JENNY DID A NICE SEND OFF AT THE ABAG MEETING 12 LAST WEEK, AND WE WILL DEFINITELY MISS HER TENACITY AND HOW 13 MUCH EFFORT SHE PUT INTO THE PROGRAMS GROWING THEM. BUT WE DO 14 15 HAVE JANE ELIAS AS OUR NEW DIRECTOR. AND JANE COMES TO US FROM 16 SONOMA COUNTY. THANK YOU COMMISSIONER RABBITT AND COMMISSIONER FLEMING. WE'RE LUCKY THAT SHE'S IS GOING TO PICK UP TH MANTLE 17 AND BE, AS WE'VE BEEN CALLING HER CONSISTENTLY, THE NEW JENNY 18 BERG. THE STATE SENT OUT \$150 MILLION FOR SIGNIFICANT 19 INVESTMENTS IN THE PORTS OF OAKLAND AND SAN FRANCISCO. THESE 20 21 FUNDS ARE FROM THE PORT AND FREIGHT INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM. COMMISSIONERS MILEY AND THAO WERE THERE YES -- LAST WEEK --22 YESTERDAY, THE OTHER DAY -- MONDAY. THE SEVEN GRADE -- THE 7TH 23 STREET GRADE SEPARATION PROJECT AT THE PORT. THERE WAS A 24

- 8 CHAMPIONED AND IT REALLY DOES REFLECT WELL ON THE REGION WE
- 9 HAVE AN AGREEMENT ON HOW WE WANT TO MOVE FORWARD AND
- 10 CONSISTENT ADVOCACY FOR PURSUING THE FUNDS FOR THE ENTIRE
- 11 REGION. SO CONGRATULATIONS TO YOU ALL. AND FINALLY A COUPLE OF
- 12 ROAD SHOWS. THE MTC AND ABAG KICKED OFF THE WORK FOR 2050 PLUS
- 13 WHICH IS A LIMITED FOCUSED UPDATE OF PLANNED BAY AREA 2050. WE
- 14 KICK OFF THE WORK WITH A LOT OF PUBLIC OUTREACH TO A CITY OR
- 15 TOWN NEAR YOU. ALL OVER THE NEXT SIX WEEKS TEAMS WILL BE OUT
- 16 IN ALL NINE COUNTIES HOLDING UP THE PUBLIC POP-UP WORKSHOPS
- 17 WITH A SPECIFIC FOCUS ON PRESENTING IN EQUITY PRIORITY
- 18 COMMUNITIES. THERE'S A LIST OF EVENTS ON THE WEB SITE AND IN
- 19 THIS REPORT THAT'S A LINK THAT HELP YOU WITH WHERE UPCOMING
- 20 ROAD SHOWS WILL BE. THE BAHFA IS DOING A SIMILAR OUTREACH
- 21 ACROSS THE REGION. KATE HARTLEY AND HER TEAM WILL BE AROUND IN
- 22 YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD SOON. WE LOOK FORWARD TO THAT CONTINUED

- 8 IN THE COMMUNITIES WE GO IN. I WANT TO MAKE SURE WE'RE
- 9 INTENTIONAL AND FOCUSED AND RESULT ORIENTED SO FOLKS KNOW IT'S
- 10 NOT JUST A MEETING WITH AN EXERCISE BUT A MEETING WITH A
- 11 PURPOSE. I APPRECIATE STAFF DOING THAT. ANY QUESTIONS FROM
- 12 COMMISSIONERS FOR OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR? SEEING NONE. THANK
- 13 YOU, MR. FREMIER. MOVING TO COMMISSION COMMENTS. AGENDA ITEM
- 14 SEVEN. I'LL SAY A LITTLE OUT OF ORDER. MANY OF YOU KNOW I'M
- 15 VERY INTERESTED IN EV CHARGING STATIONS AND I WANT TO THANK
- 16 VICE CHAIR JOSEFOWITZ FOR CONNECTING ME WITH A FEW FOLKS. BUT
- 17 ON THAT MISSION, IT WAS REALLY INTERESTING TO LEARN ABOUT THE
- 18 LIMITATIONS OF OUR ENERGY GRID AND INFRASTRUCTURE CHALLENGES.
- 19 AND I DON'T KNOW IF OTHERS ARE FACING THAT. BUT IT WAS REALLY
- 20 DAUNTING TO LEARN ABOUT THE LIMITATIONS THAT WE HAVE IN OUR
- 21 GRID. AND THESE ARE NOT FOLKS THAT ARE A THREAT, THESE ARE
- 22 PARTNERS LIKE PG&E OR OTHERS. WHETHER IT'S US OR ANOTHER
- 23 AGENCY, NOT INTERESTED IN ADDING ANOTHER PILLAR OF
- 24 RESPONSIBILITY TO OUR ORGANIZATION, BUT IT'S INCUMBENT UPON US
- 25 TO KNOW THAT WE HAVE A RESILIENT GRID AS WE'RE TRYING TO ON



ENCOURAGE A GREENER FLEET AND REDUCING OUR GREENHOUSE GAS 1 EMISSIONS. THERE WERE SOME DAUNTING REVELATIONS THAT I LEARNED 2 3 ABOUT AND LIMITATIONS ON THE GET RID. SOMETHING TO GET AHEAD OF. DO YOU HAVE A OUICK COMMENT, MR. FREMIER? 4 5 ANDREW FREMIER: THANK YOU CHAIR PEDROZA. WE AGREE, AND WE HAVE 6 MET WITH THE CREATIVE ARM OF PG&E THAT DOES LOOK AT THE GRID 7 8 AND WE'RE MEETING AGAIN TOMORROW. THEY'RE INTERESTED IN TRYING TO PARTNER WITH THE REGION. WE ALL HAVE A HISTORY OF 9 CHALLENGES WITH PG&E BUT WE FELT WE HAVE HAD POSITIVE MEETINGS 10 WHERE THEY'RE WILLING TO WORK WITH US AND HAVE GOOD IDEAS FOR 11 HOW TO ATTACK THIS PROBLEM. 12 13 CHAIR, ALFREDO PEDROZA: JUST FROM LOCAL EXPERIENCE WE WERE ON 14 15 THE FRONT EDGE OF POWER SHUT-OFFS IN NAPA COUNTY WITH 16 WILDFIRES AND THEY WERE ABLE TO BE CREATIVE AND VISIONARY. I WANT TO MAKE SURE THERE IS A PLATFORM TO HAVE THAT 17 CONVERSATION. SO, JUST FOOD FOR THOUGHT TO PUT IN THE PARKING 18 19 LOT. 20 ANDREW FREMIER: THEY HAVE A BOUTIQUE ARM TO TAKE A LOOK AT 21 THESE THINGS [INDISCERNIBLE] TO SEPARATED FROM --22
