### **Finding Words**

You can use the Find command to find a complete word or part of a word in the current PDF document. Acrobat Reader looks for the word by reading every word on every page in the file, including text in form fields.

## To find a word using the Find command:

- 1. Click the Find button (**Binoculars**), or choose Edit > Find.
- 2. Enter the text to find in the text box.
- 3. Select search options if necessary:

  Match Whole Word Only finds only occurrences of the complete word you enter in the box. For example, if you search for the word *stick*, the words *tick* and *sticky* will not be highlighted.

Match Case finds only words that contain exactly the same capitalization you enter in the box.

Find Backwards starts the search from the current page and goes backwards through the document.

4. Click Find. Acrobat Reader finds the next occurrence of the word.

## To find the next occurrence of the word, Do one of the following:

Choose Edit > Find Again Reopen the find dialog box, and click Find Again. (The word must already be in the Find text box.)

## Copying and pasting text and graphics to another application

You can select text or a graphic in a PDF document, copy it to the Clipboard, and paste it into another application such as a word processor. You can also paste text into a PDF document note or into a bookmark. Once the selected text or graphic is on the Clipboard, you can switch to another application and paste it into another document.

Note: If a font copied from a PDF document is not available on the system displaying the copied text, the font cannot be preserved. A default font is substituted.



## To select and copy it to the clipboard:

1. Select the text tool T, and do one of the following: To select a line of text, select the first letter of the sentence or phrase and drag to the last letter.

To select multiple columns of text (horizontally), hold down Ctrl+Alt (Windows) or Option (Mac OS) as you drag across the width of the document.

To select a column of text (vertically), Hold down Ctrl+Alt (Windows) or Option+Command (Mac OS) as you drag the length of the document.

To select all the text on the page, choose Edit > Select All. In single page mode, all the text on the current page is selected. In Continuous or Continuous – facing mode, most of the text in the document is selected. When you release the mouse button, the selected text is highlighted. To deselect the text and start over, click anywhere outside the selected text. The Select All command will not select all the text in the document. A workaround for this (Windows) is to use the Edit > Copy command. Choose Edit > Copy to copy the selected text to the clipboard.

2. To view the text, choose Window > Show Clipboard

In Windows 95, the Clipboard Viewer is not installed by default and you cannot use the Show Clipboard command until it is installed. To install the Clipboard Viewer, Choose Start > Settings > Control Panel > Add/Remove Programs, and then click the Windows Setup tab. Double-click Accessories, check Clipboard Viewer, and click OK.

- 7 RECOMMENDATION -- EXCUSE ME. ITEM 5C RECOMMENDATION OF
- 8 CONTRACT ACTIONS FOR THE BAY AREA TOLL AUTHORITY. SO I BELIEVE
- 9 THAT ANDY FREMIER IS ON THIS REPORT. ANDY MAY I TURN TO YOU
- 10 PLEASE?

- 12 ANDREW FREMIER: THANK YOU CHAIR WORTH GOOD MORNING
- 13 COMMISSIONERS ANDREW FREEDOM EAR DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS
- 14 AT BAY AREA TOLL AUTHORITY. I THINK WE HAVE A PRESENTATION.
- 15 THANK YOU. THIS ITEM IS A CONTINUATION OF THE STATUS UPDATE OF
- 16 THE TOLL SYSTEM ENVIRONMENT AND THE PLANS TO MOVE FORWARD TO
- 17 PROTECT THE TOLL REVENUE STREAM PRIMARILY DUE TO THE PANDEMIC.
- 18 THERE IS FOUR SPECIFIC ACTIONS IN THIS REQUEST, AND THEY'RE
- 19 DESIGNED TO PROTECT THE TOLL REVENUE AND ALLOW US TO NAVIGATE
- 20 MORE SUCCESSFULLY IN THE EVENT THE TOLL COLLECTORS DON'T COME
- 21 BACK SOON OR THEY DON'T COME BACK AT ALL. FRANKLY, THEY ALSO
- 22 COULD BE FORCED TO LEAVE AGAIN DEPENDING ON THE CONDITIONS OF
- 23 THE ENVIRONMENT. THESE STEPS ARE ALSO IMPORTANT THOUGH AS AN
- 24 INVESTMENT FOR THE FUTURE MOVE TO A COMPLETE ALL ELECTRONIC
- 25 TOLLING SYSTEM. SO WE DO THINK IT'S A GOOD INVESTMENT UNDER



- 1 ALL CIRCUMSTANCES. I WILL MENTION THAT WE WORK VERY CLOSELY
- 2 WITH CALTRANS AND ARE PHYSICALLY READY TO MOVE THE TOLL
- 3 COLLECTORS BACK INTO POSITION. WE HAVE MODIFIED THEIR WORK
- 4 ENVIRONMENT AND WE HAVE GOT SOME WORK PROTOCOLS SET IN PLACE,
- 5 BUT IT'S OUR UNDERSTANDING THAT BECAUSE OF THE CURRENT COVID
- 6 CONDITIONS, AND THE RETURN OF SOME OF THE SITUATIONS THAT HAVE
- 7 CAUSED THE PROBLEM IN THE FIRST PLACE. THE STATE WOULD LIKE TO
- 8 TAKE SOME TIME BEFORE DECIDING IF THE TOLL COLLECTORS SHOULD
- 9 COME BACK. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. JUST AS A REMINDER, HERE IS SOME
- 10 OF THE TIMELINES THAT WE HAVE GONE THROUGH DURING THE COURSE
- 11 OF THIS DISCUSSION. BACK IN 2013 THE GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE MADE
- 12 THE MOVE TO ALL ELECTRONIC TOLLING, AND THEN AS LATE AS 2018,
- 13 THE BATA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE APPROVED OUR PLANS FOR MOVING
- 14 FORWARD FOR A TRANSITION THAT WOULD TAKE MULTIPLE YEARS TO
- 15 CONVERT. IDEA WAS TO START IN 2022, AND THEN FINISH WITH THE
- 16 BAY BRIDGE IN THE '25 OR '26 TIME ERA. OBVIOUSLY ON MARCH 21ST
- 17 THE ENVIRONMENT CHANGED FOR US AND THE COLLECTORS THEMSELVES
- 18 ARE CALTRANS EMPLOYEES AND IN THE DIRECTION OF THE STATE THEY
- 19 WERE ASKED TO BE REMOVED FOR PUBLIC SAFETY BOTH FOR THEM AND
- 20 THE TRAVELING PUBLIC. AND SO WE MOVED INTO A TERM THAT WE CALL
- 21 CASHLESS COLLECTION ON MARCH 21ST, AND THIS'S CURRENTLY WHERE
- 22 WE'RE AT. AND WE'RE TRYING TO PUT IN PROTECTIONS THAT REALLY
- 23 ALLOW US A MUCH BETTER CHANCE OF COLLECTING THE REVENUE THAT'S
- 24 SO IMPORTANT TO THE REGION. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO A LITTLE BIT
- 25 OF A REMINDER ON HOW THINGS HAVE CHANGED FOR FOLKS THAT



- 1 ANTICIPATED TO PAY CASH AS THEY CAME TO THE PLAZAS. ON THE
- 2 LEFT YOU SEE WHAT IS CALLED THE TRADITIONAL TOLLING APPROACH
- 3 WHERE YOU ESCALATE VIOLATIONS FOR FOLKS THAT DRIVE-THRU
- 4 WITHOUT PAYING. THERE IS A 25 PERCENT FIRST NOTICE, \$25 FIRST
- 5 NOTICE ADD A SECOND NOTICE IT BECOMES A \$70 PENALTY AND
- 6 EVENTUALLY WE GET TO HOLDS. DURING CASHLESS COLLECTION WE HAVE
- 7 DECIDED TO HOLD OFF ON THE PENALTY ESCALATION AND DMV HOLDS WE
- 8 BELIEVE WE HAVE PROTECTED THE INTEREST OF BATA AS BEST WE CAN
- 9 AND SO WE DO ANTICIPATE AT SOME POINT REINSTATING THAT
- 10 PROCESS, BUT FOR NOW, WE ARE REALLY JUST TRYING TO COLLECT THE
- 11 TOLL REVENUE, BUT IT IS A MUCH MORE DIFFICULT SITUATION FOR US
- 12 TODAY, BECAUSE WE HAVE TO CHASE A LOT OF THE REVENUE THAT WAS
- 13 PREVIOUSLY PAID FOR IN CASH. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. WE HAVE VERY
- 14 SIMPLE GOALS. OBVIOUSLY WE'RE TRYING TO COLLECT THE TOLLS AND
- 15 PROTECT THE PUBLIC. WE WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT WE MINIMIZE THE
- 16 RISK, BOTH GOING FORWARD AND IN OUR CURRENT CONDITIONS, AND
- 17 THEN WE ALSO NEED TO PRESERVE ALTERNATIVES FOR FOLKS THAT DO
- 18 WANT TO PAY CASH BUT WE WOULD LIKE TO AVOID HAVING THEM PAY
- 19 CASH AT THE TOLL BOOTHS THEMSELVES. SO THAT DOES REQUIRE
- 20 THOUGH A SYSTEM OF CHANGES. AND THE WE WILL BE BACK IN THE
- 21 FALL TO TALK ABOUT SOME OF THE TOLL POLICY CHANGES THAT WE'LL
- 22 BE REQUIRING TO BATA RESOLUTION. WE'RE HERE NOW TALKING MOST
- 23 PRIMARILY ABOUT THE TOLL FACILITIES AND SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS
- 24 THAT NEED TO TAKE PLACE TO ENSURE THAT WE'RE READY AND JUST A
- 25 REMINDER THAT WHAT WE REALLY DO IN THE ALL ELECTRONIC



- 1 ENVIRONMENT IS YOU MOVE COLLECTION FROM THE BOOTH TO THE BACK
- 2 OFFICE. AND SO WE DO NEED TO INCREASE OUR ROLE IN CUSTOMER
- 3 SERVICE EFFORTS AT THE CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTER AND THAT ALSO
- 4 IS A PRIMARY GROWTH AREA THAT IS CURRENTLY A REAL CHALLENGE IN
- 5 THIS ENVIRONMENT THAT WE'RE IN. NEXT SLIDE. THERE IS MORE
- 6 DETAIL AFTER THIS, BUT IN GENERAL, WE'RE IN PHASE ONE RIGHT
- 7 NOW, AND SO WE'RE SPENDING 2020, REALLY GETTING READY FOR
- 8 UPGRADES IN THE CUSTOMER SERVICE ENVIRONMENT, SO THAT THE
- 9 CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTER CAN HANDLE THE INCREASED LOAD OF
- 10 TRANSACTIONS. WE NEED TO BE READY, OPERATIONALLY, TO PROTECT
- 11 THE TOLL REV NEW FINANCES TO MAKE SURE THEY'RE IN GOOD SHAPE.
- 12 WE HAVE ALSO GOT TO DO QUITE A BIT OF OUTREACH TO MAKE SURE
- 13 PEOPLE UNDERSTAND THE CHANGES. THERE NEED TO BE ENGINEERING
- 14 CHANGES IN THE PLAZAS AND WE HAVE TO DEAL WITH THE EMPLOYEES
- 15 THAT ARE CURRENTLY COLLECTING CASH IN THE BOOTH IN THE NORMAL
- 16 ENVIRONMENT. OVER THE NEXT COUPLE OF YEARS, WE'LL BE BACK
- 17 TALKING ABOUT MORE IMPROVED WAYS TO DEAL WITH THE FINANCIAL
- 18 REPORTING, AND ALSO CONTINUED IMPROVEMENTS TO A CASH NETWORK

- 1 YEAR, IS AN ALIGNMENT WITH WHAT THE GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE DOES
- 2 TODAY IN THEIR ALL ELECTRONIC ENVIRONMENT. SO THEY SEND AN
- 3 INVOICE FOR A TOLL ONLY FIRST BEFORE THEY MOVE ON TO THE
- 4 ESCALATION PROCESS. AS YOU CAN SEE, WE DON'T DO THAT TODAY,
- 5 BECAUSE WE DON'T HAVE THE ABILITY TO BUNDLE TRANSACTIONS,
- 6 WHICH MEANS IF YOU GO THROUGH DAY, YOU GET A PIECE OF MAIL, IF
- 7 YOU GO THROUGH THE NEXT DAY YOU GET ANOTHER PIECE OF MAIL.
- 8 GOLDEN GATE IS ABLE TO PUT THOSE TRANSACTIONS TOGETHER AND
- 9 BILL YOU ON A REGULAR CYCLE, WHICH IS WHERE WE WOULD LIKE TO
- 10 GET TO. EVENTUALLY, WHEN WE GET TO ALL ELECTRONIC TOLLING WE
- 11 WOULD MIMIC THE EXISTING SYSTEM OF GOLDEN GATE YOU JUST ADD AN
- 12 ADDITIONAL INVOICE WHICH IS THE ISSUE BEFORE US TODAY. I
- 13 MENTIONED CUSTOMER SERVICE UPGRADES IT'S QUITE A TRANSACTION
- 14 IN ORDER -- OR TRANSITION IN ORDER TO MOVE THE COLLECTORS FROM
- 15 THE BOOTHS TO THE BACK OFFICE. THOSE WILL GROW AND THERE IS A
- 16 LOT MORE WORK THAT HAS TO BE DONE ON THE BACK END TO COLLECT
- 17 THE REVENUE FROM THOSE INVESTMENTS, AND CLEARLY THERE IS ALL
- 18 KINDS OF PUBLIC RELATIONS UPDATES IN TERMS OF THE WEB SITE AND
- 19 OTHER CUSTOMER SERVICE ENVIRONMENT IMPROVEMENTS. NEXT SLIDE.
- 20 TRANSACTIONS THAT WE RECEIVED TODAY IN CASH REALLY CHALLENGE
- 21 THE PROCESS AND THE MAJOR INVOICING THAT WOULD BE REQUIRED,
- 22 THIS PIE CHART REALLY DESCRIBES HOW WE ANTICIPATE USING THE
- 23 EXPERIENCE THAT THE GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE HAS SEEN PLUS WHAT WE
- 24 HAVE SEEN AROUND THE NATION PLUS WHAT WE SEE WILL HAPPEN
- 25 AROUND THE TRANSACTIONS WE ANTICIPATE TRAVEL OF THE



- 1 TRANSACTIONS WILL BE COMING FROM FASTRAK CUSTOMERS WE SEE
- 2 THERE WILL BE OPTIONS TO PAY BY LICENSE PLATE SO YOU CAN DO IT
- 3 INDIVIDUALLY AS I TRANSPORT ACROSS THE BRIDGES BUT WE DO
- 4 ANTICIPATE QUITE A BIT OF INVOICING. SO ABOUT A QUARTER OF THE
- 5 TRANSACTIONS WOULD COME THROUGH INVOICING AND THEN OF COURSE
- 6 WE CONTINUE TO HAVE TO RESOLVE IMAGE REJECTIONS AND OTHER
- 7 TECHNICAL THINGS THAT HAPPEN DURING THE TOLL TRANSACTION. SO
- 8 THIS INFORMATION HAS BEEN VALIDATED BY MOST OF THE WORK THAT'S
- 9 BEING DONE IN THIS ENVIRONMENT ACROSS THE NATION AND IT'S WHAT
- 10 WE NEED TO PREPARE FOR. NEXT SLIDE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. YEAH.
- 11 SO THE PUBLIC OUTREACH CAMPAIGN, I THINK, IS PRETTY OBVIOUS.
- 12 WE WANT TO SET UP PAYMENT OPTIONS FOR FASTRAK ACCOUNTS THE
- 13 GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE USES LICENSE PLATE ACCOUNTS FOR ONE TIME
- 14 PAYMENTS SO WE NEED TO GET THAT INFORMATION OUT TO MAKE SURE
- 15 THAT PEOPLE KNOW HOW TO PAY AND ALL THE DIFFERENT WAYS THAT
- 16 THEY CAN PAY, BUT OF COURSE THE BEST SOLUTION FOR ALL OF US IS
- 17 IF THEY JOIN FASTRAK WHICH IS THREE. NEXT SLIDE. NEXT PLAZA
- 18 TOLL IMPROVEMENTS. WE DON'T ANTICIPATE SIGNIFICANT
- 19 IMPROVEMENTS THAT WILL BE NECESSARY TO MOVE TO A MORE CASHLESS
- 20 ENVIRONMENT. I THINK WE KNOW THE PLAZA OPERATES REASONABLY
- 21 WELL TODAY IN THE CASHLESS ENVIRONMENT. BUT WE ANTICIPATE
- 22 SIGNAGE CHANGES, STRIPING CHANGES AND OTHER DETAILS THAT
- 23 AFFECT THE WAY TRANSPORTATION APPROACHES THE TOLL PLAZA. SO WE
- 24 WORK CLOSELY WITH CALTRANS AND MAKE THE MINOR IMPROVEMENTS
- 25 THAT WE THINK ARE NECESSARY TO REALLY FACILITATE THE TOLL



- 1 TRANSACTION AND MOVEMENT ACROSS THE BRIDGE PLAZA WHILE WE WAIT
- 2 FOR THE LARGER IMPROVEMENTS TO COME A COUPLE OF YEARS FROM
- 3 NOW. NEXT SLIDE. ONE OF THE BIGGER CHALLENGES IN FRONT OF US
- 4 IS WORKING WITH THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA TO TRANSITION THE
- 5 EMPLOYEES PROPERLY. SO WE HAVE BEEN WORKING CLOSELY WITH THE
- 6 SACRAMENTO ADMINISTRATIVE FOLKS AND IT IS CONSISTENT WITH THE
- 7 CURRENT SEIU AGREEMENTS THAT ARE IN PLACE WITH THE COLLECTORS
- 8 BUT THERE IS QUITE A BIT OF NOTICE REQUIREMENTS AND WE DO FEEL
- 9 AN OBLIGATION TO MAKE SURE THERE IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO RETRAIN
- 10 COLLECTORS TO OTHER PROFESSIONS INCLUDING POTENTIALLY MOVING
- 11 TO OUR BACK OFFICE ENVIRONMENT. THE CALTRANS IS ALSO COMMITTED
- 12 TO BEING ABLE TO ABSORB ALL OF THE EMPLOYEES BACK INTO THE
- 13 WORK ENVIRONMENT IS THERE MIGHT BE SOME OPPORTUNITIES FOR
- 14 FOLKS TO RETIRE A LITTLE BIT EARLY AND WE'LL CONTINUE TO WORK
- 15 ON THOSE KINDS OF PLANS WITH CALTRANS OVER THE COMING MONTHS.
- 16 BUT WE DO BELIEVE THAT THERE ARE SOME REALLY GOOD
- 17 OPPORTUNITIES FOR THESE EMPLOYEES WHO HAVE SERVED WELL OVER
- 18 THE YEARS. NEXT SLIDE. SO, IN CONCLUSION, I JUST WANTED TO
- 19 SHOW YOU WHAT OUR CURRENT THINKING IS IN TERMS OF TIMELINE. SO
- 20 IN MAY AND JUNE YOU APPROVED SOME WORK FOR US TO GET STARTED
- 21 ON THE INVOICING AND THAT WORK IS UNDERWAY WITH CONDUENT. ONE
- 22 REMINDER IS WE'RE PLANNING ON OPENING THREE MAJOR EXPRESS
- 23 LANES OVER THE COURSE OF THIS TIME PERIOD AND SO WE'RE VERY
- 24 MINDFUL OF MAKING SURE THAT THE WORK THAT IS BEING DONE BY
- 25 CONDUENT IS SEQUENCED PROPERLY AND RESOURCED PROPERLY AND THIS



- 1 WILL BE A CONTINUING CHALLENGE THAT WE WILL REPORT BACK OVER
- 2 THE COURSE OF THE FALL BUT WE BELIEVE WITH THE CHANGE ORDERS
- 3 THAT YOU HAVE AUTHORIZED BEFORE AND WITH THE ANTICIPATION THAT
- 4 YOU WILL AUTHORIZE THESE TODAY, WE'LL BE WELL UNDERWAY TO BE
- 5 ABLE TO INVOICE PROPERLY BY THE END OF THE CALENDAR YEAR AND
- 6 REALLY CONCENTRATE ON IMPROVEMENTS BEYOND THAT TO GET US TO A
- 7 TRUE ALL ELECTRONIC ENVIRONMENT. SO, TODAY, WHAT WE'RE GOING
- 8 TO DO IS WHAT WE'RE ASKING FOR IS FOUR PARTICULAR ACTIONS. WE
- 9 WOULD LIKE TO AWARD A CONTRACT CHANGE ORDER TO OUR CONDUENT
- 10 BACK OFFICE CONTRACTOR TO ALLOW THEM TO CONTINUE TO DEPLOY THE
- 11 INVOICING METHODS AND TESTING. THERE IS ALSO AN ANTICIPATION
- 12 OF ADDITIONAL TRANSACTION CHARGES WHICH ARE ANTICIPATED IN THE
- 13 CONTRACT, BUT WERE NOT FUNDED DIRECTLY, BECAUSE WE HAVE HAD NO
- 14 KNOWLEDGE OF WHEN WE WOULD TRANSITION TO ALL ELECTRONIC
- 15 TOLLING. SO THE BULK OF THE CHANGE ORDER IS REALLY ASSOCIATED
- 16 WITH THE OPERATIONAL COST THAT WILL HAPPEN OVER THE COURSE OF
- 17 THE NEXT YEAR OR TWO. DEVELOPMENT, AND TESTING COST IS A MINOR
- 18 PORTION OF THAT \$10 MILLION CHANGE. WE'LL ALSO NEED TO
- 19 PURCHASE A LOT MORE TOLL TAG. AGAIN YOU HAVE EXISTING
- 20 CONTRACTS IN PLACE THAT WILL ALLOW US TO PURCHASE TOLL TAGS
- 21 WE'RE ASKING TO ACCELERATE THOSE PURCHASES TODAY. WE'RE ALSO
- 22 STARTING CUSTOMER OUTREACH DEVELOPMENT AND GETTING THAT WORK
- 23 STARTED. FINALLY THERE IS A SMALL AMOUNT OF CIVIL WORK IN THIS
- 24 CASE ON THE SOUTHERN BRIDGES YOU HAVE AUTHORIZED ENGINEERING
- 25 WORK ON THE NORTHERN BRIDGES AND THIS IS REALLY DESIGNED TO



- 1 MAKE SURE THE OPERATION IS SEAMLESS FOR THE TRAVELING PUBLIC
- 2 AS THEY GO THROUGH. WE DO ANTICIPATE POTENTIALLY BEING BACK IN
- 3 AUGUST WITH SOME OTHER CONTRACT ACTIONS. BUT RIGHT NOW WE
- 4 ANTICIPATE NOT COMING BACK 19 UNTIL THE FALL WHEN WE'LL START
- 5 TALKING ABOUT POLICY CHANGES AND OPTIONS FOR HOW WE CAN
- 6 GENERATE THE TOLLING INVOICE PROPERLY AND NOTICE IT PROPERLY.
- 7 SO WITH THAT STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT THE COMMITTEE AUTHORIZE THE
- 8 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR DESIGNEE TO NEGOTIATE AND ENTER INTO THE
- 9 FOLLOWING. CONTRACT CHANGE ORDER WITH CONDUENT NOT TO EXCEED
- 10 \$10.5 MILLION TO MODIFY THE CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTER AND
- 11 OPERATIONS SUPPORT. WE WOULD ALSO LIKE A CONTRACT AMENDMENT
- 12 WITH CARIBOU PUBLIC RELATIONS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED
- 13 \$990,000 FOR PUBLIC OUTREACH AND EDUCATION SERVICES. WE WOULD
- 14 ALSO LIKE A PURCHASE ORDER WITH NEOLOGY, NOT TO EXCEED \$2.81
- 15 MILLION FOR FASTRAK TOLL TAGS, ALL SWITCHABLE TAGS THAT WE'RE

- 19 AND WITH THAT I WOULD BE HAPPEN TO ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS.

- 21 AMY R. WORTH, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH ANDY. I SEE NICK. I
- 22 WANT TO TURN TO THE COMMITTEE --

- 22 TRYING TO PROTECT PEOPLE. MY QUESTION IS REGARDING -- AND I AM
- 23 CERTAINLY SUPPORTIVE OF THIS -- BUT I THOUGHT I WOULD GET MORE
- 24 DETAIL ON THE AMENDMENT FOR THE FUNDING FOR THE DESIGNS
- 25 CHANGES ON THE SOUTHERN BRIDGES. OBVIOUSLY YOU HAVE DUMBARTON



- 1 BRIDGE WOULD BE ONE OF THE SOUTHERN BRIDGES SO I THOUGHT I
- 2 WOULD ASK FOR MORE DETAIL ABOUT WHAT THAT WOULD ENTAIL.

- 4 AMY R. WORTH, CHAIR: OKAY TERRIFIC. THANK YOU. ANDY, WOULD YOU
- 5 LIKE TO ANSWER, RESPOND TO THAT?

- 7 ANDREW FREMIER: SURE. THAT'S SIMPLE. THANK YOU FOR THE
- 8 QUESTION, COMMISSIONER. YOU KNOW, SEVERAL YEARS AGO, WE HAD A
- 9 FASTRAK STRATEGIC PLAN THAT REALLY CHANGED THE WAY THE PLAZA
- 10 APPROACHES WORK AND THAT REQUIRED AN RETIREMENT CHANGE WHERE
- 11 FASTRAK OR HOV AND BUSES WERE PRIMARILY ON THE LEFT, FASTRAK
- 12 WAS PRIMARILY IN THE MIDDLE AND CASH WAS ON THE RIGHT AND THAT
- 13 REQUIRED A SERIES OF STRIPING AND SIGNAGE CHANGES. THOSE ARE
- 14 THE KIND OF DETAIL US THAT NEED TO MAKE ADJUSTMENTS TO WHEN
- 15 YOU CHANGE THE PHYSICAL APPROACH AS THE TRAVELING PUBLIC
- 16 APPROACHES THE PLAZA SO WE WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT THE SIGNING
- 17 IS CONSISTENT. WE DO ANTICIPATE MULTIPLE CHANGES TO THE WAY
- 18 YOU PAY, AND THAT NEEDS TO BE NOTICED. TOLL SCHEDULE NEEDS TO
- 19 BE NOTICED. THERE IS POTENTIAL FOR QUITE A BIT OF STRIPING AND
- 20 ALIGNMENT MOVES. WE WOULD PROBABLY CONSOLIDATE SOME OF THE
- 21 TRAFFIC AND MAYBE KEEP SOME BOOTHS CLOSED BECAUSE THEY'RE NOT

- 6 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI: OKAY THAT WAS GOOD INFORMATION. THANK YOU
- 7 VERY MUCH ANDY.

- 9 AMY R. WORTH, CHAIR: THANK YOU CAROLE FOR THAT QUESTION. YES
- 10 COMMISSIONER PEDROZA? ALFREDO.

12 ALFREDO PEDROZA: THANK YOU.

14 AMY R. WORTH, CHAIR: VICE CHAIR PEDROZA.

- 16 ALFREDO PEDROZA: AMY, GREAT PRESENTATION. REALLY GLAD WE'RE

- 22 ANDREW FREMIER: THE STUDY THAT WE REFERRED TO THAT WE
- 23 COMPLETED IN 2016 AND IT WAS APPROVED BY BATA IN 2018 HAD ALL
- 24 THAT DETAIL IN IT AND I AM HAPPY TO REFRESH THE COMMISSION
- 25 THROUGH SOME OF THAT INFORMATION. WE HAVE BEEN CAUTIOUS THOUGH



- 1 TO ASSUME ANY PARTICULAR SAVINGS AND HAVE PRETTY MUCH CALLED
- 2 IT A WASH. WE DO ANTICIPATE THAT OVER TIME THERE WOULD LIKELY
- 3 BE SOME SAVINGS, BUT YOU REALLY ARE, AS I MENTIONED A COUPLE
- 4 OF TIMES, MOVING THE COLLECTORS OUT OF HARM'S WAY INTO THE
- 5 BACK OFFICE. GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE HAS INDICATED THEY HAVE QUITE
- 6 A BIT OF SAVINGS BUT WE'RE BEING CAUTIOUS ABOUT IT UNTIL WE
- 7 UNDERSTAND IT. AND FRANKLY THE INVESTMENT IN THE CAPITAL
- 8 IMPROVEMENTS IS SIGNIFICANT AND THAT WILL TAKE TIME TO ABSORB
- 9 AND IT REALLY IN A LOT OF WAYS DEPENDS HOW YOU CALCULATE THE

- 15 THAT IS A GREAT THING. IT IS A LONG-TERM INVESTMENT BUT IT'S
- 16 GOING TO PAY OFF WITH THE INSTITUTION. THANK YOU FOR BRINGING
- 17 THIS FORWARD.

- 19 AMY R. WORTH, CHAIR: THANK YOU. ARE THERE ANY OTHER QUESTIONS
- 20 OF THE COMMITTEE? OKAY. IF NOT, THEN I WILL MOVE IT TO OUR
- 21 PUBLIC COMMENT. AND I SEE ONE SPEAKER, ALETA DUPREE. SO
- 22 WELCOME. AND, LET'S SEE. COULD YOU -- WELL, LET'S SEE. THERE

- 13 CUSTOMERS CAN PAY AT THEIR SUPER MARKET OR THROUGH -- IDEALLY
- 14 THROUGH KIOSKS AND VENDING MACHINES SO WE CAN REDUCE THE CLOSE
- 15 INTERACTIONS THAT ARE INVOLVED THAT HAPPEN EACH EVEN IN
- 16 STORIES. SO THE TECHNOLOGY FOR THAT WILL BE NEEDED TO BE
- 17 UPGRADED INTO THE COMMUNITY BECAUSE SOMETIMES I HAVE CASH AND
- 18 I NEED TO GET RID OF IT. COLLECTION IS AN IMPORTANT. A
- 19 REASONABLE VIOLATION POLICY IS IMPORTANT. AND THE ABILITY TO

- 21 CAMPAIGN USING HUMOR TO TALK ABOUT WHAT YOU COULD USE A TOLL

- 7 LOVE THE EDUCATION ARTWORK ON HOW THE LANE WORKS. I THINK IT'S
- 8 SIMPLE. I LIKE THE USE OF GRAPHICS AND SUCH. IN TERMS OF THE
- 9 ADVERTISING AND THE SENSE OF HUMOR AND SUCH IN TERMS OF TRYING
- 10 TO GET PEOPLE TO GET A TAG, A FASTRAK TAG, I HAVE TO SAY I'M
- 11 KIND OF LUKEWARM ON THAT. BUT JUST KIND OF LUKEWARM. I DON'T
- 12 KNOW WHY, BUT IT DOESN'T SEEM TO MOVE ME. AND I'M NOT SURE HOW

- 21 NOT -- MAYBE I HAVE A MORE DROLL SENSE OF HUMOR. [LAUGHTER]
