



Adobe Acrobat Reader

Finding Words

You can use the Find command to find a complete word or part of a word in the current PDF document. Acrobat Reader looks for the word by reading every word on every page in the file, including text in form fields.

To find a word using the Find command:

- 1. Click the Find button (**Binoculars**), or choose Edit > Find.
- 2. Enter the text to find in the text box.
- 3. Select search options if necessary:

 Match Whole Word Only finds only occurrences of the complete word you enter in the box. For example, if you search for the word *stick*, the words *tick* and *sticky* will not be highlighted.

Match Case finds only words that contain exactly the same capitalization you enter in the box.

Find Backwards starts the search from the current page and goes backwards through the document.

4. Click Find. Acrobat Reader finds the next occurrence of the word.

To find the next occurrence of the word, Do one of the following:

Choose Edit > Find Again Reopen the find dialog box, and click Find Again. (The word must already be in the Find text box.)

Copying and pasting text and graphics to another application

You can select text or a graphic in a PDF document, copy it to the Clipboard, and paste it into another application such as a word processor. You can also paste text into a PDF document note or into a bookmark. Once the selected text or graphic is on the Clipboard, you can switch to another application and paste it into another document.

Note: If a font copied from a PDF document is not available on the system displaying the copied text, the font cannot be preserved. A default font is substituted.



To select and copy it to the clipboard:

1. Select the text tool T, and do one of the following: To select a line of text, select the first letter of the sentence or phrase and drag to the last letter.

To select multiple columns of text (horizontally), hold down Ctrl+Alt (Windows) or Option (Mac OS) as you drag across the width of the document.

To select a column of text (vertically), Hold down Ctrl+Alt (Windows) or Option+Command (Mac OS) as you drag the length of the document.

To select all the text on the page, choose Edit > Select All. In single page mode, all the text on the current page is selected. In Continuous or Continuous – facing mode, most of the text in the document is selected. When you release the mouse button, the selected text is highlighted. To deselect the text and start over, click anywhere outside the selected text. The Select All command will not select all the text in the document. A workaround for this (Windows) is to use the Edit > Copy command. Choose Edit > Copy to copy the selected text to the clipboard.

2. To view the text, choose Window > Show Clipboard

In Windows 95, the Clipboard Viewer is not installed by default and you cannot use the Show Clipboard command until it is installed. To install the Clipboard Viewer, Choose Start > Settings > Control Panel > Add/Remove Programs, and then click the Windows Setup tab. Double-click Accessories, check Clipboard Viewer, and click OK.

- 13 OR LIMITED TO THIS OPTIONAL HOUSING PRODUCTION TOOL. SO GIVEN
- 14 THAT THIS COULD BE SOMETHING THAT COULD BE REALLY HELPFUL FOR
- 15 LOCALITIES IN EXPEDITING HOUSING PRODUCTION AND REALLY ALWAYS
- 16 IN MEETING OUR RHNA GOALS THAT ARE GOING TO BE PRETTY
- 17 SUBSTANTIALLY LARGE, THIS TIME AROUND IN OUR UPCOMING HOUSING
- 18 CYCLE, WE ARE RECOMMENDING SUPPORT ON THIS BILL.

- 9 GETS BUILT IS THERE IS A BY RIGHT TO THIS. IT'S THE
- 10 JURISDICTION REZONES BUT EVERYTHING IS SUBJECT TO JURISDICTION
- 11 APPROVAL THEY WOULD NOT QUALIFY TO THE CREDIT.

- 13 SAM LICCARDO, VICE CHAIR MTC: POINT WELL TAKEN AND YES IT
- 14 WOULD BE A FRIENDLY.

15

- 16 JAMES P. SPERING: I'LL ADD TO THE MOTION THAT THEY CONSIDER
- 17 OLDER HOMES AND I DON'T KNOW WHAT THE YEAR IS, 25 OR 30, BUT
- 18 THE FRIENDLY AMENDMENT EMPHASIZING OLDER HOMES.

19

- 20 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: BACK TO STAFF, IS THAT WORKABLE?
- 21 OKAY. SO WE HAVE THE AMENDED MOTION, FRIENDLY AMENDMENT TO THE
- 22 MOTION, WHICH HAS BEEN ACCEPTED BY THE MAKER OF THE MOTION,
- 23 AND THE SECONDER OF THE MOTION, I WOULD ASK FOR A ROLL CALL
- 24 VOTE, PLEASE.

- 8 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: [LAUGHTER] VERY GOOD HAGGERTY, YOU
- 9 POPPED UP FROM NOWHERE AND YOU'RE DEPUTIZED.

11 SCOTT HAGGERTY: AT LEAST I'M PAYING ATTENTION.

12

- 13 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: YOU ARE PAYING ATTENTION AND YOU
- 14 ARE DEPUTIZED AND WE DO HAVE A QUORUM. THANK YOU. THAT BEING
- 15 SAID, THAT BRINGS US TO AGENDA ITEM NUMBER SIX, PUBLIC
- 16 COMMENT, ANY OTHER BUSINESS? ANY OTHER BUSINESS FROM ANYBODY
- 17 ON EITHER SIDE OF THE AISLE? ANY PUBLIC COMMENT MADAM CLERK?

18

- 19 CLERK OF THE BOARD: NO PUBLIC COMMENT WAS SUBMITTED ON THIS
- 20 ITEM. THERE IS ONE MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC WITH THEIR HAND
- 21 RAISED. ROBERT, GO AHEAD AND UNMUTE YOURSELF.

- 23 SPEAKER: HI GOOD AFTERNOON COMMITTEE MEMBERS ROBERT F FROM SAN
- 24 FRANCISCO. I MISSED THE LAST COMMENT BUT I WANT TO COMMENT ON
- 25 ZONE CAPACITY FOR PURCHASES OF RHNA I DELVED INTO SAN



- 1 FRANCISCO HOUSING CAPACITY BETWEEN -- IN THE LAST CENTURY, AND
- 2 WHAT I HAVE FOUND, I FOUND THAT ZONE CAPACITY MATTERS A GREAT
- 3 DEAL. IN THE 1940s, SAN FRANCISCO WAS ABOUT -- HAD HALF OF ITS
- 4 RESIDENTIAL LAND ZONED FOR MULTI-FAMILY HOUSING, BUT BY NOW --
- 5 BY THIS TIME, AROUND 70 TO 75 PERCENT OF OUR ZONED CAPACITY IS
- 6 SINGLE FAMILY ZONING ONLY, AND THAT CAPACITY MAKES THE
- 7 DIFFERENCE BETWEEN POPULATION LIMIT OF AROUND 165,900,000. AND
- 8 -- 165,000 AND THAT 900,000 AND THAT MAKES AN ADVERSE IN OUR
- 9 CAPACITY AND SAN FRANCISCO SAID WE'RE REACHING CAPACITY WE
- 10 WANT TO KEEP OUR RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOODS BUT LET'S ADDRESS
- 11 OUR RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORS AND THAT'S AFFECT THE EQUITY. I WANT
- 12 TO PASS ZONING AS HAVING A MARRIAGE EFFECT -- MAJOR EFFECT ON
- 13 POPULATION.

14

- 15 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. DOES THAT END
- 16 PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEM NUMBER SIX?

17

- 18 CLERK OF THE BOARD: THERE ARE NO OTHER MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC
- 19 WITH THEIR HANDS RAISED.

- 21 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: LOVING THE DOG IN THE BACKGROUND.
- 22 BEFORE WE ADJOURNED, I WOULD LIKE TO THANK CHAIR PIERCE AS
- 23 ALWAYS HELPING TO CONDUCT THIS JOINT MEETING OF THESE TWO
- 24 COMMITTEES. I WOULD LIKE TO THANK STAFF PARTICULARLY FOR
- 25 HANGING IN THERE, AND FOR THEIR ANALYSIS AND COMMENTS. I WOULD

- 1 LIKE TO THANK ALL OF YOU GUYS FOR HANGING IN THERE. THIS HAS
- 2 BEEN YET ANOTHER MARATHON. WE KEEP ON BREAKING RECORDS.

- 6 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: -- FOR OUR ZOOM COMMITTEE MEETINGS.
- 7 MR. CHAIR HAGGERTY THANK YOU VERY MUCH AS WELL FOR HANGING IN
- 8 THERE.

10 SCOTT HAGGERTY: I HAVE A QUESTION.

12 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: YOU DO. ME?

13

- 14 SCOTT HAGGERTY: MAYBE I WASN'T PAYING ATTENTION AS MUCH AS I
- 15 THOUGHT.

17 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: [LAUGHTER]

- 19 SCOTT HAGGERTY: ON THE LAST ITEM, DO WE HAVE TWO DIFFERENT
- 20 MOTIONS ONE WITH AN AMENDMENT AND ONE WITHOUT THE AMENDMENT?

21

- 22 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: WE HAVE AN ABAG MOTION. BUT IT'S
- 23 SEPARATE --

24

25 JULIE PIERCE, CHAIR ABAG: THE MTC MOTION IN HAD AN AMENDMENT.

2 SCOTT HAGGERTY: I GET IT, SHOULD WE TRY TO, TO MAKE IT EASIER

- 3 ON STAFF, SHOULD WE TRY TO SEE IF ABAG CAN AT LEAST SUPPORT
- 4 THAT?

5

- 6 JULIE PIERCE, CHAIR ABAG: I WOULD SUGGEST THAT RATHER THAN
- 7 REQUESTING A FORMAL AMENDMENT MAYBE WHAT WE DO IS MAKE A
- 8 SUGGESTION THEY CLARIFY THE AGE OF HOMES THEY WANT THIS TO
- 9 APPLY TO. BECAUSE THERE MAY BE SOME THAT HAVE BEEN BUILT IN
- 10 THE LAST TEN YEARS FRANKLY THAT YOU CAN ADD AN ADU TO, WITHOUT
- 11 ANY PROBLEM IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD IT JUST DEPENDS ON THE SIZE OF
- 12 THE LOT.

13

- 14 SCOTT HAGGERTY: I'M FINE I'M JUST TRYING TO MAKE IT EASIER ON
- 15 STAFF.

16

- 17 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: I WAS GOING ASK STAFF, MR. CHAIR,
- 18 IF IT'S CAPABLE OF ADDING THE LEGISLATURE TO MOTIONS.

19

- 20 REBECCA LONG: I DON'T THINK IT'S A PROBLEM PARTICULARLY AS I
- 21 UNDERSTAND THE MOTION IT WAS SUPPORT AND SEEK AMENDMENT FROM
- 22 MTC SO IT'S NOT LIKE THEY'RE IN CONFLICT IN PARTICULAR. BUT
- 23 THANK YOU FOR THE QUESTION CHAIR HAGGERTY.

- 1 SCOTT HAGGERTY: YEAH, BUT, I MEAN, I THINK PROCEDURALLY, THIS
- 2 IS SOMETHING THAT -- AND MAYBE IT'S A VIEW POINT AS WE GET
- 3 CLOSER TO MERGING THE TWO COMMITTEES, BUT IF ABAG DOESN'T LIKE
- 4 IT AND WE KIND OF GO UNDER THIS THEORY THAT WELL, WE'LL JUST
- 5 MAKE IT WORK, THEN IT BECOMES A PROBLEM. BECAUSE ABAG IS A
- 6 HOUSING -- YOU SEE WHAT I'M SAYING? THIS --

- 8 JULIE PIERCE, CHAIR ABAG: CAN I ASK A QUESTION OF THE ABAG
- 9 MEMBERS. DOES ANYBODY HAVE A PROBLEM WITH THE SUGGESTED
- 10 AMENDMENT THAT MTC ADOPTED?

11

- 12 PAT EKLUND: THIS IS PAT. I DO. BECAUSE IT RESTRICTS OUR
- 13 FLEXIBILITY. UNLESS THE DEFINITION OF OLD. I LIKE YOUR
- 14 EXPLANATION EARLIER, THAT DIFFERENT COMMUNITIES HAVE DIFFERENT
- 15 CIRCUMSTANCES. AND I -- THE WHOLE REASON I SUPPORTED THIS BILL
- 16 IS BECAUSE IT GAVE US SOME FLEXIBILITY, AND IT WAS NOT
- 17 PRESCRIPTIVE, AND NOW IF WE'RE TRYING TO MAKE IT PRESCRIPTIVE
- 18 BY ONLY ELIMINATING IT TO OLDER HOMES, I'M NOT SURE I WOULD
- 19 SUPPORT IT THEN BECAUSE THAT MAY ELIMINATE SOME OF THE
- 20 FLEXIBILITY THAT WE NEED IN OUR HOUSING ELEMENT.

21

- 22 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: AND HERE I THOUGHT I WAS JUST
- 23 TRYING TO ADJOURN THE MEETING. BUT NEVER MIND. [LAUGHTER]
- 24 ANYWAY.

- JULIE PIERCE, CHAIR ABAG: STAFF, DO YOU HAVE A RECOMMENDATION
- 2 ON THIS? I THINK YOU'RE OKAY WITH GOING FORWARD WITH IT, AS IT
- 3 WAS STATED. IS THAT WHAT I'M HEARING?

- 5 REBECCA LONG: YEAH. THAT'S WHAT I SAID. I THINK THAT MAYBE
- 6 WHAT WE CAN DO IS DO SOME MORE RESEARCH. GEORGIA MENTIONED
- 7 THERE HAD BEEN SOME RESEARCH DONE TO LOOK INTO THE FEASIBILITY
- 8 AND INFORMED THE MATH, RIGHT, THE TEN PERCENT RATIO, FOR WHAT
- 9 THE CREDIT IS, AND WE'LL CERTAINLY RAISE IT, YOU KNOW, AS
- 10 SOMETHING THAT WE WANTED TO LOOK AT. IF THE POSITION IS MTC
- 11 SUPPORTS IT, IS INTERESTED IN POTENTIALLY AMENDING IT AND ABAG
- 12 SUPPORTS IT OUTRIGHT I DON'T THINK WE'RE IN TOO MUCH OF AN
- 13 AWKWARD SPACE.

14

- 15 JAKE MACKENZIE, MTC CHAIR: AND I WOULD THANK MAYOR LICCARDO
- 16 FOR BRINGING THIS UP. AND I DO BELIEVE THAT WE CAN RELY ON OUR
- 17 STAFF. THEY'LL FIGURE OUT HOW TO COMMUNICATE THE NUANCES OF
- 18 THE DISCUSSION WE HAVE HAD THIS AFTERNOON. I DO BELIEVE. THAT
- 19 BEING SAID, I'M GOING TO STAFF THANKING ANYBODY ANYMORE, AND
- 20 ADJOURN THIS MEETING UNTIL FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 11TH AT 9:40 A.M.,
- 21 OR REMOTELY, OR BY WEBCAST, OR BY WHICHEVER WAY WE'RE
- 22 COMMUNICATING, IN SEPTEMBER. OKAY. WE'RE DONE. [ADJOURNED]
