### **Finding Words**

You can use the Find command to find a complete word or part of a word in the current PDF document. Acrobat Reader looks for the word by reading every word on every page in the file, including text in form fields.

## To find a word using the Find command:

- 1. Click the Find button (**Binoculars**), or choose Edit > Find.
- 2. Enter the text to find in the text box.
- 3. Select search options if necessary:

  Match Whole Word Only finds only occurrences of the complete word you enter in the box. For example, if you search for the word *stick*, the words *tick* and *sticky* will not be highlighted.

Match Case finds only words that contain exactly the same capitalization you enter in the box.

Find Backwards starts the search from the current page and goes backwards through the document.

4. Click Find. Acrobat Reader finds the next occurrence of the word.

## To find the next occurrence of the word, Do one of the following:

Choose Edit > Find Again Reopen the find dialog box, and click Find Again. (The word must already be in the Find text box.)

## Copying and pasting text and graphics to another application

You can select text or a graphic in a PDF document, copy it to the Clipboard, and paste it into another application such as a word processor. You can also paste text into a PDF document note or into a bookmark. Once the selected text or graphic is on the Clipboard, you can switch to another application and paste it into another document.

Note: If a font copied from a PDF document is not available on the system displaying the copied text, the font cannot be preserved. A default font is substituted.



## To select and copy it to the clipboard:

1. Select the text tool T, and do one of the following: To select a line of text, select the first letter of the sentence or phrase and drag to the last letter.

To select multiple columns of text (horizontally), hold down Ctrl+Alt (Windows) or Option (Mac OS) as you drag across the width of the document.

To select a column of text (vertically), Hold down Ctrl+Alt (Windows) or Option+Command (Mac OS) as you drag the length of the document.

To select all the text on the page, choose Edit > Select All. In single page mode, all the text on the current page is selected. In Continuous or Continuous – facing mode, most of the text in the document is selected. When you release the mouse button, the selected text is highlighted. To deselect the text and start over, click anywhere outside the selected text. The Select All command will not select all the text in the document. A workaround for this (Windows) is to use the Edit > Copy command. Choose Edit > Copy to copy the selected text to the clipboard.

2. To view the text, choose Window > Show Clipboard

In Windows 95, the Clipboard Viewer is not installed by default and you cannot use the Show Clipboard command until it is installed. To install the Clipboard Viewer, Choose Start > Settings > Control Panel > Add/Remove Programs, and then click the Windows Setup tab. Double-click Accessories, check Clipboard Viewer, and click OK.

- 13 FREEWAYS? AS KEARY MENTIONED, MTC AND THE AIR DISTRICT HAVE
- 14 ALREADY BEGUN THIS COLLABORATION BUT THIS PROPOSED AGREEMENT
- 15 WOULD ESSENTIALLY FORMALIZE OUR PARTNERSHIP AND HELP US TO
- 16 ADVANCE OUR COLLABORATION ACROSS OUR TWO AGENCIES AND REALLY
- 17 ALIGNING OUR DATA SETS IS WHAT WE SEE AS A REALLY IMPORTANT
- 18 WAY WE CAN BRING OUR TWO AGENCIES CLOSER TOGETHER. SO, WITH
- 19 THAT I'LL HAND IT BACK TO YOU, KEARY.

- 14 SOFTWARE AND DATA IDENTIFYING EFFORTS ON DATA COLLECTION AND
- 15 BRINGING BETTER ALIGNMENT WITH THE USE AND APPLICATION OF DATA
- 16 TO DEVELOP INSIGHTS FOR STAFF, DECISION MAKERS AND THE PUBLIC.
- 17 FINALLY I STRESS WE DO THIS AS AN IMPORTANT OPPORTUNITY TO
- 18 ADVANCE THE COMMISSION'S EQUITY PLATFORM BY ESTABLISHING THIS
- 19 PARTNERSHIP WITH THE AIR DISTRICT BOTH AGENCIES CAN TOGETHER
- 20 LEARN DIRECTLY FROM IMPACTED COMMUNITY IN OUR REGION AND
