SO, OH, GREAT WE HAVE 18 THERESA ROMMEL WHO IS OUR DIRECTOR OF FUNDING POLICY AND 19 PROGRAMS. 20 21 22 THERESA ROMMELL: THANK YOU, CHAIR CHAVEZ. YES, JUST BRIEFLY, 23 STAFF WANTED TO HIGHLIGHT THE FACT THAT WE WILL BE BRINGING AN UPDATE TO ONE OF THE ITEMS, ITEM 2C IN YOUR AGENDA, TO THE 24 COMMISSION LATER THIS MONTH. THE PROGRAMMING THAT IS IN THIS 25

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ITEM, YOU HAVE ESTIMATED, SHARED FORMULA FUNDING BASED ON 1 PARTIAL APPORTIONMENT RELEASED BY THE FEDERAL TRANSIT 2 3 ADMINISTRATION EARLIER THIS YEAR. WE JUST RECEIVED THE FINAL APPORTIONMENTS LAST FRIDAY, AND THEY ARE SOMEWHAT 4 5 DISPROPORTIONATE TO THE PARTIAL APPORTIONMENTS THAT WE HAD INFORMED OUR PROGRAMMING. SO, THAT NECESSITATES SOME 6 ADJUSTMENTS MADE PRIOR TO THE FINAL COMMISSION MEETING LATER 7 8 THIS MONTH. WE BELIEVE IT'S IMPORTANT TO MAKE THOSE UPDATES BETWEEN YOUR REVIEW HERE AT THE PROGRAMMING AND ALLOCATIONS 9 COMMITTEE AND COMMISSION APPROVAL IN ORDER TO ALLOW 10 PROGRAMMING TO MOVE FORWARD IN THE TIP AMENDMENT THIS MONTH. 11 SO, THIS IS NOT AN OVERLY CONCERNING MATTER, BUT WANTED TO 12 HIGHLIGHT IT'S ON CONSENT, SO YOU KNOW THIS ITEM WILL CHANGE 13 BETWEEN THIS COMMITTEE AND THE ACTUAL COMMISSION MEETING LATER 14 THIS MONTH. THAT'S ALL. 15

19 APPRECIATE YOU'RE ALERTING US TO THAT. I APOLOGIZE COLLEAGUES

ANY COMMENTS FROM 9 MY COLLEAGUES. ALL IN FAVOR PLEASE NOTE BY AYE. [AYES] 10 CHAIR: ANY OPPOSED? ANY ABSTENTIONS? THAT MOTION PASSES 11 UNANIMOUSLY. MOVING TO ITEM 3A, MTC RESOLUTIONS 4607 REVISED 12 AND 4636. THIS IS ALLOCATION OF 500 MILLION IN RM3 CAPITAL 13 FUNDS TO THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA RAPID TRANSIT DISTRICT, 14 15 ALSO KNOWN AS BART, AN ALLOCATION AMENDMENTS OF 5.6 MILLION 16 REGIONAL MEASURE THREE CAPITAL FUNDS FOR SR37 SEARS POINT TO MARE ISLAND IMPROVEMENT PROJECT. CRAIG, YOU WILL DAZZLE US 17 WITH THE INFORMATION ON THIS. 18 19 CRAIG BOSMAN: GOOD MORNING, COMMISSIONERS. CRAIG BOSMAN, MTC 20 21 STAFF. THIS ITEM PRESENTS THE RECOMMENDED RM3 CAPITAL ALLOCATIONS FOR THIS MONTH. ONE NEW ALLOCATION RECOMMENDED FOR 22 500 MILLION FOR BART EXPANSION RAIL CARS AS PART OF THE 23 TRANSIT CORRIDOR CORE CAPACITY PROGRAM UNDER RM3 PROJECT ONE. 24 BART'S FLEET OF THE FUTURE RAIL CAR PROCUREMENT PROGRAM 25

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INCLUDES 306 EXPANSION RAIL CARS PARTIALLY FUNDED BY RM3. 1 OVERALL RAIL CAR PROCUREMENT PROGRAM IS MADE UP OF TWO PHASES. 2 3 CURRENTLY BART IS IN THE FINAL MONTHS OF RECEIVING RAIL CARS UNDER THE PHASE ONE OF THE PROGRAM CONSISTING OF 775 RAIL 4 5 CARS. MTC IS CONTRIBUTING TO PHASE ONE THROUGH FINANCING VIA BAIFA AGAINST FUTURE FTA FORMULA FUNDS THROUGH DIRECT 6 PROGRAMMING OF TRANSIT CAPITAL PRIORITY FUNDS AND THROUGH THE 7 8 BART CAR EXCHANGE ACCOUNTS. AS OF APRIL 1, 720 OF THESE 775 CARS HAVE BEEN DELIVERED, WITH 706 ACCEPTED INTO REVENUE 9 SERVICE. PHASE TWO WILL INCLUDE 306 EXPANSION RAIL CARS TO 10 IMPLEMENT THE CORE CAPACITY PROGRAM 306 EXPANSION RAIL 11 NECESSARY TO FULFILL BATA'S OBLIGATION TO THE FTA UNDER 12 CAPITAL INVESTMENT GRANT FULL FUNDING GRANT AGREEMENT THAT WAS 13 EXECUTED SEPTEMBER 2020. THE CORE CAPACITY PROGRAM IS A BART 14 PROJECT THAT WILL INCREASE BART CAPACITY BY 40% ENABLING 15 16 LONGER TRAINS INCREASING FREQUENCIES THROUGH TRANSBAY TUBE AND THEREBY RELIEVE CROWDING ON TRAINS REDUCE BAY AREA CONGESTION 17 AND INCREASE TRANSIT RIDERSHIP AND DECREASE GREENHOUSE GAS 18 19 EMISSIONS AND VEHICLE MILES TRAVELED THE PROCUREMENT OF 360 CAPACITY PROGRAM RAIL CARS ARE NECESSARY TO REALIZE THE 20 OVERALL BENEFITS OF THAT PROGRAM OTHER INVESTMENT INCLUDE 21 22 REPLACEMENT OF BART'S 50-YEAR-OLD LEGACY FIXED BLOCK TRAIN 23 CONTROL SYSTEM WITH NEW STATE-OF-THE-ART COMMUNICATIONS BASED TRAIL CONTROL SYSTEM AND ADDITIONAL TRACTION POWER SUBSTATIONS 24 TO POWER THE INCREASED SERVICE PHASE TWO CONTRACT HAS BEEN 25

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DEVELOPED TO MAINTAIN CONTINUOUS PRODUCTION FOLLOWING 1 COMPLETION OF PHASE ONE TO ENABLE UNINTERRUPTED SUPPLIER 2 3 FACTORY FLOW OF MATERIALS AND PHASE TWO PRIZING LEVERAGES CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS THAT TOOK PLACE OVER A DECADE AGO. IN 4 5 ADDITION TO RM3 KEY PARTNERS ON FUNDING PARTNERS INCLUDE FTA THROUGH CAPITAL INVESTMENT PROGRAM THROUGH THE STATES INNER 6 7 CITY RAIL PROGRAM CRCP AND ALAMEDA SAN FRANCISCO COUNTY 8 FUNDING MEASURE AS WELL AS BART CAR EXCHANGE ACCOUNT FUNDS. MOVING TO THE OTHER SMALL ITEM UNDER RM3 TODAY WE RECOMMEND 9 UPDATE TO A PREVIOUSLY APPROVED ALLOCATION FOR RM3 PROJECT 10 11 23.2 SR37 SERIES POINT TO MARE ISLAND IMPROVEMENTS APPROVED ALLOCATION OF \$5.6 MILLION IN OCTOBER 2023 TO THE SONOMA 12 COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY FOR BOTH DESIGN AND RIGHT OF 13 WAY PHASES SINCE MTC WAS INCLUDED AS A JOINT SPONSOR FOR SR37 14 IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT IN JANUARY 2024 AND WILL LEAD THE 15 16 IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS PORTION OF THE PROJECT TODAY'S ITEM WOULD RESCIND ALLOCATION OF SCTA AND REALLOCATE TO MTC. RM3 17 CAPITAL ALLOCATIONS TO DATE IS IN YOUR PACKET FURTHER DETAIL 18 19 ON TODAY'S RECOMMENDED ALLOCATIONS CAN BE FOUND IN ATTACHMENT B AND ALLOCATING RESOLUTIONS AND STAFF RECOMMENDATION IS TO 20 REFER MTC RESOLUTION 4636 AND 4607 REVISED TO THE COMMISSION 21 FOR APPROVAL. THANK YOU, AND OTHER RM3 PROGRAM STAFFERS ARE 22 23 AVAILABLE TO ANSWER YOUR QUESTIONS. ALSO BART STAFF IS HERE TO ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS. 24

9	COMMENT AND LOOK TO MY COLLEAGUES FOR COMMENTS OR QUESTIONS OR
10	A MOTION. ALL RIGHT. VICTORIA?

12	VICTORIA FLEMING: THANK YOU, CHAIR. I HAVE A QUESTION ABOUT
13	MOVING THE AUTHORITY FROM CTA TO MTC. IS THAT SOMETHING THAT
14	STAFF AT SCTA? UNLIKE MOST OF THE COMMISSIONERS, I DO NOT SIT
15	ON MY LOCAL TRANSIT AUTHORITY, SO I WANT TO MAKE SURE, SINCE
16	I'M NOT PART OF THOSE CONVERSATION, THAT THAT'S ALL COPACETIC
17	THERE. I HAVEN'T HEARD ISSUES ON OUR COUNTY END. DUE
18	DILIGENCE.

20	KENNETH KAO: GOOD MORNING COMMISSIONERS. I'M KENNETH KAO, MTC
21	STAFF. YES, WE HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH SCTA STAFF ON THIS AND
22	THEY CONCUR WITH MOVING FUNDS FROM SCTA TO MTC.
23	
24	VICTORIA FLEMING: EXCELLENT. THANK YOU.
25	



CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: GINA? COMMISSIONER GINA (LAUGHTER) 1 2 3 GINA PAPAN: YES THAT'S ME. THANK YOU, AND I JUST CAN'T HELP MYSELF HERE. SO, WE'RE -- ADDITIONAL CARS, AND I GET THE MONEY 4 5 WAS SET UP TO DO THIS. AT WHAT POINT DO WE EVALUATE IS THAT THE EXPENDITURE? AND WHAT ARE WE LOOKING AT HERE? WE GET ALL 6 THESE GREAT NEW PRETTY CARS HERE AND I'M ALREADY HEARING 7 8 REPORTS OF TWO DERAILED. SO, WHAT? GO AHEAD. 9 THERESA ROMMELL: I CAN TRY AND TAKE THAT, COMMISSIONER. I DO 10 THINK, AS CRAIG REPORTED IN THE STAFF REPORT THAT, WE DO 11 BELIEVE THAT THIS IS A GOOD INVESTMENT FOR SEVERAL REASONS. 12 NUMBER ONE IS THAT THE ADDITIONAL CARS ARE REQUIRED IN ORDER 13 TO MEET THE SERVICE REQUIREMENTS THAT FEDERAL AND STATE FUND 14 15 ARE, YOU KNOW, ARE REQUIRING, AND AS PART OF THIS PROJECT, SO, 16 THAT'S NUMBER ONE. NUMBER TWO IS THAT, YOU KNOW, THE PRICE FOR 17 THESE CARS WAS NEGOTIATED OVER TEN YEARS AGO AND IF WE WERE TO GO OUT TO BID AGAIN FOR THOSE SAME CARS, WE WOULD LIKELY BE 18 BEING LOOKING OR BART WOULD BE LOOKING AT A VERY SUBSTANTIAL 19 INCREASE IN COST. AND LASTLY WE THINK THE LONG-TERM CAPACITY 20 21 THAT THESE NEW CARS WILL PROVIDE WILL BE NEEDED WITHIN THE BART SYSTEM, AS WELL. SO, THAT'S FAIR. 22

24 GINA PAPAN: GOOD EXPLANATIONS I UNDERSTAND THAT BUT THEN ALSO25 AT A CERTAIN TIME WE NEED TO LOOK AT IS THIS THE BEST

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INVESTMENT WE HAVE HERE BECAUSE THIS IS CONCERNING TO HEAR 1 ABOUT DERAILMENTS AND YES WE WOULD LOVE THEM TO REACH CORE 2 3 CAPACITY WE WOULD LOVE ALL THESE CARS FILLED BUT I THINK WE NEED TO BE RESPONSIBLE AND ACCOUNTABLE. SO, JUST KEEP THAT IN 4 MIND AS WE MOVE FORWARD HERE. SO, ALL THOSE THINGS YOU SAID 5 WERE GREAT. BUT WE ALSO -- LET'S KEEP IN MIND, IS THIS WORKING 6 THROUGHOUT, AND AT A CERTAIN POINT IN TIME IF IT'S NOT, THEN 7 8 WHAT DO WE DO? THANK YOU.

CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: THANK YOU. ANY OTHER COMMENTS FROM MY 10 COLLEAGUES? I JUST HAVE TWO. I DO THINK THE OPPORTUNITY TO BUY 11 THESE CARS IS TREMENDOUS AND RECOGNIZE THAT -- I JUST WANT TO 12 EMPHASIZE THE COST OF THESE CARS TODAY. I REALLY -- I DON'T 13 EVEN WANT TO KNOW WHAT THAT PRICE IS. SO, I'M EXCITED THAT 14 15 WE'RE MOVING FORWARD. I DO WANT TO ASK THAT IF WE PROCEED, 16 THAT WE TAKE THIS ACTION TODAY -- AND I'LL ASK FOR A MOTION IN 17 JUST A MOMENT, COLLEAGUES; I'M VERY ENTHUSIASTIC ABOUT THIS. AND I WOULD LIKE TO BETTER UNDERSTAND AND GET A REASSESSMENT 18 FROM BART AS A PART OF THIS TO BETTER UNDERSTAND WHAT THEY 19 ANTICIPATE CAPACITY NEEDS TO BE OVER THE NEXT 5, 10 YEARS. AND 20 21 THE REASON I'M SAYING THIS, I THINK, THERESA, YOU'RE EXACTLY RIGHT THAT WE WANT TO GET TO THE POINT OF THESE CARS BEING 22 CROWDED AGAIN, AND I RECOGNIZE THAT THIS MAY ALLOW FOR A 23 DIFFERENT STRATEGIES, RELATIVE TO THE OVERALL CAPACITY. 24 25 BECAUSE CAPACITY HAS -- WE KNOW NEEDS HAVE CHANGED AND I'M

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ACTUALLY -- I'M ACTUALLY EXCITED ABOUT THIS. BECAUSE IN A WAY, 1 2 I THOUGHT WHEN THE CORE CAPACITY PROGRAM WAS COMING FORWARD 3 THAT, WE WERE JUST GOING TO BE AT CORE CAPACITY NOT REALLY BEING ABLE TO IMPROVE IT DRAMATICALLY BECAUSE OF THE 4 OVERCROWDING WE HAD. SO IN A WAY, I THINK THIS LULL MAY, IN 5 RIDERSHIP, MAY ACTUALLY HELP US MANAGE THE GROWTH IN A MORE --6 IN A WAY THAT'S MORE CUSTOMER FRIENDLY, FRANKLY. THAT SAID, A 7 8 REASSESSMENT, AT SOME POINT, BECAUSE IT WOULD HELP US, ALL OF YOU UNDERSTAND WHAT ARE THE INVESTMENTS THAT ARE GOING TO NEED 9 10 TO BE MADE ALONG THAT SYSTEM RELATIVE TO THE NEW TIME THAT WE'RE IN. DOES THAT MAKE SENSE? 11

13 THERESA ROMMELL: YEAH. ABSOLUTELY. AND I WOULD NOTE THAT WE 14 HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH BART ON FINDING A GOOD TIME FOR BART TO 15 COME IN AND PRESENT ON THE CORE CAPACITY PROJECT OVERALL, SO 16 WE'LL CONTINUE THOSE EFFORTS. AND I THINK WHAT YOU JUST NOTED 17 ABOUT, YOU KNOW, CAPACITY NEEDS OVER THE NEXT SEVERAL YEARS, 18 CAN DEFINITELY BE PART OF THAT PRESENTATION.

CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: YEAH. I THINK THAT WOULD BE VERY
VALUABLE. AND I WOULD JUST ADD THAT, YOU KNOW, ONE THING THAT
I HAVE REQUESTED AS COMMITTEE CHAIR, IS THAT WE HAVE SET ASIDE
SOME TIME FOR PEOPLE TO COME SO I THINK IT DOESN'T PUT YOU IN
THE POSITION OF HAVING TO INTERPRET OR DEFEND ANOTHER AGENCY



BECAUSE THEY CAN JUST BUILD THAT KNOWLEDGE WITH THE BOARD ON 1 THEIR OWN. DID YOU WANT TO WEIGH IN? ANDY? 2 3 ALFREDO PEDROZA: COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ, IF I MAY, ON THIS ITEM? 4 5 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: YES. 6 7 8 ALFREDO PEDROZA: SOMEONE RODE THIS MORNING ON BART AND IT WAS FULL. IT'S BEEN HAPPENING MORE AND MORE LATELY. I SUPPORT 9 OPERATORS COMING IN AND TALKING ABOUT WHAT THEY'RE SEEING I'M 10 INTERESTED IN CAPACITY AND RIDERSHIP GROWTH BECAUSE PEOPLE ARE 11 LIVING IF DIFFERENT PLACES WE HAVE SEEN THE DUST SETTLE BUT I 12 DON'T THINK IT'S COMPLETELY SETTLED AFTER THE PANDEMIC AND 13 WHAT MIGHT CHANGE WHERE PEOPLE ARE LIVING TYPES OF HOUSING 14 GETTING BUILT MIGHT CHANGE I THINK WE'RE LIVING IN A FLUID 15 16 MOMENT BUT LOOKING AT PROJECTIONS MIGHT HELPFUL. MY UNDERSTANDING AS MORE MONEY IS SPENT ON CARS, I WOULD LIKE TO 17 SEE MAINTAINING FOR GOOD CONDITIONS I HAVE SEEN CARS FULL AND 18 IT'S SAFE I WANT TO UNDERSTAND THE COMMITMENT TO MAKE SURE 19 THEY'RE CLEAN BECAUSE IT MATTERS AS WELL. HEARING FROM BART 20 AND THOSE INITIATIVES TO MAINTAIN THE QUALITY OF THE CARS IS 21 22 ALSO JUST AS IMPORTANT. THANK YOU.

24 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: THANK YOU. GINA?

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GINA PAPAN: YES MY OUESTION IS ALONG THOSE SAME LINES. DOES 1 THIS EXPENDITURE INCLUDE THE OPERATING COST? AS THE CHAIR 2 3 NOTED HERE, WE EXPECT THE OPERATING COST, WHAT OTHER OPERATING COST IS INCLUDED IN THE PRICE? CAN WE EXPECT BART TO COME BACK 4 5 AND SAY WE DEPOSIT ALL THESE NEW CARS, WE'RE GOING NEED MORE MONEY. WHAT KIND OF PROPOSAL IS THIS? IS THAT NOT INCLUDED OR 6 7 IS DID? 8 SPEAKER: COMMISSIONER THE FUNDING PLAN PRESENTED TODAY IS 9 10 STRICTLY FOR CAPITAL. 11 CHAIR, CINDY CHAVEZ: YEAH, SO I WOULD FOLLOW UP, GINA AND 12 ALFREDO, JUST TO SAY THAT, LET'S GET THEM SCHEDULED AND LET'S 13 HAVE A CONVERSATION WITH EM THIS. I THINK THOSE ARE ALL REALLY 14 EXCELLENT QUESTIONS. AND LIKE I SAID, I THINK THE MORE WE CAN 15

16 TALK DIRECTLY TO THEM IT DOESN'T PUT OTHERS IN A DEFENSIVE
17 POSITION BUT REALLY LET'S HAVE A CONVERSATION ABOUT WHERE BART
18 WILL BE IN ITS NEXT STEPS AND AGAIN I'M VERY ENTHUSIASTIC
19 ABOUT THIS. I WOULD LOVE TO GET A MOTION FROM ONE OF MY

20 COLLEAGUES. DON'T MAKE ME PICK. GINA?

21

GINA PAPAN: I'LL MOVE APPROVAL WITH A NOTE THAT YEAH WE REALLY
NEED, TO PART OF PLANNING FOR ANY OPERATOR, REALLY NEEDS TO
INCLUDE THE WHOLE PACKAGE. BUT I'LL MOVE APPROVAL.

MTC APPLIED FOR 102.8 IN FUND 19 TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND HCD IN 20 DECEMBER 2022 THIS ONE TIME STATE FUNDING SPECIFICALLY 21 22 ACCELERATING INFILL DEVELOPMENT REDUCING VEHICLE MILES 23 TRAVELED AND AFFIRMATIVELY FURTHERING FAIR HOUSING WITHIN THE BAY AREA AND THE REAP TWO EXPENDITURE PLAN ADOPTED BY THE 24 COMMISSION IN NOVEMBER 2022 WE PROPOSED FUNDING THREE PROGRAM 25

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AREAS THAT ALIGNED BOTH WITH STATE AND REGIONAL OBJECTIVES. 1 THE EXPENDITURE PLAN DIRECTS NEARLY 65 MILLION TO AFFORDABLE 2 3 HOUSING PILOTS, 25 MILLION FOR TRANSIT FARE COORDINATION, AND OUR MAPPING AND WAYFINDING WORK, AND 8 MILLION TO FUND 4 5 COMMUNITY DRIVEN TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS IN EOUITY PRIORITY COMMUNITIES. ADDITIONAL DETAILS ARE PROVIDED IN THE REAP TWO 6 SUMMARY MEMO THAT YOU SHOULD HAVE. UNFORTUNATELY, AND AS I 7 8 UNDERSTAND COMMISSIONERS ARE AWARE, THE GOVERNOR'S JANUARY BUDGET PROPOSAL INCLUDED A PROPOSED 50% CUT TO REAP TWO 9 FUNDING STATEWIDE. IF ENACTED THE FINAL BUDGET THIS JUNE, THAT 10 WOULD RESULT IN A 51 MILLION IN REAP TWO FUNDS FOR MTC 11 PROGRAMS ALONE. THE SUMMARY PROVIDES FURTHER DETAILS ON THE 12 IMPACT OF THAT, BUT SOME EXAMPLES INCLUDE A REDUCTION OF 13 ADDITIONAL NEW OR PRESERVED AFFORDABLE HOUSING, OUR ORIGINAL 14 TARGET FOR 800 TO 1600, NEW UNITS AND IT WILL BE PROBABLY 400 15 16 TO 800 UNITS WITH A 50% CUT. A LIMITED DURATION OF THE TRANSIT FARE PILOT PROGRAM RESULTING IN A LIMITED PROOF OF CONCEPT AND 17 LOWER ANTICIPATED BOOST TO TRANSIT RIDERSHIP AND WE ANTICIPATE 18 FOREGOING AN ADDITIONAL 8% IN ANTICIPATED GREENHOUSE GAS 19 REDUCTION LEVELS. MTC STAFF ARE WORKING CLOSELY WITH THE 20 21 CALIFORNIA ASSOCIATION OF COUNCILS OF GOVERNMENT, CALCOG AND OTHER IMPACTED METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATIONS TO 22 HIGHLIGHT THE IMPACT OF THIS FUNDING IN REACHING CALIFORNIA'S 23 HOUSING AND CLIMATE CHANGE GOALS. IN ADDITION TO THE SUMMARY 24 MEMO, INCLUDED IN THE PACKET, FURTHER OUTLINING SPECIFICS 25

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AROUND THIS PROPOSED CHANGE ATTACHMENTS INCLUDE, ATTACHMENT A 1 IS MTC'S ADVOCACY SHEET WHICH WAS CREATED TO HIGHLIGHT THE 2 POTENTIAL IMPACT OF THIS FUNDING, AS WELL AS WHAT A PROPOSED 3 BUDGET CUT WOULD ENTAIL. MTC STAFF HAS SHARED THIS WITH 4 5 VARIOUS ELECTED OFFICIALS DURING A RECENT ADVOCACY DAY IN SACRAMENTO. IN REGARDS TO THE EXPENDITURE 4 5 PLAN, IS THERE ANY FLEXIBILITY IN MOVING SOME OF THE FUNDS AROUND? OR DO WE JUST HAVE TO DO A STRAIGHT 50% CUT ON ALL THE 6 7 PROGRAMS? 8 SPEAKER: YOU KNOW, THEY HAVEN'T PROVIDED INFORMATION OF THAT. 9 SO, THE WAY WE'RE OPERATING RIGHT NOW IS ASSUMING A 50% ACROSS 10 ALL OF OUR PROGRAMS. BUT I THINK WE'RE, SORT OF, ON HOLD UNTIL 11 JUNE, AND THEN THAT WILL BE, SORT OF, A CONVERSATION WITH THE 12 PROJECT MANAGERS, AND LEADERSHIP, AND STAFF. OKAY, HERE IS 13 14 WHERE WE'RE FINALLY AT. BECAUSE IT DOES FEEL LIKE, JUST TOO 15 MUCH UNCERTAINTY TO EVEN MAKE THAT DECISION YET. 16 MARGARET ABE-KOGA: OKAY. GREAT. THANK YOU. KENNETH KAO: GOOD MORNING COMMISSIONERS KENNETH KAO, MTC STAFF 12 I WANT TO PROVIDE A BRIEF UPDATE FROM CTC WHICH IN THE LAST 13 MONTH IN SAN JOSE. HIGHLIGHT TWO PROGRAM UPDATES AND ONE 14 PROJECT UPDATE. FIRST CTC ADOPTED THE ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION 15 16 PROGRAM FUND ESTIMATE AND GUIDELINES SO THAT CALL FOR PROJECTS IS OUT ON THE STREET RIGHT NOW. APPLICATIONS WILL BE DUE ON 17 JUNE 17TH. THE CTC ALSO ADOPTED THE 2024 STATE TRANSPORTATION 18 IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM OR STIP, THAT INCLUDED ALMOST \$200 19 MILLION, NEW TRANSPORTATION FUNDING FOR THE BAY AREA, SO 20 21 THAT'S GREAT NEWS THERE AND FINALLY I WANTED TO HIGHLIGHT, ONE PROJECT, ACTUALLY OUTSIDE OF OUR REGION, IN YOLO COUNTY, THE 22 23 180 MANAGED LANES PROJECT THERE WAS AN ITEM FOR ADVANCED PROGRAMMING SB1 TRADE CORRIDOR PROGRAM FUNDS THAT ITEM WAS 24 DEFERRED BY CTC AND WILL BE CONSIDERED AT THE MAIN MEETING. 25

 ORANGE COUNTY. AND I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT THIS MEETING WAS THE
 FIRST MEETING FOR CHAIR GUARTINO IN HIS HOME SANTA CLARA
 COUNTY. I WANT TO APPRECIATE VTA AND SAN SAN JOSE AND COUNTY
 OF SANTA CLARA HOSTING THE CTC. IT WENT REALLY WELL.
