCOMES SUCH AS INCREASING PROGRAM UPTAKE AND IMPROVING THE
- 25 CUSTOMER EXPERIENCE AND DECREASING PROGRAM COSTS AND SEVEN



- 1 STRATEGIES ARE LISTED ON THE LEFT WHICH WILL BE DESCRIBED BY
- 2 MELANIE IN REVIEW. STAFF ASSESSMENT RESPONSE TO STRATEGIES
- 3 FIRST ONE ON AUTO ENROLLMENT MODELS, LIKE WITH EBT CARDS AT
- 4 STATION TICKET MACHINES OR LYFT KING COUNTY METRO MODEL OF
- 5 AUTOMATICALLY MAILING CLIPPER START CARD TO ADULTS THAT
- 6 OUALIFY FOR SOCIAL SERVICE BENEFITS SUCH AS CAL-FRESH. SECOND
- 7 STRATEGY IS VERIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY WHICH WOULD ELIMINATE
- 8 THE BURDEN OF PROVIDING DOCUMENTATION DURING THE APPLICATION
- 9 PROCESS. THIS STRATEGY WAS INCLUDED BECAUSE IT WAS IDENTIFIED
- 10 AS AN EXPLORATORY AREA. INCREASING ELIGIBILITY TO 200% FEDERAL
- 11 POVERTY LEVEL TO REFLECT THE COST OF LIVING IN THE BAY AREA.
- 12 INCREASING THRESHOLD WOULD INCREASE THE NUMBER OF RIDERS
- 13 ELIGIBLE FOR CLIPPER START WOULD INCREASE THE NUMBER OF
- 14 CLIPPER RIDERS ALTHOUGH THIS STRATEGY WOULD INCREASE THE POOL
- 15 OF ELIGIBLE RIDERS IT WOULD NOT INCREASE PERCENTAGE OF LOW-
- 16 INCOME INDIVIDUALS ENROLLED IN THE PROGRAM. UNLESS OTHER
- 17 STRATEGIES LIKE OUTREACH ARE DEPLOYED. CONSISTENT DISCOUNTS IS
- 18 THE NEXT STRATEGY ACROSS AGENCIES WOULD OFFER SAME DISCOUNT,
- 19 CONSISTENT DISCOUNT WOULD BE SIMPLER CREATING GREATER CUSTOMER
- 20 UNDERSTANDING OF THE PROGRAM. AND SEAMLESS. CURRENTLY TRANSIT
- 21 AGENCIES CAN CHOOSE 20% OR 50% DISCOUNT. FARE -- THE NEXT
- 22 STRATEGY IS FARE CAP ACCUMULATORS ALTERNATIVES TO FIXED PRICE
- 23 PRODUCTS. CAP FARES PROVIDE BONUS TRIPS BASED ON THRESHOLD.
- 24 THE NEXT IS A CUSTOMER FOCUSED APPROACH THREE ES WHICH ARE
- 25 ENGAGEMENT, EDUCATION, EQUITY PARTNERSHIPS. CALLS FOR AMPING



- 1 UP COLLECTIVE MTC TRANSIT OPERATOR REACH AND ENGAGEMENT
- 2 APPROACHES WITH CUSTOMER CULTURAL SPECIFIC DEMOGRAPHICS
- 3 PREFERENCES GEOGRAPHY EDUCATION NOT ONLY THE TARGETED CUSTOMER
- 4 BASE BUT ALSO TRANSIT EMPLOYEES AND SOCIAL SERVICE AGENCIES
- 5 COE BASED AND SERVING TARGETED POPULATION. CALLS FOR 11INGING
- 6 WHAT HAS BEEN ALREADY BEEN SUCCESSFUL WITH TRANSIT AGENCIES
- 7 AND COUNTIES AND OTHER SECTORS LIKE PUBLIC HEALTH SOCIAL
- 8 SERVICE AGENCIES AND REACHING THIS CUSTOMER BASE. THE LAST
- 9 STRATEGY MARKETING STRATEGY MATERIALS REVIEW INVOLVES APPLYING
- 10 WHAT WAS LEARNED THROUGH EVALUATION TRANSFORMING COURSE
- 11 CORRECTING AND GROUND CHECKING OF CLARITY AND MESSAGING TO BE
- 12 MORE RECEPTIVE AND CLEAR AND CONCISE. I'LL HAND IT OVER TO
- 13 MELANIE TO REVIEW MTC RESPONSE.

- 15 MELANIE CHOY: MELANIE CHOY MTC FUNDING PROGRAM AND POLICY
- 16 SECTION. BASED ON THESE FINDINGS INPUTS RECEIVED FROM THE FARE
- 17 INTEGRATION TASK FORCE AND POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL
- 18 SUBCOMMITTEES WE ARE MAKING THREE RECOMMENDATIONS, ACROSS
- 19 THREE CATEGORIES, REJECT, ACCEPT, AND FURTHER ASSESS.
- 20 STRATEGIES TOWARD CONSISTENT DISCOUNT CUSTOMER FOCUSED
- 21 COLLECTIVE APPROACH MARKETING STRATEGY AND MATERIALS REVIEW
- 22 STAFF COULD WORK TOWARDS CARRYING OUT THESE STRATEGIES WITHOUT
- 23 ADDITIONAL ASSESSMENT. UNDER CONSISTENT DISCOUNT WE HAVE MADE
- 24 STEPS TOWARD ADVANCING A CONSISTENT DISCOUNT AND IN
- 25 DISCUSSIONS WITH VTA STAFF THEY HAVE INDICATED PLANS TO JOIN



- 1 AND PARTICIPATE IN CLIPPER START DURING THE PILOT EXTENSION.
- 2 ADDITIONALLY MANY OF THE OPERATORS THAT CURRENTLY ARE OFFERING
- 3 20% DISCOUNT THEY HAVE INDICATED THERE IS INTEREST IN MOVING
- 4 TOWARDS THE 50% DISCOUNT PENDING THEIR BOARD APPROVALS. FOR
- 5 ITEMS IN PURPLE NO RECOMMENDATIONS THAT FALL UNDER THE REJECT
- 6 CATEGORY FROM STAFF RECOMMENDATION. FOR ITEMS IN PURPLE LISTED
- 7 AUTO ENROLL SELF-VERIFICATION, INCREASING INCOME ELIGIBILITY
- 8 AND FARE CAP ACCUMULATOR WE BELIEVE THESE ARE WORTH TAKING A
- 9 DEEPER DIVE LOOKING INTO AND UNDERSTANDING THESE STRATEGIES
- 10 BETTER. FOR THESE WE ENGAGE WITH THE OPERATORS LOOK AT
- 11 ANALYSIS, BENEFITS AND RISKS ALSO FEASIBILITY STEPS FOR
- 12 IMPLEMENTING CONCEPTS. WE PROPOSE EMBARKING ON FOCUSED
- 13 TECHNICAL ASSESSMENTS ON THESE TOPICS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.
- 14 OVERALL WE SEE OPPORTUNITIES FOR MAKING THE PROGRAM BETTER
- 15 BEFORE WE MOVE TO A PERMANENT PROGRAM. AND THE PROGRAM IS OFF
- 16 TO A GREAT START. THE ROLL OUT WAS SMOOTH. WE HAVE A SOLID
- 17 FOUNDATION TO BUILD THE PROGRAM ON. WE STOOD UP A CENTRALIZED
- 18 SYSTEM AND IT'S WORKING WELL. THE PROGRAM HAS ACHIEVED
- 19 OVERWHELMING AND WIDE RANGING SUPPORT AND WE ALSO NAVIGATED
- 20 THE FIRST SEVERAL YEARS IN THE MIDST OF THE PANDEMIC. AS WE
- 21 ADVANCE TO THE NEXT PHASE OF THE PILOT, STAND UPPING THE
- 22 PROGRAM THE FUTURE SUCCESS WE DO BELIEVE IS DEPENDENT ON
- 23 LEARNING CONTINUAL IMPROVEMENTS AND MAKING THINGS BETTER. AND
- 24 WE HAVE STRUGGLED GETTING THE PRODUCT IN HAND TO USE IT. OUR
- 25 CHALLENGE IS HOW TO GET MORE PEOPLE TO USE THE SYSTEM. FOR



- 1 THESE REASONS AS WE APPROACH THE SUNSET DATE OF THE THREE YEAR
- 2 PILOT PERIOD WE RECOMMEND EXTENDING THE PILOT FOR ANOTHER TWO
- 3 YEARS. AND THERE ARE A NUMBER OF FRAMEWORK COMPONENTS THAT
- 4 WE'RE GOING TO RETAIN AS WE CONTINUE, AND THESE INCLUDE
- 5 PROGRAM PARTICIPATION, THE DISCOUNT OPTIONS AND CENTRAL
- 6 ADMINISTRATION. WHAT WE ALL ARE PROPOSING ARE SOME CHANGES. WE
- 7 ARE LOOKING TO EXTEND, AGAIN, THE PILOT BY TWO YEARS, WHICH
- 8 WOULD THEN HAVE A SUNSET DATE OF JUNE 30TH OF 2025. AND, ALSO,
- 9 WITH THIS RESOLUTION WE'RE PROPOSING TO REVISE A SUBSIDY
- 10 APPROACH WITH THE OPERATORS WE ARE PROPOSING UP FRONT ONE TIME
- 11 PAYMENT THAT WOULD COVER TWO YEARS OF THE PILOT EXTENSION AND
- 12 I CAN GO INTO THAT ON THE NEXT SLIDE, AS WELL. AND THE THIRD,

- 15 SEEKING RESOURCES TO PROVIDE TECHNICAL SUPPORT FOR OPERATORS
- 16 AS THEY PROCEED WITH THEIR TITLE SIX EVALUATIONS AND ANALYSIS.
- 17 NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO, THE CLIPPER START PROGRAM IS A
- 18 REIMBURSEMENT BASED PROGRAM, AS I MENTIONED THIS IS THE ONE
- 19 THING WE'RE PROPOSING TO CHANGE HOW WE PROVIDE SUBSIDY
- 20 REIMBURSEMENTS TO THE OPERATORS. OPERATORS ARE CURRENTLY
- 21 REIMBURSED ON A PORTION OF THEIR LOST REVENUE FROM CLIPPER
- 22 START TRIPS. MTC HAS SET A SIDE LOW CARBON TRANSIT OPERATIONS
- 23 PROGRAM AND STATE TRANSIT ASSISTANCE FUNDS TO FUND BOTH THE
- 24 SUBSIDY OFFSETS AS WELL AS DIRECT ADMINISTRATION COST FOR THIS
- 25 PROGRAM. CURRENT ESTIMATE OF SUBSIDY REIMBURSEMENT IS TOTAL OF



- 1 700,000 SINCE INCEPTION AND IN TERMS OF ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS
- 2 APPROXIMATELY 1 MILLION PER YEAR IN DIRECT ADMINISTRATIVE
- 3 COST. FOR THE PILOT EXTENSION PERIOD WE'RE PROPOSING A CHANGE.
- 4 WHEN THE ORIGINAL PROGRAM WAS ADOPTED THERE WAS A CONCERN THAT
- 5 THE FUNDING THAT WE SET A SIDE WOULD DRY UP QUICKLY AND WHILE
- 6 AT THE TIME THERE WERE ONLY A FEW PROGRAMS SUCH AS THIS AROUND
- 7 THE NATION SO WE DIDN'T HAVE MUCH COMPARISONS AND LEARNED
- 8 EXPERIENCE. BUT WITH THREE YEARS OF EXPERIENCE UNDER OUR BELTS
- 9 THIS INFORMATION, WE'RE USING THIS INFORMATION ON DEVELOP A
- 10 FORMULA TO DO A ONE TIME UPFRONT PAYMENT FOR THE ONE TIME
- 11 EXTENSION PERIODS OF TWO YEARS FOR OPERATORS. GOALS MOVING
- 12 INTO THE MODEL ARE INCENTIVIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM
- 13 AND CONSISTENCY IN DISCOUNTS OFFERED AND SECONDLY LOOKING TO
- 14 MINIMIZE FINANCIAL RISK TO OPERATORS AND ADMINISTRATIVE BURDEN
- 15 FOR BOTH OPERATORS AND MTC STAFF, AND PROCESSING
- 16 REIMBURSEMENTS. AND THE FUNDING DISTRIBUTION STILL NEEDS TO BE
- 17 WORKED OUT WE WILL BE WORKING ON THIS WITH OPERATORS DURING
- 18 THE SUMMER TO FINALIZE ONCE WE HAVE KEY COMPONENTS OF FORMULA
- 19 MTC WOULD COME BACK TO THE COMMISSION WITH FUNDING APPROVALS
- 20 AND DISTRIBUTION AMOUNTS AND THERE ARE FUNDING COMPONENTS
- 21 UNDER THIS APPROVAL THAT INCLUDE FUNDING CREDITS FOR EARLY
- 22 ADOPTERS OF THE 50% GUARANTEED MINIMUMS IN THE FORM LOOKS AND
- 23 SO THESE ARE A FEW ASPECTS OF THE FORMULA THAT WE WOULD LIKE
- 24 TO INCLUDE IN MOVING FORWARD. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO, IN TERMS
- 25 OF SUMMARIZING, STAFF RECOMMENDS EXTENDING THE PILOT PROGRAM



- 1 FOR AN ADDITIONAL TWO YEARS TO JUNE 2025. AND DURING THE TWO
- 2 YEAR EXTENSION PERIOD MTC STAFF IN PARTNERSHIP WITH TRANSIT
- 3 AGENCY STAFF WOULD IMPLEMENT MARKETING OUTREACH ENGAGEMENT
- 4 STRATEGIES TO INCREASE PROGRAM USAGE. WE WOULD ALSO ACCESS
- 5 STRATEGIES TO SIMPLIFY AND POTENTIALLY EXPAND ACCESS TO THE
- 6 BENEFIT. AND LASTLY, INNOVATE AND DEPLOY DIFFERENT STRATEGIES
- 7 TO INCREASE REACH AND REMOVE BARRIERS TO MAKE IT EASIER FOR
- 8 PARTICIPANTS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM AND TO ALSO
- 9 MEET OUR PROGRAM GOALS. AND THEN LASTLY, THE FINAL
- 10 RECOMMENDATION IS ON THE FARE SUBSIDY MODIFICATIONS. AND
- 11 SUPPORT THE APPROACH OF A ONE TIME ESTIMATED PAYMENT WITH A
- 12 MINIMUM GUARANTEE, AND MTC AND OPERATOR STAFF WOULD FINALIZE
- 13 THE FORMULAS FOR THE FALL OF -- OR IN THE SUMMER OF 2023. NEXT
- 14 SLIDE, PLEASE. AND WITH THAT RECOMMENDATION, OUR OVERALL
- 15 SCHEDULE THIS HIGHLIGHTS OUR OVERALL SCHEDULE, WE HAVE DONE --
- 16 WE HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH TRANSIT AGENCY STAFF AND ALSO HAVE
- 17 SOLICITED FEEDBACK FROM THE FARE INTEGRATION TASK FORCE AS
- 18 WELL AS THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL SUBCOMMITTEES. WE'RE ALSO
- 19 PRESENTING THE RECOMMENDATION TO YOU TODAY FOR CONSIDERATION
- 20 AND IF APPROVED, WE WOULD TAKE STEPS TOWARDS EXTENDING THE
- 21 PILOT AND ALSO INITIATING THE PROGRAM IMPROVEMENTS AND
- 22 ASSESSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR CHANGES. AND, LASTLY, FOR AGENCIES
- 23 THAT ARE PLANNING TO OPT IN OR INCREASE TO 50%, INCREASE THEIR
- 24 DISCOUNT TO 50%, WE'RE SETTING A GOAL DATE FOR ALL THE
- 25 MIGRATION TO HAPPEN IN JANUARY OF 2024. SO THAT HAPPENS AT ONE



- 1 TIME. AND AT THE TOP OF THIS TIMELINE IS COMPLEMENTARY TRANSIT
- 2 AGENCY BOARD ACTIONS. SO GIVEN THIS WOULD BE A FARE CHANGE,
- 3 TRANSIT AGENCIES WOULD ALSO NEED TO TAKE A MEASURE IT CHANGES
- 4 AND ACTIONS AT THEIR BOARDS TO IMPLEMENT ANY CONTINUATION OF
