AS A BRIEF REMINDER RM3 CAPITAL PROGRAM AS 13 DEFINED IN STATUTE CONSISTS OF 35 PROJECTS TOTALLING \$4.45 14 15 BILLION. BREAK DOWN OF THE CAPITAL PROGRAM MODE BY 62% DURING 16 31% GOING TO ROADS HIGHWAYS AND SMALLER SHARES GOING TO MULTI-MODAL PROGRAMS. IN MAY THE COMMISSION DIRECTED STAFF TO BEGIN 17 COLLECTING ALLOCATION REQUESTS STARTING WITH PROJECTS RECEIVED 18 AND LETTERS OF NO PREJUDICE. A TOTAL \$272 MILLION IN 19 ALLOCATIONS WERE MADE LAST MONTH. AS THE CHAIR WENT OVER THE 20 21 RECOMMENDATIONS, ALLOCATIONS REQUESTED BY PROJECT SPONSORS 22 EIGHT ALLOCATIONS ARE RECOMMENDED TOTALING \$379.06 OF THESE 23 PROJECTS HOLD LNPS AND TWO DO NOT. NEXT SLIDE. THIS TABLE DETAILS THE JULY ALLOCATIONS INCLUDING RECOMMENDED ALLOCATION 24 AMOUNT PREVIOUSLY RECEIVED LONP AMOUNTS IF APPLICABLE. FIRST 25

THE NATURE OF THE TRANSACTION THAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT 22 IS THAT IT WILL INITIALLY BE A SHORT-TERM BANK REVOLVING LINE OF CREDIT, WE'LL BE BORROWING MONEY FROM A BANK UNDER A 23 STRUCTURED PROGRAM BUT WE'LL ONLY BE BORROWING THAT MONEY AS 24 WE ACTUALLY NEED IT DO IT IN ORDER TO MEET BART'S NEEDS. 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WILL HAVE A HOME EQUITY LINE OF CREDIT THIS IS THE SAME THING 1 WE'LL ENTER INTO A PROGRAM WHERE WE HAVE GOT ALL THE MONEY 2 3 AVAILABLE BUT ONLY ACTUALLY BORROW IT THAT'S NEEDED. THIS PROGRAM WILL HAVE THE ABILITY TO ESTABLISH BROADER REGIONAL 4 5 FINANCINGS IN THE FUTURE AS NEEDED. IT'S NOT DESIGNED IMMEDIATELY TO DO THAT. 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RESPONSIBLE FOR PROJECT DELIVERY AND THE DIRECT RECIPIENT 1 RESPONSIBLE FOR MEETING ALL OF FTA'S REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. 2 3 NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO, THE ESTIMATED FTA FORMULA FUNDS PROVIDE SIGNIFICANT DEBT SERVICE COVERAGE THAT ALLOWS US TO 4 5 GET THE BEST POSSIBLE FINANCING STRUCTURE AVAILABLE, BOTH ON THIS NEAR-TERM, SHORT-TERM LINE THE CREDIT, AND ANY FUTURE 6 TAKE OUT FINANCING THAT WE WOULD BE DOING ON A LONGER TERM 7 8 BASIS TO REFINANCE THE INITIAL SHORT-TERM PROGRAM.
